BIG TEN PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Katie Gearlds, Purdue
Sr., 6-1, G, Beech Grove, Ind./Beech Grove

Gearlds earns her second career weekly honor after being named the Duel in the Desert MVP last week. The Purdue senior helped the Boilermakers to the tournament championship with a 75-60 win over UT-San Antonio and an 80-64 victory over Boise State in the final. Gearlds was the team's leading scorer and rebounder against UTSA with 17 points and eight rebounds to go along with three assists and two steals. She followed up that performance by setting a new career-high in points against Boise State with 33 points on 12-of-17 shooting, including 5-of-8 from the three-point line in 35 minutes of play. She also pulled down five rebounds, dished out two assists and had two steals. On the week, Gearlds averaged 25 points on 17-of-27 (.630) shooting, while posting 6.5 rebounds, 2.5 assists and 2.0 assists as well.

BIG TEN NEWS & NOTES

A Look at This Week...

The 25th season of Big Ten Conference play begins this week on Thursday, with 10 of the 11 league teams in action. Illinois will host Penn State, while Indiana and Iowa both hit the road to Michigan State and Minnesota, respectively. Michigan travels to Purdue and Wisconsin hosts Northwestern.

Defending Big Ten champion Ohio State will be idle on the opening night of conference play. The Buckeyes will open their 2006-07 conference schedule on the road at Iowa on New Year's Eve.

Buckeyes Looking For Third-Straight Title

Two-time defending Big Ten champion Ohio State will enter the 2006-07 conference season in search of its third-consecutive title. Last year, the Buckeyes clinched their first outright Big Ten crown since the 1985-86 season, which marked the ninth conference championship and fourth outright title in school history. The championship also marked the first time OSU won back-to-back Big Ten regular

season titles since 1985-86 and 1986-87. The conference has not had a team win three-consecutive regular season titles since Iowa accomplished the feat from 1987-88 to 1989-90. Ohio State captured five-straight conference championships from 1982-83 through 1986-87.

Comcast SportsNet Begins Big Ten TV Slate

Comcast SportsNet Chicago is back as the flagship station for Big Ten women's basketball. This week will be the network's first televised conference game in its 22-game package. Penn State will travel to Illinois on Thursday for a 7 p.m. CT game. The matchup will be aired live, with Dave Eanet handling play-by-play duties and Suzie McConnell Serio with analysis.

Three Big Ten Teams Ranked in Nation's Top 25

Three conference squads are ranked in both the Associated Press and ESPN/USA Today Coaches Polls. The Big Ten is represented by No. 7/8 Ohio State, No. 13/13 Purdue and No. 21/20 Michigan State. Indiana is receiving votes in the AP poll.

BIG TEN NEWS & NOTES

Coaches Connection

A pair of Big Ten games this Thursday are highlighted by a special connection between the coaches on both benches. Penn State's Rene Portland will travel to Illinois to square off against her former Immaculata teammate from the mid-1970s in Theresa Grentz. Portland's 27 years at Penn State and Grentz's 12 in Champaign combine to total three more seasons than the total of the remaining nine Big Ten coaches' tenures. In addition, Felisha Legette-Jack will coach in her first Big Ten game as Indiana's mentor on a Michigan State campus where she spent the 2000-01 and 2001-02 seasons assisting under current Spartan coach Joanne P. McCallie. Legette-Jack served as the Spartans' recruiting coordinator and helped bring in the MSU nucleus that propelled Michigan State to the 2005 NCAA Championship title game.

Dishing it Out

In the latest NCAA rankings (Dec. 18), six conference teams rank in the nation's top 50 in assists per game. Trailing top-ranked Arizona State (21.3) is No. 5 Ohio State (20.0), No. 11 Michigan State (18.7), No. 25 Northwestern (17.3), No. 27 Wisconsin (17.1), No. 36 Iowa (16.4) and No. 39 Purdue (16.3).

Five Big Ten Teams Rated in Three NCAA Stats

In the latest NCAA rankings (Dec. 18), five Big Ten teams rank in the top 50 in both scoring defense, field-goal percentage and rebound margin. Wisconsin, which is tied for 10th at 11.0, leads all conference squads on the boards, while Ohio State ranked second with a .529 field goal percentage and Purdue is 13th overall in scoring defense, allowing 52.4 points per game. Seven Squads Ranked in Attendance Figures

In the weekly unofficial attendance figures compiled by the University of Wisconsin, seven Big Ten teams rank in the nation's top 30 for average attendance. Michigan State (6,462 fans per game), Purdue (6,136) and Penn State (5,617), rank Nos. 10-12, while Wisconsin (4,829) and Minnesota (4,820) and are 17th and 18th, respectively. Ohio State (3,580) is 26th and Iowa (3,509) follows in 28th.

MSU's DeHaan Leading All Big Ten Freshmen

Michigan State's Allyssa DeHaan enters her first Big Ten season comfortably ahead of all her classmates within the conference. The 6-9 Spartan newcomer leads all freshmen in scoring (13.4) rebounding (9.1) and blocks (4.64). Overall, she leads the conference in blocks and is third in rebounding, seventh in field goal percentage (.553), 12th in free throw shooting (.767) and 13th in scoring. This past week, DeHaan posted a conference season-best 18 rebounds in a win at Cal State Northridge and equaled her career and Big Ten season high of eight blocks against UC Santa Barbara for the third time this year.

Illini Fighting Through Non-Conference Season

Illinois closed out the non-conference portion of the schedule at 10-2, marking the best non-conference record in school history. The Fighting Illini have finished non-conference play with only two losses three times before (9-2 in 2004-05, 8-2 in 1996-97 and 7-2 in 1986-87), but had never reached 10 wins before Big Ten play.

The 13th annual women's event will be back in Indianapolis, March 1, 2, 4 & 5, 2007, where it has been staged in 11 of the 12 previous years. Illinois head coach **Theresa Grentz** and Penn State mentor **Rene Portland** were former teammates at Immaculata back in the mid-70s. Today, they are together again as the most tenured head coaches in the Big Ten. The 2006-07 season marks the 27th season at PSU for Portland, while Grentz enters her 12th year with the Illini. In fact, those combined 39 years on a conference campus are three more than the total of the remaining nine Big Ten coaches' tenures. The landscape of conference mentors has taken on a fairly fresh look since the 1999-00 season. Excluding Grentz and Portland, nine of the 11 conference coaches have spent six years or less at their respective schools. Seven coaches have spent less than four years on their respective Big Ten campuses.
