

**DIRECTOR, RANDY WALDRUM**

Randy Waldrum begins his eighth year as Head Women's Soccer Coach at the University of Notre Dame. Coach Waldrum — the 1999, 2000, 2003, and 2004 Big East Coach of the Year — led the Notre Dame team to the Women's College Cup in his first two years as head coach, and the NCAA National Championship in 2004.

From his first coaching job at MacArthur High School in Irving, Texas, to leading Baylor to the NCAA championship second round in its third year, Waldrum has been recognized by *US Soccer* as one of the top

soccer minds around and has held a position on the U.S. national coaching staff for the past 12 years.

Waldrum came to Notre Dame after beginning the Baylor women's soccer team from scratch in 1995. By the time he left Baylor, he had led the Bears to a 9-0-1 Big 12 Conference record and their first-ever Big 12 championship in any sport in 1998.

He holds a UEFA "A" License, and has served as assistant coach of the U.S. women's under-18 national team and for the under-20 national team as well as a National Staff Instructor for US Soccer. He also serves as an instructor for the NSCAA Coaching Schools.

**BEN WALDRUM**

Ben has joined the Irish coaching staff as an assistant working alongside his father, head coach Randy Waldrum. Since joining the Irish, Notre Dame has won 3 Big East Regular Season Championships, and the NCAA National Championship.

Waldrum - who spent 2002-2003 playing with the A League's El Paso Patriots and the Dallas Sidekicks of the Major Indoor Soccer League - first played overseas as a prep, playing in Germany at Sports School Wedau ('97) and in ('98) with the KFC Uerdingen second-division Bundesliga squad.

He then played two seasons at West Texas A&M, helping the 2000 team finish sixth in the national polls. He played in Denmark with FC Copenhagen and Helsingor IF in 2000. Spent 2001-2002 in Mexico training with UNAM Pumas and Atlante turning down a contract offer to return home and sign with A-League's El Paso Patriots.

**DAWN GREATHOUSE**

Former Baylor All-American and WUSA goalkeeper Dawn Greathouse joined the Notre Dame women's soccer staff in 2003 as an assistant coach, reuniting with her former college coach Randy Waldrum (who departed for Notre Dame after the 1998 season).

Greathouse - who trained with the U.S. Under-20 National Team in 1998 - played with the Washington Freedom in the first two seasons of the Women's United Soccer Association (2001 and '02), also playing for the San Jose Cyber Rays in '02 and '03. She has made eight career starts in the WUSA while backing up National

Team players Siri Mullinix (Washington) and former Notre Dame star LaKeysia Beene (San Jose).

She logged 7,121 minutes (sixth in NCAA history) in her four-year Baylor career while posting a 1.20 goals-against average, an .802 save percentage and 28 shutouts. The three-time all-Big 12 Conference and three-time Big 12 all-academic team honoree posted her top season as a sophomore in 1998, earning NSCAA second team All-America honors after ranking 12th in the nation with a 0.69 GAA. She helped the '98 team win Baylor's first Big-12 title in any sport - before an ACL knee sidelined her from Baylor's second straight trip to the NCAAAs.

An NSCAA and Parade All-American at Allen (Texas) High School, Greathouse helped the Texas Longhorns place second nationally and trained with the U.S. under-16 and u-17 national teams, the Region III Olympic Development Program and North Texas ODP. She was named the Dallas Morning News player of the year as a senior and was district MVP as a junior.

INSURANCE:

Accidental death and dismemberment coverage is provided according to schedule and with a maximum principal sum of \$1,000; medical expense coverage is provided with a maximum of \$50,000. Claims up to \$250 per claim are paid on the primary basis, without regard to any coverage parents might have. Claims exceeding \$250 per claim will be paid on the excess basis, meaning that family or employer group coverage must pay its maximum first. This refers to medical expenses incurred because of injury sustained during scheduled and supervised camp activities. Hernias are not covered. The contracting of illness or disease by camper is not covered under this plan. Payment for medication and/or hospitalization needed by camper as a result of illness or disease is the responsibility of the camper and his parents. Any additional coverage desired will also be the responsibility of his parents.

TRANSPORTATION:

Discount air fares are available for those needing to fly to South Bend by calling Anthony Travel, Inc. on the campus of the University at 1-800-366-3772. Identify yourself as attending the summer sports camps and save money on flights from most cities throughout the U.S. South Bend is also accessible via Amtrak and major bus lines. Notre Dame is located off the Indiana Toll Road at exit 77.

This ability can only be achieved through individual, group and team tactics, well-supervised skill development and intense training.

