HEAD COACH KIM MULKEY

When Women's Basketball Hall of Famer Kim Mulkey accepted the position of women's basketball head coach at Baylor University, few could have predicted the dramatic and prestigious turn the program was about to take. In just nine years at Baylor, the former All-American and Olympic Gold medalist has guided the Lady Bear basketball program to the pinnacle of women's basketball, the 2005 NCAA national championship, eight NCAA Tournament appearances and nine 20-win seasons.

The 2005 national title was Baylor's first for a women's team sport and the first basketball national title, men's or women's, in the Big 12 Conference's 13-year history.

In winning the 2005 title, Mulkey became the first person, man or woman, to win a basketball national championship as a player, assistant coach and head coach.

En route to the NCAA championship, the Lady Bears won their first Big 12 Conference championship and were the league's tournament champion as well. Baylor claimed another Big 12 title by winning the league's 2009 postseason tournament.

Mulkey has produced amazing results since taking over the reins of the program on April 4, 2000, averaging 26.3 wins a season. In her 10 years at the program's helm, she has posted an impressive 238-

67 (.780) record which ranks her No. 4 nationally in winning percentage. In addition, the Lady Bear program ranks No. 6 among the NCAA Division I's winningest teams over that span.

Since taking over a squad that was just 7-20 the season prior to her arrival, Mulkey has guided the Lady Bears to nine postseason appearances, including eight NCAA Tournaments and a trip to the 2003 WNIT finals.

Mulkey's autobiography, "Won't Back Down," hit bookstores on Nov. 1, 2007, the paperback edition became available on Sept. 8, 2008.

Since coming into the league in 2000-01, Kim Mulkey owns the top winning percentage and most victories among Big 12 coaches at 78.0 percent (238-67).

The Lady Bears...

- § Baylor returns one starter (**Kelli Griffin**) and eight letterwinners from its 2009 NCAA Sweet 16 team which finished the season 29-6.
- § Junior point guard **Kelli Griffin** (26 starts) is Baylor's lone returning starter, however, senior forward **Morghan Medlock** (5), junior guard **Melissa Jones** (10) and sophomore post **Ashley Field** (7) saw considerable court time in 2008-09, combining for 48 starts on the year.
- § Five newcomers, which comprised the nation's consensus No. 1-rated recruiting class, will don the green and gold for the first time this season — **Mariah Chandler**, **Brittney Griner**, **Kimetria Hayden**, **Jordan Madden** and **Shanay Washington**.
- § Baylor was tabbed the favorite in the 2009-10 Big 12 Women's Basketball Preseason Coaches Poll.
- § Four Lady Bears are averaging double-digit scoring. Junior guard **Melissa Jones** leads the team with 15.0 points a game while freshman guard **Jordan Madden** averages 13.5, freshman post **Brittney Griner** tallies 12.5 and the team's lone senior, **Morghan Medlock**, is averaging a double-double with 11.5 points and 11.5 rebounds.
- § Against eighth-ranked Tennessee, eight of the 10 players that saw game action got on the scoreboard. In fact, all five freshmen played with four (Griner 15, Jordan Madden 6, Shanay Washington and Kimetria Hayden 3 each) popping in points.
- § All 13 players saw extensive playing time against Tennessee Tech and everyone scored. Freshman Jordan Madden led all scorers with 21. As a group the freshmen combined for 50 points, 24 rebounds, nine blocks, nine assists and eight steals.
- § Freshman post **Brittney Griner**, the nation's consensus No. 1 recruit, was named Preseason Big 12 Conference Freshman of the Year by the league's coaches.
- § 5-10 guard **Melissa Jones'** 210 rebounds as a sophomore rank her No. 7 on Baylor's sophomore class list, tying her with former 6-3 Lady Bear post Danielle Wilson.
- § The Lady Bears return 39.8 percent of their scoring (966 of 2,427 points) and 43.9 percent of their rebounding (605 of 1,337 rebounds).

No. 1 Recruiting Class...

