On Radio: For the fifth consecutive season, the 16-station Boston College-ISP Sports Network provides complete and extensive coverage of every regular season and post-season game throughout New England, with Boston's AM 850 WEEI, or AM 680 WRKO as the Network flagship. Fans can also listen to each game on the Internet at www.bceagles.com and select games on XM Satellite Radio.

Coach Skinner On the Air: Boston College head coach Al Skinner is heard 10 minutes prior to each tip-off on the network, and his weekly 30-minute program "The Al Skinner Show" begins in January on the Boston College-ISP Sports Network.

The Broadcast Team: Ted Sarandis returns for his 15th season as the play-by-play voice of the Eagles and his 33rd campaign following the bouncing ball. He was inducted into the New England Basketball Hall of Fame on October 9, 2009, becoming just the sixth play-by-play announcer to earn the prestigious honor from the six-state region. Ted holds the unique distinction of having called the play-by-play for all four Division I Basketball institutions in Boston—BC, Harvard, Northeastern and BU—as well as Holy Cross. He devotes a considerable amount of time as a volunteer in support of military personnel during the Global War on Terror. Ted serves as a U.S. Army Reserve Ambassador and is a member of the USO New England Executive Council. His additional play-by-play credits include: Boston Celtics Basketball; Harvard Hockey and the Beanpot Hockey Tournament on radio; and the ECAC Basketball Game of the Week, UMass Basketball and Lowell Lock Monsters Hockey on television.

Bill Ebben will serve as the color analyst for the seventh consecutive season. A 1987 graduate of Boston College, Ebben also provided expert analysis for BC basketball broadcasts from 1993-97. Ebben comes from a strong basketball family. His father was an outstanding player at the University of Detroit in the late 1950s, while his brother Greg served as BC's team manager in the early 1990s before serving as a high-school and college assistant coach for several years.

The Series against South Dakota State

Tonight's game will mark the first-ever meeting between the Eagles and the Jackrabbits.

Injury Report

Junior guard/forward **Rakim Sanders** suffered an injury to his right ankle in the first half of the Eagles' game against Saint Joseph's on Nov. 20. He is expected to miss 2-4 weeks, but will continue to be evaluated.

Schedule Notes

This year's regular-season schedule consists of 30 games, including three games in the Paradise Jam in the U.S. Virgin Islands ... After concluding play in the Paradise Jam, BC will play consecutive road games -- at Providence (Nov. 28) and Michigan (Dec. 2 in the Big 10-ACC Challenge) - before returning home for its ACC opener against Miami (Dec. 6).

Familiar Faces

Boston College returns 11 lettermen, including four starters, from last year's team that finished with a 22-12 record, 9-7 in the ACC ... The team features one senior, seven juniors and four sophomores. There are no freshmen on the 2009-10 roster ... Sophomore **Peter Rehnquist** is the only addition to the roster. Rehnquist, a 6-foot-4-inch swingman from Sharon, Mass., joined the team as a walk-on during preseason practices.

Paradise Jam - Notes from Saint Joseph's Game

Boston College committed just five turnovers against the Hawks ... BC had a 46-38 rebounding advantage ... BC attempted 16 more field goals than Saint Joseph's, but made one fewer field goal ... BC made 22 free throws, while SJU made 20 ... BC's bench outscored the Hawks' bench 34-29 ... BC played much of the first half without two of its starters. **Rakim Sanders** suffered an ankle injury just 3:45 into the game, while **Corey Raji** was sidelined with two fouls just 5:01 into the game.

Senior Leadership

Tyler Roche, the Eagles' sole senior who also serves as team co-captain, has shined in the season's early going. Roche scored a career-high 30 points in the opener against Dartmouth (Nov. 13). He shot 10-for-12 from the field, including 4-for-5 from three-point range ... He netted a team-high 19 points and sank 5-of-6 long-range attempts against St. Francis (NY). Through three games, Roche is shooting 63.3 percent (19-for-30) from the floor.

