CHARLOTTE 49ERS AT #9/#8 DUKE

Tues., Nov. 17 -- 6:00 p.m.; Cameron Indoor Stadium (9,314), Durham, N.C.

Charlotte (2-0) at #9/#8 Duke (2-0)

Charlotte is 0-2 all-time vs. Duke, with both losses coming at Cameron Indoor Stadium in the early '90's. Charlotte lost 111-94, Dec. 1, 1990, despite a 30-point effort from freshman Jarvis Lang. The following year, the 49ers came in nationally-ranked after an 11-1 start, but fell to the top-ranked Blue Devils 104-82. Lang missed that season after suffering an injury in the first game of the season. Charlotte had posted top 25 wins over DePaul and Alabama in pushing into the national rankings. Jeff Mullins, a Duke all-America and jersey retiree, coached the 49ers in both games.

Charlotte is 25-46 all-time against top 25 foes, including an 8-19 record vs. top 10 teams. Head coach Bobby Lutz is 5-14 against top 10 opponents and owns the 49ers only two top 10 true road wins: at #7/#7 Syracuse, 2003-04 (W, 96-92); at #8/#7 Cincinnati, 2003-04 (W, 86-83).

Charlotte Faces Duke in NIT Season Tip-Off

The Charlotte 49ers powered past Elon, 75-61, in the first round of the DICK'S Sporting Goods NIT Season Tip-Off First Round and will face #9/#8 Duke in the bracket championship (ESPN, Brad Nessler, Jimmy Dykes; WBCN Radio, 1660 AM: Matt Swierad, Charlie Frederick). The game is being televised as part of ESPN's College Basketball Tip-Off Marathon. The winner earns a trip to Madison Square Garden for the Tip-Off Semifinal and Championship rounds.

Charlotte has used an inside-out balance to move to a 2-0 start for the third time this decade (2007-08; 2000-01). In a season-opening win vs. UNC Asheville, shooting guard Shamarr Bowden debuted with 21 points on 6-of-11 three-pointers. Against Elon, power forward Shamari Spears made his 49ers debut and scored 23 points on 10-of-17 shooting. Charlotte reached the post-season in each of the other two years with 2-0 starts this decade (2008 NIT; 2001 NCAA)

DEPTH: Just two games into the season, seven different 49ers have already scored in double figures in a game - led by Shamari Spears (23 vs. Elon), Shamarr Bowden (21 vs. UNC Asheville) and DiJuan Harris (14 vs. UNC Asheville; 10 vs. Elon). 12 different 49ers have already hit the scoring column.

SEASON STARTS:

Charlotte is looking to start a season 3-0 for the first time since 1995-96. Charlotte started 4-0 that season, but ended the year 14-15.

FANTASTIC FROSH:

Red-shirt freshman Shamarr Bowden, A-10 co-Rookie of the Week, scored 21 points in just 11 minutes in his 49ers debut, hitting 6-of-11 three-pointers. In particular, Bowden hit four consecutive threes within a timespan of 1:07 in the second half after UNC Asheville had cut Charlotte's lead to one. His scoring spree pushed the lead back to a more comfortable double digits. Freshman forward Chris Braswell notched a double-double in his collegiate debut, scoring 10 points with 11 rebounds. He hit 6-of-8 free throws and added three assists.

NIT SEASON TIP-OFF, NOV. 16-17, DURHAM, N.C.

The 49ers head to Durham to participate in the DICK'S Sporting Goods NIT Season Tip-Off. This is Charlotte's first-ever appearance in the NIT Tip-Off. Charlotte defeated Elon, 75-61, Monday and will face Duke in round two. The undefeated winner of the bracket will advance to the Tip-Off Semifinals/Finals in Madison Square Garden, Nov. 25-27. The teams that don't advance will compete in two more games in the Tip-Off third and fourth round games at a site to be determined, Nov 23-24.

