After finishing with a .500 conference record away from Waco, Baylor (7-3, 4-2) will vie for its first 5-0 home start since 1985 when the Bears host No. 23/25 Texas A&M (6-3, 3-2) at Floyd Casey Stadium. Saturday's 107th "Battle of the Brazos" will kick off at 6 p.m. CST and will be televised live nationally on FSN. BU and Texas A&M are bowl-eligible at the time of their series meeting for the first time since 1995.

Sophomore QB **Robert Griffin III**, who set the Baylor single-season passing record last week at Oklahoma State, is 141 passing yards shy of becoming the first Baylor QB to throw for 3,000 yards in a single season. Senior TB **Jay Finley** is 96 rushing yards shy of becoming the seventh Baylor player to rush for 1,000 yards in a single season. **Griffin III**, who leads the Big 12 and ranks third nationally in total offense (327.5), is one of eight active FBS quarterbacks — and only sophomore — to compile 5,000 passing and 1,000 rushing yards in his career.

Texas A&M enters Saturday's game ranked in the top 25 for the first time this season. Since moving into the starting role, QB **Ryan Tannehill** has thrown for 674 yards and six touchdowns in Texas A&M's last two games. Saturday's game will also serve as a family reunion for the Epperson family — older brother **Derek Epperson** is an All-American punter at Baylor, while younger brother **Ryan Epperson** is a sophomore honorable mention All-Big 12 punter at Texas A&M.

All Baylor football games are broadcast live on the Baylor/ISP Sports Radio Network; Waco's 1660 ESPN Radio is the network's flagship station. Live streaming audio and GameTracker also are available for all Baylor football games online at www.BaylorBears.com, the official website of Baylor Athletics and a member of the CBS College Sports network.

BAYLOR-TEXAS A&M SERIES

Saturday is the 107th "Battle of the Brazos" series between Baylor and Texas A&M in football, the most-played series in Baylor football history. The Aggies hold a 66-31-9 advantage in the all-time series, which dates back to a 33-0 A&M victory in 1899. Texas A&M also leads the series 33-20-6 in games played in Waco.

Baylor and Texas A&M have played every season since 1931 save the 1943 and 1944 seasons when Baylor did not field a team due to World War II.

SERIES NOTES: Texas A&M holds a 12-2 advantage in the series since the inception of the Big 12 Conference in 1996 ... Baylor has only two victories over Texas A&M since 1985, a 35-34 overtime victory at Floyd Casey Stadium in 2004 and a 41-21 rout in Waco in 2008 ... The last three meetings have been decided by 20+ points since TAMU's 16-13 OT win in 2005 ... In 1936, Baylor and 14th-ranked Texas A&M battled to a scoreless tie in the Bears' first-ever game against a ranked opponent. The following season, Baylor posted its first-ever victory over a ranked opponent as the 15th-ranked Bears blanked the 13th-ranked Aggies 13-0. That also was Baylor's first game as a ranked team; it propelled the Bears to a 5-0 record and a No. 5 national ranking. ... A 21-21 tie in 1951 stopped Baylor's 4-0 season start. ... In 1965, Kenny Stockdale was 20-of-27 for 286 yards and two TDs as the Bears shutout the Aggies 31-0. That yardage total ranks 19th all-time at Baylor. ... In the 1979 Baylor victory, Mike Singletary recorded 22 tackles. That tally still ranks eighth in school history. ... Baylor and Texas A&M have played in November only four times since 1924 — Nov. 9, 1996; Nov. 8, 1997; Nov. 15, 2008; and Nov. 21, 2009.

QUICK NOTES

- Baylor (7-3) is bowl-eligible for the first time since 1995 (finished 7-4 but did not receive bowl bid).
- Baylor started the season 7-2 for the first time since 1991 (Baylor finished that season 8-4) and has seven wins entering the month of November for the first time since 1985 (Baylor finished that season 9-3).
- Baylor is 41-163-6 all-time vs. ranked opponents; 26-143-5 when unranked and playing a ranked opponent.
- Baylor is seeking its first eight-win season since 1991 (Baylor finished that season 8-4).
- Baylor is also seeking its first five-win conference season since 1991 (Baylor finished 5-2-1 in SWC play).
- Baylor has started 5-0 at home only three times in program history — 1929 (6-0), 1979 (5-0) and 1985 (5-0).
- Baylor's four conference wins are the most by the Bears in the Big 12 era.
- Baylor has scored more than twice as many points in six Big 12 games (229) in 2010 than in eight Big 12 games (104) in 2009.
- Baylor scored 30+ points in five games to start conference play for the first time in school history.
- Baylor has scored 30+ in eight games this season — a single-season school record.
- Baylor is 5-69 vs. the Big 12 South (13-32 vs. the Big 12 North). BU swept the season series against the North (3-0), defeating Kansas, Colorado and Kansas State.
- Baylor is averaging 38.2 points-per-game in six conference contests — the second-most in the Big 12.
- Baylor notable national stat rankings: 9th in total offense, 12th in passing offense, 22nd in pass efficiency, 22nd in sacks allowed, 26th in scoring offense, 28th in net punting and 29th in rushing offense
- Baylor ranks first in the Big 12 in fewest sacks allowed (63), second in total offense (487.8), second in pass efficiency (152.2), fourth in rushing offense (187.8), fifth in pass offense (300.0), fifth in scoring offense (33.7) and seventh in scoring defense (26.3).
- Baylor is 31-for-38 in redzone opportunities this season — 18 TDs, 13 FGs.
- Baylor trails in average time of possession — 31:20 to 28:40 — through 10 games.
- Baylor opponents are averaging just 10.8 second-half points through nine games (15.5 points in first half).
- Baylor boasts six graduates on its 2010 active roster — that number is tied for 12th in FBS.
- 18 different players have caught passes through 10 games in 2010.
- Six true freshmen and 14 redshirt freshmen have played this season (not as many as last year's 10 true and 15 redshirt freshmen that saw action): **Ahmad Dixon, Sam Holl, Dominique Jones, Prince Kent, Tevin Reese and Tyler Stephenson.**
- QB **Robert Griffin III** has tossed 13 40-yard passes (10 for TDs), including seven 50-yard passes (six TDs).
- **Griffin III** has accounted for 23 plays of 30+ yards in 2010, including 16 for touchdowns (15 pass, one run).
- **Griffin III** ranks third nationally in total offense (327.50) and 22nd in passing efficiency (152.09).
- **Griffin III** is first in the Big 12 in total offense, fourth in passing yards (285.9) and fourth in passing efficiency.
- **Griffin III** is 13-11 in 24 career starts as Baylor quarterback.
- **Griffin III** is responsible for 27 of Baylor's 39 offensive touchdowns (20 pass, seven rush) in 2010 (41 overall).
- **Griffin III** is the current Baylor career leader with a 63.6 completion percentage (minimum 250 attempts).
- TB **Jay Finley** ranks seventh in the Big 12 — and 34th nationally — with 90.4 rushing yards per game.
- **Finley** has more rushing yards (600) in the last four games than he did in nine games last season (370).
- P **Derek Epperson** ranks second all-time in Baylor history with 49 career punts of 50+ yards.
- **Epperson** ranks 11th nationally — and second in the Big 12 — in punting average (45.78).
- S **Byron Landor** is fourth in the Big 12 (third in conference-only games) and tied for 21st nationally with 9.80 tackles per game. **Landor** is also tied for first in the Big 12 in fumbles recovered (three).
- DE **Tevin Elliott** is sixth in the Big 12 in TFLs (0.90/game) and tied for seventh in sacks (0.50).
- PK **Aaron Jones** is tied for ninth — and third in the Big 12 — nationally in FGs per game (1.70) and 22nd nationally in scoring (8.90 ppg).
- **Jones** ranks sixth overall in the Big 12 and second among kickers with 8.9 points per game.
- **Jones** has made more FGs (17) through 10 games than Baylor made as a team all of 2009 (nine).
- **Jones** has four successful half-ending FGs this season, including a pair of 50-yarders.
- WR **Josh Gordon**'s seven receiving TDs are the most by a BU player since **Thomas White** had eight in 2007.
- IR **Kendall Wright** has a catch in each game of his career (34 games).
- **Wright** has six career receptions of at least 50 yards.
- **Wright** is tied for eighth nationally among active FBS receivers with a reception in 34 consecutive games.

