Baylor plays its final true road contest of the season with the 106th renewal of the Battle of the Brazos vs. Texas A&M Saturday, Nov. 21 in College Station. The non-televised game is scheduled to kick off at 2:30 p.m. CST at Kyle Field.

The Bears-Aggies series is now the most-played in Baylor football history, moving past the 105-game rivalry with former Southwest Conference foe TCU.

The Bears (4-6, 1-5 Big 12) look to get back on the winning track after dropping a 47-14 decision to No. 2 Texas last Saturday in Waco. The Bears are 2-2 on the road this season, having notched victories at Wake Forest and at Missouri.

The Aggies (5-5, 2-4 Big 12) have lost two straight, most recently a 65-10 decision at Oklahoma last Saturday. Texas A&M is 4-1 at home this season.

All Baylor football games are broadcast live on the Baylor/ISP Sports Radio Network; Waco's 1660 ESPN Radio is the network's flagship station. Saturday's game also will be carried on Sirius Radio 161. Live streaming audio and GameTracker also are available for all Baylor football games online at www.BaylorBears.com, the official website of Baylor Athletics and a member of the CBS College Sports network.

BAYLOR-TEXAS A&M SERIES

Saturday is the 106th meeting between Baylor and Texas A&M in football, the most-played series in Baylor football history. The Aggies hold a 65-31-9 advantage in the all-time series, which dates back to a 33-0 A&M victory in 1899. Texas A&M also leads the series 30-10-3 in games played in College Station.

Baylor won last season's contest 41-21 in Waco and is 2-3 vs. A&M over the last five years dating to an overtime victory in 2004. Texas A&M won in 2005 (OT), 2006 and 2007. The Aggies have won eight straight at home in the series dating back to a 20-20 tie in 1990.

Texas A&M holds an 11-2 advantage in the series since the inception of the Big 12 Conference in 1996. Baylor and Texas A&M have played every season since 1931 save the 1943 and 1944 seasons when Baylor did not field a team due to World War II.

BAYLOR HONORS FORT HOOD

The Baylor family displayed its support and fellowship to the nearby Fort Hood community last Saturday when it provided 1,000 free tickets to base personnel to the game vs. Texas and welcomed police department hero Senior Sgt. **Mark Todd** to Floyd Casey Stadium. Todd participated in the pregame coin toss and was recognized and presented a ball on the field during the first timeout.

Additionally, the Bears unveiled a helmet decal of the Fort Hood insignia that will be worn for the remainder of the season.

Baylor's practices are closed to the media and the general public. Media are allowed to attend the first 20 minutes of practice; still and video photography are allowed during this time.

QUICK NOTES

- Baylor and Texas A&M meet Saturday in the 106th Battle of the Brazos, BU's most-played football rivalry.
- After averaging 196.3 rushing yards (197.0 passing) in four non-conference games, the Bears have averaged just 39.3 rushing (277.8 passing) in six Big 12 games. Starting tailback **Jay Finley** was injured in the season's second game and has played sparingly since.
- Saturday junior P **Derek Epperson** will play against his brother, Texas A&M freshman P **Ryan Epperson**.
- "Voice of the Bears" **John Morris** will call his 250th Baylor football game Saturday in College Station.
- Baylor is 7-1 in the **Art Briles** era when allowing 21 points or fewer and 1-13 when allowing more than 21 points. Nov. 7 win at Missouri (40-32) was the first victory under Briles when giving up 21-plus.
- Baylor snapped a 23-game losing streak when trailing at the half with Nov. 7 win at MU (40-32).
- Baylor has produced only four takeaways in its first six Big 12 games.
- Baylor is 3-2 this season when possessing the ball longer than opponents, conversely BU is 1-4 when losing the time of possession battle in 2009.
- The Bears are 0-7 in the Briles era when losing the turnover battle, including an 0-6 mark this year.
- Baylor is 3-0 this season when winning the turnover battle & 0-6 when not.
- Baylor averaged 36.5 points/game in non-conference but only 14.7 points/game in six Big 12 games.
- Over the last three games (20-10 loss to NU, 40-32 win at MU, 47-14 loss to Texas) Baylor was outscored 87-16 in the first half but outscored its opponents 48-12 in the second half.
- Baylor's 68 points vs. Northwestern St. was the third-highest point total by an FBS team this season.
- BU has lost 16 straight games when scoring fewer than 20 points (dating to 17-3 win vs. K-State in 2006).
- Baylor has won 11 consecutive games when reaching the 30-point plateau.
- Baylor snapped a 13-game losing streak when rushing for less than 100 yards with Nov. 7 win at Missouri in which the Bears totaled 38 yards rushing.
- Baylor has returned three interceptions for touchdowns this season.
- 25 BU freshmen have played this season (17 scholarship FR) including 10 true freshmen (3 have made starts).
- **Joe Pawelek** is the nation's active career tackle leader with 401 stops.
- **Joe Pawelek** ranks 22nd all-time in NCAA tackles (since 2000) / 2nd all-time at BU to **Mike Singletary** (662).
- **Derek Epperson** was named first-team midseason All-America by CBSSports.com.
- **Joe Pawelek** and **Phil Taylor** both earned second-team midseason All-America honors from *Phil Steele*.
- Eight Bears earned midseason All-Big 12 honors from *Phil Steele*: **Jordan Lake**, **Joe Pawelek** & **Phil Taylor** (first team); **Derek Epperson**, **Antonio Jones**, **Jason Lamb**, **J.D. Walton** & **Kendall Wright** (third team).
- Junior **Derek Epperson** ranks second nationally and leads the Big 12 with 45.6 yards per punt.
- **Kendall Wright** has a catch in each game of career (22-games). Has at least four catches in eight straight.
- **Kendall Wright** ranks seventh in the Big 12 and tied for 34th nationally with 5.7 receptions per game. Wright is 10th in the conference with 65.4 receiving yards per game.
- **Kendall Wright's** 1,303 career receiving yards 12th in BU history / 107 career catches ranks ninth all-time.
- **Joe Pawelek** is a finalist for the Campbell Trophy. He joins **Don Trull** (1963) as BU's only footballers to earn NFF post-graduate scholarships.
- **Joe Pawelek** will start his 44th consecutive game Saturday at A&M, the longest such streak by a BU player (non-special teams) since **Maurice Lane** ended his career in 2005 with a school-record 45 consecutive starts.
- QB **Nick Florence's** 61.3 completion percentage currently ranks as the second-highest in school history.
- S **Jordan Lake** is averaging 9.5 tackles in Big 12 play.
- **Joe Pawelek** ranks third in the Big 12 and 46th nationally with 8.8 tackles per game.
- **Joe Pawelek's** 21 tackles against UConn (second-best, single-game total by FBS player this season).
- **Nick Florence** named Big 12 Conference Off. Player of the Week after record performance at Missouri.
- **Nick Florence** was the recipient of [ESPN.com's](http://ESPN.com) Big 12 Helmet Sticker for performance at Missouri (11/7/09)
- LB **Antonio Jones** ranks sixth in the Big 12 with 7.3 tackles per game.
- **Jordan Lake** ranks fifth in the Big 12 with 7.6 tackles per game.
- **Jordan Lake** ranks ninth nationally among active FBS players with seven career forced fumbles. He also ranks 17th nationally with 308 career tackles & sixth nationally with 4.8 career solo tackles per game.
- **Derek Epperson's** career punting average (42.5 ypp) ranks eighth nationally among active FBS players.
- TE **Justin Akers** has at least one catch in 13 consecutive games.
- RB **Jay Finley** needs 154 yards to become 15th player at Baylor to reach 1,500 career rushing yards.
- True freshman **Terrance Williams** ranks second in the Big 12 in kick returns with a 26.8 average.
- **Terrance Williams' 26.8** kick return average currently ranks fourth on Baylor's single-season chart.
- **Nick Florence** completed passes to 11 different receivers vs. UT, including a deflected pass that he caught himself for no gain.
- Two receivers caught their career-first passes vs. UT (true freshman WR **Josh Gordon** and true freshman QB **Nick Florence**) and a third, junior WR **Krys Buerck**, made his first reception of the season.
- Five different Baylor players have thrown touchdown passes this season: QBs **Nick Florence**, **Robert Griffin III** and **Blake Szymanski**, TE **Jerod Monk** and IR **Ernest Smith**. The last time more than four Bears had touchdown passes in one season was 2003 when six Bears had TD passes.

