**Awards Nominees:** Quarterback Rakeem Cato was named a Walter Camp Award semifinalist, running back Devon Johnson was named a Doak Walker Award semifinalist and coach Doc Holliday was named a semifinalist for the Maxwell Football Club Collegiate Coach of the Year award.

**Perfect vs. Texas at Home:** Interestingly enough, Marshall has never lost to a school from Texas at home. The Thundering Herd is a perfect 11-0 against Texas schools in games played in Huntington. Marshall owns a win over North Texas (1988), two wins over Houston (2008, 2012), three wins over Rice (2007, 2011, 2014), two wins over SMU (2005, 2009), two wins over UTEP (2006, 2010) and one victory over UTSA (2013).

**Leaves Fall, Herd Wins:** The Herd is 19-6 after Oct. 28 in Doc Holliday's four-plus years as head coach, including an 11-1 mark at home.

**Big Plays:** Running back Devon Johnson's 75-yard run in the 23-18 win at UAB was the Herd's 13th play of 50 or more yards this season. In 2013, the Herd had 11 plays of 50 or more in 14 games.

**The Rock:** Running back Devon Johnson has seven runs of at least 50 yards this season. He also has nine 100-yard games, setting the Marshall major college record for 100-yard games in a season. The school mark is 10, accomplished three times by Chris Parker in the Division I-AA era (1993, '94, '95). Johnson broke the single-game rushing record at Marshall with 272 yards (24 carries) in the 35-16 win over Florida Atlantic. The previous record was 262 by Ron Darby (47 carries) at Western Carolina, 1988. Johnson's 18 touchdowns this season are the most for a Herd player since running back Ahmad Bradshaw had 21 in 2006.

**Cato Improves Streak to 44 and Continues to Climb the Charts:** Rakeem Cato's seven TD passes in the loss to WKU was the 44th-consecutive game that the quarterback has thrown at least one touchdown pass, a mark that is currently the NCAA FBS record. Cato has completed 62.8 percent of his passes in his college career (1,103 completions in 1,755 attempts). That figure currently puts him third in the Herd's all-time record book, just behind Byron Leftwich (65.1, 939-1442) and Chad Pennington (63.4, 1026-1619). Cato now has 229 touchdown passes, combining his high school (103) and college (126) careers, to go with 22,912 passing yards during that span. Also, Marshall (Cato, Pennington) now joins Hawaii (Colt Brennan, Timmy Chang) as the only schools in FBS history with two 100 TD passers. Cato now has 1,103 career completions. On the total offense front, he has 14,276 yards, also surpassing Pennington's old school mark of 13,048.

**Points? No Problem!** Marshall is tops nationally with a 26.0-point scoring margin.

**50+:** Marshall's 67-66 loss to WKU was the 13th time that the Thundering Herd has reached the 50+-point plateau under coach Doc Holliday. Jim Donnan (1990-95) holds the all-time school mark in that department with 15, while Bob Pruett (1996-2004) reached that mark 14 times and Cam Henderson (1936-42, 1946-49) also did it on 13 occasions.

**Leading The League:** In addition to the individual numbers above, Marshall leads Conference USA in scoring offense (46.7 points/game), scoring defense (20.7 points/game), total offense (574.6 yards/game), rushing offense (288.5 yards/game), net punting (40.5), PAT kicking (1.000), third down conversions (52.6%), third down defense (31.0%) and fourth down defense (25.0%).

**Herd Finishes Under Holliday:** Since Doc Holliday became head coach in 2010, the Herd has an excellent record of finishing off its opponents once it takes the lead. Marshall is 30-6 when it scores first, 27-3 when leading after the first quarter, 31-2 when leading at halftime and 30-3 when leading after three quarters.

**Breakdown:** In 12 games this season, Marshall has outscored opponents 149-69 in the first quarter and 308-132 in the first half.

**Balanced Attack:** Marshall is the ONLY team in the FBS averaging at least 285 rushing (288.5) AND passing (286.1) yards per game.

**10+:** The Herd is at it again with its output of double-digit-yard plays. Marshall has 242 this season. Since the start of the 2012 season (38 games), MU boasts 752 such plays, an average of 19.8 per contest. As you might imagine, those numbers have yielded the following: In that same period, offensive coordinator Bill Legg's attack has 25 games of 500 or more yards total offense and 24 games

with 40 or more points.

