The fifth-ranked Baylor Lady Bears, 29-5 on the season and winners of six straight games, advanced to the NCAA Tournament's Sweet 16 for the first time since 2006 with an overtime victory over UT-San Antonio (87-82) and a 60-58 win over 16th-ranked South Dakota State.

Baylor, a No. 2 seed, is competing in its sixth straight and eighth all-time NCAA Tournament, as all eight appearances have come since head coach Kim Mulkey assumed the program's helm. BU is 15-5 in NCAA Tournament games including 7-1 in first round games, 4-3 in second round games, 1-2 in the Sweet 16, 1-0 in the Elite Eight, 1-0 in the semifinals and 1-0 in championship games.

The Lady Bears, a No. 2 seed for the third time in program history, are making their fourth Sweet 16 appearance. Baylor secured the program's second automatic bid after claiming the Big 12 Championship with a 72-63 victory over 10th-ranked Texas A&M in the title game, March 14.

Baylor advances to the NCAA Tournament's Sweet 16 for the fourth time in program history and first time since 2006. A victory on Saturday afternoon over No. 3 seed Louisville would propel the Lady Bears into the regional finals for the second time in program history and the first since the 2005 NCAA title.

The seventh-ranked Louisville Cardinals enter the contest at 31-4 after first- and second-round victories over Liberty (62-42) and LSU (62-52), respectively, in Baton Rouge, La. The Cardinals are led by BIG EAST Defensive Player of the Year and All-BIG EAST performer Angel McCoughtry, a 6-1, senior forward, who leads the team in both scoring and rebounding with 23.3 points and 9.1 rebounds a game.

HEAD COACH KIM MULKEY

When Women's Basketball Hall of Famer Kim Mulkey accepted the position of women's basketball head coach at Baylor University, few could have predicted the dramatic and prestigious turn the program was about to take. In just eight years at Baylor, the former All-American and Olympic Gold medalist has guided the Lady Bear basketball program to the pinnacle of women's basketball, the 2005 NCAA national championship, eight NCAA Tournament appearances and nine 20-win seasons.

The 2005 national title was Baylor's first for a women's team sport and the first basketball national title, men's or women's, in the Big 12 Conference's 12-year history.

In winning the 2005 title, Mulkey became the first person, man or woman, to win a basketball national championship as a player, assistant coach and head coach.

En route to the NCAA championship, the Lady Bears won their first Big 12 Conference championship and were the league's tournament champion as well. Baylor claimed another Big 12 title by winning the league's 2009 postseason tournament.

Mulkey has produced amazing results since taking over the reins of the program on April 4, 2000, averaging 26.3 wins a season. In her nine years at the program's helm, she has posted an impressive 237-65 (.785) record which ranks her No. 8 nationally in winning percentage.

Since taking over a squad that was just 7-20 the season prior to her arrival, Mulkey has guided the Lady Bears to nine postseason appearances, including eight NCAA Tournaments and a trip to the 2003 WNIT finals.

Mulkey's autobiography, "Won't Back Down," hit bookstores on Nov. 1, 2007, the paperback edition became available on Sept. 8, 2008.

Since coming into the league in 2000-01, Kim Mulkey owns the top winning percentage and most victories among Big 12 coaches at 78.5 percent (237-65).

In addition, under Mulkey, BU has won at least 24 games in each of the last eight years, the league's longest active 20-game win streak and with 12 Big 12 wins this season, Mulkey has now registered 10 or more league wins in seven of her nine seasons at Baylor, including six straight campaigns. Next best is Kansas State, Oklahoma and Texas A&M, who have won 10 or more games four times during the six-year period.

In 28 seasons as a player and coach, Mulkey is making her 27th trip to the NCAA/AIAW Tournament.

SINCE WILSON'S INJURY

Since junior post Danielle Wilson's knee injury, Feb. 28, the Lady Bears have posted a 7-1 record which includes five victories over top 25 ranked opponents (No. 16 Texas, No. 10 Texas A&M [twice], No. 18 Iowa State, No. 16 South Dakota State), a Big 12 Conference postseason tournament championship and a trip to the NCAA Tournament's Sweet 16.

Over those seven games, Jessica Morrow has led the team with 13.0 points a game while Jhasmin Player has contributed 12.5, Morghan Medlock comes off the bench to score 9.5, Melissa Jones adds 9.3 and Kelli Griffin manages 8.9. Rebounding has been balanced as Rachel Allison hauls down 8.0 a game while Melissa Jones averages 7.9, Player 6.6 and Medlock 4.4.

LADY BEAR LEADERS

With 34 games under its belt, Baylor continues to rank among the Big 12 Conference leaders in rebounding and is No. 8 nationally in rebounding margin (+8.5). Four players haul down 5.6 or more rebounds a contest, junior post Danielle Wilson leads the way with 9.6, senior post Rachel Allison ranks second on the squad with 6.4 and sophomore guard Melissa Jones hauls in 6.0 while senior guard Jhasmin Player manages 5.7. The Lady Bears average 43.1 rebounds a contest while limiting their opponents to just 35.2.

