FOUR TEAMS AND ONE INDIVIDUAL HEAD TO 2006 NCAA REGIONALS

Four Big Ten women's golf teams and one individual are set to compete in NCAA Regional competition. No. 3 seed and Big Ten Champion Purdue will compete in the West Regional, while eighth-seeded Ohio State, No. 9 Michigan State, No. 16 Northwestern and Michigan's Amy Schmucker will hit the links in the Central Regional.



Each of the three regionals, which consist of 21 teams, is scheduled for May 11-13 and the top eight teams and two individuals in each region will advance to the NCAA Championships, May 23-26, hosted by Ohio State University at the Scarlet Course in Columbus, Ohio.

Purdue, playing at the Washington National Golf Club in Auburn, Wash., received the Big Ten's automatic bid to NCAA regional competition after winning its first conference title since 2000. The Boilermakers, who swept the Player, Freshman and Coach of the Year honors for the league, have been participants at the NCAA Regional since 1998.

Central Region competition will be played at the Traditions Club at Texas A&M, a course co-designed by Ohio State's Jack Nicklaus and his son, Jack Nicklaus, Jr. Jack, Sr., is responsible for the redesign of the Ohio State Scarlet Course, site of the 2006 NCAA Championships.

The Buckeyes will be making their 10th-consecutive trip to the regional competition and are looking to capture their third title under head coach Therese Hession's watch. Last season, Ohio State captured the NCAA East Regional crown.

This marks the eighth straight year Michigan State has participated in the NCAA Regionals, dating back to 1999. MSU placed seventh at the 2005 NCAA Central Regional to advance to its seventh NCAA Championships in school history. Four of the five Spartans in the lineup at last year's regionals are back this season.

Northwestern, which will join the Buckeyes and Spartans in Texas, is making an NCAA Regional appearance for the sixth time in the last seven years. The Wildcats made NCAA Regional trips in 2000, 2001, 2002, 2004 and 2005, with the 2000 squad advancing to the NCAA Championships.

Schmucker, ranked 93rd nationally by *Golfweek*/Sagarin, was one of three individuals selected to the Central Region. The senior led the Maize and Blue all season long and was honored with Second-Team All-Big Ten honors for her efforts. She led the Wolverines in nine of 11 events, including winning her second collegiate medalist honor at the Rio Verde Collegiate.

Currently, all four active Big Ten squads are ranked in the nation's top 50 by *Golfweek*/Sagarin. Purdue is eighth, followed by No. 22 Ohio State, No. 27 Michigan State and No. 48 Northwestern.

PURDUE AND NORTHWESTERN'S KIM CAPTURE 2006 BIG TEN TITLES

For the first since 2000 and just the second time in school history, the Purdue Boilermakers captured the Big Ten Women's Golf Championships, April 28-30. Despite wet and windy conditions on the final day, the Boilermakers held off Michigan State and Ohio State to claim the 72-hole title at the Indiana University Golf Course in Bloomington.



The win for Purdue (290-296-295-298--1179) ended Ohio State's four-year reign over the conference. The Buckeyes (293-297-296-299--1185) finished second, six shots ahead of Michigan State (296-294-293-308--1191). Michigan (296-301-298-307--1202) placed fourth, followed by Northwestern (297-303-302-310--1212) and Indiana (300-292-301-321--1214). Rounding out the field was Penn State (303-302-299-311--1215), Iowa (301-302-300-320--1223), Wisconsin (313-300-314-325--1252), Illinois (321-304-314-319--1258) and Minnesota (311-307-318-327--1263).

Individually, Northwestern's Alice Kim (68-72-74-77--291) struggled to a final-round 77 and bogeyed her last hole, but managed to avoid a four-person playoff for medalist honors. Kim's win was the first for a Wildcat golfer at the conference championships.

Michigan State's Sara Brown (72-73-71-76), Ohio State's Carling Coffing (72-74-71-75) and Purdue's Maria Hernandez (72-73-74-73) all tied for second, one shot back of Kim, at 4-over 292. Michigan's Amy Schmucker (74-74-71-75) placed fifth at 6-over 294.

Tied for sixth at 7-over 295 was Indiana's Elaine Harris (71-70-76-78) and Purdue's Christel Boeljon (72-74-74-75), while rounding out the top 10 in a three-way tie for eighth was Indiana's Shannon Johnson (75-72-72-79), Ohio State's Dana Je (75-74-76-73) and Purdue's Myrte Eikenaar (73-74-76-75).