LAST TIME vs. TEXAS A&M

BAYLOR 41, TEXAS A&M 21

With a couple of long passes and some nifty pitches, **Robert Griffin** helped lead Baylor to a victory over Texas A&M that ensured the turnover-plagued Aggies a losing season.

Griffin threw touchdown passes of 31 and 55 yards and **Jacoby Jones** ran for two scores after taking late pitches from Griffin in Baylor's 41-21 victory Saturday. It was Baylor's fifth-largest margin of victory over Texas A&M ever and its largest since 1980.

Baylor forced five Aggie turnovers, including four interceptions. **Joe Pawelek** had two picks, the second coming in the end zone in the fourth quarter.

Jones had a clear path to the end zone along the right sideline for a 12-yard TD that made it 13-0 after Griffin, while shedding a tackler, pitched the ball. Then on a fourth-and-1 late in the third quarter, Jones scored on an 18-yard run when Griffin got rid of the ball just before being slammed to the ground by a defender.

Griffin was 13-of-23 for 241 yards and added 56 yards on 12 rushes. **Jay Finley** carried 23 times for 116 yards and added a 13-yard TD run.

The Aggies' Jerrod Johnson was 19-of-30 for 244 yards with four interceptions and a late touchdown. He had only four passes picked off in his first eight games before throwing two against Oklahoma the previous week and four against Baylor.

Jorvorskie Lane scored on a pair of 1-yard runs.

Baylor led 6-0 after **Ben Parks** had field goals of 42 and 28 yards, the first on the Bears' opening drive of the game and the second after **Leon Freeman** recovered a fumble caused when Johnson was tackled from behind by **Zac Scotton**.

Dwain Crawford's interception set up the drive that led to Jones' first TD and included Griffin's 49-yard pass to **Ernest Smith** to convert a third-and-14.

The Aggies finally scored when Lane plunged in over the left side after Johnson's 51-yard pass to Mike Goodson, who made a leaping, stretching catch between three defenders.

YOUNG CUBS GAINING EXPERIENCE

Ten true freshmen have seen time for Baylor this season: CB **Chance Casey**, QB **Nick Florence**, WR **Josh Gordon**, S **Mike Hicks**, WR **Willie Jefferson**, LB **Logan Lanier**, TE **Jerod Monk**, S **Anthony Moore**, IR **Michael Valdez** and OG **Ivory Wade**. Casey, Florence and Wade all have garnered starts.

An additional 15 redshirt freshmen have played this season, making a total of 25 freshmen (17 scholarship) that have played for Baylor in 2009.

HEAD COACH ART BRILES



Art Briles assumed Baylor's head coaching post Nov. 28, 2007, ushering in a new era and a new attitude to the storied Bears football program. In his first season on the sidelines in Waco it was quickly evident that the Briles Era was underway at Baylor; from the innovative offense, the reintroduction of a solid running game and a record-setting quarterback, to competitive games and no acceptance of moral victories.

Briles' 2008 Bears finished with a 4-8 record, but six of eight defeats were at the hands of ranked opponents (four in top 10) and three losses came by a touchdown or less.

Highlights of Briles' first season at Baylor included the emergence of sensational true freshman quarterback Robert Griffin III, the Big 12's top newcomer and freshman All-American, a rushing attack that ranked 21st nationally and third in the Big 12 with 195.8 yards per game (2,349 yards, most since 1981) and 29 touchdowns, and a memorable 41-21 home win over Texas A&M. Baylor's 1.33 turnover margin ranked fourth nationally and junior linebacker Joe Pawelek ranked seventh nationally in tackles (10.7) and interceptions (.50).

Briles is a proven developer of professional talent, evidenced over the last three NFL drafts where his proteges include the first lineman selected in 2009 (second overall pick Jason Smith from Baylor), the first receiver selected in 2008 (33rd pick Donnie Avery of Houston) and the third quarterback selected in 2007 (36th pick Kevin Kolb of Houston).

A native of West Texas, Briles became Baylor's 25th head football coach after resurrecting the University of Houston's football program in a five-year stretch from 2003 to 2007.

Briles, who inherited a Houston program that was just two years removed from an 0-11 season and won eight total games from 2000 to 2003, posted a 34-28 record with the Cougars and guided them to four bowl games. He ranks as the program's third-winningest head coach behind College Football Hall of Famer Bill Yeoman (160 wins in 26 seasons) and Clyde Lee (37 victories in seven seasons).

Briles arrived to Houston from Texas Tech, where he spent three years (2000-02) as the Red Raiders' running backs coach. The Tech ground game flourished under Briles' direction, increasing its production every year and producing a 2001 first-team All-Big 12 performer in Ricky Williams. The Red Raiders won seven or more games each season Briles was on Mike Leach's staff and went bowling every year.

Prior to moving into the collegiate coaching ranks at Texas Tech, Briles spent 12 seasons (1988-99) as head coach and athletic director at Stephenville [Texas] High School. His Yellowjacket teams won four state championships, capturing back-to-back crowns in 1993 and 1994 and repeating that feat in 1998 and 1999.

Briles, a former Texas High School Coaches Association president, has spent his entire coaching career in the state of Texas. Following in his father's footsteps, Briles began his coaching career as an assistant at Sundown [Texas] High School in 1979 before moving to Sweetwater [Texas] High School as an assistant from 1980-83. At age 28, he landed his first head coaching job at Hamlin [Texas] High School (1984-86), where he also served as athletic director.

From Hamlin, Briles went to Georgetown [Texas] High School as head coach and athletic director for two seasons (1986-87) before moving to Stephenville in 1988. While coaching in the high school ranks, Briles developed six Division I quarterbacks and had five signal callers throw for over 3,000 yards in a season.

