**K-STATE OPENS 2010 SLATE WITH UCLA**

**K-STATE FAMILY REUNION KICKS OFF 2010 CAMPAIGN AS CATS AND BRUINS BATTLE ON NATIONAL TELEVISION**

Kansas State will open its much-anticipated 2010 season on Saturday when UCLA visits the Little Apple and Bill Snyder Family Stadium for the second-annual K-State Family Reunion. The game, which kicks at 2:36 p.m., will be televised nationally by ABC as Carter Blackburn (play-by-play), Brock Huard (analyst) and Mike Bellotti (analyst) will have the call. A live audio broadcast is also available across the K-State Sports Network, online (for free) at www.k-statesports.com and on SIRIUS satellite radio channel 122 and XM channel 143. Wyatt Thompson will call the action with Stan Weber serving as the color analyst and Matt Walters providing sideline updates. Live stats are also available through Gametracker, while Twitter updates and a live in-game blog will all be a part of k-statesports.com's gameday coverage. Less than 1,000 tickets remain for the contest as K-State will look to set a new school record for a home-opening crowd, set last season with 50,750 against UMass for the inaugural K-State Family Reunion.

**A QUICK LOOK AT THE WILDCATS**

K-State fans will get their first look at the Snyder-led Wildcats in 2010 on Saturday. The Wildcats will be led this season by captains Carson Coffman (QB), Tysyn Hartman (DB), Alex Hrebec (LB), Zach Kendall (OL), Collin Klein (QB), and Emmanuel Lamur (DB). The bulk of K-State's experience on offense resides along the line (4-of-5 starters return) and at running back as K-State will open the 2010 season with potentially one of the better run games in the Big 12 behind Doak Walker and Maxwell Award candidate Daniel Thomas. Whomever takes the first snap in 2010 at the quarterback position will have that potent rushing attack and several new but very talented wide receivers with which to work. Though receivers Brodrick Smith, Chris Harper, Tramaine Thompson and Aubrey Quarles were not in the equation a year ago, the group has been very impressive and possesses the speed, strength and go-to ability the Cats will be looking for at the position. Defensively, the Cats will look to build upon one of the nation's most improved units from 2009 as Tysyn Hartman and Emmanuel Lamur, both safeties, lead the charge. Lamur is the team's returning tackle leader (68), while Hartman collected a team-best five interceptions. K-State will look to end Brandon Harold (2008 Freshman All-American) and tackle Prizell Brown for leadership up front, while Alex Hrebec's 10 career starts paces the linebacker corps.

**SEASON NO. 115**

Kansas State will open its 115th season of college football this weekend against UCLA and its 15th season as a member of the Big 12 Conference. The Wildcats enter the 2010 season with an all-time record of 458-604-41 (.434), with 31-percent of those wins coming under the watchful eye of head coach Bill Snyder. The Cats have also sported a 158-84-1 (.652) record since 1990 and have appeared in 13 bowl games.

**SNYDER SUCCESSFUL IN OPENERS**

Head coach Bill Snyder has almost always gotten the most out of his teams from the season-opening kickoff as Snyder-led teams are riding a 17-game winning streak in season openers, and the Wildcats will put that streak on the line when they face UCLA on Saturday.

With the 2005 season-opening victory against Florida International, Kansas State broke the school record for consecutive season-opening wins with 16, while that streak was extended to 17 in 2006.

The Wildcats have not dropped a season opener under Snyder since his inaugural campaign at K-State in 1989, when the Cats lost to Arizona State, 31-0, at Sun Devil Stadium.

Saturday's game vs. UCLA will mark the 14th season debut under Snyder at the stadium that now bears his name. However, it marks the first time since 2003 a Snyder-led team will face a BCS school in the opener when the Cats topped California, 42-28, at Arrowhead Stadium in Kansas City, Mo., and the first at home since the inaugural Big 12 Conference game against Texas Tech in 1996.