The staff of the Notre Dame Soccer Camp is carefully selected and oriented to provide girls with individual attention, while giving them the opportunity to grow, both as individuals and as team players.

Our coaching staff includes many of the top high school and college coaches from around the country. We also bring in the highest quality college players available. Every year a number of current and former Notre Dame players come back to campus to help our campers get to the top of their game.

CONSENT TO TREATMENT LIMITATION AND WAIVER OF LIABILITY

In consideration of my child's acceptance in the Notre Dame Summer Girls Soccer Camp, I, individually and on behalf of my minor child, do hereby release and forever discharge the University of Notre Dame du Lac and its officers, trustees, employees, contractors and representatives from all liability of any kind for any claim, demand, action, cause of action, damage, judgment, cost or expense which arises out of, occurs during or relates in any manner to my child's participation in the aforementioned summer camp or any travel incident thereto. In the event of an accident, injury (including death), illness or other damage sustained by my child while traveling to or from, or during his or her attendance at, the Notre Dame Summer Sports Camp(s). I understand and hereby acknowledge that my only remedy and my child's only remedy will be the coverage, if any, provided by the medical insurance policy covering participants in the Notre Dame Summer Sports Camps as explained in this brochure and set forth in the insurance policy. I hereby grant permission to the staff and physicians of the University of Notre Dame and any other medical provider or surgical consultant deemed advisable by Notre Dame, and any hospital or similar facility, to render to the above-named camper any medical, surgical or other treatment that they deem necessary. I understand that the University will exercise its best efforts to inform me in the event of such treatment. I also understand and acknowledge by my signature below that the University of Notre Dame does not have the medical staff or resources available during summer camps to store or administer prescription or non-prescription medications for my child. I have decided as the child's parent or legal guardian that my son or daughter is capable of taking his or her own medication(s) throughout his or her stay at Notre Dame, or that one of my child's parents or his or her legal guardian will be personally present and available to administer the medication to my child throughout the camp. I know that Notre Dame staff will not store or administer medications, prescription or non-prescription, for my child during the camp. If I decide that my child can take his or her own medication during camp, I will make arrangements, as needed, to remind my child to take his or her medication. If my child possesses any medications (prescription or non-prescription) during camp, I understand that it will be my child's sole responsibility to safeguard and self-administer the medication at all times. The University will not be responsible for lost or stolen medication(s). I, individually, and on behalf of my child and our respective heirs, successors, personal representatives and assigns hereby release and forever discharge the University and its officers, trustees, employees, contractors and representatives from all liability of any kind for any claim, demand, action, cause of action, damage, judgment, cost or expense which arises out of or relates in any manner to the use, misuse, theft, loss or failure to adequately safeguard my child's medication at any time.

The setting for the Notre Dame Summer Soccer Camp is the nationally renowned campus of the University of Notre Dame, located on the outskirts of South Bend, Indiana, 90 miles east of Chicago on the Indiana Toll Road. All campers will reside in one of the residence halls normally occupied by undergraduate students of the University. Meals will be served in the North Dining Hall. Many of the nation's finest athletic facilities will be utilized during each camp session.

APPLICATION PROCEDURES:

All prospective campers must submit the completed application portion of this brochure. Applications will be processed on a first-come, first-served basis until all sessions are filled. Acceptance of a camper will be verified upon receipt of the camp confirmation packet. Please read the confirmation packet carefully as it details the camp schedule, items to bring, as well as roommate & transportation information. If after reviewing the confirmation packet, you have additional questions, please contact the camp office at ndcamps@nd.edu or (574) 631-8788. **Before sending in this application, please make sure all 3 signature spots are signed by a parent or legal guardian and full payment is included, or your application will be returned.** Please note: There will be a \$25 walk-up fee for any application not received by the camp office prior to the start of registration.

If a camp has been filled prior to the receipt of a camper's application, the camp office will offer you the opportunity to have the application held on a waiting list if desired. If the application cannot be accepted for any reason, the application and camp fee will be returned by mail.

ROOMMATE REQUEST:

Please **do not** include your roommate request with your application, as it **will not** be considered. A roommate request form will be included in the confirmation packet, which can be filled out and returned to the summer camp office. Please keep in mind that we do our best to meet all roommate requests, however due to accommodation limitations we cannot always meet every request. The majority of our dorm rooms are doubles, but campers could be placed in singles, triples, or quads, depending on the dorm in which the camp is residing. We **do not** accept requests for triples or quads.

ELIGIBILITY:

Girls who, in June of 2006, will have completed the 5th through the 12th grades, or are between the ages of 10 and 18 are eligible.
