Dick Butkus remains the standard to which all linebackers are compared. He played two All-America seasons in 1963 and 1964 before enjoying a Hall of Fame career with the Chicago Bears, where he was a six-time All-Pro selection. Butkus finished third in the 1964 Heisman Trophy voting and has college football's annual award for the outstanding collegiate linebacker named after him. He had his jersey, No. 50, retired at Illinois in 1986, joining Red Grange as the only two Illinois football players to have their numbers retired. Butkus helped lead the Fighting Illini to a 1964 Rose Bowl victory over Washington. He earned first-team All-Big Ten honors twice and was awarded the 1963 Silver Football Award as the Big Ten's Most Valuable Player. Butkus finished his career with 374 tackles. His 145 stops in 1963 stood as the school record until 1976. He was named the 1964 Player of the Year by the American Football Coaches Association.

Butkus was named to the Big Ten Diamond Anniversary Team in 1970, The Sporting News College Coaches All-Time Team, the Walter Camp All-Century Team and the University of Illinois All-Century Team. He was elected to the Pro Football Hall of Fame in 1979 and to the College Football Hall of Fame in 1983.

77 "RED" GRANGE

1923-25 • HALFBACK

NUMBER RETIRED IN 1925

BORN: JUNE 13, 1903 // DIED: JANUARY 28, 1991

Harold E. "Red" Grange is one of football's all-time greats, and arguably the game's greatest all-time offensive player. He is a charter member of the Pro (1963) and College (1951) Football Halls of Fame. Grange's most memorable performance came Oct. 18, 1924, when he scored four touchdowns in the first 12 minutes vs. Michigan in the Memorial Stadium dedication game. Later in the same game, he ran for a fifth touchdown and threw for a sixth. Nicknamed the "Wheaton Iceman" and "Galloping Ghost," he left Illinois to play pro football with the Chicago Bears under former Fighting Illini George Halas. He was an All-American in each of his three seasons with Illinois and won the 1924 Silver Football Award as the Big Ten's Most Valuable Player, the first recipient of the award. He was named to The Sporting News All-Time Team, the Big Ten Diamond Anniversary Team, the Walter Camp All-Century Team and the UI All-Century Team.

BUTKUS AWARD

Symbolic of the nation's top collegiate linebacker, the Butkus Award is named after former University of Illinois All-American linebacker Dick Butkus. It has been presented annually since 1985 to the nation's top collegiate linebacker by the Downtown Athletic Club of Orlando.

Considered the greatest linebacker in the history of football, Butkus was a two-time All-America selection in 1963 and 1964. He earned the Silver Football Award in 1963 as the Big Ten's Most Valuable Player after leading the Illini to the Big Ten championship. Butkus moved on to a Hall of Fame career with the Chicago Bears, where he was a six-time All-Pro selection. Butkus finished third in the 1964 Heisman Trophy voting and had his number, 50, retired at Illinois in 1986 and his professional jersey, No. 51, retired in Chicago in 1994.

Butkus helped lead the Illini to a 1964 Rose Bowl victory over Washington and was a two-time first-team All-Big Ten selection as a linebacker and center. He finished his Illinois career with 373 tackles and was the 1964 National Player of the Year, as selected by the American Football Coaches Association.

Butkus was selected to the Pro Football Hall of Fame in 1979, the College Football Hall of Fame in 1983 and the Rose Bowl Hall of Fame in 1995.

In 1994 and 1995, the Butkus Award returned to its Orange and Blue roots with back-to-back Illini recipients in Dana Howard (1994) and Kevin Hardy (1995). Howard was the Big Ten's leading tackler and a three-time All-Big Ten selection. Hardy exploded onto the national scene as a senior, earning All-America honors in every major publication and All-Big Ten honors for the second consecutive season.

