PRESEASON STORYLINES

- Pitt faces high expectations in 2006-07 as it returns four starters and eight of its top-10 players from a team that finished 25-8, advanced to its fifth straight NCAA Tournament and a fifth Big East Championship title game appearance in the last six years.
- Two key players depart the program: seniors Carl Krauser and John DeGroat. Krauser led last year's squad in scoring (15.0 ppg), and assists (17.0).
- Aaron Gray returns for his senior season after earning the 2005-06 Big East's Most Improved Player Award. He is an All-America candidate.
- Head Coach Jamie Dixon begins his fourth season at Pitt with a 76-22 overall record. The 76-22 record ranks tied for fourth among all-time best coaching starts after three seasons.

PANTHERS BASKETBALL PERSONALITY PROFILES

KEITH BENJAMIN

- Nickname is "K-Ruck" because he first started playing basketball at New York City's Rucker Park at the young age of 14.
- 2004 graduate of Mount Vernon High School where he helped lead his team to the 2004 state title. Sports a red #1 championship ring on his finger.
- Mount Vernon has produced several college/NBA standouts including Scooter McCray, Rodney McCray, Gus Williams, Ray Williams and former Connecticut guard Ben Gordon.
- Best friend on another college team is St. John's sophomore forward Dexter Gray, a teammate of his at Mount Vernon.
- Finished his four-year varsity career at Mount Vernon with a 98-13 overall record.

TYRELL BIGGS

- Has drawn comparisons to Boston College power forward Craig Smith because of his size and playing style.
- Became the third consecutive Pitt player to earn Windy City Classic All-Star MVP honors last summer in the Chicago All-Star Game. Chris Taft and Ronald Ramon were the previous MVP winners.
- Nickname is T.J. or TBiggs.
- Stood 6-5 inches tall and weighed 230 pounds as an eighth grader.
- Played with Pitt guard Keith Benjamin on the MetroHawks/Riverside Church AAU team.
- Has taken up golf, played the piano and bowls.
- Named a McDonald's Top-100 All-America Team finalist.

MIKE COOK

- Junior transfer from East Carolina University who will be eligible for competition in 2006-07.
- Led ECU in scoring (15.0 ppg in 2004-05) and averaged 12.8 points per game and registered 41 double-figure scoring games in two years with the Pirates.
- A Philadelphia native who played high school basketball with current Memphis Grizzlies player Hakim Warrick and Mustafa Shakur (Arizona).
- Chose Pitt for its style of basketball, location and league.

LEVANCE FIELDS

- Played at the same high school (Xaverian) attended by former Pitt player and current Golden State Warrior Chris Taft, associate head coach Barry Rohrsen and basketball video coordinator John Alesi. Several other Big East players attended Xaverian including Chris Mullin.
- Nickname is the "General" and/or "Lele."
- Played in the Jordan Classic All-Star game at Madison Square Gar-

den on April 16, 2005 and finished with 18 points, all in the second half.

- Committed to Pitt on Dec. 6, 2004, a day prior to Pitt's appearance in the Jimmy V. Classic at Madison Square Garden.
- As a high school senior, led Xaverian to eight consecutive wins en route to a state title game appearance.
- Named New York's Player of the Year by the *New York Daily News* and *Newsday*.
- Named a McDonald's Top-100 All-America Team finalist.

ANTONIO GRAVES

- Signed scholarship papers to attend Pittsburgh in late August of his senior year in high school. Was already set to attend a prep school but decided to attend Pitt after a scholarship opened.
- Has an intriguing basketball family background as his uncle Ahmed Kent ranks second on his alma mater Mansfield Senior's career scoring list, while several cousins played NCAA Division I basketball including Dapreis Davis (Nebraska, 1989-92) and Marquis Sykes (Morehead State, 1999-2003).
- Happiest and most gratifying moment in sports was signing scholarship papers with Pitt.
- Became the fifth player in seven seasons to earn a NCAA Division I basketball scholarship out of Mansfield Senior High School.
- Favorite sports figure is Washington Wizards guard and former Maryland standout Juan Dixon.