Charlotte is 0-2 all-time vs. Duke, dropping a pair of road games under head coach Jeff Mullins, a former Duke All-America (L, 94-111, 12/1/90; L, 82-104, 1/18/92).

INSIDE THE GAME - NOTES ON ELON WIN:

In his 49ers debut, junior forward Shamari Spears was a beast inside, scoring a game-high 23 points on 10-of-17 shooting. Meanwhile, the 49ers defense held Elon to 31% shooting thanks in part to 15 blocked shots, seven by junior center Phil Jones (his career-high). 11 different 49ers scored and five different 49ers knocked down a three-pointer as head coach Bobby Lutz continues to make his depth an asset. Senior point guard DiJuan Harris scored in double figures for the second straight game (10 points) and added a game-high 8 rebounds, six assists and three blocked shots.

20-SOMETHINGS:

Both red-shirt freshman Shamarr Bowden and junior Shamari Spears made their 49ers debut in fine fashion. Bowden hit 6-of-11 threes in scoring 21 points in the 49ers victory over UNC Asheville. Spears hit 10-of-17 shots to score a game-high 23 points as the Niners downed Elon in the NIT Season Tip-Off First Round.

SKED STRENGTH (AP/ESPN USA TODAY POLLS LISTED):

Charlotte will play four teams that are consensus preseason top 25 teams (#10/#11 Tennessee, #19/#23 Louisville, #21/#22 Dayton and #22/#20 Georgia Tech) with a possibility of playing a fifth (#9/#8 Duke) in the NIT Tip-Off. Two other foes: Xavier and Old Dominion are receiving votes.

IN-SEASON TOURNEY TIME:

Charlotte was 0-3 at last year's in-season tournament (ESPN's 76 Classic in Anaheim, Ca.). The previous year, the 49ers went 1-2 at the Paradise Jam (St. Thomas, USVI). The 49ers are 13-16 under Lutz at in-season tournaments. The last first round win came at the BCA Invitational at Wyoming (W, 82-65 vs. Coppin State, 2005-06). The last tourney title: 2004-05 Cable Car Classic (W, 80-74 vs. Yale; W, 66-52 vs. Central Connecticut). The 49ers also own a title at the 2000-01 CoSIDA Classic at NC State under Lutz. Charlotte is 2-2 in in-season tournament title games under Lutz, with wins in the last two title games they've reached.

**HEAD COACH
BOBBY LUTZ:**

The 49ers all-time winningest coach, Bobby Lutz (pronounced "Loots") is 201-146 (.579) in his 12th year as head coach of the Charlotte 49ers. In his 21st career year, he owns a career mark of 382-237 (.617). He holds the 49ers career coaching record with five NCAA Tournament trips. He is the first coach in 49ers history to reach 200 career win and just the second to reach 100 wins (Jeff Mullins, 182-142). Lutz has advanced to post-season play in eight of 11 seasons (NCAA - 1999; 2001; 2002; 2004; 2005; NIT - 2000; 2006; 2008); earned five berths to the NCAA Tournament (advancing to the 2nd round twice), won two C-USA Tournament titles (1999, 2001) and one C-USA regular-season title (2004).

In 2005, he was a finalist for the Jim Phelan National Coach of the Year Award after going 21-8 and advancing as high as #18 in the AP poll. In 2004, he was named the Mid-Atlantic Region Coach of the Year by Basketball Times after a 21-9 season that included a perfect 3-0 record vs. Top 10 teams.

In 1999, he became the third 49ers first-year coach to amass a 20-win season (Lee Rose; Melvin Watkins). He is 13-8 in conference tournament action; and 2-5 in the NCAA Tournament.

He produced a 23-11 record in his first season, capturing the Conference USA Championship with four wins in four days and an NCAA Tournament berth. That team produced the program's highest NCAA seed (#5), the program's highest RPI (#18) and a final AP rank of #24.

