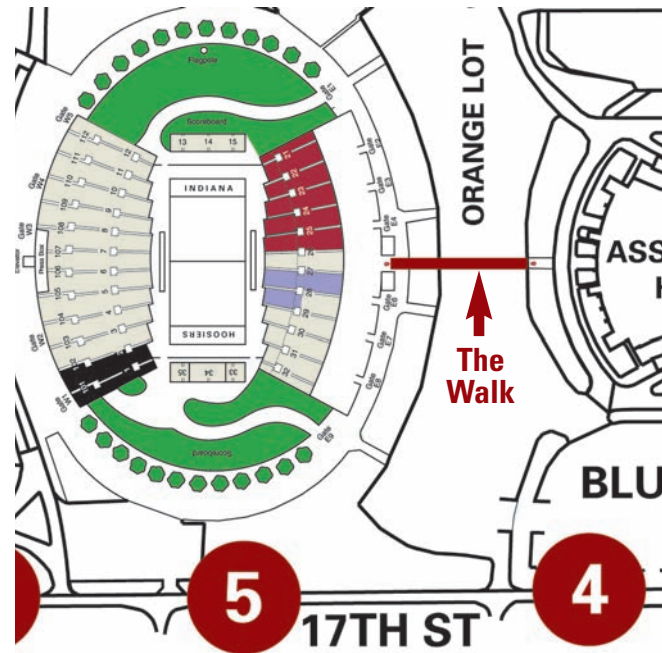


The Walk to The Rock

Two hours prior to kickoff, Coach Hep and the players will exit the team buses on the south side of 17th Street. They will cross 17th Street and walk up to the West Entrance of Assembly Hall. The Marching Hundred and the cheerleaders will lead the fans in singing "Indiana, Our Indiana" and "Indiana Fight!" as the team walks down the steps and through the Orange Lot to the stadium. Join us in the Orange Lot two hours before kickoff for this great new tradition!



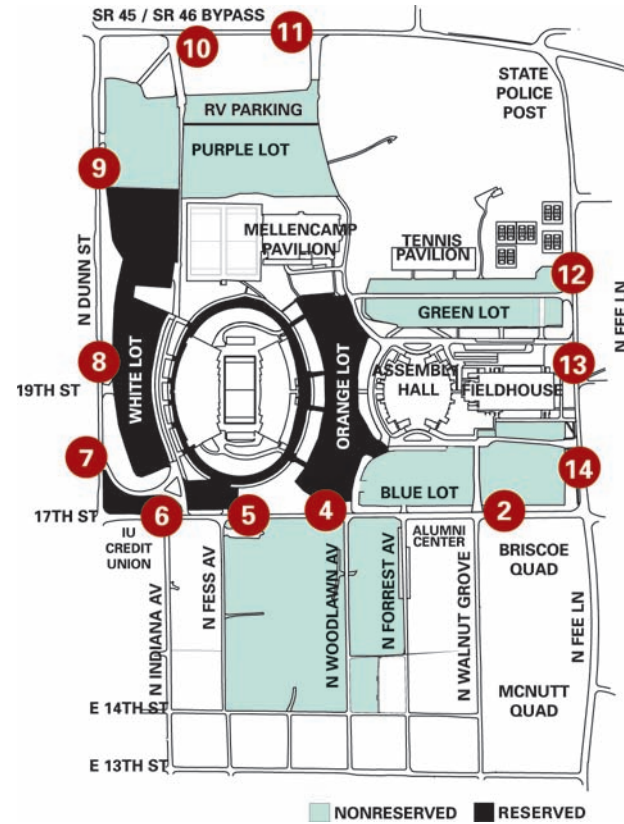

Indiana Football Parking

Game Day parking is \$10 for automobiles in all Athletic Department non-reserved lots. Gate 2 (off 17th Street), Gates 10 and 11 (off the 45/46 Bypass) and Gates 12 and 14 (off North Fee Lane) are general public and visitor parking. Gates 5 and 6 (off 17th Street) and Gates 8 and 9 (off Dunn Street) are donor reserved parking. Gate 4 parking is \$15 and limited availability. RV parking is located at Gate 11 (off the 45/46 Bypass). Buses use Gate 13 (off North Fee Lane). Bus and RV parking is \$40.



