### QUICK FACTS

- Clemson and Winthrop will face each other for the ninth time in the series on Monday evening. The Tigers hold a 7-1 all-time advantage over the Eagles.
- The Tigers won the most recent meeting between the two schools in 2002, when the game was played at Anderson Civic Center due to renovations to Littlejohn Coliseum. Edward Scott played all 40 minutes in the 78-61 Tiger victory, producing 24 points and nine rebounds.
- The Tigers are currently riding a school record 11-game non-conference winning streak in road games. The streak dates to Nov. 12, 2006 when Clemson pulled out a 74-70 victory at Old Dominion. Clemson's 11-game streak is currently the longest in the ACC.
- Clemson is coming off an 89-67 victory over UNC Greensboro. The Tigers shot 55 percent from the field and hit 8-17 from three-point range. Through three games, Clemson is hitting at a 45 percent clip from outside the arc.
- Clemson has an overall record of 97-15 in its history during the month of November. Under Head Coach Oliver Purnell, the Tigers have won 29 consecutive games dating to his second year with the program (2004-05). Clemson was 5-0 in November of 2005, 8-0 in 2006, 6-0 in 2007, and 7-0 last November.
- The Tigers are averaging 18 steals per game through the first three contests of the 2009-10 season. Clemson had 19 apiece versus Presbyterian and Liberty, then 16 in the win at UNC Greensboro.
- Clemson has an overall program record of 108-20-1 versus teams currently in the Big South Conference, including a 2-0 mark this season. The Tigers defeated Presbyterian and Liberty in the first two games. Clemson is 76-9-1 against Big South teams at home.
- David Potter ranks second on the team in scoring (12.0 ppg) and is coming off back-to-back double figure efforts for only the second time in his career. He posted a career-high 17 points in the Nov. 17 game against Liberty. The senior forward leads the team with 10 three-point goals on the season and a 66.7 percent accuracy.
- Trevor Booker is coming off his best offensive output of the season, with 17 points in 29 minutes of action at UNC Greensboro. He made 7-14 shots and added nine rebounds in the win.
- Booker is the ACC's active leader in double-doubles (22), rebounds (821), and blocked shots (208). He needs just three blocks to pass Dale Davis for fourth on the school's all-time list.
- Andre Young is off to a great start in his sophomore season. The Albany, GA native is averaging 10.0 points and 4.0 assists per game off the bench. He leads the team in steals (11) and is second in three-point shooting (54.5 percent).
- Milton Jennings had the top offensive showing of his young career at UNC Greensboro. Despite foul trouble in the first half, he finished with 14 points in 16 minutes and made 5-6 shots from the field.

# CLEMSON vs. WINTHROP

## HEAD COACH OLIVER PURNELL

- Guided Clemson program to school-record 72 wins over the past three seasons. Only Duke and North Carolina have more wins during that time than the Tiger program.
- Coached the program to back-to-back NCAA Tournament appearances, first at the school since 1997-98.
- Last season, Purnell's club went 23-9 and improved its overall winning percentage for the fifth straight season.
- In 2009, the Tigers advanced to the championship game of the ACC Tournament for the first time since 1962.
- Has taken Clemson to postseason play each of the last five years.
- One of three coaches in ACC history to take a league program to at least a three win improvement in three straight years. One of seven active Division I coaches to record a 20-win season at four different Division I schools.
- Served as an assistant coach on U.S. Olympic team for 2004 Games in Greece. Has a 45-4 record, and five Gold medals, as a USA Basketball coach.
- Has taken eleven teams to 20-win seasons, including each of his last three at Clemson. Left Dayton as the third winningest coach in school history. Finalist for the Naismith Award in 2002-03 with the Flyers.
- Member of the NABC Board of Directors and former organization president.
- Has been a Division I conference Coach of the Year in three different conferences. Coach of the Year in the Big South at Radford, at Old Dominion (CAA) and the Atlantic 10 at Dayton.
- Led Old Dominion to the Division II NCAA Championship as a senior guard (1974-75).
- Inducted into the Old Dominion Athletic Hall of Fame in 1988 and named to all-time ODU team in 2006.

## Clemson vs. Winthrop Series History

The Tigers and Eagles will meet for the ninth time in series history on Monday. Clemson holds a 7-1 advantage in the series that dates to 1985. The Tigers won that first meeting by a score of 100-55, the largest margin of victory in the series.

The closest set of games between the two schools took place from 1999-2002. Clemson won 64-59 on Dec. 18, 1999 at home. Will Solomon led that team with 22 points, while center Adam Allenspach contributed 14. The next season, the Tigers held on for a 10-point win.