AARON GRAY

- Shattered a backboard in high school. He missed 13 games due to a broken ankle as a result of the play.
- Lost 30 pounds over the summer after working out and playing pickup basketball in Philadelphia against NBA and local college players.
- At 7-0 tall, Gray is just the second seven-footer to play for Pitt. Mark Blount (1995-97), who currently plays with NBA's Boston Celtics, was Pitt's first seven-footer.
- Named Pennsylvania's 2003 Gatorade State Player of the Year.
- Uncle Steve Gray, played basketball at Duke from 1975-79. Steve Gray played in 88 career games and, along with teammates Mike Gminski, Jim Spanarkel and Gene Banks, led Duke to the 1978 Final Four.
- Another uncle played linebacker at UCLA.
- Trained with former Pitt football player John Graham (lettered in 1983).
- Nickname is "A.G."
- Favorite movie is "Men of Honor."

DOYLE HUDSON

- Native of the Bahamas.
- Arrived in the United States in January, 2003.
- Played on the Bahamian National Team during the summer of 2004.
- Favorite all-time Christmas gift was his first bicycle.
- Favorite sports figure is San Antonio Spurs and Virgin Islands native Tim Duncan.
- Junior college coach Randy Nesbit dreamed of playing for Pitt as a youngster and is from nearby Yough, Pa.
- One of two international players on Pitt's roster (Levon Kendall, Canada).
- Nickname is "D-Nice."
- Aspires to get involved with computers and computer science.

LEVON KENDALL

- Outstanding student who is a GTE Academic All-America/All-District candidate.
- Promoted to play on the Canadian Senior National Team in 2005.
- Played on Canada's Junior National Basketball Team over the past four summers.
- Helped lead Canada to its first-ever basketball medal, a Bronze Medal at the FIBA World Basketball Championships this past summer. His most outstanding performance came against Team USA where he scored 40 points (16-22 FG) and pulled down 12 rebounds in a 93-90 overtime victory.
- One of two international players on Pitt's roster (Doyle Hudson, Bahamas).
- Interests include the drums, piano, hiking, camping, cliff diving, Buddhism, meditation, racing mountain bikes, cliff diving, white water rafting and snowboarding.
- Once played the drums in a cover band called "The Unknowns."
- Led his high school team to three Provincial titles and an 84-4 record in three-year varsity career.
- Played high school soccer (a six-foot-nine-inch goalkeeper) and played on several select soccer teams.
- Native of Vancouver, British Columbia who can speak both English and French.
- Father composes and writes music and plays.
- One of several Pittsburgh sports personalities who hail from Canada: Jason Bay (Pittsburgh Pirates) and Sidney Crosby (Pittsburgh Penguins).
- Majors in anthropology and has always had an interest in teaching.

MAURICE POLEN

- A sophomore walk-on in his first season with Pitt.
- High school coach at West Philadelphia High School was former Pitt basketball player Gerald Jordan (1995-97).
- Other notable players who attended his high school include: Gene Banks, Jordan, Ricardo Lovelace and Clarence Tillman.

RONALD RAMON

- Nickname is "Double-R" for Ronald Ramon. Krauser nabbed him "Double-R with the Radar."
- Hails from a basketball family as his father Ricardo Ramon played professional basketball in the Dominican Republic, Brazil and Argentina. His role model is his father because he "showed him everything."
- Played for one of the nation's top AAU basketball programs, the New York Gauchos. Other Pitt basketball players who played for the Gauchos include Jerry McCullough, Eric Mobley and current Director of Basketball Operations Orlando Antigua.
- Native Dominican who follows in the footsteps of several former Pittsburgh Dominican players including Ricardo Greer, Jaime Peterson and Orlando Antigua.
- Invited to play on the Dominican Republic basketball team this summer but his schedule would not allow it.
- Fluent in Spanish.
- All Hallows High School retired his jersey No. 14 at the conclusion of his career.
- Named Most Valuable Player at the Wendy's All-Star Shootout in Chicago after scoring 23 points, hitting five 3-pointers (including three in the final five minutes) and registering three assists.

SAM YOUNG

- Named the 2004-05 National Prep School Player of the Year by Scout.com.
- Has drawn comparisons to Villanova forward Curtis Sumpter because of his size and playing style.
- Favorite sports figure is Michael Jordan and also sports his number 23.
- Interested in gymnastics because of his natural ability. When Young was visiting Pitt on his recruiting trip, the coaches took him on a tour of the athletic facilities. When he saw the gymnastics equipment, he started doing several tricks and backflips.
- Prior to his senior season at Friendly H.S., promised to do back flips if his team won the state title, then held true on his promise after he led the team to the championship.
- Owns a 35-inch vertical leap.

