## DUQUESNE CONCLUDES 2010 SEASON AT BRYANT:

Duquesne (6-4, 4-3), coming off a 41-17 Senior Day win over Saint Francis, heads to Smithfield, R.I. to close out the 2010 season at red hot Bryant (7-3, 4-3) on Saturday, Nov. 20 at 12:00 p.m. Bryant, which is coming off a 27-21 win over NEC leader No. 25 (Sports Network) Robert Morris last weekend, has won three in a row. The Bulldogs, who are 6-0 at home, are 8-0 all-time against the NEC's three Pennsylvania schools (Duquesne, Robert Morris and Saint Francis). Duquesne, which clinched a winning season with the victory over Saint Francis, is 1-3 on the road. Bryant is 22-5 at Bulldog Stadium since the 2006 season. The Bulldogs have not lost more than two games at home since 2004 and are 7-2 against NEC opponents in Smithfield since beginning the transition to Division I membership.

## DUKES AND BULLDOGS:

This is the third meeting between Duquesne and Bryant ... two years ago, in the first meeting between the two, Bryant scored nine points in a 16 second span of the fourth quarter to break open a close game in handing Duquesne a 24-10 defeat in a non-conference game at Smithfield, R.I. ... last year, Bryant limited Duquesne to 133 yards in the second half in posting a 20-0 season-ending win over the Dukes at Rooney Field ... Bryant outgained Duquesne 341-257 in shutting out the Dukes for the first time since a 24-0 loss at Albany in the 2002 ECAC Classic.

## ON THE DUKES:

Duquesne amassed 326 of total offense in its loss at now-No. 1 Delaware (9-1) on Sept. 18 ... DU is one of just three teams (William & Mary - the team that handed UD it lone defeat - and UMass are the others) to gain over 300 yards vs. the Blue Hens who rank third nationally in total defense ... DU also rolled up 461 yards in total offense, including 135 on the ground, in its win over now-No. 24 Dayton ... Dayton (10-1) currently ranks 3rd nationally in rushing defense ... sophomore running back Larry McCoy, who ranks 14th nationally in rushing (113.1 ypg.), has been the model of consistency with 81, 84, 88, 123, 74, 246, 122, 131, 81 & 101 yards rushing in DU's 10 games ... McCoy has topped 100 yards in five of seven NEC games ... McCoy enters the Bryant game with 1,131 yards ... his yardage total ranks 10th on DU's all-time, single-season list ... a pair of Michigan State transfers lead the Dukes in receptions ... senior Dave Williams has 51 catches for 676 yards and nine TDs ... Connor Dixon, a converted QB who attended MSU with Williams, has 41 catches for 560 yards and five scores ... Duquesne ranks 12th nationally in pass defense (156.2 ypg.), 22nd in pass efficiency defense (111.6) and 43rd in total defense (333.5 ypg.).

## 2010 PLAYERS TO WATCH

### 44 • LB • NATHAN TOTINO, Sr. (5-10, 210)

2008 First Team All-NEC linebacker ... three-year starter entered the season fifth among active NCAA FCS players with a career 9.9 tackles per game average ... his career average of 5.1 solo tackles per game was third-best among FCS returnees ... led the Dukes in tackles for the second consecutive season with 73 last year despite missing two games due to injury ... had 110 tackles in 2008 and 93 in 2007 ... saw his 2009 season cut short by a knee injury suffered in game nine at Wagner ... underwent knee surgery prior to last season ... has 19 career double-digit tackle games including a career high 23 (13 solo) against Albany in 2008.

### 28 • RB • LARRY MCCOY, So. (5-11, 215)

Was the top rushing freshman in the FCS last season at 73.36 ypg. while earning NEC Rookie of the Week three times ... topped the 100-yard mark four times with a career-best 195 at Nicholls State ... tied the school record with five rushing touchdowns at Sacred Heart ... averaged 5.0 ypc. ... carried 160 times for 807 yards and 8 TDs.

### 4 • WR • AKEEM MOORE, So. (6-2, 197)

Talented athlete started all 10 games in the defensive backfield in 2008 (3 INTs for 111 yards) ... moved to receiver in the spring of 2009 ... had four catches for 82 yards (20.5 ypc.) before suffering internal injuries following a hit on the first series of the Nicholls State game (game two of 2009).

### 10 • WR • CONNOR DIXON, Sr. (6-5, 206)

Came to Duquesne as a quarterback transfer from Michigan State ... threw for 1,899 yards and 21 TDs in 2008 before shoulder problems set in ... started three times at QB last season before moving to receiver ... caught 22 passes for 333 yards and two TDs in four games at flanker.