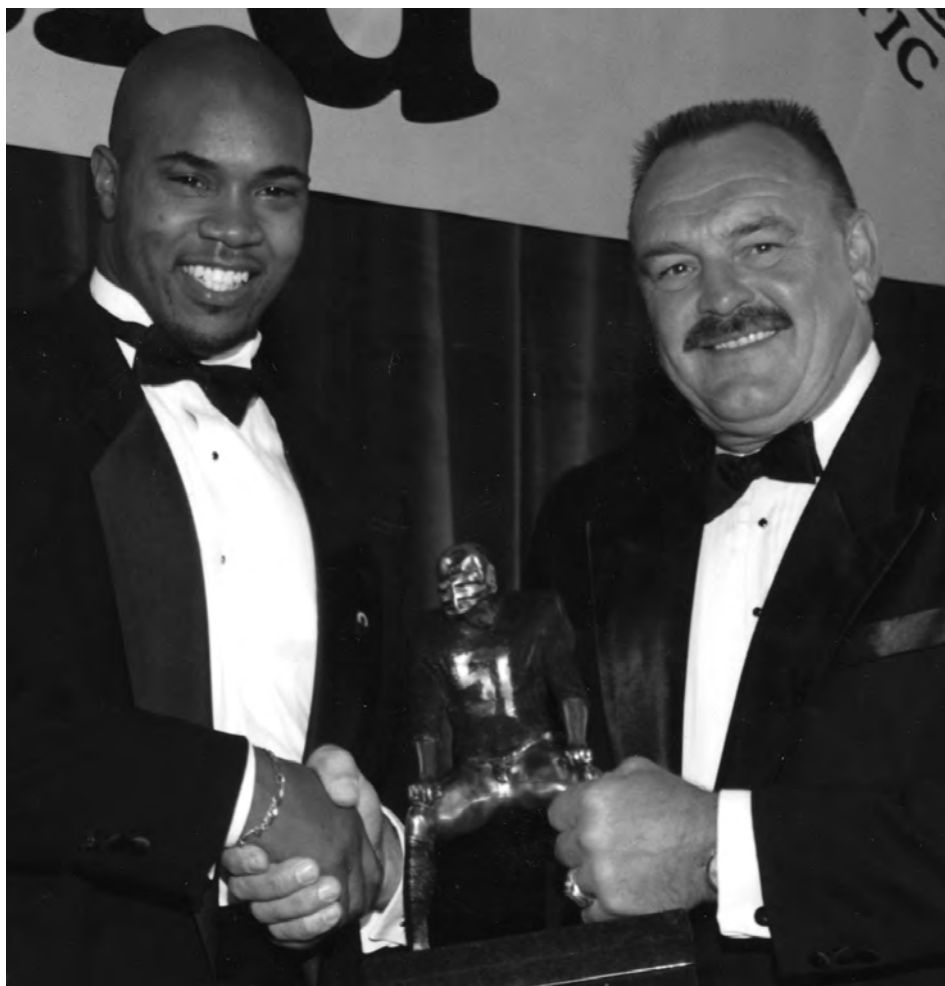

ALEX AGASE
 (INDUCTED IN 1963)

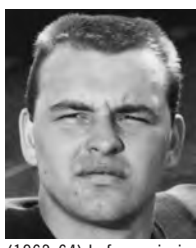
An All-America guard at Illinois in 1942 and '46, he holds the rare distinction of earning All-America honors at another school (Purdue) in 1943 while in the Army. He also was selected to Walter Camp Foundation's All-Century Team in 1989. Agase enjoyed a lengthy Big Ten coaching career, first as a head coach at Northwestern from 1964-1972 and Purdue from 1973-1976. He was also a volunteer assistant coach at Michigan in charge of special teams from 1982-1987. Agase also served as athletic director at Eastern Michigan University from 1977-1982. He is now retired and living in Tarpon Springs, Fla.


BOB BLACKMAN
 (INDUCTED IN 1987)

Blackman served as Illinois' head football coach from 1971-76, compiling a 29-36-1 record. During his six seasons at Illinois, Blackman coached future NFL stars Scott Studwell, Larry McCarren and Revie Sorey, as well as All-Americans Tab Bennett and Dan Beaver. Before heading the Illinois program, Blackman enjoyed great success at Dartmouth College, where he compiled a 104-37-3 record in 16 seasons. In 15 years of official Ivy League competition, Blackman's Dartmouth Indians were 79-24-2, won four league championships outright, shared three other championships, had three perfect 9-0 seasons (1962, 1965, 1970) and won two Lambert Trophies, symbolic of supremacy in Eastern college football. He served as chairman of the selection committee for the annual East/West Shrine Game. Blackman passed away in March of 2000.


