Other Awards and Honors

Additional awards are selected for each Conference sport. In football, coaches and a media panel each choose All-Conference teams (First, Second and Honorable Mention). Coaches and media pick Big Ten Offensive and Defensive Players and a Freshman of the Year. The coaches select the Conference Offensive and Defensive Linemen of the Year, while the media vote on the Dave McClain Coach of the Year award. The Big Ten Chicago Tribune Most Valuable Player is chosen from each of the 11 institutions' MVPs.

Academic All-Big Ten teams are named for every sport. The teams are composed of all letterwinners who have a cumulative grade point average of "B" or better. Freshmen and first-year junior college transfers are not eligible for Academic All-Big Ten selection.

Pre-Season Notes



Welcome Back: Returning to Big Ten fields in 2005 are 28 All-Conference players from last season, including 15 First Team honorees and 13 Second Team selections. The First Team returnees are comprised of eight offensive standouts, five defensive stalwarts and two punters. The Second Team picks include six players on offense and seven on defense. In addition, 32 Honorable Mention honorees from last season also return to campus.

ALL-BIG TEN FIRST-TEAM RETURNEES

OFFENSE

Drew Tate, JR QB, IOWA (Coaches only)

STATS: 375-233-2786 yards, 20 TDs

First-year starter led the League in pass efficiency (137.1 in Big Ten games only) and was named the Capital One Bowl Most Valuable Player.

Michael Hart, SO, RB, MICH

STATS: 282-1455 yards, 9 TDs

Became first true freshman to lead the League in rushing since Wisconsin's Ron Dayne in 1996, as his yardage total ranked second behind only Dayne for single-season ground efforts by a first-year player.

Matt Lentz, SR, OL, MICH (Coaches only)

Helped Michigan rank second in Big Ten games only in total offense (423.6 ypg) and scoring offense (30.8 ppg), despite starting a freshman at quarterback and running back.

Tim Massaquoi, SR, TE, MICH

STATS: 18-184 yards

Ranked fourth on the team with 10.2 yards per reception and fifth with 18 catches.

Adam Stenavich, SR, OL, MICH (Coaches only)

Led Michigan to back-to-back Big Ten titles for the first time since the 1997-98 seasons and blocked for the League's leading rusher.

Greg Eslinger, SR, OL, MINN

Second-team Academic All-American led the way for a Gophers offensive attack that produced two running backs with 1,000-yard rushing seasons.

Laurence Maroney, JR, RB, MINN

STATS: 217-1348 yards, 12 TDs

Ranked third in rushing yards per game and second in rushing touchdowns while splitting

time with Marion Barber III, as the duo became the first pair of teammates in NCAA history to both rack up 1,000 yards rushing in back-to-back seasons.

Mark Setterstrom, SR, OL, MINN (Media only)

Helped Minnesota lead the Big Ten in rushing offense (fifth nationally with 256.8 yards per contest in all games) for the second straight season for the first time since 1986.

DEFENSE

Chad Greenway, SR, LB, IOWA

STATS: 113 tackles (71 solo)

Ranked second in tackles on an Iowa unit that topped the Big Ten in total defense for the first time since 1984 while also leading the Conference against the run.

Abdul Hodge, SR, LB, IOWA (Coaches only)

STATS: 116 tackles (79 solo)

Two-time First Team All-Big Ten selection topped the Hawkeyes and ranked fourth in the League in tackles.

Gabe Watson, SR, DT, MICH (Coaches only)

STATS: 37 tackles (25 solo)

Anchored the Michigan defensive line with 37 defensive stops, 6.5 TFLs and two sacks.

Tim McGarigle, SR, LB, NU (Media only)

STATS: 151 tackles (102 solo)

Led the nation in solo tackles per game (8.5) and ranked third in total tackles per outing (12.6) to become the first NU player to earn First Team All-Big Ten honors since 2000.

A.J. Hawk, SR, LB, OSU

STATS: 141 tackles (66 solo)

Consensus All-American ranked fifth nationally (and second in the Big Ten) with 11.8 tackles per contest while adding 7.5 TFLs and two interceptions.

SPECIAL TEAMS

Steve Weatherford, SR, P, ILL (Coaches only)

STATS: 57-2589 yards, 23 Inside 20

Ranked second in the Big Ten and fourth nationally with an average of 45.4 yards per punt while dropping 23 boots inside the 20-yard line.

Brandon Fields, JR, P, MSU (Media only)

STATS: 50-2394 yards, 13 Inside 20

Consensus All-American and Ray Guy Award finalist led the country with an average of 47.9 yards per punt, the third-highest average in Big Ten history.

Familiar Faces in Starting Lineup:

Ten of the Big Ten's 11 teams return more than half of their starters from a season ago, as Purdue leads the way with an astounding 20 of its 24 starters back on the field in 2005. After replacing eight starters on the defensive side of the ball at the start of the 2004 campaign, the Boilermakers return all 11 starters on defense for the 2005 season along with seven offensive starters and their kicker and punter. Penn State ranks second with 19 starters back on campus while Ohio State brings back 18 starters. The Nittany Lions and Buckeyes lead the League with nine of their 11 offensive starters returning while

ranking second to Purdue with nine players back on the defensive side of the ball. Illinois and Michigan are tied for fourth with 16 starters returning. The Wolverines, along with Michigan State and Minnesota, return eight of 11 starters on the offensive side of the ball. The breakdown of starters returning and lost appears above while a complete list appears on each team page.