Wilson, currently sidelined by a knee injury, leads the team in both scoring and rebounding at 15.1 points and 9.6 boards a game while senior guard Jessica Morrow ranks second on the team in scoring at 11.4 a contest and Player completes Baylor's double-digit scorers at 10.7 a game.

BAYLOR QUICK HITS

- All three of Baylor's seniors, Rachel Allison, Jessica Morrow and Jhasmin Player, are scheduled to graduate in May 2009. The trio has posted a 106-27 (.797) record, including a 59-7 (.894) Ferrell Center mark, throughout their four years. This class has posted three Big 12 Conference second-place finishes, one third-place finish, a Big 12 Championship postseason tournament championship (2009) and two Sweet 16 appearances (2006, 2009).
- Senior Jhasmin Player now ranks No. 10 on BU's all-time steals list with 192. In addition, she needs 15 points to reach 1,000 for her career.
- Sophomore Melissa Jones entered the South Dakota State game having made 31 consecutive free throws since a first-half miss at Texas; with six makes to begin the game, she set a Baylor record of 37 consecutive free throws made, bettering Jessica Stratton's 32 straight makes, set in the 2004-05 season.
- Baylor has led at the half in 29 of 34 games this season and is 26-3 when leading at the half.
- BU is 28-0 on the season when scoring 60-plus points, 1-5 when totaling 59 or fewer points. In its five losses this year, BU has averaged 53.45 points per game. In those same five games, the Lady Bears yielded 61.6 points per game.
- Baylor is 10-3 versus ranked opponents this season and 4-2 against top 10 teams.
- Baylor has outrebounded its opponent in 25 of 34 games this year. The 2008-09 Lady Bears rank No. 8 nationally in rebound margin.
- BU has won at least 24 games in each of the last eight years, the league's longest active 20-game win streak. The Lady Bears have posted nine consecutive 20-win seasons all told. In addition they have posted

20-win seasons in each of last nine seasons and six straight 25-plus win seasons.

- Danielle Wilson eclipsed the 100,000 mark in home attendance for the fourth straight season with 104,925 fans in 2008-09. The ranks as the third-highest single-season total in school history and is also No. 3 in attendance average at 6,558 fans per contest.

- Danielle Wilson was one of 30 players named to the mid-season Naismith Award list, one of 19 named to the Wooden Award ballot and was a WBCA All-Region 5 selection.

- With 12 Big 12 wins this season, Kim Mulkey has now registered 10 or more league wins in seven of her nine seasons at Baylor, including six straight campaigns. Next best is Kansas State, Oklahoma and Texas A&M, who have won 10 or more games four times during the six-year period.

- Six Lady Bears were named to the fall Big 12 Commissioner's Honor Roll.

- Prior to her knee injury versus Texas on Feb. 28, Wilson had, over the previous 21 games, averaged 16.4 points, 10.2 rebounds and 3.3 blocks. In addition, she had posted a double-double in 16 of those 21 contests.

- Wilson ranks No. 4 on the Big 12's career shot block chart (249).

- Wilson ranks No. 1 in the Big 12 Conference and No. 8 nationally in blocks per game (3.1).

- Wilson leads the team in double-doubles with 16 (Wisconsin, Lamar, Samford, UT-Pan Am, Oregon, Iowa State, Oklahoma State [twice], Texas A&M, Texas Tech [twice], Texas, Nebraska, Kansas State, Missouri, Oklahoma).

- The Lady Bears own the Big 12's top two team rebounding marks this season. They hauled down 70 against Florida Atlantic (Nov. 14) and 64 versus Lamar (Dec. 8).

- Baylor has equaled or topped the 50-rebound mark eight times this season (Florida Atlantic-70; Rice-52; UCF-50; Lamar-64; UT-Pan Am-50, Oklahoma State-51 [twice], Texas Tech (50).

- Baylor tallied a school record 70 rebounds versus an NCAA opponent in its win over Florida Atlantic.

- Allison has four double-doubles to her credit this season, two of which have been recorded by halftime (Florida Atlantic, Rice).

- After achieving its highest Associated Press ranking of the season at No. 4 in the Jan. 26 listing, Baylor is No. 5 in the AP's final poll. BU has spent 18 straight weeks in the top 10 and in 21 of the last 31 polls dating back to last year. The Lady Bears have finished the season ranked among the AP's top 10 three times, No. 5 in 2004-05, No. 5 in 2008-09 and No. 10 in 2005-06. Baylor is No. 5 in the latest *USA Today* ESPN Coaches' Poll.

- The then-19th-ranked Lady Bears downed No. 2 Stanford, 81-65, on Nov. 16. BU's victory over No. 2 Stanford marked the program's highest-ranked regular-season win ever.

