HOOSIERS SET FOR CWPA EASTERN CHAMPIONSHIP

The Indiana water polo team is seeded fourth in the 2006 Collegiate Water Polo Association (CWPA) Eastern Championship, the conference office announced on April 24. The Hoosiers will battle the No. 5 seed Bucknell Bison at 10:30 a.m., on April 29. The Eastern Championship will be hosted by Brown University at the Smith Swim Center in Providence, R.I. The winner of the championship will earn one of five automatic bids to the NCAA Championship, which is slated for Davis, Calif., on May 12-14.

The top two teams from Northern, Southern and Western Divisions earned automatic berths in the CWPA Eastern Championship. The CWPA Championship Seeding Committee selected two at-large teams, before deciding the bracketing and seeding for the event. The Hoosiers earned a spot in the championship by virtue of finishing second at the CWPA Western Division Championship in Bloomington, Ind., on April 22-23. IU fell in the title game to Michigan, 4-3.

Indiana will be in search of its second CWPA Eastern Championship. The Hoosiers won the title in 2003, before taking second last season in Bloomington. Indiana is 11-5 all-time at the CWPA Eastern Championship, and has finished third or better in four of the last five years.

SCOUTING BUCKNELL

Bucknell enters the CWPA Eastern Championship as the No. 5 seed with a record of 22-7. The Bison are only one win shy of equaling the program record for wins in a season. Bucknell has won 10 of its last 12 matches entering the event.

The Bison were one of the at large teams selected to the Eastern Championship field after finishing third at the CWPA Southern Division Championship. At the Southern Championship, Meagan Gins broke the school standard for points in a season with 95. She also equaled the Bison school record for single-season goals with 66.

Aubrey Rowe ranks second on the team with 53 goals on the year. Elizabeth Jensen leads the team with 40 assists to go along with 43 goals on the season. Mallory Sullivan and Amanda Nogie top the team defensively with 35 steals apiece. Mandy Bynum has seen action in 28 games between the pipes for the Bison, as she notched 204 saves while allowing 163 goals.

Indiana and Bucknell will be meeting for the fourth time overall and first time in the Eastern Championship. IU owns a 3-0 series advantage over the Bison, including a 12-9 victory earlier this season at the Princeton Invitational. Juniors Kristin Zernicke and Brooke Zimmerman notched hat tricks in the victory for the Hoosiers.

AGAINST THE EASTERN CHAMPIONSHIP FIELD

The Hoosiers are 5-3 against the field at the CWPA Eastern Championship. IU's opening round match against Bucknell will be a rematch of the Hoosiers' 12-9 victory at the Princeton Invitational on Feb. 17. Indiana also owns a pair of victories over Michigan (6-4 on March 17 and 6-5 on March 25), along with wins over Brown (7-5 on Feb. 18) and Harvard (13-5 on Feb. 18). Of the three IU losses to the field, two have come against Michigan. Coupled with the 4-3 loss in the Western Division Championship game, the Hoosiers fell 11-7 to open the season on Feb. 4. IU also suffered a 9-8 sudden victory defeat at the hands of Princeton on Feb. 18.

IN SEARCH OF 200

Indiana head coach Barry King has been at the helm of the Hoosier program since its inception in 1998, and he is closing in on a milestone victory. Over this nine years, the Hoosiers have won 198 matches entering the 2006 CWPA Eastern Championship, leaving King two wins shy of 200 career victories. Including the 2006 season, the Hoosiers are averaging 22 victories a season under the direction of King. The Hoosiers have collected 20 wins each of the last five seasons under King.

During his tenure, King has guided his Hoosiers to six All-American honors, 29 AWPCA Academic All-America honors, 29 Academic All-CWPA and 55 Academic All-Big Ten honors. He also led IU to the 1998 Midwest Regional Title, the 2003 CWPA Eastern Championship and the 2003 NCAA Final Four.

