NCAA NOTES

State Update: Michigan State (17-12) earned its seventh consecutive NCAA Tournament bid on Sunday night. The Spartans, in the Mideast region, will play Wisconsin-Milwaukee on Dec. 2 at 8 p.m. ET in Pauley Pavilion on the campus of UCLA in Los Angeles, Calif. If MSU wins, it plays the winner of UCLA-Morgan State on Dec. 3 at 6 p.m. ET. MSU is 7-6 in six NCAA Tournament appearances, all under head coach Chuck Erbe.

NCAA History In Brief: MSU's first NCAA appearance was in 1994 when it lost in the first round to Texas A&M. In 1995 the Spartans advanced to the Final Four where they lost to Nebraska in five. MSU returned to the regional finals the following year but fell to Florida, 1-3. In 1997, State bowed out in the second round to Nebraska, 0-3. Pepperdine ended the Spartans' 1998 season in the first round in a five-game thriller and did it again in '99, this time winning in four in the second round.

Round One Vs. Wisconsin-Milwaukee: The Panthers, 23-4 overall, were an at-large bid into the NCAA Tournament. UWM saw its 14-match winning streak end in the semifinals of the Midwestern Collegiate Conference Tournament as Butler won in five.

The Panthers are led by Laura Dallenbach at 4.14 kills and 4.12 digs per game. Setter Lindsey Spoden averages 12.63 assists per game while Larissa Cattanaach tallies 1.30 blocks per game. As a team UWM is hitting .222 with 16.13 kills, 14.86 assists, 18.86 digs and 2.52 blocks per game.

This will be the first meeting between Michigan State and Wisconsin-Milwaukee.

Wisconsin-Milwaukee is coached by Kathy Litzau (Notre Dame, '90) in her eighth season. Litzau, a former Michigan State assistant, has a 143-101 career record and earned her fourth MCC Coach of the Year Award this season. Last season she was named AVCA District IV Coach of the Year.

Potential Opponents: If the Spartans beat Wisconsin-Milwaukee, they will play the winner of the UCLA-Morgan State match.

No. 11 UCLA - The host Bruins are 22-7 overall and finished third in the Pac-10 Conference with a 14-4 record. This is UCLA's 19th NCAA Tournament. With an all-time NCAA record of 48-16, the Bruins have won three national championships, in 1984, 1990 and 1991. *UCLA has never faced Wisconsin-Milwaukee or Morgan State, and is 2-0 all-time against the Spartans, including a 3-1 UCLA win on Sept. 8 in the Notre Dame adidas Invitational.*

Kristee Porter leads the team at 5.84 kills and 3.35 digs per game. Setter Erika Selsor puts up 14.41 assists per game while the Bruins' leading blocker is Elisabeth Bachman at 1.39 per contest.

UCLA is coached by Andy Banachowski, who is 895-211 in 34 years with the Bruins.

Morgan State - The Lady Bears are 26-15 overall and earned a berth in the tournament as champions of the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference, defeating defending MEAC champion Florida A&M 3-0 on Nov. 18. This is the third NCAA tournament (1997, '98, '00) for MSU as it became the first historically black institution to go to the tournament in 1997. The Lady Bears are led by Java Johnson at 3.32 kills per game while setter Tiffanie Sepree averages 9.50 assists per contest. MSU's defense is led by Dorothy Buford at 2.39 digs per game while Johnson contributes 1.09 blocks per game. *Michigan State and Morgan State have never met.*

The Lady Bears are coached by Ramona Riley-Bozier who is in her 10th season at MSU.

Four Spartans Honored By Big Ten: Senior outside hitter/middle Sarah Gustin was named to the 2000 All-Big Ten Volleyball Team as announced on Nov. 27. Senior setter Christie Landry and senior middle Jessica Sanborn, along with junior outside hitter Erin Hartley were all named honorable mention.

Gustin earns the honor for the second consecutive year. Gustin leads the team in kills at 4.10 per game, is second with a .323 attack percentage and third at 1.02 blocks per contest. She has nine 20-kill matches this season and was named Big Ten Player of the Week on Sept. 18. Gustin owns the fifth-best career hitting percentage in school history (.298), is fourth on the school block assists (342) and total blocks (421) lists and is tied for seventh in all-time block solos (79).

Landry, who has played and started in all 29 matches for MSU, tops the Spartans with 13.13 assists per game and is third in digs at 2.45 per game. Last weekend she was named MSU's MVP for 2000. A preseason All-Big Ten selection, she became just the third setter in school history to reach 3,000 career assists earlier this season and is currently third all-time in career assists at State with 3,637. Against Michigan on Sept. 20, Landry became the first setter in MSU history and the first Spartan since 1996 to record a triple double with 11 kills, 48 assists and 14 digs.

