**On Radio:** For the sixth consecutive season, the 14-station Boston College-ISP Sports Network provides complete and extensive coverage of every regular season and post-season game throughout New England, with Boston's AM 850 WEEI, or AM 680 WRKO as the Network flagship. Fans can also listen to each game on the Internet at [www.bceagles.com](http://www.bceagles.com) and select games on XM Satellite Radio.

**The Broadcast Team:** Jon Meterparel and Malcolm Huckaby will call all the Boston College basketball action during the 2010-11 season. This will mark the pair's first season together with the Eagles.

**Meterparel**, who also serves as the play-by-play voice for Boston College football, joined the Dennis and Callahan morning show on WEEI in 2000. Prior to that, he had worked at WFNZ radio in Charlotte, NC for nearly three years. A native of Weston, Mass., Meterparel also worked with the Triple A Charlotte Knights (baseball), UNC Charlotte (basketball color analyst) and New England Revolution (soccer).

**Huckaby** is no stranger to BC basketball fans. He starred for the Eagles from 1990-94, finishing his 126-game career with 1,316 points. He currently ranks 18th on BC's career scoring list. Huckaby also ranks fourth on the career three-point field goals list, having sank 199 treys in his brilliant four-year career.

### All-ACC

**Reggie Jackson** and **Joe Trapani** both gained 2010-11 All-ACC honors. Jackson earned first-team recognition, while Trapani captured third-team honors for the second consecutive season. Jackson was joined on the first team by Nolan Smith and Kyle Singler (Duke), Jordan Williams (Maryland) and Malcolm Delaney (Virginia Tech).

**Honored Eagles:** Jackson is the fourth different Boston College player to earn All-ACC first-team honors since 2006 (joining **Craig Smith**, **Jared Dudley** and **Tyrese Rice**). Only Duke (with seven) has had as many or more different players earned first-team honors in this same period.

### The Series against Northwestern

Tonight's game will be the fifth-ever meeting between the Eagles and the Wildcats. BC has a 2-2 mark in these games. In the teams' last contest, on Dec. 23, 1998, Northwestern earned a 69-59 home win over the Eagles ... Exactly one year earlier, BC gained a 64-63 home victory ... The teams also met during the 1968-69 (Northwestern win) and the 1990-91 (BC win) seasons.

### ACC Preseason Selection

Boston College, which finished in a three-way tie for **fourth place**, was picked to finish **10th** in the 2010-11 ACC Preseason Poll. The preseason poll was based on the vote of 62 ballots cast by media representatives from around the conference. Duke was selected to finish first, followed by Virginia Tech, North Carolina and NC State.

### Joe Trapani

**Joe Trapani** finished the 16-game conference slate ranked among ACC leaders in rebounding (sixth, 8.3) and in scoring (13th, 14.1) ... The senior forward has recorded four point-rebound double-doubles this season -- at Florida State, at Duke, against North Carolina and against Miami ... Trapani scored a season-high 25 points and grabbed a career-high 15 rebounds (nine offensive) against the Tar Heels (Feb. 1).

### John Cahill

**John Cahill** is undoubtedly one of the best stories in college basketball this season. The 6-foot-1-inch senior joined the team as a walk-on prior to the 2010-11 season. He has played in 24 games this season. Most remarkably, he has earned a spot in the starting line-up for the last six games ... In fact, Cahill's playing time has increased substantially over the last nine games. In this stretch, the Albany, N.Y., product has averaged 27.1 minutes per game.

**Career High:** In the Eagles' game at Virginia Tech on March 1, Cahill posted a career-high 12 points on 2-for-2 shooting from long range and 6-for-6 shooting from the foul line. He also equaled his career high with five rebounds. He did all this in 33 minutes, two minutes shy of his career high (set one game earlier at Virginia).

**A True Student-Athlete:** John Cahill was selected to the 2010-11 All-Atlantic Coast Conference Academic Men's Basketball Team. To be eligible for consideration, a student-athlete must have earned a 3.00 grade point average for the previous semester and maintained a 3.00 cumulative average during his academic career. Cahill is a senior, majoring in economics.

### The Head Coach

**Steve Donahue** is in his first season as the head coach at Boston College. He has a 20-12 record as the Eagles' head coach and a 166-150 career record ... Donahue spent the last 10 seasons as the head coach at Cornell. He led the Big Red to three consecutive Ivy League titles (2008-10) and a trip to the 2010 NCAA Sweet 16. During his tenure, Donahue totaled a 147-138 record. Cornell achieved the best Ivy record over the last five years (55-15) ... He coached and/or recruited seven of Cornell's top 13 all-time leading scorers, two Ivy League Rookie of the Year players, eight NABC All-District selections, six Academic All-District picks and two Academic All-Americans ... Prior to assuming the head coaching job at Cornell, Donahue spent 10 seasons as assistant coach and recruiting coordinator for Fran Dunphy at the University of Pennsylvania.



