### NO. 8 MIAMI OPENS ACC PLAY AT HOME AGAINST NC STATE

The eighth-ranked University of Miami baseball team will open Atlantic Coast Conference play this weekend when it plays host to NC State for a three-game series, March 6-8, at Alex Rodriguez Park at Mark Light Field.

The Hurricanes (7-2) come into the series off a road sweep at No. 12 Florida and a mid-week spilt at home this past week. NC State (7-2) has won seven straight - including a 27-inning double-header win over Villanova and Akron on Wednesday - after dropping its first two games of the 2009.

Miami will embark on its fifth ACC season when sophomore left-hander Chris Hernandez goes up against NC State left-hander Jimmy Gillheeny Friday night at 7 p.m. Hernandez has picked up wins in each of his first two starts and has struck out 12 in 11 innings of work while Gillheeny has 15 strikeouts in 13 innings and also owns a season mark of 2-0.

Freshman Harold Martinez is coming off the best game of his young career, going 2-for-3 with a homer, a double, two walks, four runs and three RBI. Martinez, who owns a team-high 12 RBI, is also tied for the team-lead in runs (9) and hits (12) and is hitting at a .375 clip. Dave DiNatale has arguably been the team's best offensive threat, hitting a team-best .414 to go along with a homer, seven RBI, nine runs, 12 hits and a team-high three steals. He is also one of just two players on the UM roster, along with junior Jason Hagerty, that has an on-base percentage and slugging percentage both over .500.

Junior right-hander and ACC Pitcher of the Week David Gutierrez has opened the season off to a strong start, allowing just one earned run in two starts. Gutierrez, coming off a career-best seven shut-out innings in a 2-1 UM win in Gainesville this past Saturday, has a record of 1-0 with a miniscule 0.75 ERA heading into the weekend. Sophomore left-hander Iden Nazario has also pitched well early on and owns a 2-0 record with a team-high 15 strikeouts in 11 innings.

Miami's bullpen has been the team's strength as of late, allowing just one earned run in 21 combined innings over the last five games. Junior closer Kyle Bellamy, who is a perfect 3-for-3 in save opportunities, has struck out nine and has yet to allow a run in 4 1/3 innings of work.

# HEAD COACH JIM MORRIS - 16TH SEASON

2001, 1999 & 1994 NATIONAL COACH OF THE YEAR • 2008 ACC COACH OF THE YEAR



Full Name: James W. Morris III  
 Nickname: "Will" and "3"  
 Born: February 20, 1950 in Lexington, N.C.

In his 16th season at Miami, no other program, nor head coach, has qualified for the College World Series as much as Morris and his Hurricanes. Miami, which has qualified for the NCAA Tournament a NCAA-record 36 consecutive years, has made it to Omaha in 11 of Morris' 15 seasons in Coral Gables. Morris set an NCAA record for guiding a program to the CWS in each of his first six years at UM. In addition, Morris won a record 13 consecutive NCAA Regionals from 1994-2006. His teams have qualified for NCAA Regionals for the last 24 years, 15 at Miami and nine at Georgia Tech.

Morris has directed the Hurricanes to a 702-258-3 (.731) mark since arriving in 1994. Including his 12 seasons at Georgia Tech (1982-93), Morris has forged a 1,206-502-4 (.706) Division I record in 28 years as a head coach. Overall, Morris has been the head coach at the collegiate level for 31 seasons, spending the first four at DeKalb (Ga.) C.C. (now Georgia Perimeter College) from 1976-79, and has recorded a 1,337-543-4 (.711) mark.

In addition to carrying on Miami's great baseball reputation in the last 15 years, Morris has personally led the charge in the construction of Alex Rodriguez Park, and has logged hundreds of hours raising funds for the new stadium project.

## MORRIS IS A REGIONAL REGULAR

Jim Morris earned his 24th consecutive NCAA regional bid as the Hurricanes hosted the 2008 NCAA Coral Gables Regional. He has led Miami to a regional in each of his 15 seasons (1994-2008), winning 14 of his 15 appearances. The 13 consecutive regional championships (94-06) was an NCAA record. He also went to nine straight regionals from 1985-93 with Georgia Tech. Additionally, Miami has advanced to nine Super Regionals under Morris.

Affectionately known as "3" by those surrounding the UM program, Morris led the 2008 Hurricanes to their 36th-straight NCAA Tournament. Eight players from the 2008 team were selected in last year's Major League Baseball Draft. In addition to reaching the CWS, the 'Canes also won the Atlantic Coast Conference, widely considered one of the toughest, if not the toughest collegiate baseball conference.