**Feel The Rush:** Marshall has outrushed 22 of its last 27 opponents overall and 15 of its last 19 Conference USA opponents, dating back to the 2012 season. In 2012, 56 percent of Marshall's plays were passes. This season to date, 56 percent are rushing plays. And the Herd is getting more from its ground game, too. Marshall already has 108 runs of 10 or more yards in 12 games. In 14 games last season, there were 94 rushes for double-digit yards. In 2014, Marshall has four regulars averaging at least 5.5 yards per carry (Devon Johnson-8.6, Steward Butler-8.4, Rakeem Cato-5.7 and Remi Watson-5.5). Marshall's major college record -- in modern times -- for average rushing yards per game in a season came last season, at 205.9. The school record for total ground yards is 3,395 in 1996 -- the final season of Division I-AA play -- for an average of 226.3. The C-USA record for season rushing average is 293.8, set back in 1998 by Army's option attack. In 12 games, MU has had 15 100+ yard rushing performances (Johnson 9, Butler 3, Watson and Cato one). Last year, there were 10 in 14 games.

**Ground Game:** Marshall has rushed for 3,462 yards in 12 games, surpassing the 3,000-yard mark for only the fourth time in the school record book. The previous MU single-season record for rush yards was 3,395 in 1996 (15 games).

**Protecting the Home Turf:** Marshall is nationally known for being one of, if not the, toughest places to play in college football. The program has won 84.4 percent (141-26) of its home games in Joan C. Edwards Stadium, the second-highest mark in the country for schools who have hosted more than five games (Baylor).

**Red Zone Magic:** In the red zone, Cato now has 75 career touchdown passes against five interceptions (at Tulsa in 2013 and 2014 vs. Ohio, at Old Dominion, vs. Middle Tennessee and at FIU).

**Shuler Headed to the Top...Again:** With 10 catches vs. WKU, wide receiver Tommy Shuler has 297 career receptions, which is good enough for No. 2 on the Herd's career receptions list and number three on the C-USA list. Houston's Tyrone Carrier holds the all-time C-USA record at 320. Shuler's 106 catches last season placed him in a tie for second on the school's all-time single-season list. Shuler also got his 24th career touchdown reception vs. WKU, placing him in a tie for fifth in Marshall annals. His streak of consecutive games with a reception is now at 39 (streak started in 2011 Beef O Brady's Bowl), a figure that ties him for eighth nationally among active players. Shuler also has 3,294 career receiving yards through 12 games this season, good for fifth on the school's all-time list.

**Stew Hits Double Digits...Often:** Steward Butler has 54 career rushes for 10 or more yards, and the 233-yard day against WKU was his seventh career 100-yard rushing game.

**Haigabombs:** Senior Justin Haig booted nine PATs vs. WKU, giving him 211 for his career and the No. 2 spot in C-USA history. Matt Hogan (Houston, 2009-12) has the record of 228. Haig is now tied with Tim Openlander for the school's all-time mark. Haig has 322 career points. Tim Openlander has the most by an MU kicker with 337. Dewey Klein is second with 330.

**Turnovers Tell The Story:** Under Holliday, Marshall is 31-8 when it has as many or fewer turnovers than the opposition.

**Spreading The Wealth:** In 12 games, the Herd has had seven different leaders in receiving yards (Eric Frohnapfel (twice), Davonte Allen (three times), Angelo Jean-Louis, Tommy Shuler (three times), Craig Wilkins, Devon Johnson and Deon-Tay McManus).

**Third Down Masters:** Marshall is converting 52.9% of its third downs on offense (#3 in the nation), and holding the opponents to 30.8% (#10 in the nation), the only school to register in the top 12 of both categories.

**Making the Grades:** Seven senior members of Coach Doc Holliday's team will play the 2014 season with their Marshall undergraduate degrees in hand. Here's the list, with their MU undergraduate majors: TE Eric Frohnapfel (finance); PK Justin Haig (management); C Chris Jasperse (sports management); OG Trevor Mendelson (finance); CB Darryl Roberts (sports management); DT James Rouse (criminal justice); LB Raheem Waiters (sports management).

