### 2004 NCAA MEN'S & WOMEN'S CHAMPIONSHIPS PREVIEW

On Monday, November 22, 11 Conference squads and four individuals will compete at the 2004 NCAA Men's and Women's Cross Country Championships, which will be held at the Lavern Gibson Championships Course at the Wabash Valley Family Sports Complex in Terre Haute, Ind. Indiana State University will serve as host.

The women's 6,000-meter race will take place at 11 a.m. ET, followed by the men's 10,000-meter race at 12:15 p.m. Of the 11 Big Ten teams and four individuals that qualified for the NCAA Championships, eight were automatic qualifiers, while the remaining seven received at-large bids. Three teams - Michigan women, Minnesota men and Wisconsin men - earned automatic bids by way of claiming NCAA Regional titles as the Wolverines and Badgers captured the Great Lakes Regional Championships, while the Gophers won the Midwest Regional. The Illinois women placed second in the Midwest, which also earned them an automatic invitation to the NCAAs.

On the men's side, seven Big Ten teams - **Indiana, Iowa, Michigan, Michigan State, Minnesota, Ohio State** and **Wisconsin** - will vie for the nation's top prize. Wisconsin, which has been ranked No. 1 the entire season and finished second the past two years at the NCAA meet, is one of the favorites to claim the national championship. The Badgers will be making their 44th overall NCAA appearance and their 33rd consecutive meet dating back to 1972. Michigan enters the NCAA Championships ranked 13th in the men's Mondo National Top 30 Poll, while No. 15 Minnesota, No. 17 Indiana, No. 23 Ohio State and No. 25 Iowa are ranked as well. Minnesota, behind senior **Andrew Carlson**, who captured his second Midwest Regional title last weekend in 29:48.44, added the 2004 Midwest Region team title to those won in 1999 and 2001. Michigan, Indiana, Ohio State and Michigan State placed fourth through seventh, respectively, at the Great Lakes Regional, while Iowa finished third at the Midwest. Minnesota's Carlson was not the lone Big Ten runner to earn an NCAA Regional title as Michigan's **Nate Brannen** won the Great Lakes race with a time of 30:10.9, followed closely behind by Indiana's **Sean Jefferson** (30:14.3). Ohio State's **Brian Olinger**, Indiana's **John Jefferson** and Wisconsin's **Matt Tegenkamp** and **Chris Solinsky** finished fourth through seventh, respectively. Minnesota received a third-place finish in the Midwest from **Ryan Malmin**, who finished one spot ahead of Illinois' **Jason Bill**. Both Bill and Penn State's **Dan Mazzocco**, who finished fifth at the Mid-Atlantic Regional, earned automatic bids as individuals.

Four Big Ten women's teams will advance to Monday's NCAA Championships, as **Illinois** and **Michigan** captured automatic bids, while **Indiana** and **Michigan State** were selected at-large. No. 4 Michigan leads all four Big Ten squads in the latest women's FinishLynx National Top 30 Poll. Michigan State is 13th, Illinois is 21st and Indiana is 24th. At the Great Lakes Regional, the Wolverines paced the field with 40 points, followed by Michigan State in third and Indiana in fourth. Michigan, which finished fourth at last year's NCAA meet, will make its 16th overall appearance. Individually, the meet was determined between the 2003 Big Ten Champion, Michigan's **Rebecca Walter**, and Michigan State's **Danette Doetzel**, the 2004 Conference Champion and Athlete and Freshman of the Year award winner. Walter (20:01.4) beat out the Spartan freshman by 0.9 seconds as Doetzel finished in 20:02.3. MSU's **Caitlin Kelly** placed fifth, while Indiana's **Jessica Gall** and Michigan's **Andrea Parker** finished seventh and eighth, respectively.

Last season's Big Ten Freshman of the Year, **Cassie Hunt**, claimed the Midwest Regional crown in a time of 20:21.29 and led her Illinois Fighting Illini to a second-place finish. It was the highest finish for an Illini team since the 1984 squad finished runner-up and marked the first time in program history the Illini advanced to the NCAA Championships as a team. Hunt's teammate, **Jamie Turilli**, crossed the finish line in eighth place in 20:48.65. Individually, Wisconsin's **Katrina Rundbaug** and Purdue's **Amber Ferner** gained automatic bids to the NCAAs by way of placing 11th and 20th, respectively, at the Great Lakes Regional. Ferner made history last weekend as she became the first Purdue female to run in the NCAA Championships in cross country since Becky Cotto in 1982.

Gates open for spectators at 9 a.m. on Monday, with admission prices set at \$5 for adults and students. Children two years and younger are free. ## BIG TEN MEN'S CHAMPIONSHIP IN REVIEW

Top-ranked **Wisconsin** earned its sixth consecutive Big Ten Championship last week in Iowa City. The Badgers, who have been ranked No. 1 in the Men's Mondo National Top 30 poll the entire season, finished 1-2-3 and placed all seven runners in the top 21. Wisconsin's total of 23 points was the fourth-lowest winning score in Big Ten history. Schumacher's squad beat out second-place finisher Indiana by 81 points, shattering the Big Ten record for largest winning margin of 55, set by the Badgers in 1910.

Wisconsin junior **Simon Bairu**, a native of Regina, Saskatchewan, captured his second straight Big Ten title as he breezed across the 8,000-meter Bill & Jim Ashton Cross Country Course circuit in a time of 23:45 - 13 seconds faster than his winning time from a year ago. Bairu, who won by 10 seconds over teammates Chris Solinsky (23:55) and 2002 League champion Matt Tegenkamp (23:57), earned the sixth individual title for the Badgers in the last seven years and the 24th in the program's history. This year's team title was Wisconsin's 38th overall - a total that exceeds the next three teams combined - Michigan State (14), Indiana (13) and Michigan (9).