AL BROSKY
 (INDUCTED IN 1998)

Brosky piled up staggering numbers that still stand in the NCAA record book. He holds the NCAA record for career interceptions with 29, consecutive games with an interception (15) and most interceptions per game (1.07) in his career. His remarkable interception streak spanned parts of three seasons from 1950-52, also including a theft in a 16th game, the 1952 Rose Bowl. His records have stood up through 50 years and the revolution in the passing game in college football. Brosky intercepted 30 passes in just 28 games, including the 1952 Rose Bowl, in his three-year UI career and was also an outstanding punt returner. Brosky, who played at Illinois from 1950-52, led the Fighting Illini to a three-year mark of 20-7-1, including the 1951 Big Ten title, an undefeated 9-0-1 record and a 40-7 victory over Stanford in the 1952 Rose Bowl. The Illini, under coach Ray Eliot, were ranked third in the final UPI poll in 1951, the highest finish for a UI squad since the 1927 national championship. Illinois also posted a 7-2 (No. 11) mark in


 1954. Brosky resides in Naperville, Ill.
DICK BUTKUS
 (INDUCTED IN 1983)

Butkus remains the standard to which all linebackers are compared. He played two All-America seasons at Illinois (1963-64) before enjoying a Hall of Fame career with the Chicago Bears, where he was a six-time All-Pro selection. In 1964 he finished third in the Heisman Trophy balloting to Notre Dame's John Huarte. College football's annual award for the outstanding collegiate linebacker is appropriately named after Butkus and is awarded each year by the Downtown Athletic Club of Orlando, Fla. Butkus and Red Grange are the only players to have their numbers retired at Illinois. Butkus' No. 50 was retired during halftime of the Illinois-Nebraska game, Sept. 20, 1986. He was also honored on the 1989 Walter Camp Foundation All-Century team and is a member of the Rose Bowl Hall of Fame. Butkus is now enjoying a successful acting and entertainment career and resides with his family in Malibu, Calif.


CHUCK CARNEY
 (INDUCTED IN 1966)

Tall, slender and sure-handed, Carney was an All-America receiver at Illinois in 1920. One of Head Coach Bob Zuppke's favorite targets, the coach once instructed one of his quarterbacks to "bombard passes in Carney's direction." After leaving Illinois, Carney served as the end coach at Northwestern, Wisconsin and Harvard. He is also the only Illinois athlete to earn All-America honors in both football (1920) and basketball (1920 & 22). Carney died in 1984.


J.C. CAROLINE
 (INDUCTED IN 1980)

Caroline led the nation in rushing as a sophomore in 1953 with 1,256 yards in just nine games and was named an All-American. He was called "the best all-around athlete I ever had in 26 years of coaching," by his head coach Ray Eliot. He led the Fighting Illini in rushing again in 1954 before entering the Canadian Football League, and later spent 10 seasons in the NFL with the Chicago Bears. Caroline lives in Champaign, Ill., and is retired from his longtime career as a physical education instructor at the Urbana Middle School.

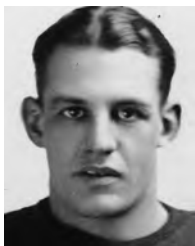

PETE ELLIOTT
 (INDUCTED IN 1993)

After a distinguished collegiate playing career at the University of Michigan, Elliott went on to have a long collegiate coaching career and helped lead Illinois to the 1963 Big Ten title and a 1964 Rose Bowl victory. A native of Bloomington, Ill., Elliott graduated from Michigan in 1949 after quarterbacking the Wolverines to undefeated seasons in 1947 and 1948, winning the 1948 Rose Bowl and earning a national championship in his senior season. After assistant coaching stints at Oregon State and Oklahoma, Elliott was the head coach at Nebraska and California, where he led the Bears to Pasadena in 1959. Elliott became the head coach of Illinois in 1960 and stayed for seven seasons, coaching the likes of Dick Butkus and Jim Grabowski. He compiled a record of 31-34-1 while at Illinois. Elliott went on to serve as athletic director and head coach at the University of Miami and assistant coach of the NFL's St. Louis Cardinals. He also has been inducted into the University of Michigan Sports Hall of Fame, the State of Michigan Sports Hall of Fame, the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame and the State of Illinois Basketball Hall of Fame. Elliott is the retired executive director of the Pro Football Hall of Fame and resides in Canton, Ohio.