**NON-CONFERENCE NOTABLES**

Kansas State has been one of the most dominant teams nationally in terms of non-conference success, having won 12 of its last 18 non-conference games, while the Wildcats have had perfect non-conference ledgers eight times in the last 13 years.

Under Bill Snyder, K-State is 62-14 (.816) overall against non-conference opposition, while the Cats are 12-7 against BCS conference schools, including a 3-0 mark at home. Also, K-State has won 54 of its last 57 non-conference home games.

**A LOOK AT THE OPPONENT**

UCLA enters the 2010 season coming off a 7-6 campaign in 2009, which ended with a 30-21 victory over Temple in the EagleBank Bowl. The Bruins return five players that earned All-Pac 10 honors a year ago, while they bring back 15 starters and 42 total letterwinners. Quarterback Kevin Prince is one of the returning starters for UCLA, which was predicted to finish eighth in the Pac-10 by the media. Prince finished the year 173-for-308 (56.2 percent) for 2,050 yards and eight touchdowns. He will benefit from Jonathan Franklin, who returns in the backfield from a season in which he rushed for 566 yards and five touchdowns. The Bruins must replace their top two defenders from last year in Reggie Carter and Brian Bosworth, but Akeem Ayers is back after collecting 75 tackles and 14.5 TFLs - including six sacks - in 2009.

**HOW'S THIS FOR STARTERS**

**Kansas State will square off against a non-conference BCS school in its season and home opener for the fourth time in school history and the first since 1982 when the Wildcats take on UCLA.** K-State is a perfect 3-0 in those games, which include a 13-3 victory over Texas in 1926, a 14-8 win over Big Ten foe Indiana in 1961, and a 23-9 triumph against Southeastern Conference member Kentucky in 1982. The Wildcats also hold a perfect record in home games against current members of the Pac-10 as they topped Oregon State, 22-16, at home on Sept. 22, 1979, and USC, 27-20, on Sept. 21, 2002.

**SNYDER IN SEPTEMBERS**

Fast home starts have propelled the Wildcats to winning seasons under Bill Snyder. **From 1992-2009 under Snyder, K-State is a combined 44-5 (.898) in games played during the month of September.** Of the five losses, three came on the road, as the Cats are 36-2 in September home games during that stretch. The lone losses occurred against Fresno State on Sept. 11, 2004, and Marshall on Sept. 20, 2003.

**SNYDER AMONG BEST ACTIVE COACHES**

The author of the greatest turnaround in college football history, Bill Snyder is in act two of guiding K-State, and his work ranks among the best in college football when compared to other active coaches.

Snyder, who currently ranks 12th all-time in wins among active FBS coaches, is one of just two active BCS coaches who have served at the same school for at least 18 years and have never held the same position at another school (Joe Paterno of Penn State). Also, Snyder holds the 11th-best winning percentage among active FBS coaches with at least 125 wins.

**What might be even more amazing is that Snyder has tallied the fifth-most victories among active coaches since 1990 despite a three-year hiatus.** Snyder has guided Kansas State to 141 victories since the 1990 season, only to be out-done by the likes of Mack Brown, Frank Beamer, Joe Paterno and Steve Spurrier.

**DEFENDING THE HOME TURF**

Kansas State sported a 5-1 home record in 2009, just one win shy of an undefeated slate for the first time since 1999. **However, the Wildcats have won at least five home games in 14 of Snyder's 18 seasons.** A big part of last season's home success was due to the play of the defense as K-State outscored opponents by an average of 30-15, out-rushed foes 222.5 to 55.5 yards, outgained teams 374 to 266 yards and forced 16 turnovers (nine interceptions and seven fumbles) as opposed to just seven (two interceptions and five fumbles).

**HOME SWEET HOME**

Few teams in college football have taken care of their home field as well as the Wildcats since the start of the 1990 season. Over the past 18 years, K-State is an amazing 106-23-1 (.819) when playing at Bill Snyder Family Stadium, including a 52-18-1 mark (.739) in league games (combined Big 8/Big 12).