FOURTH SEASON AS HEAD COACH/8TH YEAR AT PITT • TCU '87 • 76-22 OVERALL RECORD

In his fourth season as the University of Pittsburgh's head men's basketball coach, Jamie Dixon has certainly made his mark on the Pitt program. Dixon, who has spent a total of eight years at Pitt, has compiled several coaching milestones:

- He became the first head coach in school history to guide Pitt to three consecutive 20-win seasons and three straight 10-plus win Big East regular seasons.
- Became the second head coach at Pitt to lead the school to three straight NCAA Tournaments. Paul Evans guided Pitt to three straight appearances from 1987-89.
- Ranks tied for fourth among the all-time best starts to an NCAA Division I coaching career with 76 career wins.
- Compiled the school's best record for a head coach after only three years of service (76-22) and reached 70 career victories faster than any other coach in school history.
- Amassed a three-year 33-15 Big East regular-season record.
- Recorded the best current career winning percentage among Big East coaches (.679).
- Tallied a 48-6 home record in his first three seasons.
- Advanced to the Big East Championship final in two of his three seasons as head coach at Pitt.

In 2003-04, Dixon became the first rookie head coach in Big East history to both guide his team to the league's regular-season title and earn Big East Coach of the Year honors. Dixon earned those accolades after leading the Panthers to their third consecutive Big East regular-

season title and second all-time overall Big East title, third straight NCAA Tournament "Sweet Sixteen" appearance and to a school-record 31 wins. In addition, the 31 victories rank as the third all-time highest total in NCAA Division I history for a first-year head coach. Dixon also led Pitt on an 18-game win streak to begin the 2003-04 season, a streak which ranks as the third-best start for a rookie head coach in NCAA Division I history.

An outstanding talent evaluator who is nationally recognized for his coaching know-how, unquestioned character and integrity, recruiting skills, rapport with players and work ethic, Jamie Dixon was introduced as the University of Pittsburgh's 14th head basketball coach on April 15, 2003.

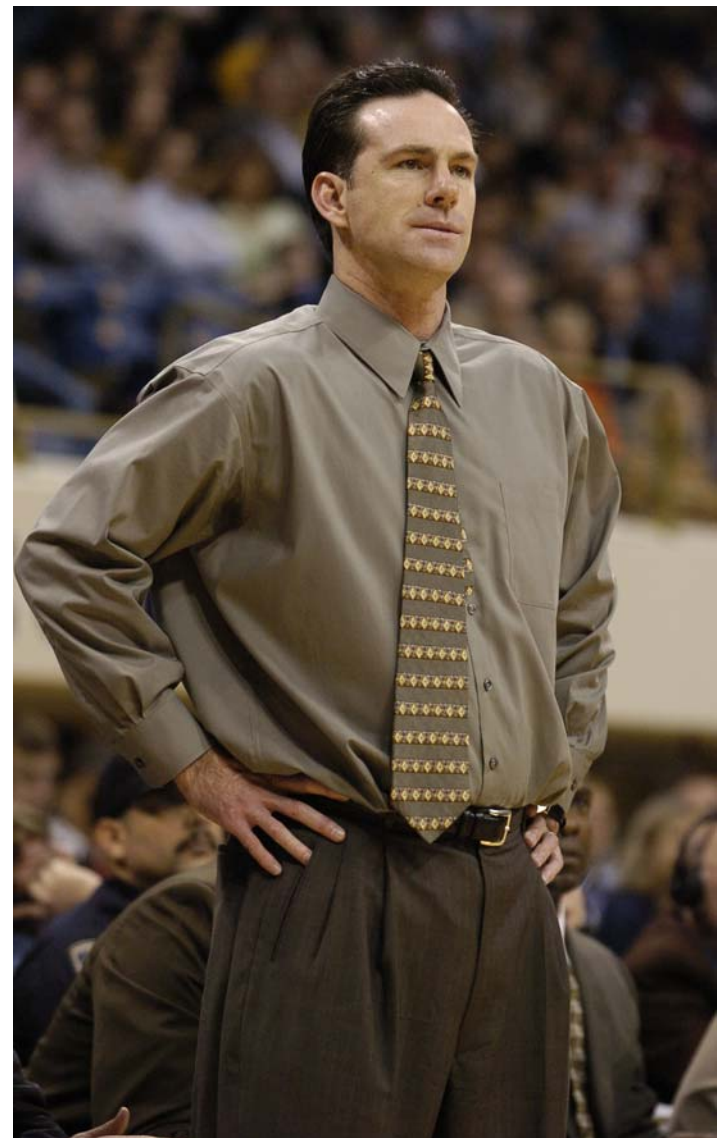
Dixon, who has spent eight seasons as both the head coach and assistant at Pitt, is a basketball coach who is smart, intelligent, honest, confident, well-spoken, genuine and true to his word. He is a family man and complete coach who cares for his players and program to the highest degree. For Dixon, basketball is a lifestyle, not a job. He believes teamwork, defense, rebounding and taking good shots are the key ingredients to winning championships. That philosophy has paid off as Pitt consistently ranks among the nation's top defensive and rebounding squads.