- Baylor has registered a win streak of at least 10-straight games in each of the last five seasons, including 2008-09. All told, BU has had at least one 10-game win streak in seven of Kim Mulkey's nine seasons in Waco. Prior to her arrival Baylor had only recorded one double-digit win streak in school history.

- Baylor is 140-30 (.824) since the start of the 2004-05 season with 22 of the 30 setbacks coming at the hands of nationally ranked opponents.

- Baylor is 177-13 (.932) under Coach Mulkey when scoring 70 or more points, including a 105-3 (.972) mark when putting 80 or more in the scoreboard.

- The Lady Bears have won 34 consecutive games when scoring more than 70 points since a 78-72 overtime loss to North Carolina State in the second-round of the 2007 NCAA Tournament at Raleigh, N.C. Baylor has also won 46 straight when scoring 80 or more since a 103-99 loss in triple overtime at Nebraska in 2004-05.

- Since coming into the league in 2000-01, Kim Mulkey owns the top winning percentage and most victories among Big 12 coaches at 78.5 percent (237-65). Please see chart at the bottom of page two for complete listing.

FOUR AT 1,000, IT COULD HAPPEN

Jhasmin Player is just 15 points shy of scoring her 1,000th career point. She will become the fourth Lady Bear this season and the 28th all-time to accomplish the feat. In addition, it will mark the first time in Baylor history and 15th time in NCAA Division I women's basketball history that four teammates achieved 1,000 career points in the same season.

Teammates Rachel Allison, Jessica Morrow and Danielle Wilson all recorded their 1,000th career point earlier this season.

SUPER SOPHOMORES

Baylor's sophomore guard tandem of Kelli Griffin and Melissa Jones have been producing impressive numbers in the NCAA Tournament. In Baylor's 87-82 victory over UTSA in first-round action, Jones scored a career-high 21 points while adding 10 rebounds, three assists and three steals. She was 6-of-11 from the floor, including 8-for-8 from the free throw line.

Against South Dakota State the tandem combined for 20 of Baylor's 28 first-half points, tallying 10 apiece. Griffin went on to score a career-high 21 points and added three rebounds, two assists and a steal in 38 minutes of action. She was 7-of-14 from the floor, 2-for-3 from 3-point range and 5-of-5 from the charity stripe. In addition, Griffin scored Baylor's winning bucket with 0.5 seconds left on the clock. Again, Jones turned in a good performance with 12 points, seven rebounds, two assists and three steals. The two players combined to shoot 10-for-19 (.526) from the floor, 11-of-12 (.917) from the free throw line and hauled down 10 of BU's 30 rebounds.

BENCH POINTS

During Baylor's five 2009 postseason games, the Lady Bear bench has scored 37.2 percent of the team's points, tallying 130 of 349 points. Of Baylor's 130 points during that span, Melissa Jones and Morghan Medlock have accounted for 119 points with 61 and 58, respectively.

ALL-AMERICAN CANDIDATE WILSON

Prior to her knee injury against Texas (Feb. 28), Baylor's Danielle Wilson, an All-American candidate, had been on a roll since the Lady Bears played Wisconsin. Over the 21 game time period, the junior post produced 16 double-doubles, led the team in scoring on 13 occasions and rebounding in 16 contests. In addition, against Texas State and again against Missouri, she poured in a career-high 26 points and at Texas Tech she hauled down a career-high 17 rebounds.

Over the 21 games she averaged a team-leading 16.4 points, 10.2 rebounds and 3.3 blocks.

Wilson has raised her season averages to 15.1 points and 9.6 rebounds a game, both of which lead the team. She has blocked a team-leading 83 shots which ranks her No. 1 in the Big 12 at 3.1 a contest.

Wilson has hauled down 258 rebounds, 126 (48.8 percent) of which are off the offensive glass.

As of games through March 24, Wilson ranks No. 8 nationally in blocked shots (3.1).

In addition, on Feb. 25 she became the third Lady Bear this season to achieve the 1,000 milestone and the 27th overall. She has now 1,015 points to her credit.

Wilson now ranks No. 4 on the Big 12 Conference's career blocks list with 249.

Wilson was recently named WBCA All-Region 5, first-team All-Big 12 and to the All-Big 12 Defensive team.

LET ME GUARD HER COACH

When deciding which player to assign to defend the opponent's top perimeter player, coach Mulkey often hears from 6-0 senior guard Jessica Morrow, "let me guard her coach." Morrow's long arms and lanky frame make her a daunting defender and she has often held her assigned player to well below her scoring average this season.

In addition, Morrow, who was recently received All-Big 12 Conference honorable mention honors and Most Outstanding Player of the Big 12 Championship, has stepped up her offensive production since the start of Big 12 play. Prior to entering league action, the 6-0 guard averaged 9.7 points a game to rank fourth on the squad in scoring. She has raised her season scoring average to 11.4 ppg which ranks No. 2 on the team. In Baylor's 16 league games, Morrow averaged 12.4 points a game. Against 18th-ranked Iowa State (March 14), Morrow poured in a season-high 24 points, including a career-high six treys.