**Indiana** finished second with 104 points, followed by **Iowa** (11), **Minnesota** (124), **Michigan** (125) and **Ohio State** (127). **Michigan State** placed seventh with 158 points. Rounding out the top 10 was **Illinois** (162), **Penn State** (206) and **Purdue** (312).

Outside Wisconsin's top-three finishers, Minnesota's **Andrew Carlson** place fourth with a time of 24:00, Michigan's **Nate Brannen** was fifth at 24:16, while the Badgers' **Josh Spiker** placed sixth at 24:18. Rounding out the top 10 individually was Ohio State's **Brian Olinger** (24:21), Indiana twins **Sean** (24:30) and **John** (24:31) **Jefferson**, and Minnesota's **Ryan Malmin**.

Ohio State's **John Ealy** earned Big Ten Freshman of the Year honors after finishing 15th at the Big Ten Championships with a time of 24:40. Ealy is just the second Buckeye to earn Freshman of the Year honors, as Eric Nelson split the inaugural honor with Michigan's State's Anthony Hamm in 1987. A native of Reynoldsburg, Ohio, Ealy was the first freshman to cross the line last Sunday, just ahead of Iowa's Eric MacTaggart, who finished 16th overall with the same time as Ealy.

Wisconsin's **Jerry Schumacher** earned his fourth consecutive Big Ten Coach of the Year award, which marks his fifth honor in six seasons.

The Conference office also announced honorees from each team for the Big Ten Sportsmanship Award. The student-athletes chosen are individuals who have distinguished themselves through sportsmanship and ethical behavior. In addition, the student-athletes must be in good academic standing and have demonstrated good citizenship outside of the sports-competition setting.

Honorees for men's cross country are Illinois' **Kris Cunningham**, Indiana's **Tom Burns**, Iowa's **Matt Esche**, Michigan's **Nate Brannen**, Michigan State's **Andy Marsh**, Minnesota's **Ryan Malmin**, Ohio State's **Brian Olinger**, Penn State's **Ryan McGarry**, Purdue's **Josh Robinson** and Wisconsin's **Matt Tegenkamp**.

These 10 student-athletes are now candidates for the Big Ten Sportsmanship Award, as the Conference office will select one male and one female student-athlete from each institution at the end of the school year.

## BIG TEN WOMEN'S CHAMPIONSHIP IN REVIEW

The **Michigan** Wolverines successfully defended their League title last Sunday, giving 13th-year head coach **Mike McGuire** his sixth Conference crown. McGuire was also honored by his peers as the women's Coach of the Year for the sixth time in his career.

Michigan captured its second three-peat in 10 years, having also won Conference titles from 1992-94. The Wolverines placed three runners in the top 10 and scored all five runners in the top 16. The Maize and Blue have now finished in the top two at the League Championships 12 times under McGuire's tutelage.

Michigan State's **Danette Doetzel** became only the second freshman in League history to claim Big Ten Athlete and Freshman of the Year accolades in the same season and the first since Michigan's Deanna Arnill accomplished the feat in 1994. The Spartan freshman won the 6,000-meter race in convincing fashion in a Big Ten-record time of 20:33, besting second-place finisher and defending Conference champion and Athlete of the Year, Michigan's **Rebecca Walter**, by 20 seconds. Doetzel, a native of Macklin, Saskatchewan, is just the third woman in MSU history to win a Big Ten individual title, joining Misty Allison (1991) and Michelle Carson (2002). The Spartans recorded 85 points and finished second behind Michigan.

**Illinois** placed third with 85 points, followed by **Minnesota** (133), **Indiana** (135), **Penn State** (142) and **Iowa** (170). Rounding out the field was **Wisconsin** (178), **Purdue** (190), **Northwestern** (258) and **Ohio State** (276).

Indiana's **Jessica Gall** finished third overall with a time of 21:01, followed by Penn State's **Molly Landreth** (21:03) and 2003 Big Ten Freshman of the Year, Illinois' **Cassie Hunt** (21:09). Hunt's teammate, **Jaime Turilli**, finished sixth with a time of 21:13, while placing seventh at 21:19 was Michigan's **Alyson Kohlmeier**. Round out the top 10 individually was Michigan State's **Katie Kelly** (21:25), Michigan's **Andrea Parker** (21:30) and Illinois' **Maggie Carroll** (21:36).

The Conference office also announced honorees from each team for the Big Ten Sportsmanship Award. The student-athletes chosen are individuals who have distinguished themselves through sportsmanship and ethical behavior. In addition, the student-athletes must be in good academic standing and have demonstrated good citizenship outside of the sports-competition setting.

Honorees for women's cross country are Illinois' **Tabitha Volling**, Indiana's **Jessica Gall**, Iowa's **Christine Kotarba**, Michigan's **Rebecca Walter**, Michigan State's **Katie Kelly**, Minnesota's **Sarah Hesser**, Northwestern's **Marie Grabinski**, Ohio State's **Melanie Price**, Penn State's **Kayla Matrunick**, Purdue's **Kara Lahey** and Wisconsin's **A'Havahla Haynes**.

These 11 student-athletes are now candidates for the Big Ten Sportsmanship Award, as the Conference office will select one male and one female student-athlete from each institution at the end of the school year.