20 WINS THE MARK

For the fifth straight season and eighth time in the nine-year history of the program, Indiana notched 20 wins in a season with a 13-9 victory over Sonoma

INDIANA WATER POLO

State on day two of the Davis Shootout on April 9. The Hoosiers are currently 20-9 on the year. The lone year IU failed to win 20 was 2001 when Indiana finished 18-12-1.

Indiana head coach Barry King has led the Hoosiers during every season as a varsity sport. In his nine years, he has guided the Hoosiers to a 198-104-2 (.655) record. The school record for wins is 26 accomplished in 1998 and 2003. The 2003 squad also was the first to win the CWPA and advance to an NCAA-sponsored Final Four.

SINGLE SEASON RECORD BOOKS

A quartet of Hoosiers moved into or is teetering on entering the top 10 on single season lists in 2006. Senior Janis Pardy and junior Brooke Zimmerman became only the second and third Hoosiers to record 40-or-more assists in a single season. Zimmerman recorded her 40th helper against Gannon at the CWPA Western Division Championship, while Pardy accomplished the feat a game later against Slippery Rock. Pardy has 42 assists on the year, which ranks second all-time and trails Deb Simone's school record by three. Zimmerman sits in third on the single-season list with 41 assists.

Pardy also moved into ninth on the single-season steals list with 62. Junior Kristin Zernicke and Zimmerman are just short of moving into the top 10 with 58 swipes apiece. Tenth place on the single-season list is 60 by Sheri Fagley during the 2000 season.

Sophomore goalkeeper Jackie Pyrzs also stamped her name in the IU annals. The Harleysville, Pa., native has 230 saves this season, which ranks third on the all-time charts. She also sits in second on the shots faced list with 597. She trails Jessica Goldner's school record of 614 during the 2003 season.

HOOSIER HISTORY AT THE EASTERN CHAMPIONSHIP

Since joining the Collegiate Water Polo Association in 2001, the Hoosiers are 11-5 at the Eastern Championship. The Cream and Crimson have placed in the top three each of the last four seasons.

In 2002, the Hoosiers lost an epic five-overtime match to Michigan, before knocking off Princeton in the third-place match. Indiana won its first Eastern title in 2003, defeating Princeton, 5-1, in the semifinals and Brown, 7-5, in the finals. In 2004, the Hoosiers fell to Hartwick in the semifinals, 6-5, before ending the season on a high note with a 9-4 victory over Brown. Indiana hosted the 2005 Eastern Championship at the Counsilman-Billingsley Aquatic Center, and after knocking off Hartwick in the semifinals, the Hoosiers dropped a tight 8-7 affair to Michigan in the title tilt.

SORIA ON A TEAR

While junior transfer Melissa Soria tops the Hoosiers in goals this season with 53, the Villa Park, Calif., native has caught fire recently. She led IU in scoring in seven of the last nine games, while recording hat tricks in those seven affairs. For the year, Soria has nine, three-plus goal games. On three occasions, Soria garnered five goals in victories over Marist, Sonoma State and Slippery Rock.

Though she played in 20 of the Hoosiers' first 22 games, Soria had 21 goals on the year. In the last 10 games, all starts, she notched 32 goals for an average of 3.2 per contest. Soria also tops the Hoosiers in kickouts earned with 36 on the campaign.

ZIMMERMAN NOTCHES SCHOOL-RECORD

In the Hoosiers' 13-9 victory over Sonoma State on April 9, junior Brooke Zimmerman equaled the school record and became the fourth IU player to record five assists in a contest. She tied the mark held by current teammate Kara Woolley (vs. Penn State-Behrend on March 27, 2004), Kim Steele (vs. Washington & Jefferson on April 20, 2002) and Deb Simone (vs. Santa Clara on March 13, 1999).

Zimmerman notched a pair of assists in the first period. She assisted on the first goal of the game and found junior Melissa Soria with three minutes remaining in the opening frame. The former Canadian Junior International recorded assists in the second, third and fourth periods.

HOOSIERS IN THE NATIONAL RANKINGS

A quartet of Hoosiers hold down rankings in the nation's top 50 in respective statistical categories, while IU as a team is ranked among the top 11 in both goals per game and goals allowed per game. Indiana is 11th nationally with an average of 9.0 goals per contest and also ranks ninth in goals allowed giving up just 6.2 per match.

