### NOTING THIS WEEKEND

• Baylor hits the road for its final game of the season as it takes on #12 Texas.

• The 12th ranked Longhorns will be the fifth ranked team Baylor has played in 2008. The Lady Bears are 0-4 against ranked opponents thus far.

• Senior Andi Fagan leads the Bears with 10 points (four goals and two assists), while Lotto Smith (three goals and one assist) and Christine Clark (two goals, three assists) each have seven points.

### Baylor Takes On No. 12 Texas

The Baylor soccer team will wrap up its 2008 season on the road against No. 12 Texas at Mike A. Myers Field on Friday at 7:00 p.m..

"I really enjoy challenging the best teams and this weekend we get a chance to do that," head coach Marci Jobson said. "We are going to give it everything we have and see what happens."

Texas leads the all-time series against the Bears 8-5-1 and has won three-straight.

Baylor (5-11-2, 1-7-1) enters the weekend in 10th place in the Big 12 standings after dropping a pair of games at No. 20 Missouri and Kansas last weekend. The Bears are led offensively by Andi Fagan, who has 10 points (four goals and two assists) this season. Baylor will be looking to strike up its offense, which has been held scoreless in its last five games.

**SCOUTING TEXAS**

**LAST TIME OUT: BAYLOR FALLS AT KANSAS**

A goal in the eighth minute by Kansas' Monica Dolinsky handed the Baylor soccer team a 1-0 loss to the Jayhawks on Oct. 26 at the Jayhawk Soccer Complex.

The Bears had 10 shots during the contest, but were able to get just one on goal as Bethany Johnston rifled a shot in the 17th minute that was saved by KU's Julie Hanley.

Gianna Quintana had another solid game for Baylor, coming with eight saves and allowing just one goal. In the eight minute, Dolinsky lined up a free kick from 27 yards and knocked it in the upper near corner of the goal for a 1-0 lead.

Baylor's defense held Kansas's offense at bay the rest of the way, but was unable to find a goal itself. With a minute to go in the game, Christine Clark fired a shot that was just wide of the goal, allowing the Jayhawks to salvage the victory.

**GOALS ARE GONE**

The Bears have been held scoreless in each of its last five games, being outscored 13-0. Baylor's last goal came in the eighth minute of the game at Texas Tech on Oct. 10.

**OT... OH NO**

Three times this season the Lady Bears have had games go to double overtime. Unfortunately for Baylor, the games have not equaled a win, as the squad is 0-1-2.

**THERE'S ALWAYS NEXT YEAR**

The Bears will welcome back 23 players off its 2008 roster next season, as Baylor will lose four seniors off this year's roster, only three of whom have seen time on the field.

**WELCOME BACK**

Junior midfielder Nicky Smith returned to the lineup on Oct. 3 for the first time in 2008 due to injury. During her first two seasons, Smith played in 37 of 38 possible games, registering three assists.

**LOTTO'S THE TICKET**

Baylor forward Lotto Smith broke through for two goals on Sept. 14 in a 3-0 win over UTSA. Her two goals marked the second time Smith has scored two goals in a game during her career, as she also registered a pair during a 6-2 win on Sept. 7, 2007 at Jacksonville

**OFFENSIVE NUMBERS**

Baylor had an offensive outpouring for the ages on Sept. 7 against Prairie View A&M. Ten players recorded at least a point in the game, as the Bears' 10 goals were the most by Baylor since an 11-0 home win over McNeese State on Oct. 5, 1996. In addition, it was the most shots taken by a Baylor team since registering 37 against Oklahoma on Oct. 19, 2003. The school record for shots is 40, which occurred on Sept. 14, 1997 versus Kansas.

**FAGAN EN FUEGO**

Fagan has scored four goals with two assist so far in 2008. She entered the season with just two points for her career (two assists) and now has 10 on the season.

**FINALLY FOR FAGAN**

Fagan played 53 games, and finally, on her 54th game as a Bear, she accomplished it... A goal... two of them to be exact. The Walnut, Calif., native, scored two goals in a 3-0 win over Presbyterian on Aug. 31. Fagan has spent the majority of her career as a midfielder, but has been moved to the forward position in 2008 under first year head coach Marci Jobson.

**ROAD WOES**

The road has not been kind to the Baylor soccer program of late. The Bears 0-6-1 in its last seven road games dating back to a loss to Iowa State on Oct. 21, 2007. Baylor's last road win was a 4-0 blasting of Nebraska on Oct. 19, 2007.

**I'LL BE MISSING YOU**

Baylor has been without a key cog so far this season. Senior midfielder Amanda McGrath is still rehabbing a knee injury she suffered six games into the 2007 season. The Sugar Land, Texas, native has played in 42 games during her career, scoring eight goals and notching four assists.

**YOUTH IS BEING SERVED**

Baylor welcomes 10 freshmen to the 2008 roster with nine coming from the state of Texas. Christine Clark is the lone player from outside the Lone Star State, coming from Littleton, Colo. Including redshirt freshman goalkeeper Courtney Seelhorst, 41 percent (11-of-27) of Baylor's roster are freshmen.

**BETTY LOU MAYS FIELD**

The 2008 season marks the 10th year for the Baylor soccer team at Betty Lou Mays Soccer Field. The former Baylor Soccer Stadium was named during the 2000 season in honor of the late Betty Lou Mays of Amarillo, Texas. Mrs. Mays was the wife of Troy Mays, a 1945 graduate of Baylor; the two were longtime supporters of Baylor Athletics.

Thanks to a generous gift from the Troy Mays Foundation, the Baylor soccer program has seen a number of improvements to Betty Lou Mays Soccer Field, as over \$250,000 worth of improvements were made to the Bear's home soccer stadium in 2007.

Through the gift, a gated fence has been placed along the perimeter of the stadium to enclose the soccer field. The fence is supported by a number of brick-laid posts that are similar to those seen around the Baylor campus. In addition, a brick façade has been placed around the stands and the press box. The improvements give the facility more of a "stadium-feel" and is the latest in a long list of upgrades to Baylor's home soccer facility.

**BAYLOR SOCCER ANNOUNCES 2008 BROADCAST SCHEDULE**

For the third time in program history, Baylor soccer games will be broadcast on BaylorBears.com as audio for the Bears as six contests will be broadcast on BaylorBears.com.

The live, audio feed is free for users; however, interested listeners will have to sign up for a free username and password at [baylorbears.com](http://baylorbears.com) in order to access the broadcast if they do not already have one.

Baylor opens the broadcast season with a home match against Prairie View A&M on Sunday, Sept. 7, at 1:00 p.m. In addition, broadcasts can be heard for contests against UTSA (9/14), Houston (9/21), Texas A&M (9/28), Nebraska (10/5) and Oklahoma (10/19).

Heath Nielsen and Kyle Cornish form the Baylor soccer broadcast team as pre-game for all matches will begin approximately 10 minutes before kick-off.