### 5 • WR • DAVE WILLIAMS, Sr. (5-10, 185)

Second-year Michigan State transfer is a talented deep threat who caught 29 passes for 385 yards and three TDs in five games before being lost for the season with a shoulder injury.

### 84 • TE • SEAN BUNEVICH, Sr. (6-4, 241)

Caught 25 passes for 454 yards for a team-best 18.2 ypc. average in seven games in 2008 prior to being lost for the season due to a knee injury... was named Second Team All-NEC IN '08 despite missing the final three games ... underwent offseason knee surgery and did not participate in spring drills ... was ready to go for 2009 before re-injuring the knee in fall practice ... the injury sidelined him for the 2009 season ... averaging 17.4 yards per catch for his career (51-886-7) ... was Second Team All Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference as a sophomore ... 22 of his 51 career catches have covered 20 or more yards (including 12 in 2009).

### 77 • OT • RON DUNN, Jr. (6-6, 297)

Talented young lineman has started a team-high 30 consecutive games on the offensive line including all 11 last season at left tackle.

### 78 • DE • THAIMU BANGURA, Sr. (6-3, 278)

Led the Dukes with 4.0 sacks in 2009 (has 11.5 for his career) ... led all linemen with 42 tackles and was second on team with 6.5 TFL.

**NOTING BRYANT:** Bryant is 8-0 against NEC teams from Pennsylvania since 2008 ... BU is 6-0 at home for the first time in school history ... the Bulldogs have amassed 27 rushing touchdowns this season, the second-highest total in school history ... Bryant is two interceptions shy of setting a school record for interceptions in a season (15) ... sophomore RB Jordan Brown - the NEC's leading rusher - eclipsed the 100-yard mark for the ninth time this season with 138 yards vs. Robert Morris ... Brown, who has 1,311 yards on 247 carries (131.1 ypg.), leads the NEC in rushing touchdowns (15), rushing yards (1,311), rushing yards/g. (131.1) and all-purpose yards/g. (179.2).

**SAINT FRANCIS LEFTOVERS:** Duquesne upped its series lead to 31-6 and extended Saint Francis' road losing streak to 18 games with the 41-17 victory ... with the win, DU finished with a 5-1 home record, marking the first time the Dukes have posted five home wins since the 2003 Mid-Major National Championship team went 6-0 on Rooney Field ... sophomore quarterback **Sean Patterson (Toledo, Ohio/St. John's Jesuit)** completed 13-of-21 passes for 278 yards and a career high five touchdowns (79, 44, 10, 10 & 9) in earning NEC Offensive P-O-W ... he completed 7-of-9 passes for 191 yards and three touchdowns and ran for another in the second quarter alone ... seniors **Dave Williams (Monroeville, Pa./Gateway)** and **Connor Dixon (South Park, Pa./South Park)** both topped the 100-yard receiving mark in their final home game ... Williams finished with five catches for 100 yards and Dixon had 5 grabs for 109 yards ... it was the fourth career 100-yard game for Williams (third this season) and second for Dixon (both this year) ... this was the first time Duquesne had two 100-yard receivers in the same game since Michael Rasky (3-105) and Bruce Hocker (4-104) reached the century mark in a 28-19 loss to Bucknell on Sept. 1, 2007 ... senior linebacker **Nathan Totino (Pittsburgh, Pa./Seton-La Salle)** had a game-high 10 tackles in addition to his first career interception ... it was his third consecutive double-digit tackle game and 19th double-digit tackle game of his career ... sophomore running back **Larry McCoy (Wytheville, Va./George Wythe)** carried 22 times for 101 yards ... it was his fifth 100-yard game this season and ninth of his career ... McCoy has topped the 100-yard mark in five of seven NEC games ... McCoy has gained at least 74 yards in every game this season.

**THE REAL MCCOY:** Sophomore **Larry McCoy (Wytheville, Va./George Wythe)**, a three-time NEC Rookie of the Week last season, ranks 14th nationally with a 113.1 ypg. rushing average. The 5-11, 215-pound Virginia native has been the model of consistency this season, having rushed for between 74 and 246 yards on no fewer than 18 carries in any game. McCoy, who entered 2010 as the Dukes' top returning rusher, topped the 100-yard mark four times (34-195 at Nicholls State, 14-118 at Dayton, 20-107 vs. Robert Morris and 20-121 at Sacred Heart) in leading all FCS freshman rushers with a 73.4 yards per game average (160 carries for a team-high 807 yards and eight touchdowns) in 2009. McCoy's 246 yards at CCSU on Oct. 9 were the most by a Dukes back since Mike Hilliard rushed for a school record 323 yards against La Salle in 2003. The Virginia native had runs of 51, 148 and 46 yards against the Blue Devils on his way to earning NEC Offensive Player of the Week honors. Earlier this year, McCoy carried 29 times for 123 yards and two touchdowns (25, 1) in the 28-17 win over Albany. The 25-yard scoring run came on a fourth-and-one play in the first quarter. The one-yard run put the Dukes up 28-14 in the third quarter. He also ran for 122 yards and a TD against Sacred Heart, 131 on 29 attempts at Wagner and 101 on 22 totes vs. Saint Francis, giving him 100 or more yards in five of seven NEC games. McCoy is accounting for 65 percent of Duquesne's rushing attempts this season.