Pre-Season Notes



Veteran Signal Callers: After entering the 2004 campaign with six new starting quarterbacks, the Big Ten returns a wealth of experience behind the center in 2005 as eight of the 11 programs feature a returning starter. In addition, only two of those returning starters will be seniors this season. The schools with returning starters are Iowa (**Drew Tate**), Michigan (**Chad Henne**), Michigan State (**Drew Stanton**), Minnesota (**Bryan Cupito**), Northwestern (**Brett Basanez**), Ohio State (**Justin Zwick/Troy Smith**), Penn State (**Michael Robinson**) and Wisconsin (**John Stocco**). Below is a chart listing the statistics of the Big Ten starting quarterbacks returning to the field in 2005.

Breaking Down the Returning QBs:

Despite the turnover last season, five of the six new quarterbacks advanced to postseason play while the final stats featured five new standouts among the top 10 in pass efficiency and total offense. Iowa's Tate, who ended the year ranked second in the League with a pass efficiency of 134.7 in all games, earned First Team All-Big Ten honors from the coaches and led the Hawkeyes to a share of the Big Ten title and a victory in the Capital One Bowl. Michigan's Henne, ranked third in all games with a 132.6 pass efficiency, was an Honorable Mention All-Conference pick and became the first true freshman to start in the Rose Bowl after guiding the Wolverines to a share of the Big Ten crown. Michigan State's Stanton was also an Honorable Mention choice after rating fourth with a passer rating of 131.8 and third in total offense with 228.8 yards per contest. Minnesota's Cupito guided the Gophers to victory in the Music City Bowl and ranked sixth overall with a pass efficiency rating of 127.0. Northwestern's Basanez was an Honorable Mention selection and ranked second in the League in passing yards and total offense per contest. Ohio State rotated a pair of signal callers last season in Zwick, who led the team to a triumph in the Alamo Bowl, and Smith. Penn State's Robinson started three games last season at quarterback while also rotating at the wide receiver position. Wisconsin's Stocco led the Badgers to a berth in the Outback Bowl

while producing a passer rating of 109.8, which ranked 10th in the Conference.

More Returnees for 2005: In addition to the eight teams returning starting quarterbacks, the Big Ten will also return the majority of statistical leaders in rushing, receiving and tackles. On the ground, six of the top 10 rushers will be back on the field including Michigan freshman **Michael Hart**, who topped the League with 121.2 yards per contest and was a First Team All-League pick. Other returning rushers who received All-Conference laurels in 2004 are Illinois' **Pierre Thomas** (5th at 82.1 ypg) and Minnesota's **Laurence Maroney** (3rd at 112.3 ypg). Seven of the top 10 wideouts will also return to campus in 2005 led by Iowa's **Clint Solomon** and **Ed Hinkel**, who will be the returning statistical leaders in yards (75.4) and receptions (5.25) per contest, respectively. Other returning wide receivers to pick up 2004 All-League accolades are Michigan's **Jason Avant**, Minnesota's **Ernie Wheelwright**, Northwestern's **Mark Pilmore**, Ohio State's **Ted Ginn, Jr.**, and **Santonio Holmes** and Wisconsin's **Owen Daniels** and **Brandon Williams**. On the defensive side of the ball, eight of the top 10 tacklers will be back in 2005 including all four First Team All-Big Ten selections at linebacker in leading tackler **Tim McGarigle** of Northwestern (12.6 per game), Ohio State's **A.J. Hawk** (2nd with 11.8) and the Iowa pair of **Abdul Hodge** (4th with 9.7) and **Chad Greenway** (7th with 9.4).

Strong on the Line: The Big Ten will also be strong on the offensive and defensive lines in 2005, as nine of the 11 programs return at least three starting offensive linemen and nine schools feature at least two returning defensive linemen. On the offensive side of the ball, Indiana and Penn State return their entire starting offensive line while Iowa, Michigan and Ohio State feature four returning starters. The Nittany Lions are the only Conference squad to return every starter on both the offensive and defensive line, as Purdue will also feature four returning defensive linemen, part of a Boilermakers defense that brings back all 11 starters.

New Faces on the Sidelines:

The Big Ten will feature a pair of new head coaches in 2005 in Illinois' **Ron Zook** and Indiana's **Terry Hooppner**. Zook was named the 22nd head football coach in Illini history in December and

comes to Champaign with 27 years of coaching experience at both the collegiate and professional level. The new Illinois mentor served as the Florida head coach from 2002-04, posting an overall mark of 23-14 and 16-8 in Southeastern Conference action while leading the Gators to three consecutive bowl appearances and a share of the 2003 SEC East Division title. Hooppner, a native of Woodburn, Indiana, was named Indiana's 26th head football coach in December after leading Miami (Ohio) to a pair of consecutive Mid-American Conference East Division titles and bowl game appearances for the first time in 30 years. He spent 19 seasons at Miami and compiled a 48-24 overall record as the head coach over the last six years, including finishing among the top three in the MAC East each of those seasons.

Carr Aims for 100th Win: With a record of 95-29 in 10 seasons in Ann Arbor, Michigan head coach **Lloyd Carr** will aim to become just the 11th head coach in Big Ten history and the third in school annals to compile 100 wins at a single school. Wisconsin's **Barry Alvarez** became the 10th member of that group last season while Carr will look to join former Wolverines Bo Schembechler and Fielding Yost on the prestigious list. Breaking Down the 2005 Schedule: The 2005 Big Ten non-conference schedule features 13 games against 2004 bowl opponents, as nine of the 11 League programs will face at least one bowl team. Wisconsin may face the most challenging schedule, as three of their four non-conference foes played in a bowl last season -- Bowling Green (GMAC), North Carolina (Continental Tire) and Hawaii (Hawaii). Michigan and Ohio State both square off against a pair of bowl teams as the Wolverines will battle Northern Illinois (Silicon Valley Classic) and Notre Dame (Insight) while the Buckeyes will be tested by Miami (Ohio) (Independence) and Texas (Rose). Six other Big Ten squads will play one non-conference bowl opponent as Michigan State and Purdue will also take on the Fighting Irish, Illinois travels to California (Holiday), Iowa faces a road test at Iowa State (Independence), Northwestern will play at Arizona State (Sun) and Penn State hosts new Big East-member Cincinnati (Fort Worth).

