**BIG TEN PLAYER OF THE WEEK**

**Allyssa DeHaan, Michigan State**  
Fr., 6-9, C, Grandville, Mich./Grandville

DeHaan earns her first career Player of the Week award after averaging 24 points on 18-of-26 (.692) shooting, in addition to 9.5 rebounds, 6.5 blocks and two assists in a pair of Michigan State wins last week. Her 28 points against Rhode Island was the second-highest point total for a freshman in school history, despite playing just 27 minutes. Against South Florida, she tied her own school record with eight blocks while posting 20 points on 7-of-12 shooting from the field. The freshman was also 6-of-7 from the free throw line versus the Bulls, who are receiving votes in both national polls. Her 32 blocks through seven games are already tied for the 11th-best mark in school history. DeHaan is the first freshman to earn the weekly award since Michigan's Stephany Skrba was honored on Nov. 14, 2005.

**BIG TEN NEWS & NOTES**

**Big Ten Off to Best Start Since 1998**

With all 11 conference schools at or above the .500 mark, the Big Ten is off to its best start since the 1998-99 season. This is the latest the conference has gone in the season having all 11 teams with a winning percentage of .500 or better since Dec. 27, 1998. At that time, Ohio State topped the standings at 9-3 overall and 2-0 in conference play, while Minnesota was at the bottom at 5-5 on the season and a day away from entering Big Ten play.

**Two Teams Remain Undefeated**

Two Big Ten squads have yet to suffer a loss in the 2006-07 season. Purdue and Ohio State sit atop the standings at 6-0 and 5-0, respectively, six conference squads follow with only one loss. Four weeks into the season, the Big Ten boasts a combined 72-20 record, which amounts to a .783 winning percentage.

**On the Road Again...**

Of the 18 Big Ten women's basketball contests played this week, 13 games will be played away from the conference's home courts, including the first five of eight scheduled. Illinois hosts Florida on Tuesday, while Penn State and Wisconsin welcome Xavier and Illinois-Chicago, respectively, on Thursday. The Badgers return home on Sunday to host Albany and Northwestern will battle Missouri in Evanston.

**Five Conference Teams Recognized by AP**

In the latest Associated Press Top 25 Poll, released on Dec. 4, five Big Ten squads earned recognition including three inside the top 25. Ohio State is ranked No. 5 overall, followed by No. 10 Purdue and No. 20 Michigan State. Two teams are accumulating votes outside the top 25 in Indiana and Wisconsin.

## BIG TEN NEWS &amp; NOTES

**Top-10 Matchup Highlights Week's Play**

Highlighting this week's schedule will be a top-10 matchup as two-time defending Big Ten Champion Ohio State, ranked fifth in the AP poll, will travel to No. 9 LSU on Sunday for a 3 p.m. ET contest. The Buckeyes fell at home to the Lady Tigers, 64-48, in a meeting during last year's regular season.

**Hurryin' Hoosiers**

At 7-1, Indiana is off to its best start since the 2000-01 squad opened the year 7-0 under then-first-year head coach Kathi Bennett. Felisha Legette-Jack, who is in her first season as the Hoosiers' head coach, has seen her IU squad hold its opponents to less than 40 percent shooting in six of its eight games. IU is now 7-1 on the season and receiving votes in both the ESPN/USA Today Coaches and Associated Press polls. The Hoosiers are on the brink of their first top 25 ranking since Jan. 18, 1994, when they were 25th in the CNN/USA Today poll.

**McCallie Looking for Career Win No. 300**

Michigan State head coach Joanne P. McCallie enters the week two wins shy of her 300th career win. McCallie, who coached for eight years at Maine, has won 131 games in East Lansing. During her career, which has featured five conference tournament titles (four at Maine, one at MSU) and an Associated Press National Coach of the Year award (2004-05), McCallie has won 68 percent of the time her teams have hit the floor. The Spartans will look to give her career win No. 299 on Saturday against Hartford.

**Turning Forty...**

In a 72-34 win over Chicago State last Saturday, Minnesota scored a school record 40 unanswered points. Against the independent Cougars, the Gophers quickly turned an 8-6 deficit to a 48-6 lead over a 13 minute, 24 second span late in the first half. Katie Ohm scored all 12 of her points during the stretch. Chicago State (3-5) had two chances from the free throw line to end the run and finally did so on their third try when Chandra Timberlake hit a free throw with 1:13 on the clock. The Cougars didn't hit a field goal for the last 14:39 of the half. Minnesota led by a 48-11 count at half-time, the 11 points allowed tying a school record for fewest opponent points in a half.

**Davenport Holding Court**

Ohio State senior Jessica Davenport continues to post remarkable numbers in dominating performances this season. Against Washington last week, Davenport made 10-of-11 shots from the field, which puts her 32-of-38 (.842) from the floor in her last four games. The two-time defending Big Ten Player of the Year scored 25 points and pulled down a season-best 16 rebounds versus Washington. She has now scored in double figures in 58 of her last 59 contests and has 36 career double-doubles. With 10 field goals Sunday, Davenport became the fifth Buckeye to record 700 career field goals. She has 709 for her career.

**Lady Lions Celebrate With Win**

Not only did Penn State pull its record to .500 at 5-5 this past Sunday with a thrilling 80-77 win over Old Dominion, but it also took time to celebrate two remarkable feats. Junior guard Adrienne Squire was honored for breaking the NCAA single-season free throw percentage record (.964) prior to the game, while Genny Vaneman of Zion, Pa., was the 1,000,000th Lady Lion fan to see a game in the Bryce Jordan Center. Vaneman was showered with gifts, which included two season tickets for life and a trip for two to the 2007 Big Ten Tournament presented by Xbox Live.

**Stone Keeps on Rolling**

At 8-1, the Wisconsin Badgers have their best season opening under fourth year coach Lisa Stone. It is the team's best opening since 1997-98 when the Badgers opened the season 9-0. This past weekend in an 88-37 win over Southern Mississippi, the Badgers' 51-point margin of victory was also the largest for UW during Stone's tenure.

**Former Boilermaker Stars in Big Ten Campaign**

Former Purdue All-American Katie Douglas is one of 11 selected student-athletes that will be the face of the Big Ten Conference this year as it celebrates its 25th Anniversary of Women's Championships. Douglas has been featured in a 30-second public service announcement "sharing her story" about overcoming family tragedy to become a Big Ten and NCAA Champion. Illinois head coach **Theresa Grentz** and Penn State mentor **Rene Portland** were former teammates at Immaculata back in the mid-70s. Today, they are together again as the most tenured head coaches in the Big Ten. The 2006-07 season marks the 27th season at PSU for Portland, while Grentz enters her 12th year with the Illini. In fact, those combined 39 years on a conference campus are three more than the total of the remaining nine Big Ten coaches' tenures. The landscape of conference mentors has taken on a fairly fresh look since the 1999-00 season. Excluding Grentz and Portland, nine of the 11 conference coaches have spent six years or less at their respective schools. Seven coaches have spent less than four years on their respective Big Ten campuses.
