BIG TEN PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Jessica Davenport, Ohio State
SR, 6-5, C, Columbus, Ohio/Independence

Davenport turned in three consecutive double-double performances in wins over No. 22 Boston College, Cornell and Montana this past week and averaged 21.6 points and 10.3 rebounds per game over that stretch. The latter two wins earned No. 6/6 Ohio State its sixth-consecutive Buckeye Classic tournament title and helped Davenport claim Most Valuable Player honors for the third year in a row. After posting 19 points and 11 boards in a double-overtime win against Boston College, Davenport shot 18-of-21 on 85 percent shooting while blocking 12 shots in the two Buckeye Classic wins. This is Davenport's first weekly honor of the season and 10th of her career, which is second all-time behind the 17 of Penn State's Kelly Mazzante.

BIG TEN NEWS & NOTES

A Full Week of Women's Hoops

Big Ten women's basketball action will take to the court on Tuesday, Nov. 28, with Michigan, Penn State and Wisconsin on the road. A total of 26 games will be contested this week, highlighted by seven on Sunday. Northwestern, which is 4-1 on the season, will host its annual Mildred & Roger L. White Invitational in Evanston this weekend.

Three Teams Remain Undefeated

Three Big Ten squads have yet to suffer a loss in the 2006-07 season. Purdue and Wisconsin sit atop the standings at 6-0, with Ohio State one game back at 5-0. Three weeks into the season, the Big Ten boasts a combined 44-12 record.

Eight Conference Teams Recognized by AP

In the latest Associated Press Top 25 Poll, released on Nov. 27, eight Big Ten squads earned recognition including three inside the top 25. Ohio State is ranked No. 6 overall, followed by No. 9 Purdue and No. 20 Michigan State. Five teams are accumulating votes outside the top 25 in Indiana, Iowa, Northwestern, Penn State and Wisconsin.

ESPN2 to Televisе Top-10 Matchup Thursday

Big Ten basketball hits the national airwaves on Thursday night as No. 9 Purdue travels to No. 7 Connecticut. ESPN2 will broadcast the game at 7 p.m. ET. Purdue, which has only faced UConn twice, captured the first meeting, 89-87 in overtime, on Dec. 1, 1990. The two teams last met in the 2003 NCAA East Regional Championship, when the top-ranked Huskies defeated No. 10 Purdue, 73-64.

Indiana Nearly Misses Another Tourney Title

Indiana extended its record to 5-0 last week with a 73-52 win over Wright State, but suffered the first loss of the season in the championship game of the Miami Thanksgiving Tournament to the host Hurricanes, 79-70. The Hoosiers picked up consolation honors as junior Nikki Smith and sophomore Whitney Thomas each earned All-Tournament honors. Thomas recorded her second double-double of the season in the Hoosiers' game against Miami with 13 points and 10 rebounds. IU is now 5-1 on the season and receiving votes in both the ESPN/USA Today Coaches and Associated Press polls.

Nothing But Freebees

Iowa has been quite impressive this season from the free throw line, as the Hawkeyes have converted 79.7 percent of its attempts. They have made 137-of-172, while their opponents are only 85-of-121 (.702). Iowa gets to the free throw line 19.6 times per game and made its first 22 attempts from the foul line in its six-point win at Creighton last week.

Movin' On Up...

Michigan State sophomore Aisha Jefferson has rebounded after preseason knee and shoulder surgery and proven she is a threat again for the Spartans. In the past two weeks, she has returned to post impressive numbers, including 16 points and six rebounds against UT Arlington on Nov. 19. She boasted a career performance against Houston on Nov. 26 as she recorded 17 points and 15 rebounds. The career-high 15 rebounds helped her draw fouls, as she went to the charity stripe a career high 11 times, and connected a career high seven shots.

First One to 100

This past week, Pam Borton won her 100th game at Minnesota (100-35), becoming the second coach to reach the century mark at Gophers' coach and the fastest to do so.

From Way Downtown...

Indiana's Nikki Smith turned in an impressive performance from beyond the arc in the Hoosiers' 73-52 win over Wright State last week in Miami, Fla. The IU junior guard shot .833 from the perimeter on 5-of-6 shooting, which ties her for sixth all-time in Big Ten history. The last conference standout to hit 83 percent of their shots from the perimeter was Smith's former teammate Cyndi Valentin. Last year's All-Big Ten selection hit 5-of-6 from beyond the arc in the Hoosiers' upset of Purdue in West Lafayette.

Stone Keeps on Rolling

At 6-0, the Wisconsin Badgers have their best season opening under fourth year coach Lisa Stone. It is the team's best opening since 1997-98 when the Badgers opened the season 9-0.

Former Boilermaker Stars in Big Ten Campaign

Former Purdue All-American Katie Douglas is one of 11 selected student-athletes that will be the face of the Big Ten Conference this year as it celebrates its 25th Anniversary of Women's Championships. Douglas has been featured in a 30-second public service announcement "sharing her story" about overcoming family tragedy to become a Big Ten and NCAA Champion. Illinois head coach **Theresa Greutz** and Penn State mentor **Rene Portland** were former teammates at Immaculata back in the mid-70s. Today, they are together again as the most tenured head coaches in the Big Ten. The 2006-07 season marks the 27th season at PSU for Portland, while Greutz enters her 12th year with the Illini. In fact, those combined 39 years on a conference campus are three more than the total of the remaining nine Big Ten coaches' tenures. The landscape of conference mentors has taken on a fairly fresh look since the 1999-00 season. Excluding Greutz and Portland, nine of the 11 conference coaches have spent six years or less at their respective schools. Seven coaches have spent less than four years on their respective Big Ten campuses.