In 2001-02, the Tigers lost the first game in the series against Winthrop. Coached at the time by Gregg Marshall, the Eagles won 66-61 in Littlejohn Coliseum. The Tigers got a 20-point effort out of Jamar McKnight, but it was not enough to overcome Tyrone Walker's 25-point outburst.

The most recent meeting between Clemson and Winthrop took place in the Anderson Civic Center in 2002, when Littlejohn Coliseum was undergoing renovations. The Tigers won 78-61 after point guard Edward Scott posted 24 points and nine rebounds in 40 minutes of play.

## Scouting Winthrop

The Eagles are under the direction of third-year Head Coach Randy Peele, who took over after Marshall left to take the head coaching position at Wichita State. Peele has a career 35-32 record since taking over for Marshall.

Winthrop began the season in dramatic fashion, pulling off a last-second, 57-55 win over Limestone College. Mantoris Robinson hit a layup as the final buzzer sounded, capping an 11-2 run by Winthrop over the final two minutes of the game.

In their second game, the Eagles fell to College of Charleston at Carolina First Arena by a score of 69-57. Andre Jones, who scored 15 against Limestone, led the Eagles with 11 points in the loss. The common thread in Winthrop's first two games was poor shooting. The Eagles shot 36 percent or worse in both games.

Winthrop defeated USC Upstate by a score of 49-46 on Saturday, Nov. 21. Gideon Gamble came off the bench to post 12 points for the Eagles.

The leading scorer on the season for the 2-1 Eagles is Andre Jones, a guard averaging 11.3 points per game.

## Clemson Beats UNC Greensboro 89-67 on the Road

For the second straight game, Clemson went on the road and came away with a big victory. The Tigers used a 17-2 run to end the first half en route to an 89-67 win

over UNC Greensboro in the first official game of the 2009-10 season for the Spartans in their new home, the Greensboro Coliseum.

UNCG pushed the Tigers during the opening 10 minutes of the game. Thanks in large part to repeated trips to the free throw line, the Spartans were within three at 25-22 after a three-point basket by Mikko Koivisto. Clemson ended the half with an impressive 17-2 run, sparked by a trio of three-point baskets. Andre Young had one of the long balls, then added a beautiful three-point play on a layup following a steal with under a minute left.

For the third straight game, Oliver Purnell and his staff were able to play a significant amount of players in the final half of action. Clemson pushed its lead to as much as 31 after a three-point play by senior Trevor Booker with just under eight minutes left in the game. Booker did not play any more after that point and finished the game with 17 points and nine rebounds.

Milton Jennings gave the Tigers a nice lift off the bench in the first half. Despite foul trouble, he was able to put seven points on the board in the frame and the Summerville, SC product finished with 14 points. He hit 5-6 shots, including 2-3 from three-point range. Andre Young added 13 points on 4-5 shooting, while David Potter posted double figures (11 points) for the second straight game.

## We're Going Streaking

Clemson's road win at UNC Greensboro on Nov. 20 was the program's 11th straight over a non-conference foe, a school record. The Tigers' last non-conference road loss was in the 2006 postseason NIT at Louisville. Also included among Clemson's victims in the record streak are Alabama, Charlotte, East Carolina, Illinois, Liberty, Minnesota, Mississippi State, Old Dominion, and South Carolina.

During its 11-game road non-conference winning streak, Clemson has defeated three SEC teams and two from the Big Ten as well. The streak began on Nov. 12, 2006 when Clemson held on for a 74-70 win over Old Dominion in Norfolk. That season, the Tigers defeated

Minnesota in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge as well as South Carolina in Columbia. In 2007-08, Clemson went to Starkville, MS for the second game of the season and handed an eventual NCAA Tournament Bulldog team an 84-82 loss. The Tigers also won at East Carolina and Alabama that season.

Last year, Clemson enhanced its reputation for playing well on the road on Nov. 22 by holding off Charlotte in front of a hostile Halton Arena crowd. Clemson then knocked off eventual NCAA Tournament five-seed Illinois 76-74 in Champaign. The Tigers closed out the non-conference road slate with another road win in Columbia, as they defeated South Carolina 98-87 on Dec. 30, 2008.

### Tigers Strong in November Under Purnell

Clemson has been strong historically in November, but especially so under seventh-year Head Coach Oliver Purnell. Clemson finished 7-0 for the month in 2008-09 and has won 29 consecutive games in November dating to Purnell's second year. The Tigers are off to a good start again, winning their first three non-conference games by an average of 35 points.