LAST TIME VS. TEXAS A&M

TEXAS A&M 38, BAYLOR 3
 NOV. 21, 2009 • KYLE FIELD • COLLEGE STATION, TEXAS

Baylor was eliminated from bowl contention with a decisive 38-3 defeat at the hands of rival Texas A&M in College Station.

Jerrold Johnson threw for 153 yards and threw two touchdown passes and ran for another score as the Aggies beat Baylor for the ninth straight time at Kyle Field.

Nick Florence completed 21 of 31 passes for 177 yards with two interceptions for the Bears, guaranteed a losing record for the 14th consecutive season.

Following a goalline stand by the Aggies' defense early in the second quarter, freshman **Christine Michael** busted loose for a 97-yard touchdown run.

The Bears drove to the A&M 8-yard line with the Aggies leading 14-3. On third-and-goal, receiver **Kendall Wright** took the ball from Florence and threw to the end zone, but A&M cornerback **Terrence Frederick** intercepted.

On second down, Michael burst through a hole and outran Baylor safety Jeremy Williams down the sideline to the end zone.

The Bears threatened again late in the half, but A&M linebacker Kyle Mangan intercepted a Florence pass at the 2-yard-line with 24 seconds left. The Aggies rushed for 287 yards in the first half after breaking several big runs.

Gray had gains of 17 and 42 yards on A&M's first series, and Johnson threw a 2-yard touchdown pass to **Kenny Brown** less than four minutes into the game.

Baylor linebacker **Logan Lanier** blocked a punt later in the quarter, leading to **Dary Stone's** 31-yard field goal that cut A&M's lead to 7-3.

On A&M's ensuing possession, Gray had another 17-yard run and freshman receiver Uzoma Nwachukwu gained 35 yards on a reverse. Johnson finished the drive with a 1-yard sneak. **Randy Bullock's** 48-yard field goal early in the third quarter stretched A&M's lead to 24-3. Michael tacked on a 2-yard touchdown run in the first minute of the fourth quarter. Johnson threw a 7-yard TD pass to **Ryan Tannehill** with 6:55 left. Johnson has 24 touchdown passes this season.

ART BRILES

HEAD COACH
THIRD SEASON



The 2010 season marks year three of the Art Briles era at Baylor, and hopes are high in Central Texas that a solid foundation is being laid to foster successful football teams for years to come.

Briles assumed Baylor's head coaching post Nov. 28, 2007, ushering in a new era and a new attitude to the storied Bears football program. From his first game on the sidelines in Waco it was quickly evident that the Briles regime was underway at Baylor; from the innovative offense, to the reintroduction of a solid running game, to competitive games and no acceptance of moral victories.

Nowhere is Baylor's steady improvement under Briles more evident than in the back-to-back recruiting classes his staff put together in 2009 and 2010 — the school's highest-ranked signing classes in the Big 12 era. The 2010 signing class was ranked 39th nationally by *Rivals.com* including a defensive backfield rated fifth nationally.

After a promising start, the 2009 season suffered injury setbacks in the season's first month, including the season-ending loss of superstar quarterback and face-of-the-program Robert Griffin III in the third game (all told, eight different starters missed games in 2009 due to injury). The Bears remained competitive, but a season that began with a road win over ACC power Wake Forest and the team receiving votes in the AP Top 25 poll ended with a 4-8 record. The Bears notched a second impressive road victory in 2009, upsetting defending Big 12 North champion Missouri, 40-32, in Columbia.

Briles' 2008 Bears squad finished with a 4-8 record, but six of eight defeats were at the hands of ranked opponents (four in top 10) and three losses came by a touchdown or less.

Highlights of Briles' first season at Baylor included the emergence of sensational true freshman quarterback Griffin, the Big 12's top newcomer and freshman All-American, a rushing attack that ranked 21st nationally and third in the Big 12 with 195.8 yards per game (2,349 yards, most since 1981) and 29 touchdowns, and a memorable 41-21 home win over Texas A&M.

Baylor's 1.33 turnover margin ranked fourth nationally and linebacker Joe Pawelek ranked seventh nationally in tackles (10.7) and interceptions (.50).

Briles is a proven developer of professional talent, evidenced over the last four NFL drafts where his protégés include the second center selected in 2010 (80th pick J.D. Walton of Baylor), the first lineman selected in 2009 (second overall pick Jason Smith from Baylor), the first receiver selected in 2008 (33rd pick Donnie Avery of Houston) and the third quarterback selected in 2007 (36th pick Kevin Kolb of Houston).

A native of West Texas, Briles became Baylor's 25th head football coach after resurrecting the University of Houston's football program in a five year stretch from 2003 to 2007.

A former wide receiver for the Cougars from 1974 to 1977, Briles was a member of the 1976 Cougar squad that captured the Southwest Conference championship in UH's first season in the league. He later played in the 1977 Cotton Bowl against fifth-ranked Maryland, a game the Cougars won 30-21.

He received a Bachelor of Arts degree from Texas Tech in 1979 and a Masters of Education degree from Abilene Christian in 1984.

A Big Country Athletic Hall of Fame inductee for his West Texas exploits, Briles and his wife, Jan, have three children: Jancy, a UH graduate who works in the Dallas Cowboys Public Relations office; Kendal, a UH graduate and Baylor assistant coach; and Staley, a UH graduate; as well as one grandson, Jaytn Briles. Briles was inducted into the Texas High School Football Hall of Fame in April 2008.

5-0 HOME STARTS FEW AND FAR BETWEEN

Baylor, which enters the "Battle of the Brazos" with a 4-0 home record, is looking for its first 5-0 home start in the Big 12 era and only its fourth in program history. The Bears haven't started 5-0 at home since 1985, when Baylor finished 15th and 17th in the final AP and UPI polls, respectively, with a 9-3 record. That season, Baylor defeated LSU, 21-7, in the Liberty Bowl.

Baylor's first 5-0 home start at Floyd Casey Stadium came in 1979. That season, the Bears finished 14th and 15th in the final AP and UPI polls, respectively, with an 8-4 record after a 24-18 win over Clemson in the Peach Bowl.

The Bears' only other 5-0 home start was in 1929 when Baylor finished the season with a flawless 6-0 home mark and a 7-3-1 final record.

LUCKY NUMBER SEVEN

With a 30-22 win at Texas on Oct. 30, Baylor won its seventh game of the 2010 season, marking the first time the Bears have won at least seven games since 1995 (Baylor finished that season 7-4).

Baylor started the season 7-2 for the first time since 1991 (Baylor finished that season 8-4) and had seven wins entering the month of November for the first time since 1985 (Baylor finished that season 9-3).

SEVEN AND COUNTING

Baylor hasn't won eight games in a season since 1991, when the Bears finished 8-4 in the second-to-last season of the **Grant Teaff** era. That season was also the last time Baylor won five conference games; Baylor finished Southwest Conference play with a 5-2-1 mark.

BEARS BREAK THROUGH BIG 12 WIN BARRIER

Entering the 2010 season, Baylor had never won more than three Big 12 games in any season (3-5 in 2006). In fact, the Bears had only three Big 12 victories in the **Art Briles** era. This season, the Bears have won four Big 12 games — the most conference victories in the Big 12 — and are guaranteed their first .500+ conference record since 1995 (Baylor finished 5-2 in the final season of the Southwest Conference).

YEAR THREE MAKES ALL THE DIFFERENCE

Baylor won eight of its first 24 games under third-year head coach **Art Briles**. Since starting the **Briles** era with an 8-16 record, the Bears have won seven of their last 10 games.

ROAD WARRIORS

After winning just two road games (2-8 in true road games) in the first two years under third-year head coach **Art Briles**, Baylor went 3-2 in true road games in 2010, including a 2-1 mark in Big 12 play. Prior to this season, Baylor hadn't won three or more road games in a season since 1995, when the Bears posted a 4-2 road record.

TRIO NAMED ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT

A trio of Baylor football student-athletes earned ESPN Academic All-District VI honors, as announced by College Sports Information Directors of America. It marks the second consecutive season the Bears have had three players honored.