Dixon's three-year head coaching tenure at Pitt has seen the Panthers compile a 76-22 record, accumulate a 33-15 Big East regular season record and earn three NCAA Tournament berths, including a Sweet Sixteen appearance in 2003-04. His

76-22 slate set a school record for the best three-year start to a Pitt coaching career. His .776 winning percentage currently stands as the best career winning percentage among active Big East coaches. The 2003-04 squad won the Big East regular-season title with a school-record 31 wins.

Over the past eight seasons, Dixon has been an essential figure in the Panthers' dramatic rise to national prominence. The three-year period

from 2001-04 produced the winningest four-year period in school history (107-30 record) and witnessed Pitt achieve three consecutive Big East regular-season titles, advance to three straight NCAA Sweet Sixteen appearances, capture the program's first-ever Big East Tournament title in 2003, and compile one of the nation's three best winning percentages (.846 with an 88-16 record) from 2001-04 including a 51-2 home record over the last

three years. In addition, the program opened its sparkling, 12,508-seat Petersen Events Center, the nation's best on-campus basketball venue.

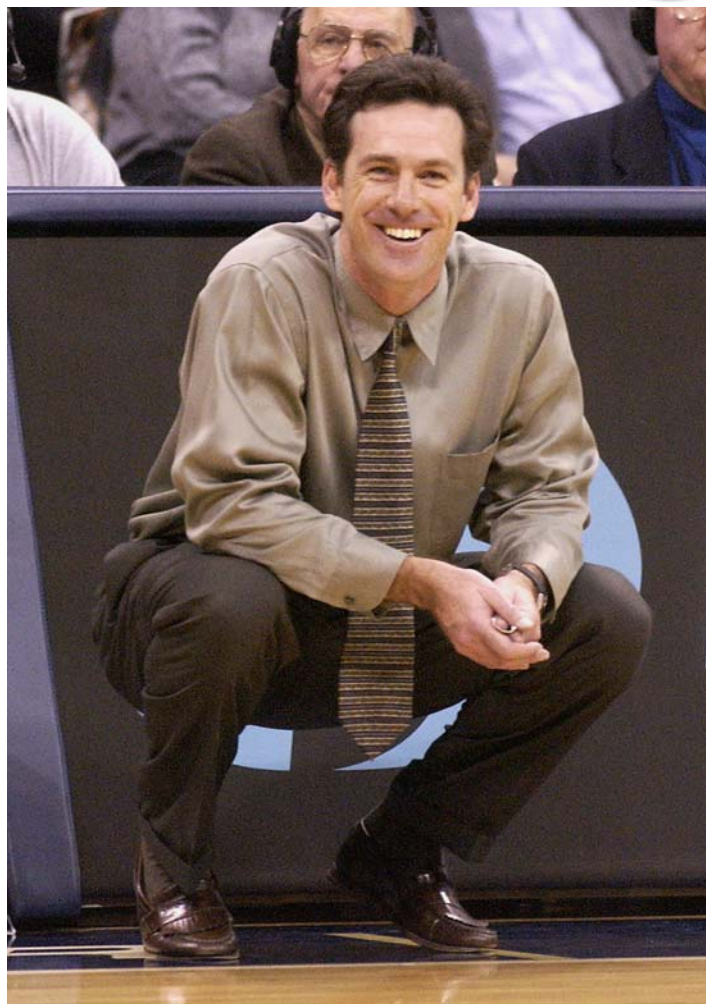
Dixon owns 15 years of major NCAA Division I coaching experience, including stints at Pitt (seven years), Northern Arizona (four years), Hawaii (three total years) and at UC-Santa Barbara (one year). Additionally, he has served as an assistant under a school's winningest coach in four different stints (winning percentage). His teams have won nine conference titles, advanced to the postseason in 10 different seasons and his student-athletes have earned four league player of the year awards. He helped turn destitute programs at Pitt, Hawaii and Northern Arizona into winners, has been a winner everywhere and has been a success at several different levels.