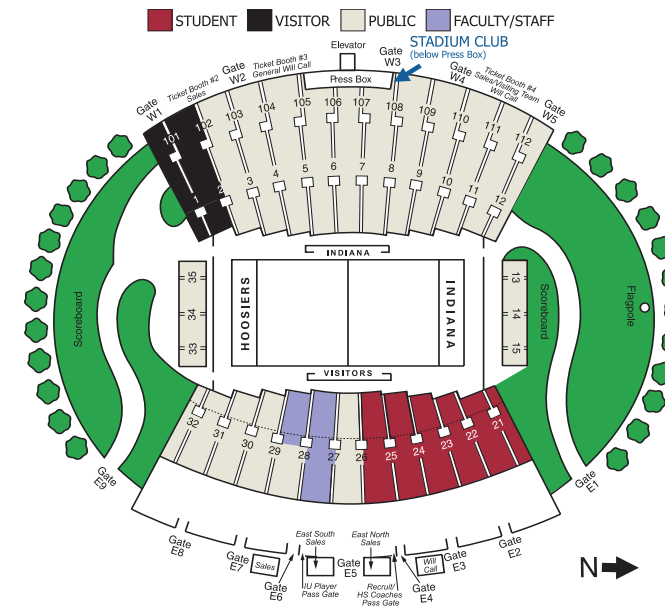

May We Have Your Cooperation - Code of Conduct

In order to keep Hoosier football games as enjoyable as possible for all, we ask that you respect others around you. If a patron displays conduct which endangers or disrupts players, coaches, officials or other patrons, Indiana University reserves the right to remove the individual from Memorial Stadium. No refunds will be given in such cases.

Alcohol – Alcoholic beverages are prohibited in Memorial Stadium.

Cameras – Video cameras are not allowed, still cameras with no flash are permitted, and pictures are to be taken from your assigned seat.

Containers – No containers or coolers, including water bottles, are permitted in Memorial Stadium.

Pets/Animals – Only service dogs, either certified or in training, will be admitted.

Smoking – Smoking is prohibited in all areas of Memorial Stadium including the restrooms and concourse areas.

Umbrellas – Umbrellas may not be carried into or used in Memorial Stadium. Check-in facilities are not available.

First Aid – First Aid Stations are located behind Entry 9 in the West Stands and behind Entry 26 in the East Stands. Contact the nearest usher or uniformed police officer if medical assistance is needed in the stands.

Lost and Found – Any found items may be turned in to Event Staff. Patrons may claim lost items by calling the Andy Frain office at 812-856-0651.

Lost Patrons – Lost patrons and persons looking for lost patrons should contact a uniformed police officer or call 812-855-4111.

Prohibited Items – For your safety and the enjoyment of others, the following items are not permitted in Memorial Stadium: banners, signs, cans and bottles, noisemakers, boomboxes or televisions, video cameras, and weapons. Check-in facilities are not available.

Projectiles – For the safety of all patrons, the throwing of any objects is prohibited in Memorial Stadium. Patrons throwing objects in the stadium will be ejected.

Public Address System – To request reading of personal messages (birthday, anniversary) over the public address system, please contact IU Sports Marketing at 812-855-9517.

Weapons – No weapons of any kind are permitted on University property.

Restrooms – Restrooms are located throughout the stadium in the concourse areas. Diaper changing facilities are located in the restrooms between Entrances 25 & 26 and 27 & 28 on the East Concourse, and Entrances 5 & 6 and 7 & 8 on the West Concourse.

Wheelchairs – Patrons in wheelchairs must purchase tickets for the wheelchair area and enter the stadium through Gate E9 in the East Stands for access to the wheelchair seating area. Wheelchair accessible restrooms are located near the seating area.

Accessible Carts – Carts will be made available in the designated parking lots of the stadium to transport limited mobility patrons. The carts also will be available following the game to return patrons to their parking lot.

Concessions – Whether you are hungry for a traditional stadium hot dog or want to experience a pound and a half turkey drumstick, Memorial Stadium concessions have something to satisfy your appetite. All concession stands feature Eisenberg's hot dogs, polish dogs, bratwurst and foot long steak dogs. Also available at all stands are gourmet soft pretzels, nachos, fresh popcorn, candy and an assortment of Coca-Cola beverages. Our many portable carts feature items such as Dippin' Dots, Connie's Pizza, pulled pork sandwiches, frozen lemonade and specialty pretzels. Be sure to stop by our Kids Korner concession stand located on the East Concourse, where you will find special menu items specifically designed with your child in mind. Cash, debit and credit cards accepted at all permanent concession stands, Campus Access accepted at stands located in the IU student section. Concessions for Indiana University Athletics are operated by Chartwell's.