**Coach of the Year:** Steve Donahue received the 2010 Clair Bee Coach of the Year honor after leading Cornell to a 29-5 overall record, the Ivy League title and the NCAA Tournament's Sweet 16.

### The Coaching Staff

Associate head coach **Joe Jones** joined the BC staff this past spring after serving seven seasons as the head coach at Columbia University. Prior to that position, Jones spent six seasons as an assistant coach at Villanova ... Assistant coach **Nat Graham** came to BC after serving the past five seasons as an assistant coach under Steve Donahue at Cornell ... Assistant coach **Akbar Waheed**, also in his first year at BC, spent the last 11 seasons as an assistant coach at Niagara University, his alma mater ... Director of basketball operations **Woody Kampmann** served the past three seasons as an assistant coach under Steve Donahue at Cornell.

### 1,000 Career Points

Boston College has three 1,000-point scorers on its active roster. Each of the three has reached the milestone this season. Senior forward **Corey Raji**, who reached the mark against Indiana (Dec. 1), enters today's game with 1,303 points ... Senior forward **Joe Trapani**, who reached the mark at Maryland (Dec. 12), enters with 1,365 points ... Junior guard **Reggie Jackson** reached the mark on a three-point field goal against Virginia, enters with 1,246 points ... Here's the career scoring list ...

**Shooting**

BC is shooting 46.1 percent from the field ... BC shot a season-best 58.2 percent from the field against Wake Forest (March 6) in the regular-season finale ... BC has shot 50.0 percent or better in 20 halves this season.

**League Shooting:** BC had two players rank among ACC leaders in field-goal percentage in conference games -- **Corey Raji** (.485) ranked sixth, while **Reggie Jackson** (.471) ranked seventh.

**The "Three Ball"**

Boston College is shooting 38.2 percent from three-point range this season. **Biko Paris** leads the Eagles with 73 treys. **Reggie Jackson** has hit 71 treys ... BC has made 10 or more treys in each of 15 games -- 13 treys against Bryant (Dec. 19), at Maryland (Dec. 12), at South Carolina (Jan. 1) and against North Carolina (Feb. 1); 12 treys against Providence (Dec. 8), Bucknell (Dec. 22), Rhode Island (Dec. 29) and Wake Forest (March 6); 11 treys at McNeese State (March 15); and 10 treys against Holy Cross (Nov. 22), California (Nov. 28), Indiana (Dec. 1), Maryland (Feb. 12), at Virginia Tech (March 1) and against Wake Forest (March 10).

**School Record:** BC has made a school (single-season) record 301 three-point field goals this season.

**Treys Per Game:** BC ranks fourth among all Division 1 schools, making 9.1 treys per game (on 23.8 attempts).

**Finding the Range:** BC has shot 40 percent or better from three-point range in 15 games, including four of the last five games.

**Free Throws**

Boston College is shooting 72.3 percent from the foul line this season, the third-highest percentage among ACC schools. **Reggie Jackson**, **Biko Paris** and **Dallas Elmore** all shoot better than 75 percent from the charity stripe.

**Rebounding**

Boston College has outrebounded its opponent in 15 games this season ... BC enjoyed a plus-15 rebounding margin at McNeese State (March 15) ... The Eagles enjoyed a plus-14 rebounding margin in each of two games -- at South Carolina (Jan. 1) and at Virginia Tech (March 1) ... BC has a minus-0.5 rebounding margin.

**League Rebounding:** **Joe Trapani** ranked sixth in rebounding in league play, averaging 8.3 rpg. **Corey Raji** was tied for 10th at 6.8 rpg.

**Turnovers**

Boston College is averaging 11.1 turnovers per game this season, the second lowest total among ACC schools and raking as the 22nd lowest among 336 Division 1 schools. The Eagles have committed fewer than 10 turnovers in each of 11 games, including a season-low five in each of four games -- against Holy Cross (Nov. 22), Bryant (Dec. 19), Bucknell (Dec. 22) and Virginia (Jan. 19) ... BC made just six turnovers against Indiana (Dec. 1), and just eight turnovers against Texas A&M in the first round of the Old Spice Classic (Nov. 25) and against NC State (Jan. 11).

**Bench Strength**

Boston College has received solid contributions from its reserves this season. Through 33 games, the Eagles' bench is averaging 16.1 points per game ... The reserves have scored a season-high 30 points in each of two games -- in a 76-71 win over Massachusetts in TD Garden (Dec. 4) and in a home win over Georgia Tech (Jan. 8).

**Assist City**

Boston College is averaging 15.3 assists per game, ranking third among ACC schools. BC was credited with a season-high 25 assists (on 34 field goals) against Bryant (Dec. 19) ... BC recorded 23 assists on 33 baskets at South Carolina (Jan. 1), and 23 assists on 32 baskets in the regular-season finale against Wake Forest (March 6).

**Acting Defensively**

Boston College is allowing 68.8 points per game this season ... The Eagles are forcing 10.5 turnovers per game and making 4.8 steals per game ... The opponents' field-goal percentage is a cumulative 44.2 percent.