Facing a major rebuilding project, he joined the Pitt staff in 1999 as associate head coach and recruiting coordinator. And in four short years, he helped turn the Pitt basketball program into a consistent national power. In 2000-01, the Panthers surged through the conference tour-

namment, earning a surprising Big East Championship title game berth while winning five of their last seven contests. It was that year in Madison Square Garden that the college basketball world first took notice of the emerging Pitt program as the Panthers upset nationally ranked Syracuse, Notre Dame and a surging Miami team to earn the school's first-ever championship game berth. That strong finish concluded with a National Invitation Tournament berth, the school's first postseason appearance in four years.

The 2001-02 Pitt team built upon that momentum as it finished 29-6 and surpassed the school-record of 25 victories set in 1973-74. Pitt won the Big East West championship, the school's first league title of any kind since the 1987-88 campaign, and made its first NCAA Tournament appearance in nine seasons (1992-93). The squad also became the first Pitt team to advance to an NCAA Sweet Sixteen since 1973-74 with two NCAA tournament wins over Central Connecticut State and California.

With all five starters and nine letterwinners back, the 2002-03 Pitt

squad captured the school's first-ever Big East Tournament championship while making its third straight appearance in the title game. It finished 28-5 on the year and advanced to its second consecutive NCAA Sweet Sixteen. The Panthers also won their second straight Big East West title and co-Big East regular-season title with a second consecutive 13-3 league record. In addition, the Panthers concluded the inaugural season of the Petersen Events

Center with a perfect 16-0 home record and ended the season on a 22-game home win streak.

In his first season as head coach at Pitt (2003-04), Dixon guided the Panthers to a school-record 31-5 slate which included the Big East regular season championship, a third consecutive "NCAA "Sweet Sixteen" appearance and the program's fourth straight Big East Tournament title game appearance. He became the first rookie head coach in league history to both earn Big East Coach of the Year honors and guide his team to the regular season title. He led Pitt to a school record 27-3 regular season and its first Big East Tournament No. 1 seed in 16 years. Dixon also won the first 18 contests of his coaching career, a mark that ranks third in NCAA Division I history for most wins to begin a coaching career.

His second season at Pitt saw Dixon guide the Panthers to a school-record fourth straight NCAA Tournament appearance and the program's fourth consecutive 20-plus win season (20-9).

In 2005-06, Dixon guided Pitt to a fifth straight NCAA Tournament appearance, 25-8 record and fifth berth in the Big East Championship final over the last six seasons. The year marked Dixon's third straight 20-win season since taking over the coaching helm.

Prior to Pittsburgh, Dixon served as an assistant coach at the Univer-

sity of Hawaii under legendary head coach Riley Wallace for the 1998-99 season and previously was an assistant under Ben Howland at Northern Arizona University (1994-98). He also coached as an assistant with Howland at the University of California-Santa Barbara (1991-92) under Jerry Pimm before moving on to the University of Hawaii for two seasons (1992-94).

While at Northern Arizona, Dixon helped lead the Lumberjacks to a 42-17 record over his last two years, including back-to-back 21-win seasons and a pair of Big Sky regular-season championships. Northern Arizona led the nation for three consecutive seasons (1997-99) in 3-point field goal percentage and ranked among the nation's top two schools in overall field goal percentage during that span. In addition, Northern Arizona won 20-plus games in three consecutive seasons and advanced to postseason play two times, including the 1997 National Invitation Tournament and the school's first-ever NCAA Tournament appearance in 1998. The 1998 Lumberjack squad was one of two teams to reach the NCAA Tournament and carry a team grade point average of 3.0 or better.

