## BOBCATS FOCUS ON REDHAWKS

- This is the 84th meeting between Ohio and Miami. The RedHawks have won 51 of the previous meetings, including nine of the last 11 in Peden Stadium. The Bobcats picked up a 38-21 win on Oct. 15, 1988 and a 40-28 triumph on Nov. 13, 1999.
- Ohio is coming off a 48-37 loss at Akron on Nov. 7. Senior running back Kalvin McRae had 109 yards rushing and a touchdown, while senior quarterback Brad Bower threw for 239 yards and three touchdowns. Junior tight end Andrew Mooney led Ohio's receiving attack with a pair of touchdown receptions to give him seven for the season. Ohio junior safety Michael Mitchell had 12 tackles, while senior defensive tackle Landon Cohen had 3.5 tackles for loss. Kicker Michael Braunstein also booted three field goals to him 19 for the season.
- Miami knocked off Akron at home on Nov. 14 by a score of 7-0. The lone score came when senior defensive lineman Craig Mester picked up a fumble at the Zips' seven-yard line and rumbled in for the score with 9:38 to go in the game. Senior running back Cory Jones led the rushing attack with 66 yards on 18 carries. Redshirt sophomore quarterback Daniel Raudabaugh completed 16 of 31 passes for 189 yards, but also tossed three interceptions. Freshman wideout Chris Givens was the RedHawks' leading receiver with five catches for 78 yards. Redshirt junior linebacker Clayton Mullins led the way defensively with 11 tackles, including five tackles for loss and one sack.
- The RedHawks went 2-10 in 2006, including a 2-6 mark in the MAC. Miami registered wins over Buffalo and Bowling Green, while falling to Northwestern, Purdue, Kent State, Syracuse, Cincinnati, Northern Illinois, Akron, Ball State, Western Michigan and Ohio.

### SCOUTING THE REDHAWKS

- Miami is 6-5 on the season with wins over Ball State, Syracuse, Kent State, Bowling Green, Buffalo and Akron. The RedHawks have lost to Minnesota, Cincinnati, Colorado, Temple and Vanderbilt.
- The RedHawks went 2-10 in 2006 and finished fifth in the MAC East with a 2-6 record.
- Senior running back Austin Sykes is Miami's leading rusher with 460 yards on 103 carries with three rushing touchdowns. Freshman back Thomas Merriweather also has three scores on the ground. Redshirt sophomore quarterback Daniel Raudabaugh is Miami's leading passer with 1,954 yards passing, completing 159 of 288 attempts with 10 touchdowns and eight interceptions. Redshirt freshman wide receiver Eugene Harris is the RedHawks' leading receiver with 38 catches for 468 yards and two scores. Redshirt freshman Armand Robinson and redshirt junior tight end Jake O'Connell also have a pair of scores through the air.
- Redshirt junior linebacker Clayton Mullins is Miami's leading tackler with 116 tackles, 12.5 tackles for loss, four sacks, six pass breakups, one fumble recovery and one forced fumble.
- Redshirt junior punter Jacob Richardson has averaged 45.2 yards per punt and has downed 14 of his 61 kicks inside the 20.
- Sophomore Trevor Cook and junior Nathan Parseghian have combined to make just 12 of 22 field goal attempts, including seven of 17 from 30 yards or beyond.

### MCRAE, DAVIDSON EARN MAC HONORS

- Ohio senior Calvin McRae was named the Mid-American Conference East Division Player of the Week for the Week of Oct. 27, after amassing 200 yards rushing and three rushing touchdowns in the Bobcats' 38-27 victory over Bowling Green. This is the second time McRae has been honored in 2007.
- Rookie Vince Davidson was named the MAC East's Special Teams Player of the Week after a similarly impressive performance against BGSU. Davidson averaged 39.3 yards per kick return in the victory, including a 67-yard return on Ohio's first opportunity of the game, setting up a score.

### McRAE BACK TO CARRY RUSHING LOAD

Senior Calvin McRae (Decatur, Ga.) was a first-team All-MAC selection for the second straight year in 2006. He ran for 1,252 yards, the second-best single-season rushing total in school history. He has followed that effort with 1,322 rushing yards thus far this season, becoming the first Bobcat in school history to rush for at least 1,000 yards in three consecutive seasons.

McRae is currently fifth in the nation in rushing touchdowns (18) and tied for sixth in total touchdowns (19).

McRae has earned as much attention from the national media and awards committees as he surely will from opposing defenses this season. During the 2007 preseason, McRae has been recognized as an All-America candidate, a First-Team All-MAC selection and named to watch lists for both the Walter Camp award and the Maxwell Award.

Against Gardner-Webb in the season opener, McRae became the third Bobcat in school history to rush for 3,000 career yards (Stevland Hookfin, 1995-98, 3,972; Kareem Wilson, 1995-98, 3,597).