Senior P **Derek Epperson**, junior RB **Terrance Ganaway** and sophomore QB **Robert Griffin III** all earned first-team honors, making them eligible for the Academic All-America teams that will be announced later this month.

Epperson, a native of Southlake, Texas, graduated in August with a double major in management/MIS. He was also a first-team selection in 2009, joining **Daniel Sepulveda** and **Joe Pawelek** as the only Baylor players to earn first-team honors multiple times since 2004.

Ganaway, a general studies major from DeKalb, Texas, is on track to graduate in December. Griffin III, a sophomore political science major, is scheduled to graduate in December, just three years after graduating high school a semester early and enrolling at Baylor.

'CRASH' IMPACT

Senior S **Byron Landor** — nicknamed "Crash" for his hard hits — ranks fourth in the Big 12 and is tied for 18th nationally with 10.11 tackles per game through nine contests. Landor's 91 total tackles leads the team, nearly 40 tackles more than Baylor's second-leading tackler, **Chris Francis (53)**. A third-team midseason All-Big 12 pick by *Phil Steele*, Landor has six games with 10+ tackles.

Landor is a two-time Big 12 Defensive Player of the Week (Oct. 18, Nov. 1) and was named Jim Thorpe Defensive Back of the Week on Oct. 21.

After tallying a team-high 15 tackles along with two pass break-ups in Baylor's 30-22 win at Texas on Oct. 30, Landor was awarded an *ESPN College Football Final* helmet sticker by analyst **Lou Holtz**.

BAYLOR IN THE TOP 25

After spending back-to-back weeks in both the Associated Press and the ESPN/USA Today Coaches' Top 25 polls, Baylor fell out of both polls in the latest rankings released on Nov. 7.

Baylor has either been ranked or receiving votes in both polls in each of the last four weeks. The Bears have been ranked or receiving votes in six AP polls and five coaches' polls. Prior to the Oct. 24 rankings, Baylor was among others receiving votes three times in the AP (Sept. 12, Oct. 3, Oct. 17) and two times in coaches' (Oct. 3, Oct. 17) polls.

THE FIRST TO 3,000

Sophomore QB **Robert Griffin III** has thrown for a single-season school-record 2,859 yards this season. Griffin III needs 141 yards this week vs. Texas A&M to become the first Baylor QB to throw for 3,000 yards in a single season. Griffin III is one of only 12 quarterbacks in Baylor history to throw for 3,000 or more career yards.

YES, THERE ARE TWO ROBERT GRIFFINS

For the last two seasons, there was only one **Robert Griffin** on the Baylor football team — QB **Robert Griffin III**. This season, there are two Robert Griffins — RG3 and **Robert T. Griffin** (no relation). RTG, a right guard, enrolled at Baylor in January 2010, transferring from Navarro Junior College. Griffin III has started all 10 games at QB, while RTG has eight starts to his credit.

BAYLOR BOWL-ELIGIBLE FOR FIRST TIME IN 15 YEARS

Baylor's 47-42 Homecoming win over Kansas State on Oct. 23 was its sixth victory of the season, making the Bears bowl eligible for the first time since 1995. That year, the Bears finished 7-4 in their final season in the Southwest Conference, but did not receive a bowl invitation.

Baylor has not played in a bowl game since the 1994 Alamo Bowl in San Antonio, suffering a 10-3 loss to Washington State. Entering the 2010 season, Baylor owns the seventh-longest active bowl drought among NCAA Division I FBS schools.

PASSING HIS WAY THROUGH BAYLOR'S RECORD BOOKS

Robert Griffin III ranks fourth all-time in Baylor history with 5,431 career passing yards and, with 219 yards against Texas on Oct. 30, became only the sixth 5,000-yard passer in school history.

Griffin III enters the Texas A&M game as Baylor's career leader in passing efficiency (147.1), completion percentage (63.6) and touchdown responsibility (61). As it stands now, his 66.1 completion percentage and 152.1 passing efficiency through 10 games would set single-season school records.

BIG PLAY ROB

QB **Robert Griffin III** has accounted for 23 plays of 30+ yards in 2010, including 16 for touchdowns (15 pass, one run). In addition, Griffin III has tossed eight passes of 50+ yards with seven going for touchdowns and 14 passes of 40+ yards (11 TDs). Five different receivers have caught a 40+ yard TD pass from RG3 this season.

GRIFFIN III HAS EYES ON THE END ZONE

Not only does sophomore QB **Robert Griffin III** currently own the Baylor career marks for passing efficiency, touchdown-interception ratio and touchdown responsibility (61), he is also climbing two other career TD charts. Griffin III is now the Baylor career leader with 39 touchdown passes, breaking the previous mark held by **Shawn Bell** (38).

Griffin III ranks fourth in career rushing touchdowns with 22 — the most by a Baylor QB. Griffin III needs two more to tie and three to overtake former Pittsburgh Steelers RB **Walter Abercrombie** (24).

MORE ON GRIFFIN III**RG3 REACHES 5,000/1,000 CAREER MILESTONES**

With his 219 passing yards in Baylor's 30-22 win at Texas on Oct. 30, sophomore QB **Robert Griffin III** became the eighth active Division I FBS quarterback — and only sophomore — with 5,000 passing and 1,000 rushing yards. Through 24 career games, Griffin III has thrown for 5,431 yards, while rushing for 1,336 yards on the ground. RG3 joined an impressive list:

AN ACCURATE RG3

Robert Griffin III has completed 70.2 percent of his passes (151-of-215) in six Big 12 games this season, while throwing for 1,888 yards and a 158.69 passing efficiency. In the eight Big 12 games during his 2008 freshman campaign, Griffin III completed 59.8 percent of his passes (113-of-189) with a 129.9 passing efficiency.

RACKING UP THE TOTAL OFFENSE YARDS

Sophomore QB **Robert Griffin III**, the Big 12 leader in total offense, has accumulated 300+ yards of total offense in seven of 10 games this season. Prior to his 236 total yards at Texas on Oct. 30, Griffin III had posted 350+ yards of total offense in four consecutive games, including a school-record 444 yards in Baylor's 55-7 rout of Kansas on Oct. 2.

FINLEY, RG3 RUSHING UP CAREER YARDAGE LIST

Baylor's 1-2 backfield punch of senior TB **Jay Finley** and sophomore QB **Robert Griffin III** have racked up 3,682 career rushing yards. Finley has 2,346 career rushing yards, the fourth-best career total in Baylor history. With his school-record 250 yards against Kansas State on Oct. 23, he became the seventh 2,000-yard rusher in school history.

During Baylor's 34-6 win over Buffalo on Sept. 11, Griffin III became the 29th 1,000-yard rusher — and first 1,000-yard rushing QB — in school history. Griffin III ranks 23rd all-time with 1,336 career yards. He needs 164 yards to become the 16th 1,500-yard rusher in school history.

RG3 WAS GOOD BEFORE, BUT HE'S BETTER NOW

In the first 15 games of his career, sophomore QB **Robert Griffin III** completed 61.0 percent of his passes and threw for 2,572 yards with 19 TDs. Through the first 10 games of the 2010 season, Griffin III has completed 66.1 percent of his passes, throwing for 2,859 yards with 20 TDs.

OFFENSIVE EXPLOSION

With the return of sophomore QB **Robert Griffin III**, Baylor's offensive numbers have improved drastically through 10 games of 2010 as compared to the 2009 season. Griffin III has thrown more touchdowns (20) in 2010 than Baylor threw as a team in 2008 (16) and 2009 (13).

Baylor is averaging 487.8 yards of total offense in 2010 — 144.9 more yards-per-game than the Bears accumulated in 2009 (342.9). The Bears are averaging 300.0 yards passing and 187.8 yards rushing through 10 games in 2010 (242.3 passing and 100.6 rushing in 2009).

Baylor ranks ninth in total offense, 12th nationally in passing offense, 22nd in pass efficiency, 26th in scoring offense and 29th in rushing offense.