**QUICK HITS:** Sophomore kicker **Eric Duale (Hinckley, Ohio/Highland)**, who has converted 11-of-15 field goal attempts and 27-of-28 extra points, can safely stake a claim as one of the NEC's most-improved players ... Duale has kicked a school record-tying three field goals in a game twice (vs. Monmouth and at CCSU) ... he is two field goals shy of tying the school record of 12 set by Mark Troyan in 2007 ... Duale converted 6-of-14 field goal attempts as a freshman ... he is 8-of-9 inside the 30-yard line ... six players have caught at least one touchdown pass ... six receivers also have at least one 30-yard reception ... freshman **Ryan Ho (Pearl City, Hawaii/Kamehameha Schools)** ranks sixth nationally with a 31.2 yards per kickoff return average ... he had returns of 85 & 71 yards vs. Monmouth ... the Dukes have 14 fewer penalties than their opponents (48-461 to 62-586 ... DU is outscoring opponents 113-89 (+24) in the second half

**OUCH!:** Last year, a total of 13 starters missed at least one game due to injury. The list included: TE Sean Bunevich (season/injured in preseason), WR (and QB) Connor Dixon (one g.), CB Aaron Fitzpatrick (four g.), TE (now OL) Brian Layhue (season/played in the opener), CB Justin Melhado (one g.), WR Akeem Moore (season/injured in game two), LB Anthony Rhoades (one g.), DL Tyler Scruggs (two g.), DL Aldon Sutton (one g.), LB Nathan Totino (two g.) and WR Dave Williams (season/injured in game five).

**TOTINO KNOWS TACKLES:** Senior LB **Nathan Totino (Pittsburgh, Pa./Seton-La Salle)**, a first team All-NEC pick in 2008, has led the Dukes in tackles in each of the past two seasons and is well on his way to leading DU again in 2010. The 5-10, 210-pounder, despite injuries that limited him to nine games in both 2008 & 2009, ranks among FCS leaders in career tackles per game. Totino, who missed spring drills in each of the past two years due to rehab, has topped the 10-tackle mark 19 times in 38 career games (four this season) including a career-high 23 stops two years ago against Albany. The 23 stops were the most by a DU player since the school moved to the FCS level in 1993. Totino got off to a solid start with a game-high 13 tackles (10 solo) in DU's season-opening win over Bucknell. He was named NEC Defensive Player of the Week for his effort. He followed that with eight solo stops and a key fumble

recovery in the victory over Dayton, eight more tackles at Delaware and a team high-tying seven in the win over Albany. Totino had 12 tackles, including 3.5 for losses, in earning Defensive Player of the Week a second time following DU's 21-20 win at Wagner. He added a team-high 11 stops in the loss at Robert Morris and followed that with 10 more vs. Saint Francis, giving him double-digit tackles in DU's past three games.