Clemson was 5-0 in November of 2005, then had an 8-0 November of 2006. The Tigers were 6-0 under Purnell during November of 2007. Clemson's last loss in November took place in 2004 when the Tigers lost at Boston College the day after Thanksgiving, 79-70.

Clemson is 97-15 all-time in the month of November. Clemson first played a game in November of 1972, an 86-77 victory over Georgia Tech in Littlejohn Coliseum.

### Booker Drawing Early Positive Press

It's been well-publicized that Trevor Booker is one of the top returning players in the ACC. He was named to the preseason All-ACC team at the conference media day in October, and even received votes for Player-of-the-Year.

However, Booker is also drawing his fair share of positive press on a national scale. He was named a preseason first-team All-American by Basketball Times. Booker was also a preseason All-American according to CBSsports.com, FoxSports.com, TheCollegeInsider.com,

and Blue Ribbon.

Booker, rated the nation's No. 7 power forward by Lindy's magazine, was one of 50 players named to the preseason watch list for the Wooden Award.

### Three-Point Shooting Still a Question Mark?

While Clemson is only three games into the 2009-10 season, early returns on the Tigers' perceived biggest weakness have been very positive. The Tigers came into the year having to replace the program's all-time leading three-point shooter K.C. Rivers (281 career makes) and departed sharpshooter Terrence Oglesby (177 in two years).

Most national media publications felt Clemson would be unable to replace the three-point marksmen from its 2008-09 team. However, that has not been the case through three games. Clemson has made 32 out of 71 attempts from behind the three-point line, which equates to an impressive 45 percent clip.

While the Tigers do not necessarily have the range or the "go-to" shooter as they have in the past, the three-point shots have been well distributed throughout the lineup. David Potter has been the most effective outside shooter, converting 10-of-15 (.667) attempts. Andre Young has made 6-of-11 from three, or 54.5 percent. Trevor Booker has made 2-of-3 attempts on the season, while Milton Jennings (.429) has been the top percentage shooter among the freshmen.

### Bookers First Brother Combination to Play for Clemson Since 1984-85

Trevor and Devin Booker are the first combination of brothers to play for Clemson since Horace and Harvey Grant in 1984-85. Trevor is a senior forward, while Devin is a freshman who has seen plenty of playing time through the first two games.

The most productive combination of brothers to play for Clemson were the four Mahaffeyes, whose careers spanned from 1959 to 1970 for the Tigers. The quartet combined to score 3,555 points during that time. Two of the brothers, Randy and Richie, both scored over 1,000 points in their career. In those days, freshman were not allowed to play, so the point totals would have been even higher had the quartet played in today's college basketball.

The Grant brothers, Horace and Harvey, scored a combined 473 points during the 1984-85 season. It was their only season playing together. Harvey transferred and finished his career at Oklahoma, while Horace went on to become ACC Player-of-the-Year for Clemson in 1987.

So far this season, Trevor is averaging 11.5 points and 10.0 rebounds per game. Devin has averaged 4.5 points and 5.5 rebounds off the bench.

Below is a career comparison of their high school careers. As you can see, Trevor held the upper hand in rebounds and blocked shots (both school records), but Devin left as Union County High School's all-time leading scorer with over 1,500 points.

### Tigers Earn Largest Road Victory Margin Since 1956

Clemson's 40-point win at Liberty was the program's largest margin of victory on the road since a win at The Citadel on Feb. 6, 1956 (114-69). The Tigers defeated the Flames by a score of 79-39 on Tuesday, Nov. 17 behind a suffocating fullcourt defense. Liberty committed 28 turnovers, and Clemson turned them into 32 points. In the first two games of the season, Clemson has a 75-10 advantage in points off turnovers.

### Eight Different Players Make a Three-Pointer in Season Opener

Clemson tied a single-game record after eight different players made a three-point goal in the season-opening win over Presbyterian. On Jan. 22, 1983, when the three-point distance was just 17'9", eight different Tigers made three-point baskets in a 105-87 loss to a seventh-ranked Virginia team led by All-American Ralph Sampson. Clemson made 65 percent of its three-point goals (15-23) that day versus the Cavaliers.

The Tigers received a 6-13 shooting performance from behind the arc from its freshman class, led by Noel Johnson's 4-8 effort. Milton Jennings (1-2) and Donte Hill (1-3) also knocked down long-range attempts. Clemson's top player, forward Trevor Booker, even knocked down a three in the second half.