## MORRIS IN HIS 31ST SEASON AS A COLLEGE COACH

Morris currently has a 1,206-502-4 (.706) record at the Division I level. As a head coach overall, he has compiled a 1,337-543-4 (.711) record over 30-plus years.

Jim Morris notched his milestone 1,000th win against his former school, Georgia Tech, with a 16-13 win on April 4, 2004. Thirteen days later he notched win No. 500 at Miami with a 7-3 win against Florida State on April 17. Morris' 1,000th win as a head coach, including four years at DeKalb Junior College, came in a 5-3 win over Northeastern on March 23, 2001.

Prior to his 14 seasons in Coral Gables, Morris went 504-244-1 at Georgia Tech from 1982-1993. In his first stint as a head coach, he guided DeKalb Junior College to a 131-41 mark from 1976-79.

## JIM MORRIS MAKING HISTORY

\* Guided the Miami Hurricanes to College World Series National Championship in 1999 and 2001.

\* The only coach in NCAA history to take a school to the College World Series in each of his first six years at a program. Morris has gone to Omaha with

Miami in 11 of 15 seasons and led Miami to 13 straight NCAA Regional Championships, an NCAA record.

\* Named National Coach of the Year five times while at Miami, by Baseball America in 1994 and by the ABCA and Collegiate Baseball in 1999 and 2001.

\* Sent 150 players to the Pro's, including Pat Burrell (Rays), Ryan Braun (Brewers), Danny Graves (Astros), Alex Cora (Mets), Nomar Garciaparra (Dodgers) and Jason Varitek (Red Sox).

\* Has served three stints with the U.S. National Team: Assistant Coach for 1987 Pan American Games (Silver), Head Coach for 1989 Presidential Cup (Silver) and Head Coach for 1990 Goodwill Games (Bronze).

## SHORTSTOPS AND JIM MORRIS

Morris, who played shortstop during college at Elon and then in the Boston Red Sox organization, has had great success developing the position while a head coach. Over the last decade Morris has taught prominent shortstops such as Nomar Garciaparra at Georgia Tech and Bobby Hill and Alex Cora at Miami.

Morris worked with Javy Rodriguez, who entered 2002 as a preseason All-American. Rodriguez led UM in just about every category as a junior in 2001, including a national-high 66 stolen bases. He currently works with All-American Ryan Jackson, considered one of the best all-around shortstops in the country.

Morris coached Hill, who played for the San Diego Padres. Before Hill was Cora and Mike Metcalfe. Both players went on to play at the Major League level with the Los Angeles Dodgers. Cora is currently with the Mets. Garciaparra played under Morris during the coaches' final two seasons in Atlanta and went on to become an All-Star with the Red Sox and now plays for the Dodgers.

## NC STATE REPORT

The Wolfpack come into the weekend having won seven straight - including two in a split-opponent doubleheader that totaled 27 innings Wednesday night in Lake Worth. NC State crushed Villanova, 15-0, in game one of the doubleheader before edging out Akron, 5-4, in an 18-inning affair in the second game. The Wolfpack set an NCAA record in recording 31 strikeouts (11 pitchers) against the Zips, five more than the previous mark of 26 set by Murray State on April 12, 1987 against Austin Peay.

Pratt Maynard is NC State's top offensive threat, leading all regulars in average (.367), runs (10), home runs (3), slugging percentage (.700) and on-base percentage (.472). Kyle Wilson (.263) leads the team in RBI with 12 while Drew Martin (.357) and Chris Schaeffer (.333) each have 10. Wilson is the team's top speed threat, having swiped six bases already this season.

Zak Sinclair, Jake Buchanan and Sam Brown have all tossed at least eight innings and have an ERA under 2.00. Buchanan, who is slated to start on Saturday, is 1-0 with a 1.50 ERA in two starts, having allowed just two earned runs in 12 innings of work. Friday's starter - Jimmy Gillheeny - is 2-0 with a 2.08 ERA, and a struck out a team-high 15 batters in 13 innings.

The Wolfpack bullpen is anchored by Joey Cutler. Cutler, whose six innings this year have all come in relief, has a 1.50 ERA and leads all relievers with nine strikeouts.