**WELCOME BACK:** Three players who were expected to be the heart-and-soul of the 2009 receiving corps are back after missing significant playing time due to injuries. 2009 Preseason All-NEC tight end **Sean Bunevich (North Ridgeville, Ohio/North Ridgeville)** saw his season ended before it began with a non-contact knee injury suffered at practice last August 11. Bunevich, who was held out of spring drills while rehabbing, was slowed by a hamstring injury in fall practice. He made his first catch since Oct. 25, 2008 in the opener versus Bucknell and followed that with an emotional game-winning, eight-yard touchdown catch with 21 seconds left in DU's 35-31 win over Dayton. Bunevich has 11 catches for 130 yards in 2010. Promising sophomore receiver **Akeem Moore (Pittsburgh, Pa./Brentwood)** was sidelined with internal injuries suffered on the first series at Nicholls State last Sept. 12. Moore who started 10 times in the defensive backfield as a freshman, had four catches in two games (20.4 ypc.) prior to the injury. Moore had nine catches for 112 yards in DU's first two games before an ankle injury kept him out of the Delaware game. He returned to make a 45-yard catch-and-run versus Albany, added a team-high four grabs vs. Monmouth and a season-high 69 yards on three receptions against Saint Francis. Moore has 22 catches for 322 yards (team high 14.6 ypc.) this year. Michigan State transfer **Dave Williams (Monroeville, Pa./Gateway)**, who went down with a shoulder injury in week five last year versus Robert Morris, had four catches for 42 yards including a nine-yard third quarter TD that put the Dukes up 17-10 in the 17-13 DU's opening day win over the Bison. He added 106 yards on three catches against Albany and seven grabs for 63 yards and two scores (9, 5) at CCSU. The second TD came of the final play of the game to set up an unsuccessful potential game-tying two point conversion. He followed that with four grabs for 87 yards - including a 49-yard TD - against Sacred Heart and added nine catches for 128 yards and two fourth quarter TDs in earning NEC co-Offensive Player of the Week following the win at Wagner. Williams added five catches for 100 yards - including TDs of 79 and 10 yards - in the win over Saint Francis. The Pittsburgh native, who was leading the Dukes with 29

## DEPTH BY NECESSITY

Last year, injuries forced 13 starters to miss at least one game. Despite the revolving door lineup, the Dukes were competitive, losing five times by seven or fewer points. On a positive note, injuries last did allow a number of players to receive meaningful playing time. In all, 32 returnees started at least once in 2009 - including 21 freshmen and sophomores:

catches for 385 yards at the time of last year's injury, has 51 catches for 676 yards and nine TDs this season. Williams was a preseason All-NEC pick.

**MR. CLUTCH:** Injuries to receivers last season forced head coach Jerry Schmitt to do some experimentation. One of the by-products of the misfortune was the move of 6-5, 206-pound **Connor Dixon (South Park, Pa./South Park)** from quarterback to receiver. Dixon, who threw for 429 yards and a school record six TDs at Bucknell in his first start in the 2008 opener, had difficulty recovering from 2009 shoulder surgery and was shifted to receiver eight games into last season. In four games at receiver, the Michigan State transfer caught 22 passes for 333 yards. All seven of his catches of 20 yards or more, including a season-long 43-yarder versus Wagner, came in the fourth quarter. He had 13 catches for 250 yards in the fourth quarter alone in 2009. Dixon had another clutch grab at Dayton in week two, pulling in a 13-yard pass from Sean Patterson with no time left to tie the score at 21-21 at the half. Forty of Dixon's 41 catches have come in DU's past nine games. He set career highs for catches (8) and yards (117) at nationally ranked Delaware and added five catches for 109 and two TDs (44 & 10 yards) against Saint Francis.

**DU'S THIRD SEASON IN THE NEC:** Duquesne, a member of the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference Football League from 1994 to 2007, is in its third season as an associate member of the Northeast Conference Football League. With the move to the NEC, Duquesne offered 18 scholarships beginning in February of 2008 and will increase that number by two through 2011. Duquesne granted only need-based financial aid for football playing student-athletes as a member of the MAAC. The NEC competed as a non-scholarship member of the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision until 2006 when the conference adopted an athletics-based aid model. Duquesne started its program in 1902 and competed at the highest level - winning a pair of New Years Day Bowl games (1934 Festival of Palms and 1937 Orange) - before disbanding following the 1950 season. DU returned at the Club level prior to the 1969 season and won a National Club Championship in 1973. The Dukes competed at the NCAA Division III level from 1979-92 before moving up to the non-scholarship Football Championship Subdivision in 1993. The NEC Football League, which was established in 1996, includes full-time conference members Bryant, Central Connecticut State University, Monmouth University, Robert Morris University, Sacred Heart University, Saint Francis (Pa.) University and Wagner College along with associate member the University at Albany.