Sanborn, a first-team selection last season and a preseason All-Big Ten pick prior to this season, has missed 12 matches for MSU after breaking her foot. Before the injury she was leading the team with a .420 hitting percentage and averaging 1.28 blocks and 2.18 digs per game. Sanborn tallied a career-high 26 kills against Notre Dame on Sept. 10 and hit lower than .400 just three times in 14 matches she played in.

NCAA NOTES

Hartley, a 2000 preseason All-Big Ten, leads the team at 2.85 digs per game, is second with 3.30 kills and 0.22 service aces per game and third in blocks at 0.99 per game. Hartley has amassed 17 double-doubles on the season, including the last eight straight matches and, earlier this season recorded her first career triple-double with 18 kills, 11 digs and 10 blocks versus Illinois on Sept. 30.

Hartley Again Leads The Way: Junior outside hitter Erin Hartley had two more standout matches last weekend. In MSU's 3-0 win over Northwestern, Hartley led the way with 16 kills on .484 hitting, six assists, 10 digs and seven blocks. Against No. 5 Wisconsin, she led the team with 13 kills and 13 digs. Hartley has 17 double-doubles on the season. In the last four matches, she is averaging 4.54 kills, 3.38 digs and 1.62 blocks per game while hitting .364.

Setting 'em Up: Christie Landry, averaging 13.13 assists per game this season, is third all-time at MSU in assists with 3,637 and is fourth in assists per game for a career at 9.52. She has 1,379 assists on the year, fourth-best in a single season. Landry is just the third setter in Spartan history to amass 3,000 assists in a career. Last week she was named the MVP for the 2000 season.

Hitting Stride: The Spartans are hitting .266 as a team, third-best in a single season in school history. MSU has hit .300 or better in a match 15 times in 2000.

...Everywhere a Block, Block: As a team, MSU is averaging 3.33 blocks per game to lead the Big Ten and rank fourth in the nation. That figure is second-best in school history for a single-season. The team's block solos (109) and block assists (509) rank fifth- and sixth-best in a single-season, respectively, while its total blocks (363.5) is fifth-best.

Gustin Blocks The Middle: Sarah Gustin has been dominating on the block since her return to the middle. She has had no fewer than seven blocks in each of the last four matches, including a season-high nine at Iowa on Nov. 17. Gustin has also maintained her hitting percentage and is currently ninth in the conference and second on the team at .323 on the season.

In The Big Ten: As of 11/28, MSU led the Big Ten in blocks per game (3.33), is third in hitting percentage (.266), sixth in assists (14.85 pg), sixth in kills (16.55 pg), seventh in digs (15.42 pg) and eighth in service aces (1.34 pg).

Individually, Sarah Gustin is ninth in hitting percentage (.323) while Angela Morley is 10th (.311). Christie Landry is sixth among setters at 13.13 assists per game, while Morley ranks seventh in blocks (1.29 pg) and ninth in service aces (0.32 pg). Gustin is seventh in kills per game at 4.10.

In The NCAA: As of 11/26, Michigan State was fourth in the nation in blocks per game at 3.33.

Holding Opponents: Northeastern scored just 12 points against the Spartans on Sept. 2. That's tied for sixth-fewest points scored against MSU in its 28-year history. Illinois scored 50 points in a five-game win over MSU on Nov. 3. That's the sixth-fewest points State has ever allowed in a fiver.

Games won 15-1 in 2000: Game 2 vs. Georgetown, 9/1; Game 1 vs. Iowa, 10/21; Game 3 vs. Northwestern, 11/24

Remarkable Hitting Numbers:

- MSU hit .460 (55-9-100) in its 3-0 win over Georgetown on 9/16. That's the fifth-best three-game hitting percentage in school history.
- Against Illinois on Sept. 30 in a five-game win, State hit .335, the third-best percentage in a five-game match in school history.
- Against Illinois on Nov. 3, the Spartans hit .324 in a five-game loss, the fifth-best five-game hitting percentage in school history.

Remarkable Blocking Numbers:

- Against Michigan on Nov. 8, State tallied 10 block solos, tops in a five-game match in school history and the second-best mark in State's history in a match of any length. The 21 total blocks was second-best at MSU in a five-game match.
- Against Iowa on Nov. 17, MSU tallied 34 block assists and 18 total blocks, both school records for a three-game match. The block assists total is tied for third-best ever in a match of any length.

