## **Conference Announces Baseball Academic All-Big 12 Team**

**DALLAS**—The Big 12 Conference takes great pleasure in honoring 47 student-athletes who have been named to the 2003 Baseball Academic All-Big 12 Team announced Tuesday.

On the squad there are 16 repeat performers from past academic all-league teams. Highlighting this season's team is Missouri sophomore Garrett Broshuis, who was nominated with a 4.00 grade point average for the second straight year (he was a redshirt freshman in 2002). The Advance, Mo., native has a 5-2 record with a 6.75 ERA as the No. 2 starter for the Tigers (32-17). Broshuis' 66 2/3 innings ranks second on the squad, and he is undefeated (3-0) in Big 12 play this year for Mizzou.

Nominated by each institution's director of student-athlete support services and the media relations offices, the baseball academic all-league squad consisted of 30 first-team members combined with 17 on the second team. First-team members consist of those who have maintained a 3.20 or better GPA, while the second team are those who have a 3.00 to 3.19.

To qualify student-athletes must maintain a 3.00 GPA or higher either cumulative or the two previous semesters and must have participated in 60 percent of his team's scheduled contests. Pitchers must have at least one inning pitched per game played by the team or have appeared in 35 percent of their team's total games. Freshmen and transfers are not eligible in their first year of academic residence. Senior student-athletes who have participated for a minimum of two years and meet all the criteria except percent of participation also are eligible.

Many of these student-athletes will compete at the Phillips 66 Big 12 Conference Baseball Tournament at SBC Bricktown Ballpark in Oklahoma City, Okla., May 21-25. Texas, the reigning national champion, looks to defend its conference tourney title next week. Last season, the Longhorns halted Nebraska's tournament-winning streak at three (1999-2001) with a 9-6 victory over the Huskers for their first Big 12 postseason triumph. Currently, NU and UT are tied for first place in the league standings with a week left in the regular season.