During the 2006 season, McRae tied the school record for most 100-yard games in a single season with eight, matching the record established by Hookfin in 1998. (McRae set a school-record with seven consecutive 100-yard games.) McRae surpassed Hookfin's school record for career 100-yard games with 20 in the 48-37 loss at Akron.

The 2007 campaign presents a number of opportunities for McRae to solidify his name in the record books, including one chance to complete a feat never before accomplished by a Bobcat running back. According to the complete school records, which date back to the 1960 season, no Bobcat has ever led the team in rushing yards in four consecutive seasons. Having already led Ohio as a freshman (559 yards), a sophomore (1,153 yards) and a junior (1,252 yards), McRae should be the first.

• During his junior campaign, McRae set the Ohio single-season record with 15 rushing touchdowns, a mark he surpassed in the ninth game of his senior season, re-writing the record books again. He has 18 so far this season, giving him 44 in his career, which is second on the all-time list.

• In 2006, McRae ranked 46th in the nation with 109.43 all-purpose yards per contest. In addition to averaging better than 89 yards from scrimmage on the ground, McRae also tallied 20 yards per game receiving for the Bobcats.

- As a junior, McRae totaled a team-high 1,532 all-purpose yards, which was strong enough to place fifth on the all-time single season chart for the Bobcats. McRae appears on Ohio's single-season all-purpose yard leaders list three times, having amassed 1,250 all-purpose yards during his sophomore season and 1,597 yards thus far this season.
- Against Buffalo on Oct. 6, McRae became the school's all-time leader in all-purpose yards. A total of 104 all-purpose yards against the Bulls, put McRae at 4,223 yards for his career, eclipsing the previous mark set by Steveland Hookfin (1995-98). McRae currently has 5,136 all-purpose yards.
- During the 2006 season, he led Ohio with 16 touchdowns and one two-point conversion for a total of 98 points, the second-best single-season scoring effort ever in Bobcat history. This season, he has also surpassed that total with 114 points through 11 games, tying the school record for points in a single season dating back to 1968 (the Bobcats' last MAC Championship and bowl appearance prior to the 2006 season), when Bob Houmard registered that total. McRae is currently ranked second all-time in school history with 290 career points scored. Former Bobcats quarterback Kareem Wilson (1995-98) leads the all-time list with 302 points in his career.
- McRae's aforementioned 16 total touchdowns during the 2006 season ranked second all-time in on Ohio's single-season top ten, trailing only Houmard, who found the end zone 19 times during the illustrious 1968 campaign. He has also eclipsed this mark as well, as he has 19 TDs as well this season. McRae is currently second all-time with 48 career touchdowns. The school record of 49 career touchdowns is held by Kareem Wilson (1995-98).

### McRAE'S MARKS

Against Louisiana-Lafayette, a 13-yard touchdown run for Calvin McRae at the 4:32 mark in the fourth quarter gave him his fourth touchdown of the game, tying him for first all-time in touchdowns for a game (six others have scored four in a game).

- The touchdown was McRae's third on the ground for the game, a career-high, and tied for sixth most in a single game in Ohio history.
- McRae is the first to score four touchdowns in a single game when finding the end zone both in the air and on the ground. Against the Ragin' Cajuns, McRae opened the scoring for the Bobcats by hauling in a 44-yard pass from quarterback Brad Bower. McRae added three rushing touchdowns in the second half for the victory.

### RED-HOT OFFENSE

• With one game left in the season, the 2007 Ohio offense ranks third in the all-time record book with 4,175 yards of total offense. When Ohio gains its 23rd yard against Miami, it will move into second all-time, passing the 1968 squad (4,197). If it gains 425 yards against the RedHawks, the 2007 squad will be tops all-time, surpassing the 2000 team that registered a total of 4,599 yards of total offense. The Bobcats are averaging 379.5 yards per game, which currently ranks as the third-best mark in school history.

• Ohio has scored 328 points this season, which currently ranks as the third-best total in program history, and the 29.8 points per game average stands as the fifth-best single-season average. The Bobcats would need to score 16 points against Miami to move into second (343-2000) all-time in points in a season and 49 to move into first (376-1968).

### NOTES FROM AKRON

- Ohio quarterback Brad Bower's 37 pass attempts was the most for an Ohio quarterback since Austen Everson's 37 in the GMAC Bowl loss to Southern Mississippi last season.
- Matt Schulte's 62-yard punt against the Zips was, not only a career-high for the redshirt freshman, but also marked the first time in three seasons that an Ohio punter had kicked one more than 60 yards (Matt Miller, 61 at Ohio-2004).
- The game at Akron marked the second consecutive game the Bobcats have not thrown an interception. The last time Ohio had gone consecutive games without a pick was last season in wins over Eastern Michigan and Akron.
- Ohio's 37 points marked the fifth time the Bobcats have scored at least 35 points this season, the most since 2000 when the program also registered that total five times. The last time Ohio has gone one better in a season was 1968 when it won the MAC with a 10-1 mark.

