## Quick Notes...

- *The Big 12 won its first men's basketball National Championship in 2007-08.*
- *The Big 12 posted the most NCAA Tournament victories in the nation and also had the best win percentage (conferences with multiple teams).*
- The Big 12 has had six Final Four teams since 2002, more than any conference in the nation during that span.
- The Big 12 had three players on the Wooden Award All-America Team, more than any other conference.
- The Big 12 is 52-29 (.642) in NCAA Tournament games over the last six seasons, the top win percentage and second-best victory total nationally.
- This year, the Big 12 posted a 5-1 record in first round NCAA Tournament action. The league had the only lower-seeded teams (Kansas State, Texas A&M) to win on the first day of the NCAA Championship on March 20.
- *The Big 12 sent half of its teams to NCAA Championship competition for the sixth time in the league's 12-year history. The other years it happened were 2000-03 and 2005.*
- On Selection Sunday, the Big 12 had five teams finish in the top 30 of the RPI strength of schedule rankings.
- This year marks just the second time in Big 12 history that the conference will have all its teams record double-digit overall victory totals. The other time it happened was 2002-03.
- *The Big 12 led the nation in victories against nationally-ranked non-league opponents.*
- Big 12 teams were 65-31 at home in conference play this season.
- *Ten of the 12 squads in the Big 12 had winning records (83.3%).*
- The Big 12 has posted a 146-47 (.757) record in non-conference play. It is the best win total in league history.
- The Big 12 had a .500 or better record against 27 of the 30 conferences it faced in 2007-08. The records against other major leagues are as follows: ACC (5-0), Big East (5-4), Big Ten (4-9), Pac-10 (11-8) and SEC (6-5).

**BIG 12 WAS ALONE WITH TWO IN ELITE EIGHT**

The Big 12 sent two teams - Kansas and Texas - to regional final competition. The conference was the only one in the nation with multiple schools in the Elite Eight. It is the fifth time in the 12-year history of the league that more than one Big 12 squad has advanced to the Elite Eight. Since the Big 12 began play in 1996-97, half of its teams (ISU, KU, MU, OU, OSU, UT) have made the regional final round.

**KANSAS, TEXAS IN SWEET COMPANY**

A total of three teams nationally have played in the Sweet 16 in five of the last seven years, and two are from the Big 12. Kansas, Texas and Duke are the only squads who can boast the feat.

**BIG 12 IS SWEET OVER THE PAST SEVEN YEARS**

Since the 2002 season, the Big 12 is second nationally in the number of NCAA regional semifinalists. The conference has had 17 squads advance to the "Sweet 16" during that time.

**ELEVEN BIG 12 SCHOOLS HAVE BEEN RECENT DANCERS**

In the last six years, 11 of the schools in the Big 12 have been selected to participate in the NAAs. Since the league began play in 1996-97, every Big 12 squad has earned a NCAA invitation.

**BIG 12 BOASTS STRONG POSTSEASON RECORD**

The Big 12 is among the nation's leaders in victories and winning percentage in NCAA competition over the last six years. No league has a better win percentage and only one conference - the Big East with four more teams overall - has more victories.

**SIX IS SPECIAL IN BIG 12 HISTORY**

Since 2000, there have been 29 occasions when a conference has sent six or more teams to the NCAA Tournament. The Big 12 has done it six times. Only one conference (SEC, 7) can boast more six-team seasons than the Big 12 in that span. Other conference that boast multiple years with six or more teams include: Big East (6), Big Ten (4), ACC (3) and Pac-10 (3).

**BIG 12 SENDS SIX SCHOOLS DANCING**

The Big 12 earned six bids in the 2008 NCAA Championship, tying for the most in conference history. The league has garnered six bids in *half* of its 12 seasons of existence, including six times in the last nine years. The last six-bid campaign came in 2005, with the others in 2000, 2001, 2002 and 2003.

**BIG 12 AMONG LEADERS IN NCAA APPEARANCES**

Over the last nine years, the Big 12 is among the leaders in NCAA bids. The league is one of three nationally with 48 bids or more during that span.

**BIG 12 COACHES HAVE FINAL FOUR EXPERIENCE**

Despite the fact that there have been 11 new head coaches at nine Big 12 schools since 2006-07, half of the mentors have Final Four experience in their backgrounds.

**NEBRASKA, OKLAHOMA STATE COMPETE IN NIT**

Nebraska earned its first postseason victory in four years with a win over Charlotte in the first round of the NIT. The Huskers hold a 23-14 record in 15 NIT appearances, with a 6-5 record during the Big 12 era. The Huskers are one of 19 schools to make at least 14 appearances in the NIT. Oklahoma State earned its 10th NIT berth this season. The Cowboys have played in the postseason each of the last 12 years.