A former wide receiver for the Cougars from 1974 to 1977, Briles was a member of the 1976 Cougar squad that captured the Southwest Conference championship in UH's first season in the league.

He received a Bachelor of Arts degree from Texas Tech in 1979 and a Masters of Education degree from Abilene Christian in 1984.

A Big Country Athletic Hall of Fame inductee for his West Texas exploits, Briles and his wife, Jan, have three children: Jancy, a graduate of the University of Houston who works in the Dallas Cowboys Public Relations office; Kendal, a Cougar letterman and UH graduate who serves as an assistant coach on Baylor's staff; and Staley, a UH graduate. Briles was inducted into the Texas High School Football Hall of Fame in April 2008.

EIGHT BEARS EARN MIDSEASON HONORS FROM PHIL STEELE

FS **Jordan Lake**, LB **Joe Pawelek** and DT **Phil Taylor** headline the eight Baylor Bears included on *Phil Steele's* 2009 Midseason All-Big 12 Team.

Lake, Pawelek and Taylor all garnered first-team Midseason All-Big 12 honors. Pawelek and Taylor also were named to the publication's Midseason All-America second team. P **Derek Epperson**, LB **Antonio Jones**, DE **Jason Lamb**, C **J.D. Walton** and IR **Kendall Wright** were named to the Big 12 third team.

BAYLOR-TEXAS TECH SHOOTOUT SET FOR 5PM ON FSN AT JERRYWORLD

Baylor's Nov. 28 football game vs. Texas Tech at Cowboys Stadium in Arlington will kickoff at 5 p.m. CST and be televised nationally on FSN.

The series, under the title of the Texas Farm Bureau Insurance Shootout, was moved this spring from campus sites to the Dallas-Fort Worth Metroplex for the 2009 and 2010 seasons. The 2009 game is officially a Baylor home game and the 2010 contest is considered a Texas Tech home game. The 2010 contest will be played at the Cotton Bowl in Fair Park.

The Baylor-Texas Tech Shootout is the third of five college football games to be played in the first-year facility which is home to the NFL's Dallas Cowboys. Previous college games included Oklahoma vs. BYU and Arkansas vs. Texas A&M. The Big 12 Championship game will be played at Cowboys Stadium on Dec. 5 as well as the Cotton Bowl on Jan. 2, 2010.

PAWELEK NEARING NCAA CAREER TACKLES MILESTONE

Senior LB **Joe Pawelek** needs eight tackles to crack the NCAA top-20 list for career tackles. He currently ranks 22nd on the list with 401 career stops, most among active FBS players. The NCAA began tracking tackles for its records book in 2000. Since then, 21 players have reached 400 career tackles. Tim McGarigle of Northwestern holds the recognized NCAA career tackles record, making 545 career stops from 2002 to 2005.

Due to the fact that the NCAA did not begin recognizing tackles records until 2000, two former Baylor All-Americans are not on the list. **Ray Berry** had 380 career tackles from 1983 to 1986. **Mike Singletary** is the unofficial all-time tackles leader in Division I history; he made 662 stops from 1977 to 1980.

JOEPAW NATIONS ACTIVE TACKLE LEADER

With 401 career tackles LB **Joe Pawelek** is the national leader in career tackles among active FBS players. Pawelek also leads all FBS linebackers with nine career interceptions. After ranking seventh nationally last season in tackles (10.7 per game), Pawelek ranks third in the Big 12 and 46th nationally with 8.8 tackles per game this season.

Senior FS **Jordan Lake** ranks 17th among active players with 308 career tackles, seventh among defensive backs.

THREE BEARS EARN ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT HONORS

Three Baylor football student-athletes earned 2009 ESPN The Magazine Academic All-District VI honors. P **Derek Epperson**, DL **Jason Lamb** and LB **Joe Pawelek** each earned first-team honors and are eligible for Academic All-America honors to be announced later this month.

Pawelek, a senior finance and economics major from San Antonio, Texas, earned first-team honors for the third consecutive year. He was a second-team Academic All-America selection last season.

Epperson, a junior management/MIS major from Southlake, Texas, earned Academic All-District honors for the first time. He was a first-team Academic All-Big 12 selection last season.

Lamb, a senior management and human resource management major from Richardson, Texas, also is a first-time honoree after earning first-team Academic All-Big 12 honors last season.

BANGED-UP BEARS

After a nearly injury-free 2008 season, eight Baylor starters have sustained injuries during the 2009 campaign, including two players who have sustained season-ending injuries.

Baylor has lost more games to opening-day starters than every school in the Big 12 but Oklahoma, according to a poll recently conducted by *The Oklahoman* newspaper. Through nine games, six Baylor starting players had missed 27 games (not counting seven missed by kick returner **Mikail Baker**) and nine OU players had missed 31 games.

QB **Robert Griffin III** tore his ACL during the first quarter of the Northwestern State game and is out for the remainder of the season. Also out is return specialist and nickelback Baker, who also sustained an ACL tear in the same game. TB **Jay Finley** suffered an ankle sprain vs. UConn and has played sparingly in four games in the last seven weeks.

Other starters suffering injuries this season are CB **Antareis Bryan** (knee injury, missed six games), CB **Tim Atchison** (broken hand, has continued playing with cast), LG **John Jones** (missed three games with ankle and hand injuries) and S **Jeremy Williams** (ankle, missed UConn game).

Furthermore, **Blake Szymanski**, the preseason No. 2 QB, has been limited due to a shoulder injury suffered vs. NSU. DT **Phil Taylor** missed the second half of the Oklahoma game and was limited in the next two games due to turf toe.

GETTIS, WRIGHT CLIMBING BAYLOR RECEIVER CHARTS

WR **David Gettis** and IR **Kendall Wright** have both entered Baylor's Top 10 list for career receptions this season (they both reached the 100-catch plateau in BU's road win at Missouri Nov. 7, the eighth and ninth Bears ever to hit that mark). Gettis currently ranks eighth in Baylor history with 108 receptions, Wright ranks ninth with 107 catches.

Additionally, Gettis ranks ninth in Baylor history with 1,456 career receiving yards. He needs 44 yards to become Baylor's seventh 1,500-yard receiver and the program's first since 2006 when **Trent Shelton** and **Dominique Zeigler** both reached the plateau. Wright ranks 12th in Baylor history with 1,303 career receiving yards.

BETTER SECOND HALVES

Baylor's scoring margin in the second halves of recent games has been markedly better than in the first halves. Over the last three games (20-10 loss to NU, 40-32 win at MU, 47-14 loss to UT) Baylor was outscored 87-16 in the first half but outscored its opponents 48-12 in the second half.

In six Big 12 games this season, Baylor has been outscored 132-26 (22.0-4.3) in the first half but outscored its opponents 62-58 (10.3-9.7) in the second.

FINLEY LIMPING UP BAYLOR CAREER YARDAGE LIST

RB Jay Finley's assault on Baylor's career rushing list has been derailed by injuries during his junior season. Finley has carried the ball just 31 times over the last eight games (including three games he didn't play in) while nursing an ankle sprain.