### CAREER-HIGHS

• Ohio's Joshua Abrams, Chido Nwokocha and Noah Keller each recorded career-highs in the 48-37 loss at Akron. Abrams set personal bests with seven kickoff returns and 173 yards, while Nwokocha's six catches were the most in a game for the California native. Keller, a linebacker, registered a career-high six tackles against the Zips.

### BRAUNSTEIN'S ONE YEAR PLAN

- Senior Michael Braunstein (Gilbert, Ariz.) led the nation in consecutive field goals made (20), dating back to last season when he kicked for the University of Washington, prior to his 35-yard miss in the 38-27 win at Bowling Green.
- Braunstein is the lone graduate student on the Bobcats' 2007 roster. Braunstein graduated from the University of Washington in the Spring of 2007. He came to Ohio via a now-suspended NCAA rule allowing a player who had already complete a degree program to transfer to another school to play out his or her remaining eligibility without having to sit out for a year. He is enrolled in Ohio University's Master of Sports Administration Program.
- Dating back to his time with the Huskies, Braunstein has now converted on 70 consecutive Point After Touchdown (PAT) attempts. He is 33 of 33 for Ohio this season.
- He also broke Matt Lasher's school record of 10 consecutive field goals made with a pair of successful tries (40, 38) in the 48-42 win over Eastern Michigan.
- Braunstein did everything he was asked against Wyoming in the Bobcats' 34-33 win. Braunstein was perfect on three PATs. He set a new single-game record at Ohio with four field goals made, converting from 42, 27, 27, and 30-yards, respectively. The four field goals not only marked an individual record for the Bobcats, but represented the most successful field goals for the Bobcats as a team in the program's history. His first field goal of the game was his second of the season for better than 40-yards. Braunstein also made a pair of tackles on kickoff coverage.
- Braunstein connected on a 47-yard field goal attempt in the 23-7 win over Temple, setting an Ohio career-mark and tying his personal best set during his career at Washington.

### CHRIS GARRETT: SOPHOMORE SENSATION

- After earning Freshman All-American honors during the 2006 season, Ohio's **Chris Garrett (Bristow, Va.)** wasn't about to rest on his laurels or let anyone think that his explosive rookie season was a fluke. Garrett has come on strong for the Bobcats during the early part of the 2007 season, establishing himself as one of the team's top specialists and playing an increased role during offensive possessions.
- Against Wyoming on Sept. 22, Garrett had his first career kickoff return for a touchdown. The 94-yard return tied for the second-longest all-time in school history, matching a mark set in 1964 by Jerry France against Bowling Green. The school record is held by Kahieem Maxwell, who returned a kick for 99 yards against Western Michigan in 1998.
- Garrett is one of several players in school history to return one kickoff for a touchdown, however, no one has repeated the feat. Garrett returned a punt for a touchdown during his freshman season, amassing 88-yards against Western Michigan.

### MOONEY MAKES HIS MARK(S)

- A newcomer to Ohio, Andrew Mooney has already shown Bobcat fans just what he is capable of, contributing significantly to the offensive attack against Wyoming and Kent State.
- Against the Cowboys, Mooney set new career records for a single game with three receptions for 75 yards, including a long of 68 yards, and a touchdown.
- The very next week, Mooney established two new career records against MAC foe Kent State, with four receptions and a pair of touchdowns. Mooney also scored on a two-point conversion attempt in the fourth quarter against the Golden Eagles, Ohio's first two-point conversion of the season.
- Mooney's pair of scores against Kent State marked the first time an Ohio player had tallied two touchdown receptions since William Norwood accomplished the same during the 2006 season. He would tie that mark with a pair of scores in the 48-37 loss at Akron on Nov. 7. His seven touchdowns are just one off the school mark of eight set by Todd Snyder in 1969.
- He then set a new career-mark in receiving yards with 82 at Toledo.

### DOMINATING DEFENDERS

Their counterparts on offense and special teams are not the only ones making a name for themselves in the Ohio record books. Three current players have earned a spot among the Bobcats' career defensive leaders.

• Cornerback Mark Parson (Richmond, Va.) already ranks among Ohio's career leaders in both pass breakups and passes defended (breakups and interceptions). In 2006, Parson amassed 16 pass breakups, a mark which tied for second all-time on the school's career single-season list. He currently has 24 in his career, which ranks fifth among all-time Bobcat defenders. In 2006, he also recorded 17 passes defended, which also placed fifth in the single-season records. He currently has 27 for his career, which is also fifth all-time.

• As a junior in 2006 Landon Cohen made 14 tackles for loss, a mark which ranked seventh (tie) all-time on the school's single-season leaderboard. For his career, Cohen has 38, which puts him fifth all-time in school history. Cohen also ranks in the school's top ten all-time in TFLs in a single game (at Kent State-2006, at Akron-2007), where a mark of 3.5 ties him for seventh in school history.