- § Baylor's incoming 2009 recruiting class was ranked as the nation's consensus No. 1 class according to *USA Today*. The publication compiled the rankings of the top recruiting services, *Collegiate Girls Basketball Report* (BU #1), ESPN's *HoopGurlz* (BU #1) and *Blue Star Basketball* (BU #2) to determine the nation's best recruiting class.
- § Led by the nation's top prep player, 6-8 post **Brittney Griner**, the Lady Bears also inked 6-2 forward **Mariah Chandler**, 5-11 guard **Kimetria "Nae-Nae" Hayden**, 6-0 guard **Jordan Madden** and 6-1 guard **Shanay Washington**.
- § The Women's Basketball Coaches Association named Griner the 2009 State Farm/WBCA High School Player of the Year after averaging 27 points, 13 rebounds and 11 blocks a game. Also, Griner was named a 2009 McDonald's All-American. In addition, Chandler and Griner were two of 20 prep players selected to play in the WBCA High School All-America Game.

Freshmen Producing...

- § Against Tennessee Tech, Baylor's freshman class produced encouraging results. Brittney Griner narrowly missed a triple-double with 10 points, 11 rebounds and eight blocks, while guards Jordan Madden, Shanay Washington and Kimetria "Nae-Nae" Hayden had 21, 10 and seven points, respectively. As a group, including 6-2 forward Mariah Chandler, the freshmen combined for 50 points, 24 rebounds, nine blocks, nine assists and eight steals.

McDonald's All-Americans...

- § Baylor's 2009-10 roster features three McDonald's All-Americans while one more (**Brooklyn Pope**, 2008), will sit out this season to satisfy NCAA transfer requirements.
- § Senior **Morghan Medlock** was a 2006 selection and freshmen **Brittney Griner** and **Mariah Chandler** were honored in 2009.

Nearing 250 Victories...

- § Head coach **Kim Mulkey** entered the 2009-10 season with 237 wins to her credit at the helm of the Lady Bear basketball program. Mulkey is the winningest coach in school history.
- § With 238 victories on her resume, Mulkey is 12 wins shy of reaching 250 victories as Baylor's head coach. She was the sixth-fastest NCAA Division I coach to reach 200 victories.

Over Achievers?...

- § For the sixth straight year, the Lady Bears were selected by the league's coaches to finish among the top four in the Big 12 women's basketball regular season race. The coaches tabbed the Lady Bears as favorites to win the 2010 regular season title.
- § In 2008-09 the Big 12 coaches picked Baylor to finish fourth in the league's annual preseason poll. Oklahoma, Texas and Iowa State were tabbed to finish ahead of Baylor. As usual, the Lady Bears, with their second-place finish, exceeded the coaches' expectations. Only once over the past six seasons has Baylor finished below the coaches' predictions:

California Golden Bears...

§ The California Golden Bears enter the contest hosting their third straight home game when they take on the Lady Bears. The Golden Bears have posted victories over Idaho State (100-43) and Saint Mary's, 68-65. Against Saint Mary's, freshman Layshia Clarendon hit a go-ahead jumper with 48 seconds left and a free throw with seven seconds remaining to earn the Cal victory.

§ Head coach Joanne Boyle is in her fifth season along the Cal sideline and sports a 97-35 record. She is in her eighth season as a head coach with a career record of 164-64.

§ A glance at the Cal roster reveals six freshmen, one junior and four seniors while its starting lineup features three seniors and two freshmen.

§ Senior guard Natasha Vital leads the Golden Bears in scoring with 16.5 a contest while freshman center DeNesha Stallworth follows at 13.5 and senior Alexis Gray-Lawson manages 12.5 a contest. Three Bears average 8.5 or more rebounds a game, freshmen center Talia Caldwell and forward Gennifer Brandon share the team lead at 8.5 a contest each, while Stallworth manages 8.0 an outing.

Series Record...

§ Baylor holds a 2-1 series lead over Cal, both wins have come with Kim Mulkey as Baylor's head coach. The two squads most recent meeting came in Waco on Nov. 25, 2007, when Baylor posted a 69-56 win. The Lady Bears also downed the Golden Bears on Nov. 26, 2005, 75-68, in the Caribbean Classic at Riviera Maya, Mexico. Cal's lone win, an 82-72 triumph, came on Feb. 26, 1981 in Amarillo, Texas, as part of the National Women's Invitational Tournament.

Versus the Pacific-10 Conference...

§ Baylor owns a 17-9 record against Pacific-10 Conference teams, including a 2-1 mark against California.

Mulkey vs. Ranked Opponents...

§ In head coach Kim Mulkey's 10 seasons, Baylor is 49-46 against ranked opponents. Since a 69-55 loss to No. 15 Texas during the 2004-05 season, Baylor is 34-22 versus ranked opponents.

Home, Sweet Home...