**A DEARTH OF DEPTH AT QB:** Last season, three different quarterbacks started at least twice for the Dukes in Kevin Rombach (six times), Connor Dixon (three times) and redshirt freshman **Sean Patterson (Toledo, Ohio/St. John's Jesuit)** (twice). That kind of depth hasn't been a luxury in 2010 as Rombach graduated as the most accurate thrower in school history (.606 completion pct.) and Dixon, after repeated shoulder injuries, has made the successful move to receiver. Patterson, now a sophomore, entered the year as the only QB on the roster with college experience. Patterson, who completed 25-of-52 passes for 342 yards and three touchdowns in 2009, took all of the snaps in the spring as the lone QB in camp. The 6-1, 200-pound lefty nearly matched his passing yardage total for last season when he completed 27-of-40 passes for 326 yards in DU's 35-31 win over Dayton on Sept. 11. Patterson threw TD passes of 13, 31 and 8 yards, the last of which was to tight end Sean Bunevich with 21 seconds left, against the Flyers. Patterson added 49 yards on the ground for 375 yards of total offense in earning NEC Offensive Player of the Week honors. The 375 yards were the most by an NEC quarterback since Dixon posted 447 at Bucknell in the 2008 opener. The Ohio native converted four third downs via the air in leading the Dukes on a 98-yard drive in the fourth quarter at Wagner. Patterson culminated the drive with a 16-yard TD pass to Dave Williams with 1:41 left in the 21-20 win. He threw for 278 yards and five touchdowns (79, 44, 10, 10 & 9) and ran for one more in a 41-17 win over Saint Francis to earn NEC Offensive Player of the Week honors a second time. Patterson is the fourth QB in DU history to throw for five or more scores in a game. Patterson has completed 55.9 percent of his passes for 1,853 yards and 18 touchdowns and run for 225 yards in 2010. True freshman Marty Mitchell (Dearborn, Mich./Divine Child), who played one snap in the first four games, saw his first extended action in relief of an injured Patterson vs. Monmouth. Mitchell completed 10-of-18 passes for 135 yards and two scores (4, 21), but was picked off four times in a little over two quarters of action.

**CONTINUITY:** Last year, injuries prevented Duquesne from starting the same defense for no more than two consecutive games. So far this season, the same 11 has started seven of 10 games with only DT Mike Passodelis missing three starts due to injury.

**CAPTAINS:** A trio of seniors are serving as permanent captains for the 2010 season. They are linebacker **Nathan Totino (Pittsburgh, Pa./Seton-La Salle)**, receiver **Connor Dixon (South Park, Pa./South Park)** and defensive lineman **Thaimu Bangura (Lanham, Md./Eleanor Roosevelt)**. An additional game captain is named on a weekly basis.

**ALL TAY:** Senior defensive lineman **Thaimu Bangura (Lanham, Md./Eleanor Roosevelt)** joined Dave Williams on the 2010 preseason All-NEC team as chosen by the league's coaches. Bangura (first name pronounced TAY-moo) has played in 39 of 41 games over the past three seasons. The 6-3, 278-pounder, who has led the team in sacks in each of the past two seasons, leads the team with 11.5 career sacks. Bangura, who led all DU defensive linemen with 42 total tackles (15 solo) last season, has 21 career tackles for loss, including three at Robert Morris on Oct. 30.

**A WELCOME ADDITION:** **Dave Opfar**, who served as head coach at Saint Francis, Pa. for the past eight seasons, is in his first year as DU's defensive coordinator. This is the second stint on the Bluff for Opfar who began his college coaching career at Duquesne as the defensive line coach under Greg Gattuso in 1993. The McKeesport, Pa. native, who served on the Dukes' staff along with current head coach Jerry Schmitt (then the offensive coordinator), spent five years at Duquesne eventually serving as defensive coordinator for DU's 1996 MAAC championship team. Opfar inherited a defense that ranked 106th of 118 teams in rushing defense last season. The 2009 Dukes were dented for 376 yards per game (197 on the ground). The installation of Opfar's first edition of Duquesne defense was aided by the addition of two of his former assistants in LB/special teams **Michael Craig** and DB coach **Darnel Richardson**. The revamped DU defense got off to a promising start, holding Bucknell without an offensive touchdown and 178 yards overall in Duquesne's 17-13 season-opening win. In week two, the defense, despite giving up 374 yards, held Dayton to 10 second half points in a 35-31 win. On Sept. 25, the defense forced three turnovers in limiting Albany to 208 total yards in a 28-17 win. On Oct. 23, DU limited Wagner to three points of four Dukes turnovers.

### A STAFF WITH DEEP WESTERN PA. ROOTS:

Every coach on the Duquesne staff either played high school football in the Western Pennsylvania Interscholastic Athletic League (WPIAL) or at Duquesne University. The two coaches on the current staff who did not play high school ball in Western Pa., played collegiately at Duquesne (defensive backs coach Jeremy McCullough and running game coordinator/running backs coach Matt Stansfield). **A BIG YEAR FOR THE NEC:** The NEC learned in the spring of 2008 that it will gain automatic access to the Division I Football Championship beginning in 2010. The former bracket granted eight FCS leagues an automatic qualifier while awarding eight additional schools with at-large bids. The expanded format maintains the 1-to-1 ratio of automatic qualifiers and at-large teams at 10 and 10. In addition to the NEC, the Big South is championship eligible for the first time in 2010.