Lutz, a 1980 UNC Charlotte High Honors graduate, coached Pfeiffer University from 1986-95 and produced a program-best record of 181-91 (.665) including marks of 22-11, 29-4, 30-5, 23-6, 24-6 and 25-8 in his last six seasons for a combined mark of 153-42 (.785) from 1990-95. His Falcons played in six straight NAIA National Tourneys, including the "Final Four" in 1991, '92, and '95 (title game), the "Elite Eight" in 1990 and the "Sweet 16" in 1994.

Lutz joined the Charlotte program as an assistant in Jeff Mullins' 11th and final year (he retired), 1995-96, and was a Melvin Watkins' assistant from 1996-98. He was named head coach April 9, 1998 after being appointed Interim Head Coach, March 31.

A resident of Harrisburg, N.C., Lutz was Grand Marshall of the 2001 Harrisburg, N.C. 4th of July Parade, and was presented a key to the city following the

team's 2001 C-USA Championship.

AWARDS AND HONORS FOR LUTZ:

Bobby Lutz was a finalist for the 2005 Jim Phelan National Coach of the Year Award after leading Charlotte to a 21-8 record and C-USA runner-up finish and a four-week stay in the national polls. He was the 2004 Mid-Atlantic Region Coach of the Year by Basketball Times after leading Charlotte to a 21-9 record, a share of the Conference USA Regular-Season Championship and a berth in the NCAAs.

Lutz was inducted into the UNC Charlotte Alumni Hall of Fame, Nov. 9, 2002. In the summer of 2002, he was named Carolinas "Father of the Year". Lutz is on the Pfeiffer University Board of Directors. He was inducted into the Pfeiffer Hall of Fame, Oct. 9, 1999. Pfeiffer hosts the annual Bobby Lutz Tournament in Misenheimer, N.C. each Thanksgiving. Head coach at Pfeiffer for nine years, Lutz put Pfeiffer (N.C.) basketball on the map, taking the NCAA II school to six NAIA Tournaments, including three "Final Fours" and one NAIA National Runner-Up finish.

HOME AT HALTON:

The 49ers have won at least 10 home games in 10 of the 13 seasons at Halton Arena with an Arena record 12 wins posted in 2007-08 and 2004-05. The 49ers have advanced to post-season play in 10 of the 13 years that they have called Halton home. Overall the Niners boast a 135-40 (.771) record in the 14th year at Halton.

INSIDE THE GAME - NOTES ON UNC ASHEVILLE WIN:

Three key stages of the season opening win. **Stage One (1st half):** Junior Phil Jones notched his first career double-double by halftime with 10 points and 10 rebounds to push Charlotte to a 13-point lead at the break. Charlotte owned the boards in the first half, 32-15, with Chris Braswell adding eight in the first frame. **Stage Two (Rally Killer):** The Bulldogs cut the lead to one before Shamarr Bowden stepped up, knocking down three-pointers on four consecutive possessions over a span of 1:07 to push the lead back to double-digits. **Stage Three (Ice it):** In the final 2:09 junior Charles Dewhurst came up with five defensive rebounds and hit 8-of-8 free throws to thwart any final come back attempts. In fact, Charlotte hit 16 straight free throws over the final 3:06 (Dewhurst, 8-of-8; DiJuan Harris, 6-of-6).

BOWDEN'S BIG DAY:

With 21 points against UNC Asheville, red-shirt freshman Shamarr Bowden became the first 49er freshman since teammate An'Juan Wilderness to score 20 or more points. Wilderness scored 21 points against Wake Forest (11/29/07). Prior to that, Leemire Goldwire scored 22 points vs. Yale as a freshman in the Cable Car Classic, Dec. 28, 2004. 2001 ESPN.com National Freshman of the Year Rodney White was the last 49er freshman to score 20 or more points in his debut (22 pts. vs. Fordham in 2000 CoSIDA Classic). White also scored 21 points in game two (vs. NC State).