Reggie, Reggie

Sophomore **Reggie Jackson**, who made his first two collegiate starts in the team's first two games this season, will return to the starting line-up tonight. Through three games, Jackson is averaging 17.0 points, 8.3 rebounds and 5.0 assists in 36.3 productive minutes per game. Most recently, he tallied his first career double double -- 18 points and 11 rebounds -- against Saint Joseph's.

Miscellaneous Notes Through Three Games

Junior **Josh Southern** equaled his career high with 13 points against St. Francis (NY) ... BC's reserves contributed 34 points in the loss to Saint Joseph's. **Reggie Jackson** led the way with 18 points, Tyler Roche scored six points, and **Evan Ravenel** and **Dallas Elmore** each contributed five points. Elmore is averaging 7.0 ppg and 4.3 rpg through three games.

Offensively Speaking

Boston College is averaging 80.3 points per game through three games ... BC averaged 74.4 points per game last season. Three players, including two returning players (Joe Trapani and Rakim Sanders), sported double-figure scoring averages last winter.

The "Three Ball"

Boston College is shooting 34.7 percent from three-point range this season. Tyler Roche leads the Eagles, having hit 11-of-17 (.647) attempts in three games ... BC attempted 19.1 three-point field goals per game last winter, making 6.4 per game ... Joe Trapani is the team's top returning three-point shooter. He made 52 treys in 34 games in 2008-09. Rakim Sanders sank 48 treys.

Acting Defensively

Boston College is allowing 62.0 points per game this season ... BC allowed 70.5 points per game in 2008-09. The Eagles forced 12.6 turnovers per game and made 6.1 steals per game ... The opponents' field-goal percentage was a cumulative 42.6 percent in 2008-09.

Our Captains

Senior **Tyler Roche** and junior **Biko Paris** are the captains of the 2009-10 Eagles. Roche has played in 83 career games, making 31 starts. Paris has played in 68 games, making seven starts.

Birthday Month

November is a big "birthday month" for the basketball Eagles. **Bonzie Colson** (Nov. 1), **Pat Duquette** (Nov. 4), **Corey Raji** (Nov. 7) and **Evan Ravenel** (Nov. 24) all have celebrated/will celebrate birthdays this month.

Close Calls

Boston College has a 0-1 record in games decided by four or fewer points ... Last winter, BC had a 5-2 record in games decided by four or fewer points.

The Coaching Staff

Al Skinner is in his 22nd season as a head coach, his 13th season at Boston College. Already Boston College's all-time winningest coach, he has led the Eagles to postseason tournament berths in eight of the last nine seasons. BC participated in the 2001, 2002, 2004, 2005, 2006, 2007 and 2009 NCAA Tournaments and the 2003 National Invitation Tournament ... Skinner enters tonight's with a 372-276 career record, including a 234-150 record at Boston College. Skinner is a 1974 graduate of the University of Massachusetts, where he enjoyed a stellar basketball career (1971-74).

20 Wins: Al Skinner has recorded 20 or more wins seven times during his BC tenure and 10 times during his collegiate coaching career (three times at URI).

Hall of Famer: Skinner has been inducted into three Halls of Fame. He was inducted into the Athletic Hall of Fame at the University of Massachusetts, his alma mater, in 1982. He was inducted into the University of Rhode Island Athletic Hall of Fame (where he served as head coach for nine years), in 2000. He was inducted into the New England Basketball Hall of Fame (multi-category) in 2004.

The Coaching Staff

Associate head coach **Pat Duquette** is in his 13th season at Boston College, his first as associate head coach. Duquette served as the team's administrative assistant for four years, before being elevated to the assistant coaching position after the 2000-01 season. He assumed his current position after the 2008-09 season. **Bonzie Colson**, who joined the staff in June 2001 as director of basketball operations, assumed assistant coaching duties after the 2005-06 season. Prior to coming to BC, Colson had spent the previous three years as assistant coach at George Washington University. Colson played one season for Skinner at Rhode Island ... Assistant coach **Mo Cassara** is in his fourth year on Skinner's staff. He joined the BC staff after serving the previous two years as head coach at Clark (Mass.) University ... **Preston Murphy** is the team's director of basketball operations. Now in his fourth season, Murphy came to BC after serving three seasons as head coach at Woonsocket (R.I.) High School.