## MIAMI VS. NC STATE

Miami has a 19-10 edge in the all-time series between UM and NC State. The 'Canes took three-of-four last year from the Wolfpack, winning two-of-three in Raleigh and another at the ACC Tournament in Jacksonville. The last time the two teams met in Coral Gables, the Wolfpack won two-of-three games against the 'Canes in 2007. The series between the two schools opened in 1989 when Miami defeated NC State, 7-4, in Chapel Hill, N.C.

## AFTER NC STATE

The 'Canes will return to non-conference play with a pair of mid-week games after this weekend's series against the Wolfpack. Saint Joseph's (Pa.) visits Alex Rodriguez Park on Tuesday, March 10 before Pittsburgh comes to town on Wednesday. Both games are slated for 6 p.m.

## MIAMI CONNECTION

The Wolfpack have three players from the South Florida area, including Devon Cartwright (Palm Beach/Palm Beach CC/Forest Hill HS), Kyle Rutter (Miami/Palmer Trinity) and Greg Conner (Margate/American Heritage). Conner was teammates with UM freshman Kevin Youst at American Heritage.

## RELIABLE RELIEF

Over the last five games, Miami's relief pitchers have allowed just one earned run in 21 innings of work. Eight Hurricane relievers - Travis Miller, Jason Santana, Kyle Bellamy, John Housey, Michael Rudman, Taylor Wulf, Sam Robinson and Daniel Miranda - have a combined 0.42 ERA since the series opener at Florida on Feb. 27. Miller and Santana lead the group with four scoreless innings apiece while Kyle Bellamy has appeared in three games over that span and has yet to allow an earned run. Over that span, the group has allowed just 10 hits while striking out 22.

## DIFFERENT DAY, NEW LINEUP

Miami has opened the 2009 season using nine different starting lineups in the first nine games. Nathan Melendres has started eight of nine games in centerfield and in the lead-off position. The No. 2 spot in the lineup has been filled by second baseman Scott Lawson in all but one game, while Ryan Jackson (6 games) and Yasmani Grandal (two games) have shared the No. 3 spot, while Chris Herrmann has hit clean-up most often (6 games). Harold Martinez has started the last seven games in the No. 5 spot, Dave DiNatale has hit sixth seven times, six different players have batted seventh already, Jason Hagerty is usually batting eighth (6 games) while Jonathan Weislow has started and batted ninth all but one game.

## HURRICANES IN ACC OPENERS

Miami is 8-4 all-time in ACC opening weekends. This year's opener marks the fourth time in five seasons the 'Canes opened league play at home. In those three years at home, UM is 8-1, including a sweep of Boston College last season. In 2005 - UM's first season in the ACC - Miami took two of three from NC State. The 'Canes are 3-1 on Fridays, 2-2 on Saturdays and 3-1 on Sundays on ACC opening weekends.

## GUTIERREZ NAMED ACC PITCHER OF THE WEEK

University of Miami junior right-hander David Gutierrez was named Atlantic Coast Conference Pitcher of the Week for the week of Feb. 23 - March 1, as announced by the league office on Monday. Gutierrez, who started game two of UM's three-game sweep over No. 12 Florida in Gainesville this past weekend, is the first Hurricane to be given the weekly honor this season. The Miami native was victorious in No. 10 UM's 2-1 series-clinching win over UF on Saturday, holding the Gators scoreless in a career-long seven innings of work. Gutierrez stayed in command throughout, scattering six hits to earn his first win of the season and improve his career record to 8-0. Along with relievers Taylor Wulf and Kyle Bellamy, Gutierrez held the Gators - who were averaging 8.8 runs per game coming in - to their lowest run total of the year. His efforts helped the Hurricanes become the first team since Georgia in 2006 to sweep a three-game series in Gainesville. Florida State's Tyler Holt was named ACC Player of the Week.

## WEISLOW'S WEEKEND

Senior outfielder Jonathan Weislow had a breakout weekend for UM at Florida, hitting the first two home runs of his collegiate career in UM's 8-5 win Friday night. He finished the weekend leading the team in average (.444), runs (6), home runs (2), RBI (5), total bases (10) and slugging percentage (1.111) while ranking second in walks (4) and on-base percentage (.643). Weislow played a key role in Miami's first two wins on the weekend. His second homer on Friday - a three-run blast in the sixth inning - proved to be the game-winner, while he also scored UM's only two runs in Saturday's 2-1 win.