JIM GRABOWSKI
 (INDUCTED IN 1995)

By the time Jim Grabowski left Illinois, he was the all-time leading rusher in Big Ten history with 2,878 career yards. A bruising fullback, Grabowski was named an Associated Press All-American in 1964 and 1965. He was named the 1964 Rose Bowl MVP after leading Illinois to a 17-7 victory over Washington by rushing for 125 yards. Besides his All-America honor in 1965, Grabowski also was named the Back of the Year by the Washington Touchdown Club and the Co-Player of the Year by The Sporting News. He finished third in the Heisman Trophy voting in 1965. After graduating with a finance degree in 1966, he was the first-round draft pick of the Green Bay Packers and played in the NFL for six years with the Packers and the Chicago Bears. An excellent student-athlete, Grabowski earned GTE Academic All-America honors in 1964 and 1965 and was inducted into the GTE Academic All-America Hall of Fame in 1993. In 1997, Grabowski was inducted into the Rose Bowl Hall of Fame. A native of Chicago, Ill., Grabowski currently resides in Inverness, Ill., where he is vice president of Great Lakes Telecommunications. He is also beginning his 27th season as the color analyst on the Illini Sports Network.

COLLEGE FOOTBALL HALL OF FAME


**HAROLD E.
"RED" GRANGE**
(INDUCTED IN 1951)

As its first legitimate "star," Grange is credited with establishing the popularity of professional football. At 5-foot-10-inches and 170 pounds,

Grange was a three-time consensus All-America halfback at Illinois from 1923-25. After his final game at Illinois, Grange signed with the Chicago Bears, owned by Illinois alumnus George Halas. During an age when professional football rarely saw crowds of more than a few thousand, Grange attracted 36,000 spectators for his pro debut on Thanksgiving Day at Wrigley Field; 10 days later 73,000 watched him play at New York's Polo Grounds. In addition to his feats as a halfback, Grange is sixth on Illinois' all-time career interception list with 11; seventh in career punt return yardage; and possessed amazing average-yards-per-carry statistics in interceptions (22.5), pass receptions (18.1) and kickoff returns (30.2). He is also a charter member of both the college and pro football Halls of Fame. Grange's legendary No. 77 was retired after the completion of his final game at Illinois, Nov. 21, 1925. Grange is a member of the Camp Foundation's All-Century team. He died Jan. 28, 1991.


EDWARD K. HALL
(INDUCTED IN 1951)

Hall became the third coach in Illinois history, coaching from 1892-93. He compiled a 12-5-5 record. It is Hall's off-field contributions to the game of football that earned him his

recognition. He is credited with proposing and writing the first football code for the proper conduct of its players. In an age when the game was often brutal and reckless, Hall's code was adopted and later appeared in the Official Football Guide. Hall is also known for putting the 1892 Illinois team through the most grueling schedule ever thrust upon a college football team. The Fighting Illini, with only 18 players, played six games in just eight days, in three states. Illinois went 4-2 on the trip and finished Hall's first season with a 9-3-2 record. No Illinois team has ever played more games in one season. At the time of his death in 1932, William Bingham, Harvard's athletic director, said, "If Walter Camp was the father of American Football, certainly E.K. Hall was the 'savior' of the game."


BART MACOMBER
(INDUCTED IN 1972)

Macomber joined All-American Harold Pogue in the backfield to lead Illinois and second-year Head Coach Bob Zuppke to their first national championship in 1914. That team shut out its first four opponents, and allowed

just 22 total points during a perfect 7-0 season. Macomber had also played for Zuppke as a prep at Oak Park High School. The following year, Macomber earned All-America honors as a halfback, and he was captain of the 1916 team. He was a versatile athlete who could play every backfield position, and did a majority of the team's kicking. Macomber died in 1971.


BERNIE SHIVELY
(INDUCTED IN 1982)

"Red" Grange was led to many of his spectacular scores by an agile, athletic guard who was so quick and powerful for his size that he wrestled for the Big Ten heavyweight championship in 1926. He lost the bout, however, after wrestling George Fisher of Indiana to a draw during regulation and then losing the coin toss to decide the champion. Shively earned All-America honors as a guard in 1926. He joined the University of Kentucky's staff as an assistant football coach, before being named that school's athletic director in 1938, a post he held until his death in 1967.