Big Ten Instant Replay

Instant Replay Approved for 2005: The Big Ten will begin year two of its college football instant replay program in 2005. On February 24, the NCAA Playing Rules Oversight Panel approved the NCAA Football Rules Committee's proposal to allow all NCAA conferences and independent institutions to experiment with the use of video replay for the 2005 season.

First Year Success Story: The Big Ten used an experimental instant replay system during the 2004 season, as all 44 Big Ten games utilized the new system which was featured in 13 non-conference home games. The NCAA Football Rules Committee granted the Big Ten the right to experiment with instant replay on a one-year basis for all televised games at League stadiums in 2004 following a pilot program study conducted during the 2003 season. Visiting teams during non-conference contests needed to approve the usage of instant replay, as the four schools that did not grant their approval for use of the system were Arizona State (Sept. 11 at Northwestern), UCLA (Sept. 11 at Illinois), Iowa State (Sept. 11 at Iowa) and San Diego State (Sept. 18 at Michigan). The remaining 13 non-conference opponents consented to the use of instant replay, while the system was unavailable for the five home games not scheduled to be televised (Florida A&M and Western Michigan at Illinois; Central Michigan at Indiana; Kansas at Northwestern; Ball State at Purdue).

Instant Replay By The Numbers: During the 2004 campaign, play was stopped in only 28 of 57 contests (49 percent) for a total of 43 stoppages and 21 overturned calls (49 percent of stoppages). These numbers compared favorably to the Big Ten's instant replay pilot program, as the data collected in 2003 showed that play would have been stopped in 31 of 68 games (46 percent) for a total of 45 stoppages and 23 overturned calls (51 percent of stoppages). In addition, the use of instant replay did not significantly affect game times as the length of the 57 games utilizing instant replay in 2004 was only three hours and 16 minutes, compared to three hours and 13 minutes in all 2003 contests. Less than one stoppage occurred per game in 2004, as the Big Ten's average length of review was only two minutes and 39 seconds, compared to the National Football League average of three minutes and 20 seconds for its instant replay system.

Big Ten Bowl Wrapup

The Big Ten has recorded three or more bowl wins in three straight seasons for the first time in Conference history, as the League produced a record of 3-3 during the 2004 bowl season. The Big Ten boasted a 3-5 mark in 2003 and a record of 5-2 in 2002, as the League's 11 bowl wins over a three-year period ranks second all-time behind the Conference's 12 postseason triumphs during the 1998 (5-0), 1999 (5-2) and 2000 (2-4) bowl campaigns.

The Big Ten's total of three bowl wins last season was tied for second among all conferences, as the Big 12 produced a 4-3 mark followed by the Big Ten, ACC, Conference USA, Pac-10 and SEC with three triumphs. The complete conference-by-conference bowl breakdown appears to the right.

The Big Ten's 3-3 bowl record last season included victories in the Alamo, Music City and Capital One Bowls. Ohio State has won three straight bowl games for just the third time in school history and the first time since 1981-83. Minnesota has also won three straight bowl contests for the first time in program annals, as the Gophers won only two bowl games in their first seven bowl excursions. Iowa picked up its second straight postseason triumph for the first time since the 1995-96 seasons and third bowl victory in four years for the first time since the 1984-87 campaigns.

The Big Ten's three bowl defeats last season came by a combined eight points against higher-ranked opponents, as No. 13/12 Michigan was edged by one point on a last-second field goal in the Rose Bowl against No. 6/5 Texas, No. 16/16 Wisconsin was narrowly beaten by three points in the Outback Bowl against No. 8/7 Georgia while unranked Purdue was knocked off by four points in the Sun Bowl as No. 21/24 Arizona State tallied a touchdown with less than a minute left.

Four of the Big Ten's six bowl games drew sellout crowds, as one attendance record fell and two others were challenged during the 2004-05 bowl season. The Conference's six postseason games attracted 408,753 patrons for an average of 68,126 fans per contest, as the Alamo, Sun, Capital One and Rose Bowls all featured packed houses. The Music City Bowl set an all-time attendance record with 66,089 fans. The Sun Bowl attendance of 51,288 was the second-highest all-time and the largest crowd since the record was set in 1985 with 52,203 fans. The Alamo Bowl crowd of 65,265 was less than 150 below the all-time record of 65,380 established during the 1999 event.

The Big Ten's stable of coaches for the 2005 campaign, including new mentors Ron Zook at Illinois and Terry Hoeggner at Indiana, have produced a combined record of 48-39-1 (.551) in bowl games as collegiate head coaches and a mark of 30-22 (.577) as members of the Big Ten. Wisconsin's Barry Alvarez boasts a 7-3 record in bowls while Penn State's Joe Paterno ranks second among the Conference's coaches with six postseason triumphs since joining the League in 1993. Paterno is the all-time leader with 31 bowl games and 20 victories. Former Big Ten mentors Hayden Fry of Iowa and Bo Schembechler of Michigan are tied for ninth with 17 bowl bids each.

