2006: The pleasant surprise in the secondary...shed the injury jinx and assumed the starting role at cornerback in preseason practice...was among UC's tackling leaders all season (38 stops), showing the ability to tackle in the open field...great speed made him outstanding in coverage... recorded a career-high 10 tackles vs. Pittsburgh...also returned a fumble 24 yards vs. the Panthers...recorded an interception vs. Miami (Ohio) that stopped a scoring threat and ended another drive with a timely breakup, earning BIG EAST Honor Roll honors...picked off a deflected Western Michigan pass and returned it 25 yards for the first score in International Bowl history...competed for the Bearcats' track team, his first track competition since high school, in the spring of 2006 and won the BIG EAST 100 meter title...also anchored the winning 4x100 relay team that claimed the league title and qualified for the NCAA Championships.

2005: Promising season was cut short by an arm injury...opened the season in a three-player rotation at the cornerback positions...had four tackles vs. Eastern Michigan...started the Penn State game but sustained the injury which sidelined him for the season.

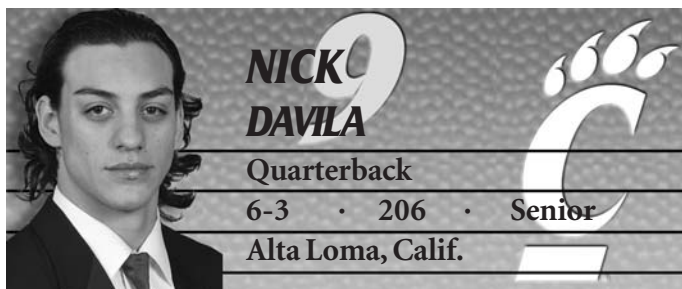

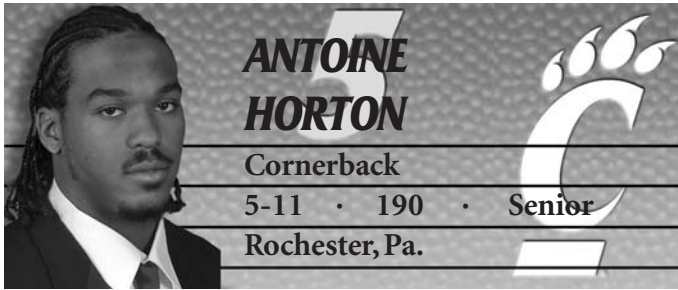

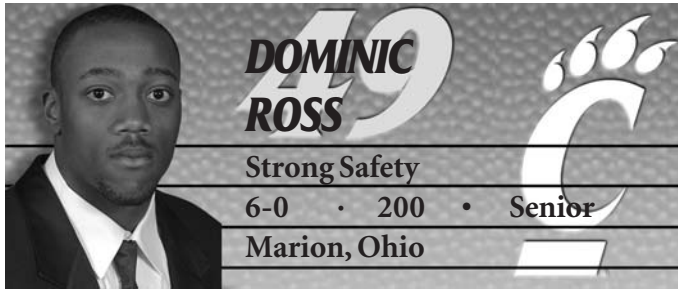