DAVID WILLIAMS
(INDUCTED IN 2005)

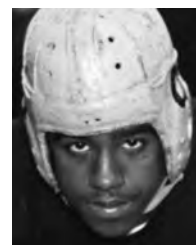
Illinois' all-time leading receiver, David Williams finished his collegiate career as the second-leading receiver in NCAA history. He was a two-time unanimous First-Team All-American. In 1984, he led the

nation with 101 receptions, becoming only the second player in NCAA history to surpass the 100-reception mark. He was twice named First-Team All-Big Ten and led Illinois to a conference title in 1983. He currently works in sales and lives in Gardena, Calif.


**GEORGE W.
WOODRUFF**
(INDUCTED IN 1963)

Woodruff coached the University of Pennsylvania in its greatest days of college football. He compiled a 124-15-2 record from 1892-1901 at Penn. His

1897 Pennsylvania team was a perfect 15-0 and was recognized as national champions. Woodruff coached one season at Illinois, compiling a record of 8-6 in 1903. He died in 1934.


**CLAUDE "BUDDY"
YOUNG**
(INDUCTED IN 1968)

In a college career split by the armed services, the 5-foot-5-inch halfback earned All-America honors in 1944. Young

scored 13 touchdowns in his All-America year, while rushing for 842 yards with an amazing 8.9 yards-per-carry average. He rushed for 103 yards in Illinois' 45-14 upset of unbeaten UCLA in the 1947 Rose Bowl and was selected as the game's MVP. A world-class sprinter, Young enjoyed a lengthy pro football career and served as an assistant commissioner in the NFL. He died in an automobile accident in 1983. He was inducted into the Rose Bowl Hall of Fame in 1993.


ROBERT ZUPPKE
(INDUCTED IN 1951)

Hired by Athletic Director George Huff as head football coach in 1913, Zuppke held the position for 29 years, the longest tenure of any Illinois head coach. An

innovator and trend-setter, Zuppke established many of the current traditions and styles of football today. He is credited with inventing several different formations, the flea-flicker, the huddle and spring practice. He also recruited and coached "Red" Grange, considered by many as the greatest player in football history. In all, Zuppke won four national titles (1914, 1919, 1923, 1927), seven conference championships and compiled a record of 131-81-13. The playing field at Memorial Stadium is named after him and is identified by a large stone engraving under the scoreboard in the north end zone. Zuppke died in 1957.

CONSENSUS ALL-AMERICANS



RALPH "SLOUIE" CHAPMAN

GUARD, 1914

Chapman joined teammate Perry Graves as consensus All-America selections on Walter Camp's All-America squad.

Chapman played guard on Head Coach Bob Zuppke's 1914 national championship squad. A quick, aggressive 180-pound standout, Chapman came to Illinois from Washington, D.C., and earned three letters in football, was wounded in World War I, entered the brokerage business in Chicago and served as vice president of the UI Foundation. He died in 1969 at age 77.



JOHN DEPLER

CENTER, 1918

Depler earned All-America honors in 1918, 1919 and 1920 and was a consensus pick in 1918. A native of Lewistown, Ill., Depler anchored an offensive line that included All-America picks Burt Ingwersen, Albert

Mohr and Clarence Applegran and helped lead Illinois to its second national championship in 1919. Depler went on to found the Brooklyn Dodgers professional football team and coached eight years at Columbia. He died in 1970 at age 71.



HAROLD E. "RED" GRANGE

HALFBACK, 1923-25

The greatest running back in history, Grange revolutionized the game and became one of the greatest sport celebrities of the

20th century. A charter member of both the college and professional Halls of Fame, Grange was the initial winner of the *Chicago Tribune's* Silver Football Award and received the Toomey Trophy in 1924, the precursor of the Heisman Trophy, presented to college football's best player. Nicknamed the "Wheaton Iceman" as a tribute to his summer job and workout regimen in his hometown, Grange's famed "77" jersey was immediately retired after his last college game in 1925 and he took his worldwide popularity to the fledgling National Football League and George Halas' Chicago Bears, singlehandedly lending credibility and popularity to the pro game. Grange is a member of the Camp Foundation's All-Century team. He passed away Jan. 28, 1991, at age 87.