OFF THE BENCH

Coming off the bench, sophomore guard Melissa Jones has proven to a valuable asset to the Lady Bears. Not only can she hit from the outside, but she can post-up, is one of the team's best rebounders and leads the squad in steals.

Her performance this season has earned her a share of the Big 12 Conference's Sixth Man Award.

The 5-10 Thornton, Colo., native is averaging 7.9 points and 6.0 rebounds while hitting 50.6 (81-160) percent from the floor, including 42.2 percent (19-45) from three-point range. She has dished out 53 assists and stolen the ball a team-high 50 times. Against 16th-ranked Texas (Feb. 28), Jones hauled down a career-high 15 rebounds and scored a career-high 21 points against UT-San Antonio.

"Rebounding is so much about heart and soul. It's about wanting the ball more than somebody else does," Texas head coach Gail Goestenkors said. "I pointed out that little Melissa Jones for them came off the bench and had double-figure rebounds. She just wanted the ball. I told our team that we'll be watching video of her, because that demonstrated she's not bigger than us, stronger than us, faster, doesn't jump as well. But she went in and wanted the ball."

SCOUTING THE CARDINALS

The seventh-ranked and third-seeded Louisville Cardinals enter the contest at 31-4 after first- and second-round victories over Liberty (62-42) and LSU (62-52), respectively, in Baton Rouge, La.

Louisville head coach Jeff Walz is in his second season on the Louisville campus with a record of 57-14 (.803). Prior to arriving at Louisville, Walz spent two seasons as an associate head/assistant coach at Maryland, and one as an assistant at Minnesota, five at Nebraska and two at Western Kentucky.

The Cardinals are led by BIG EAST Defensive Player of the Year and All-BIG EAST performer Angel McCoughtry, a 6-1, senior forward, who leads the team in both scoring and rebounding with 23.3 points and 9.1 rebounds a game. Senior forward Candyce Bingham, 6-1, ranks second in both categories with 12.4 points and 7.1 boards a contest.

SERIES RECORDS

This will be the first meeting between Louisville and Baylor. Maryland and BU have met once, the Terps defeated the Lady Bears, 82-63, in the 2006 NCAA Tournament's Sweet 16 in Albuquerque en route to the NCAA title. Vanderbilt and Baylor have never met.

COMMON OPPONENTS

Baylor and Louisville have no common opponents this season.

BAYLOR VERSUS POSTSEASON TEAMS

Baylor faced 12 opponents that are participating in postseason competition and holds a 15-4 record versus those teams. Baylor posted a 10-2 record against its seven former opponents playing in the NCAA Tournament: Iowa State (2-0), Kansas State (1-0), Oklahoma (0-2), Stanford (1-0), Texas (2-0), Texas A&M (3-0) and UCF (1-0). The Lady Bears are 5-2 against their five opponents participating in the Women's WNIT: Kansas (0-1), Nebraska (1-0), Oklahoma State (3-0), St. John's (1-0) and Wisconsin (0-1).

RBC CENTER - FAMILIAR DIGS

Baylor's senior class of Rachel Allison, Jessica Morrow and Jhasmin Player have all played two games in Raleigh's RBC Center. The then-sophomore trio faced Chattanooga and N.C. State in the RBC Center in first- and second-round action, respectively, of the 2007 NCAA Tournament.

The Lady Bears downed Chattanooga, 68-55, while Baylor dropped a 78-72 overtime decision to N.C. State

LEON BARMORE, SAME TOURNAMENT, DIFFERENT ROLE

First-year Baylor assistant coach Leon Barmore, a member of both the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame and Women's Basketball Hall of Fame, is coaching in his 21st NCAA Tournament but in a different capacity than previously. Barmore, in his 20 seasons as Louisiana Tech's head coach, guided the Lady Techsters to 20 NCAA Tournament trips, which included a national championship in 1988, four NCAA runner-up finishes and nine NCAA Final Fours.

With head coach Kim Mulkey being sidelined by a reaction to post-surgery medication, Barmore served as head coach in Baylor's NCAA Tournament first-round game, an overtime victory over UT-San Antonio.

VERSUS RANKED OPPONENTS

Baylor is 10-3 versus ranked opponents this season, 5-2 at home and 5-1 on the road. The Lady Bears own victories over No. 2 Stanford (81-65), No. 20 Iowa State (68-57 & 63-57), No. 22 Oklahoma State (75-57), No. 9 Texas A&M (64-61, 64-60, 72-63), No. 18 Kansas State (59-50), No. 16 Texas (66-57) and No. 16 South Dakota State (60-58), while losing to No. 2 Oklahoma (56-51 & 66-58) and No. 18 Texas (58-55). All rankings are listed at game time.

Baylor has five ranked road wins under its belt, at Texas A&M, at Texas, versus Iowa State (Big 12 Tournament), Texas A&M (Big 12 Tournament) and South Dakota State.