Howland and Dixon arrived at Northern Arizona for the 1994-95 season. After suffering through back-to-back 9-17 and 7-19 seasons, the staff guided Northern Arizona to the 10th-best one-year turnaround in NCAA basketball history, improving the Lumberjacks from a 7-19 record in 1995-96 to a 21-7 record in 1996-97.

Dixon completed his first stint as an assistant coach at the University of Hawaii from 1992-94 under head coach Riley Wallace. In 1993-94, he helped lead the Rainbows to their first-ever WAC championship and first NCAA Tournament appearance in nearly 30 years. Dixon was also instrumental in developing the Rainbows' perimeter players, including former Phoenix Suns guard and Buffalo, N.Y. native Trevor Ruffin. In his second stint at Hawaii (1998-99), he worked with the perimeter players including Denver Nugget Predrag Savovic and concentrated on recruiting both nationally and abroad. At UC-Santa Barbara, Dixon helped lead the Gauchos to an NIT appearance in 1992.

Dixon began his coaching career in 1989 as the head coach at TeAute College in New Zealand before serving as an assistant coach from 1989-

91 at Los Angeles Valley Junior College where he helped head coach Jim Stephens lead the school to a Western States Conference Championship.

A North Hollywood, Calif. native, Dixon attended Notre Dame High School in Sherman Oaks, Calif., where he earned All-Del Rey League and All-California Interscholastic Federation honors. Dixon enjoyed a successful four-year career at Texas Christian University in Fort Worth, Texas where he played for Jim Killingsworth and led the Horned Frogs to two Southwest Conference titles both as a junior and senior. He earned All-SWC honors in 1987 and was an All-SWC Academic performer. Additionally, he led the SWC in assists as a senior, earned the Henry Iba Award as MVP of the All-College Tournament and was voted TCU's Senior Male Scholar-Athlete Award recipient.

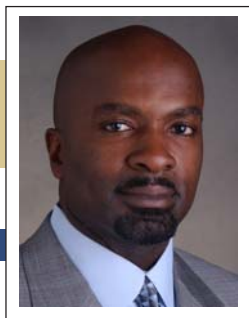

SAN FRANCISCO STATE '87 • FOURTH SEASON AT PITT

Known for scouting ability, work ethic, defense, intensity and successful guard play, Pat Sandle begins the fourth year of his second stint as an assistant coach at Pitt. Along with head coach Jamie Dixon, Sandle came to the University of Pittsburgh in 1999. Sandle's primary responsibilities are overseeing guard play and scouting opponents.

Sandle has played a key role in helping lead Panthers basketball back to national prominence. Since Sandle arrived back at Pitt in 2003, the Panthers own a 76-22 record, .776 winning percentage and have advanced to three NCAA Tournaments. In 2003-04, the Panthers set a school record with a 31-5 mark, captured the Big East regular-season title and advanced to NCAA Sweet Sixteen play for the third straight year. Last year, Pitt advanced to its fourth straight NCAA Tournament. Pitt finished 25-8, earned a berth to the Big East Championship final and advanced to its fifth straight NCAA Tournament in 2005-06.

Sandle came back to Pitt from UCLA, where he served as an assistant basketball coach from 2001-03. At UCLA, Sandle helped lead the Bruins to an NCAA Sweet Sixteen appearance and 20-plus win season under Steve Lavin in 2001-02. During his tenure at UCLA, he helped coach NBA players Dan Gadzuric, Matt Barnes and Jason Kapono.

"We're fortunate to have Pat Sandle at the University of Pittsburgh," Head Coach Jamie Dixon said. "Pat and I have known each other for a number of years. From the start, he was instrumental in building this program."

During a five-year coaching tenure with Dixon on Ben Howland's staffs at both Pitt and Northern Arizona (1996-99), Sandle was responsible for guard play, scouting, conditioning and player development, on-campus recruiting and academic progress. He also served as director of the school's summer basketball camps. During Sandle's 2000-01 season on Pitt's staff, the Panthers advanced to the National Invitation Tournament, their first postseason appearance in four years. While at Northern Arizona, the Lumberjacks enjoyed their most successful three-year period in school history (63-23, .733), won back-to-back Big Sky Championships and advanced to the 1997 NIT and 1998 NCAA Tournament.