Sophomore goalkeeper Jackie Pyrz ranks seventh nationally in saves with 230 stops on the season. Juniors Melissa Soria and Brooke Zimmerman along with senior Janis Pardy rank among the national leaders in goals. Soria leads the way in a tie for 23rd with 53 goals. Zimmerman is tied for 31st with 49 goals, while Pardy stands tied for 44th with 45 markers.

BACK-TO-BACK PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

Senior Janis Pardy and junior Melissa Soria earned back-to-back Collegiate Water Polo Association (CWPA) Western Division Player of the Week honors on March 23 and March 30, respectively. They were the second and third Hoosier to earn the distinction this season after Brooke Zimmerman garnered the honor on Feb. 22.

Pardy led IU to its second straight CWPA Western Division title with a 6-4 victory over then-No. 15 Michigan. In the weekend opener against Michigan for the regular-season championship, Pardy notched a pair of goals, including the eventual game-winner in the third period.

In the Hoosiers' 10-9 victory over then-No. 17 Cal State-Northridge at the Wolverine Invitational on March 18, Pardy notched her seventh career hat trick. It was her fifth three-goal game of the season as the Hoosiers picked up their second straight victory over a ranked opponent. After starting the season 0-7 against ranked foes, Pardy led the team to victories over Michigan and Northridge, their first wins over ranked opponents in 2006. By virtue of those victories, the Hoosiers ran their winning streak to nine matches, which tied the second-longest streak in school history.

Pardy also scored a pair of goals in the Hoosiers' 13-7 win over Cal Baptist on March 19. The goals brought her season total to 33 and gave her 90 for her Hoosier career. She became the 11th IU player to accomplish the feat.

A week later, Soria led Hoosiers to a perfect 3-0 mark at the Fluid Five Challenge, March 25-26, with 11 goals in the three contests. In the opener against No. 16 Michigan, Soria finished with two goals and a steal. Additionally, she notched the first goal of the second half to tie the match at three as the Hoosiers went on to a 6-5 victory. The win marked the second straight weekend IU had knocked off its rival Michigan.

On March 26, Soria recorded nine goals on 10 shots in victories over Wagner and Marist. In the first game of the day against Wagner, Soria equaled a career high with four goals, only to better it by one in the win over Marist. She became the 17th Hoosier to notch five goals in a game. The Villa Park, Calif., native scored IU's first three goals for a first period hat trick against Marist. Soria had two kickouts drawn against Wagner and one steal against Marist.

BACK-TO-BACK CWPA WESTERN DIVISION TITLES

By virtue of its 6-4 victory in Ann Arbor, Mich., on March 17, IU garnered its second straight CWPA regular season Western Division title. The win completed a perfect 7-0 run for IU through the CWPA Western Division. This season prior to beating Michigan on March 17, IU defeated Grove City (10-3), Slippery Rock (11-3), Washington & Jefferson (12-2),

Gannon (15-5), Mercyhurst (14-6) and Penn State-Behrend (13-4). Indiana also claimed the regular season title in 2005 with a 7-6 victory over Michigan in sudden victory.

HOOSIERS ON A HOT STREAK

Prior to a 12-5 defeat at the hands of then-No. 7 San Diego State on March 18, Indiana had won nine straight matches. The streak tied for the second longest in school history. The record is 11 held by the 2000 squad from April 2-16. Both the 1999 and 2003 teams each had nine-match winning streaks as well. In 2003, the Hoosiers won nine consecutive from Feb. 9-March 8, while the 1999 team won nine straight from March 28-April 10.

The Hoosiers have won 18 of their last 21 matches to move their record from 4-7 to 22-10. IU started the streak with a victory over Harvard to close out the Princeton Invitational. On March 25 and 26, the Hoosiers won all three matches at the Fluid Five Challenge in Bloomington. IU defeated then-No. 16 Michigan (6-5), Wagner (13-9) and Marist (12-6). At the Davis Shootout, Indiana topped CSU-San Bernardino (8-5), Colorado State (10-1) and Sonoma State (13-9). The Hoosiers breezed past Gannon (15-3) and Slippery Rock (11-2) to open the CWPA Western Division Championship.