#### **WKU:**

-QB Rakeem Cato's seven TD passes take him to 35 this season, making him the first Marshall QB in history to have three 30-TD seasons.

-Marshall game captains versus WKU, as chosen by Coach Doc Holliday and his staff, are Offense: Rakeem Cato, QB; Tommy Shuler, WR; Defense: Jermaine Holmes, LB; Neville Hewitt, LB. Cato has the team-high of eight captaincies this season.

-Senior C Chris Jasperse made his team-leading 51st career start (every game he's played at MU), tied for most among active offensive linemen in FBS. The Marshall record for starts -- as an FBS program (1953-81 and 1997-present) -- is 52 by OT Steve Sciuolo (1999-2002). Stat includes players on offense, defense; no specialists.

-WR Tommy Shuler touchdown catch is his 24th at Marshall, tying him with Troy Brown and Aaron Dobson at No. 5 in career receiving TDs in Herd history. Mike Barber (1985-88) is No. 4, at 26 TDs.

-QB Rakeem Cato's first-quarter TD pass takes him to 44 consecutive games with

a scoring pass, the NCAA's FBS record. The only QB in NCAA history with a longer streak is Mike Reilly (2005-08) of Central Washington. He has 46, the Division II record.

-The 91 points by both teams at halftime fell short of the major-college record by 3. The 94 was set Nov. 10, 2007, at North Texas in the first half: North Texas 49, Navy 45. The Midshipmen won on the road, 74-62.

-Stew Butler's 233 rushing yards are his career high. His total gives Marshall two backs with 200-yard games in one season for the first time in history. Devon Johnson had a school-record 272 versus FAU last month.

#### **UAB:**

-Marshall game captains versus UAB, as chosen by Coach Doc Holliday and his staff, are Offense: Rakeem Cato, QB; Chris Jasperse, C; Defense: James Rouse, DT; Neville Hewitt, LB. Cato and Jasperse share the team-high with seven game captaincies this season. Rouse has six.

-The Herd defense's "tribute" to injured linebacker Evan McKelvey has senior cornerback Darryl Roberts - who usually wears No. 7 - wearing McKelvey's No. 31 today versus UAB. McKelvey suffered a season-ending knee injury in the win at Old Dominion on Oct. 4.

-Senior C Chris Jasperse made his team-leading 50th career start (every game he's played at MU), tied for most among active offensive linemen in FBS. The Marshall record for starts - as an FBS program (1953-81 and 1997-present) -- is 52 by OT Steve Sciuillo (1999-2002). Stat includes players on offense, defense; no specialists.

-QB Rakeem Cato (1,709 pass attempts) surpassed Chris Redman (1,679, Louisville, 1996-99) for No. 2 in C-USA history in career pass attempts.

-QB Rakeem Cato (1,074 completions) passed Chris Redman (1,031 at Louisville, 1996-99) for No. 2 in C-USA history. Houston's Case Keenum (2007-11) is No. 1, with 1,546.

-QB Rakeem Cato (13,830 yards total offense) surpassed Kevin Kolb (13,715, Houston, 2003-06) for No. 2 in C-USA history.

-QB Rakeem Cato (13,073 pass yards) passed Kevin Kolb (12,964, Houston, 2003-06) for No. 2 in C-USA history.

-QB Rakeem Cato's two first-half TD passes take him to 43 consecutive games with a scoring pass, the NCAA's FBS record. The only QB in NCAA history with a longer streak is Mike Reilly (2005-08) of Central Washington. He has 46, the Division II record.

-WR Tommy Shuler (287 catches) has passed Emmanuel Sanders (285 at SMU, 2006-09) for No. 5 in receptions in C-USA history.

-Marshall became the third C-USA team in league history (1996-present) to start 11-0. Tulane in 1998 went 12-0 for season. In 2011, Houston started 12-0, lost C-USA title game to Southern Miss, then won the TicketCity Bowl for 13-1 record.

-RB Devon Johnson (1,573 yards) ranks 4th in single-season rush yardage in Herd history. He passed Ron Darby (1,506 in 1987) for No. 5 and Ahmad Bradshaw (1,523 in 2006) for No. 4.

#### **Rice:**

-The Herd clinched a spot in the C-USA title game with the win and Middle Tennessee's loss to Florida International.