**RECORD NUMBERS RETURN FOR A FAMILY REUNION**

When K-State head coach Bill Snyder made his return to the sidelines in 2009, the Wildcat family flocked through the gates of Bill Snyder Family Stadium in record numbers. In fact, the announced crowd of 50,750 for the 2009 opener against UMass was the largest crowd in school history for a home opener. Following the second game of the 2009 season, the Wildcats' two-game attendance figure of 98,844 ranked as the second-most in school history for the first two home games of a season. K-State officials are expecting another tremendous crowd on Saturday for the UCLA game, one that could very well surpass last season's opening day record crowd.

**AYE, CAPTAIN**

Following the 2010 spring game, head coach Bill Snyder named four captains for the 2010 season as senior quarterback Carson Coffman and junior linebacker Alex Hrebec were named captains for the second straight season. Junior defensive backs Tysyn Hartman and Emmanuel Lamur, along with senior offensive lineman Zach Kendall and sophomore quarterback Collin Klein were each named captains for the first time in their careers.

**PASADENA, Calif.** - Kevin Craft made the most of a second opportunity Saturday night, passing for 186 yards and a touchdown to lead unbeaten UCLA to a 23-9 victory over Kansas State at the Rose Bowl.

Craft, completed 13 of 24 passes with one interception including a game-clinching 51-yard scoring pass to Terrence Austin with 6:18 remaining.

Carson Coffman completed 20 of 34 passes for 193 yards with two interceptions and was sacked six times for the Wildcats (1-2). Daniel Thomas, who became the first player to begin his Kansas State career with consecutive 100-yard rushing performances since Cornelius Davis accomplished the feat in 1966, was held to 54 yards on 15 carries.

After being held to one field goal in the first half, Kansas State moved 80 yards on 14 plays on their first possession of the third quarter, scoring on a 7-yard run by Thomas to trim UCLA's lead to 13-9. The conversion failed after a botched snap. Thomas carried eight times for 43 yards on the drive, which consumed nearly eight minutes.

Ryan Doerr pinned the Bruins deep in their territory with a 53-yard punt to the 4 yard line late in the third quarter, and after forcing a punt, the Wildcats got the ball back at the UCLA 41. But Josh Cherry missed a 40-yard field goal in the opening minute of the final period.

Craft's 18-yard touchdown pass to Ryan Moya on UCLA's second possession was nullified by an illegal man downfield, forcing the Bruins to settle for a 39-yard field goal by Forbath on the second play of the second quarter. Forbath added a 35-yarder later in the second quarter to make it 13-3, and that's how it stood at halftime. The Bruins had another potential scoring chance in the second period, but Joshua Moore picked off Craft's long pass at the Kansas State 19-yard line.

**WHAT A DIFFERENCE A YEAR MAKES**

K-State put an emphasis on defensive improvement in 2009 and the Wildcats' efforts made them one of the most improved units in all of college football. After averaging nearly 218 yards rushing allowed and 261 yards passing in 2008, K-State held its opponents to 339.9 total yards a game, 234.5 through the air and 105.4 on the ground. **The numbers compared to 2008 are impressive as the Cats surrendered nearly 140 less total yards a game, including 112 less rushing yards a game.** K-State was also better about limiting long plays as it gave up 13 less plays of 20 or more yards.

**GETTING DEFENSIVE**

K-State's defense was masterful in 2009 in terms of holding its opponent and getting its offense back on the field. The Cats forced their opponents into 34 three-and-outs, including five against Texas A&M and four each against Louisiana, Tennessee Tech, Iowa State and Colorado, but what is more impressive is that K-State held opponents to six plays or less (without scoring) on 85 drives. Also, the Wildcats allowed 38 plays of 20 or more yards last season after surrendering a whopping 75 in 2008.