GRIFFIN III ON TRIO OF WATCH LISTS

Entering the 2010 season, Baylor sophomore QB **Robert Griffin III** is listed on three different award watch lists for the Maxwell Award, Davey O'Brien Award and Manning Award. In July, he was listed among 30 quarterbacks on the watch list for the Davey O'Brien Award, which is presented annually to the best college quarterback by the Davey O'Brien Foundation.

In August, Griffin III was added to the watch lists for the Maxwell and Manning Awards. The Maxwell Award has been presented to the nation's most outstanding college football player since 1937.

RG3 NAMED O'BRIEN AWARD SEMIFINALIST

Sophomore QB **Robert Griffin III** was named a semifinalist for the 2010 Davey O'Brien National Quarterback Award, as announced by the Davey O'Brien Foundation on Oct. 25. Griffin III, a native of Copperas Cove, Texas, is among four Big 12 quarterbacks named in the list of 16 semifinalists. RG3 is joined by Landry Jones (Oklahoma), Blaine Gabbert (Missouri) and Taylor Martinez (Nebraska). The semifinalist list features one freshman, five sophomores, seven juniors and three seniors. The Big 12 and Big Ten lead all conferences with four candidates.

The O'Brien National Selection Committee narrowed down the list from 120 quarterbacks representing every team in the NCAA Division I Football Bowl Subdivision. Fan voting counted for five percent of the total, and with 9,320 votes, RG3 finished third behind Cam Newton (Auburn) and Kellen Moore (Boise State) in the opening round.

The three finalists will be selected on Nov. 22, and the 2010 winner will be announced on The Home Depot ESPNU College Football Awards Show on Dec. 9. The 34th Annual O'Brien Awards Dinner will be held Feb. 21 at The Fort Worth Club in Fort Worth, Texas.

DEFENSE OVERCOMING INJURIES

This season the Bears have suffered an inordinate number of injuries on the defensive side of the ball. In all, 11 members of the defensive two-deep have sat due to injury (including eight with starts): CB **Romie Blaylock**, CB **Antareis Bryan**, DT **Chris Buford**, CB **Chance Casey**, LB **Elliot Coffey**, S **Mike Hicks**, DE **Terrance Lloyd**, CB **Clifton Odom**, LB **Earl Patin**, DT **Tracy Robertson** and DE **Zac Scotton**. Four additional defensive reserves/special teamers have also missed time with injuries (S **Denerick Demby**, S **Ahmad Dixon**, S **Sam Holl** and LB **Logan Lanier**).

The 15 injured defenders have missed a combined 42 games through the first 10 weeks of the 2010 season.

FINLEY SMASHES RG3'S SINGLE-GAME RUSHING RECORD

A week after rushing for a career-high 143 yards at Colorado on Oct. 16, senior TB **Jay Finley** shattered both his personal single-game and Baylor's single-game rushing marks against Kansas State (Oct. 23). Finley rushed for a school-record 250 yards, breaking the previous school best held by QB **Robert Griffin III**, who rushed for 217 yards against Washington State in 2008.

Finley became only the fourth 200-yard rusher — and second in three seasons — in school history, joining **Griffin III (217)**, **Jerod Douglas (210)** and **Walter Abercrombie (207)**.

HALFTIME TRENDS

The Bears have lost 28 of their last 31 games when trailing at halftime dating to 2006. All three wins during that stretch came on the road — a 40-32 victory at Missouri in 2009 (trailed 27-16 at half), a 31-25 triumph at Colorado in 2010 (trailed 15-10 at half) and a 30-22 win at Texas in 2010 (trailed 12-10 at half). Conversely, the Bears have won 12 of their last 15 games when leading at halftime. The lone losses in that time were at Texas Tech (2008), Nebraska (2009) and vs. Texas Tech (2009).

OFFENSE MAKING MAJOR STRIDES IN FOUR YEARS

Both Baylor's offense has played a big role in the Bears being bowl-eligible for the first time since 1995. In four seasons, Baylor's offensive numbers have made major improvements. In 2007, the Bears ranked 85th nationally in total offense (351.2 yards per game) and 111th in scoring offense (18.2 PPG)

In six Big 12 games, Baylor has increased its total yardage output from 2009 (317.8 to 487.8), while scoring nearly three times as many points (13.0 in 2009 to 38.2). Through 10 games in 2010, Baylor ranks ninth nationally in total offense (487.8) and 26th in scoring offense (33.7).

JONES NAMED GROZA AWARD SEMIFINALIST

Redshirt freshman PK **Aaron Jones** is one of 20 semifinalists for the 2010 Lou Groza Collegiate Place-Kicker Award presented by the Discover Orange Bowl, as announced by the Palm Beach County Sports Commission.

Jones is the lone freshman among the 20 semi-finalists and is one of four place kickers from the Big 12 Conference, joining Bailey, Alex Henery (Nebraska) and Grant Ressel (Missouri).

Semifinalists will be voted on by all Division I Head Coaches and SIDs, along with national, regional and local football writers and others who will select the three finalists. These finalists will be honored at the Lou Groza Collegiate Place-Kicker Awards Banquet on Dec. 7 in West Palm Beach, Fla. The winner will be announced on the Home Depot ESPNU College Football Awards Show on Dec. 9.

MORE THAN DOUBLING UP

Through the first six games of the 2010 season, TB **Jay Finley** rushed 65 times for only 304 yards and one touchdown. In the last four games, Finley has more than doubled his season production, rushing for 600 yards on 73 attempts with seven touchdowns.

Finley has more rushing yards (600) in the last four games (143 at Colorado, school-record 250 vs. Kansas State, 116 at Texas, 91 at Oklahoma State) than he did in nine games last season (370).

WRIGHT CLIMBING BAYLOR RECEIVER CHARTS

IR **Kendall Wright** is quickly climbing Baylor's career charts for receptions and receiving yards. Wright is second on Baylor's career list with 175 career receptions. He needs nine more catches to become Baylor's all-time leader in career receptions. Last season, Wright became the first Baylor player with 100 career receptions by the end of his sophomore season.

Wright ranks third in Baylor history with 2,169 receiving yards; with his 113 yards against Kansas State on Oct. 23, he became only the fourth 2,000-yard receiver in school history.

Wright ranks ninth in the Big 12 and is tied for 29th nationally with 5.9 receptions per game. He also ranks sixth in the Big 12 and 36th nationally with 78.0 receiving yards per game.

Six true freshmen and 17 redshirt freshmen have played through 10 games in 2010. In comparison, a total of 25 true and redshirt freshmen saw action in the entire 2009 season. Additionally, 24 total sophomores have played this season. All told, 47 of the 83 players who have played this season for Baylor are either freshmen or sophomores (18 juniors, 18 seniors).

"COUSIN PHIL" LEADING THE WAY ON D-LINE

Senior DT **Phil Taylor** currently has 41 tackles (25 UT-16 AT), more than any defensive lineman last season (**Jason Lamb** led all d-linemen with 32 tackles in 2009). Taylor is on pace for 50 tackles, which would stand as the most by a d-lineman since Lamb's 53 in 2007 and the most by an interior d-lineman since **Ethan Kelley** (eventual NFL player) made 76 in 2002.

In his first season at Baylor in 2009, he played in all 12 games, starting nine at defensive tackle. He totaled 25 tackles (2.5 for loss), an assisted sack, five QB hurries, two blocked kicks and one interception. Taylor made more than half (13) of his tackles for the season (25) in the first three games

Prior to the season, Taylor was named to preseason All-Big 12 second team by *Sports Illustrated* and *Phil Steele* and third team by *Athlon*. He was also rated nation's No. 10 defensive tackle by *Phil Steele*. He sat out the 2008 season after transferring from Penn State. He was a member of the 2007 Penn State defensive line that ranked seventh nationally in rush defense (93.8 ypg) and held opponents to nine rushing touchdowns in 13 games. He played in 18 games in two seasons at Penn State. In May 2010, he traveled to Kenya for mission trip with Baylor student-athletes. He was named preseason Big 12 Newcomer of Year selection by media in 2009.

SCORING 30+ IN RECORD FASHION

Baylor has scored 30 or more points in eight games this season — a single-season school record. Baylor has reached the 30-point plateau in six consecutive games (5-1 in those contests), which is also a school record.