• Junior Jameson Hartke earned a starting role at defensive end as a sophomore and put up the stats to prove that he'd earned it. During his sophomore season in 2006, Hartke tallied 7.5 sacks against opposing quarterbacks, a mark which ranked fifth all-time on the single-season list. His pair of sacks against Kent State is tied for fifth all-time for a single game effort. Hartke is the Bobcats' active leader with 13.0 sacks, which places him in a tie for fifth on the school's career leaderboards. Hartke also appears in Ohio's tackles for loss records. Against Central Michigan in the 2006 MAC Championship game, Hartke made 3.5 tackles for loss, tying for seventh all-time in a single game.

### LONG PLAYS, SHORT DRIVES

Against Wyoming, the Bobcats recorded their longest play to that point in the 2007 season, as well as their longest play from scrimmage, despite not putting together a drive of more than six plays.

• Sophomore Chris Garrett scored Ohio's first touchdown of the contest on a 94-yard kickoff return in the first quarter. The play was the Bobcats' first non-offensive touchdown of the season and Garrett's first career kickoff return to the end zone.

• Senior quarterback Brad Bower connected with Andrew Mooney for a 68-yard touchdown late in the second quarter, representing the Bobcats' longest play from the line of scrimmage. Ohio's previous longest play of the season was a 64-yard pass from Bower to Justin Fitzgerald against Louisiana-Lafayette.

### TEMPLE TIDBITS

- The 209 yards allowed to Temple was the fewest for the program since yielding just 171 to Buffalo in a 42-7 win at Peden Stadium on Oct. 21st of last season. Ohio also allowed just 13 first downs to Temple which is the lowest for the program since the Bulls recorded just 10 in that same game.
- The 48 yards rushing allowed to the Owls was the fewest allowed for the program since Akron amassed -4 yards rushing in a 17-7 Ohio win on Nov. 16 last season in Peden Stadium.
- With the 219-yard rushing performance in the 23-7 win over Temple, the Bobcats have now averaged over 261.8 yards rushing over their last four games. In the previous four, Ohio rushed for just 63.3 yards per game on the ground (0-4 record).

### OHIO POSTS BIG NUMBERS AGAINST BGSU

- The Bobcats held the ball for a remarkable 35 minutes and 23 seconds in the win. That is the highest mark for the program since posting a TOP of 36:06 in the 31-10 loss to Central Michigan in last season's MAC Championship.
- Ohio also converted nine third downs in the victory, the most since last season's 35-23 victory at Northern Illinois on Sept. 9, 2006. On the flip side, the Falcons converted 15 first downs by passing, the most Ohio has given up since surrendering 17 to Miami in a 38-7 loss on Nov. 21, 2005.
- The 17 passing attempts is also the fewest since last season's regular season finale win at Miami (34-24 Ohio win) when the Bobcats also put the ball in the air 17 times.
- Offensively, Ohio completed 70.6 percent of its passes (12-17) in the victory. That is the highest mark for the unit since a 73.5 percent effort (23-35) in the 35-23 win last season at Northern Illinois. Defensively, the Bobcats held BGSU passing to a 44.1 percent completion percentage (19-43). That is the lowest mark for an Ohio opponent since Kent State completed just seven of 20 passes (35.0 percent) in a 35-32 Bobcat win on Sept. 24, 2005.
- Ohio ran the ball 53 times in the victory over BGSU. That is the highest number for the program since rushing the pigskin 57 times in the 35-32 win over Kent State on Sept. 24, 2005. Individually, on his way to setting a career-high with 42 carries in Saturday's win, Ohio running back Calvin McRae also registered the highest number of carries since Bill Gary toted the ball a school-record 43 times in the 24-14 win at Kent State on Sept. 19, 1970.
- Ohio scored more than 21 points at Bowling Green for the first time since 1976. The 38 points were also the most points Ohio has ever scored in a game at BGSU (previous - 34, 1970).
- Ohio has scored 38 or more points in three straight (48, 40, 38) games for the first time since the 2000 season (42, 44, 52).

### TOLEDO NUMBERS

The Bobcats' 43-40 loss to Toledo in the Glass Bowl marked the fourth-highest total for Ohio in a loss in school history.

- The last time the program scored more points in defeat was a 48-41 loss, also to Toledo (ranked 23rd), on Oct. 6, 2001 in Peden Stadium. Those two games mark the only times since 1998 that the program has not registered a win when scoring at least 40 points. The last time the Bobcats allowed back-to-back 40-plus point games was Oct. 23, 2004 against Bowling Green (41-16) and Oct. 30, 2004 at Kent State (42-16).
- On a positive note, the Bobcats registered back-to-back 40-plus point outings for the first time since Oct. 12, 2002 vs. Eastern Michigan (55-27) and Oct. 19, 2002 at Kent State (50-0).
- Ohio's 560 yards of total offense rank as the fifth-highest single game total in Ohio history. The 83 combined points tied for the ninth-highest single-game total in Ohio history.
- In all, Ohio has lost 16 straight games at Toledo. The Bobcats' last win in the Glass Bowl was in 1967. Ohio has lost 11 straight games to the Rockets overall. The longest MAC winless streak that the Bobcats have endured came against Miami from 1945 to 1959 (0-14-1).
- Ohio's Nov. 4, 2005 matchup (30-21 Toledo win) was also the last time the Bobcats have fallen despite having a 100-yard rusher (Kalvin McRae-114 yards), prior to this season's contest.
- The last time Ohio had the ball less than they did in the loss to Toledo (24:45) was Nov. 15, 2005 in a 27-3 loss at Akron (23:13).