For the sixth straight year and 13th time overall, the Big Ten sent six or more teams to postseason play. It was the 12th straight season and 19th time overall that five or more Conference programs participated in bowls.

Over the last 10 years, League institutions have earned 65 bowl berths, including a League-record eight in 2003. Overall, Big Ten institutions have collected 212 bowl bids -- the third-highest total of all Division I-A conferences (SEC 337, Big 12 288).

Last season marked the 12th consecutive year that two or more Big Ten teams played on New Year's Day, dating back to the 1992 season.

Michigan's current streak of 30 consecutive bowls is the longest active streak in the nation.

Big Ten programs faced unfamiliar foes during the last bowl season, as League teams boasted a combined 1-1 all-time record against their six postseason opponents and four of the games featured the first-ever meetings between two schools. The four first-time matchups were Michigan-Texas, Iowa-LSU, Purdue-Arizona State and Minnesota-Alabama. Ohio State and Oklahoma State met for

the first time since the 1989 season opener, won by the Buckeyes. Wisconsin and Georgia squared off for the second time in the Outback Bowl, as the Badgers were defeated by the Bulldogs following the 1997 campaign.

Only two Big Ten programs made their first appearances in their respective bowl games as Iowa and Ohio State made their maiden voyages to the Capital One and Alamo Bowls, respectively. Prior to bowl competition, the Big Ten produced a record of 24-11 (.686) in non-conference play in 2004, as five of the eight schools that defeated League programs played in bowl games -- Arizona State, Boston College, Hawaii, Notre Dame and UCLA.

The Big Ten once again faced stiff competition in bowl games last year, as the League's opponents had a combined record of 49-17 (.742) prior to postseason play and three of the squads already boasted nine or more wins -- Texas (10-1), Georgia (9-2) and LSU (9-2). Only the Big 12 faced a tougher bowl slate, as its combined opponents' record was 63-17 (.788) with four programs holding nine or more triumphs.

The Big Ten boasts three of the 11 programs with 36 or more bowl appearances in Penn State (37), Michigan (36) and Ohio State (36). The Nittany Lions are tied for fourth all-time with 23 bowl triumphs, the Wolverines rank 12th with 18 victories and the Buckeyes are tied at 13th with 17 wins.

IOWA QB Drew Tate: Named Capital One Bowl Most Valuable Player after completing 20-of-32 passes for 287 yards and two TDs, including a 56-yard scoring strike to Warren Holloway with no time on the clock to send Iowa to victory.

MICH WR Braylon Edwards: Hauled in 10 passes for 109 yards and shattered Big Ten and school record for career TDs as his three scoring receptions boosted his career total to 39 TDs.

MICH QB Chad Henne: Became the first true freshman to start at quarterback in the Rose Bowl and equaled a bowl record with four TD passes, connecting on 18-of-34 attempts for 227 yards.

MINN RBs Marion Barber III and Laurence Maroney: Became the first running backs to break the 100-yard barrier against Alabama last season; Barber set a Music City Bowl record with 187 rushing yards on 37 attempts with one TD while Maroney added 29 carries for 105 yards.

OSU WR Ted Ginn, Jr.: Compiled 125 all-purpose yards while playing quarterback (rotating with injured starter Justin Zwick), wide receiver and returning kicks; Racked up 40 rushing yards, including a five-yard TD, and led OSU with six catches for 78 yards.

PUR QB Kyle Orton: Completed 23-of-47 passes for 281 yards and three TDs, including a scoring strike with 1:14 left in the game to give Purdue the lead; Ended his career ranked among the top four in Big Ten annals in total offense, passing attempts, completions and yards.

PUR WR Taylor Stubblefield: Boosted NCAA receiving record to 316 career catches while hauling in seven passes for 81 yards and a TD.

DEFENSE:

IOWA DT Jonathan Babineaux: Recorded seven tackles, 4.5 TFLs (-28 yards), 2.5 sacks (-13 yards) and a forced fumble.

IOWA LB Abdul Hodge: Racked up a game-high 15 tackles (10 solo), including 2.5 sacks (-13 yards)

MICH DE LaMarr Woodley: Named Rose Bowl Defensive Player of the Game after racking up a game-high 11 tackles and four TFLs (-7 yards).

PUR S Bernard Pollard: Registered a game-high 14 tackles (10 solo) with two passes defended.

PUR DT Brandon Villarreal: Produced seven tackles, including four TFLs (-14 yards) and an eight-yard sack.

WIS LB Andy Crooks: Posted seven tackles and returned interception 11 yards for a TD to narrow the gap to 24-21 with 4:13 left in the game.

SPECIAL TEAMS:

IOWA P David Bradley: Averaged 49.2 yards on six punts (295 yards total), including a 56-yarder.

MICH KR/PR Steve Breaston: Set school and Rose Bowl records with 221 yards on six kickoff returns, as the yardage total ranks third in Big Ten annals; Also totaled 315 all-purpose yards, including 77 receiving yards and a 50-yard scoring reception.

MICH K Garrett Rivas: Was a perfect 3-of-3 on field goals (44, 32, 42), as his 42-yarder gave Michigan the lead with 3:04 left in the game.

OSU K Mike Nugent: Connected on 4-of-4 field goals (37, 35, 41, 46) to establish school career scoring record of 356 points, while his 72 career field goals established a new Big Ten and program record.

PUR P Dave Brytus: Placed four punts inside the 20-yard line while averaging 48.9 yards on eight boots, including a long of 48 yards.