Since 2001, Baylor is 29-3 (.906) when scoring at least 30 points and 10-71 (.125) when scoring less than 30 points. The losses in that span when scoring 30 points were at Texas in 2006 (63-31), at Oklahoma in 2005 (37-30 in double overtime) and vs. Texas Tech in 2010 (45-38).

Prior to Baylor's 45-38 loss to Texas Tech (Oct. 9) in the Texas Farm Bureau Insurance Shootout, the Bears had won 15 consecutive games when reaching the 30-point plateau. It was Baylor's first loss when scoring 30+ points since a 63-31 setback at Texas in 2006.

Conversely, the Bears have lost 31 of their last 32 when not reaching the 30-point plateau. The lone victory in that stretch was a 24-21 win at Wake Forest in the 2009 season opener.

OUTSCORING 2009

Baylor has scored more points in its first six Big 12 games (229) to start 2010 than the Bears did in all eight Big 12 games (104) in 2009. Through 10 games, the Bears have scored 337 points (33.7 points per game). Last season, Baylor scored 249 points (20.8 points per game) in 12 games.

HERE'S THE KICKER

Redshirt freshman PK **Aaron Jones**, nicknamed 'Stork' by coach **Art Briles**, is 17-of-21 on FG attempts, including 12-of-14 from 30+ yards. Through 10 games, Jones has made more FGs (17) than Baylor made as a team in the last two seasons (15) combined (6-of-9 in 2008 and 9-of-14 in 2009).

Jones' 17 FGs are the second-most on Baylor's single-season list. 'Stork' is one FG shy of tying current Miami Dolphins GM **Jeff Ireland (1989)** for the single-season school record of 18. He currently ranks third for single-season field goal percentage (minimum seven made), making 81.0 percent of his kicks. Jones has hit two 50-yard FGs, becoming the first Baylor PK with two FGs of 50+ yards since **Jeff Ireland** did it in 1991 (58 and 50).

Jones is tied for ninth — and third in the Big 12 — nationally in FGs per game (1.70) and 22nd nationally in scoring (8.90 ppg).

EPPERSON PUNTING HIS WAY UP BAYLOR CAREER CHARTS

Baylor senior P **Derek Epperson** ranks in the top six of all five major career punting categories at Baylor. Epperson ranks third all-time with a 43.06 yards-per-punt average behind only **Buzzy Sawyer (43.44)** and **Daniel Sepulveda (45.24)**. Epperson ranks second all-time in Baylor history with 49 career punts of 50+ yards.

Epperson is one of only five punters in Baylor history with more than 8,000 career punting yards; he ranks fourth all-time with 8,999 yards. He also ranks fourth in both total punts (209) and fifth in punts of 60+ yards (seven).

A HALF OF DIFFERENCE

Baylor is averaging 17.7 first-half points as compared to 16.0 second-half points through 10 games in 2010. Conversely, Baylor opponents are averaging 15.5 points in the first half and 10.8 in the second half. Baylor is outscoring the opposition in all four quarters.

TRIPLE THREATS

Second-year sophomore TE **Jerod Monk**, a former high school QB, has two receiving touchdowns. Monk has recorded a TD via rush (1-yard keeper vs. Kent State, 10/3/09), pass (3-yard pass to **Justin Akers** at Iowa State, 10/17/09) and reception (6-yard catch at Rice, 9/25/10; 9-yard catch at Colorado, 10/16/10).

Monk is joined by IR **Kendall Wright**, who threw his career-first TD pass Oct. 2 vs. Kansas. For his career, Wright has caught 12 TD passes, while rushing for two more.

SPREADING THE BALL AROUND

With IR **Darius Jones'** career-first reception in a 31-25 win at Colorado on Oct. 16, 18 different Baylor players have recorded a reception through the first 10 games of the 2010 season.

During the Texas Farm Bureau Insurance Shootout in Dallas on Oct. 9, senior LB **Antonio Johnson** and sophomore QB **Robert Griffin III** recorded their career-first receptions. Johnson registered a 34-yard reception from QB **Brody Trahan** on a fake punt, while Griffin III caught a nine-yard pass from IR **Kendall Wright**. Baylor QBs Griffin III and **Nick Florence** have also completed passes to 15 different receivers, including 12 in the Bears' 34-3 season-opening win against Sam Houston State.

Six different receivers have registered a TD reception in 2010, including **Josh Gordon** (seven), **Kendall Wright** (six), **Terrance Williams** (four), **Jerod Monk** (two) and **Brad Taylor**.

In total, eight players have recorded their career-first receptions in that span — redshirt freshman IR **Darius Jones**, sophomore QB **Robert Griffin III**, senior LB **Antonio Johnson**, true freshman IR **Tevin Reese**, sophomore TE **Jerod Monk**, junior FB **Kaeron Johnson**, redshirt freshman FB **Erik Wolfe** and sophomore IR **Michael Valdez**.

SEVERAL GRADUATES ON BAYLOR ROSTER

Baylor's roster boasts six student-athletes who have earned their undergraduate degrees. The six graduate players are seniors **Tim Atchison** (FS), **Mikail Baker** (DB/KR), **Chris Buford** (DT), **Derek Epperson** (P), **Jay Finley** (RB) and **Brad Taylor** (TE). An additional four student-athletes are on pace to graduate in December; the quartet includes seniors **Antareis Bryan** (CB) and **Phil Taylor** (DT), junior **Terrance Ganaway** (RB) and sophomore **Robert Griffin III** (QB).

Baylor is tied for third among Big 12 schools and is tied for 12th nationally among Division I FBS programs with six graduates on its active roster.

WRIGHT ON BILETNIKOFF WATCH LIST

Baylor junior IR **Kendall Wright** is one of 51 student-athletes on the 2010 Fred Biletnikoff Award watch list, which was announced in August by the Tallahassee Quarterback Club Foundation. As a sophomore in 2009, Wright led the Bears with 66 receptions, 740 receiving yards and four touchdowns on his way to being named to numerous All-Big 12 teams. His 66 receptions rank as the third-most in a single season in program history.

The Biletnikoff Award, first presented in 1994, is named for former Florida State All-American **Fred Biletnikoff**. It is presented annually to the nation's most outstanding receiver in college football. Ten semi-finalists will be announced Nov. 15, with three finalists selected Nov. 22. The winner of the 17th Biletnikoff Award will be announced as part of the Home Depot ESPNU College Football Awards Show on Dec. 9.

FINLEY NAMED TO DOAK WALKER WATCH LIST

Baylor senior RB **Jay Finley** is one of 49 FBS student-athletes named to the 2010 Doak Walker Award watch list. The Doak Walker Award, which is in its 21st year, is named after the three-time All-American running back from SMU. Semifinalists for the award will be announced Nov. 10, with the finalists to be announced Nov. 22.

COACHING STABILITY

The Bears' coaching staff has remained the same since being assembled by head coach **Art Briles** prior to the 2008 season. Baylor is one of nine schools nationally in its third-plus season with an entire staff intact. Baylor is joined by Indiana, Iowa, Navy, Nebraska, Penn State, Texas, Virginia Tech and Wake Forest.

WATKINS ON LOMBARDI AWARD WATCH LIST

Baylor senior offensive tackle **Danny Watkins** is one of only three Big 12 offensive linemen on the 41st annual Rotary Lombardi Award watch list. Watkins, who is in his second year at Baylor after transferring from Butte (Calif.) College, is among the 87 members of the watch list.

The Rotary Lombardi Award is presented annually to the college football lineman who, in addition to outstanding performance and ability, best exemplifies the discipline of Vince Lombardi. The award is open to offensive and defensive linemen, as well as linebackers who set up no farther than five yards deep from the line of scrimmage.

The watch list will be periodically updated and revised through the conclusion of voting to determine the 12 semifinalists. The 2010 Rotary Lombardi Award will be presented Dec. 7-8 at the George R. Brown Convention Center in Houston, Texas.

BAYLOR ISP SPORTS NETWORK

The "Voice of the Bears," **John Morris** (Baylor, 1980) enters his 24th year broadcasting Baylor football and men's basketball in 2010-11. Morris, who has broadcast 251 consecutive Baylor football games entering the 2010 season, will broadcast his 260th consecutive game Oct. 30 when the Bears travel to Texas.