The Marshall record for starts - as an FBS program (1953-81 and 1997-present) -- is 52 by OT Steve Sciuillo (1999-2002). Stat includes players on offense, defense; no specialists.

-QB Rakeem Cato's TD pass moved his FBS record for consecutive games with a TD to 42. The only player in NCAA history with a longer streak is Division II record-holder: 46 games - Mike Reilly, Central Washington, 2005-08 (Division II record). FCS record-holder Dominic Randolph, Holy Cross, 2006-09 also was 42.

-QB Rakeem Cato in C-USA, career numbers, 1,054-for-1,671 for 12,789 yards passed Trevor Vittatoe (1,641 at UTEP, 2007-10) for third place in Conference USA career history in pass attempts; passed Chris Redman (1,031 at Louisville, 1996-99) for No. 2 in C-USA history in completions and pass yards (12,492) for No. 3 in C-USA history.

-WR Tommy Shuler (277 catches) passed Vincent Marshall (272 at Houston, 2003-06) for No. 6 in C-USA career history. No. 5 is Emmanuel Sanders, SMU (2006-09)

with 285.

-Freshman WR Hyleck Foster's TD catch - his first college TD -- made him the 15th player to score a TD for the Herd this season.

-RB Devon Johnson has moved into No. 6 spot in MU single-season rushing, with 1,402 yards. No. 5 is Ron Darby, 1,506 yards, in 1987.

-Rakeem Cato's TD pass to Eric Frohnapfel with 9:29 left in third quarter was the 116th of his Herd career, breaking Chad Pennington's school career record. He followed with a 7-yarder to Deon-Tay McManus in the fourth quarter.

-PK Justin Haig's 5 PATs gave him 200 in his Herd career. The school record is 211 by Tim Openlander.

-The 180 total yards allowed by MU was the fewest yards allowed by the Herd to a major college foe in Holliday's five seasons (FCS member Rhode Island had 175 in an Edwards Stadium loss in September), and the fewest since MU permitted only 123 to Ohio in a 2009 Little Caesars Pizza Bowl victory under interim coach Rick Minter to close the 2009 season. Until the 180 yards by Rice, the lowest total offense figure against the Herd in a C-USA game came in Marshall's first season in the league - 186 by Tulane in a 27-26 Marshall victory in 2005 in Mobile, Ala., a game moved from New Orleans following Hurricane Katrina

-Tight end Eric Frohnapfel's 107 receiving yards was a career high, and his six catches mated his career best (at West Virginia in 2012).

-Rice had 81 rush yards, the ninth time in the last two seasons that Marshall has held a foe below 100 ground yards.

#### **Southern Miss Notes:**

-Marshall game captains versus Southern Miss, as chosen by Coach Doc Holliday and his staff, were -- Offense: Rakeem Cato, QB; Chris Jasperse, C; Defense: James Rouse, DT; Neville Hewitt, LB. Cato and Jasperse share the team-high with five game captaincies this season. Rouse and Hewitt have four apiece.

-The Herd defense's "tribute" to injured linebacker Evan McKelvey had senior linebacker Jermaine Holmes - who usually wears No. 46 - wearing McKelvey's No. 31. McKelvey suffered a season-ending knee injury in the win at Old Dominion on Oct. 4.

-Senior C Chris Jasperse made his team-leading 48th career start (every game he's played at MU), tied for most among active offensive linemen in FBS. -Junior Remi Watson got the start at running back for MU in place of injured Devon Johnson. It was Watson's fifth career start and first start since Nov. 10, 2012, in a loss at UAB.

-RB Remi Watson's TD catch from Rakeem Cato (first quarter) was Watson's first career TD reception.

-The pass attempt on which Rakeem Cato completed a first-quarter TD pass to Remi Watson was Cato's fifth attempt of the game, giving Cato 1,620 attempts for his career, passing Chad Pennington (1,619) for No. 1 in Marshall history.

-RB Stew Butler's 83-yard TD run was the 13th rush of 30 or more yards in his Herd career.

-WR Tommy Shuler's five catches for 80 yards moved him past Tim Martin for No. 5 on Herd career receiving yards list. Shuler has 2,951 yards. Shuler's five catches move him to 269 for his career and into for No. 7 spot in C-USA history. It also was Shuler's 22nd career TD catch, tying him with Jim Swierczek (1951-53) for No. 10 in Marshall career TD reception history.