**FORCING THE ISSUE**

K-State saw its national ranking in turnover margin improve from 61st to 19th over the second half of the 2009 season. After collecting just 11 total takeaways in its first six games, K-State forced 15 turnovers in its last six games. On the season, the Cats collected 25 takeaways and surrendered 18 (+7).

**GROUND GAINS ON DEFENSE**

K-State's rush defense yielded just 105.4 yards on the ground last season and held both Texas A&M (-13 yards) and Tennessee Tech (-19) to negative rushing yards, the fewest surrendered since the 2002 Baylor game (-37). Also, the two negative rushing performances were the fifth (-19) and ninth (-13) lowest totals allowed in a game last season in the nation. In K-State's three conference home games, the Wildcats yielded just 60.5 yards a game on the ground.

**CONTINUITY ALONG THE FRONT**

One of the biggest strengths for Kansas State heading into the 2010 season is the offensive line as four of the five regular starters from a season ago are back in Clyde Aufner, Kenneth Mayfield, Wade Weibert and Zach Kendall. **The four linemen, who have combined for 51 starts, helped the Wildcats grind out 179.9 rushing yards per game and helped Big 12 Offensive Newcomer of the Year Daniel Thomas lead the conference with 1,265 rushing yards. This season marks the third time since 1997 that four starting offensive linemen from the previous season return** (also happened in 2007). But this year could mark the first time since 1997 that the four linemen also started at least seven games the next season.

**MULTIPLE OPTIONS AT RECEIVER**

Kansas State's receiving corps return just four catches for 29 yards from 2009, but the position could be a team strength during the 2010 campaign. **K-State welcomes two players that sat out last season due to transfer rules in Chris Harper and Brodrick Smith. The two players, who are both sophomores, saw extensive action as true freshmen at other BCS schools in 2008 as Harper caught nine passes for 122 yards and two touchdowns at Oregon, while Smith (Minnesota) caught five passes for 50 yards and one score.**

Aubrey Quarles, who caught 34 passes for 407 yards and one score in 2008, returns after redshirting in 2009, while redshirt freshman Tramae Thompson will also see significant playing time. Thompson will serve as the punt returner and could become the first freshman at the position since David Allen in 1997.

**WELCOME HOME**

Kansas State has become a haven for transfers returning to the state of Kansas after spending time at other FBS institutions. **K-State boasts five Division I transfer players on its roster - all originally from the state of Kansas** - including wide receivers Chris Harper (Wichita; Oregon) and Brodrick Smith (Garden City; Minnesota), who will play this season after sitting out the 2009 campaign. New to the squad this season are brothers Arthur (Miami; linebacker) and Bryce (Tennessee; running back) Brown from Wichita, as well as offensive lineman Nick Puetz (Salina; Wyoming) after all three enrolled at K-State in time for the fall semester. Brown was rated the nation's top recruit two season's ago by numerous recruiting services.

**CATS OWN NATION'S 10TH-LONGEST SCORING STREAK**

Kansas State extended one of the nation's longest scoring streaks last season as the Wildcats have now tallied points in 164 consecutive games. The 164-game stretch is the 10th-longest streak in the nation. The Wildcats have not been kept off the scoreboard since Colorado shutout K-State, 12-0, on Nov. 16, 1996. In the Big 12, only Nebraska (176 games) owns a longer streak than the Cats.

**ON THE TUBE**

Saturday's opener against UCLA will be the Wildcats' 122nd television appearance all-time as K-State is 61-60 (.504) when playing on TV. **The contest also represents the first televised non-conference game that will serve as both the season and home opener in school history.** The only other televised season/home opener in school history was the inaugural Big 12 game against Texas Tech on August 31, 1996.