The most surprising shooting display came courtesy of North Augusta, SC native Bryan Narcisse. He made 2-3 from long distance, the first three-point goals of his career. In fact, coming into his sophomore season, he had only attempted one career three-point goal.

### Potter Starting, Producing at High Rate for Tigers

Senior forward David Potter has patiently waited his turn behind some talented wing players. He played in all 102 games of his first three years with the program, but never started a game until the season opener on Nov. 13 against Presbyterian. That is a stark contrast from classmate Trevor Booker, who has 105 consecutive starts under his belt.

The Severn, MD has made the most of his three starts. After settling in against the Blue Hose to his new role, he contributed eight points and hit 2-4 three-point shots. Then, on Tuesday, Nov. 17, he produced a career high by pouring in 17 points against Liberty on the road. Prior to the game against Liberty, his career high was 12 points in his first-ever collegiate game against Arkansas State.

Potter enters Monday's contest against Winthrop as the team's top shooter, having made 10-15 from behind the three-point arc. He hit 5-6 in the win at Liberty and followed with a 3-5 performance at UNC Greensboro.

Potter ranks second on the Tiger squad this season with 12 points per game.

### Sophomores Smith and Narcisse Produce Career Nights

It's obvious Tanner Smith gets pumped up to play in season openers. Last year, as a freshman, he posted a season-high 11 points against Hofstra in the first game of the season. Last Friday, Smith topped that with a career 14-point effort. He hit 6-9 field goals, including 1-3 from three-point distance. Smith added six rebounds in a solid 16 minutes of play.

Not to be outdone, however, was classmate Bryan Narcisse. The 6-6 forward who had totaled just 24 points as a freshman, posted nearly half that with 10 in the opener against PC. Narcisse had career highs in terms of field goals (4), field goal attempts (7), three-point goals (2), three-point attempts (3). He did it all in only 10 minutes.

### Heralded Freshman Class Impresses in Season Opener

The Clemson men's basketball program has four incoming freshmen ranked among the nation's best at their respective positions. With the addition of four-star guard Noel Johnson in June, the class has been ranked as high as No. 11 in the nation by both Rivals.com and Scout.com. Clemson's 2009-10 freshman class includes Milton Jennings, a 6-9 forward from Summerville, SC, Devin Booker, a 6-8 forward from Whitmire, SC, Donte Hill, a 6-4 guard from Virginia Beach, VA, and Johnson, a 6-6 wing from Fayetteville, GA.

Jennings was a McDonald's All-American in 2009, the first to sign with Clemson since Sharone Wright in 1991. He also was Mr. Basketball and two-time Gatorade Player-of-the-Year in the state of South Carolina. Booker, younger brother of Clemson senior Trevor, was first-team All-State as a senior and re-wrote his older brother's scoring records at Union County High School.

Hill was a first-team All-State selection as a senior at Norfolk Collegiate School, where he posted an incredible 23 double-doubles. Johnson was also an all-state player and originally signed with Southern Cal. He opted out of his letter-of-intent following the resignation of coach Tim Floyd, then signed with Clemson in early June.

In the season opener, the four combined for 26 points and 12 rebounds. Johnson was

the most impressive, converting on 4-8 from three-point range with 12 points. Booker added six points, while Jennings contributed five points and three steals. Hill hit a late three-pointer, one of 14 in the game for the Tigers against Presbyterian.

### Booker Ranks Among Top Shot-Blockers in School History

Trevor Booker is the ACC's active leader with 208 career blocked shots, including 64 in 2008-09. He will obviously continue to be the active ACC leader entering 2009-10. In the 2008 ACC Tournament championship game, Booker set a final game record with six blocked shots against North Carolina.

Booker ranked second in the ACC in blocked shots per game in 2008-09, averaging 2.0 per contest. He ranks fifth among the school's all-time leaders in blocks. Only Tree Rollins, Elden Campbell, Sharone Wright and Dale Davis, all NBA first-round draft choices, have more than Booker.

He was right on his average in the opener, swatting a pair of field goal attempts by Presbyterian. He needs just three blocks to pass Dale Davis for fourth on the list.

### Booker Ranks Among Top Rebounders in School History

Trevor Booker has moved into the top 10 in Clemson history in rebounding. With 20 caroms through the first two games, Booker now has 821 career rebounds, to rank seventh in school history. He averaged 9.7 rebounds per game as a junior, best in the ACC, and has a 7.8 average for his career. Booker has started 105 consecutive games, 75 of which have resulted in Clemson victories.