-QB Rakeem Cato, with 278 yards total offense, moved to 13,196 yards for his career, passing Chad Pennington (13,048) for No. 1 on the Marshall career total offense list.

-QB Rakeem Cato had two TD passes and one TD run, giving him 126 career scores in touchdown responsibility, second in Conference USA history to 178 by Case Keenum (Houston, 2007-11). Cato passed Rice's Chase Clement (125 from 2005-08).

-With 7:12 left in the third quarter, the Herd went up 35-17, extending its streak as the only major college team with at least 35 points in every game this season.

-QB Rakeem Cato has thrown a TD pass for a 41st consecutive game, the NCAA major college (FBS record). Only two quarterbacks in NCAA history have longer streaks, both in lower divisions: 46 games - Mike Reilly, Central Washington, 2005-08 (Division II record); 42 games - Dominic Randolph, Holy Cross, 2006-09 (FCS record).

-LB Raheem Waiters' fumble recovery was the first of his career.

-QB Rakeem Cato's 33-yard run (late third quarter) was the second-longest of his

career. He ran for a 63-yd TD in win over Rhode Island in September.

-RB Steward Butler's 83-yard TD run (14:37 fourth quarter) was his longest career run and the eighth-longest in Herd history. It is MU's longest run since Doug Chapman ran 87 yards for a TD in the 1999 Motor City Bowl win over BYU.

-Butler had 118 yards, giving the Herd 12 100-yard rushing games this season. His 23.6 yards per carry average (5 att., 118 yards) is the third-best single-game average in Herd history (min. 5 att.).

-The Herd's scoreboard total was the fifth-highest for MU since 1940. The 63 points, the most for a Herd team in C-USA, is the second-most ever by Marshall in a road game, bettered only by the 65-0 win at New River State (WV Tech) in 1927. The last time Marshall scored more points was its 66-point showing against Buffalo in 2002.

-Marshall rushed for seven of its nine touchdowns, the most ground scores for a Herd team since the program's first NCAA Division I-AA title season of 1992, when MU ran for eight TDs in a 63-28 Week 2 victory over an Eastern Illinois team that featured assistant coach Bill Legg, now Marshall's offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach.

-Tony Pittman's touchdown was the first of his career.

-Marshall averaged 9.1 yards per play, the 10th-best single-game total in school history.

-Justin Haig's nine PATs are the most since Tim Openlander made that many against Morehead in 1994. The only Herd players with more in a game were 10 by Dewey Klein against Morehead in 1991 and by William Nagel vs. Wilmington in 1914.

-The 19 pass attempts were the fewest for the program since throwing just 17 in the 2009 Little Caesars Pizza Bowl win (21-17) over Ohio.

-The Herd defense's "tribute" to injured linebacker Evan McKelvey had sophomore cornerback Corey Tindal – who usually wears No. 10 – wearing McKelvey's No. 31 versus FAU. McKelvey suffered a knee injury in the win at Old Dominion and is out for the season.

-Senior center Chris Jasperse made his team-leading 47th career start (every game he's played at MU), tied for most among active offensive linemen in FBS. The Marshall record for starts – as an FBS program (1953-81 and 1997-present) -- is 52 by offensive tackle Steve Sciuлло (1999-2002). Stat includes players on offense, defense; no specialists.

-Running back Devon Johnson passed 1,000 yards for the season, in only eight games – the fastest a Herd running back has reached 1,000 ground yards.

-Linebackers Neville Hewitt and Jermaine Holmes posted 18 tackles apiece. That total is the most for a Herd player in a game since D.J. Hunter had that many in Marshall's double overtime loss at East Carolina in the final game of the 2012 season.

-Quarterback Rakeem Cato has thrown a touchdown pass for a 40th consecutive game, the NCAA major college (FBS record). Only two quarterbacks in NCAA history have longer streaks, both in lower divisions -- 46 games – Mike Reilly, Central Washington, 2005-08 (Division II record); 42 games – Dominic Randolph, Holy Cross, 2006-09 (FCS record). Cato matched the 40 by Bill Borchert, Mount Union, 1994-97 (Division III record).

