2009 Football Notes

Red-White Spring Game (April 25)

RED-WHITE SPRING GAME SET FOR SATURDAY...

The University of Maryland football team will close its spring season Saturday with the annual Red-White Game at Chevy Chase Bank Field at Byrd Stadium. The contest is scheduled to kickoff at 3:30 p.m. ET. Gates open at noon and Terp players will be available from 12:30-1:30 p.m. for an autograph session on the stadium concourse. Due to construction on the press box and suites, there will be no radio or TV broadcast of the game. Admission to the game is free. The White team has won the last three spring games, including a 27-3 victory last season.

SPRING GAME FORMAT...

The spring game will pit the Red team vs. the White team under a normal format with four 12-minute quarters. There is also a third team – the Black squad – which features offensive linemen and specialists who are eligible to play for either Red or White. Players can switch teams and the quarterbacks will be in yellow jerseys (non-contact).

OUT FOR SPRING GAME...

DB Nolan Carroll (concussion), DL Travis Ivey (shoulder) and RB Da'Rel Scott (knee) were injured recently and will not play in the Red-White Spring Game.

TERPS PREP FOR SPRING GAME WITH A PAIR OF SCRIMMAGES...

The Terps opened spring practice on Tuesday, March 24 and Saturday's Red-White Game will be the culmination of 15 workouts over the last five weeks. Maryland has scrimmaged twice during the spring with the defense holding the edge in the first one (April 11) with four interceptions and eight sacks, and the offense rebounding this past Saturday with over 400 passing yards and seven touchdown passes.

Scrimmage Notes:

- **Jamarr Robinson**, vying for the No. 2 quarterback job, had a standout performance last Saturday. The sophomore completed 15 of 19 passes, including his final 12 attempts, for 253 yards. He also tossed four TD passes, including two to **Torrey Smith**, who had 210 all-purpose yards in the 100-play scrimmage. Smith had a 96-yard kickoff return for a touchdown Saturday.
- Junior **Morgan Green** and sophomore **Anthony Green** (no relation) were the leading rushers in the two scrimmages, each posting 104 yards on the ground. Morgan Green has averaged 8.0 yards per carry, while Anthony Green, a defensive back by trade who is serving as the No. 3 quarterback this spring, has averaged 5.2 ypc and completed 6 of 8 passes for 68 yards.
- Junior linebacker **Adrian Moten** has been active on the defensive side of the ball. Moten has posted eight tackles in the two scrimmages, including three TFLs, two sacks and two interceptions. Sophomore safety **Kenny Tate** has also posted some solid numbers with 14 tackles and two interceptions. Senior **Jamari McCollough** has been his usual steady self with 14 tackles and a 35-yard interception return for a touchdown in last Saturday's scrimmage.
- Sophomores **Nick Wallace** and **Mike Barbour**, and senior **David May** have been in a battle for the place-kicking chores. Wallace has fared slightly better in the scrimmages, going 5-for-8, including a 48-yarder last Saturday. Barbour has hit on 4 of 7 attempts, including a long of 41 yards.

QUICK HITTERS...

- The Terps return 39 letterwinners, including 10 starters (six offense/four defense), from last year's squad.
- Maryland made its sixth postseason appearance in **Ralph Friedgen's** eight seasons in last year's Humanitarian Bowl. The 42-35 win over Nevada moved Friedgen's record to 4-2 in bowl games at Maryland.
- Maryland was among the best in the nation last season playing ranked opponents. The Terps went 4-1 vs. ranked foes (AP poll) with wins vs. No. 23 Cal, No. 20 Clemson, No. 21 Wake Forest and No. 17 UNC. The Terps were one of only five teams in the nation (also Florida, Oklahoma, USC and Texas) to beat at least four Top 25 teams. The other four all finished in the top five of the final polls.
- The Terps will face eight teams (Cal, Rutgers, Clemson, Wake Forest, NC State, Virginia Tech, Florida State and Boston College) in 2009 which played in bowl games last season and another (James Madison) which reached the FCS playoffs.
- The Terps' 10 returning starters are the second-fewest in the Friedgen era. Heading into the 2004 season, Maryland had nine starters (five offense/

four defense) back from the previous campaign.