In one-plus games before suffering the injury in the second game vs. UConn, Finley had rushed for 212 yards, including a career-high 121 yards (on eight carries, a 15.1 yards-per-carry average) vs. the Huskies. That game was the fourth 100-yarder of his career and his fourth consecutive game with at least 90 rushing yards.

Finley enters the Texas A&M game with 1,346 career rushing yards, tied for the 21st-best career total in Baylor history. He needs 154 yards to become the 15th player in school history to amass at least 1,500 career rushing yards. With 654 yards, he would become the program's seventh 2,000-yard rusher and Baylor's first since Darrell Bush (1997-2000).

PAWELEK NAMED CAMPBELL TROPHY FINALIST

Senior LB Joe Pawelek is one of 16 finalists for the 2009 William V. Campbell Trophy (formerly the Draddy Trophy), the National Football Foundation announced Thursday. The Campbell Trophy, endowed by HealthSouth, is in its 20th year and honors college football's top scholar-athlete (considered by many to be the "Academic Heisman").

Each of the 16 finalists receives an \$18,000 post-graduate scholarship. The winner of the Campbell Trophy, named for the former Columbia University player and coach, earns an additional \$25,000 post-graduate scholarship. The 2009 Campbell Trophy winner will be announced Dec. 8 at the Waldorf Astoria in New York City.

Pawelek, a product of Smithson Valley [Texas] High School, is one of three linebackers among the 16 finalists, joining Matt Bauman of BYU and Reed Williams of West Virginia, and one of three Big 12 student-athletes along with Texas QB Colt McCoy and Kansas QB Todd Reasing.

A 2008 All-America and Academic All-America honoree, Pawelek also is active in community service. He has assisted the Central Texas area at events such as Santa's Workshop, the One Book One Waco program, was a spokesperson for Baylor's "Food for Families" canned food drive, played with young cancer survivors at the Li'l Wrangler Round-Up Party, and worked with Waco's Special Olympics. He also speaks regularly to youth at area schools.

BEARS SNAP HALFTIME JINX

The Nov. 7 second-half comeback win over Missouri (defeated the Tigers 40-32 after trailing 27-16 at the half), snapped a 23-game Baylor losing streak in games which it trailed at the half. That streak dated back to 2006, when the Bears defeated Kansas 36-35 after overcoming a 35-17 halftime deficit. The Bears lost last Saturday after a halftime deficit vs. Texas.

Conversely, the Bears have won seven of their last nine games when leading at halftime. The lone losses in that time were at Nebraska and at Texas Tech last season.

30 POINTS KEY FOR BEARS

Since 2001, Baylor is 22-2 (.917) when scoring at least 30 points and 10-69 (.127) when scoring less than 30 points. The only losses in that span when scoring 30 points were at Texas in 2006 (63-31) and at Oklahoma in 2005 (37-30 in double overtime).

Baylor has won 11 consecutive games when reaching the 30-point plateau. Conversely, the Bears have lost 27 of their last 28 when not reaching the 30-point plateau. The lone victory in that stretch was a 24-21 win at Wake Forest in this year's season opener.

LACK OF TURNOVERS AFFECTING BEARS

Baylor is tied for 78th nationally in turnover margin with a -.30 turnover/takeaway ratio this season; furthermore, the Bears have produced only four takeaways in their first six Big 12 games.

Last season, Baylor averaged 2.3 takeaways per game; this season, that average has dipped to 1.5 per game. The Bears won the turnover battle in 10 of 12 games last season, losing the edge once and breaking even once. This season, the Bears have won the turnover battle in just three of 10 games (3-0 record in those games).

Baylor's defense produced at least one turnover in every game of the 2008 season; however, the Bears have produced zero turnovers in four games thus far this season (1-3 record).

RECORD-SETTING PASSING DAY IN UPSET OF MISSOURI

Baylor set several records and career passing marks in its 40-32 upset of Missouri in Columbia Nov. 7. True freshman QB **Nick Florence**, in his fifth career start, set a school record with 427 passing yards on 32-of-43 completions (topped old mark of 412 set by teammate **Blake Szymanski** vs. Rice in 2007). The 427 yards also set the school record for team passing yards (topping 423 vs. Rice in 2007).

Florence also set career highs in completions (32), attempts (43), passing TDs (3), completion percentage (74.4%), TD pass (59 yards), passing efficiency (180.86) and TDs responsible for (4).

BEARS THROW BLOCK PARTY

Baylor has blocked four kicks this season — three field goals and one extra point. DE **Jason Lamb** and DT **Phil Taylor** are responsible for the four blocks, each claiming two. Lamb had a blocked two field goals against Kent State Oct. 3, while Taylor also had a blocked extra point against the Golden Flashes. Baylor's single-season record for team blocked kicks is 13, established in 1980.

FLORENCE BIG 12 PLAYER OF THE WEEK vs. MIZZOU

Baylor freshman quarterback **Nick Florence** was named Big 12 Conference Offensive Player of the Week Nov. 9 after his record-setting performance in Baylor's 40-32 upset at Missouri. Florence threw for a school-record 427 yards and three TDs in the win.

The honor is the first for the rookie quarterback, and the second weekly honor earned by a Baylor student-athlete this season; linebacker **Joe Pawelek** earned defensive honors in week one.

FORMER SIGNAL CALLERS FIND NEW HOMES

Baylor's 2009 roster features seven student-athletes who were starting quarterbacks in high school, including one former signal caller who played quarterback beyond high school.

Safety **Jeremy Sanders** made the move to another position after playing quarterback at Navarro [Texas] College. He played running back last season and switched to safety this season. Sanders was a standout prep quarterback at Marlin [Texas] High School.

The most interesting position change was that of **Zac Scotton**, who now plays defensive end. The six-foot-six, 255-pound Scotton made the switch away from quarterback prior to his junior season at Houston's Cypress Creek High School after out-growing the position.

The "Voice of the Bears," John Morris (Baylor, 1980) enters his 23rd year broadcasting Baylor football and men's basketball in 2009-10. Morris, who has broadcast 239 consecutive Baylor football games entering the 2009 season, will broadcast his 250th consecutive game Nov. 21 when the Bears travel to Texas A&M.

A Kentucky native, Morris also produces the daily "State Farm Baylor SportsBeat," daily Big 12 reports and co-hosts the award-winning "Inside Baylor Sports" television show. Morris also hosts "The Central National Bank Art Briles Show" in the fall, the "State Farm Baylor Hour" January through May and a daily 60-minute program, "The John Morris Show," on Waco's 1660 ESPN Radio. This is Morris' 15th year as signature voice of Baylor athletics since succeeding the legendary Frank Fallon. In November 2002, he was presented the Frank Fallon Sportsmanship Award by the Greater Waco Chamber of Commerce.

Three-time Academic All-American J.J. Joe returns for his sixth season as color analyst. The Bears' leading passer for four consecutive seasons from 1990-1993, Joe graduated as Baylor's career passing and total offense leader and is one of the school's most decorated student-athletes as a three-time Academic All-American. He was inducted into the Baylor Athletic Hall of Fame in 2006.