### Close Calls

Ohio's 34-33 loss at home against Wyoming was the first one-point game for the Bobcats under Head Coach Frank Solich and the leanest margin of victory in a regulation game for Ohio in more than seven seasons.

- Prior to the loss to the Cowboys on Sept. 22, Ohio's last one-point game was a 17-16 overtime win against University of Central Florida on Nov. 6, 2004.
- The last regulation (non-overtime) game Ohio played in with a one-point margin of victory for either side was a 27-26 loss at Eastern Michigan on Oct. 16, 1999.
- Previous to the 34-33 defeat against Wyoming, the closest margin of victory under current Head Coach Frank Solich was three points:

### PRICE FINDING HIS PLACE

Sophomore receiver Taylor Price has markedly picked up his production in Ohio's last seven games, especially when you compare it to the previous four. In the first four contests of the season, Price snared just five passes for 67 yards. In the last seven, the Hilliard, Ohio native has 26 catches for 374 yards and four touchdowns.

### LIGHTING IT UP...

Ohio's 48 points in the win over Eastern Michigan were the most for the program since defeating Kent State 50-0 on Oct. 19, 2002. The 42 points allowed were also the most given up by the Bobcats in an Ohio win since Nov. 16, 1968 when Ohio won at Cincinnati 60-48. The 90 combined points between the two teams represented the sixth-highest scoring game in school history and the most since 2002 when Bowling Green (72) and Ohio (21) amassed 93 on Oct. 5, 2002 in Bowling Green, Ohio.

### BAD STREAK

The 31-10 at Buffalo loss was Ohio's fourth in a row, marking the first time since 2004 that it has suffered as many consecutive defeats (Marshall, at Toledo, Bowling Green, at Kent State). The last time the program has suffered more consecutive losses was 2003 when it lost six consecutive games to close the season (at Kentucky, at Buffalo, Kent State, at Akron, #23 Miami, at Marshall).

### IRONMEN

Seniors Kalvin McRae (Decatur, Ga.), Landon Cohen (Spartanburg, S.C.) and Brett Sykes (Eastlake, Ohio) have played in every game for the Bobcats over the last three-plus seasons. Dating back to the start of the 2004 season, the trio has appeared in all 47 games in which the Bobcats have taken the field. Cohen and McRae currently share the team lead in consecutive games started, which stands at 36 games. McRae has started 43 games, earning seven starts in the middle of his freshman season.

### QUICK STARTS IMPORTANT FOR BOBCATS

- Since the start of the 2002 season, the Bobcats have played 68 games in which one team or the other has held the lead at halftime. In those games, the squad leading at intermission has won 56 times (.824).
- Ohio had won 15 straight games when leading at halftime, prior to a 34-33 loss against Wyoming at home. The streak included all seven games in which the Bobcats held the lead at the break during the 2006 season and the first contest of the 2007 season, a 36-14 win over Gardner-Webb on Sept. 1.
- The 31-23 win at Louisiana-Lafayette marked the third time in the last two seasons Ohio overcame a halftime deficit (20-10). Against Northern Illinois on Sept. 9, the Bobcats trailed 17-14 at the break, but pulled out a 35-23 win. Eastern Michigan held a one-point edge (10-9) over Ohio heading into halftime on Nov. 4, but the visiting Bobcats held the Eagles scoreless in the second half for a 16-10 win.
- The Bobcats are 1-2 when tied at halftime since the start of 2002.

### BY THE NUMBERS

Some troubling numbers have arisen this season as the Bobcats have surrendered an average of 18.7 points per game in the second half this season, which is more than double what the defensive unit (7.8) allowed last year. Ohio has particularly had trouble in the third quarter this season, yielding 28 more points (93-65) to its opponents.

### QUAD QB'S?

Four players completed passes for Ohio in the 48-42 win over Eastern Michigan, a rarity in football. Bower completed a career-high 18 passes, while reserve quarterbacks Theo Scott, Josh Febus and wideout Price all had one completion.

### LOVING THE LEAGUE

The Bobcats love it when the Mid-American Conference television package appears on the schedule as they are 4-0 over the last three seasons when they appear on the conference's network. The wins are: 38-21 over Ball State (10/22/05), 27-20 over Western Michigan (10/7/06), 17-7 at Kent State (10/28/06) and 48-42 over Eastern Michigan (10/13/07).

### STEELE'S PICKS

Phil Steele has released his midseason All-MAC team and Ohio has four players on his lists. Kicker Michael Braunstein was named to the first team, running back Kalvin McRae was named to the second team and defensive end Kris Luchsinger and safety Todd Koenig were named to the third team.