- The Terps welcomed five scholarship newcomers to the roster this spring. Joining the team are DL **De'Onte Arnett**, DL **Zachariah Kerr**, DL **Cody Blue**, LB **Darin Drakeford** and LB **Avery Murray**. Arnett, Drakeford and Murray were members of the 2009 recruiting class who enrolled in January. Blue and Kerr signed last season, but attended prep school last fall.
- **Chris Turner** is on track to become the first three-year starting quarterback since Brian Cummings (1995-97). The senior ranks fourth on Maryland's career completion percentage list (59.7), seventh in career passing yards chart (4,474), seventh in total offense (4,294), fifth in completions (367), sixth in career pass attempts (615) and tied for 11th in TD passes (20).
- Junior **Travis Baltz's** career punting average (41.0) ranks fifth in school history.
- Junior **Da'Rel Scott** ranks 22nd in school history in career rushing yards (1,268). His five career 100-yard rushing games are tied for 10th in school history.
- Sophomore **Torrey Smith** averaged a school record 21.3 yards each time he touched the ball last season (1,425 yards/67 attempts).
- Junior **Alex Wujciak** is the fifth-leading returning tackler in the country (133 stops in 2008).

NEW FACES...

The Terps have two new coaches on staff. Joining the team after the 2008 season were defensive coordinator **Don Brown** and special teams/tight ends coach **Charles Bankins**. Brown, who replaced Chris Cosh and oversees the cornerbacks, spent the last five seasons as head coach at the University of Massachusetts Amherst, leading the Minutemen to the 2006 NCAA FCS championship game. During his tenure, UMass maintained one of the top defensive units in the nation. The Minutemen finished among the top 20 in total defense in three of his five seasons (third in 2005; 20th in 2006; 14th in 2007). They were also first nationally in scoring defense in 2005 and fifth in 2006. Bankins, who joined the staff in February, has experience coaching offense and special teams at the collegiate and professional levels, most recently serving as an assistant at the University of Richmond, which captured the 2008 Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) title. During Bankins' two-year stint as Richmond's running backs coach, the Spiders had one of the most prolific rushing attacks in the country. Last season, the Spiders had the 24th-ranked offense in the nation. In 2007, the Richmond rushing attack ranked No. 12 nationally (234.6 yards per game). Bankins also oversaw Richmond's special teams in 2008 when the Spiders ranked 27th nationally in punt returns (12.0 yards per return) and 22nd in kickoff coverage (18.0 ypr).

 • A two-year starter at linebacker; One of the top tacklers in the ACC his final two years, tallying 218 stops during the 2007-08 seasons, the third-highest total in the league (248 by Michael Tauillili of Duke; 220 by Vincent Rey of Duke).

LB Moise Fokou 3V 6-2, 225
 • A two-year starter at Sam linebacker; One of the team's most athletic defenders and top special teams players; Posted 161 tackles his final two seasons.

DB Kevin Barnes 4V 6-1, 188
 • A two-year starter; One of the top cornerbacks in the ACC his final two years; Played in 43 career games, including 21 starts.

DB Jeff Allen 4V 6-1, 190
 • Started all 13 games at strong safety last season; Ranked fifth on the team in tackles (66); Played in every game (50) during his four seasons.

FRANKLIN TO SUCCEED FRIEDGEN...

Assistant head coach/offensive coordinator **James Franklin** was named the eventual successor to head coach **Ralph Friedgen** in February. Franklin, 37, has spent the better part of this decade on the Maryland staff. He served as the wide receivers coach from 2000 to 2004, which spanned Friedgen's first four seasons. During that time, Franklin established himself as one of the nation's top recruiters. Rivals.com ranked Franklin as one of the nation's top 25 recruiters for two of those first four years and tapped him again this past season.

OFFENSE RETURNS PLENTY OF SKILL...

Despite losing a potential first-round NFL draft choice in **Darius Heyward-Bey** and returning just six starters on offense, Maryland has many of its skilled players back in the fold:

- Junior RB **Da'Rel Scott** is coming off a year in which he was named first-team All-ACC and MVP of the Humanitarian Bowl. He capped his sophomore campaign by rushing for a Maryland bowl record 174 yards (all in the second half) on 14 carries (12.4 ypc) vs. Nevada. With that performance, Scott became the seventh player in school history to rush for 1,000 yards in a season and the first since **Chris Downs** in 2002. Scott's performance marked his fifth 100-yard rushing game of the season, which ties for the fourth-most in a single season by a Terp. Scott finished the season with 1,133 rushing yards - the seventh-highest single-season total all-time at Maryland - and a team-best eight touchdowns.

- Sophomore **Torrey Smith** emerged as a receiving threat midway through last season. As well as setting the ACC single-season record for kickoff return yards (1,089), Smith finished the year with 24 receptions for 336 yards. Both of those totals are tops among returning players.

- Sophomore **Ronnie Tyler** made a number of acrobatic catches last season and had a solid bowl game posting five receptions for 55 yards, including a 14-yard touchdown catch. Tyler is expected to slide into the slot receiver position occupied by **Danny Oquendo** the last three seasons, though redshirt freshman **Kerry Boykins** has been impressive this spring in that spot.