NEW FACES:

Several new faces fill out the 49ers 16-man roster, including an incoming class that includes sophomore combo guard Derrio Green, freshman frontcourters Chris Braswell and KJ Sherrill and long-limbed shooter Gokhan Sirin. In addition, two 49ers who were with the team last year: Boston College transfer Shamari Spears and red-shirt freshman Shamarr Bowden made their 49ers' debuts this season.

BIRTHDAY WISHES:

DiJuan Harris' turned 23 on the date of the season-opener, Friday, Nov. 13. He scored 14 points with five rebounds, six assists and three steals. Senior Ian Andersen celebrates his 22nd birthday, Dec. 6, the day after the 49ers game at Louisville while freshman Chris Braswell turns 20, Dec. 18, two days before a road game at Winthrop.

THE KISSING BANDIT:

Senior shooter Ian Andersen, who blows kisses to his wife, Jill, after every made three-pointer, scored 15 or more points in seven games and scored in double digits 18 times, last year. The 49ers second-leading scorer, Andersen knocked down 81 three-pointers. He shot .355 from long-range. He hit 5-of-7 threes in the Niners win over #16/#17 Xavier on his way to a game-high 16 points. He hit a career high 7 treys (7-of-11) vs. Clemson, on his way to a career-best 21-point effort and nailed 6 second-half threes in the Niners comeback win at Southern Illinois. He had 5 vs. Xavier, at Duquesne and vs. Winthrop. He now has 168 career three-pointers made, 9th all-time in school history, 6 shy of #8 De'Angelo Alexander (174) and 32 shy of becoming the seventh 49er to reach 200.

JONES' BLOCK PARTY:

Junior center Phil Jones led the 49ers with 43 blocks (1.4/gm), last year, which are the 10th most in a single-season in school history. This season he already has eight, including a career-high vs. Elon in the first round of the NIT Season Tip-Off.

616 STRAIGHT GAMES WITH A TREY:

After hitting 6 treys vs. Elon, the 49ers have scored at least one three-point field goal in 616 straight games, which includes all 302 games played in the 90s, and every game in the last 20 years. The last game without a trey was in a win over Jacksonville, 2/23/89. The 49ers streak ranks 9th in the nation.

BIG WINS:

The 49ers posted a pair of impressive home wins in the month of February, handing Dayton just its third loss of the season with a 13-point victory, 79-66, Feb. 8. Less than two weeks later the 49ers down #16/#17 Xavier, 65-60. The 49ers are the only A-10 team to defeat both Xavier and Dayton this season. The 49ers were 1-2 in Top 20 games this season and the Xavier win was the 49ers second top 20 win in as many seasons. The 49ers toppled #18/#19 Clemson, 82-72, on the road, in 2007-08. Charlotte scored 79 points against Dayton (79-66), which ranked 2nd in the A-10 in scoring defense; and allowed just 60 points to Xavier (65-60), which ranked third in the A-10 in scoring offense.

STREAK CONCLUDES:

In each of head coach Bobby Lutz's first 10 years, the 49ers boasted the league leader in three-pointers made or three-pointers made per game. That streak came to an end in 2008-09, when Ian Andersen led the 49ers with 81 three-pointers made (2.61/gm) to rank fifth in the A-10. In 2006-07, Rhode Island's Jimmy Baron led the A-10 in three-pointers made, the first time a 49er had not led their league in Lutz's tenure -- but Charlotte's Leemire Goldwire did lead the league by hitting 3.03 threes per game (91 overall). In 2008-09, Goldwire was 1st in the A-10 in threes made (128) and 2nd in threes made per game (3.76/gm).