A Kentucky native, Morris also produces the daily "State Farm Baylor SportsBeat," daily Big 12 reports and co-hosts the award-winning "Inside Baylor Sports" television show. Morris also hosts the "Raising Canes Baylor SportsBeat" (weekdays at 7:20 a.m. and 5:20 p.m.), the "State Farm Baylor Hour" January through May and a daily 60-minute program, "The John Morris Show," on Waco's 1660 ESPN Radio. This is Morris' 16th year as signature voice of Baylor athletics since succeeding the legendary Frank Fallon. In November 2002, he was presented the Frank Fallon Sportsmanship Award by the Greater Waco Chamber of Commerce.

Three-time Academic All-American **J.J. Joe** returns for his seventh season as color analyst. The Bears' leading passer for four consecutive seasons from 1990-1993, Joe graduated as Baylor's career passing and total offense leader and is one of the school's most decorated student-athletes as a three-time Academic All-American. He was inducted into the Baylor Athletic Hall of Fame in 2006.

Ricky Thompson returns for his 11th season providing sideline color and analysis. Thompson is a former SWC long jump champion and was the Bears' leading receiver in 1975 before embarking on a seven-year NFL career. He also is a member of the Baylor Athletic Hall of Fame.

Baylor's radio team also includes the multi-talented **Craig Harper**, who, in his 24th year as a member of the crew, serves as executive producer of the football broadcasts.

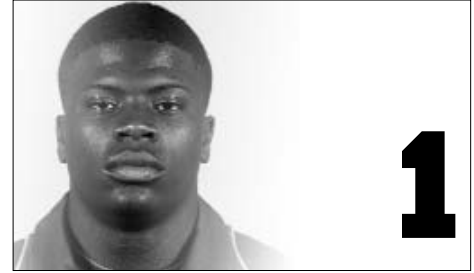

Robert Griffin III threw a 68-yard touchdown pass on his second series, ran 30 yards for a touchdown on his next possession and led Baylor to a 34-3 victory over Sam Houston State in his first game since tearing a knee ligament early last season.

A freshman sensation in 2008, he played only 2 1/2 games last season. He came back bigger and stronger, but also wearing a brace on his right knee.

He proved right away that his arm was fine, completing his first three passes and drilling the short pass that turned into the longest TD throw of his career. The big tests were running and taking his first hit.

Both came at the start of the third drive. He scrambled right for 15 yards, getting jerked down by his legs. He jumped right up, drawing a huge cheer. A few plays later, he scrambled left, saw an opening and zipped through the defense, holding up his right index finger as he crossed the goal line. He had another TD run in the fourth quarter called back because of a penalty.

Griffin III stretched the lead in the second quarter. Two plays after freshman **Tevin Reese** narrowly missed a juggling touchdown catch, Griffin III saw **Terrance Williams** break free toward the goal line and hit him for the easy score.

The Bears went up 28-0 when **Jay Finley**, who is coming back from offseason ankle surgery, ran 44 yards up the middle for a touchdown on the first play of the second half.

Griffin III went 19-of-36 for 242 yards, playing all but Baylor's final drive. He was sacked once and didn't have any turnovers. He also ran six times for a team-best 59 yards. Griffin III accounted for three of Baylor's four touchdowns — his eighth career three-TD performance.

Sam Houston State didn't break Baylor's 20-yard line until the fourth quarter, then had to settle for a 27-yard field goal. They gained just 195 yards.

Baylor's defense enjoyed a first-half shutout for the first time since 2006. Sam Houston's only points came with 10:35 left.

DE **Tevin Elliott** recorded a team-high eight tackles, two tackles-for-loss and one sack in his first career game. **Byron Landor** tied a career high with seven tackles, while recording a career-high two TFLs. Elliott, Landor and **Phil Taylor** recorded a team-high two tackles-for-loss each.

Six players made their career-first starts Saturday — LB **Elliot Coffey**, LB **Chris Francis**, DE **Terrance Lloyd**, DE **Gary Mason Jr.**, RG **Robert T. Griffin** and WR **Terrance Williams**.

Robert Griffin III passed for a career-high 297 yards, including 230 in the first half, and had a hand in all four Baylor touchdowns to lead the Bears past the Buffalo Bulls, 34-6. Baylor is 2-0 to start a season for the first time since 2005.

Griffin III put the Bears in control with a five-yard scoring run on fourth-and-two late in the first quarter and two long second-quarter touchdown passes. One was a 61-yarder to **Kendall Wright**, who has caught a pass in all 26 career games.

Buffalo quarterback Jerry Davis struggled in his second career start while the Bulls were falling behind in the first half. He finished 18 of 46 for 163 yards and no touchdowns after throwing for 302 yards and four scores in the opener.

Griffin III ran for two touchdowns, the latter a 1-yard plunge that put Baylor ahead 34-3 early in the third quarter.

Griffin III's final TD could have been the second for Wright, but the receiver fell down while all alone at the 1 after stretching out to catch Griffin III's 47-yard pass. He had five catches for 128 yards.

Besides harassing Davis into a rough night, the Bears mostly held the Buffalo running game in check until the game was decided.

The Bulls didn't get a first down until their fourth possession, and promptly fumbled two plays later. Griffin III kept the subsequent drive alive with a nifty fumble recovery, completed a pass to get the Bears to the Buffalo 4, then scored the game's first touchdown on a designed run around right end on fourth-and-2 from the 5.

The Bears would like someone other than the multitasking Griffin III to be their leading rusher, and **Jay Finley** obliged against Buffalo. He didn't score but finished with 76 yards on a 5.8-yard average before going to the bench for good in the third quarter.

The only blemish for Griffin III was the first nonconference interception of his career, by Domonic Cook after a tipped pass. Griffin III had several other tipped passes, and a couple of those were almost intercepted.

After not allowing a touchdown in its first two games, Baylor gave up five touchdowns on TCU's first five drives, falling 45-10 to the fourth-ranked Horned Frogs in Fort Worth.

TCU's 45 points are the most by a Baylor opponent since a 56-14 loss to UAB in 2004. Baylor has now lost the last three series meetings with TCU since the Southwest Conference dissolved in 1996. TCU's win broke the tie in the series, as the Horned Frogs now lead the all-time series, 50-49-7.

Ed Wesley, who became the first Baylor opposing player to rush for 150 yards since 2008, ran for a game-high 165 yards and two scores, while Andy Dalton completed 21-of-23 passes for 267 and two TDs. The Horned Frogs built a 35-3 lead and had 335 of their 558 total yards by halftime.

Dalton, whose 91-percent completion rate was a single-game TCU record, hit his first 11 passes. His first incompletion didn't come until four minutes into the second quarter.

On the opening series of the game, Dalton hit a wide-open Jeremy Kerley streaking down the middle of the field for a 28-yard score.

After Baylor dual-threat quarterback **Robert Griffin III** was stuffed for a five-yard loss on his first snap and the Bears went three-and-out, Wesley took a handoff over the left side, busted through the line and had a clear path to the end zone for a 14-0 lead less than 7:30 minutes into the game.

Freshman PK **Aaron Jones** tied a career-long with a 48-yard field goal to put Baylor on the board for the first time. TCU then scored 24 unanswered points to take a 38-3 lead.

Griffin III threw a 53-yard TD pass to **Josh Gordon** in the third quarter, but was frustrated most of the day by TCU's stifling defense. Griffin III finished 16-of-28 passing for 164 yard and ran 14 times for only 21 yards.

Gordon and **Terrance Williams** combined to catch nine of Griffin III's 16 passes. **Jay Finley** led the Bears with 56 rushing yards on nine carries.

Robert Griffin III passed for 268 yards and three touchdowns to lead Baylor to a 30-13 win over Rice on a rain-soaked night that included a 67-minute weather delay.

Baylor led 7-3 early in the second quarter when the game was suspended for about an hour because of lightning in the area. After the rain passed and the teams returned to the field, the Bears built a 20-3 lead by scoring on their last three possessions of the first half.

