ACC teams are 27-2 (.931) in early-season non-conference play ... five ACC teams - North Carolina (6), Duke (9), Georgia Tech (21), Clemson (23) and Maryland (25) - ranked in this week's AP poll ... four ACC teams - North Carolina (4), Duke (8), Georgia Tech (19) and Clemson (23) - are listed in the USA Today/ESPN Coaches' poll ... Wake Forest's Al-Farouq Aminu named ACC Player of the Week ... Miami's Durand Scott earns ACC Rookie of the Week recognition ... Duke's Kyle Singler has scored 10 or more points in a league-best 18 consecutive games ... Paul Hewitt has 155 career wins in 10 seasons with the Yellow Jackets and is one win shy of tying Clemson's Bill Foster (1976-1984) for 18th place on the ACC's coaches' career victories list ... AROUND THE ACC

Boston College

Senior forward Tyler Roche is averaging 24.5 points after two games, exactly 21 points above his career average entering the season ... Roche shot 5-for-6 from 3-point range in Tuesday's win over St. Francis, raising his two-game season total to 9-for-11 (.818) ... Roche played a career-high 39 minutes ... BC outscored St. Francis by the same 36-22 margin in each half of a 72-44 win ... Reggie Jackson registered eight rebounds and seven assists to go with 17 points ... Jackson's 17 points were a career high, as were Josh Southern's 13 ... Roche scored a career-high 30 in the opener vs. Dartmouth.



Georgia Tech

The 21st-ranked Yellow Jackets are currently competing in the Puerto Rico Tipoff, Georgia Tech's 10th regular-season tournament off the mainland of the United States, and the third in the last four years ... Tech played in the Maui Invitational in 2006 and the Paradise Jam in 2007 (third place) ... Tech's 100 points against Florida A&M in the season opener marked the Yellow Jackets' first game in triple digits in a regulation game since Nov. 16, 2006 (a 103-74 win over Georgia State) ... the Yellow Jackets scored 112 later that year against Wake Forest in the ACC Tournament, but that game went into overtime.



NC State

Javier Gonzalez has connected on a 3-point shot in nine straight games, third-longest current streak in the ACC behind Duke's Kyle Singler (18) and Duke's Jonathan Scheyer (15) ... Saturday's game against Austin Peay will mark head coach Sidney Lowe's 100th game on the sidelines for the Pack ... heading into tonight's game vs. Akron in the Glenn Wilkes Classic, Lowe has a career 52-46 record at NC State ... the Wolfpack won its 16th straight season opener when it defeated visiting Georgia State on Nov. 12 ... the Wolfpack has posted a record of 14-2 in November games in Lowe's four seasons.



Clemson

The 22nd-ranked Tigers are currently riding a school record 10-game non-conference winning streak in road games ... the streak dates to Nov. 12, 2006, when Clemson pulled out a 74-70 victory at Old Dominion ... Clemson's 10-game streak is tied for longest in the ACC with North Carolina ... senior forward David Potter is coming off a career-high 17-point game against Liberty ... Potter hit 5-of-6 3-point goals and 6-of-7 shots overall ... Trevor Booker had his first double-double of the season (12 points and 10 rebounds) at Liberty ... Booker's 22 career double-doubles lead all active ACC players.



Maryland

The 42 points allowed by the 25th-ranked Terps in Tuesday's win over Fairfield were the fewest allowed since Jan. 6, 2004, when they defeated Maryland-Eastern Shore, 87-38 ... after allowing only 51 points in the opener to Charleston Southern, the Terps are giving up 46.5 per game in the early-going, with opponents hitting 29 percent from the floor in two games ... senior guard Eric Hayes has scored in double figures in seven straight games, dating to last season ... Sean Mosley, Landon Milbourne and Hayes have each scored in double figures in each of the Terps' first two games of this season.