Ricky Thompson returns for his 10th season providing sideline color and analysis. Thompson is a former SWC long jump champion and was the Bears' leading receiver in 1975 before embarking on a seven-year NFL career. He also is a member of the Baylor Athletic Hall of Fame.

Baylor's radio team also includes the multi-talented Craig Harper, who, in his 23rd year as a member of the crew, serves as executive producer of the football broadcasts.

Baylor's 2009 roster features 11 student-athletes from the Central Texas area, including two starters and three others listed second on the depth chart at their respective positions.

Headlining that group are starters CB **Tim Atchison** (Copperas Cove) and LB **Antonio Johnson** (Waco). Backups on the list are DS **Casey Cooper** (Abbott), S **Mike Hicks** (China Spring), BS **Andrew Judy** (Crawford) and RB **Jarred Salubi** (Waco). S **Jeremy Sanders** prepped at Marlin HS and also played junior college ball at Navarro College. Others on the list are DT **Courtney Green** (Corsicana), QB **Robert Griffin III** (Copperas Cove), OL **Zach Northern** (Waco-Midway) and PK **Chris Winkler** (Temple).

BAYLOR SCHEDULE AMONG NATION'S TOUGHEST

After playing eight teams that went to bowl games in each of the last two seasons, Baylor is again facing eight returning bowl teams on its 2009 schedule, including five of eight Big 12 foes.

Baylor's 2009 schedule currently is tied for the nation's 22nd toughest based upon cumulative opponents' winning percentage (53-41, .564). That factors only FBS opponents and games against FBS teams. The Bears' schedule ranks second among Big 12 teams; Oklahoma's schedule ranks as the nation's second toughest. Another Baylor opponent — Connecticut — has the nation's ninth-toughest schedule.

BEARS MEMORIALIZE KYLE WOODS

Baylor football helmets display a black circle with the initials "KW" for the 2009 season. The decal, located on the back of the helmets, is in memory of former Baylor letterwinner Kyle Woods, who passed away in early April at the age of 49.

Woods, who sustained an injury during a 1979 practice at Floyd Casey Stadium that rendered him a quadriplegic, had a heart attack on March 22, 2009, and never regained consciousness.

As a 19-year-old sophomore defensive back from Dallas, Woods was a member of the scout team defense working against the second team offense. While making a tackle, Kyle fractured his neck and severely damaged his spinal cord. Because of Kyle's faith, determination, and positive attitude, he became an inspiration to his teammates and coaches during the 1979 Peach Bowl championship season and the undefeated 1980 Southwest Conference championship campaign.

At the end of the 1979 season, his teammates dedicated the Bears' game against Clemson to their fallen teammate and head coach Grant Teaff's team responded with a 24-18 victory over the heavily favored Tigers in the Peach Bowl.

EPPERSON TABBED PRESEASON ALL-AMERICAN

Junior punter **Derek Epperson**, who inherited Baylor's punting chores from three-time All-American and two-time Ray Guy Award winner **Daniel Sepulveda**, is a consensus preseason All-Big 12 selection and has been tabbed a preseason All-American (first-team by *Lindy's* and *Yahoo! Sports/Rivals.com*, second-team by *Sporting News/Walter Camp*).

TAYLOR PRESEASON BIG 12 NEWCOMER OF YEAR / MIDSEASON ALL-AMERICA

Junior DT **Phil Taylor**, who sat out the 2008 season at Baylor after transferring from Penn State, was named the Big 12 Preseason Newcomer of the Year by a vote of the league's media. The 6-4, 355-pound Taylor was named a midseason All-American by *Phil Steele* and was projected an All-Big 12 performer by preseason publications (second-team by *Phil Steele*, third-team by *Athlon*).

WALTON ANCHORS LINE AS RIMINGTON, OUTLAND, LOMBARDI CANDIDATE

Senior center **J.D. Walton**, an All-Big 12 honorable mention pick in 2008 (*Associated Press*) and preseason All-Big 12 selection in 2009 (third-team *Athlon*, fourth-team *Phil Steele*), is an All-America, Rimington Award, Outland Trophy and Lombardi Award candidate. Walton has started all 33 games of his career since transferring from Arizona State in 2006. He anchored BU's 2008 offensive line that generated 2,349 rushing yards, the most at Baylor since 1981, as well as 29 rushing TDs.

KEEPING UP WITH THE JONESES

Baylor's 2009 roster features five student-athletes with the last name Jones, including two starters **Antonio Jones** (linebacker) and **John Jones** (offensive guard). Also on that list are PK **Aaron Jones**, IR **Darius Jones** and LB **Jenner Jones**.

POSITION CHANGES

A total of 10 Bears have switched positions since 2008, including eight that switched sides of the ball. During preseason camp, senior **Mikail Baker** moved from receiver to defensive back, sophomore **Matt Singletary** moved from receiver to defensive end and sophomore **Courtney Green** switched from the offensive to defensive line.

During the spring seven players were moved, including three offensive players to the defensive backfield: running back **Jeremy Sanders** (senior) and receiver **T.J. Scranton** (senior) moved to safety and receiver **Romie Blaylock** (sophomore) moved to cornerback. **Krys Buerck** (junior) moved back to receiver after playing last season at cornerback. **Sam Sledge** (senior) moved from defensive tackle to big slot (fullback). **Jason Lamb** moved from defensive end to defensive tackle and fellow senior **Ernest Smith** moved from wide receiver to the inside receiver position.

RETURNING AWARD-WINNERS

Baylor returns eight players who received on-field honors in 2008. The Bears return one All-American, five All-Big 12 honorees and two freshman All-Americans.

The returning award-winners are headlined by senior linebacker **Joe Pawelek**, a 2008 third-team All-America pick by *Phil Steele* and a three-year All-Big 12 selection (consensus first-teamer in 2008).

Additional 2008 All-Big 12 returners include first-teamer **Jordan Lake** (senior safety), second-teamer **Derek Epperson** (junior punter) and honorable mention selections **James Barnard** (senior offensive guard) and **J.D. Walton** (senior center).

Freshmen standouts from 2008 back as sophomores are **Robert Griffin** (quarterback, first-team) and **Kendall Wright** (wide receiver, third-team), each freshman All-Americans last season and Griffin was named the Big 12 Freshman of the Year by multiple outlets.

Running back **Jay Finley** (junior) was named second-team All-Texas by *Dave Campbell's Texas Football*.

Baylor's defense forced Wake Forest into three incomplete passes and a sack on the game's final series, sealing a 24-21 victory in each team's season opener. It was Baylor's first road victory in a non-conference game against a BCS opponent since a 14-0 victory at North Carolina State in 1995.

The Bears also earned their first victory in a season opener since a 28-23 victory at SMU in 2005. It was Baylor's first victory in a season opener against a current BCS program since defeating Ole Miss in 1975.

Leading 10-7 at halftime, Baylor took control of the game with a pair of third-quarter touchdowns. The first came on a 37-yard **Kendall Wright** scamper off a backward screen pass from **Robert Griffin III** with 13:12 remaining in the quarter. Later in the period, Griffin threw a backward screen pass to **Ernest Smith**, who then connected with **Lanear Sampson** for a 33-yard touchdown pass.