-Four rushing touchdowns for Devon Johnson is the most rushing touchdowns for a Herd player since Ahmad Bradshaw had five against UTEP in 2006.

-Johnson's 11.3 yards per carry set a school record for anyone with 20+ carries in a game. Jack Mahone held the old record at 10.2.

-Marshall's 9.4 yards per carry average is the fourth-highest single-game total in school history.

-Herd junior Tyler Williams' 51.4 average on five punts versus FAU is the best of his career and No. 5 all-time in a Herd single game. The record is 63.0 by Curtis Head at Toledo, in the 2001 Mid-American Conference title game. Williams has nine career boots of 60 or more yards.

-The game featured no turnovers between the two teams, the first Marshall game without a turnover since Sept. 4, 2011 when the Herd traveled to West Virginia for a rain-shortened affair. The last time the Herd and an opponent played a full game without a turnover was Nov. 29, 2008 when Tulsa visited Huntington.

-The Herd defense's tribute to injured linebacker Evan McKelvey has sophomore safety Tiquan Lang – who usually wears No. 21 – wearing McKelvey's No. 31 today at FIU. McKelvey suffered a knee injury in the win at Old Dominion and is out for the season.

-FIU won the toss and deferred, and Marshall went on offense on the first series of the game for the first time this season.

-WR Tommy Shuler's first-series reception stretched his game streak with a catch to 34 games (tied for No. 9 longest streak in FBS).

-FIU's touchdown with 2:00 to go in first quarter for a 7-0 lead is the first time Marshall has trailed since early in the fourth quarter of the 2013 Military Bowl win over Maryland. An Essray Taliaferro 7-yard run with 12:05 left gave the Herd the lead for good, 24-20, in what became a 31-20 win.

-Now that Cato has the NCAA's FBS record, he is in pursuit of:

-RB Devon Johnson's 71-yard run to set up Marshall's first touchdown was the longest of his career.

-DT Ricardo Williams' block of a second-quarter FIU field goal attempt is the 22nd blocked kick in Coach Doc Holliday's five Marshall seasons. It is the first FG block since James Rouse blocked a Virginia Tech attempt in September 2013.

-QB Rakeem Cato's four TD passes gave the Herd QB 122 scores in TD Responsibility in his MU career, breaking Chad Pennington's school record of 119. He also improved to 110 career TD passes, which also passed Russell Wilson's mark of 109 at NC State and Wisconsin (2008-11).

-Freshman TE Ryan Yurachek's first-quarter scoring catch was his first collegiate touchdown ... Sophomore WR Justin Hunt's 39-yard, second-quarter reception was his longest this season. The longest of his career was a 40 yarder against FIU last season.

-Cato total offense – With 33 plays total offense. QB Rakeem Cato has 1,845 total offense plays in his career, moving to no. 5 in Conference USA history. No. 4 is Chase Clement (Rice, 2005-08) with 1,857 plays.

-CB Corey Tindal's interception for a TD in the fourth quarter was his first career pick and first career TD for the Herd.

-The 9.3 yards per carry ranks fourth in a game in school history .... And all in the top five in that category have come in the past two seasons.

-Devon Johnson is the 2nd FBS player this season with a 3-TD game rushing + a 2-TD game receiving (Paul James, Rutgers).

-The last time the Herd allowed 0 tackles for loss was Nov. 24, 2001 when Marshall defeated Youngstown State 38-24.

-The last time a Marshall player led the team in rushing and receiving yardage in the same game (prior to Johnson's performance against FIU) was Oct. 15, 2005 when Ahmad Bradshaw did it in a 20-19 win over UAB (17 rushes for 72 yards, 5 catches for 35 yards).

#### **Middle Tennessee Notes:**

-Marshall game captains versus Middle Tennessee, as chosen by Coach Doc Holliday and his staff, were center Chris Jasperse, running back Devon Johnson, linebacker Neville Hewitt and defensive end Ra'Shawde Myers. It's Jasperse's fourth game captaincy of the season, which leads the 2014 Herd.

-Senior center Chris Jasperse made his team-leading 45th career start (every game he's played at MU), tied for the most among active offensive linemen in FBS. The Marshall record for starts – as an FBS program (1953-76 and 1997-present) -- is 52 by offensive tackle Steve Sciuлло (1999-2002). Stat includes players on offense, defense; no specialists).