### TOO MUCH LAUNDRY

In some respects, the Bobcats have done more to stop themselves than have their opponents. Currently, Ohio is last in the MAC in both penalties (89) and penalty yards per contest (70.2). In 2006, Ohio ranked eighth in the MAC at 57.4 yards per contest and seventh in 2005 with 62.5 yards per game.

### Bobcats Win When Scoring Twenty-Eight

- Since the 1998 season, Ohio is 32-13 (.711) when reaching the 28-point plateau.
- In that same span, Ohio has had 13 victories when scoring less than 28 points, including five contests during the 2006 season (vs. Western Michigan 27-20; at Illinois 20-17; at Kent State 17-7; at Eastern Michigan 16-10; vs. Akron 17-7).
- The Bobcats had won 12 straight games when scoring at least 28 points, prior to the loss against Wyoming (34-33).
- Ohio is 26-9 since 1998 when scoring at least 30 points, 12-2 when putting up at least 40 points and 4-0 when scoring at least 50 points.

### Longest Scoring Drives

The Bobcats had a 16-play scoring drive that resulted in a field goal versus Central Michigan in the MAC Championship game. It was the 11th Ohio scoring drive of at least 15 plays since the start of the 2000 season.

### THANKFUL FOR HOMECOMING

Ohio was happy to find comfort - and a win - in the arrival of homecoming against Eastern Michigan on Oct. 13. The Bobcats are now 45-39-1 all-time on homecoming and have posted a 2-1 record against the Eagles on the occasion. Ohio has faced Miami more than any other opponent on homecoming, winning eight of 18 meetings all-time between the two schools.

### TURNOVERS?

After forcing 13 turnovers in the first four games of the season, against Eastern Michigan on Oct. 13th, Ohio failed to register a takeaway for the third game in a row.

### CENTURY MARK – TIMES TWO

Against Kent State, Ohio had a pair of passers eclipse the 100-yard mark. Both Brad Bower and Theo Scott threw for 100 yards or more against the Golden Eagles. Bower completed six of 16 pass attempts for 110 yards, while Scott set career-highs with 16 completions on 24 attempts, passing for 161 yards. It was the first time that two Ohio signal-callers have thrown for 100 yards or better since Ryan Hawk (114) and Austen Everson (104) pulled off the feat in a 28-16 win at Kentucky on Oct. 2, 2004.

### GIVING UP 200

On Sept. 29, Kent State's Eugene Jarvis went over 200 yards rushing against the Bobcats with a 42-yard carry for a touchdown with 9:28 remaining in the third quarter. It marked the first time Ohio had yielded a 200-yard rusher since KSU's Joshua Cribbs had 223 against Ohio on Oct. 30, 2004. It also marked the first time since that game that a KSU back went over the 200-yard mark.

### DONAHUE HITS CENTURY MARK

- Even as a true freshman, many people have been expecting big things from receiver Matt Donahue, and the Nebraska native is doing his best not to disappoint anyone.
- In just his fourth game on the Division I level, Donahue pulled in four catches for 113 yards against Wyoming. Three of the rookie's receptions (40, 28, and 38 yards, respectively) ranked among the longest plays from scrimmage for the Bobcats this season.
- His four receptions, 113 total yards and 40-yard catch were all career records for the freshman.
- Donahue's first 100-yard receiving game is the first 100-yard game by a Bobcat during the 2007 season and is the first by an Ohio player since Scott Mayle collected 100 receiving yards against Northwestern in 2005.

### SCHULTE LAUNCHES PUNTS

Redshirt freshman punter Matt Schulte has launched some long, long punts this season. Against Gardner-Webb, Schulte had kicks of 57 and 58 yards. In the first quarter against Virginia Tech, Schulte went one more with a new personal best, 59 yards, which turned the field position tables on the Hokies. Against Akron, Schulte continued his assault on his personal records with a 62-yard punt against the Zips. Schulte also had a career-high 13 punts against the Hokies, which tied for second all-time in the team record books. The Ohio record for punts in a game is 14, set in 1985 against Marshall.

### LUCHSINGER LOCKS IN

Ohio's Kris Luchsinger recorded his second sack of the game with 10:09 left in the fourth quarter on a Louisiana-Lafayette fourth down attempt. The sack resulted in a 10-yard loss, giving the Bobcats possession at the Louisiana 45-yard line. His two sacks were the first two of his career, and tied Ohio's fifth best single-game effort, placing Luchsinger in the Bobcat record books for the first time. In the 38-27 win at Bowling Green, he snared his first career interception and returned it 58 yards for a touchdown.

### OHIO NAMES CAPTAINS

• During fall camp, the Ohio Bobcats officially announced the 2007 Team Captains, tabbing six seniors and one junior for the roles.

• **Landon Cohen, Sr., DT, Spartanburg, S.C.**

Cohen was named second-team All-MAC in 2006 after starting all 14 games for the Bobcats. He led the Bobcats' defensive line with 14.0 tackles for loss.