Wake Forest did not go quietly, though. With just 10 seconds remaining in the third, Riley Skinner hit Devon Brown on a 19-yard touchdown pass. The Deacons cut the Bears' lead to three points with 3:57 remaining in the game when Skinner found Andrew Parker in the back of the end zone for a 5-yard touchdown pass.

That was as close as the Deacons would get, though. The Bears expired nearly three minutes of game clock on their next possession before **Derek Epperson's** punt pinned Wake Forest at its own 12. Skinner, who was under intense pressure from Baylor linemen and linebackers, was unsuccessful on four consecutive pass attempts, including an **Antonio Jones** sack on third down.

Baylor out-gained Wake Forest 366 to 269 and won the turnover battle 4-to-1. Three Bears snagged interceptions, including **Joe Pawelek**; it was Pawelek's ninth career pick and fifth in his last five games. **Mikail Baker**, who moved from receiver to defensive back in the off-season, also had an interception. Pawelek added seven tackles, including one of Baylor's three sacks.

The Bears took the game's opening kickoff and drove 80 yards on eight plays, a drive that culminated in an 8-yard touchdown pass from Griffin to **David Gettis**. Ben Parks' 22-yard field goal in the waning moments of the first quarter staked the Bears to a 10-0 lead. Wake Forest answered at the 6:45 mark in the second quarter as Mike Rinfrette scored on a 2-yard run.

NOTES

- Baylor leads the all-time series 5-1. This was the programs' first-ever meeting at Winston-Salem.
- Baylor improved to 67-36-5 all-time in season openers, including a 13-23-1 mark when opening on the road. It was just Baylor's second victory in a season opener since 2002.
- Baylor snapped a 14-game losing streak when allowing the opponent to rush for at least 100 yards.
- Baylor eclipsed 100 yards rushing for the fifth consecutive game.

Three costly turnovers and a stagnant offensive performance led to a 30-22 loss to Connecticut for the Bears in their home opener.

After blocking a Connecticut field goal attempt on the final play of the first half, Baylor trailed 13-7 to start the second half.

However, **Mikail Baker** fumbled the opening kickoff of the second half; Connecticut recovered and scored four plays later. The fumble bug bit the Bears again on their next offensive play as **Jarred Salubi** fumbled and the Huskies recovered. Six plays later, Andre Dixon scored on a 1-yard run to push UConn's lead to 27-7; it was his third rushing touchdown of the day.

That 20-point deficit was too much for the Bears to overcome. **Robert Griffin** scored on a 5-yard run midway through the third quarter, and Connecticut added a 34-yard Dave Teggart field goal on its next possession.

Baylor pulled within striking distance late in the fourth quarter when Griffin scored on a 1-yard run and then connected with **Justin Akers** on a jump-pass two-point conversion to cut the deficit to 30-22. However, Connecticut recovered the Bears' onside kick and gained two first downs to run out the clock.

Connecticut out-gained Baylor 382-266 on the day, including a 235-147 edge on the ground. The Bears, who managed only 11 first downs on the day, had just 88 yards of offense at the 10:49 mark in the third quarter. Most of that came on **Jay Finley's** 72-yard touchdown run midway through the first quarter that gave the Bears a 7-3 lead, their only lead of the day.

Teggart opened the scoring with a 39-yard field goal, capping an 11-play, 55-yard drive for the Huskies on the game's opening possession. Three plays later, Finley produced the longest run of his career to date on a third-and-four scamper up the middle.

Connecticut recaptured the lead on the first play of the second quarter when Dixon scored on a 1-yard run. Teggart pushed the Huskies' lead to 13-7 with a 30-yard field goal midway through the second quarter.

Dixon finished with 149 yards rushing, the highest total by a Baylor opponent since Connecticut's Donald Brown rushed for 150 yards against the Bears one year earlier. Jordan Todman added 103 yards rushing.

Finley had a career day with 121 yards on eight carries; he also had one reception for six yards and accounted for 47.7 percent of the Bears' offense.

Joe Pawelek tallied 21 tackles, a career high and the most by a Baylor linebacker since **Mike Singletary**.

Baylor's highest-scoring game in 67 years ended up being a costly victory. The Bears trounced Northwestern State 68-13 but lost quarterback **Robert Griffin III** and S/KR **Mikail Baker** to season-ending knee injuries.

Griffin sustained his injury on the game's opening drive but finished the first half. By the time Baylor had its first offensive possession of the second half, the Bears led 47-10; Griffin did not return to the field.

Baker's injury came on a kickoff return midway through the first half.

Griffin's injury came when he was stopped on a fourth-and-one rush at the Northwestern State 25. The Demons took over possession and marched 75 yards on 15 plays to take the game's first lead on William Griffin's 1-yard touchdown run. That was the last lead of the night for Northwestern State.

Baylor scored twice in the final three minutes, three seconds of the first quarter to take the lead, moving ahead on Griffin's 42-yard pass to **Kendall Wright**. Early in the second quarter, Griffin connected with Wright for another touchdown, this time from 38 yards away.

The Bears added a 76-yard **Jarred Salubi** scoring jaunt, a 9-yard **Terrance Ganaway** touchdown scamper and a 42-yard Gettis-to-**David Gettis** scoring pass to take a 41-10 lead at the half.

Jason Lamb's 25-yard interception return for a touchdown on the opening drive of the second half all but put the game out of reach. The Bears tacked on three more touchdowns in the third quarter. **Blake Szymanski** connected with **Willie Jefferson** for an 18-yard scoring strike, **Chance Casey** returned an interception 66 yards for a touchdown, and Ganaway fou pay-dirt from two yards out for his third touchdown of the night.

Gettis finished the night 13-of-19 passing for 226 yards and three touchdowns. Wright had five of those catches for 105 yards, while Gettis had four receptions for 85 yards. Salubi posted a career high with 131 yards rushing; Wright added 44 yards on four rushes, and Ganaway had 43 yards on seven carries.

Baylor's point total was its largest since a 68-0 victory over Blackland Army Air Force Base in 1942. The Bears marched to the Northwestern State 4 midway through the fourth quarter thanks to strong rushing from walk-on **Caleb McEachern**, who finished the game with 36 yards on seven carries. Third-string quarterback **Nick Florence** then took a knee three consecutive snaps, giving the ball back to Northwestern State.

Third-string quarterback **Nick Florence** rushed for two touchdowns in his first career start and Baylor won its first game without standout **Robert Griffin III**, beating Kent State 31-15.

Florence was 20-of-27 passing for 216 yards and added 60 yards rushing. He gave Baylor the lead for good with a 6-yard touchdown run in the second quarter.

Kendall Wright caught nine passes for 125 yards, and **Jarred Salubi** rushed for 64 yards and a touchdown in support of the freshman Florence.

Griffin was not the only offensive starter in street clothes for Baylor. Starting running back **Jay Finley** missed his second straight game with an ankle injury.

Even with most of its starting backfield missing, the Bears had 374 yards of offense.