Two 1,000: Two Spartans reached the 1,000 kill career mark this season, Sarah Gustin on Sept. 29 vs. Purdue and Erin Hartley on Nov. 11. Gustin is currently ranked seventh on the all-time chart with 1,223, while Hartley is 10th at 1,061.

2000 Timeline

- Aug. 30 Michigan State is picked to finish fourth in the Big Ten.
- Sept. 2 The Spartans, ranked preseason No. 20, begin the season by winning the Sixth Annual L&L/MSU Classic; Jessica Sanborn named MVP and Amy Sibbernsen and Christie Landry named all-tournament. Northeastern scored just 12 points against the Spartans, tied for sixth-fewest point allowed in MSU's 28-year history.
- Sept. 10 MSU finishes third at the adidas/Notre Dame Invitational, losing to No. 3 UCLA and No. 4 Nebraska, but defeating No. 22 Notre Dame; Jessica Sanborn named all-tournament.
- Sept. 16 State wins the San Diego Invitational; Sarah Gustin named MVP and Jessica Sanborn all-tournament. The Spartans hit .460 vs. Georgetown, the fifth-best three-game hitting percentage in school history.
- Sept. 18 Sarah Gustin is named the Big Ten Player of the Week after winning the tournament MVP and recording 59 kills (.432), while adding 10 blocks and 2.3 digs per game.
- Sept. 20 MSU defeats No. 21 Michigan in its Big Ten opener, 3-2; Christie Landry tallies her first career triple-double with 11 kills, 48 assists and 14 digs. It is the first triple-double at MSU since 1996 and the first-ever for a Michigan State setter.
- Sept. 29 Sarah Gustin records her 1,000th career kill, the 10th Spartan in history to reach the mark.
- Sept. 30 Erin Hartley notches her first career triple-double with 18 kills, 11 digs and 10 blocks as Michigan State defeats Illinois 3-2, raising its record to 3-0 in five-game matches. MSU hit .335 against Illinois, the third-best team hitting percentage in a five-game match in team history. The win also raised MSU's record to 7-1 on Saturdays.
- Oct. 13 Jenny Rood steps into the starting lineup against Wisconsin, notching 16 kills, 18 digs and two block solos. She would start the rest of MSU's matches for the season.
- Oct. 14 Starting middle Jessica Sanborn is lost for the season with a broken foot. Christie Landry tallies her 3,000th career assist, just the third Spartan setter to reach the mark.
- Oct. 17 Back row specialist Lisa Ashton records a career-high 15 digs in MSU's three-game win over Indiana.
- Oct. 28 Middle Angela Morley blocks her way onto MSU's top 10 list with her 219th block assist and 262nd career block.
- Nov. 3 After missing two weeks with a sprained foot, Sarah Gustin returns in MSU's 2-3 loss to Illinois, leading the team with a season-high 24 kills. The Spartans hit .324 against the Illini, the fifth-best five-game hitting percentage in school history, but lose. The 50 points Illinois tallied against MSU was the sixth-fewest points State has ever allowed in a five-game match. And, in game four, MSU beat the Illini 15-1, the 27th time in history the Spartans have held an opponent to just one point.
- Nov. 4 Angela Morley gets a season-high 10 blocks in MSU's 3-1 win over Purdue.
- Nov. 8 MSU loses to Michigan, 2-3, but wins back the State Pride Flag on the basis of points 128-120 since both teams won a match and each team won five games.
- Nov. 11 Erin Hartley tagged her 1,000th career kill in MSU's 3-1 upset over No. 13 Ohio State. The outside hitter is the 11th Spartan in history to reach the mark. The win was just the third over a ranked team for MSU all season. Sarah Gustin moves back to the middle hitter position and records 20 kills, 12 digs and six blocks.
- Nov. 13 Michigan State falls out of the AVCA/USA Today top 25 for the first time all season.
- Nov. 17 Michigan State defeats Iowa, 3-0, and sets the school three-game match record for block assists (34) and total blocks (18). The block assists mark is third best all-time, regardless of length of match.
- Nov. 18 The Spartans nearly escape No. 8 Minnesota with an upset but are beaten by the serve of the Gophers' Lindsey Berg.
- Nov. 25 MSU ends its regular season with a 0-3 loss to No. 5 Wisconsin. The Spartans honor their four seniors: Vicki Basil, Sarah Gustin, Christie Landry and Jessica Sanborn.
- Nov. 26 Christie Landry is named team MVP at the annual banquet. Lisa Ashton earns the Spirit Award, Jessica Sanborn the hitting efficiency award (.420) and Sarah Gustin the team GPA award (3.74, communication). Michigan State earns its seventh-consecutive bid to the NCAA Tournament, all under eighth-year head coach Chuck Erbe. The Spartans will play Wisconsin-Milwaukee on Dec. 2 in Los Angeles, Calif.