MULKEY VERSUS RANKED OPPONENTS

With Baylor's victories this season over second-ranked Stanford on Nov. 16, 2008, Iowa State on Jan. 14 and March 14, 2009, Oklahoma State on Jan. 19, Texas A&M on Jan. 21, March 7 and March 15, Kansas State on Feb. 7, Texas on Feb. 28 and March 24 over South Dakota State, head coach Kim Mulkey is now 49-44 against ranked opponents.

Since a 69-55 loss to No. 15 Texas during the 2004-05 season, Baylor is 34-20 versus ranked opponents.

VERSUS TOP 10 TEAMS

For the first time in program history, with wins over No. 2 Stanford (81-65), No. 9 Texas A&M (64-61) and No. 10 Texas A&M (64-60 & 72-63) the Lady Bears have posted more than one regular season victory over a top 10 team. In eight of head coach Kim Mulkey's nine seasons, Baylor has managed one regular season top 10 win. With its four so far this season, the Lady Bears have tied the school record for top 10 wins in a season. En route to the 2005 NCAA championship, the Lady Bears ended the year with four top 10 wins, three of which came in the NCAA Tournament.

Baylor is 4-2 versus top 10 teams in 2008-09. Baylor dropped two top 10 game this season, both to the second-ranked Oklahoma Sooners, 56-51, at Waco and 66-58 at Norman.

BAYLOR IN THE RANKINGS

In its March 17 poll, its final poll of the season, the Associated Press lists Baylor at No. 5, moving up two spots after claiming the Big 12 Championship with wins over Oklahoma State, No. 18 Iowa State and No. 10 Texas A&M. Baylor has been ranked in a school-record 109 straight AP polls dating back to week nine of the 2003-04 listing when it broke in at No. 24.

BU has spent 18 straight weeks in the top 10 and in 21 of the last 31 polls dating back to last year.

In the latest *USA Today* ESPN Division I Top 25 Coaches' poll, the Lady Bears are ranked No. 5.

LAST TIME OUT

LUBBOCK, Texas (AP) -- Baylor continues to thrive on adversity.

Kelli Griffin hit a floater from outside the lane on the right side with 0.5 seconds remaining to lift the second-seeded Bears past South Dakota State 60-58 on Tuesday night to advance to the regional semifinals.

Griffin scored 21 points to lead Baylor (29-5), which trailed for most of the game and rallied from 14 points down in the first half. The Bears, making their fourth trip to the round of 16, will face Louisville in Raleigh, N.C., on Saturday.

Jennifer Warkentien scored 18 points to lead the Jackrabbits (32-3), who failed on a desperate three-quarters-court pass to end the game.

"We just keep finding ways to win," said Baylor coach Kim Mulkey, who was hospitalized Sunday and didn't coach the Bears in their first-round game.

After Jessica Morrow gave Baylor its first lead of the game, 55-53, on 3-pointer from the corner with 2:57 remaining, Stacie Oistad pulled the Jackrabbits even at 55 on a layup.

Both teams failed to score on their next two possessions before Griffin hit a running layup with 40 seconds remaining to put Baylor up 57-55.

Warkentien missed a layup but was fouled and missed the second free throw of a 1-and-1. Rachel Allison, who left the game with an injury to her left knee about 3 minutes earlier but returned, got the rebound and was fouled.

She appeared to hurt the knee again and Whitney Zachariason shot Allison's free throws. Zachariason hit only the front end of a 1-and-1 and Jackrabbits redshirt freshman Jill Young got a layup at the other end to tie it at 58 with 7 seconds left.

That's when Griffin took over. She took the inbounds pass and went the length of the court before cutting toward the lane and letting the ball fly from outside the paint.

The Bears tied it at 36, on a layup by Griffin, and Baylor leveled it again at 47 and 49 but couldn't pull ahead.

Allison went down after fouling Warkenthien with 4:20 remaining with what appeared to be an injury to her left knee. That came in the midst of a 3-minute drought the Bears could ill afford to trail 53-49.

LADY BEARS EARN BIG 12 AWARDS

Junior Danielle Wilson was named to the 2008-09 Phillips 66 All-Big 12 First Team and to the league's All-Defensive Team, while seniors Rachel Allison, Jessica Morrow and Jhasmin Player earned honorable mention honors. In addition, sophomore Melissa Jones was one of two players voted to receive the Sixth Man Award. The official All-Big 12 awards are selected by the league's head coaches, with coaches not allowed to vote for their own players.

In addition, Morrow was named the Big 12 Championships' Most Outstanding Player and Player and Morghan Medlock were both named to the all-tournament team.

20 WINS AGAIN

Baylor head coach Kim Mulkey kept her 20-win streak intact. With the victory at Oklahoma State on Wednesday, Feb. 11, Baylor notched its ninth straight 20-win season and the program's 15th overall. The Lady Bears have recorded 20-wins in each of Mulkey's nine seasons at the helm, including 24 or more wins in each of the last eight seasons.