§ In **Kim Mulkey's** nine seasons along the Ferrell Center sideline, her teams have posted some impressive numbers in the venue. The Lady Bears have maintained a 129-17 (.884) Ferrell Center record during that time span. Mulkey's first three seasons produced a 44-8 (.849) Ferrell Center mark while over the past six years the Lady Bears are 85-9 (.904).

§ The Lady Bears have won 73 of their last 80 home games, including 31 of their last 34.

§ Last season, Baylor finished with a 14-2 home record.

Hall of Fame Coaches...

§ With Kim Mulkey and Leon Barmore on the Lady Bear coaching staff, Baylor is one of just two women's programs with at least two Women's Basketball Hall of Fame members on its 2009-10 staff.

§ Head coach Kim Mulkey was enshrined in 2000, while Barmore entered the Hall in 2003. In addition, Barmore was a 2003 inductee into the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame.

Louisiana Tech Connection...

§ When Baylor hosts Louisiana Tech on Dec. 5 (FSSW) there will be numerous Louisiana Tech-Baylor connections on the floor. Baylor head coach Kim Mulkey played four years at Louisiana Tech and coached there for 15 seasons prior to coming to Baylor. BU assistant Leon Barmore was the Lady Techster's head coach for 20 seasons, and current Louisiana Tech head coach Teresa Weatherspoon played for both Barmore and Mulkey there.

BU in the Polls...

§ The Lady Bears entered the season ranked No. 7 in the AP Top 25 preseason poll. The No. 7 ranking marked the program's third top 10 preseason AP debut, as the Lady Bears were No. 6 in 2006-07 and No. 8 in 2004-05.

§ Baylor dropped one spot, to No. 8, after a 74-65 loss at then-eighth ranked Tennessee.

§ The Lady Bears currently rank No. 9 in the *USA Today* ESPN Coaches' poll.

§ BU began the 2009-10 season ranked No. 4 in the *USA Today* ESPN Division I Top 25 Coaches' preseason poll. The Lady Bears debut in the Coaches' poll top 10 for the third time in program history and their No. 4 ranking is their highest initial ranking.

§ Baylor finished No. 5 in the 2008-09 Associated Press Top 25 final poll. BU has spent 19 straight weeks in the top 10 and in 22 of the last 32 polls dating back to 2007-08. The Lady Bears have finished the season ranked among the AP's top 10 three times, No. 5 in 2004-05, No. 5 in 2008-09 and No. 10 in 2005-06.

§ The Lady Bears have 134 AP Top 25 poll appearances in the 2000s, all of which have come under head coach Kim Mulkey, to rank No. 12 on the wire service's all-time list.

§ BU has been ranked in a school-record 113 straight AP polls dating back to week nine of the 2003-04 listing when it broke

10 minutes left in the eight-ranked Lady Bears' 100-55 victory over Tennessee Tech.

When the 6-foot-8 Griner tried a right-handed slam just over 3 minutes into the second half, the ball caromed off the back of the rim. She got the ball right back and was fouled on a putback try, then made one of the free throws to put Baylor up 51-29.

The Lady Bears (1-1) had stretched the lead to 65-38 by time she fouled out with 10:10 left. Coach Kim Mulkey had purposely left Griner in after her fourth foul only 38 seconds earlier.

When Griner committed her fifth foul and went to the bench, Mulkey met her and tenderly spoke with her.

"Teaching her how to play in games, where she has three (fouls), making her stay in there when she has four so she will learn next time she's in that situation," Mulkey said. "Can I stay in the game, can I have confidence in your as a coach that you won't foul out and you'll keep playing good defense? That was the whole purpose of leaving her in there."

While Baylor appeared to be trying to get the ball inside to Griner several times, she had a rough shooting night (3 of 9) and wasn't able to get a dunk against the Golden Eagles (1-2), whose 10-player traveling squad consisted of seven freshmen and three sophomores--all of them at least eight inches shorter than Griner.

Jordan Madden, another of Baylor's five freshmen, had 21 points to lead five Lady Bears in double figures. Ashley Field had 16 points, lone senior Morghan Medlock had 13 points and 10 rebounds, and Shanay Washington had 10 points.

Krystal Stirrup led Tennessee Tech with 19 points.

The Golden Eagles' only lead was 3-2 when Kylie Cook, who finished with 12 points on four 3-pointers, hit her first one on their opening shot of the game. Medlock's two free throws put Baylor back ahead, and the Lady Bears had already stretched the lead to 22-10 when Madden hit a 3-pointer midway through the first half.