MSU In The NAAs

MSU NCAA RECORD: 7-6 (6 appearances)

2000 marks the seventh time in Michigan State volleyball history that the Spartans have earned a berth in the NCAA Tournament. This year is also the seventh consecutive NCAA bid for MSU, all under eighth-year head coach Chuck Erbe. Michigan State is 7-6 (.538) in NCAA Tournament matches.

In its first-ever bid in **1994**, Michigan State traveled to College Station, Texas, where it lost in the first round.

In **1995**, the Spartans received a first-round bye and defeated Brigham Young as the host school in the second round. In the Mountain Region Semifinal MSU defeated San Diego State and then went on to defeat Hawai'i in the Regional Final to earn the school's first-ever berth in the NCAA Final Four. The Spartans were finally defeated in the National Semifinal by Nebraska.

Michigan State again received a bye in **1996** and hosted Texas A&M in the second round, winning 3-0. In the Central Regional Semifinal in Gainesville, Fla., MSU defeated Long Beach State, 3-1 before being stopped in the Regional Final by host Florida, 3-1.

The Spartans received an at-large bid in **1997** and traveled to Lincoln, Neb., for the first round where they beat Butler, 3-0. The host Cornhuskers bounced MSU from the tournament with a 3-0 win in the second round

1998 marked the third time in four years that the Spartans hosted the first and second rounds of the NCAA Tournament. Michigan State was caught off guard by a hot Pepperdine team and run out of the tournament in the first round in a 2-3 loss.

In **1999** Michigan State was one of eight Big Ten teams to gain entry into the NCAA Tournament, making it as an at-large bid. The Spartans traveled to Malibu, Calif., defeating Cal Poly San Luis Obispo in the first round, 3-1, but falling for the second consecutive year to Pepperdine, 1-3.

Head Coach Chuck Erbe



Head Coach Chuck Erbe is in his eighth season at Michigan State, where he has developed one of the top volleyball programs in the nation.

Since his arrival in East Lansing in 1993, Erbe has resurrected the Spartan program, guiding MSU to back-to-back Big Ten titles in 1995 and '96, and seven-straight NCAA Tournament appearances.

The ascent of Michigan State volleyball has helped Erbe and his staff attract several *Volleyball Magazine* Fab 50 and high school All-Americans to the program. The Spartans boast six Fab 50 players in 2000: seniors Sarah Gustin,

Christie Landry and Jessica Sanborn, junior Erin Hartley and freshmen Jenny Rood and Nikki Colson. Redshirt sophomore Angela Morley was an honorable mention. Redshirt junior Maren Witzel was the Alaska Gatorade Volleyball Player of the Year.

One of the great technical coaches in the collegiate game today, Erbe has served on the U.S. National Team Review Committee since 1984 and is currently an advisor to the U.S. Women's National Team. Last summer, Erbe led the Spartans on a three week tour of Europe. During the summers of 1997 and 1998 he spent time in Aukra, Norway, working with that country's national team and coaches and giving coaching clinics. In 1997, he also spent 10 days in Colorado Springs working with the National Team.

Now in his 20th season at the collegiate level with more than 450 career victories, Erbe's goals remains the same year-in and year-out - win the Big Ten Championship, compete for the national title and provide an atmosphere for his players to succeed in the classroom as well as on the court.

His eight-year record at MSU speaks for itself. He has guided the Spartans to a mark of 17-12 in 2000 and the team's seventh consecutive NCAA bid. Senior Sarah Gustin was named Academic All-District second-team and four Spartans earned Academic All-Big Ten honors.

Last season, MSU tallied a 21-13 record, the team's fifth-straight 20-win season, and a sixth consecutive trip to the NCAA Tournament where the Spartans advanced to the second round after defeating Cal Poly SLO in Malibu, Calif., but fell to host Pepperdine in four games.

Junior Jessica Sanborn was named AVCA All-District and GTE Academic All-American second-team and both she and junior Sarah Gustin were selected first-team All-Big Ten. Freshman Angela Morley was honored on the all-freshman team.

In 1998, Jenna Wrobel was named first-team All-Big Ten, while then-sophomores Christie Landry and Sarah Gustin earned honorable mention status. Wrobel also earned first-team All-America honors, becoming just the third player in MSU history to achieve the feat.

When he arrived at MSU, Erbe boldly predicted the Spartans would win a Big Ten title and be competitive with the nation's elite programs.