2004 Season in Review



Big Ten Standouts Claim National Honors: The Big Ten Conference collected three postseason football awards, as Michigan's **Braylon Edwards** claimed the Biletnikoff Award, teammate **David Baas** shared the Rimington Trophy and Ohio State's **Mike Nugent** was named the Lou Groza Award honoree. Edwards became the first Michigan standout to earn the Fred Biletnikoff Award, which honors the nation's outstanding wide receiver. The Big Ten Offensive Player of the Year is the fourth Conference player to pick up this award, joining Penn State's Bobby Engram (1994), Ohio State's Terry Glenn (1995) and Michigan State's Charles Rogers (2002). Baas also set a school first as he is the only Wolverine to win the Rimington Trophy, which is awarded to the country's best center. The Big Ten Offensive Lineman of the Year shared the national laurel with LSU's Ben Wilkerson and is only the second Conference standout to be honored along with Ohio State's LeCharles Bentley (2001). Nugent is the second Big Ten student-athlete in the last three years to claim the Lou Groza Award, which goes to the nation's best place kicker. The First Team All-Big Ten selection joins Iowa's Nate Kaeding (2002) as the League's only other winner of this award.

Big Ten Dominates All-America Teams: The Big Ten led all conferences with nine consensus All-Americans, followed by the SEC (6), Pac-10 (5), ACC (4) and Big 12 (3). The Big Ten's nine honorees included unanimous selections Edwards and Nugent, along with Michigan's Baas, **Marlin Jackson** and **Ernest Shazor**, Michigan State's **Brandon Fields**, Ohio State's **A.J. Hawk**, Purdue's **Taylor Stubblefield** and Wisconsin's **Erasmus James**. Michigan and USC led the nation with four consensus All-Americans a piece, while Ohio State was one of five schools with two honorees.

Excelling Both On and Off the Field: Six Big Ten student-athletes were named to either the first or second team of the 2004 ESPN The Magazine Academic All-America squads. First Team honorees included the Northwestern duo of defensive back **Jeff Backes** and defensive tackle **Luis Castillo**, Penn State defensive back **Andrew Guman** and Wisconsin defensive back **Jim Leonhard**, while Michigan punter **Adam Finley** and Minnesota offensive lineman **Greg Eslinger** were named to the Second Team. Backes and Leonhard were both Second Team Academic All-Americans last season. To be nominated, student-athletes must be a starter or important reserve and carry a cumulative grade point average of 3.20 or higher.

Iowa and Michigan Share 2004 Big Ten Title: For the fifth time in the last 10 seasons, the Big Ten Championship was split by multiple teams as Iowa and Michigan both earned a share of the 2004 crown. The Wolverines entered the final weekend of League action with a 7-0 Conference mark and at least a share of the Conference title, as the Hawkeyes and Wisconsin were both one game back in the standings at 6-1. After Michigan was knocked off at Ohio State, the two second-place teams squared off in Iowa City as the hosts defeated the Badgers to earn a share of the championship. After opening the 2004 Big Ten season with a defeat against Michigan, Iowa rallied to win its final seven Conference contests. However, the Wolverines claimed the Big Ten automatic berth into the Bowl Championship Series (BCS) based on their victory over the Hawkeyes.

Wolverines Collect 42nd Big Ten Title: Michigan claimed back-to-back Big Ten titles for the first time since the 1997-98 seasons and its fifth championship in 10 years under head coach **Lloyd Carr** (1997, 1998, 2000, 2003, 2004). The Wolverines built on their League-leading total of Conference crowns as the program earned a share of its 42nd Big Ten Championship. Ohio State ranks second with 29 League titles, followed by Minnesota (18) and Illinois (15).

2004 Season in Review



Hawkeyes Pick Up 11th Conference Crown: Iowa, which also tied for the top spot in 2002, picked up its second title in three seasons for the first time since finishing atop the standings in 1960 and 1958. The Hawkeyes now boast 11 Big Ten Championships, which is tied for fifth among all League teams with Wisconsin.

Carr Joins Prestigious Coaching Circle: Michigan's **Lloyd Carr** is now one of only eight head coaches in League history to win five or more Big Ten titles. The Wolverines mentor joined a prestigious group that includes Chicago's Amos Alonzo Stagg (seven titles from 1896-1932), Illinois' Bob Zuppke (seven from 1913-41), Michigan's Bo Schembechler (13 from 1969-89) and Fielding Yost (10 from 1901-26), Minnesota's Bernie Bierman (seven from 1932-50) and Henry Williams (eight from 1900-21) and Ohio State's Woody Hayes (13 from 1951-78). Carr concluded his 10th season in Ann Arbor in 2004, as he ranks third among all 10-year Big Ten coaches with a winning percentage of .788 (63-17) in League games only. Schembechler leads all Conference coaches with a winning percentage of .850 (143-24-3) in League outings.

Ferentz Accomplishes Rare Feat: Iowa head coach **Kirk Ferentz** led the Hawkeyes to 10 or more wins in three straight seasons for the first time in school history. He joined a rare coaching fraternity of six other mentors who have accomplished that feat, along with Michigan's Carr (1997-99), Schembechler (1971-74; 1976-78) and Yost (1901-05), Minnesota's Williams (1903-05) and Ohio State's John Cooper (1995-98) and Hayes (1973-75).

Big Ten Championships for Current Coaches: Seven current League coaches have earned at least one Big Ten crown in their careers, led by Michigan's Lloyd Carr. The complete list is below:

Spreading the Wealth: In the last decade (1995-2004), seven different teams have won the Big Ten title either outright or as a co-champion: Illinois ('01), Iowa ('02, '04), Michigan ('97, '98, '00, '03, '04), Northwestern ('95, '96, '00), Ohio State ('96, '98, '02), Purdue ('00) and Wisconsin ('98, '99). The title has been shared by at least two teams five times in this span, with a pair of three-team ties in 1998 and 2000 and two teams atop the standings in 1996, 2002 and 2004.