**K-STATE PROMINENT IN NATIONAL TV HISTORY**

Kansas State's homecoming contest on October 28, 1939, against Nebraska became the second college football game ever televised, following the Fordham-Waynesburg contest in New York earlier that fall. The Cornhuskers spoiled homecoming with a 25-9 triumph in Manhattan before a limited Nebraska ETV audience in the surrounding area. **Also, the Cats were part of the first live game televised on ESPN when they took on Wisconsin in the 1982 Independence Bowl.**

**VERY SPECIAL TEAMS**

The rise of K-State football over the last two decades has much to do with the emphasis on special teams. Since 1990, Kansas State is 42-14 when scoring on special teams and 16-1 when scoring on special teams and on defense.

And, in non-offensive touchdowns, the Cats have ranked among the nation's best over the past 10-plus seasons. Since 1999, the Wildcats rank third nationally in non-offensive touchdowns with 73, behind only Virginia Tech (76) and Texas (74). K-State had five non-offensive touchdowns in 2009 - four kickoff returns and one interception return.

**BLOCK PARTY**

Kansas State's play on special teams has been unparalleled as the Cats have the fifth-most blocks in the nation since 2002 with 36, which includes a school-record-tying nine total blocks in 2008 (four punts, two extra points and three field goals) and three (one punt, one field goal and one PAT) in 2009, two of which came from safety Emmanuel Lamur.

Also, Kansas State has amassed 52 total blocked kicks since 1996 and currently ranks second among Big 12 schools, behind Texas, in total blocks in the 14-year history of the league.

**GRADUATING EARLY**

Kansas State has been the Big 12 leader in all-sports graduation rate by student-athletes each of the last three years. The same holds true specifically for football as the program led the conference in graduation rates each of the last three years.

So it should come as no surprise that the Wildcats are one of the national leaders when it comes to players who have completed their degree or are on track to finish this semester. K-State is fourth nationally with active graduates on its roster with eight. That number is also the most in the Big 12 and will grow to as many as 13 following the fall semester.

**MR. EVERYTHING**

Running back Daniel Thomas returns for his senior season after earning Big 12 Newcomer of the Year honors as he led the league in rushing with 1,265 yards and 11 rushing touchdowns. But, Thomas brings a lot more to the table than just his rushing ability. Thomas is also the team's leading returner in receiving yards (257), scoring (66 points) and kickoff return yardage (25).

Thomas is frequently featured in the Wildcat formation as he was also 3-for-4 passing for 50 yards and one touchdown. **Throughout the 2009 season, Thomas registered 276 total touches out of 802 offensive plays, which equated to 34.4-percent of the total offense.** For his efforts, Thomas has been named to the Hornung Award watch list, which recognizes the most versatile player in major college football.

**IRONMAN**

Daniel Thomas rushed 247 times in 2009, which were the second-most attempts in a single season in school history. Not only was Thomas able to take on a heavy work load, he was also able to do so without many setbacks as he only lost 25 yards the entire season. In Big 12 play, Thomas lost three yards against Missouri and just one yard against four teams. He was not brought down behind the line against Texas A&M, Kansas or Nebraska.

**AND THE AWARD GOES TO...**

Running back Daniel Thomas picked up six different preseason honors prior to the 2010 season after leading the league in rushing in 2009. **The Hilliard, Fla., product is on the watch list for two prestigious postseason awards in the Doak Walker Award, which is presented to the nation's top running back, and the Maxwell Award, which is presented to the nation's most outstanding player.**

In addition to those watch lists, Thomas is a candidate for the Hornung Award, was named a presason All-American, All-Big 12 pick, and he was named the 16th best player in the nation by NationalChamps.net.

**SCORING MACHINE**

Running back Daniel Thomas moved into elite status in 2009 against Texas A&M as he was a vital part of the Wildcats' rout of the Aggies. Thomas, who entered the game with four rushing touchdowns, scored four touchdowns on the ground - all in the first half. His four rushing touchdowns tied for second in school history as he became the sixth player (seventh occurrence) to register four or more rushing scores in a single game.

**Thomas led the Wildcats in scoring with 66 points on his 11 rushing touchdowns, which were the the third most in the Big 12 last season.** His 11 rushing scores were also the most by a Wildcat running back since James Johnson had 12 in 2007.