HOME GROWN:

Three 49ers (Charles Dewhurst, DiJuan Harris, Javarris Barnett) hail from Charlotte. Dewhurst played at Charlotte Latin while both Harris and Barnett played at Victory Christian. In addition, freshman KJ Sherrill (Cleveland, N.C./West Rowan) and Shamari Spears (Salisbury, N.C./Salisbury H.S.) are from nearby counties. In all the 49ers have nine players on their 17-man roster from North Carolina. The Niners have had a nice track record with local talent, including Lew Massey (South Mecklenburg H.S.) Byron Dinkins (East Meck), DeMarco Johnson (North Meck), Jobey Thomas (Independence), and Curtis Withers (West Charlotte) who all rank in the 49ers all-time Top 10 scorers. E.J. Drayton (Vance) and George Jackson (East Meck), who holds the 49ers single-game (45 points) and single-season (24.5 ppg) scoring records, are Charlotte natives.

CAPS AND GOWNS:

Over the last five years, the 49ers have graduated 14 seniors that have exhausted their eligibility. May, 2009: Charlie Coley, III; May, 2008: Leemire Goldwire; Sean Phaler, December, 2007: Jerrell Jamison. May, 2007 E.J. Drayton and Travis Gordon. The entire senior class of 2006: Curtis Withers, Chris Nance, Marcus Bennett, Mitchell Baldwin and Tripp Miller all graduated as did the 2005 senior class: Eddie Basden, Brendan Plavich and Chris Sager.

THREE 49ERS TAKEN IN NBDL DRAFT:

Three former Charlotte 49ers were selected in the 2009 NBDL Draft, including Curtis Withers, who was taken with the 11th overall pick in the first round by the Dakota Wizards. Also selected were former stars Leemire Goldwire and De'Angelo Alexander.

Withers, one of just three players in school history to earn first team all-conference honors three times, is the 49ers third all-time leading rebounder and seventh all-time leading scorer. He helped the 49ers to three post-season ap-

pearances, including the 2004 and 2005 NCAA Tournaments. A three-time team MVP, Withers led Charlotte to a share of their first Conference USA regular-season title in 2004. He graduated with 1750 career points and 1042 career rebounds -- one of just three players to eclipse the 1500 point mark and the 1000 rebound plateau.

Two-time team MVP Leemire Goldwire, who scored thirty or more points six times while averaging 18.6 points during his senior season in 2008 was taken with the 52nd overall pick in the fourth round by Sioux Falls. Alexander, a 2006 first team all-Atlantic 10 choice who led the 49ers in scoring in both 2006 (17.0 ppg) and 2007 (17.6 ppg) was taken with the 117th overall pick in the eighth round by Rio Grande Valley.

CHAMPIONSHIP CHATTER:

Starting in 2010, a new format will be in place for the Atlantic 10 Men's Basketball Championship. The top 12 teams will qualify for the Championship; however the first round games will be hosted on the campuses of teams seeded

#5, #6, #7, and #8 on Tuesday, Mar. 9, 2010. The setting for the Championship then shifts to Boardwalk Hall in Atlantic City, N.J., as the quarterfinal round commences on Friday, Mar. 12. Semifinal action will take place on Saturday, Mar. 13, with the Championship game held on Sunday, Mar. 14, and televised live nationally at 1:00pm on CBS Sports for the first time in A-10 history.

MULTIPLICITY:

For the 15th time in conference history and sixth since 2000, the Atlantic 10 earned multiple at-large berths to the 2009 NCAA Men's Basketball Championship as league champion Temple was joined by Dayton and Xavier in the field of 65. The league received two of just four at-large bids awarded to non-BCS conferences and over the past two years, the A-10 leads all non-BCS conferences with six NCAA berths.

MORE TV TIME FOR THE A-10 IN 2010:

The league's television schedule for the upcoming season consists of 133 televised contests representing 206 appearances, including the title game of the 2010 Men's Basketball Championship on Mar. 14 at 1:00pm on CBS Sports for the first time in league history. Among the highlights for this season's television schedule: 73 A-10 matchups will air on television this season, an increase of 25 percent from a year ago; an 18 percent increase in the total number of television appearances from last season; greater distribution in A-10 media markets; ESPN will televise 32 men's games on its three networks as part of its college basketball package representing 41 appearances; 10 games will be carried nationally on CBS College Sports Network, including the semifinals of the 2010 A-10 Championship; and 32 league contests will be part of CBS College Sports Network's syndication package, including the quarterfinals of the A-10 Championship.