Griffin III added a 46-yard touchdown pass to **Josh Gordon** in the third quarter that stretched the lead to 27-6. Gordon shrugged off his coverage and grabbed the TD pass, then took a late shot from Brian Stacey as the Owls were flagged for unnecessary roughness.

Nick Fanuzzi had 204 yards passing with two interceptions for Rice. The Owls' only touchdown came when Sam McGuffie scored on an 11-yard run that made it 27-13 with about six minutes left.

The second half got off to a wild start with three turnovers in a four-play span. Baylor's **Kendall Wright** had a reception for 17 yards before fumbling at the end of the play. **Mikail Baker** intercepted a pass by Fanuzzi on the next play to give the Bears the ball back.

But Baylor coughed it up again two plays later when Griffin III's pass was intercepted by Chris Jammer.

The Owls took advantage of that mistake, making it 20-6 early on a 43-yard field goal.

Griffin III found **Linear Sampson** on a 47-yard pass that got the Bears to the 3-yard-line just before halftime. Baylor settled for a 20-yard field goal after an incomplete pass to lead 20-3 at halftime.

Griffin III didn't take long to get the Baylor offense going after the delay, finding Wright on a 40-yard touchdown pass about 7 1/2 minutes before halftime to push the lead to 14-3. That drive came after **Chance Casey** intercepted a pass by Fanuzzi.

Wright finished with seven receptions for 106 yards.

Jerod Monk put the Bears on top when he grabbed a 6-yard touchdown pass from Griffin to make it 7-3 with about three minutes left in the first quarter.

The Owls took an early 3-0 lead when Chris Boswell connected on a 42-yard field goal in the first quarter.

Baylor's **Aaron Jones** missed a field goal from 26 yards with about 10 minutes left in the game, but hit one from 37 that made it 30-13 with about 3 minutes left.

Robert Griffin III threw for a career-best 380 yards with two of his three touchdowns to Josh Gordon, who turned a short pass into a school-record 94-yarder, and Baylor beat Kansas 55-7 for its most lopsided conference victory ever.

The Bears had never won a Big 12 game by more than 28 points. Their largest conference margin had been a 47-point Southwest Conference victory over Arkansas in 1922.

Griffin III passed for 288 yards before halftime, only nine shy of his previous mark set in Baylor's last home game three weeks ago. He finished 26 of 36 and ran eight times for 64 yards with a 1-yard TD before coming out after three quarters.

His 444 total yards were a single-game school record, as were the 678 yards for the team.

Griffin III hit Gordon in stride in the end zone for a 39-yard TD on the opening drive. Late in the first half Griffin III dumped a pass in the right flat to Gordon, who avoided a desperate diving tackle attempt by a linebacker then sprinted untouched along the sideline in front of the Kansas bench for the 94-yarder.

The Jayhawks have never won in Waco, going 0-5 including losing all four since the inception of the Big 12 in 1996. No other league team has lost more than twice there in that span. The Jayhawks' losses there in 1998 and 2002 were the bookends to Baylor's 29-game conference losing streak.

Griffin III threw an 11-yard TD pass midway through the third quarter, though he went a lot farther. Griffin III went back to the 30 retrieving a snap over his head, then ran toward the left sideline fleeing defenders before throwing against his body to Terrance Williams wide open in the end zone.

When Kansas got the ball back, Tim Atchison intercepted a pass thrown by Jordan Webb and returned it 14 yards for a touchdown to make it 48-7.

Williams also caught a 50-yard touchdown on a double-pass play from fellow receiver Kendall Wright.

Griffin's 1-yard keeper early in the second quarter put Baylor up 17-0, though he had to do it twice after officials nullified the first one because they were reviewing a 34-yard catch by Williams on the previous play.

Aaron Jones kicked a 50-yard field goal on the final play of the first half for a 27-7 lead, after he had given the Bears a 10-0 lead less than five minutes into the game. His 10 field goals are already one more than two Baylor kickers combined for last season.

Robert Griffin III passed for a career-high 384 yards and tallied four touchdowns, but it was not enough as Baylor fell to Texas Tech 45-38 in the Texas Farm Bureau Insurance Shootout at the Cotton Bowl.

The Red Raiders were coming off consecutive losses to Texas and Iowa State. Texas Tech hadn't been 0-3 in league play since 1990 when it was a member of the now-defunct Southwest Conference.

Taylor Potts, who completed 15 straight passes at one point in the first half and finished 42-of-59, guided an offense which gained 635 total yards.

Baylor has dropped 15 consecutive games to Texas Tech. The Bears were looking to start 5-1 for the first time since 1994, the last year they played in a bowl game.

Terrance Ganaway returned an onside kick for a touchdown and Griffin III's great performance included a 2-yard run that cut Texas Tech's lead to 45-38 early in the fourth quarter.

The Bears had chances to tie the game after that. They had a drive stall at the 16 when they couldn't convert fourth-and-15.

Baylor had one last opportunity when it took possession at its 34 with 57 seconds left. The Bears drove to the Tech 31, but time expired before they got off a final play.

The Red Raiders led 35-28 at halftime and quickly built on their advantage in the third quarter.

Matt Williams kicked a 30-yard field goal and Potts went 6-of-8 on an 84-yard touchdown drive. Baron Batch caught a 7-yard pass to make it 45-28.

Texas Tech's Detron Lewis had 11 receptions for 95 yards and Batch rushed for 97.

Potts, who was 25 of 32 for 306 yards in the first half, threw a 3-yard scoring pass to Alex Torres that gave the Red Raiders a 28-21 lead in the second quarter. Torres also had a 1-yard TD in the opening quarter.

Kendall Wright, who had 145 yards receiving and tied a career high with 11 receptions, hauled in a 62-yard touchdown pass from Griffin III to bring Baylor within 35-28 with 1:17 left in the first half.

The teams combined for 685 total yards in the first half, with Texas Tech gaining 418 of those.

The Bears went 82 yards on its opening drive, which was capped by Griffin III's 1-yard sneak. The Red Raiders answers when Eric Stephens broke free for a 10-yard touchdown run on fourth-and-1.

Baylor's special teams was also successful on a fake punt which led to Griffin III's 34-yard touchdown pass to Josh Gordon, putting the Bears on top 21-14.

Batch broke three tackles on a 37-yard TD run which evened it at 21 with 10:53 left in the first half.

Jay Finley rushed for a career-high 143 yards and Chance Casey batted down a last-second pass in the end zone, helping Baylor to a 31-25 win over Colorado in the final meeting between the two schools as members of the Big 12.

The Bears fended off a late charge by the Buffaloes, who had the ball on the 19-yard line with five seconds remaining, only to have Casey knock away a pass intended for Toney Clemons.

Robert Griffin III was his typical hard-to-defend self, high-stepping his way to 137 yards rushing and throwing for another 234. He entered the game fourth in the nation in total offense, averaging 329 yards a game.

Rodney Stewart had a big day for the Buffaloes, gaining 125 yards and scoring twice. Quarterback Tyler Hansen bounced back from being benched late in last weekend's 26-0 loss at Missouri. He finished with 207 yards passing and one touchdown, a seven-yard strike to Scotty McKnight with 5:14 remaining to draw the Buffaloes to within 28-25.

But the Bears responded with a drive that resulted in a 38-yard field goal by Aaron Jones, his third of the night.

Finley gave the Buffs fits, scoring twice. It was part of a huge day on the ground for the Bears, who finished with a season-high 309 yards rushing.

Baylor took a 21-15 lead it wouldn't relinquish late in the third quarter on a 17-yard run by Finley and Griffin III's scramble into the end zone on a 2-point attempt.

It was quite a momentum shift after the Buffs were on the cusp of increasing their lead moments earlier. But as tailback Will Jefferson was stumbling toward the goal line, Baylor stripped the football from him, forcing a touchback.

Usually a receiver, Jefferson was switched to the backfield this week after Brian Lockridge was lost for the season to an ankle injury.

The speedy Stewart showed off his elusiveness in the first half, darting right and then cutting back left for an 18-yard score in the first quarter. He later made a Baylor defender miss near the goal line and dove for the pylon for a 6-yard TD.

After Stewart's first score, coach Dan Hawkins gambled and attempted a 2-point conversion. He sent out his son and backup quarterback Cody, whose pass was low and incomplete.

