- Posted a record of 19-10 overall in 2005-06, 11-5 and tied for third (MSU) in Big Ten
- Minnesota made its fifth consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance (lost to Washington in first round) in 2005-06
- Minnesota's third-place finish (tie with Michigan State) is the Golden Gophers' best Big Ten showing since tying for second place in 2002-03, Pam Borton's first year with the program
- Kelly Roysland, the Gophers' lone senior and team captain in 2006-07, is the leading returning scorer, averaging 8.9 ppg. a year ago
- Roysland led the Big Ten in three-point percentage in conference play at 51.2 percent
- Leslie Knight represented Minnesota on the 2006 Big Ten Foreign Tour
- Gopher sophomore Emily Fox - the world record-holder in sport stacking - joined other sport stackers for a taping of the ABC show Master of Champions
- Including Ohm and Ellis-Milan, the Gophers will

- have seven scholarship freshmen on the roster making the 2006-07 squad one of the youngest in school history. The only Minnesota teams younger were in 1994-95 and 2000-01 when the Gopher roster included eight freshmen.
- Having only one senior (Kelly Roysland) on the roster is much more common. The Gophers did not have a single senior on the 1979-80 roster and seven other years (the last in 2003-04, Janel McCarville) Minnesota had only one senior.
- Landed 10 of eligible 13 players from the 2005-06 roster on the Academic All-Big Ten Team
- Minnesota finished fifth nationally and first in the Big Ten in attendance averaging 8,329 fans per game in 2005-06
- Minnesota will play host to the first and second rounds of the 2007 NCAA Women's Basketball Tournament
- 2005-06 recruiting class ranked among top 15 in the nation and second in the Big Ten