• **Jameson Hartke, Jr., DE, Centerville, Ohio**

Entering his third year with the Bobcats, Hartke is tied for seventh all-time at Ohio with 11.5 career sacks. He started all 14 games in 2006 and earned second team All-MAC honors.



• **Taj Henley, Sr., LB, Richmond, Va.**

In three years with the Bobcats, Henley has played in 34 games, including all 14 of his junior campaign. He made 14 tackles during the 2006 season as a reserve linebacker.



• **Todd Koenig, Sr., S, Nanty-Glo, Pa.**

A returning starter in the defensive backfield for the Bobcats, Koenig recorded 49 tackles, including 25 solo stops during the 2006 season.



• **Kalvin McRae, Sr., RB, Decatur, Ga.**

A two-time All-MAC running back, McRae has been named to the watch list for the Walter Camp and Maxwell awards this season.



• **Matt Miller, Sr., OL, Mechanicsville, Va.**

One of three offensive linemen to start all 14 games for the Bobcats in 2006, Miller led Ohio with 61 pancake blocks and graded out at 85 percent.



• **David Shelby, Sr., OL, New Albany, Ohio**

Shelby started every game of the 2006 season, playing a team-high 856 snaps, including every snap over the final six games of the season.



### HUGE CROWD

The Bobcats and Hokies squared off in front of 66,233 fans, the most for Ohio since Coach Solich's arrival. The previous high also came against the Hokies, which was held in front of 65,115 fans.

### STOUT HOKIES

The Hokies held Ohio to just 114 yards of total offense, the lowest total for the program since amassing 110 at Akron on Nov. 15, 2005.

### COMEBACK CATS

The 31-23 win over Louisiana-Lafayette marked the first time under Frank Solich that the Bobcats have won after trailing after three quarters. Ohio scored two touchdowns in the fourth quarter for the final eight-point margin.

• Prior to the victory over the Ragin' Cajuns, Ohio was 0-12 when trailing at the start of the final stanza. The win marks the third time since 2005 that the Bobcats have won despite facing a halftime deficit. Ohio also came back to win after trailing at the break at Eastern Michigan (10-9) and at Northern Illinois (17-14).

### OHIO SCORES WELL IN GRADUATION SUCCESS RATE

Ohio student-athletes who entered school between 1997 and 2000 boast a Graduation Success Rate (GSR) of 83 percent, six points higher than the national Division I institutional average of 77 percent according to figures released Wednesday by the NCAA. Ohio posted a GSR of 82 percent in last year's numbers, which was five percent better than the national average.

In this year's edition, nine of the Bobcats' 16 varsity sport programs posted rates of 86 percent or better. Four programs had perfect scores (field hockey, men's and women's golf and women's swimming/diving). The other top scores were women's soccer (96), women's cross country/track and field (91), volleyball (88), women's basketball (87) and men's basketball (86).

The men's basketball program's score of 86 percent is 22.4 percent higher than the national average, while the Ohio football team's mark of 77 percent is 10.4 percent higher than the national football mark.

### SEASON-OPENING SAFETIES

• In each of the last two seasons, Ohio has recorded a safety during its season-opener. Against Gardner-Webb on Sept. 1, senior Joshua Abrams' third blocked punt of the game was knocked out of the Runnin' Bulldogs' end zone for a safety. Against UT-Martin in the 2006 season-opener, Ohio registered a second quarter safety to go up 9-0 en route to a 29-3 victory.

### TERRIFIC TRIFECTA

• In the season-opener against Gardner-Webb, senior Joshua Abrams wasted no time making the most of his final year with the Bobcats. In addition to scoring the first touchdown of his career on a one-yard run in the final minute of the first half, Abrams led the Bobcats' special teams effort with three blocked punts.

• Abrams blocked punts in each of the second, third and fourth quarters, tying his previous career block total of three (all recorded during the 2006 season).

• The NCAA record for blocked punts in a single game is four, shared by Ken Irvin of Memphis (1992) and James King of Central Michigan (2001).

• Abrams is now four blocks away from tying the NCAA record for punts blocked in both a single season and his career. Central Michigan's King holds the record for career blocks with 10 (2001-04), as well as blocks in a single season (7-2001).

• With six currently to his credit, Abrams is in a six-way tie for third all-time on the NCAA's career punt block list.

### OHIO HERITAGE LINE

Ohio Athletics' five Heritage line marks:

- **Interlocking OU** - This mark dates back to the 1900s and was one of the first University marks seen on athletic gear. It was used on Ohio's basketball uniforms as well as on sweaters and jackets worn by members of our earliest football and baseball teams.

- **OHIO** - This mark dates back to the 1940s & 1950s. This mark was worn primarily by the men's basketball team and was on the warm ups of the 1941 NIT runner up team. This mark was also on the basketball court at Grover Center while it served as home to Ohio Basketball in the 1960s.

