2006 BIG TEN WOMEN'S GOLF CHAMPIONSHIPS

Ohio State enters this weekend's Big Ten Women's Golf Championships at Indiana looking to continue its dynasty. In 2005, the Buckeyes secured their fourth-consecutive conference title in Ann Arbor, marking the first time a team had captured four straight conference championships in league history.

In fact, there have only been three occasions in Big Ten men's golf history where a school has successfully won five straight league titles. The Ohio State men captured a handful from 1976-80 and six straight from 1982-87, while Michigan earn five consecutive titles during 1932-36.

The No. 22 Buckeyes will face tough competition when they vie for five, as three other Big Ten squads are ranked in the nation by *Golfweek*/Sagarin. Purdue is seventh nationally, followed by OSU, No. 27 Michigan State and No. 47 Northwestern.

All 11 conference teams will compete Friday through Sunday, April 28-30, at the Indiana University Golf Course in Bloomington, Ind. The event will be 72 holes of competition with 36 holes Friday (April 28), 18 holes Saturday (April 29) and a final 18 holes Sunday (April 30). The Indiana University Golf Course will be set up for a par of 72 and 6,477 yards.

The Boilermakers pose a threat to the field as they boast the only three golfers ranked in the nation's top 50 in No. 22 Onnarin Sattayabanphot, No. 36 Christina Boeljon and No. 42 Maria Hernandez. Those three golfers also posted the only top 10 finishes in a field of eight conference teams last week at the Lady Buckeye Invitational. Boeljon and Hernandez both tied for seventh overall, while Sattayabanphot shot even-par to finish fourth, earning the final Golfer of the Week honor of the season for her efforts.

Four additional conference standouts are found among *Golfweek*'s top 100. Michigan State's Sara Brown is ranked 51st, while Ohio State's Dana Je, who along with Sattayabanphot tied for fourth at last year's Big Ten Championships, is rated 65th. Purdue's Myrte Eikenaar is 67th, while Ohio State's Stephanie Connelly is 80th. One golfer absent from last year's event, but is familiar with the Hoosier layout is Indiana's Shannon Johnson. The New Mexico transfer has been impressive during her senior year in Bloomington, posting two wins and a runner-up finish and shattering the school's 54-hole record with a 211 that won her the UNLV Invite title in March. Her two Golfer of the Week honors ties her with Northwestern's Alice Kim for the most of any Big Ten golfer this season.

Indiana last hosted the Big Ten Women's Golf Championships in 1996. That year, IU claimed the title with a 946 (315-318-313), led by Erica Wicoff's 226 (76-75-75), who claimed medalist honors.

In the history of the Big Ten Women's Golf Championships, seven conference squads have captured the league title. Ohio State leads all teams with 11 wins, followed by Indiana (7), Michigan State (2) and Iowa, Minnesota, Purdue and Wisconsin with one title each.

Indiana University will play host to the 2006 Big Ten Women's Golf Championships, Friday through Sunday, April 28-30, at the Indiana University Golf Course in Bloomington, Ind. With all 11 conference schools participating, the Big Ten Championships will be 72 holes of competition with 36 holes Friday (April 28), 18 holes Saturday (April 29) and a final 18 holes Sunday (April 30). The Indiana University Golf Course will be set up for a par of 72 and 6,477 yards.

TEAMS

The 2006 Big Ten Women's Golf Championships features all 11 teams from the conference: Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Michigan, Michigan State, Minnesota, Northwestern, Ohio State, Penn State, Purdue and Wisconsin.

FORMAT

The 2006 Big Ten Women's Golf Championships will be 72 holes of championship play. Scoring for the 2006 Big Ten Women's Golf Championships will be six players, count the low four scores each round.

SCHEDULE

The 2006 Big Ten Championships will be 72 holes of stroke-play competition with 36 holes Friday, 18 holes Saturday and 18 holes Sunday. First-day pairings shall be determined by the *Golfweek*/Sagarin ratings. Second- and final-day pairings shall be determined by team totals from the previous rounds.