**BAYLOR (21-11, 9-7 Big 12)**

**Next Game:** Season Complete  
**Recent Result:** Lost to Purdue, 90-79  
**Last 5/Last 10 Games:** 2-3/4-6

- Baylor earned its first NCAA bid since 1988 this season. Prior to this year, the Bears had the longest active stretch in the Big 12 without a NCAA appearance.
- Junior guard Curtis Jerrells set a school record for a NCAA Tournament game when he finished with 27 points versus Purdue. He was eighth in the Big 12 in scoring this year with 15.3 points per game.
- Baylor connected on 275 shots from 3-point range this season, a school record for connections from beyond the arc.
- The Bears' nine conference wins are their most in Big 12 history. Nine of their 11 losses were by 10 points or less, with all but two coming to teams in the 2008 NCAA field.



**COLORADO (12-20, 3-13 Big 12)**

**Next Game:** Season Complete  
**Recent Result:** Lost to Oklahoma, 54-49  
**Last 5/Last 10 Games:** 2-3/3-7

- Senior guard Richard Roby became the all-time scoring leader at Colorado during the 2007-08 season. He scored 2,001 points in four years, the first CU player to pass the 2,000-point plateau.
- Roby is ranked fourth on the career Big 12 scoring chart. He is just one of four players in league history to record at least 2,000 points. He was one of 12 players nationally to reach the 2,000 mark in 2007-08.
- Roby, senior Marcus Hall and freshman Cory Higgins started every game during the 2007-08 campaign. They are the first CU trio to start every contest in a season since 1984-85.
- Hall posted 609 minutes in conference regular-season action this year, setting a school record for Big 12 competition. He finished with double-figure points in 10 of his final 11 outings.



**IOWA STATE (14-18, 4-12 Big 12)**

**Next Game:** Season Complete  
**Recent Result:** Lost to Texas A&M, 60-46  
**Last 5/Last 10 Games:** 0-5/1-9

- Freshman forward Craig Brackins was just the third Cyclone rookie (Ron Harris, Adam Haluska) to start every game of his inaugural campaign. He started 32 contests in 2007-08.
- Brackins recorded five 20-point games in 2007-08, tied (Ron Harris, 1980-81) for the third-highest total of 20-point performances by a freshman at Iowa State.
- Senior forward Rahshon Clark finished 13th on the ISU career rebounds list with 670. He started 108 games during his tenure in Ames, the eighth-best total all-time at the school.
- In his last six games of 2007-08, junior Sean Haluska had 51 points after scoring a total of 50 in his first 25 contests. He had nine 3-pointers in that span, after having just five the entire year prior to this stretch.



**KANSAS (37-3, 13-3 Big 12)**

**Next Game:** Season Complete  
**Recent Result:** Defeated Memphis, 75-68 (ot)  
**Last 5/Last 10 Games:** 5-0/10-0

- Kansas won its third national championship in 2007-08 and first since 1988. The Jayhawks finished with a school-record 37 victories and a 13-game winning streak.
- Junior guard Mario Chalmers finished the year scoring in double digits in seven straight outings and 31 times overall. He led KU in double-figure scoring efforts, despite ranking second in points per game.
- Every regular-season defeat for Kansas in the last two years has been by single digits. The team's three losses in 2007-08 were by a combined total of 13 points.
- KU has won the postseason Big 12 Championship six times, more than any other school in the league. The Jayhawks have won nine straight in the event and have posted a 25-6 all-time record.



**KANSAS STATE (21-12, 10-6 Big 12)**

**Next Game:** Season Complete  
**Recent Result:** Lost to Wisconsin, 72-55  
**Last 5/Last 10 Games:** 3-2/4-6

- Kansas State made its first NCAA appearance since 1996 this season and first since the Big 12 began play. It is the 23rd NCAA bid for the school, which has advanced to four Final Fours.
- Freshman Michael Beasley is the third player (Kevin Durant, UT; Marcus Fizer, ISU) in Big 12 history to score 800 points in a season. Beasley had 866 points, the second-best freshman mark in NCAA history.
- Beasley averaged 26.2 points and 12.4 rebounds. The combined total (38.6) set a Big 12 season record, topping the mark set by Durant a year ago (36.9).
- The Wildcats have 20 Big 12 victories over the last two seasons, the best two-year total in school history. Prior to the current stretch, KSU had never recorded more than seven league wins in one Big 12 season.



**MISSOURI (16-16, 6-10 Big 12)**

**Next Game:** Season Complete  
**Recent Result:** Lost to Nebraska, 61-56  
**Last 5/Last 10 Games:** 1-4/3-7

- Junior forward Leo Lyons finished with 405 points in 2007-08. Prior to this year, he had combined for 287 points in his first two seasons at Mizzou.
- Junior forward DeMarre Carroll recorded 22 double-digit performances during the season. He scored 71 points in his last four outings and led the team in both points (417) and rebounds (213) on the year.
- Missouri had single-digit turnover totals in four of the last six games. During that span, MU posted 24 fewer turnovers (54) than its opponents (78).
- The Tigers averaged 12.9 miscues on the season, the lowest mark in school history. Mizzou led the Big 12 in turnover margin with a +3.97 mark.