Booker moved ahead of all four Mahaffey Brothers on the Clemson career list and Larry Nance, a player who went on to an NBA All-Star career, at the end of his junior year.

Other than Booker, each of the top eight rebounders in Clemson history played in the NBA. The career leader is Tree Rollins at 1,311, while Dale Davis had 1,216. It will be difficult for Booker to catch either of those Clemson greats, but he will have a chance to get to 1,000 rebounds during his senior year. Rollins and Davis are the only Clemson basketball players with 1,000 career rebounds.

### Clemson Picked Third in ACC Preseason Poll

Clemson was picked to finish third in the ACC this season in men's basketball on Sunday, Oct. 25 at the conference's media day. This marks the third straight season the Tigers have been predicted to finish among the top five teams in the conference. It is the first time since the 1975-77 era that Clemson has been predicted to finish among the upper half of teams in the ACC three consecutive seasons.

North Carolina and Duke tied in the preseason poll, with the two rivals collecting 545 points. The Tigers were third (409 points). Georgia Tech (387) was picked fourth.

# CLEMSON vs. WINTHROP

The Tigers are coming off back-to-back appearances in the NCAA Tournament, a first at Clemson since 1997-98. Clemson finished the 2008-09 season with a 23-9 overall record, the third straight year the Tigers surpassed the 20-win mark. The Tigers have improved their overall winning percentage five straight seasons as well.

The top returning player on the team is senior Trevor Booker, who was voted to the preseason All-ACC team. Booker was a second-team selection last season when he led the ACC in rebounds per game (9.7) and field goal percentage (.571). Booker was named to the preseason all-conference squad, alongside Kyle Singler (Duke), Greivis Vasquez (Maryland), Ed Davis (North Carolina), and Malcolm Delaney (Virginia Tech). He received eight votes for Preseason ACC Player-of-the-Year.

## **Marcus Thornton Signs Letter of Intent with Clemson Basketball**

The Clemson men's basketball program announced the signing of Marcus Thornton to a national letter of intent on Nov. 11, the first day of the early signing period. Thornton, a 6-8 forward from Atlanta, GA, will play for the Tigers beginning in 2010.

"We are really pleased to add a tremendous student-athlete to our program in Marcus Thornton," said Oliver Purnell, Clemson's head coach. "He will really fit in well with our high-octane attack on both ends of the floor."

Thornton, a three-star prospect according to both Rivals.com and Scout.com, is also listed as the nation's No. 27 power forward prospect by ESPNU. The first-team all-region player averaged 14.0 points, 7.0 rebounds, and 4.5 blocks per game last season for a 25-7 Westlake squad. He led the Lions to a region championship and berth in the AAAAA semifinals in Georgia. He recorded a triple-double in the state quarterfinals with 13 points, 11 rebounds and 10 blocks against Savannah. Thornton is on pace to break the school record for blocked shots in a career.

Thornton also won the state of Georgia's slam dunk contest in 2009, an event sponsored by the Atlanta Journal-Constitution. He signed with Clemson over scholarship offers from Maryland and Xavier.

## **ESPN College GameDay Coming to Clemson in 2010**

ESPN announced in August that Clemson will serve as one of the host sites for the network's popular basketball series, College GameDay, this upcoming season. Two one-hour shows (11:00 AM and 8:00 p.m. Eastern) will originate from Littlejohn Coliseum on Jan. 23, 2010 for the Clemson vs. Duke game. The Tigers and Blue Devils will square off on ESPN at 9:00 p.m.

"We are delighted to be hosting ESPN College GameDay," said Oliver Purnell, head coach of the Tigers. "This is another first for Clemson basketball. I think that speaks to the positive direction of our program. This will showcase not only our basketball program, but also our great university."

As Purnell mentioned, this will be Clemson's first appearance on ESPN College GameDay. The series, which is in its sixth season, will make four first-time stops in 2010. Other first-time hosts include Illinois, Kansas State and Washington. The Clemson/Duke game will be one of two ACC tilts featured this season, with the other being North Carolina at Duke on Mar. 6. In total, the series will feature eight consecutive weeks of coverage beginning with a Jan. 16 women's game in Storrs, Conn.

"I am looking forward to going to Clemson for College GameDay," said Digger Phelps, former Notre Dame coach who serves as an analyst for the show. "Since we started the program five years ago, I thought Clemson could challenge any of the places we have visited. The support of the student body and their fans will challenge anything you see at Pauley Pavilion, Allen Fieldhouse or Cameron Indoor Stadium. Oliver Purnell has done a great job at Clemson. I will be there and ready to dance!"
