## The University of California



California's academic status, ranking it as the best overall graduate institution in the United States, with 30 of its 32 graduate departments rated within the top six. Seven departments — music, chemistry, statistics, biostatistics, civil engineering, anthropology and history — were judged to be the finest in the United States, while 20 other departments ranked among the top five.

More than 31,000 students annually enroll at Cal. Of these, about 22,000 are undergraduates, while about 9,000 are graduate students. Students come to Berkeley from all over California, in addition to every state in the union and more than 2,000 students from 90 countries around the world.

Each year, more than 8,000 students receive degrees from the University—about 5,000 bachelor's degrees, 2,200 master's degrees, 800 doctorates and 300 law degrees.

The excellence of the University's intercollegiate athletic program rivals the school's academic reputation as Cal boasts one of the finest all-around programs in the nation. Twenty seven sports - baseball, basketball, crew, cross country, gymnastics, soccer, swimming and diving, tennis, track and field, football, golf, men's rugby and water polo, along with women's lacrosse, softball, volleyball and field hockey — are among those sponsored by the University.

Over the years, Cal has captured more than 46 national team championships, while claiming over 100 NCAA individual champions in a variety of sports.



Overlooking the San Francisco Bay, long considered some of the most beautiful scenery in the world, the campus is bordered by wooded, rolling hills and the city of Berkeley. The campus is a 1,232-acre oasis in an urban setting. The grounds have retained much of the tranquil beauty of their rural beginnings. Spacious lawns, hiking and

**N**estled between the San Francisco Bay to the west and the Berkeley Hills to the east, the University of California is as diverse an academic institution as the community which surrounds it.

By any standard, the University of California ranks as one of the world's leading intellectual centers, renowned for the size and quality of its libraries and laboratories, the scope of its research and publications, and the distinction of its faculty and students. Since its birth more than 100 years ago, it has earned a reputation unmatched by any university in America, public or private.

Several recent surveys and widely quoted expert views have rated Cal as the best large public university in undergraduate education. An example is this view in The Fiske Guide to

Colleges, published by Time-Life Books: "The Preeminent public university in the country — and probably anywhere — the University of California at Berkeley thrives on diversity...The common denominator in the Berkeley community is academic motivation".

The most recent comprehensive survey taken by the Associated Research Councils confirmed
