2006 BIG TEN MEN'S PREVIEW

Top-ranked Wisconsin is looking for its record-tying eighth consecutive Big Ten Championship this Sunday, Oct. 29, when all 10 conference cross country squads converge at the Indiana Cross Country Course in Bloomington, Ind., on the campus of Indiana University.

The 8,000-meter race will take place at 11:30 a.m. ET, following the women's Big Ten Championship at 10:45.

The Badgers, who are the defending national champions, posted a near-perfect finish and Big Ten record 16 points last year as they placed five of the top-six runners en route to the conference title. Two years ago, UW placed seven of its runners in the top 21, but last year put eight in the top nine spots. Wisconsin also boasted the largest margin of victory in Big Ten history last year with an 85-point win over Ohio State. The Hoosiers placed second with 101 points, followed by Minnesota in third with 102.

The Golden Gophers enter the race ranked 14th in the latest USTFCCCA Top 30 Poll, followed by No. 17 Iowa and No. 18 Michigan, which placed fourth and fifth, respectively, last year. Michigan State and Ohio State are currently receiving votes.

A new Big Ten individual champion will be crowned this year as gone is three-time conference and two-time national champion Simon Bairu of Wisconsin. Senior Chris Solinsky enters as the race favorite after placing third in his freshman season in 2003 and runner-up to Bairu the past two seasons. Wisconsin has claimed seven individual titles in the past eight years and 25 overall to go along with 39 total team titles. The Badgers' total nearly exceeds the next four teams combined with 40 - Michigan State (14), Indiana (13), Michigan (9) and Minnesota (4).

Badger mentor Jerry Schumacher earned his fifth consecutive Big Ten Coach of the Year award in 2005, which tied the conference record with former UW coach Martin Smith (1989-91-92-94-95-96).

This year's event marks the sixth occasion Indiana has hosted the men's Big Ten Championship. The Hoosiers first hosted in 1921, when Illinois captured the team title. In fact, of the five previous championships held at Indiana, Wisconsin has claimed first-place the past three times (1978-87-96), while Minnesota won the other remaining event in 1969. UW also claimed victory last year in Bloomington when the Badgers captured the NCAA Great Lakes Regional title.

2006 BIG TEN WOMEN'S PREVIEW

All 11 conference schools, including five ranked in the top 15 of the latest USTFCCCA Top 30 Poll, will compete at the 2006 Big Ten Championship this Sunday, Oct. 29, at the Indiana Cross Country Course in Bloomington, Ind., on the campus of Indiana University.

The 6,000-meter race, which precedes the men's 8K race, will take place at 10:45 a.m. ET.

No. 3 Michigan looks to capture its fifth straight conference title and eighth overall, after posting three consecutive titles from 1992-94 and the last four since 2002. Wolverine mentor Mike McGuire, now in his 15th season, has seen U-M junior Alyson Kohlmeier, who finished runner-up at the Big Ten meet last year, and Erin Webster lead to the Maize and Blue this season. Webster finished seventh at the 2005 Big Ten Championship and captured two Runner of the Week awards this season.

The Wolverines, who placed three runners in the top 10 and scored all five runners in the top 14, have now finished in the top two at the championships 13 times under McGuire's tutelage.

Four women's squads enter the Big Ten Championships ranked among the top 10 teams in the nation. Following No. 3 Michigan is No. 5 Wisconsin, No. 6 Minnesota and No. 9 Illinois. Michigan State is ranked 13th nationally and Iowa is 23rd.

In 2005, the Illini finished runner-up to the Wolverines, while Minnesota, Indiana and Michigan State rounded out the top five in the team standings.

Illinois senior Cassie Hunt, last year's Big Ten Champion, Athlete of the Year and Athlete of the Championships, returns to defend her individual title, which she won by two seconds over Michigan's Kohlmeier.

This year's event marks the third occasion Indiana has hosted the women's Big Ten Championship. The Hoosiers first hosted in 1987 and then again in 1996. Wisconsin won both of those events in Bloomington, however Michigan is coming off a win on the IU course after claiming the NCAA Great Lakes Regional title last year.