Florence capped an 89-yard drive with a 6-yard run that finished by diving into the end zone. This gave the Bears a 14-7 lead with 13:02 left in the first half. The score came three plays after he hit Wright on a screen pass, which the speedy receiver turned into a 44-yard gain.

Salubi's 45-yard touchdown run gave the Bears a 21-7 halftime lead. Then Florence showed off his athletic ability on the opening drive of the second half. He scampered for gains of 14 and 10 before his 29-yard scoring run gave the Bears a 21-point lead.

Jacquise Terry had 109 yards rushing for Kent State, including a 61-yard scoring run on the first play from scrimmage after Florence's touchdown run. The Golden Flashes drove deep into Bears territory three times after that but only scored a safety. Freddy Cortez missed a field goal and Kent State was stopped twice on fourth-down attempts inside the 10, including once on a fake field goal.

Kent State got the scoring started when quarterback Giorgio Morgan fired a lateral to receiver Leneric Muldrow, who connected with a wide open Jameson Konz for a 35-yard touchdown pass. It was the first time this season the Golden Flashes scored on their opening drive.

Baylor came right back, tying the game at 7-7 on the ensuing possession. Florence kept the drive alive by hooking up with **Ernest Smith** for 10 yards on third-and-7, then Salubi broke loose for a 28-yard run down to the Kent State 2. Two plays later, Jerod Monk scored on a 1-yard run.

In his first game back from a three-game hiatus due to a shoulder injury, reigning Heisman Trophy winner Sam Bradford threw for 389 yards and one touchdown as 19th-ranked Oklahoma defeated Baylor 33-7 in the Big 12 opener for both teams.

It marked Baylor's 19th loss in as many meetings against Oklahoma, the most losses by one team without a victory in any series between two BCS programs.

Baylor held Oklahoma scoreless in the first quarter, something the Bears had not done since 2005. But the Sooners found the end zone midway through the second quarter when Chris Brown scored on a fourth-and-goal run from the 1. Brown pushed Oklahoma's lead to 14-0 on the Sooners' next possession, scoring on a 4-yard run. Both drives were extended when the Bears were flagged for roughing the passer on unsuccessful third-and-goal pass attempts from outside the 5-yard line.

Baylor posted its only score of the day on the next possession, driving 59 yards on six plays. **Nick Florence** connected with **Andrew Judy** for a 3-yard touchdown pass with 2:10 remaining in the first half. It was Judy's first career reception.

That was as close as the Bears would get, though. Oklahoma added three Jimmy Stevens field goals in the third quarter and a fourth field goal early in the fourth quarter to stake a 26-7 advantage. The last three field goals were all from 25 yards or less.

Bradford connected Adron Tennell on a three-yard touchdown pass with 4:03 remaining in the game to cap the scoring. Bradford finished the game 27-of-49 with no interceptions.

Florence was 22-of-41 for 220 yards and one interception. It was Baylor's first interception thrown by a quarterback this season, snapping a 137-attempt streak that dated back to the 2008 season finale. The Bears managed only six rushing yards on 17 carries, Baylor's lowest rushing total since the Sooners held the Bears to minus-48 yards in the 2006 season finale.

Oklahoma out-gained Baylor 592-268, gaining 203 yards on 50 rushes. The Sooners ran 99 offensive plays, the most ever against a Baylor team.

DeMarco Murray paced the Sooners' rushing attack with 113 yards on 24 carries. Brown finished with 70 yards on 19 totes. Brandon Caleb was Bradford's favorite receiver, snagging seven passes for 139 yards.

Ernest Smith established career highs with six catches for 71 yards for the Bears, who fell to 0-7 when opening Big 12 play on the road. It was Baylor's 20th consecutive loss when trailing at halftime and its 19th straight loss against ranked opponents.

Iowa State out-rushed Baylor 240-89 en route to a 24-10 victory at Jack Trice Stadium. The Bears suffered their 13th consecutive Big 12 road loss and their 21st straight loss when trailing at halftime.

The Cyclones entered the game as the league's best rushing team statistically. Meanwhile, the Bears entered the game as the league's lowest-rated rushing defense. Those figures held true as Iowa State averaged 5.2 yards per carry and posted the most rushing yards against Baylor since the 2007 season finale.

Four Cyclones tallied at least 40 rushing yards each on the night, led by Alexander Robinson's 83 yards on 19 totes. Quarterbacks Jerome Tiller and Austen Arnaud rushed for 74 and 45 yards, respectively, and each scored a touchdown. Jeremiah Schwartz added 42 yards on eight carries.

Baylor took the game's first lead on **Ben Parks'** 38-yard field goal late in the first quarter. However, the Cyclones scored the game's next 24 points and took control of the game. During that stretch, Iowa State enjoyed a streak of seven consecutive third-down conversions, going 9-of-11 in the first half. At the same time, the Bears failed on their first seven third-down conversion attempts.

Arnaud's 1-yard touchdown run with 13:38 remaining in the second quarter gave Iowa State a lead it would never relinquish. Less than three minutes later, Arnaud connected with Derrick Catlett on a 4-yard touchdown pass that pushed ISU's lead to 14-3 at the break.

After a Grant Mahoney 45-yard field goal with 12:30 remaining in the third, Tiller capped the Cyclones' scoring with a 20-yard touchdown run down the right sideline midway through the third.

Baylor finally found the end zone nine seconds before the end of the game.

Jerod Monk, a reserve tight end and former high school quarterback, lined up under center and connected with **Justin Akers** on a 3-yard jump pass for a touchdown.

Blake Szymanski finished the game 23-of-38 passing for 223 yards and three interceptions in his first start since the 2007 season finale. He connected with **Ernest Smith** and **Kendall Wright** seven times each. Smith finished with 125 yards, the first 100-yard receiving game of his career.

Baylor finished the game 5-of-14 in third-down conversion attempts, while Iowa State was 12-of-18. The Cyclones subsequently dominated time of possession, holding the ball more than 35 minutes, and ran 25 more offensive plays than did the Bears.

Zac Robinson completed 23 of 27 pass attempts for 250 yards and three touchdowns as 14th-ranked Oklahoma State spoiled Baylor's homecoming game 34-7 at Floyd Casey Stadium.

It was Oklahoma State's third consecutive victory in the series and 13th in 14 meetings since the inception of the Big 12 Conference in 1996.

Baylor suffered its third consecutive loss, failing to reach double digits in the scoring department in each game.

Oklahoma State scored the game's first 34 points, starting with a Dan Bailey 24-yard field goal on its first possession. Robinson connected with Wilson Youman on a 22-yard touchdown pass on the Cowboys' next drive.

Robinson found Dameron Fooks on a 16-yard touchdown pass midway through the second quarter, giving OSU a 17-0 halftime lead. Robinson completed his third touchdown pass of the day to Cooper Bassett from 19 yards out midway through the third quarter.

Bailey added a 33-yard field goal on the final play of the third quarter, and Keith Toston scored on a 1-yard touchdown run with 9:39 remaining in the game.

Baylor finally got on the scoreboard on the ensuing drive when Nick Florence connected with David Gettis for a 17-yard touchdown pass.