## DUQUESNE BY THE NUMBERS

1 . . . Number of Dukes currently in the National Football League. Cornerback Leigh Bodden, an All-American at DU from 1999-02, had his eighth NFL season - and second with the New England Patriots - cut short by a torn rotator cuff. Bodden, who was originally signed as an undrafted free agent by the Cleveland Browns on May 2, 2003, was placed on season-ending injured reserve in late August.

3.76 . . . Grade point average of ESPN Academic All-District 2 receiver Joe Cangilla. Cangilla, a mathematics/secondary education major, ranks second on the team with a 13.9 yards per catch average.

4.5 & 63.8 . . . Number of catches and yards per game Connor Dixon has averaged since making the move from quarterback to receiver in the eighth week of his junior season (63-893 in 14 g.). The 6-5 Dixon, a Michigan State transfer, threw for 429 yards and a school record six TDs in his first career start at QB at Bucknell on Sept. 6, 2008. Shoulder injuries forced his move to receiver. He is currently second on the team with 41 receptions for 560 yards and five TDs.

6 . . . Number of MAAC championship teams sixth-year head coach Jerry Schmitt was part of at Duquesne both as an assistant (1995, 1996 & 1999) and head coach (2005, 2006 & 2007).

9 . . . Number of career 100-yard rushing games posted by Larry McCoy. McCoy, who led the nation's FCS freshmen with a 73.4 yards per game rushing average, posted four 100-yard games last season. McCoy, who was named NEC Rookie of the Week three times, scored a school record-tying five touchdowns in DU's win at Sacred Heart in 2009. McCoy, bolstered by a career-high 246-yard day at CCSU, is averaging 113.1 ypg. in 2010. He has run for 100 or more in five of seven NEC games this season.

9.5 . . . Career average tackles per game (362 total, 192 solo in 38 g.) for senior linebacker Nathan Totino. Totino's average ranks seventh among active FCS players.

10 . . . Number of wins Duquesne has over Patriot League schools (all since 1999). No current or former MAAC, Pioneer League or Northeast Conference school has won more than five games versus teams from the Patriot League.

18 . . . Number of scholarships Duquesne granted in February of 2008 in conjunction with the school's move to the Northeast Conference as an associate football-playing member. The 2010 recruiting class is the third to receive scholarships. DU's scholarship total for football currently rests at 22.

26 . . . Total number of games missed by the trio expected to be the foundation of last year's receiving corps; WR Akeem Moore (nine games), FL Dave Williams (five games) and TE Sean Bunevich (season, 11 games). The three have combined for 84 catches and 12 touchdowns in the Dukes 10 games.

32 . . . Number of returning position players who started at least one game last season.

246 . . . Number of yards sophomore Larry McCoy rushed for at CCSU on Oct. 9. McCoy, who averaged 10.2 ypc., had runs of 51, 48 and 46 yards in posting the fifth-highest rushing total in school history. It ranks as the sixth-most yards gained by an FCS player in a game this season.

326 . . . Yards gained by Duquesne in its loss at then-#11 Delaware. DU is one of three teams to gain over 300 yards on the Blue Hens this season. Delaware, currently ranked No. 1 in the FCS by the Sports Network, ranks third nationally in total defense.

Bryant limited Duquesne to 133 yards in the second half in posting a 20-0 season-ending win over the Dukes at Rooney Field.

Duquesne finished with a 3-8 overall record, 2-6 in the Northeast Conference. Bryant ended its season at 4-7 overall and 4-4 in NEC play.

Bryant outgained the Duquesne 341-257 in shutting out the Dukes for the first time since a 24-0 loss at Albany in the 2002 ECAC Classic.

Kevin Rombach, who entered the game with four interceptions on the season, was picked off five times, including three on the Dukes' first four possessions.

Bryant was unable to capitalize on the early miscues, gaining just six yards on 12 plays in a scoreless first quarter.

Bryant's offense came to life early in the second quarter as the Bulldogs drove 65 yards only to be stopped on downs at the DU 22.

The Bulldogs had the best scoring chance of the scoreless first half, but Chris Bird's 35-yard field goal attempt hit the left upright with 1:19 left.

Bryant ended the scoring drought when Bird converted a 43-yard field goal with 7:41 to go in the third quarter. He added his second field goal of the quarter, a 36-yarder, with 3:46 to go to give the Bulldogs a 6-0 lead.

Rombach was picked off for the fourth time early in the fourth quarter by Michael Morgan who returned the ball 56 yards to the Duquesne 16. Michael Croce hit Matt Tracey with a touchdown pass on the next play to make it 13-0.