## MORRIS REACHES TWO COACHING MILESTONES

Six games into the 2009 season, head coach Jim Morris has already reached two coaching milestones as he recorded his 1,200th win as a Division I head coach in UM's season opener before recording his 700th win at Miami this past Saturday in Gainesville. Currently fifth among active Division I coaches in career wins, Morris became just the 18th coach in the history of D-I collegiate baseball to reach the 1,200-win mark with UM's 6-1 win over Rutgers on Feb. 20. Former UM head coach Ron Fraser, who coached UM from 1963-1992, is 12th all-time in D-I history with 1,267 career wins.

## WHERE'S HAROLD?

Freshman Harold Martinez entered the UM program after a heralded prep career as a shortstop at Miami's Braddock Senior High School. In the season-opening weekend against Rutgers, not only did he have an impressive series at the plate, but he did it while playing a number of different roles for the 'Canes. Despite having no experience at the college level, Martinez played three of the four infield positions against the Scarlet Knights, including three starts at first base and one at third in addition to filling in at shortstop in one contest. This past weekend against Florida, he spent the entire weekend at first. Offensively, Martinez is hitting .375 (12-for-32) with two homers, nine runs scored and a team-high 10 RBI.

In addition to Hernandez and Jackson being named to national player of the year watch lists, junior closer Kyle Bellamy has also been named one of 40 relievers nationally to the National Collegiate Baseball Writer's Association's 2009 Stopper of the Year Watch List. Bellamy, who already has three saves and nine strikeouts this season, owns a perfect ERA in 4 1/3 innings through the season's first nine games.

## FORMER 'CANE AUBREY HUFF HONORED

The University of Miami Sports Hall of Fame honored former UM baseball star Aubrey Huff prior to UM's season-opener as he is set to be inducted into the Hall as a part of the 2009 class. Huff was joined on the field by 2008 Inductee and World Series Champion Pat Burrell of the Tampa Bay Rays, UM head coach Jim Morris and HOF President Jodi Applebaum-Steinbauer as he was presented his Hall of Fame ring and jacket.

Huff was a 1998 All-American when he led the 'Canes to the College World Series with 21 home runs and a school-record 95 RBI. He currently plays for the Baltimore Orioles. ## DAVID S DEVELOPMENT

After splitting time between the bullpen and the starting rotation last year, junior right-hander David Gutierrez has opened the 2009 season as the Hurricanes' No. 2 starter behind sophomore All-American Chris Hernandez and he has performed well in that role thus far. Gutierrez, who went 5-0 with a 4.75 ERA in 2008, has opened the 2009 season with a 1-0 record and a miniscule 0.75 ERA in his two starts. Against Rutgers, he allowed just one earned run while striking out five in five innings of work. This past weekend, he shut down a Gators' offense that was averaging 8.8 runs per game coming in, tossing a career-high seven scoreless inning to improve his career record to 8-0.

## BRAUN, CORA, GUTIERREZ TO PLAY IN WBC

Former Hurricanes Ryan Braun (USA), Alex Cora (Puerto Rico) and Carlos Gutierrez (Puerto Rico) have been selected to play in next month's World Baseball Classic. Cora, a shortstop at Miami from 1994-96, is one of six infielders on Puerto Rico's roster, while Gutierrez, UM's closer last season, is one of 14 pitchers on the squad. Braun, an All-Star last year with the Milwaukee Brewers, is one of four outfielders on Team USA.

Final rosters of the 16 participating countries were announced late Tuesday, a little more than a week before the second annual tournament begins on March 5.

Cora, a recent signee with the New York Mets, is an 11-year Major League Baseball veteran with 688 career hits in his big league career. Gutierrez, a first-round draft pick of the Minnesota Twins in 2008, went 3-1 with a 2.10 ERA with the Class A Advanced Fort Myers Miracle last season. Braun, the National League's 2007 Rookie of the Year, hit .285 with 37 homers and 106 RBI this past season.

Team Puerto Rico, along with fellow Pool D members Dominican Republic, Netherlands and Panama, will play its first round games at Hiram Bithorn Stadium in San Juan, Puerto Rico. If Team Puerto Rico is able to reach the second round of the Classic, Cora and Gutierrez will play in South Florida at Dolphin Stadium from March 14-19.

Other first-round games of the WBC are slated for Tokyo Dome (March 5-8), Toronto's Rogers Centre (March 8-12) and Foro Sol Stadium in Mexico City (March 8-12). In addition to Dolphin Stadium, San Diego's PETCO Park will serve as the other second round venue. Dodger Stadium will host the semifinals and finals from March 21-23. PETCO was home to the semis and finals in 2006, when Japan defeated Cuba to take home the first Classic championship.