Big Ten Packs Them In: Big Ten schools produced sellout crowds at a record pace during the 2004 season, as the League established a Conference record with 39 sellouts on the year. The Big Ten's 39 full houses were accomplished in only 66 home outings, as the previous record of 38 sellouts was set in 67 games in 2000 while the League boasted 37 packed houses in 75 home contests in 2003. Nine of the Conference's 11 teams produced at least one sellout, as Iowa, Michigan, Michigan State, Ohio State and Wisconsin sold out every home game.

The Nation's Best Fans: The Big Ten shattered the four-million barrier in total attendance for the 12th straight season and the 15th time overall, as 4,591,722 fans went through the turnstiles for 66 games. The League's average

of 69,572 patrons per contest ranks fourth in Conference history, as the Big Ten record of 70,505 was established in 2002. Michigan averaged 111,025 patrons in six home contests to establish a new Big Ten and NCAA record for average attendance in a season. The Wolverines led the nation in average attendance and were joined by two other League outfits in the top four, as Ohio State (104,876) ranked third while Penn State (103,111) rated fourth. Other Big Ten teams among the top 30 included No. 13 Wisconsin (82,368), No. 20 Michigan State (73,602), No. 21 Iowa (70,397) and No. 26 Purdue (63,549). The Conference surpassed the five-million mark in each of the last two seasons while playing 75 home games in 2003 and 78 home games in 2002, compared to the 66 home outings scheduled for 2004. In League games only, the Big Ten averaged more than 70,000 fans per contest for the fifth straight season as Conference schools welcomed 70,016 patrons in 44 home outings, including 28 sellouts. In addition, the Big Ten shattered the oldest single-day attendance record in Conference history during the opening week of play, as 650,916 fans attended nine home contests on September 4 and 5 for an average of 72,324 patrons per game. The old nine-game record had stood since October 6, 1980, when 596,916 fans were present at nine home contests (66,324 avg.).

Big Ten Individual Leaders . . . : The Big Ten crowned new individual statistical champions in four categories for Conference games only. Michigan running back **Michael Hart** topped the League with 151.8 yards per game to become the first true freshman to lead the Big Ten in that category since Wisconsin's Ron Dayne began his march to the Conference's all-time rushing record with 163.3 yards per outing in 1996. Hart is the second straight Wolverine to lead the Big Ten in rushing, as Chris Perry averaged 126.8 yards per outing in 2003 on his way to Offensive Player of the Year accolades. Iowa's **Drew Tate** became the second Hawkeye quarterback in the last three years to lead the League in pass efficiency as the first-year starter produced a 137.1 pass efficiency rating, completing 176 of 280 passes (62.9 percent) for 2,099 yards and 15 touchdowns. O'Brien Award winner Brad Banks of Iowa topped the Big Ten with a 171.2 rating in 2002. Purdue's prolific passing tandem of **Kyle Orton** and **Taylor Stubblefield** led the League in two categories, as Orton averaged 265.7 yards of total offense while Stubblefield hauled in 8.12 receptions per game. Orton is the first Boilermaker to lead the Big Ten in total offense since Drew Brees dominated the category from 1998-2000. Purdue has now produced the Conference's leading pass-catcher in five of the last six seasons, as Stubblefield also led the way as a sophomore in 2002 before giving way to teammate John Standeford in 2003. Stubblefield's 8.12 catches per outing is

the highest average since fellow-Boilermaker Chris Daniels averaged 9.9 receptions per contest in 1999. Michigan State's **Dave Rayner** became the first kicker to lead the Big Ten in scoring since fellow-Spartan Paul Edinger in 1998, as Rayner tallied 10.4 points per game this season while connecting on 19 field goals and 26 extra points. Another MSU special teams standout led the way in another category, as **Brandon Fields** topped the Big Ten in punting for the second straight season after averaging 48.0 yards per boot. He is the first player to lead the League in punting in consecutive years since fellow-Spartan Greg Montgomery accomplished the feat in 1985 and 1986.

... And Team Leaders: Michigan State became the first team since Northwestern in 2000 to lead the Big Ten in total offense, scoring offense and rushing offense, as the Spartans topped the League in all three categories in Conference games only for just the second time in school history and the first time since 1965. MSU averaged a League-best 477 yards, 31.6 points and 265.8 rushing yards in eight Big Ten outings. The last time the Spartans led the Conference in total offense or points per game was 1996, as the team had not produced the Big Ten's top ground attack since 1990. After a three-year absence, Purdue once again boasted the League's top passing attack after racking up 307.2 yards per contest in 2004. The Boilermakers led the way in passing for five consecutive seasons from 1996-2000. On the defensive side of the ball, Iowa and Penn State split the statistical honors as the Hawkeyes ranked first in the Big Ten total and rushing defense while the Nittany Lions topped the League in passing and scoring defense. Iowa has now led the Big Ten against the run twice in the last three years, as their 2002 title team also ranked first, while the last time the Hawkeyes led the way in total defense was 1984. Penn State ended the season first in points and passing yards allowed for the first time in school annals.

