19 MWC PLAYERS SELECTED IN 2006 MAJOR LEAGUE BASEBALL DRAFT

The Mountain West Conference had 19 players selected during the 2006 Major League Baseball Draft, held June 6-7 in New York City.

TCU first baseman Chad Huffman was the conference's highest pick, selected by the San Diego Padres in the second round (53rd overall selection).

San Diego State had the most players taken with nine, while TCU had four players selected.

There have been 111 MWC players selected in the seven-year history of the league.

UTAH'S RYAN KHOURY NAMED DISTRICT 8 PLAYER OF THE YEAR

Utah senior shortstop **Ryan Khoury** was named District 8 Player of the Year by the National Collegiate Baseball Writers' Association.

Khoury, the 2006 MWC Player of the Year, led the MWC in batting average (.438), on-base percentage (.549) and hits (98), and was second in the league in slugging percentage (.728), runs scored (73) and walks (39). He also ranked in the top-five in doubles (18), total bases (163) and stolen bases (16). Khoury broke the all-time MWC single-season record for batting average and on-base percentage. He also broke the Utah school record for hits in a career earlier this season. Khoury finished his career with 291 career hits, which ranks second all-time in MWC history.

ALL-AMERICAN HONORS

New Mexico designated hitter **Chris Carlson** earned *Collegiate Baseball* First-Team All-America honors, headlining a group of seven MWC student-athletes to garner All-America status in 2006. MWC Player of the Year **Ryan Khoury** (Utah) was named NCBWA Second-Team All-America and Collegiate Baseball Third-Team All-America, while TCU's **Chad Huffman** earned third team honors from *Collegiate Baseball*, Baseball America and the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association (NCBWA). TCU's **Jake Arrieta** (Baseball America and NCBWA Second Team) and New Mexico's **Danny Ray Herrera** (*Collegiate Baseball* Second Team and Baseball America Third Team), the MWC Co-Pitchers of the Year, also earned All-America status, while BYU's **Ben Saylor** garnered *Collegiate Baseball* and NCBWA Third Team accolades. BYU's Jordan Muir rounded out the list, earning *Collegiate Baseball* Freshman All-America acclaim.

NEW MEXICO'S CHRIS CARLSON NAMED ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICAN

New Mexico junior designated hitter **Chris Carlson** was named to the ESPN The Magazine Academic All-America first team, selected by the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA). This is his second nomination to the All-America team, placing on the second team in 2005.

Carlson, a Topeka, Kan., native, maintained a 3.69 GPA in General Management. On the field, he finished the 2006 season with a .366 batting average, 63 runs scored, 79 RBI and 21 home runs. Carlson's home run total for the 2006 season ranks third all-time in MWC history. He ranked nationally in home runs (15th) and RBI (24th), while starting all 59 games for UNM in 2006.

ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT

Four Mountain West Conference baseball student-athletes were named ESPN the Magazine Academic All-District, as selected by the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA). New Mexico's **Chris Carlson** and **Ian Hollick** were first-team District VI selections, while Air Force sophomore **Josh Meents** was a District VII selection and Utah's **Jay Brossman** was a District VII honoree.

Carlson has a 3.69 grade-point average in management, while Hollick, a general management major, is maintaining a 3.65 GPA. Meents, an operations research major has a 3.33 overall grade-point average and Brossman has a 3.33 grade-point average in exercise and sports science.

MWC TOURNAMENT RECAP

The MWC Baseball Championship made its third appearance at Earl E. Wilson Stadium in Las Vegas, Nev., with TCU posting a 3-0 record en route to its first-ever MWC Tournament title. The Horned Frogs are the fourth No. 1 seed to win the championship (BYU, 2001 and UNLV, 2003 and 2005).

HORNED FROGS WIN REGULAR SEASON CROWN

The MWC has produced five different regular season champions in its seven years and TCU claimed the title in its first year as a part of the league. The conference race came down to the final weekend of the regular season as TCU, San Diego State and BYU were all in contention for the regular season MWC title and a No. 1 seed at the conference tournament. TCU defeated New Mexico in the first game of their series last Friday to claim the regular season MWC title and the top seed in the MWC Tournament. The Horned Frogs finished the season at 17-5 in the league standings, winning five of their last six conference games to wrap up the title.

NATIONAL HONORS

Three MWC student-athletes garnered national recognition for their on-the-field play this season.

TCU pitcher **Brad Furnish** was awarded a total of three national awards for the week of Feb. 20, after hurling the second no-hitter in MWC history. Furnish garnered national pitcher of the week accolades from College Baseball Newspaper (Louisville Slugger) and the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association (Pro-Line Cap). He also received co-national player of the week from CollegeBaseballInsider.com as well as being listed on the College Baseball Foundation weekly honor roll.

New Mexico junior **Chris Carlson** was named one of five Louisville Slugger National Players of the Week for the week of April 17 by Collegiate Baseball Newspaper.

San Diego State freshman **Nick Romero** was also named Louisville Slugger National Player of the Week for the week of May 8.

2006 NCAA BASEBALL CHAMPIONSHIP

The 2006 NCAA Division I Baseball Championship will feature a 64-team field with 30 automatic bids to conferences and 34 at-large qualifiers.



Each of the 16 NCAA regionals feature four teams, playing a double-elimination format. The regionals will be conducted from Friday, June 2, to Monday, June 5. Selection of the eight super regional hosts will be announced on www.ncaasports.com, Monday, June 5 at approximately Midnight (ET). The best two-of-three super regionals will be played from either Friday, June 9, to Sunday, June 11, or Saturday, June 10, to Monday, June 12. The 60th College World Series begins play Friday, June 16, at Rosenblatt Stadium in Omaha, Neb. This year's championship features a best-of-three series format for the finals.

2006 MWC BASEBALL CHAMPIONSHIP

The 2006 Mountain West Conference Baseball Championship will be hosted by UNLV in Las Vegas from May 23-27. All seven MWC teams will compete in the double-elimination tournament and seedings will be determined by regular-season results in conference games.



The MWC Championship will take place at 3,000-seat Earl E. Wilson Baseball Stadium at Roger Barnson Field. The park dimensions are 335 feet down the left and right field lines, 375 feet in the power alleys, and 400 feet to straightaway centerfield.