CAREER HAT TRICKS

Twelve current Hoosiers have registered at least one hat trick during their career. Junior Brooke Zimmerman has notched 11 hat tricks this season to lead the way. IU is 9-2 in those contests. Junior Melissa Soria ranks second with nine hat tricks, including seven in the Hoosiers' last 10 matches. Senior Janis Pardy is third with eight career hat tricks. The Hoosiers are 42-3 when a player on the roster nets a trio of tallies.

ZIMMERMAN NAMED WESTERN DIVISION POW

Junior Brooke Zimmerman garnered Collegiate Water Polo Association (CWPA) Western Division Player of the Week honors following her performance at the Princeton Invitational, Feb. 17-19. Zimmerman led the Hoosiers to a 3-1 mark at the invite and is the first Hoosier to earn the honor in 2006 after four Hoosiers earned the honor last season.

Zimmerman topped the squad in goals and assists at the competition. The Calgary, Alberta, Canada native finished with eight goals on 18 shots to go along with nine assists, eight steals, and four kickouts earned.

She opened the Princeton Invitational with her first career hat trick on Feb. 17 as she scored three goals on four shots against Bucknell in a 12-9 victory. She also recorded two assists and a kickout earned in the contest.

On the second day of the invitational, Zimmerman started the day with a solid effort against Brown that included two goals, a career-high three assists and two steals. She followed that performance with her second hat trick in as many days against No. 18 Princeton. She was one of the driving forces behind the Hoosiers' offense and defense against the host Tigers. Along with the hat trick, Zimmerman posted two kickouts earned and a team and career high four steals. Despite her efforts, the Hoosiers

fell to the Tigers in sudden victory, 9-8.

On the final day of the Princeton Invitational, Zimmerman did not attempt a shot against Harvard, but that did not stop her from contributing to the Hoosier attack. She finished with three first-half assists and a pair of steals in the victory.

TRIO OF CANADIAN JUNIOR NATIONALS

The Hoosiers have a trio of Canadian Junior National Team players on the roster for the 2006 season. Senior Janis Pardy and junior Kristin Zernicke return for their third seasons in the cream and crimson, while junior Brooke Zimmerman joins the fray. All three players were members of the Canadian Junior team that won the silver medal at the Pan American Games in 2002 and a gold medal at the 2003 World Championships.

Pardy became the fifth Hoosier in school history to record 30 or more goals, assists and steals in a season during her junior campaign. She led IU with 39 assists, which ranked fourth in school history, and is the top returning goal scorer for IU with 30 a season ago. Zernicke led Indiana in steals during each of her first two campaigns with the Hoosiers. In 2005, she had 45 steals and 34 assists, which ranked sixth in school history. Zimmerman is one of nine Hoosier newcomers in 2006. In 1999, she was named the National MVP while playing for the Canadian Youth National Team.

This season, the trio has combined for 118 goals, 112 assists, 178 steals and 64 kickouts earned. Those numbers equate to the following percentages of the overall team total: 40.8 percent of the team's goals, 50 percent of the team's assists, 42.8 percent of the team's steals and 37.9 percent of the team's earned kickouts.

REGULAR SEASON CWPA WESTERN DIVISION STREAK

Indiana completed its second straight regular season of the CWPA Western Division. The Hoosiers went 7-0 in the division following a 6-4 win over then-No. 15 Michigan on March 17. Indiana has won 19 straight CWPA Conference matches dating back to 2004 season. IU closed the 2004 Western Division regular season with five consecutive victories before winning the regular crown each of the last two seasons with sterling 7-0 marks.

