BIG TEN PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Lindsay Wisdom-Hylton, Purdue
Jr., 6-2, F, Naperville, Ill./Neuqua Valley

Wisdom-Hylton earns her first career weekly honor after averaging 19.5 points on 62 percent shooting, 6.5 rebounds, 4.5 steals and 2.5 blocks last week as Purdue split a two-game road swing. The junior had a career performance on Sunday with a personal-best 24 points on 11-of-12 shooting to go along with five rebounds, four steals, three assists and three blocks in the Boilermakers' 81-38 victory at Butler. Her 91.7 percent shooting percentage for the game was a career high and is the top mark in the Big Ten this season. Wisdom-Hylton also had a strong all-around game in a 67-58 loss at Notre Dame on Dec. 6. She tied for a team-high 15 points and grabbed a game-high eight rebounds. Wisdom-Hylton also had two blocks and five steals, which marks the third time this season she has recorded at least five steals in a game.

BIG TEN NEWS & NOTES

Big Ten Off to Best Start Since 1998

With all 11 conference schools at or above the .500 mark, the Big Ten is off to its best start since the 1998-99 season. This is the latest the conference has gone in the season having all 11 teams with a winning percentage of .500 or better since Dec. 27, 1998. At that time, Ohio State topped the standings at 9-3 overall and 2-0 in conference play, while Minnesota was at the bottom at 5-5 on the season and a day away from entering Big Ten play. Five weeks into this season, the conference boasts a combined 81-29 record, which amounts to a .736 winning percentage.

Big Numbers for Pair of Major Conferences

The Big Ten and Big 12 are currently the only major conferences (ACC, Big East, Big Ten, Big 12, Pac-10, SEC) to boast all of its member schools at or above a .500 winning percentage.

Five Big Ten Standouts Named to Naismith List

Five Big Ten standouts -- Iowa's Megan Skouby, Michigan State's Victoria Lucas-Perry, Ohio State's Jessica Davenport, Purdue's Katie Gearlds and Wisconsin's Jolene Anderson -- were among 50 of the country's top collegiate women's basketball players were named as preseason candidates for the Naismith Trophy presented by Cingular Wireless on Dec. 11. The preseason watch list for the Naismith Trophy, which is presented to the men's and women's players of the year, was compiled by the Atlanta Tipoff Club's Board of Selectors, comprised of leading basketball journalists, coaches and administrators from around the country. The board based its pre-season criteria on player performances from last season and expectations for the 2006-07 season. In January, the Board of Selectors will narrow its pre-season list to the Top 30 players in the nation. Those players, and others who distinguish themselves throughout the season, will be eligible for the final ballot in March.

BIG TEN NEWS & NOTES

Five Conference Teams Recognized by AP

In the latest Associated Press Top 25 Poll, released on Dec. 11, five Big Ten squads earned recognition including three inside the top 25. Ohio State is ranked No. 8 overall, followed by No. 13 Purdue and No. 18 Michigan State. Two teams are accumulating votes outside the top 25 in Indiana and Wisconsin.

Michigan State to Host LSU on Saturday

Highlighting this week's schedule will be a top-20 matchup as No. 18 Michigan State hosts No. 7 LSU on Saturday at the Breslin Center. This past week, No. 5/6 Ohio State fell to ninth-ranked LSU in Baton Rouge, La.

Seven Squads Ranked in Attendance Figures

In the weekly unofficial attendance figures compiled by the University of Wisconsin, seven Big Ten teams rank in the nation's top 30 for average attendance. Michigan State (6,315 fans per game), Purdue (5,803) and Penn State (5,617), rank Nos. 10-12, while Minnesota (4,820) and Wisconsin (4,805) are 17th and 18th, respectively. Ohio State (3,660) is 27th and Iowa (3,509) follows in 28th.

Spartans Swatting & Swiping at School Records

Michigan State's Rene Haynes and Allyssa DeHaan are both eyeing impressive marks in school history this season. Haynes enters the week four steals shy of becoming the sixth player in school history to reach 200 career steals. She has tied her career high twice this season, pick-pocketing Bucknell and Hartford six times. DeHaan blocked four shots against Hartford to move her freshman-season total up to 36, which is already tied for eighth in school history. She is currently tied with Annette Babers, who blocked 36 shots in 1991-92. The school record is 57, set by Kristin Rasmussen in 1998-99.

First to 10 Wins...

At 10-1, Wisconsin is the first Big Ten squad to reach the 10-win mark this season. However, the feat is perhaps more significant when looking at past Badger seasons. Head coach Lisa Stone's 2006-07 team reached 10 wins faster than any other squad coached by the fourth-year head

coach at Wisconsin. The previous fastest Stone team reached 10 wins in 21 games in 2004-05. The 2003-04 team took 25 games and the 2005-06 squad took 26 games. It was the 2001-02 Badger team that also took 11 games to reach the 10-win plateau, which marked the most recent NCAA Tournament appearance for the Badgers.

McCallie Looking for Career Win No. 300

Michigan State head coach Joanne P. McCallie enters the week one win shy of her 300th career win. McCallie, who coached for eight years at Maine, has won 132 games in East Lansing. During her career, which has featured five conference tournament titles (four at Maine, one at MSU) and an Associated Press National Coach of the Year award (2004-05), McCallie has won 68 percent of the time her teams have hit the floor. The Spartans will look to give her career win No. 300 on Saturday against LSU.

Big Ten Ranks Among Nation's Best in Stats

According to the latest NCAA stats, released Dec. 11, four Big Ten standouts and nine teams rank in the nation's top 10 in nine statistical categories. Three stars rank in the top 10 for blocks per game, led by Michigan State's Allyssa DeHaan (4.5) in third. Lindsay Wisdom-Hylton (3.2) ranks seventh followed by Ohio State's Jessica Davenport (3.1) in eighth. Davenport also rates third in shooting percentage at .705. Purdue (12.6) and Illinois (12.8) rank second and fourth, respectively, in fouls per game. Michigan State ranks fourth in blocks (6.6), ninth in assists (19.1) and 10th in field-goal percentage (.330). The complete Big Ten breakdown can be found on page five of the weekly release.

Former Boilermaker Stars in Big Ten Campaign

Former Purdue All-American Katie Douglas is one of 11 selected student-athletes that will be the face of the Big Ten Conference this year as it celebrates its 25th Anniversary of Women's Championships. BIG TEN COACHES CORNER

Back Where I Come From?

Four Big Ten coaches have a very unique tie to the conference as one has returned to her alma mater and the other three played at a different Big Ten school than the one they are currently employed at. Michigan State's **Joanne P. McCallie** was a member of the Northwestern squad from 1984-87, while NU mentor **Beth Combs** was a student-athlete at Illinois from 1987-89 and Wisconsin's **Lisa Stone** played at Iowa from 1980-84. The Immaculata Idols

Illinois head coach **Theresa Greutz** and Penn State mentor **Rene Portland** were former teammates at Immaculata back in the mid-70s. Today, they are together again as the most tenured head coaches in the Big Ten. The 2006-07 season marks the 27th season at PSU for Portland, while Greutz enters her 12th year with the Illini. In fact, those combined 39 years on a conference campus are three more than the total of the remaining nine Big Ten coaches' tenures. The landscape of conference mentors has taken on a fairly fresh look since the 1999-00 season. Excluding Greutz and Portland, nine of the 11 conference coaches have spent six years or less at their respective schools. Seven coaches have spent less than four years on their respective Big Ten campuses.