The Kids Zone – *The Kids Zone has moved to a new location for 2006!* The Kids Zone is now located on the west side of Assembly Hall near the banner denoting The Walk. The Kids Zone features interactive games, face tattoos, hair braiding, and pre-game music. The Kids Zone opens immediately following The Walk, which begins 2 hours prior to each home game. Admission is free with a ticket to the game. Children 10 years of age and younger must be accompanied by an adult.

Gate Information

Gate Information – For direct stadium access to your seat(s), please enter through the gate indicated on your ticket. All gates open 2 hours prior to kickoff.

Pass-Outs – Following the first quarter, patrons may leave and re-enter Memorial Stadium. Have your ticket scanned at designated gates as marked on each side of the stadium to be valid for re-entry.

Security – All patrons will be subject to a search as they enter Memorial Stadium. This is to provide a safe and secure environment for everyone in Memorial Stadium.

IU Student Tickets – Student ticket must be accompanied with a valid IU student ID.

Ticket Information

Tickets – All persons, including children of any age, must have a ticket for admission to Memorial Stadium.

Tickets should always be treated like cash. Keep them in a secure place. Keep tickets away from direct heat, sunlight and moisture. Do not attempt to laminate tickets.

Do not bring the entire season ticket booklet to the game; bring the specific event ticket only.

Indiana University cannot guarantee the authenticity of a ticket not purchased through the IU Athletic Ticket Office. Persons holding a counterfeit or stolen ticket may be subject to prosecution according to Indiana State Law.

Ticket Replacement – Tickets will be replaced for a service fee to ticket holders of record only. Ticket Booth W3 and the East Will Call Box Office will serve as replacement centers. Replacement tickets may be picked up on the day of the game only. Please contact the Ticket Office in advance if replacement tickets are needed.

Ticket Office – The Memorial Stadium Ticket Offices will open 2 1/2 hours prior to game time.

Will Call – East Stands South Booth: public and IU players; East Stands North Booth: high school coaches and recruits; West Stands Booth W3: media and public; West Stands Booth W4: visiting school.

Ticket Sales for Upcoming

Games – Tickets for upcoming home games will be on sale at all booths until the start of the second half and after the game at Ticket Booth W3 on the inside of the West Concourse and the East South Ticket Booth.

Parking Lot Policies

Indiana University Athletics welcomes students, faculty-staff, alumni and guests to campus. We want our guests to enjoy the football game day experience in a safe, fun, family-friendly environment. We encourage everyone to please be respectful of fellow guests and to abide by our policies. These policies are designed to ensure the comfort, safety and enjoyment of everyone.

If you need assistance in any way, please contact the nearest parking lot attendant, an Indiana University Police Department officer or a member of any other law enforcement agency who is assisting in our parking lots.

Please adhere to the following policies:

- Parking in the Grass Lots south of 17th Street is restricted to cars, vans, motorcycles, pickup trucks, and sport utility vehicles only. Large trucks, RVs, buses, and other oversized vehicles will not be admitted to the Grass Lots and will be assigned to alternate lots.

- The instructions of parking lot attendants are to be followed. Only one space per car is permitted.

- Erecting canopies directly in front of or behind vehicles will be permitted, as long as traffic is not impeded or additional parking spaces are not taken. Tents and large tarps are not permitted.

- Trailer grills or other vehicle attachments are not permitted unless they are approved by an Indiana University caterer.

- Couches, large indoor or outdoor furniture, and large sound systems are not permitted.

- Kegs are not permitted unless approved by an official Indiana University caterer. Underage consumption of alcoholic beverages is not permitted under Indiana state law.

- For safety reasons, consumption of all beverages should be from plastic cups/plastic bottles. Glass bottles are prohibited.

- These parking lots are reserved for those attending the football game, and patrons who enter these lots are expected to have game tickets. Any tailgate activities are expected to conclude within ten minutes after kickoff. Police and security personnel will monitor these policies.

Parking lot policies will be strictly enforced by parking lot attendants, Indiana University Police Department personnel, and other law enforcement agencies.