KNOCKING OFF THE RANKED

After struggling against ranked opponents this season through the opening three tournaments, the Hoosiers cracked the code in Michigan on March 17 and have won three of their last four against ranked competition. Indiana not only knocked off then-No. 15 Michigan, 6-4, to claim the CWPA regular season Western Division title, but IU defeated then-No. 17 Cal State-Northridge, 10-9, a day later in the Wolverine Invitational. The wins were the first of the 2006 season for the Hoosiers against ranked opponents. On March 25, the Hoosiers knocked off then-No. 16 Michigan for the second time in as many weeks, 6-5, in Bloomington at the Fluid Five Challenge. IU is 3-10 against ranked foes in 2006. A season ago, the Hoosiers claimed 10 victories over ranked foes, including five over top-10 competition.

BARRY KING HEAD COACH (NINTH YEAR)

Few collegiate sports teams can match the immediate success that the Indiana water polo team has enjoyed in its first eight years of existence. In Barry King's eight seasons, the Hoosiers have made four trips to the national championships, highlighted by the 2003 NCAA Final Four appearance, won a total of 176 games, an average of 22 per season, won the 1998 Midwest Regional Title and the 2003 CWPA Championship.

In 2002, 2004 and 2005, King and his Hoosiers were just shy of advancing to the NCAA Championships. In the middle of those near misses, the Hoosiers advanced to their first NCAA-sponsored Final Four in 2003. The NCAA started sponsoring a national championship in water polo in 2001.

In 2005, Indiana posted its fourth straight 20-win season. The Hoosiers went 7-0 in conference play for the first time since 2001. In going perfect in regular season conference action, the Hoosiers captured the program's first CWPA Western Division regular season title. IU spent 14 of 15 weeks ranked among the top 10 programs in the country. Indiana finished the year ranked 10th in the country. Additionally, the Hoosiers knocked off five ranked opponents among the national top 10.

The Hoosiers program has won 20 or more games in a season during seven of eight years as a varsity sport under King. In 2004, the Hoosiers went 20-9 and spent 11 of 15 weeks ranked among the top 10 nationally.

The 2003 campaign saw King coach the Hoosiers to their first CWPA Conference Championship as well as a school-record tying 26 wins. The 2003 Hoosiers knocked off the first top 10 opponents in school history with wins over then-No. 7 San Jose State, 10-8, and then-No. 10 UC-Santa Barbara, 9-7.

During his tenure, King has guided his Hoosiers to six All-American honors, 29 AWPCA Academic All-America honors, 29 Academic All-CWPA and 55 Academic All-Big Ten honors in his eight years.

Barry, his wife, Mindy, and two sons, Creighton (6) and Aidan (2), reside in Bloomington.



CARA SCHINDLER ASSISTANT COACH (THIRD YEAR)

Cara Schindler is in her third season as an assistant coach for the water polo team. Schindler began her coaching career on the West Coast before coming to Indiana in 2003.

IU capped off Schindler's second season as the Hoosiers' assistant coach with a 24-10 record. The Hoosiers went 7-0 in conference play for the first time since 2001 and knocked off five ranked opponents among the national top 10. In the process, IU won its first CWPA Western Division regular season title.

During her first season at IU, the Hoosiers finished the year with a third-place performance in the Collegiate Water Polo Association Eastern Championships. IU defeated No. 20 Brown, 9-4, in the third-place match.

The Hoosiers also turned in another stellar season in the classroom in 2005. The Hoosiers matched an Indiana record with seven AWCPA selections for the second consecutive season.

Schindler comes to Indiana after working as an assistant coach at California State University Northridge in 2002 and an age group coach for the Los Angeles Water Polo Club since 2001. The 2002 season marked Northridge's first as a varsity sport. Schindler also was the girls' varsity coach at Harvard-Westlake School in the winter of 2002-2003. Prior to being an assistant at Northridge, Schindler worked as a graduate assistant in the Office of the Vice President of Student Affairs at Loyola Marymount from August of 2001 to May of 2002.

Schindler, a team captain in 2001, helped the Lions to a third-place finish at the NCAA Championships and first team All-Western Water Polo Association selection. She graduated from Loyola Marymount in 2000 with a Bachelor of Arts in psychology with a business administration minor and finished a Master's in Business Administration with an emphasis in marketing in 2002.