PERRY GRAVES

END, 1914

A two-year letterman for Bob Zuppke at end, the 148-pound Graves helped lead the 1914 Illini to a perfect 7-0 record and a shared national championship with Army. The Rockford native

was a two-sport star, also playing infield for George Huff's Big Ten champion baseball squad. Graves joined teammate Ralph "Slouie" Chapman as 1914 consensus All-America selections. Graves went on to serve as a Big Ten football official for 22 years and died in 1979 at age 89.



CHUCK CARNEY

END, 1920

One of the greatest athletes in Illinois history, Carney is the only Illini athlete to earn All-America honors in football and basketball, including consensus All-America accolades as an end

in 1920. Carney was a receiver for Coach Bob Zuppke from 1918 to 1921. On the hardwood, Carney set a Western Conference scoring record that stood for 22 years and earned All-America honors in 1920 and 1922. The Evanston native went on to coach football at Northwestern, Wisconsin and Harvard and was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame in 1966 after a long investment career on the New York Stock Exchange. Carney died in 1984 at age 84.



BERNIE SHIVELY

GUARD, 1926

A three-sport star at Illinois, Shively earned consensus All-America honors as a quick, agile guard in football following the 1926 season. The Paris, Ill.

native won eight varsity letters at Illinois from 1924-26, battling to a draw in the 1926 Big Ten heavyweight wrestling championship and competing in the hammer throw in track and field. Shively joined the University of Kentucky staff as an assistant coach in 1927 and was eventually promoted to athletic director in 1938, a position he held for the next 30 years. Shively died in 1967 at age 64 and was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame in 1982.



BART MACOMBER

HALFBACK, 1915

Halfback Macomber teamed with backfield mates Harold Pogue and George "Potsy" Clark to help Illinois win a national title in 1914 as a sophomore before earning consensus All-America honors in 1915 and All-

America honors as the captain of the 1916 Fighting Illini. The rugged Macomber played halfback for two seasons before switching to quarterback for his senior campaign. The Oak Park graduate played all three backfield positions and handled kicking duties. Macomber passed away in 1971 and was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame in 1972.



JIM MCMILLEN

GUARD, 1923

The rugged McMillen earned All-America honors in 1922 as a guard before earning consensus accolades opening holes for the legendary Red Grange on the 1923 national championship

squad. McMillen was a native of Grayslake and played left guard from 1921-23, serving as captain on the undefeated 8-0 1923 squad as a senior. He passed away on Jan. 19, 1984.



ALEX AGASE

GUARD, 1946

Joining Dick Butkus and Red Grange on the Camp Foundation All-Century team selected in 1990, Agase was a three-time All-America selection at Illinois

and Purdue. He earned *Chicago Tribune* Silver Football Most Valuable Player honors following the 1946 season when he helped lead Coach Ray Eliot's Big Ten champions to a 45-14 Rose Bowl victory over UCLA. Agase went on to a long professional playing career with Chicago, Cleveland, and Baltimore before serving as head coach at Northwestern and Purdue. The Evanston native was selected to the College Football Hall of Fame in 1963 and is now retired and living in Tarpon Springs, Florida.

CONSENSUS ALL-AMERICANS



JOHNNY KARRAS HALFBACK, 1951

"The Argo Ex-press" came to Illinois in 1946 as a freshman, then spent 18 months in the Army. When he returned as a sophomore in 1949, Karras exploded on the scene with seven touchdowns, 826 yards rushing and a 6.5 yards per carry average. He led the Illini in rushing in 1950 and 1951 as Illinois went 16-3-1, winning the 1952 Rose Bowl over Stanford. Karras was a 1951 consensus All-American after gaining 716 yards and scoring a UI-record 13 touchdowns as Illinois went 9-0-1 to win the Big Ten title and earn a No. 3 final national ranking.