Sandle has 20 years of coaching experience, including 10 seasons at the NCAA Division I level. He has served NCAA Division I stints at Pitt (1999-2001, 2003-current), UCLA (2001-03), Northern Arizona (1996-99), Fresno State (1991-92) and Saint Mary's College, Calif. (1990-91). Additionally, Sandle has coached at Sonoma State (1994-96), Santa Barbara City College (1989-90),

Skyline (Calif.) Junior College (1987-88) and Cuesta College (1986-87). He also coached two stints at San Rafael (Calif.) High School in 1988-89 and from 1992-94.

A standout at San Francisco State University (1982-84), Sandle is a member of the school's athletic hall of fame. A two-time All-California North Conference selection, Sandle is the school's all-time career assist leader (268) and ranks third in career steals (120). He also held the single-season assists record for seven years with 138 in 1983-84.

Sandle began his basketball career at Los Angeles Crenshaw High School under legendary prep coach Willie West. As a 6-foot-1-inch senior guard, Sandle helped lead Crenshaw to back-to-back Los Angeles city championships. Sandle was a standout junior college performer at Cuesta College (1980-82), earning All-California and All-North Coast Conference honors. 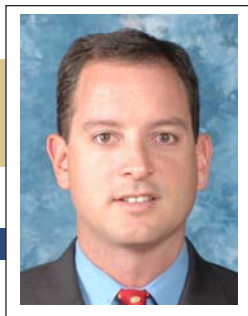

Mike Rice, a Western Pennsylvania native, begins his first season at the University of Pittsburgh as an assistant basketball coach on Head Coach Jamie Dixon's staff. Rice's main responsibilities include recruiting student-athletes, game preparation and on-floor coaching.

A Pittsburgh native, Rice arrives at Pitt with 12 years of NCAA Division I coaching experience, the last two as an assistant at Saint Joseph's under head coach Phil Martelli. Rice, who has extensive East Coast recruiting ties, was raised in a basketball family as his father, Mike Rice, Sr., served as head coach at both Duquesne (1979-82) and Youngstown State (1982-87). The elder Rice currently serves as the Portland Trailblazers' television color commentator.

"We are extremely excited about Mike becoming a member of the university community and I know he is thrilled to be coming home to Pittsburgh," Dixon said.

"For the past two seasons, Mike has worked for one of the best coaches in the country in Phil Martelli. He also has the experience of coaching in several different environments and is familiar with the Big East region."

Rice's widespread collegiate coaching experience includes stints at Fordham (1991-94), Marquette (1994-97), Niagara (1997-98), Chicago State (1998-2001) and Saint Joseph's (2004-06). In two years at Saint Joseph's, Rice helped

guide the Hawks to a 43-26 record (.623 winning percentage) and a pair of NIT bids. The 2004-05 squad finished 24-12 and advanced to the 2004-05 NIT final. His primary responsibility included working with the Hawks' post players. As an assistant coach at Marquette, Rice helped lead the Golden Eagles to consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances in both 1996 and 1997. In addition, Marquette claimed the 1997 Conference USA Tournament championship and finished as the NIT runner-up in 1995. His one season at Niagara saw his squad place third in the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference.

Prior to joining the Saint Joseph's staff in 2004, Rice spent three years as director of the Hoop Group Eastern Invitational Basketball Camp. As the director, he oversaw all camp activities while recruiting student-athletes for participation in the camps and also developed the prestigious Eastern Invitational Team Camp, which grew from 12 to 64 teams over a three-year period.

A three-year starter at Fordham from 1988-91, Rice led the Rams to three 20-win seasons while seeing action in 117 career games. As a senior in 1990-91, Rice served as team captain for a squad that finished 25-8 overall, 11-1 in the Patriot League and earned a postseason appearance in the NIT. His 152 assists in 1990-91 still ranks as the third highest total in Fordham's all-time season records. Rice earned a bachelor's degree in communication from

Fordham in 1991 and began his coaching career there as an assistant. In 1992, the Rams captured the Patriot League tournament title and earned a berth in the NCAA Tournament.

Rice attended Boardman High School in Youngstown, Ohio where he earned three letters in basketball. A three-year starter at guard, Rice was a two-time All-Northeast Ohio honoree and two-time Steel Valley All-Conference pick.