Virginia

The Cavaliers' Tony Bennett became the eighth (of 11) Virginia head coach to post a win in his debut when the Cavaliers defeated Longwood in their season opener Nov. 13 ... each of the Cavaliers' last five coaches won his debut game ... junior forward Mike Scott's 11 career double-doubles rank 21st in school history ... Scott just missed his 12th when he scored 17 points and pulled down nine rebounds in Thursday's win over Fairfield ... Saturday's home game against Oral Roberts will mark the first meeting between the two programs ... Virginia has won its last 18 games against a first-time opponent, dating back to a loss to Gonzaga in the 2001 NCAA Tournament.



Duke

Junior Nolan Smith made his season debut Tuesday night vs. Charlotte after sitting out the first game due to a suspension for playing in a non-sanctioned summer league game ... Smith scored a career-high 24 points, giving him 24 career games with 10 or more points ... ninth-ranked Duke extended its NCAA-leading home win streak against non-conference opponents to 71 games ... the streak is the second-longest streak in school history (95 from Feb. 2, 1983 to Nov. 29, 1995) ... sophomore Miles Plumlee recorded his first career double-double vs. Charlotte, setting career highs for both points (15) and rebounds (11).



Miami

Senior Dwayne Collins -- who converted a school-record 8-of-8 field goals in Thursday's win over Tulane en route to a season-high 22 points -- needs just 59 points to become the 30th Hurricane with 1,000 career points... Collins posted his 15th career double-double (22 pts, 14 reb) versus the Green Wave, which ranks third-most among active ACC players and sixth-best in Miami history ... After knocking down a career-high five 3-pointers versus Nova Southeastern on Monday, senior James Dews needs just one 3-pointer to enter UM's top 10 in career treys... Friday's game versus UNCW is UM's fourth in seven days.



Virginia Tech

Virginia Tech junior guard Malcolm Delaney enters Monday's game at Campbell with 989 career points ... Delaney is poised to become the 40th player in school history to reach 1,000 points ... Delaney would become the first Virginia Tech junior to reach that level since A.D. Vassallo did so in the 2007-08 season ... fellow junior Jeff Allen has 870 career points following Tuesday night's double-double (14 points 10 rebounds) vs. UNC Greensboro ... Virginia Tech is 68-28 all-time in games played in the month of November, a .708 winning percentage ... November is the best winning percentage of any month for the Hokies.



Florida State

The Seminoles (2-0) limited Stetson to 10 first-half points in Tuesday night's 80-38 win ... Stetson's 10 first-half points tied the Tucker Center record for the fewest points FSU has allowed in a half ... the Hatters' 38 total points broke the Tucker Center record and were the fewest FSU has allowed in a game since March 2, 1979 ... Florida State blocked 10 shots in the game while forcing 17 turnovers and forcing the Hatters to shoot 27.5 from the floor ... FSU's Xavier Gibson leads the ACC in blocked shots thus far with eight in two games ... Ryan Reid's 11 offensive rebounds in two games are tops among ACC players.



North Carolina

The sixth-ranked Tar Heels have shot 50 percent or better from the floor in five of eight halves this season (missing just the second half against NC Central with a 48.1 percent clip and both halves against Ohio State on Thursday night) ... senior Marcus Ginyard hit three 3-pointers in a game for the first time in his career in the 77-73 win over Ohio State ... Friday's game between the Tar Heels and Syracuse in the Coaches vs Cancer title game in New York will mark their first meeting since Nov. 21, 1987 ... North Carolina has been ranked in the Top 10 of the Associated Press poll for 61 consecutive weeks.



Wake Forest

Wake Forest has not lost at home to a non-conference in-state opponent since the 1985-86 season, when Charlotte posted a 62-61 victory at the old Memorial Coliseum ... the Deacons have won 48 straight home games against non-conference in-state opponents, which includes a perfect 41-0 record at the Joel Coliseum ... after being named ACC Player of the Week following his 24-point and 11-rebound average over the first two games, Al-Farouq Aminu notched his 12th career double-double Wednesday night vs. High Point ... Aminu scored a team-high 22 points on 8-of-10 shooting to go with 10 rebounds.