**TOUGH UP FRONT**

Daniel Thomas wasn't the only player earning preseason recognition as center Wade Weibert was named to the watch list for the Rimington Trophy, which honors the nation's top center. Weibert started all 12 games last season, including 11 at center, and helped K-State average 179.9 rushing yards per game.

**WHO WILL IT BE?**

Kansas State has been habitual about competition at quarterback entering the season under Bill Snyder. No matter who takes the first snap under center this Saturday against UCLA, it will be significant to the past quarterback history at K-State.

If Carson Coffman gets the nod, it will mark the second-straight time that the same quarterback has started back-to-back seasons after Josh Freeman took the opening snaps of the 2007 and 2008 campaigns. However, if Collin Klein or Sammuell Lamur starts, it will be the 14th time in the past 19 years that a quarterback that did not start the previous season takes the first snap of the next year.

**LAMUR LAYING IT ON**

Emmanuel Lamur, twin brother of quarterback Sammuell Lamur, was vital to the Wildcats' resurgence on defense last season as he topped the team with 68 tackles. He was aggressive from his safety spot all year long as he had at least five tackles in 11 of the 12 games, including a career-high 10 stops against Missouri and seven tackles against both Iowa State and Nebraska.

Lamur he can be haradous to opponents in other facets of the game as well as he picked off two passes against Colorado and blocked a potential game-tying extra point against Iowa State with 32 seconds left in the game, preserving a 24-23 victory.

**PICK ME**

Backup quarterback turned starting safety Tysyn Hartman did not have an interception or a pass break up in 2008, but made up for it in 2009. Hartman intercepted five passes - the most by a Wildcat in a season since Jame McGill had six in 2003 - as he tied for second in the Big 12 and 19th nationally in that department. He also had a total of 11 passes defended to rank 10th in the conference and 48th in the NCAA in that department.

Hartman, who earned honorable mention All-Big 12 accolades from the league coaches a year ago, was voted a team captain as he enters his second full season as a defensive back. He is also an Academic All-American candidate after garnering Academic All-Big 12 and All-District honors last season.

**TALE OF TWO SEASONS**

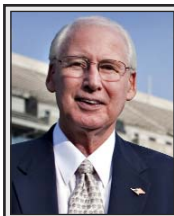
Junior Josh Cherry began the 2009 season just 1-of-6 on field goals during the non-conference portion of the season, including missing his first three attempts of the year. However, Cherry lit up the scoreboard during Big 12 play. Cherry was true on 12 of 15 field goals against conference foes, including a streak of seven-straight makes.

The Nebraska product hit two field goals against both Texas A&M and Colorado and connected on a career-long 47-yarder against Kansas before missing from 39 yards. But Cherry was able to come back and go 4-for-4 against Missouri, including another 47-yarder. His four field goals were the most since Brooks Rossman also had four against Colorado on October 13, 2007, and tied for second in school history.

**ADAMS ON TARGET**

The most unsung hero on K-State's roster, and perhaps the Big 12, is long snapper Corey Adams. Adams has been perfect on a combined 356 snaps in his three year career and has appeared in all 36 games in the past three seasons. Last year, he was on target on all 55 field goal/PAT attempts, as well as a total of 55 punt snaps.

The Monument, Colo., product has also excelled off the field as he was named to the preseason candidate list for the Senior CLASS Award. The award recognizes NCAA Division I seniors that have obtained notable achievements in four areas of excellence - community, classroom, character and competition. Adams was the lone long snapper on the list.



**HEAD COACH**

**BILL SNYDER**

**19th season at  
Kansas State**

The 2009 season saw one of the greatest legends in college football return to the sidelines in hopes of revitalizing a program that he once built, piece by piece, into a national force.