Baylor's 29 victories ranks as the second-most season wins under Mulkey. The only squad to post a better season record was the 2004-05 team's 33 wins, en route to claiming the NCAA championship.

WILSON NAMED TO MID-SEASON NAISMITH AWARD LIST, WOODEN BALLOT, WBCA ALL-REGION

Baylor junior post Danielle Wilson was selected one of 30 mid-season candidates for the 2009 Naismith Trophy presented by AT&T, which was announced by the Atlanta Tipoff Club on Feb. 25.

The list was voted on by the Atlanta Tipoff Club's Board of Selectors, comprised of the nation's leading basketball journalists, coaches and administrators. The board based its criteria on player performances this season. The vote was tabulated and certified by the accounting firm of Habif, Arogeti & Wynne, LLP. HA&W is the largest independent accounting firm in Georgia and one of the top 50 firms in the United States.

On March 12 it was announced that Wilson was one of just 19 players named to the final Wooden Award Ballot.

In addition she was named to the Women's Basketball Coaches Association's All-Region 5 team.

BAYLOR'S AP POLL HISTORY

Baylor's 132 Associated Press Top 25 poll appearances in the 2000s, all of which have come under head coach Kim Mulkey, rank No. 12 on the wire service's all-time list. The Lady Bears' average ranking during that time frame is 10.54. Tennessee and Connecticut top the 2000s list with 189 each.

According to the AP Poll Archives, Baylor's average rank (10.54) during the 2000s is the highest among the six Big 12 schools included in the AP's Top 25 listing: Baylor (10.54), Texas Tech (10.93), Oklahoma (11.52), Iowa State (12.21), Kansas State (13.28), Texas (13.76).

All told, the Lady Bears have appeared in the Associated Press Top 25 poll 148 times which ranks No. 32.

The Lady Bears have finished the season ranked among the AP's top 10 three times, No. 5 in 2004-05 and No. 5 in 2008-09 and No. 10 in 2005-06.

THREE LADY BEARS ACHIEVE 1,000 CAREER POINTS

Lady Bear senior Rachel Allison scored her 1,000th career point on Jan. 3 against Texas State. The forward/post from Jonesboro, Ark., became the 26th Lady Bear to attain the milestone and now has 1,124 career points to rank tied for 21st on Baylor's all-time list.

Fellow Lady Bear Jessica Morrow scored her 1,000th career point on Dec. 8, versus Lamar, and now has 1,305 points to rank 17th on Baylor's all-time.

Junior post Danielle Wilson became BU's latest player to join the elite group. On Feb. 25 against Texas Tech, she scored her 1,000th career point, becoming the 27th Lady Bear to achieve the milestone. She now has 1,015 career points to rank 25th all-time.

Only one other time in Lady Bear history have three players reached 1,000 career points in the same season; Debbie Polk, Gaye Pack and Jackie Valentine achieved the feat during the 1981-1982 season.

In addition, Jhasmin Player needs just 15 points to reach the 1,000 career point milestone. It will mark the first time in Baylor history and 15th time in NCAA Division I women's basketball history that four teammates achieved 1,000 career points in the same season.

LADY BEARS SELECTED FOURTH BY COACHES

For the fifth straight year, the Lady Bears were selected by the league's coaches to finish among the top four in the Big 12 women's basketball regular season race. The Big 12 coaches picked Baylor to finish fourth in the league's annual preseason poll. Oklahoma, Texas and Iowa State were tabbed to finish ahead of Baylor.

As usual, the Lady Bears, with their second place finish, exceeded the coaches' expectations. Only once over the past six seasons has Baylor finished below the coaches' predictions:

ALLISON ONE OF FIVE ADDED TO WADE TROPHY WATCH LIST

The State Farm Wade Trophy Committee elected to add five additional student-athletes to the 2008-09 State Farm Wade Watch List. Rachel Allison (Baylor), Kristi Cirone (Illinois State), Shalee Lehning (Kansas State), Deirdre Naughton (DePaul) and Lindsay Wisdom-Hylton (Purdue) become part of the 30-player pool, which includes 25 preseason selections.

The committee chose to add the five players to the Wade Watch after extensively reviewing each student-athlete's contributions to their team and to the integrity of the game.

The 6-1 senior forward/post from Jonesboro, Ark., becomes Baylor's fifth Wade Trophy nominee. Debbie Polk made the list in 1982 while Sophia Young had a spot on the 2005 and '06 lists, Steffanie Blackmon was a 2005 nominee and Bernice Mosby (2007) was the Lady Bears' most recent nominee.