-Junior Sebastian "Swede" Johansson got the start at left guard. He started the first two games of the season at left tackle before missing Weeks 3-4 with a high ankle sprain. He was the starting left guard in 2013.

-Marshall has scored on its first offensive series in the last five games – touchdowns vs. Rhode Island, Akron, Old Dominion and Middle Tennessee and a field goal versus Ohio. The Herd scored on its second offensive series at Miami (Ohio), after punting on its first series.

-Wide receiver Tommy Shuler's first-quarter reception stretches his streak of games with at least one catch to 33 (streak began in 2011 Beef 'O' Brady's Bowl).

-The Herd has outscored its six foes 97-14 in the first quarter of games this season.

-Quarterback Rakeem Cato's streak of consecutive games with a touchdown pass is now at 38, which ties for the NCAA major college record with Russell Wilson (N.C. State and Wisconsin, 2009-11). Oregon's Marcus Mariota is second among current FBS quarterbacks, with 32 games.

-After recording 342 yards of total offense on the day, Cato now has 12,431 yards total offense in his career, moving him to No. 3 in Conference USA history in total offense. No. 2 is Kevin Kolb, Houston, 2003-06 (13,715).

-Middle Tennessee's second-quarter touchdown (with 25 seconds left) was the first second-quarter touchdown allowed by Marshall this season.

-Running back Devon Johnson has five 100-yard rushing games this season (91 in his other game). The Marshall major college record for 100-yard rushing games in a season is seven, shared by Ahmad Bradshaw (2006) and Darius Marshall (2008). The Marshall overall record is 10, three times by Chris Parker (the 1993, 1994 and 1995 seasons, all in Division I-AA).

-Marshall is the only major-college team in the country that has scored at least 40 points in every game this season.

-With three rushing touchdowns on the day, Devon Johnson has 11 rushing touchdowns this season, the most for a Herd running back since Darius Marshall had 11 in 2009. The 11 rushing touchdowns by Johnson (2014) and Darius Marshall (2009) are the most on the ground for a Herd back since Ahmad Bradshaw had 19 in 2006.

-Hewitt's 14 tackles are the most for a Herd player since D.J. Hunter racked up 18 in the 2012 season finale at East Carolina.

-Marshall's four successful fourth-down conversions are the most for the program as far back as the research into existing records allow (1950s).

Taylor Heinicke suffered the worst day of his career with a 10-25 showing for just 85 yards, 1 TD and 1 INT. The 85 passing yards were the lowest total vs. the Herd since UCF was held to 29 yards in 2008.

-Cato's two TD passes moved him to 103 for his career and 16th place in major college history, past former Central Michigan star Dan LeFevour (2006-09). At No. 15, with 107, is Tajh Boyd (Clemson, 2010-13). Cato is tops in TD passes on the FBS level for an active QB, with Oregon's Marcus Mariota a distant No. 2 at 80.

-Marshall's 72.7% clip on third down (8-11) was the best number since registering those same totals in a 31-24 win at UAB on 10/21/06.

## Doc Holliday Head Coach - Fifth Season (38-25 overall, 27-13 C-USA)

Marshall University Director of Athletics Mike Hamrick introduced Doc Holliday as the Thundering Herd's 29th head football coach on Dec. 17, 2009. In four-plus seasons, Holliday has returned the Thundering Herd program to national attention.

Holliday, a Hurricane, W.Va., native, is widely regarded as one of the top recruiters in the nation. He has more than 30 years of collegiate coaching experience, including previous stops at Florida, NC State and West Virginia.

In 2013, Holliday took the Herd where it hadn't been in its previous eight years in Conference USA ... nine regular-season victories, seven league wins and a berth in the C-USA title game, mostly on the strength of an unblemished 6-0 mark at home for the first time since 2002.

The Herd earned a bid to the Military Bowl, where it toppled Big Ten-bound Maryland, 31-20 – one of only two bowl victories by teams from non-AQ BCS conference teams over BCS league schools in the 2013 postseason.