The architect of the "greatest turnaround in the history of college football" Bill Snyder returned to lead the Kansas State football program in 2009 after 17 ultra-successful seasons as the head coach from 1989-2005. And in his first season back, Snyder led the Wildcats to a 6-6 record and a second place finish in the Big 12 North. In fact, K-State was just one win away from advancing to the Big 12 Championship game as the Wildcats played at Nebraska in the season finale with a championship game berth on the line. Not bad for a program that was picked by most preseason publications to finish fifth or even sixth in the 2009 Big 12 North race.

K-State claimed more First Team All-Big 12 selections on offense than any other school with four last season. Big 12 Newcomer of the Year Daniel Thomas led the league in rushing in his first year at the position, while Nick Stringer, Jeron Mastrud and Brandon Banks also garnered first team accolades.

Named the 32nd head football coach at Kansas State on Nov. 30, 1988, and again as the 34th on Nov. 24 2008, Snyder has amassed a 142-74-1 (.657) record during his tenure with the Wildcats, including a 79-57-1 (.580) mark in Big 8/12 games. His 142 victories are the 12th-most among active FBS coaches and are more than triple the man in second place on K-State's all-time coaching victories list (Mike Ahearn, 39 wins).

But to fully understand the turnaround ushered in by Snyder at Kansas State one must only consider that the Wildcats were in the midst of an 0-26-1 run when he was hired. It also took K-State 51 seasons (1938-1988) to total just 130 wins, while the 12 head coaches prior to Snyder's arrival in Manhattan combined to win just 116 games from 1945-1988.

Snyder led Kansas State to 11 straight bowl berths between the 1993 and 2003 seasons, making K-State one of only seven programs in the nation to appear in the postseason every year during that stretch. During that span, Snyder's Wildcats won

nearly 80 percent of their games, chalking up 109 victories - a staggering average of nearly 10 wins per season - and making Kansas State the nation's second-winningest program over that period.

And Snyder continued to break new ground with the Wildcats. Kansas State's 35-7 victory over top-ranked Oklahoma in the 2003 Big 12 Championship game lifted K-State to its first conference championship since Pappy Waldorf's 1934 squad and secured the school's first BCS bowl berth in the Tostitos Fiesta Bowl.

With an 11-4 record in 2003, K-State was the only team in the country to win 11 games in six of the previous seven years and just the second program in the history of college football to win 11 games six times in a seven-year stretch.

Snyder's unprecedented success in 17 years at Kansas State did not go unnoticed. He was named the National Coach of the Year on three occasions (1991, 1994 and 1998). He has been a finalist for the prestigious Bear Bryant/FWAA National Coach of the Year Award in 1993 and 1995 before winning in 1998; a finalist for the Football News National Coach of the Year Award in 1995 and 1998; and a finalist for the Kodak/AFCA National Coach of the Year Award in 1993 and 1998.

During his three-year hiatus, Snyder remained involved with the university and is currently a member of the Missouri and Kansas Halls of Fame, the K-State and Austin College Athletics Halls of Fame while also being inducted into the Holiday Bowl Hall of Fame. The long-time mentor also remained active in the community as he currently is the Chairman of the Kansas Mentors Council and the Kansas Leadership Council, a member of the Board of Directors for Kansas Leadership Center, the Board of Trustees for the Kansas Sports Hall of Fame, the KSU Leadership Studies Advancement Council, the Terry C. Johnson Cancer Research Center Advisory Council, the Manhattan Community Foundation Board of Trustees, the KSU Foundation Board of Trustees and is the Honorary Co-Chairman of the Kansas Masonic Partnership for Life.

Snyder, 70, received his B.A. from William Jewell in 1963. He earned his M.A. from Eastern New Mexico in 1965. As a player, he was a three-year letterwinner as a defensive back at William Jewell. Snyder and his wife, Sharon, have two sons (Sean and Ross) and three daughters (Shannon, Meredith and Whitney). They also have eight grandchildren, Sydney, Katherine, Tate, Matthew, Alexis, Gavin, Kadin and Tylin, and one great-grandson, D.J.