Oklahoma State dominated Baylor on the ground, churning out as many rushing attempts as the Bears had rushing yards. OSU finished the day with 195 yards on 43 carries, while the Bears managed only 43 yards on 19 totes. Toston paced the attack with 109 yards on 15 carries, and Beau Johnson added 93 yards on 22 tries. Jay Finley was the only Bear to gain more than 10 yards rushing with 31 yards on 10 attempts.

Florence finished 21-of-35 for 235 yards with one interception. Ernest Smith was Florence's favorite target with six catches for 33 yards. Justin Akers added five receptions for 62 yards. Gettis finished with 62 yards on four receptions.

Joe Pawelek turned in the 16th double-digit tackle performance of his career, making 10 stops. Elliott Coffey (eight), Chance Casey (seven), Byron Landor (seven) and Mike Hicks (six) all turned in career highs in the tackles department. Coffey and Landor each had a sack.

A pair of missed scoring opportunities thwarted Baylor's second-half comeback bid as Nebraska held on for a 20-10 victory at Floyd Casey Stadium.

Nebraska led 20-0 at halftime, but the Bears' defense stepped up the second half. Baylor held the Huskers scoreless over the game's final 39-plus minutes and yielded only 103 second-half yards.

Baylor cracked the scoreboard with a 41-yard Ben Parks field goal at the 9:22 mark in the third quarter.

After the teams exchanged punts, Baylor's defense put the Bears back in the game with 3:27 remaining in the third quarter. Clifton Odom intercepted Cody Green's third-and-five pass attempt and returned it 45 yards for a touchdown. It was Odom's first career interception and first career touchdown; it also was Baylor's third interception return for a touchdown this season.

That was as close as the Bears would get, though, despite three trips inside the Nebraska 25 in the game's final seven minutes.

Parks missed a 29 yard field goal with 6:28 to play. On their next drive, the Bears reached the Nebraska 20 before giving the ball over on downs. Nick Florence found Jarred Salubi wide open in the corner of the end zone on third and 10, but Florence's pass went through Salubi's hands and was incomplete.

After holding the Huskers to one first down on the ensuing drive, the Bears put together a 60-yard punt return with a pair of laterals, the last of which was carried 62 yards by Chance Casey to the Nebraska 32. Baylor got a first down to the Huskers' 20 on a pair of passes to David Gettis, but consecutive pass attempts into the end zone were incomplete as the clock expired.

Florence finished 19-of-38 for 222 yards and one interception. Gettis had seven catches for 124 yards, the first 100-yard game of his career. Kendall Wright added four receptions for 49 yards and 15 yards on four rushes.

Nebraska used special teams to score the game's first points. After the Bears' game-opening drive stalled at their own 34, Eric Martin blocked Derek Epperson's punt. Justin Blatchford picked up the ball and returned it 25 yards for a touchdown. Alex Henery pushed the Huskers' lead to 13-0 with a pair of field goals, and Dontrayevous Robinson's 1-yard touchdown run midway through the second quarter gave Nebraska a 20-0 halftime lead.

Freshman **Nick Florence** passed for a school-record 427 yards and three touchdowns and ran for a fourth, helping Baylor defeat Missouri 40-32 on Saturday.

Kendall Wright set career highs with 10 receptions for 149 yards and two touchdowns as the Bears (4-5, 1-4) ended a 13-game Big 12 road losing streak and beat Missouri for the first time in eight tries in conference play. Baylor rallied from an 11-point halftime deficit and held Missouri to 10 yards rushing on 25 carries.

Danario Alexander had a career-high 13 receptions for 214 yards and two scores for Missouri (5-4, 1-4), which has lost three straight at home for the first time since 2004. Alexander's 84-yard reception in the second quarter, the last 65 yards after bouncing off a tackler, was the Tigers' longest play of the season.

Missouri's **Blaine Gabbert** passed for the second highest total in school history, going 30 for 51 for 468 yards and two touchdowns. But he was shut down along with the rest of the Missouri offense in the second half. The Tigers made it to the Baylor 16 in the final minute before running out of downs.

Baylor had been allowing 179.5 yards rushing per game, and the lowest opponent total before Saturday was Wake Forest's 126 yards in the season opener.

Baylor averaged 8.5 points in its first four conference games and went without a first-half touchdown three straight games before embarrassing Missouri behind Florence, who began the year as the third-string quarterback and moved up due to injuries. Florence completed 11 of his first 12 passes and finished 32 for 43, and he broke the school record of 412 passing yards set by **Blake Szymanski** in 2007 against Rice.

Szymanski started one game after **Robert Griffin** was lost for the season with a knee injury in late September, and the senior was the backup Saturday after missing two games with a bruised shoulder.

Baylor had gone 26 games without a 300-yard passing game, let alone a 400-yard game. St. Louis Rams rookie offensive tackle **Jason Smith**, the second overall pick of the draft out of Baylor, took advantage of his team's week off and watched from the sideline.

Baylor scored on its first two drives. The Bears took a 9-7 lead on their first offensive touchdown in 80 minutes and 4 seconds, Florence's 8-yard keeper with 2:13 to go in the first quarter.

Baylor surrendered 40 first-half points to the nation's second-ranked team as the Bears dropped their home finale to the Texas Longhorns, 47-14, at Floyd Casey Stadium.

Colt McCoy tied the NCAA record for career victories by a starting quarterback, throwing two touchdown passes in the victory. McCoy left the game midway through the third quarter with 181 yards on 23 of 34 passing. Texas led 40-0 by halftime with McCoy throwing touchdown passes of three and seven yards to **Jordan Shipley**. **Cody Johnson** ran for 109 yards and two short touchdowns and **Tre' Newton** added a 45-yard scoring run.

Texas opened the scoring with an 80-yard drive on its first possession capped by the first McCoy to Shipley touchdown toss.

Baylor responded with a long drive to the Texas 4-yard line. Baylor freshman quarterback **Nick Florence** threw an interception to **Aaron Williams** in the end zone. A week after setting the school's single-game mark for passing yards, Florence finished with 240 yards passing with three interceptions.

Baylor lost all momentum when Texas stuffed the Bears at midfield on fourth down on the next drive. Given the short field, the Longhorns made it 14-0 with a Johnson rushing TD. Newton soon made it 21-0 with a 45-yard scoring run.

Texas' top-ranked defense forced four turnovers and the Bears actually went backward in the second quarter, losing 20 yards. On Texas' five touchdown drives, three started in Baylor territory.

A fumble by **Terrence Ganaway** at the Baylor 20 bounced all the way back into the end zone to force a safety. A Texas field goal in the final seconds of the half made it 40-0.

Eddie Jones capped the Texas scoring with a 60-yard interception return in the fourth.

Baylor got on the board in the fourth quarter on a 1-yard touchdown run by Ganaway and a 19-yard scoring pass from Florence to **Brad Taylor**.

Florence threw completions to 11 different receivers on the day, including a batted-pass that he caught himself for no gain.

Kendall Wright led all Baylor receivers with seven catches for 57 yards. **David Gettis** added five catches for 40 yards on Senior Day.
