**FOUR TEAMS AND TWO INDIVIDUAL HEAD TO 2006 NCAA REGIONALS**

Four Big Ten men's golf teams and two individuals will compete in NCAA Regional competition, May 18-20. Big Ten Champion Northwestern will play in the Central Regional with Minnesota and Purdue. Also competing in the Central Regional will be Illinois' Patrick Nagle and Michigan State's Ryan Brehm. Indiana will compete in the East Regional.



Three regional tournaments, encompassing the current nine regions, will be conducted over the three-day span. A total of 27 teams and six individuals not on selected teams were assigned to each regional site. Ten teams and two individuals not on advancing teams will move on from each regional to the championship finals. The championships will be conducted May 31-June 3 at Crosswater Golf Club at Sunriver Resort in Sunriver, Ore. The University of Portland is the host institution for this year's championships.

Minnesota, Northwestern, Purdue and the two conference individuals in Brehm and Nagle will compete at the Sand Ridge Golf Club in Chardon, Ohio. Cleveland State is serving as host. Northwestern, rated 28th in the latest Golfweek/Sagarin index, earned the No. 9 seed in the Central Regional, while Minnesota and Purdue earned the 10th and 15th seeds, respectively. This year's regional selections mark the 14th-consecutive trip for Minnesota and the fifth time in the last six seasons Purdue has competed. Northwestern, which is seeking its 23rd all-time trip to the national championships, is returning to the postseason after a two-year hiatus.

The 15th-seeded Hoosiers will participate in the East Regional for the second-straight season at the Lake Nona Golf Club in Orlando. This marks the first time Indiana has made three consecutive NCAA appearances since the Hoosiers advanced to six straight from 1972-77. It also is the third NCAA berth in Big Ten Coach of the Year Mike Mayer's eight years at the helm of the IU program.

Brehm was the 2005 Big Ten Freshman of the Year and recently posted a runner-up finish at the Big Ten Championships for the second year in a row earning First Team All-Conference honors for his efforts. Nagle, a Second-Team All-Big Ten selection, led the Illini during the season with a 73.61 stroke average in 23 rounds. He has recorded four top-10 finishes on the year and was Illinois' top finisher in five of eight tournaments before a hand injury forced him out of the lineup for the final three tournaments of the regular season.

Currently, all four active Big Ten squads are ranked in the nation's top 50 by *Golfweek*/Sagarin. Northwestern is 28th, followed by No. 33 Minnesota, No. 41 Purdue and No. 47 Indiana.

**NORTHWESTERN SWEEPS 2006 BIG TEN MEN'S GOLF TITLES**

Despite strong winds and Sunday morning showers, Northwestern took back the team lead it held after day one to claim the 2006 Big Ten Men's Golf Championships title on April 30, the eighth team crown in school history. A strong charge on the back nine, led by Wildcat junior Chris Wilson, proved to be the deciding factor in the team results as NU shot a final-round 17-over-par 301 for an overall score of 1160 (282-286-291-301).



Wilson captured the individual title with a 4-under 280 (70-70-71-69) and was the only competitor to record all four rounds of even-par or better. The last time Northwestern won a Big Ten team title was in 2001, the same year former Wildcat Luke Donald claimed medalist honors. The 2006 season marked the third time in the NU records books that the Wildcats captured both the team and individual titles.

Minnesota was this year's runner up with a final mark of 1169 (288-294-280-307). Purdue also moved up the team standings on the final day, firing an 1170 (284-286-294-306) after four rounds to finish third just one stroke behind the Golden Gophers. Michigan State, which led after the first round and sat in second place entering the final round, dropped to fourth place with an 1172 (277-292-289-314). Illinois finished in fifth place with an 1177 (285-295-288-309).

Indiana placed sixth (285-288-283-325--1181), followed by Penn State (293-299-290-315--1197) and Wisconsin (291-296-296-318--1201). Ohio State (302-309-291-323--1225), Michigan (308-305-297-318--1228) and Iowa (296-310-302-325--1233) rounded out the final team standings.

Michigan State's Ryan Brehm, the 2005 Big Ten Freshman of the Year, placed second overall with a final score of 3-under 281 (64-72-70-75). Purdue's Pariya Junhasavasdikul placed third at 1-under 283 (71-66-71-75), while Minnesota's Bronson La'Cassie fired at fourth-round 3-over 74 to take him to 1-over 285 (72-71-68-74), good enough for fourth place. Gopher teammate Clayton Rask rounded out the top-five after shooting a 5-over 289 (72-74-69-74).