BAYLOR IN BIG 12 GAMES

The 2008-09 season marks the 13th year of competition for women's basketball in the Big 12 Conference. Baylor is 178-204 (.466) all-time versus Big 12 opponents and has a record of 127-81 (.611) all-time in regular season Big 12 games. However in Kim Mulkey's nine years, Baylor is 100-44 (.694) in regular-season Big 12 play and has never posted a losing conference record. The 2004-05 Lady Bears claimed their first-ever Big 12 Conference championship, winning both the regular season and tournament titles. The Lady Bears added more hardware to the trophy case when they claimed the 2009 Big 12 Championship postseason tournament title.

With 12 Big 12 wins this season, Mulkey has now registered 10 or more league wins in seven of her nine seasons at Baylor, including six straight campaigns. Next best is Kansas State, Oklahoma and Texas A&M who have won 10 or more games four times during the six-year period.

LADY BEAR SENIORS ON TRACK TO GRADUATE IN MAY

All three of Baylor's seniors, Rachel Allison, Jessica Morrow and Jhasmin Player, are scheduled to graduate in May 2009. Baylor boasts a 100% graduation rate by Lady Bears who have completed their athletic eligibility at BU since coach Mulkey's arrival.

Allison will graduate with a degree in exercise physiology while Morrow and Player are both speech communication majors.

BAYLOR TOPS IN RECRUITING

Baylor's recruiting class, which signed National Letters of Intent on Wednesday, Nov. 12, has been ranked as the nation's consensus No. 1 recruiting class according to *USA Today*. The publication compiled the rankings of the top recruiting services, *Collegiate Girls Basketball Report* (BU #1), ESPN's *HoopGurlz* (BU #1) and *Blue Star Basketball* (BU #2), to determine the best recruiting class.

Led by the nation's top prep player, 6-8 post Brittney Griner (Houston Nimitz), the Lady Bears also inked 6-2 forward Mariah Chandler (Southwest Atlanta Christian), 5-11 guard Kimetria "Nae-Nae" Hayden (Dallas Lincoln), 6-0 guard Jordan Madden (Lepanto, Ark., East Poinsett County) and 6-1 guard Shanay Washington (Austin Del Valle).

The Women's Basketball Coaches Association recently named Griner the 2009 State Farm/WBCA High School Player of the Year. This season she is averaging 27 points, 13 rebounds and 11 blocks a game. Also, Griner was named a 2009 McDonald's All-American.

In addition, Chandler and Griner were two of 20 prep players selected to play in the WBCA High School All-America Game, April 4 in St. Louis.

HOME SWEET HOME

In Kim Mulkey's nine seasons along the Ferrell Center sidelines, her teams have posted some impressive numbers in the venue. The Lady Bears have maintained a 129-17 (.884) Ferrell Center record during that time span. Mulkey's first three seasons produced a 44-8 (.849) Ferrell Center mark while over the past six years the Lady Bears are 85-9 (.904).

The Lady Bears were 17-1 at home in 2007-08, are 14-2 in 2008-09, and have won 72 of their last 79 home games, including 30 of their last 33.

NCAA ATTENDANCE FIGURES

Through games of March 8, 2009, Baylor ranks No. 11 in the NCAA's weekly attendance listings with 6,558 a game.

The Lady Bears are fourth in the Big 12 in attendance with Iowa State leading the way at No. 3 with 9,901, Oklahoma ranks No. 4 at 9,007 and Texas Tech follows at No. 7 with 8,576.

Baylor registered the third (10,118) and 17th (8,220) largest crowds in program-history for games versus Texas A&M and Oklahoma, March 7 and Jan. 28, respectively.

LADY BEARS ECLIPSED 100,000 ATTENDANCE AGAIN

With its third-largest crowd in program history (10,118) against 10th-ranked Texas A&M (March 7), Baylor eclipsed the 100,000 fan mark for the fourth straight season with 104,925 for 2008-09. The Lady Bears average 6,558 fans a home game this season which ranks No. 11 nationally.

This season marks the third-best total and per game average in school history.

HALL OF FAME COACHES

With the addition of Leon Barmore to the Lady Bear coaching staff, Baylor becomes one of just three women's programs, joining Tennessee and Rutgers, with at least two Women's Basketball Hall of Fame members on its 2008-09 staff. Head coach Kim Mulkey was enshrined in 2000, while Barmore entered the Hall in 2003. In addition, Barmore was a 2003 inductee into the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame.

CAPTAINS

Seniors Rachel Allison and Jhasmin Player have been named team captains for the 2008-09 season.

Baylor's Ferrell Center record in regular season, non-conference games under Coach Mulkey is 66-1 (.985). During that nine-year time span, Baylor's lone Ferrell Center loss came against 12th-ranked Purdue on Nov. 19, 2006, in the Preseason WNIT championship game. Since then, Baylor has won 25 straight non-league home games.

STRENGTH AND CONDITIONING

The Lady Bears underwent a strength and conditioning program this past summer that centered upon game performance and recovery specific to the women's game and designed to prepare their minds as well as their bodies for the season's rigors.