Rombach was picked off a fifth time, setting up a five-yard Lindsey Gamble touchdown with 2:19 left.

The Dukes drove to the Bryant one-yard line, looking to avoid the shutout, but Cleo Williams was hit hard on a dive play and fumbled. The ball was recovered by the Bulldogs.

Williams finished with 95 yards rushing in 17 carries in his final game.

Croce completed 18-of-35 passes for 208 yards for Bryant.

Bryant scored nine points in a 16-second span of the fourth quarter to break open a close game in handing Duquesne its fifth consecutive defeat by a 24-10 score in a non-conference game at Smithfield, R.I.

The win upped Bryant's record to 5-4, while the Dukes dropped to 2-6.

Bryant took an 18-10 lead on a 25 yard Brian Donnelly field goal with 5:51 remaining. On the next play from scrimmage, Cheyenne Ray stepped in front of a Connor Dixon pass and took it 29 yards for a score to put the game out of reach.

Bryant's starting backfield of Jerrell Smith and Lindsey Gamble combined for 223 rushing yards as Bryant outgained Duquesne 445-275.

Dixon completed 16-of-28 passes for 193 yards for Duquesne, however his two fourth-quarter interceptions led to Bryant's last two scores.

Smith had a game-high 129 yards rushing and Jay Graber completed 18-of-26 passes for 213 for Bryant.

Duquesne got on the board first when Mark Troyan capped a 10 play, 71 yard game-opening drive with a 24-yard field goal.

Neither team scored until Bryant took advantage of a short field to drive 44 yards - the last 15 coming on a run by Mike Canfora - to take a 6-3 lead with 23 seconds left in the half.

The Bulldogs scored on their first possession of the second half when Donnelly finished a 75 yard drive with a 19-yard field goal.

Duquesne answered with a 54-yard Dixon to Alex Roberson touchdown pass to take a 10-9 lead with 4:44 left in the third quarter.

Smith broke off a 49 yard run on Bryant's next play to move the ball into Duquesne territory, but the Dukes held on downs to preserve the lead. Bryant then mounted a 79 yard drive that ended with a 29 yard Gamble run. Duquesne stopped the Bulldogs' bid for a two-point conversion to make it 15-10 Bryant with 12:14 left in the game.

Paul Polomski picked off a Dixon pass at the Bryant 43 and the Bulldogs drove to the Duquesne eight before settling for a 25 yard Donnelly field goal to make it 18-10 with 5:51 remaining.

On the ensuing play, Ray put the game out of reach with his 29-yard touchdown return.

## GAME #1

DUQUESNE 17, BUCKNELL 13

partly cloudy, wind gusting 18 to 28 mph at kickoff - 68 degrees

Sophomore quarterback Sean Patterson ran for a touchdown and threw for another and the Duquesne defense held Bucknell to 70 second-half yards as the Dukes defeated the Bison 17-13 at Rooney Field.

It was the second-straight season opening win for Duquesne over Bucknell, marking first time since 1933 & 1934 that the Dukes have defeated the Bison in back-to-back years.

Patterson completed 13-of-24 passes for 159 yards and added 30 more on the ground in his third career start. Larry McCoy ran for 81 yards on 20 carries for Duquesne which outgained Bucknell 267-178.

Nathan Totino led the DU defensive charge with a game-high 13 tackles (10 solo).

Brandon Wesley threw for 81 yards and rushed for 48 for Bucknell.

Duquesne went 45 yards in four plays on its first possession with Patterson scoring from eight yards out to make it a 7-0 lead less than four minutes into the game. A 22-yard run by McCoy set up Patterson's touchdown.

The Dukes looked sharp early, outgaining the Bison 108-32 in the first quarter.

Drew Orth got Bucknell on the board when he capped a 19-play, nine minute drive with a 22-yard field goal with 8:29 left in the second quarter.

The first half ended with the Dukes up 7-3.

Alex Inda ended Bucknell's first drive of the second half with a forced fumble that was recovered by DU's Serge Kona at the Bucknell 20. Eric Duale booted a 29-yard field goal to put the Dukes up 10-3 less than five minutes into the second half.

The Duquesne lead was short-lived, as Tyler Smith returned the ensuing kickoff 89 yards for Bucknell's lone touchdown to make it 10-10 with just under 10 minutes left in the third quarter.

DU answered with a 74-yard drive capped by a nine-yard pass from Patterson to Dave Williams who beat a pair of Bison to the pylon in the corner of the end zone to make it 17-10.