- **Attack Cat** - This mark dates back to the 1960s and 1970s. This mark was the original midcourt logo at the Convo and received national exposure when Bobcat basketball standout Walter Luckett was on the cover of Sports Illustrated in 1972.

- **Full Body Bobcat** - This mark represents the first time that Ohio used a full-body Bobcat logo. It was featured prominently during the 1960s and 1970s.

- **The Paw** - This mark came into use in 1978 and was worn on the Bobcat football helmet. The Paw Print received national exposure in 1984 when the Bobcat basketball team advanced to the NCAA basketball tournament.

### BOBCATS PICKED TO WIN MAC EAST

Announced at Mid-American Conference Football Media Day in Ford Field on July 25th, the Bobcats were named the favorite to repeat in the East Division in 2007 according to the MAC News Media Association Preseason Poll.

- The Bobcats, who went 9-5 overall and 7-1 in league play in 2006 en route to a division title and an appearance in the GMAC Bowl, received 15 first-place votes in the preseason poll. Ohio garnered 216 total points, the most of any of the 13 football programs in the MAC. Kent State accumulated 203 points and was tabbed to finish second in the East Division, two first-place tallies behind Ohio.

- With 15 first-place votes, Western Michigan will enter the season the favorite in the MAC West Division. Central Michigan, the defending division and league champion, received 10 first place votes.

- WMU is also the preseason pick to win the 2007 MAC Championship with 11 votes followed by CMU with 10 and Ohio with six.

### OHIO FOOTBALL HONORED BY AFCA

The American Football Coaches Association has announced that the Ohio football team has received 2007 Academic Achievement Award honorable mention recognition.

- The award recognizes NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision programs that graduate at least 70 percent of its players. It marks the the third time in the last four years, and fourth time overall that the Bobcats have earned honorable mention accolades. Ohio was also on the honored in 1999, 2004 and 2005.

- During the 2006 season, four members of the Bobcat team were honored as Academic All-MAC honorees: Austen Everson (quarterback), Jameson Hartke (defensive end), J.J. Knabb (center), and Tyler Russ (linebacker).

- Hartke, Russ, and nose tackle Shane Yates were also honored as members of the Second-Team Academic All-District IV team.

### OHIO HIRES NEW "VOICE OF THE BOBCATS"

- Ohio Director of Athletics Kirby Hocutt has announced the hiring of Warren Swain to the position of Director of Broadcasting, which includes play-by-play duties for the Ohio Sports Network.

- The new "Voice of the Bobcats" brings a distinguished resume to his new position in Athens. A veteran of collegiate athletics broadcasting, Swain most recently served as the play-by-play voice for Drake University. In addition to Drake, Swain's play-by-play experience includes covering Nebraska, Virginia, Oregon, Iowa State and Creighton since his career began in 1972.

- Swain's duties will extend beyond play-by-play in Ohio's Director of Broadcasting position. Swain will also be responsible for coordinating all radio broadcast activities for OSN, including games, the "Frank Solich Call-In Show" and "Tim O'Shea Call-In Show," and the daily "Bobcat Minute." Among his other responsibilities, Swain will also be involved in the coordination of OSN television broadcasts and will work with OSN affiliates.

### OHIO RELEASES HERITAGE LINE

- This announcement will allow licensees and retailers to expand their current product offering and bring back looks such as the popular "Paw Print" mark. The collection will also be supported with custom signage, hang tag options and other collateral materials.

- These marks will only enter the merchandising marketplace and will not be used as official marks for Ohio Athletics.

- Retailers in the Athens area will sell products with the Heritage marks one month before they will be released to all other licensees and retailers, which is currently scheduled for September 20, 2007.

- Ohio wide receivers coach **Dwayne Dixon** will participate in his first game as a member of the Bobcats's staff against Gardner-Webb in the season opener. Dixon joined the Ohio staff during the offseason after spending two seasons with the Wolfpack of NC State University. Dixon spent the first 15 years of his coaching career at his alma mater, the University of Florida. While he spent all of his time working with the Gators' receivers, Dixon held many titles while at Florida, including that of Assistant Head Coach from 1995-99 and 2003-04. During the 2000 season, Dixon also worked with Florida's kickoff and punt return units.

### Preseason Predictions: Early season buzz about the Bobcats

- *CBSSportsline.com's* college football preview picked the Bobcats to reign once again atop the MAC East. Out of 119 Division I-A teams across the nation, Ohio was ranked No. 86, higher than all MAC foes save for Central Michigan (66) and Western Michigan (78). *CBSSportsline* has tabbed Solich as the conference's Coach of the Year.
- *CollegeFootballNews.com* says that Ohio holds the MAC East division title in "its own hands," but predicts just a 7-5 season with losses on the road at Virginia Tech, Toledo and Akron and home defeats against Wyoming and Miami.
- *Phil Steele's College Football Preview* selected Ohio a surprising fourth in the MAC East, behind Kent State, Miami and Bowling Green, respectively.