All 39 games are slated to be televised this year by ESPN and MLB Network -- 16 on the Network, which also adds a nightly half-hour wrap-up show of the day's events.

## WALK THIS WAY

Miami has walked an impressive 45 times already through the season's first nine games (five walks per contest). Jason Hagerty leads all Hurricanes with 10 walks, followed by six 'Canes that have tallied at least five thus far. Yasmani Grandal and Ryan Jackson each have six while Harold Martinez, Nathan Melendrez, Chris Herrmann and Jonathan Weislow all have five. With UM hitting .331 as a team, in addition to drawing 45 free passes, six regulars have an on-base percentage of .440 or higher. Hagerty, despite only hitting .200, leads the team with a .515 on-base percentage while Dave DiNatale has also getting on base in at least half of his plate appearances (.500).

## CANES MOVING UP IN POLLS

After sweeping the Gators this past weekend, the 'Canes made major jumps in the top college baseball polls released on Monday, moving from No. 14 to No. 8 in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches poll, No. 14 to No. 10 in the Collegiate Baseball poll and No. 20 to No. 14 in the Rivals.com poll. Baseball America also jumped the 'Canes from being unranked to No. 15 in its most recent poll while UM moved up one spot in the NCBWA poll to No. 9.

## TEXAS TRIO

Three of Miami's 14 newcomers this season enter the program via junior colleges in the state of Texas. Two position players - Chris Herrmann and Scott Lawson - along with a right-handed pitcher Taylor Wulf are making the move into Division I baseball after successful stints at the junior college level. In fact, all three played in the JUCO World Series in 2008, where Herrmann and Wulf - then teammates at Alvin Community College - lost the series to Lawson's Grayson Community College team.

## WHO'S BACK?

UM returns over half of its pitching staff from last year in terms of appearances. The 14-man '08 pitching staff combined for 230 appearances a year ago and nine of those pitchers (134 appearances in '08) are on the '09 active roster. On the hitting side, the 'Canes don't return as much, as 379 starts from a year ago are gone while just 197 return. The player on UM's roster with the most college experience is senior outfielder Dave DiNatale, who has appeared in 161 games at the college level and has tallied 521 career at-bats. After spending his first collegiate season at UCF, DiNatale is in his third season at UM, appearing in 42 games as a sophomore in 2007, 61 last season as a junior and all four this year. The most experienced pitcher in terms of innings pitched on the active roster is sophomore Chris Hernandez, who has logged just 112.2 innings coming into the season.

## PICK A SIDE, ANY SIDE

Junior catcher Jason Hagerty became the first Hurricane since 2004 to hit a home run from both sides of the plate in game in UM's series finale against Rutgers. Hagerty's first came from the right side in the fifth inning when he smacked his first homer of the season and just his second career grand slam. An inning later, he hit a two-run shot from the left side to become the first 'Cane since Adam Ricks accomplished the rare feat against USF on March 17, 2004.

## BEHIND THE DISH

Despite so many position player losses from '08 to '09, the Hurricanes return one of the top catching tandems nationally in sophomore Yasmani Grandal and junior Jason Hagerty. The pair split time last year behind the plate, with Grandal starting 36 contests and Hagerty garnering the other 28 starts. Grandal, who hit .234 with seven homers and 28 RBI his rookie season, started 15 of UM's final 16 games behind the plate in '08 and is expected to be the regular starter this season. Hagerty, who hit .289 with eight homers and 38 RBI as a sophomore, could be all over the field this season, likely spending time at catcher, first base, DH and possibly left field. So far this year, the duo has accounted for 11 hits, four homers, 12 RBI, 15 runs scored and 16 walks.

## LAWSON'S DEBUT

A number of newcomers had a solid opening weekend but none was more impressive than junior college transfer Scott Lawson's. Batting second and starting all four games at second base against Rutgers, Lawson finished the four-game series going 7-for-16 with a home run, four doubles, four runs, four RBI and a team-best 14 total bases. He already owns two eventual game-winning hits this year already, and currently leads the team in at-bats (35) and doubles (4) and is tied for the lead in hits (12).

## HURRICANES RANKED IN PRESEASON POLLS

The Hurricanes entered the 2009 season ranked in the Top 25 in four of college baseball's major polls. Miami's highest preseason ranking of No. 12 came via the National Collegiate Baseball Writers' Association, while the USA TODAY/ESPN Top 25 Coaches' Poll has the 'Canes at No. 14, *Collegiate Baseball Newspaper* at No. 18 and Rivals.com at No. 23. UM entered the 2009 season unranked in *Baseball America's* preseason rankings. Last season, the 'Canes entered the year ranked 2nd (Rivals), 10th (*Baseball America*), 12th (NCBWA) and 14th (USA TODAY/ESPN).