NCAA Record-Breakers: The Big Ten made its mark on the NCAA records book during the 2004 campaign, setting career and single-season records in both individual and team categories. Purdue's **Taylor Stubblefield** hauled in 14 passes in his final regular season game to break the former NCAA record of 300 receptions, set by Louisville's Arnold Jackson from 1997-2000, before adding seven catches in the Sun Bowl to boost his NCAA standard to 316 career catches. Stubblefield is the Big Ten's all-time leading receiver with 325 receptions, as the NCAA did not include bowl game statistics until the 2002 season (which erases his nine catches in the 2001 Sun Bowl). Ohio State's **Ted Ginn, Jr.** recorded four punt return touchdowns on the year to equal the NCAA single-season record held by Kansas State's David Allen (1998) and BYU's Golden Richards (1971). The Buckeye freshman ranks second on the Big Ten career list behind Iowa's Tim Dwight, who returned five punts for touchdowns from 1994-97. And finally, Northwestern played in four overtime games in 2004 to establish a new NCAA single-season high.

New Big Ten Records: In addition to Stubblefield's attack on the NCAA records book, the Purdue wideout was one of four players to set Big Ten career records last season. Stubblefield not only holds the Conference record with 325 career receptions, he ended his career ranked second with 3,629 receiving yards behind former teammate John Standeford, who set the League standard in 2003 with 3,788 career yards. Fellow wideout and Big Ten Offensive Player of the Year **Braylon Edwards** hauled in three touchdowns in the Rose Bowl to set a Big Ten and school record with 39 career receiving scores, surpassing former-Wolverine Anthony Carter's total of 37 touchdowns scored from 1979-82. Edwards ended his time in Ann Arbor ranked third all-time with 3,542 receiving yards and fourth with 252 receptions. Ohio State kicker **Mike Nugent** booted four field goals in the Alamo Bowl to set the Big Ten career record with 72 field goals, sur-

passing the 71 field goals recorded by Minnesota's Dan Nystrom from 1999-2002. Nugent ended his career with a school record 356 points, which ranks third among all Big Ten place kickers. Wisconsin's **Jim Leonhard** established the League record for punt return yardage as he boasts 1,347 yards running back punts and his 105 career punt returns rate third in League annals. The three-time First Team All-Big Ten selection at defensive back is also tied for fourth in the Big Ten records book with 21 interceptions, as he equaled Jamar Fletcher for the Badgers school record this season.

Big Ten Single-Season Records: Conference standouts surpassed or nearly equaled some single-season Big Ten records for all games, as Ohio State freshman **Ted Ginn, Jr.** set the single-season record with four punt return touchdowns and an average of 25.6 yards per punt return. Fellow Buckeye **Mike Nugent** ended the year with 24 field goals, the second-highest single-season total in Big Ten history as four players have booted 25 field goals, most recently Purdue's Ben Jones in 2003. Michigan State's **Brandon Fields** averaged 47.9 yards per punt, which ranks third in League annals behind Iowa's Reggie Roby (49.8 avg. in 1981) and Purdue's Travis Dorsch (48.1 avg. in 2001). The Purdue passing connection of **Kyle Orton** and **Taylor Stubblefield** both appear among the single-season leaders, as Orton's 31 touchdown passes last season rank second all-time behind fellow Boilermaker Drew Brees' 39 scoring tosses in 1998. Stubblefield's 16 touchdown receptions rank third behind OSU's Terry Glenn (17 in 1995) and Michigan's Desmond Howard (19 in 1991).

Rushing to Greatness: The Minnesota tandem of **Marion Barber III** and **Laurence Maroney** became the first pair of teammates in NCAA history to both rack up 1,000 yards rushing in back-to-back seasons, while Michigan freshman **Michael Hart** ended the season ranked second among Conference freshman for single-season ground efforts. After Barber III and Maroney rushed for 1,196 and 1,121 yards, respectively, in 2003, Maroney rated third in the Conference with 1,348 yards on the ground while Barber III was fourth with 1,269 stripes. Hart topped the Big Ten with 1,455 rushing yards, as only Wisconsin's Ron Dayne (2,109 yards in 1996) produced more yards as a freshman.

Edwards' Receiving Feat: Michigan wideout **Braylon Edwards** became the first player in Big Ten history to record three consecutive 1,000-yard receiving seasons, as he produced a career-high 1,330 yards in 2004 after breaking the 1,000-yard barrier as a sophomore (1,035) and junior (1,138).

Four Big Ten Mentors Among Top 10 All-Time Coaches: The Big Ten boasted four of the top 10 coaches of all-time, twice as many as any other conference, in the "Dell Presents College Football's 10 Greatest Coaches" survey. Current Penn State mentor **Joe Paterno** was ranked the second-best coach of all-time behind only Alabama's Paul "Bear" Bryant, as the PSU head coach broke Bryant's record for Division I-A victories in 2001. Other Big Ten head coaches among the top 10 included Ohio State's **Woody Hayes** (6th), Michigan's **Bo Schembechler** (9th) and Chicago's **Amos Alonzo Stagg** (10th). An expert panel of more than 300 media, current and former football coaches, Heisman Trophy winners and members of the College Football Hall of Fame made the selections, in addition to thousands of online voters.

Alvarez Joins Century Club: Wisconsin's **Barry Alvarez** became just the 10th head coach in Big Ten history and the first in school annals to compile 100 wins at a single school with a home triumph over Central Florida on September 4. Alvarez is now 108-70-4 in 15 seasons in Madison, including a mark of 7-3 in bowl games and three Rose Bowl victories.