- **Davin Meggett** had a memorable true freshman season. Meggett was second on the team in rushing (457 yards) and rushing touchdowns (four). He helped spark wins vs. NC State and North Carolina. Meggett had a key 31-yard reception on third down to set up the game-winning field goal vs. NC State, and tallied a career-high 86 yards on 13 carries in the win over UNC.

- Sophomore wide receivers **Tony Logan** and **Quintin McCree** have been sharp in the spring. Neither has hauled in a pass in the regular season, but they are in a battle for the No. 1 Z receiver spot.

HOLES TO FILL ON THE LINE...

After losing five of his top seven performers from a year ago, offensive line coach **Tom Brattan** has had a busy spring. Gone are three-year starting center **Edwin Williams**, two-year starting left guard **Jaimie Thomas** and two-year starting tackle **Scott Burley**. **Jack Griffin** and **Dane Randolph** also completed their eligibility. In all, those five players combined to start 115 games. LT **Bruce Campbell** and C **Phil Costa** return as starters. Campbell started the last six games at left tackle last season, while Costa has played at left and right guard in his career. Costa will take over as the starting center this year. The other three spots are still up for grabs. **Lamar Young** and **Andrew Gonnella** have been battling for the No. 1 left guard role, and **R.J. Dill** and **Tyler Bowen** are among those vying for the right tackle role.

YOUTH SERVED AT LINEBACKER...

With the loss of **Dave Phillistin**, **Moise Fokou**, **Chase Bullock** and **Rick Costa**, the Terps will have to replace a ton of experience at linebacker. That group combined to play in 144 games, including 54 starts. The Terps started out the spring with just one linebacker - **Adrian Moten** - who has played in a game at that position. With **Alex Wujciak** and **Ben Pooler** missing the spring, the LB two-deep currently features three freshmen, junior **Drew Gloster**, who has moved from tight end, and special teams performer **Hakeem Sule**. Moten has played in 23 career games, earning his first start in the Humanitarian Bowl.

SECONDARY STANDS OUT...

The Maryland secondary looks like it may be the strength of the defense. The Terps lost starters **Kevin Barnes** and **Jeff Allen**, but they return five players who saw plenty of action last season. CB **Anthony Wiseman** and FS **Terrell Skinner** are the returning starters, but **Nolan Carroll**, **Kenny Tate**, **Jamari McCollough** and **Antwine Perez** each played a number of snaps in 2008. **Cameron Chism**, **Michael Carter**, **Trenton Hughes** and **Brandon Jackson-Mills** are all fighting for time at cornerback. Chism, Carter and Hughes played last season, though sparingly. The secondary has accounted for four interceptions and seven pass breakups in the two spring scrimmages.

CHECK YOUR FLIPCARD...

Quite a few Terps have changed numbers this spring, including WR **Kerry Boykins** (81 to 13), TE **Devonte Campbell** (86 to 34), DB **Cameron Chism** (37 to 22), RB **Gary Douglas** (49 to 20), DL **Derek Drummond** (58 to 44), DL **A.J. Francis** (98 to 96), LB **Demetrius Hartsfield** (59 to 50), DL **Masengo Kabondo** (65 to 55), WR **Quintin McCree** (88 to 17), RB **Davin Meggett** (41 to 8), DB **Antwine Perez** (20 to 2), DB **Kenny Tate** (18 to 12) and DB **Austin Walker** (15 to 29).

SITTING OUT SPRING BALL...

A number of players have sat out spring ball to continue rehabbing from a variety of surgeries, including starters **Cory Jackson** (knee) and **Alex Wujciak** (knee). Others who have not participated in spring ball are RB **Paul Lariviere** (knee), WR **LaQuan Williams** (foot), OL **Matt Harraka** (shoulder), LB **Ben Pooler** (knee), DB **Richard Taylor** (knee) and DB **Dominique Herald** (knee). DL **Travis Ivey** (shoulder) is not expected to see time the rest of spring. In addition, DB **Nolan Carroll** (concussion) and RB **Da'Rel Scott** (knee) are not expected back this spring after being involved in a collision in last Saturday's scrimmage.

Pairings for other ACC schools include **Paul Johnson** and **Jon Barry** (Georgia Tech), **Frank Beamer** and **Dell Curry** (Virginia Tech), and **Jim Grobe** and **Billy Packer** (Wake Forest). In all, 11 teams are scheduled to hit the links, all vying for the \$120,000 first-place scholarship prize.