Bobby Lutz captured his 100th conference win vs. #16/#17 Xavier, 65-50, last year and picked up his 200th overall victory as 49ers head coach vs. UNC Asheville, 86-70, in the season opener, this year. Lutz now owns a 101-74 conference record. Overall, the 49ers' winningest coach has a 200-146 record with the 49ers -- the first 49ers head coach to reach the 200-win plateau.

LUTZ DONS SNEAKERS FOR COACHES vs. CANCER:

This season, head coach Bobby Lutz will again take part in the Coaches vs. Cancer "Suits and Sneakers" movement. Lutz and his staff coached in sneakers in the 49ers home game vs. Winthrop, last year, to demonstrate their support for the American Cancer Society and the fight against cancer. Coaches vs. Cancer "Suits and Sneakers Awareness Weekend" is a collaborative initiative of the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) and the American Cancer Society (the Society) designed to spotlight the fact that cancer remains a major health concern.

COACHES CURING KIDS CANCER DAY:

In addition to his participation in Coaches vs. Cancer Day, Bobby Lutz, an ambassador for Coaches Curing Kids Cancer (CCKC), hosted seven patients of the Levine Children's Hospital to a day of activities surrounding the Winthrop game, Jan. 31, in the 49ers' annual celebration of CCKC. The children toured facilities, met the team in the locker room and enjoyed some free time on the floor of Halton Arena. The 2009-10 CCKC game will be Jan. 9 vs. Saint Bonaventure.

LUTZ BAREFOOTS FOR RELIEF ORGANIZATION:

Head coach Bobby Lutz will coach barefoot, Jan. 17 vs. Saint Louis as part of an effort to raise awareness for Samaritan's Feet. Samaritan's Feet is a humanitarian non-profit relief organization based in Charlotte, N.C. whose aim is to put shoes on kids' feet all around the world. In 2007-08, IUPUI head coach Ron Hunter coached in bare feet and garnered enough attention to raise over 200,000 pairs of shoes to help impoverished children all around the world and the U.S. He asked coaches to join him last year during the weekend in which the nation honored Dr. Martin Luther King, "who is still the voice of the poor." The goal was to raise over 1,000,000 pairs of shoes. Lutz took part in the effort, last year, going barefoot at Saint Joseph's, Jan. 18. Those interested in donating to the cause can log on to www.samaritansfeet.org to contribute shoes or make a financial contribution. For a \$30.00 donation, Samaritan's Feet will be able to outfit two children with new pairs of shoes.

LUTZ OFTEN WILLING TO LEND A HAND (OR FOOT):

Charlotte 49ers head coach Bobby Lutz has been extremely active in an array of causes. In addition to wearing sneakers to support Coaches vs. Cancer or going shoeless to support Samaritan's Feet, Lutz is serving as an Ambassador for Coaches Curing Kids' Cancer and will again host young patients and take his team to visit them in the hospital. He has been the honorary chair of the Leukemia and Lymphoma Man and Woman of the Year Campaign and he hosted the 2009's Light up the Night for Leukemia and Lymphoma in October. He has twice participated in the Defense Department's Operation Hardwood "Hoops with the Troops." An avid golfer, he was named a Board Member of Charlotte's First Tee program.

Lutz's efforts often times revolve around the fight against cancer.

"There are so many worthy causes and I am honored to play a small part in various events. The fight against cancer is of particular interest to me because my two mentors at Bandys (High School): Bill Bost and Mike Matheson, lost their lives to cancer. Obviously, I and many others were touched and moved by (former 49er) Charles Hayward's battle with leukemia here at Charlotte. If my presence can raise awareness and increase funding to assist in finding a cure for these diseases that impact so many then I am thrilled to be involved."