J.C. CAROLINE HALFBACK, 1953

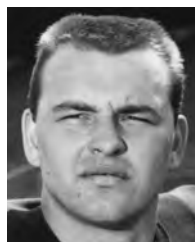
As a sophomore in 1953, Caroline led the nation in rushing and shattered the Big Ten-record with 1,256 yards on just 194 carries, enjoying six 100-yard performances, including 205 yards against Minnesota and 192 against Ohio State. Caroline earned consensus All-America honors, leading Illinois to an undefeated 7-0-1 record, a No. 7 national ranking and Coach Ray Eliot's last Big Ten title. Caroline was seventh in the Heisman Trophy balloting in 1953. After battling through injuries as a junior, the Columbia, S.C., native went on to the Canadian Football League and a 10-year all-pro career as a defensive back with the NFL's Chicago Bears. Caroline was an assistant coach under Jim Valek and Bob Blackman from 1967-76 and was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame in 1980.



BILL BURRELL GUARD, 1959

Burrell finished fourth in balloting for the 1959 Heisman Trophy and was the nation's top defensive player, earning consensus All-America honors in Coach Ray Eliot's final season.

The Chebanse, Ill.-native was a two-time All-America selection, a three-time first-team All-Big Ten selection and received the *Chicago Tribune* Silver Football Award as the Big Ten's Most Valuable Player in 1959. One of the greatest defensive players in Illinois and Big Ten history, Burrell went on to a successful career in real estate in Rockford. He passed away in March of 1998 and is currently on the ballot for election to the College Football Hall of Fame.



DICK BUTKUS LINEBACKER/CENTER, 1963-64

The greatest linebacker in history, Butkus is one of four Illinois players in history to earn consensus All-America honors in two seasons, receiving the awards in 1963 and 1964. Butkus played center on offense and linebacker on defense for Coach Pete Elliott, leading the Illini to the 1963 Big Ten title and a Rose Bowl victory over Washington. Butkus was named the 1963 *Chicago Tribune* Silver Football Most Valuable Player and finished third in the 1964 Heisman Trophy balloting. Butkus went on to a seven-year Hall of Fame career with the NFL's Chicago Bears. The Chicago native was named to the College Football Hall of Fame in 1983. His Illinois jersey, No. 50, was retired in 1986 and he was named to the Camp Foundation All-Century team in 1989. The nation's top collegiate linebacker receives the "Butkus Award." Butkus has gone on to a successful acting and entertainment career.



JIM GRABOWSKI FULLBACK, 1965

Grabowski finished his Illinois career as the all-time Big Ten rushing leader with 2,878 yards. A punishing runner, Grabowski was third in the Heisman Trophy balloting in 1965 after finishing second in the nation with 1,258 yards. A two-time Academic All-America selection and the 1965 Big Ten Medal of Honor and Silver Football Award winner recipient, Grabowski went on to a six-year NFL career with the Green Bay Packers and Chicago Bears, playing in two Super Bowls for Coach Vince Lombardi. Grabowski was inducted into the Rose Bowl Hall of Fame, honoring his 125-yard MVP effort in Illinois' 17-7 victory over Washington in the 1964 Rose Bowl. Grabowski was inducted into the GTE Academic All-America Hall of Fame in 1993 and the College Football Hall of Fame in 1995. Grabowski runs his own telecommunications company in suburban Chicago and has been a color analyst for Illini football games for 26 years.



DAVID WILLIAMS RECEIVER, 1984-85

Williams was quarterback Jack Trudeau's favorite target for three seasons, catching a UI-record 262 passes for 3,392 yards and 24 touchdowns. A native of Los Angeles, Williams finished his career as the second-leading receiver in college football history and caught a record 101 passes in 1984. Williams helped the Illini to the 1983 Big Ten title, catching 69 passes for 958 yards. One of three Williams brothers to play receiver for Illinois, he went on to play with

Tampa Bay and the Los Angeles Raiders in the National Football League and seven years in the Canadian Football League. He was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame in Dec. 2005.



MOE GARDNER NOSETACKLE, 1989-90

A two-time consensus All-America selection, Gardner was the anchor of a defensive unit that helped Illinois win 10 games in 1989 and earn a share of the Big Ten title in 1990. The Indianapolis native made 316 tackles in his four-year UI career and also recorded a then-record 57 tackles for loss. Gardner was named to the Illinois All-Century team in 1990 as an active player and played with the Atlanta Falcons from 1991-96.