Orth kicked a 36-yard field goal with 9:41 left to pull the Bison within four at 17-13.

Derrick Lakins stopped Wesley on fourth-and-two at the Duquesne 39 with 1:18 left to seal the win.

Lakins also added a sack and Zach Richert added 1.5 sacks and five tackles as Duquesne held Bucknell to 16 yards in the third quarter and 54 in the fourth.

DUQUESNE 35, DAYTON 31

Sean Patterson hit Sean Bunevich with an eight-yard touchdown pass with 21 seconds left to give Duquesne a dramatic 35-31 win over Dayton at Rooney Field.

The Dukes took over on their 34 with 1:18 left after Dayton's Steve Valentino gave the Flyers a 31-28 lead on a 26-yard pass to Justin Watkins.

Patterson, who was 27-of-40 for 326 yards and three TDs on the afternoon, completed 5-of-7 passes for 57 yards on the winning drive.

Patterson's effort overshadowed a 22-of-32, 248-yard, three touchdown performance by Valentino.

Valentino took the Flyers 56 yards on five plays to open the scoring with a five-yard touchdown pass to Nick Collins just over four minutes into the game.

Duquesne answered with a four-yard Larry McCoy touchdown run to tie it at 7-7. Patterson completed 6-of-8 passes to four different receivers in the 72-yard drive.

Dayton converted a Patterson interception into a score when Valentino found Collins again, this time from six yards out, to make it 14-7.

Valentino passed and ran for 69 of 75 yards - including a 9-yard touchdown run - to cap an 11-play drive that put Dayton up 21-7 with 4:37 left in the half.

The Dukes answered with a pair of Patterson touchdown passes in the final 2:45 to tie it at 21-21 at the half.

First, Patterson found a streaking Akeem Moore down the right sideline from 31 yards out to pull the Dukes within seven. Then, following a Dayton punt, he drove the Dukes 66 yards in seven plays before finding Dixon in the left corner of the end zone from 13 yards out on the final play of the half.

Dayton turned a botched Duquesne punt into a 27-yard Nick Glavin field goal to retake the lead at 24-21. The Flyers took over at the DU 34 after a punt snap sailed over punter Charlie Leventry's head, resulting in a minus-four yard boot.

Valentino hit Collins for a gain of 16 yards before Devin Duggan popped the ball loose and Nathan Totino pounced on it at the Duquesne 47. McCoy nearly single-handedly turned the turnover into a score, carrying on seven of eight plays, the last a four-yard touchdown, to make it 28-24 Duquesne with 2:28 left in the third quarter.

Valentino drove the Flyers 80 yards in 11 plays before hitting Watkins with a 26-yard touchdown pass with 1:24 left to set up Patterson's heroics.

Duquesne outgained Dayton 461-374 and enjoyed a 25-21 edge in first downs.

Nathan Totino led the Duquesne defense with eight tackles. Garrett Heron added seven solo stops for the Dukes. Thaimu Bangura added a sack and Serge Kona and Zach Richert combined on a second sack for DU.

No. 11/12 (Sports Network/AFCA) Delaware, playing without pre-season All-American starting quarterback Pat Devlin who was out with a fractured wrist, turned to the ground game to defeat Duquesne 30-6 at Delaware Stadium.

Leading the charge for the Blue Hens was Andrew Pierce who set a Delaware freshman record with 200 yards on 16 carries. Pierce scored on touchdown runs of one and 33 yards.

Duquesne, playing its first road game of the season, dropped to 2-1. Delaware moved to 3-0.

Delaware, with freshman quarterback Trevor Sasek making his first career start, finished with 373 of its 448 yards on the ground. The Blue Hens attempted just nine passes.

Duquesne, which finished with 326 total yards, drove inside the Delaware 15 three times, but came away with just three points against a UD defense that has yet to give up a touchdown this season.

The win was the first for the Hawks (1-3, 1-0), who were playing their Northeast Conference opener. Duquesne dropped to 3-2 overall and 1-1 in conference play.

Kyle Frazier completed 15-of-29 passes for 232 yards and a touchdown to lead Monmouth which recorded a school record six interceptions.

A valiant comeback by Duquesne ended with a failed two-point conversion as Central Connecticut hung on for a 31-29 win over the Dukes at Arute Field.

The win was the school record 12th in a row at home for the Blue Devils who moved to 4-2 overall and 3-0 in the NEC. The loss dropped Duquesne to 3-3 overall and 1-2 in conference play.

The Dukes scored two touchdowns in the final 2:07, the last of which was a five-yard pass from Sean Patterson to Dave Williams on fourth-and-goal on the final play of the game.