**NEBRASKA (20-13, 7-9 Big 12)**

**Next Game:** Season Complete

**Recent Result:** Lost at Mississippi, 85-75 (ot)

**Last 5/Last 10 Games:** 3-2/6-4

- Nebraska reached the 20-win mark this season for the 12th time in the program's 112-year history and first time since 1998-99. Only six NU squads have won more games than the 2007-08 Huskers.
- Senior center Aleks Maric is the third player in Big 12 history (Nick Collison, KU; Arthur Johnson, MU) to score more than 1,600 points and grab 1,000+ boards in a career.
- After averaging 6.0 points in his first 14 contests, junior guard Steve Harley increased the mark to 11.5 points per game in the season's final 18 contests. He shot 50 percent or better 10 times in that span.
- Head coach Doc Sadler has won 37 games in his first two seasons at Nebraska. The total matches the highest by a Husker mentor in his first two seasons (Paul Schlisser, 1920-21).



**OKLAHOMA (23-12, 9-7 Big 12)**

**Next Game:** Season Complete

**Recent Result:** Lost to Louisville, 78-48

**Last 5/Last 10 Games:** 4-1/6-4

- Oklahoma made its 25th NCAA appearance this season. The Sooners have made the NCAA's in 12 of the last 14 years and have competed in postseason play in 25 of the past 26 campaigns.
- Forward Blake Griffin is the first freshman in OU history to earn All-Big 12 First, Second or Third team honors. He led the team in scoring (14.7 ppg), rebounding (9.1 rpg) and field goal percentage (.568).
- Junior guard Austin Johnson had 18 assists with just eight turnovers in his last five contests. He had multiple assists in 20 outings during the 2007-08 campaign.
- OU has won at least 20 games in a season for the 10th time in the last 11 years. The Sooners have also won nine or more Big 12 contests in 10 of 12 seasons since the conference began play in 1996-97.



**OKLAHOMA STATE (17-16, 7-9 Big 12)**

**Next Game:** Season Complete

**Recent Result:** Lost at Southern Illinois, 69-53

**Last 5/Last 10 Games:** 1-4/6-4

- Oklahoma State played in the postseason for the 19th time in the last 20 seasons. Prior to the current string, the Cowboys had 12 all-time postseason showings.
- Junior guard Byron Eaton has dished out 30 assists in three years of Big 12 Championship play. He is one of three Cowboys (Doug Gottlieb, James On Curry) to reach the career mark, more than any school.
- Senior Marcus Dove is the second player in Big 12 history to win a major award in consecutive seasons. The two-time Defensive Player of the Year joins Raef LaFrentz of KU (Player of the Year) in the group.
- Freshman guard James Anderson scored 438 points during 2007-08. The total is the second-highest freshman mark in school history.



**TEXAS (31-7, 13-3 Big 12)**

**Next Game:** Season Complete

**Recent Result:** Lost to Memphis, 85-67

**Last 5/Last 10 Games:** 3-2/7-3

- Texas played 20 of its 38 games this season against squads that participated in the 2008 NCAA Tournament. The Longhorns posted a 15-5 record in those contests.
- UT finished No. 7 in the final Associated Press poll. It marks the fifth time in the last six seasons that the Longhorns have been ranked in the top 12 of the final AP poll.
- The Longhorns' 31 victories this season is the highest total in school history. UT has won at least 25 games in five of the past six years.
- Forward Damion James set the Texas single-season rebounding record with 393 boards in 2007-08. The total is the second-most in Big 12 history and is the most ever by a league sophomore.



**TEXAS A&M (25-11, 8-8 Big 12)**

**Next Game:** Season Complete

**Recent Result:** Lost to UCLA, 51-49

**Last 5/Last 10 Games:** 2-3/4-6

- Texas A&M has earned three straight NCAA bids for the first time in school history. Prior to the current stretch, the Aggies had a total of six bids in their history.
- A&M is one of two league schools (KU) to win at least 21 games each of the past four seasons. The Aggies have at least eight Big 12 wins per year in that time after never having won more than six Big 12 contests in any one season.
- The Aggies held 13 of their last 16 opponents to 69 points or less. Overall this season, just eight foes crossed the 70-point plateau.
- Sophomore forward Bryan Davis had double-digit points in four of the last five contests in 2007-08, after having nine double-figure scoring outputs prior to that time. He shot 62.5 percent or better in each of the last five games.



**TEXAS TECH (16-15, 7-9 Big 12)**

**Next Game:** Season Complete

**Recent Result:** Lost to Oklahoma State, 76-72

**Last 5/Last 10 Games:** 1-4/4-6

- Senior guard Martin Zeno finished his career with 1,913 points, sixth on the all-time Big 12 scoring list. The total has moved him into fifth place on the Tech career points chart.
- Freshman guard John Roberson ended the year third on the team with 380 points. He had 18 double-figure scoring outputs in 2007-08, including 20 points or more seven times.
- Junior guard Alan Voskuil concluded the 2007-08 campaign with 405 points, second on the squad. He entered this season with a combined total of 244 points.
- Texas Tech scored 75.1 points per game at home, while averaging just 62.0 points at road venues. The Red Raiders made 335 free throws at home, compared with 145 in road facilities.