BIG TEN ANNOUNCES 2004 FOOTBALL ALL-CONFERENCE TEAMS AND INDIVIDUAL HONORS

The Big Ten announced the 2004 All-Conference Football teams and individual award winners on November 23 as selected by the League coaches and a media panel. Big Ten Co-Champion Michigan claimed three individual honors as the coaches and media picked **Braylon Edwards** as the Offensive Player of the Year and **Michael Hart** as the Freshman of the Year while the coaches also chose **David Baas** as the Offensive Lineman of the Year. Wisconsin's **Erasmus James** swept Defensive Player of the Year laurels from both groups while also garnering Defensive Lineman of the Year accolades from the coaches. Iowa mentor **Kirk Ferentz** was the media's choice for the Dave McClain Coach of the Year award after leading his program to a share of the title.

Edwards boosted Michigan to back-to-back Big Ten titles for the first time since the 1997-98 seasons to become the second straight Wolverine to earn League Offensive Player of the Year laurels, as running back Chris Perry was honored last season. The senior became the first wide receiver to be named Offensive Player of the Year since fellow-UM wideout Desmond Howard collected the accolade in 1991 on his way to the Heisman Trophy. Edwards is the first player in Big Ten history to record three consecutive 1,000-yard receiving seasons, as he has produced a career-high 1,221 yards in 2004 after breaking the 1,000-yard barrier as a junior (1,138) and sophomore (1,035). The Detroit-native currently ranks among the top four in Conference career records for receiving touchdowns (2nd with 36), receptions (4th with 242) and yards (4th with 3,433). A finalist for the Biletnikoff, Maxwell and Walter Camp Awards, Edwards leads the Big Ten and ranks among the top five nationally in receptions (3rd with 7.91) and receiving yards (5th with 111.0) per contest and is also tied for third in the country with 12 touchdown catches. He is the only player to earn unanimous First Team All-Big Ten honors from both coaches and media this season, as he was also a First Team honoree in 2003.

Hart became the first true freshman to lead the Big Ten in rushing since Wisconsin's Ron Dayne in 1996 to give the Wolverines their second straight Freshman of the Year award, as Steve Breaston was honored by the coaches last season. Hart ranks 10th nationally with 124.7 rushing yards per outing, as he accumulated 261 attempts for 1,372 yards and nine touchdowns this season. He was also the only freshman to earn All-Big Ten First Team accolades in 2004.

Baas was tabbed the Offensive Lineman of the Year as he bolstered an attack that blocked for the League's leading rusher and protected a true freshman quarterback. After earning First Team All-Conference laurels as a guard the last two seasons, the senior made the move to center and the Wolverines ranked second in Big Ten play with 423.6 total yards and 30.8 points per game. Baas is only the second offensive lineman in Michigan history to earn First Team All-League honors in three straight seasons along with four-time honoree Steve Hutchinson (1997-2000), who was the last Wolverine to be named Offensive Lineman of the Year in 2000.

James was named the Defensive Player and Defensive Lineman of the Year after leading a Wisconsin defense that topped the Big Ten and ranked among the top 10 nationally in passing (6th with 158.5 yards per game), scoring (7th with 14.6 points per contest) and total defense (8th with 275.9 yards per outing). The senior defensive end is a finalist for the Lombardi Award, Nagurski Trophy and Hendricks Award after leading the Conference and ranking among the top 15 in the country with eight sacks. He picks up First Team All-Big Ten honors for the first time in his career, including a unanimous selection by the media. James is the first Badger to claim Defensive Player and

Defensive Lineman of the Year accolades in the same year since Tom Burke in 1998, as Wisconsin has produced the Defensive Lineman of the Year in four of the last seven seasons including Wendell Bryant in 2000 and 2001. The last UW product to collect the Defensive Player of the Year award was Jamar Fletcher in 2000.

Ferentz earns Coach of the Year laurels for the second time in his career, as he was also honored in 2002 after leading the Hawkeyes to his first Big Ten title. The Iowa mentor rallied his team from a season-opening defeat at Michigan to reel off seven straight victories and earn a share of the 2004 Big Ten Championship, as Iowa finished atop the standings twice in three seasons for the first time since 1960 and 1958. The only other Hawkeyes mentor to claim Coach of the Year honors was Hayden Fry, who was honored on two occasions in 1981 and 1990. The Dave McClain Big Ten Coach of the Year award is voted on by a Conference media panel and is named for the late Wisconsin coach, who served at the Badgers' helm from 1978-1985. The League dedicated this award to his honor in 1986.

Overall, there are 17 repeat honorees on either the First or Second All-Big Ten Teams from a year ago, including eight First Team selections from 2003 who are on this year's First Team - Iowa's Abdul Hodge and Matt Roth, Michigan's Baas and Edwards, Minnesota's Greg Eslinger, Ohio State's A.J. Hawk and Wisconsin's Anttaj Hawthorne and Jim Leonhard. Baas and Leonhard are the only three-time First Team All-Big Ten honorees, as Leonhard is the first Badger to earn three straight selections since Bryant from 1999-2001.

The Conference office also announced honorees from each team for the Big Ten Sportsmanship Award. The student-athletes chosen are individuals who have distinguished themselves through sportsmanship and ethical behavior. In addition, the student-athletes must be in good academic standing and have demonstrated good citizenship outside of the sports-competition setting. Honorees for football are **Kelvin Hayden** of Illinois, **Aaron Halterman** of Indiana, **Jonathan Babineaux** of Iowa, **Kevin Dudley** of Michigan, **Tyrell Dortch** of Michigan State, **Dominique Sims** of Minnesota, **Luis Castillo** of Northwestern, **Maurice Hall** of Ohio State, **Zack Mills** of Penn State, **Kyle Ingraham** of Purdue and **Scott Starks** of Wisconsin. These 11 student-athletes are now candidates for the Big Ten Sportsmanship Award, as the Conference office will select one male and one female student-athlete from each institution at the end of the school year.