Colorado went for two points again in the second quarter, only to have Hansen tackled short of the end zone.

The Bears were held scoreless in the opening period, breaking a string of 12 straight quarters in which they had put points on the board. They fumbled once in Colorado territory and turned the ball over on downs during another trip.

That trend didn't spill over into second quarter as Griffin found tight end Jerod Monk for a nine-yard TD score.

Jay Finley rushed for a school-record 250 yards, Robert Griffin III threw for a career-high 404 yards and four touchdowns and Baylor became bowl eligible for the first time since joining the Big 12, beating Kansas State 47-42.

Baylor (6-2, 3-1) has not played in a bowl game since 1994, back when the Bears were a member of the now defunct Southwest Conference.

Griffin III was 26 of 38 passing and Finley averaged 9.6 yards per carry to key an offense which gained 683 yards, breaking a school record that was set three weeks ago.

One week after thumping rival Kansas 59-7, the Wildcats (5-2, 2-2) missed out on becoming bowl eligible. Kansas State hasn't played in the postseason since 2006.

Josh Gordon and Kendall Wright each had two receiving touchdowns as the Bears scored on eight of their first 10 possessions.

William Powell returned a kickoff 100 yards for a touchdown and Daniel Thomas rushed for 113 yards and two scores for the Wildcats.

Powell's kickoff return brought the Wildcats within 34-28.

Kansas State caught a break when Finley fumbled just before getting to the end zone on an 82-yard run. Finley was originally ruled down, but Kansas State got the ball after the call was reversed.

The Wildcats didn't score on their next two drives and the Bears were able to pull away.

Finley powered in for a 2-yard touchdown run, his second of the game, and Griffin III threw a 30-yard touchdown pass to Wright to extend Baylor's lead to 47-28 early in the fourth.

Quarterback Carson Coffman's 1-yard touchdown run made it 47-42 with 7 seconds left. Baylor recovered an onside kick and took a knee on the final snap to clinch things, setting off a celebration where hundreds of students stormed the field after the final horn sounded.

Baylor, which once had a 30-game conference losing streak, is the only Big 12 school that hasn't played in a bowl game.

The game was delayed 1 hour, 47 minutes because of a thunderstorm. Four plays into the game, lightning was spotted in the area and players and coaches were sent back to their locker rooms.

When play resumed, Baylor's big-play offense went to work as it piled up 387 yards in the first half.

Griffin III, who tossed a 52-yard touchdown pass to Wright earlier in the second quarter, hooked up with Gordon on a 47-yard scoring pass that gave Baylor the lead for good at 28-21 with 4:17 left in the first half.

Griffin has thrown for 10 touchdowns of 40 yards or longer this season, including six of more than 50.

Robert Griffin III passed for two touchdowns and ran for another in leading No. 25 Baylor to a 30-22 win over Texas, the Bears' first over the Longhorns since 1997.

Baylor trailed 19-10 early in the third quarter before Jay Finley ran 69 yards for a touchdown. Griffin III then scored on a 1-yard touchdown and hit Kendall Wright with a 30-yard scoring pass in the fourth.

Baylor (7-2, 4-1) got its first win in Austin since 1991 and stays in first place in the Big 12 South. Texas (4-4, 2-3) looked in control when Garrett Gilbert scored on a 20-yard run in the third, but dropped its third consecutive home loss.

Finley rushed for 116 yards on 15 carries. Griffin III passed for 219 yards and also had a 59-yard TD strike to Terrance Williams in the first half.

Justin Tucker tied a Texas record with five field goals.

Baylor came in ranked for the first time since 1993, but still in search of a win that would make them legitimate contenders for the South division title.

A second-half rally in Austin should prove the Bears are for real.

Baylor's defense kept Texas out of the end zone after long drives and came up with a big turnover that helped give Baylor the lead. On offense, Griffin III & Co., just kept making the big plays.

And just like UCLA and Iowa State before them this season, the Bears sprinted to the corner of the end zone for visiting fans to celebrate what is probably the program's biggest win under third-year coach Art Briles.

Texas led 9-3 before Griffin III hit Williams with the long TD strike in the second quarter. The pass only covered about 10 yards in the air but Williams made Texas safety Blake Gideon miss and had no one else to beat over the final 45 yards to the end zone.

Gilbert drove Texas to the go-ahead field goal before halftime and put Texas up by nine with his scrambling run for a touchdown on the first drive of the third.

But on Texas next possession, a big hit on Greg Smith forced an interception by Antonio Johnson that set up Baylor inside the Texas 20. Baylor converted a fourth-and-1 on the Texas 2.

Griffin III scored on the first play of the fourth quarter. The touchdown pass to Wright put the Bears up 30-19 with 8:38 to play.

NOTES

- Baylor is 7-2 for the first time since 1991.
- The four conference wins are the most by a Baylor team in the Big 12 era.
- It was the first win for Baylor against Texas since 1997 and first win in Austin since 1991.
- TB Jay Finley is the first Baylor player with three straight 100-yard rushing games since Rashad Armstrong in 2003.
- Robert Griffin III broke Shawn Bell's school record for career passing touchdowns.
- Griffin III also broke Baylor's single-season total offense record.

After being held scoreless in the first half, Baylor scored 28 second-half points, but it was not enough as the 22nd-ranked Bears dropped a 55-28 Big 12 South contest at No. 19 Oklahoma State.

Justin Blackmon had 173 yards receiving and a touchdown and also scored on a 69-yard run in his return from a suspension. Brandon Weeden threw for a school-record 435 yards and three scores and Kendall Hunter ramed in a pair of 1-yard touchdown runs for Oklahoma State (8-1, 4-1 Big 12), which opened a 34-0 lead as it moved past the Bears (7-3, 4-2) in the conference standings.

The Bears and Cowboys were picked to finish at bottom of the division at the start of the season.

Weeden was 34 for 42 to break the school record for completions in a game. He threw an 8-yard pass to Chelf to start the Cowboys' final drive and break Zac Robinson's record of 430 yards against Texas in 2007.

Until midway through the third quarter, only one of the Big 12's top two offenses could get anything done.

The Cowboys pulled out to a 24-0 halftime lead by scoring on four of their six first-half possessions — and they had chances to score on the other two.

Weeden's would-be touchdown pass down the right sideline dropped in over Blackmon's shoulder and went through his arms before falling in complete, and kicker Dan Bailey was wide right from 31 yards out to end the half. It was his first miss in 11 field goal tries this season.

The Cowboys still had plenty of cushion, though.

Blackmon caught a 5-yard TD pass on a fade from Weeden in the back, right corner of the end zone to go with Hunter's two first-half TDs.

Johnny Thomas then prevented the Bears from getting on the scoreboard by cutting in front of a seemingly open Krys Buerck in the end zone to intercept Robert Griffin III's pass for Baylor's third turnover of the half. Brodrick Brown also stripped Josh Gordon and Shaun Lewis knocked the ball free from Finley.

Blackmon tacked on another score on the first play of the second half, taking a pitch from Weeden and racing 69 yards down the left sideline for his first career rushing touchdown. He was leading the nation in TD catches this season before adding his 15th against the Bears.

Bailey's 23-yard field goal made it 34-0 before Baylor finally was able to respond.

Griffin III had 267 yards on 30 for 48 passing but Baylor's dual-threat quarterback was largely contained by the Cowboys.

Terrance Ganaway and Jay Finley each had two rushing TDs for the Bears, which were seeking their first four-game conference winning streak since 1986-87.

NOTES

- Oklahoma State leads the series 17-12, including a 10-5 mark in Stillwater.
- Baylor is 5-68 all-time against the Big 12 South (Baylor is 13-32 all-time against the Big 12 North).
- Baylor was held under 30 points in a Big 12 game for the first time this season. It snapped a streak of six straight games with 30+ points.
- Baylor allowed its most points in a game since Oct. 13, 2007, at Kansas (58).
- TB Jay Finley has scored a rushing touchdown in four straight games (seven TDs during streak). He's the first Baylor player to do so since Robert Griffin III had six straight games with a rushing TD in 2008.
- Finley's 904 rushing yards rank eighth on Baylor's single-season list.