DANA HOWARD LINEBACKER, 1994

Howard set the Big Ten record for career tackles with 595 stops and earned consensus All-America honors as a senior in 1994. The East St. Louis native became the first UI football player to earn a major national award when he was named the 1994 Butkus Award recipient. A model of consistency, Howard made 147 tackles in 1991, 150 in 1992 and 1994 and 148 stops in 1993. He played with the St. Louis Rams in 1995 and spent two seasons with the Chicago Bears from 1996-97.



KEVIN HARDY LINEBACKER, 1995

Hardy followed in former teammate Dana Howard's footsteps, earning the Butkus Award as the nation's top college linebacker in 1995. The Evansville, Ind., native made 105 tackles in 1995, joining Simeon Rice to form college football's top linebacker duo and cementing Illinois' reputation as "Linebacker U." Hardy made 326 tackles in his Illinois career, including 38 tackles for loss. He was chosen by Jacksonville as the No. 2 pick in the 1996 NFL draft.

CONSENSUS SELECTIONS

In 1950, the National Collegiate Athletic Bureau (the NCAA's service bureau) compiled the first official comprehensive roster of all-time All-Americans.

The compilation of the All-America roster was supervised by a panel of analysts working in large part with the historical records contained in the files of the Dr. Baker Football Information Service.

The roster consists of only those players who were first-team selections on one or more of the All-America teams that were selected for the national audience and received nationwide circulation.

Not included in the NCAA's list are the thousands of players who received All-America mention on second or third teams, nor the numerous others who were selected by newspapers or agencies with circulations that were not primarily national and with viewpoints, therefore, that were not normally nationwide in scope.

NCAA AWARD OF VALOR

Awarded only five times since 1974, the Award of Valor is presented to a coach, administrator, or current or former varsity letterwinner who, when confronted with a situation involving personal danger, averted or minimized potential disaster by courageous action or noteworthy bravery. In 1982, former Fighting Illini football player Timothy J. McCarthy '71 was presented the award for his actions in the assassination attempt of President Ronald Reagan on March 30, 1981. McCarthy served as a secret service agent and was wounded in the line of duty. In that same incident, another UI graduate, presidential press secretary James Brady, was also wounded.

NCAA SILVER ANNIVERSARY AWARD

This award is given annually to six distinguished former student-athletes on their silver anniversary (25th) as college graduates. In 1990, Illinois great Dick Butkus '65 was presented the award along with a group that included Dr. Donald Baxter (basketball, Mercer University), Paul Bucha (swimming, U.S. Military Academy), Dr. Archie Roberts (baseball, Columbia University) and Roger Staubach (football, U.S. Naval Academy). Following his career at Illinois, Butkus earned Pro Football Hall of Fame honors with the Chicago Bears and also has distinguished himself as a sports commentator and actor.

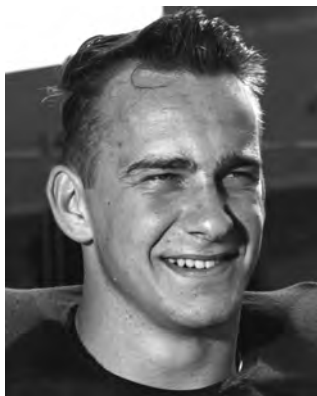
ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICA HALL OF FAME

Jim Grabowski was among four former college student-athletes inducted into the GTE Academic All-America Hall of Fame April 22, 1993. The other inductees were football's Raymond Berry and Dave Casper, and basketball's Kermit Washington.

To be eligible for the GTE Academic All-America Hall of Fame, an athlete must have been a GTE Academic All-America team member with a cumulative grade-point average of 3.0 (4.0 scale). In addition, his/her class must have been graduated for at least 10 years. Academic All-America Hall of Fame members must have attained high achievements in their chosen professions and have made substantial contributions to their communities.

Grabowski was a two-time consensus All-American who, as a sophomore, was the MVP of the 1964 Rose Bowl. He placed third in the balloting for the Heisman Trophy as a senior in 1965. He graduated as a finance major.

The Big Ten's career rushing leader at the time of his graduation, Grabowski was a



first-round draft choice of the NFL-champion Green Bay Packers and played six years of professional football with the Packers and Chicago Bears.

Grabowski has been involved with many charitable organizations and is an officer of the Red Cloud Athletic Fund, which raises money for Sioux Indians.

The color analyst for Illini football radio broadcasts, Grabowski is Chief Operating Officer of Great Lakes Telecommunication Corp.