In just his third season at the helm of the MSU program, Erbe delivered on his promise of a title, leading the Spartans to their first-ever Big Ten championship in 1995 (19-1 record).

Not only did the Spartans take the Big Ten Conference by storm, but they came to the forefront on the national scene as well, earning their first-ever national ranking and climbing as high as No. 3 in the polls.

In just its second-ever NCAA Tournament appearance, MSU defeated previously unbeaten Hawaii before 10,000 fans in Honolulu in the Mountain Region final. The come-from-behind five-game victory propelled the Spartans into the national semifinals and the national limelight.

Despite a five-game loss to eventual national champion Nebraska, the Spartans put together their finest season in program history with a 34-3 overall record. MSU had also posted its first back-to-back winning seasons since the 1979-80 campaigns, while its 34 wins in 1995 were the most since 1976.

Erbe was recognized by his peers for his efforts in revitalizing the Spartan program, earning 1995 Big Ten, AVCA District 2 and AVCA National Coach of the Year honors. In addition, he was tabbed as the *Volleyball Magazine* National Coach of the Year.

Several Spartans also reaped the rewards of success. Dana Cooke, Val Sterk and Jenna Wrobel were named to the First-Team All-Big Ten squad, with Wrobel being named the Big Ten Freshman of the Year and earning a spot on *Volleyball Magazine's* Freshman All-America squad.

Cooke, Courtney DeBolt and Sterk also earned the distinction of becoming MSU's first-ever All-Americans. Jenna Wrobel joined the elite club in 1998.

Sterk is currently playing on the USA National Team.

The success of the Spartan volleyball program has not gone unnoticed as Erbe has helped turn the East Lansing area into a volleyball-crazed city.

Attendance figures have increased noticeably since Erbe's first season with MSU in 1993. The Spartans finished among the top schools in the country in attendance in 1995 and '96. In '96, MSU was sixth in total attendance (35,867)

and average (2,391) while in '95, the Green and White was fifth in total attendance (31,799) and 12th in average (1,590). Last season, the school ranked 24th in average (911) with 12,573 fans rotating the turnstiles.

It should come as no surprise that Erbe, who has won nine national titles at various levels in 26 years of coaching, was able to change so quickly the fortunes of a program that was the doormat of the Big Ten prior to his arrival.

The 58-year-old Erbe guided the Spartans to a 17-15 overall record in his second season in East Lansing, giving MSU its first winning campaign in over a decade and the most wins since 1983. MSU placed seventh in the rugged Big Ten with a 9-11 mark, its most conference wins ever and its highest finish in the league since 1986.

The most remarkable accomplishment for Erbe and Michigan State in 1994 was the school's selection to its first-ever NCAA Tournament. Despite losing to Texas A&M in the first round, the foundation for a successful future had clearly been established.

Erbe, who has a 20-year career record of 480-212-3, will always be remembered for the 12 seasons (1976-77, 1979-88) he spent as the head coach at the University of Southern California where he compiled a record of 310-121-3.

He led the Trojans to AIAW National Championships in 1976, 1977 and 1980, and to the NCAA National Championship in 1981, the first year of NCAA competition for women's sports. USC advanced to AIAW or NCAA Tournament play in 11 of his 12 years as head coach.

Erbe's first two teams at USC won AIAW National Championships with a combined record of 72-1. His 1977 squad, which amassed a perfect 38-0 record, included six All-Americans and is still considered by many to be the best collegiate volleyball team ever assembled. During his tenure, USC players earned All-America honors 24 times.

Internationally, Erbe led the United States women's team in the 1981 World University Games in Bucharest, Romania. In 1979, he served as an assistant coach for the women's U.S. National Team. Erbe headed the U.S. women's team in the 1974 World Volleyball Championships in Mexico City, Mexico, and led the United States to back-to-back titles in the Pacific Rim Junior Championships in 1975 and 1976. The 1975 win marked the first time in volleyball history that a USA team defeated Japan at any level of competition.

Erbe began his coaching career in 1973 at Marina High School in Huntington Beach, Calif., where he helped guide the team to a perfect 20-0 record and the National High School Volleyball Championship.

After leaving USC in 1988, Erbe spent one season (1989) as an assistant coach at Illinois and from 1990 until his appointment at MSU, he served as the Director of the Great Lakes Volleyball Center in Chicago.

Born Oct. 12, 1944, in Tulsa, Okla., Erbe attended Ripon College (Wis.) and Kansas before serving as a hospital Corpsman in the U.S. Navy from 1964-68. After leaving the Navy, Erbe completed his degree in physical education at Cal State Fullerton (1968-72).

Erbe's family includes wife, Rebecca.