**Extra Efforts:** In its game at North Carolina on **Feb. 19**, BC limited the Tar Heels to 48 points, the fewest points ever scored by UNC in the Smith Center (opened in 1986). It also marked the fewest points scored by UNC since Roy Williams became the school's head coach in 2003. North Carolina entered the game averaging 78.3 points per game ... BC limited Virginia (**Feb. 26**) to 44 points on 32.1 percent shooting from the field.

**Reggie Jackson**

Junior **Reggie Jackson** ranked among ACC leaders in seven categories (conference games only): scoring (fourth, 18.1 ppg), field-goal percentage (seventh, .471), assists (third, 4.3), free-throw percentage (second, .870), three-point field-goal percentage (sixth, .398), three-point field goals made (ninth, 2.1) and minutes played (tied-eighth, 33.3).

**On the Mark:** Jackson is shooting 50.8 percent from the field this season (all games), ranking him third among all ACC players ... He has made at least half his shots in 19 games this season.

**All-District Choice, All-District Choice:** Jackson earned **USBWA All-District I honors** and **NABC All-District 2 honors**. The USBWA's District I is composed of the six New England states, while the NABC's District 2 is composed of the 12 ACC schools ... Jackson was joined on the NABC All-District 2 team by Nolan Smith and Kyle Singler (Duke), Jordan Williams (Maryland) and Malcolm Delaney (Virginia Tech).

**National Jesuit Player of the Week:** Jackson earned National Jesuit Player of the Week honors for his efforts against Clemson and Maryland (Feb. 8 and 12). He was selected from among the 28 Jesuit schools in the United States.

**ACC Honoree:** Jackson earned ACC Player of the Week honors twice this season. He was first honored on Dec. 13 for his play against Providence and Maryland. He averaged 21.0 points, 6.5 rebounds and 4.5 assists per game in the two contests ... On Jan. 17, he shared Player of the Week honors (with Florida State's Chris Singleton) after averaging 25.5 points, 5.0 rebounds, 5.0 assists and 2.0 blocked shots per game in games against NC State and Miami.

**Old Spice Classic:** Jackson earned All-Tournament honors at the Old Spice Classic after averaging 16.6 points, 3.7 rebounds and 3.7 assists per game in three games.

**Corey Raji**

Senior **Corey Raji**, who averaged 13.4 points and 6.8 rebounds in 16 ACC games, finished the league schedule ranked among league leaders in rebounding (tied-10th, 6.8) and scoring (15th, 13.4) ... Raji totaled 11 points, nine rebounds and two assists in 28 minutes in the Eagles' win at Maryland (Dec. 12). The senior scored the game's final six points to lift BC to a 79-75 road win\* ... Raji registered a season-high 22 points, nine rebounds and two assists in a home win over Georgia Tech (Jan. 8), and 18 points at Duke (Jan. 27) ... He posted 17 points (7-for-10 FG) and eight rebounds at Virginia (Feb. 26), and tallied 19 points and 12 rebounds at Virginia Tech (March 1) ... He finished the regular season with a 21-point, six-rebound effort against Wake Forest (March 6).

**\*Final 1:27 at Maryland:** Raji's lay-up with 1:27 to play evened the score at 75-75 ... Raji's three-pointer with 37.4 seconds left gave BC a 78-75 lead ... Raji's free throw with 14.0 seconds left sealed the win for the Eagles.

**Biko Paris**

Senior guard **Biko Paris** ranked among ACC leaders -- in conference games -- in four categories -- assist-turnover ratio (sixth, 2.3), assists (ninth, 3.7), three-point field-goal percentage (seventh, .386) and three-point field goals made (sixth, 2.1) ... Paris has scored in double figures 16 times in 32 games this season, surpassing the number of times he'd reached double digits in his first three years (13 times in 96 games) ... He has made 73 three-pointers (on 175 attempts) this season, more than doubling the three-point total of his first three seasons (36 made on 121 attempts) ... Paris enjoyed a career day in the Eagles' 79-75 win at Maryland (Dec. 12). He scored a career-high 22 points, hitting a career-high eight field goals, including six three-point field goals. He shot an identical 4-for-6 from the field and 3-for-5 from three-point range in each half ... Paris sank six treys (6-for-7 treys) in a 19-point effort against Wake Forest (March 6) and then sank six more treys (6-for-10) against Wake Forest in the ACC Tournament's opening round (March 10).

**BC in the NIT**

After its first-round win over McNeese State, Boston College now has a 17-11 record in 11 appearances in the National Invitation Tournament. The Eagles have previously appeared in the NIT in 1965, 1966, 1969, 1974, 1980, 1984, 1988, 1992, 1993 and 2003. The Eagles have advanced as far as the semifinal round twice -- 1974 and 1988 -- and to the championship game once -- 1969. In 1969, BC defeated Kansas, Louisville and Army, before dropping an 89-76 decision to Temple in the title game.