Jhasmin Player - Improved her squat max to 330 pounds, a 30 pound improvement from her pre-ACL injury max. She ranks No. 1 on the team in power clean (187 lbs.) and No. 2 in bench press (150 lbs.)

Rachel Allison - Improved her squat max by 41 lbs., up to 311, second on the team and second all-time. Ran the mile in 5:59, the best all-time for a post player. Allison increased her lean muscle mass by eight pounds over the 18 week period.

Danielle Wilson - Ranks No. 1 all-time in running approach vertical jump at 10'7" (7" above the rim) and added seven pounds of lean mass over the 18 week period. Wilson has a wing span of 82 1/4", only five inches smaller than BU men's player Mamadou Diene (gee-EHN) who is 7'0" tall.

Melissa Jones - Ranks No. 1 on the team in vertical jump (27.5") and No. 3 all-time and improved her mile run time 39 seconds (6:02) which ranks No. 3 all-time. Jones was used to test the off-season training program. During the testing she was executing Power Cleans (the single most athletic/explosive lift for a basketball player) and achieved 74 reps in 12 minutes (68 reps were executed using a load of 85% of her rep max.), moving 10,725 pounds.

FUTURE LADY BEARS

The Lady Bear basketball program signed five players to National Letters of Intent (NLI) on Wednesday, Nov. 12. Inking with Baylor in the early signing period were guards **Shanay Washington** (Austin, Texas), **Jordan Madden** (Lepanto, Ark.) and **Kimetria "Nae-Nae" Hayden** (Dallas, Texas), forward **Mariah Chandler** (Atlanta, Ga.) and post **Brittney Griner** (Houston, Texas).

The quintet is definitely the program's top-ranked recruiting class and was named the nation's top recruiting class. All of the signees are ranked among the top 60 nationally.

Mariah Chandler - 6-2, Forward, Atlanta, Ga. (Southwest Atlanta Christian)

Chandler is a left-hander who can play both inside and outside and runs the floor well. Recently selected, along with Brittney Griner, as one of 20 players to participate the 2009 WBCA All-Star Game, April 4 in St. Louis.

The 6-2 forward sat out the 2007-08 season rehabilitating a knee injury (ACL) but averaged 16.0 points, 12.0 rebounds and 4.0 steals per game as a sophomore. Despite not playing last season, Chandler ranks No. 16 by both ESPN's HoopGurlz and Allstar Girls Report and No. 29 by the Collegiate Girls Report. Prior to her injury, Chandler had been ranked among the nation's top 10 on every ranking list.

Brittney Griner - 6-8, Post, Houston, Texas (Nimitz, HS)

Griner, at 6-8, is the nation's most dominating prep player and ranks No. 1 by virtually every major national rating service. She was recently named by the Women's Basketball Coaches Association as the State Farm/WBCA Player of the Year and is one of two future Lady Bears, along with Mariah Chandler, to be named to play in the organization's 2009 All-Star game on April 3 in St. Louis. In addition, Griner has been selected a 2009 McDonald's All-American.

The athletic post can elevate at the rim and dunk with ease, create off the dribble, post up, and, with her 86-inch wingspan, be an intimidator on defense. Griner averaged 24.6 points, 12.3 rebounds, 5.9 blocks and shot 64 percent from the field as a junior. She recorded four triple doubles and 30 double-doubles as a junior. In the first game of her senior year (Tuesday, Nov. 11) Griner scored 21 points, blocked 25 shots and hauled down 13 rebounds against Alief Hastings HS, setting a national high school record.

Kimetria "Nae-Nae" Hayden - 5-11, Guard, Dallas, Texas (Lincoln HS)

Hayden, a versatile athlete who can score from the paint or perimeter, averaged 17.9 points, 7.2 rebounds and 3.2 assists while leading Dallas' Lincoln HS to the 2008 Class 4A state title. Hayden was named the 2008 *Dallas Morning News*'s Girls Player of the Year and was tabbed the Class 4A state tournament's Most Valuable Player. She is ranked No. 56 by Collegiate Girls Report.

Jordan Madden - 6-0, Guard, Lepanto, Ark. (East Poinsett County HS)

Madden, a 6-0 guard who possess both speed and strength, led her East Poinsett County HS team to the Class 3A state finals where she scored 45 of the team's 51 points in the title game. Madden ranks No. 58 by both ESPN's HoopGurlz and Allstar Girls Report, No. 57 by the Collegiate Girls Report.

Shanay Washington - 6-1, Guard, Austin, Texas (Del Valle HS)

Washington, a 6-1 guard, is a very strong, quick player with sound fundamentals. She sat out her junior season with an ACL injury but is fully rehabilitated. She played in the 2007 USA Basketball Youth Development Festival, earning a gold medal with the undefeated white team. As a sophomore, Washington averaged 20.7 points and 12.0 rebounds at Del Valle HS. Washington is listed No. 4 by the Collegiate Girls Report, No. 5 by Allstar Girls Report and No. 64 by ESPN's HoopGurlz.