In finishing 10-4, Marshall boasted the best (scoring) defensive turnaround in the nation (19.9 fewer points allowed per game than in 2012), and junior quarterback Rakeem Cato was named the C-USA Offensive Player of the Year while nickel back Corey Tindal was the co-Freshman of the Year. Tight end Gator Hoskins was selected for the Senior Bowl, the fourth Holliday-coached player to make the Mobile, Ala., game in four MU seasons. Holliday's team had 16 All-C-USA selections (first and second team and honorable mention) and five C-USA All-Freshman Team selections.

During his time in Huntington, Holliday's teams have consistently improved as the season stretches into the winter months. The Herd is 15-5 under Holliday after Oct. 28, including an eye-popping 10-0 mark in the friendly confines of Joan C. Edwards Stadium.

In 2012, Marshall's offense enjoyed a record-setting season, leading the nation in passing yardage and completions, while setting a school record in total offense per game. The unit also finished second in first downs per game and third down conversion percentage. In C-USA, Marshall led in scoring offense (40.9), total offense (534.2), passing offense (365.1), pass efficiency (147.7), first downs (29.4) and third down conversions (54.6). Due in large part to these accomplishments, Cato was named Conference USA's Most Valuable Player, while running back Kevin Grooms was named C-USA Freshman of the Year.

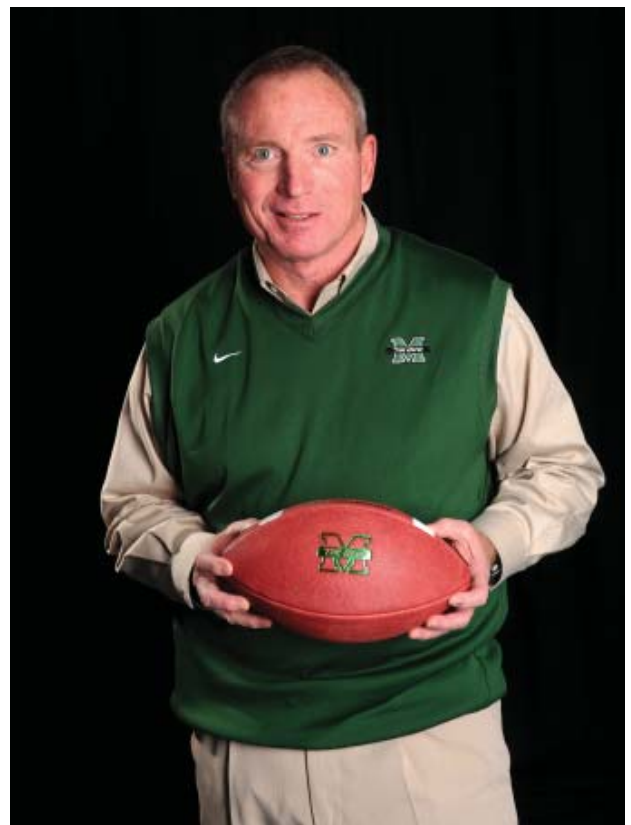
In 2011, the Herd went 7-6 against the 16th-toughest schedule in the nation, a slate that was ranked second among non-BCS schools. Two of those victories came against eventual C-USA champion Southern Miss and Big East co-champ Louisville, the latter coming on the road for the program's first non-conference road win since the early 2000s. Marshall also won five Conference USA games, the most for the program since it joined the league in 2005. Holliday also mentored All-American defensive end Vinny Curry, who was named the league's Defensive Player of the Year.

His first Herd squad won four of its last five games in 2010 and featured two first-team All-Conference USA performers in Curry and linebacker Mario Harvey. Marshall got it done in the classroom as well, as tight end Lee Smith was named to C-USA's All-Academic Team and the squad, as a whole, was recognized by the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) for its outstanding graduation rate. The Herd was one of just 15 schools in major college football to have a graduation rate of 90 percent or better based on the NCAA's Graduation Success Rate formula.

During his coaching career, Holliday has coached in 23 bowl games, three national championship games and coached 11 players that have gone on to the National Football League. He has also coached five All-Americans and 27 student-athletes that have earned all-conference or All-East honors.

Holliday was a three-year letter-winner at linebacker at West Virginia (1976-78) and has earned bachelor's (1979) and master's (1981) degrees from WVU. He won a state high school wrestling title at 175 pounds (all divisions) in 1975 at Hurricane.

Holliday and his wife, Diana, have four children - Meghan, Cade, Chase and Cody.