## ALEX RODRIGUEZ PARK INFORMATION

Renovations to Alex Rodriguez Park are thanks in large part to a \$3.9 million contribution by New York Yankees third baseman and 11-time MLB All-Star Alex Rodriguez. The gift - the largest ever to the University of Miami baseball program - has assisted the program in continuing to develop first-class facilities. The official announcement of his gift was made on Oct. 10, 2002.

Alex Rodriguez Park has taken form in a three-phase process:

- Phase I called for seating modifications, new dugouts, new stadium lighting and utility infrastructure and new rest rooms.

- Phase II entailed renovating below the grand stand area in addition to adding new concession areas.

- The final phase included adding a new clubhouse, weight room, training room, meeting room, video room and academic area. In addition, a new press box - along with four VIP suites - have been built atop the grandstand.

### 2009 CO-CAPTAINS

Juniors Ryan Jackson and Kyle Bellamy were selected to serve as the team's captains for the 2009 season. Both players have earned numerous All-America accolades this pre-season with both South Florida natives coming off of impressive sophomore seasons. Bellamy was one of the nation's top set-up men in '08, going 6-0 with a 1.86 ERA in 63 innings. Jackson, one of the top shortstops in collegiate baseball, hit .360 with four homers and 50 RBI last year.

### FAMILIAR FACES

A number of pitchers that saw time either in middle relief or in spot starts return for the 2009 season. Iden Nazario, Jason Santana, Anthony Nalepa, Rene Guerra, John Housey and Michael Rudman all tossed more than 10 innings last year as the group appeared in a combined 56 games. Housey started five games last season and Nalepa's 14 relief appearances in '08 was second to only Kyle Bellamy among returnees.

## SCHOOL RECORD THREE CANES GO IN FIRST ROUND OF MLB DRAFT

Three University of Miami Hurricanes were selected in the first round of the 2008 Major League Baseball Amateur Draft on June 5, marking the first time in the program's 60-year history that three players were selected in the first round. Junior first baseman Yonder Alonso was selected seventh overall by the Cincinnati Reds followed by junior second baseman Jemile Weeks, the 12th overall pick to the Oakland Athletics and junior right-handed pitcher Carlos Gutierrez, the 27th pick to the Minnesota Twins.

The 'Canes had six players selected on day one as junior rightfielder Dennis Raben was the 66th overall pick taken in the second round by the Seattle Mariners, centerfielder Blake Tekotte followed as the 101st overall pick to the San Diego Padres and sophomore third baseman Mark Sobolewski ended up as the 129th pick in the fourth round to the Toronto Blue Jays. In all, UM had eight players go in the draft. Senior RHP Enrique Garcia was selected as the 719th pick in the 24th round by the Cincinnati Reds. Junior outfielder Adan Severino was selected in the 26th round by the Minnesota Twins as the 786th pick overall.

## BURRELL WINS A WORLD SERIES TITLE

University of Miami Hall of Famer Pat Burrell became the second Hurricane in as many years to win a Major League Baseball World Series title as the Philadelphia Phillies defeated the Tampa Bay Rays last fall to win the Phillies' first world title since 1980. Burrell delivered what would prove to be the series-clinching run with a double in the seventh inning as Philadelphia won 4-1 in game five of the classic. Drafted by the Phillies with the first pick in the 1998 draft, Burrell had spent all 11 seasons of his big league career before signing with the Rays this past offseason.

A third baseman at Miami from 1996-98, Burrell follows up former UM shortstop Alex Cora, who won a ring last year with the Boston Red Sox in 2007.

During the 2008 regular season, Burrell hit .250 with 33 home runs, 86 RBI and 33 doubles. For the postseason, he had 10 hits, three home runs and eight RBI in 14 games. Heading into the 2009 season, Burrell has 251 homers, 827 RBI, 655 runs scored and 1,166 hits in his big league career.

Recognized as one of the greatest players in UM history, Burrell finished his three-year career in Coral Gables with a program-high .442 career batting average. He ranks second in UM history in career home runs (61) and total bases (465), while ranking fifth in RBI (187) and fourth in walks (170) despite only playing three seasons.

The only Hurricane to have ever won the Golden Spikes Award, Burrell was inducted into the UM Sports Hall of Fame in 2008.