Rice resides in Pittsburgh with his wife, Kerry and their children, Michael (8) and Katie (6). He hails from an athletic family which includes his father, Mike Rice, Sr., who served as a coach at both the collegiate and high school levels, his mother Kathy, who played basketball at Duquesne, and his sisters Susan and Stephanie both played collegiate tennis at Syracuse.

Former University of Pittsburgh basketball standout Orlando Antigua begins his fourth year on Head Coach Jamie Dixon's staff and first season as an assistant coach. Named an assistant coach on June 7, 2006, Antigua is responsible for recruiting student-athletes, game preparation and on-floor coaching. He served the previous three seasons as Pitt's director of men's basketball operations.

"Orlando has played a key role in our recruiting since he joined our staff four years ago," Dixon said. "He understands what type of players we look for and what type of student-athletes we want to represent the university."

A four-year basketball letterwinner and two-year team captain at Pitt from 1991-95, Antigua ranks 11th all-time in career 3-pointers made (117) and sixth in career 3-point field goal percentage (.386). He also ranks among the school's career leaders in blocked shots with 78, the 12th best total in Panthers history. Over his four-year career, Antigua scored 930 points and grabbed 409 rebounds. He averaged 8.0 points and 3.5 rebounds per game while starting 78 of his 116 career contests played. A 1992 Big East Conference All-Rookie team member, Antigua helped lead the Panthers to an 18-16 record and berth in the National Invitation Tournament as a freshman. As a sophomore in 1992-93, Antigua helped lead Pittsburgh to a 17-11 record and NCAA tournament berth under Head Coach Paul Evans. He was named the United States Basketball Writers' Association (USBWA) Most Courageous Athlete in 1994, an honor presented annually to the

college basketball player who displays exceptional courage both on and off the floor. Antigua averaged over 10.0 points per game in each of his last two seasons. He graduated from Pitt with a degree in social sciences in December 1995.

Upon his graduation from the University of Pittsburgh, Antigua was selected to play for the world-renowned Harlem Globetrotters, becoming the first player of Latin American descent to play for the squad. Nicknamed "Hurricane" for his dazzling moves and quickness, Antigua played with the Globetrotters for seven years until 2002. He represented the squad in 49 different countries and on tours to South America, South Africa and on the acclaimed "Youth in Our Lives Tour."

Antigua also played in the Puerto Rico Superior Basketball League for eight years and represented the Dominican Republic national team in both 1994-95 and 1997-98. Because of his dedication to the community, Antigua was named one of the nation's top-100 most influential Hispanic Americans by *Hispanic Business* magazine.

In 2002-03, Antigua served as an assistant basketball coach at nearby Mt. Lebanon High School under former Panthers player Joey David (1983-86) and worked as a sales representative for Cavanaugh Promotions in the North Hills.

"I am extremely excited to be a part of this staff," Antigua said. "I look forward to continuing the great tradition that has been established over the past few years at the University of Pittsburgh. This is a great opportunity for me to be involved in coaching at my alma mater."

A Dominican Republic native who was raised in Bronx, N.Y.,

Antigua recovered from a 1988 Halloween incident where he was shot in the head near his left eye. Nevertheless, Antigua was back playing basketball just two weeks after the incident and played his three seasons at Pittsburgh with the slug in his head. Doctors initially ruled out removing the bullet as being too risky, but Antigua began suffering severe headaches. Antigua's family also went through a period of homelessness. The oldest of three brothers, Antigua was credited with keeping the family together while housing was secured.

He overcame these difficulties and went on to serve as student council president at St. Raymond's High School and played a major

role in the program's New York Catholic League Championship run under head coach Gary DeCaesare. As a senior, he earned McDonald's All America, All-New York City and Parade All America Second Team honors after averaging 15 points and eight rebounds. He also became the school's second all-time leading scorer with over 1,000 career points. In addition, Antigua played on the Gauchos youth basketball team along with his Panthers teammates Jerry McCullough and Eric Mobley.

Fluent in Spanish, Antigua has resided in Pittsburgh since graduation. He lives with his wife Dana, son Orlando Anthony and daughter Olivia.

David Cox begins his first year on Head Coach Jamie Dixon's staff as director of basketball operations. Cox is responsible for the day-to-day operations of the men's basketball program, serve as a liaison to athletic department officials and coordinate the student-athletes' practice, game-day and daily schedules.

"David is a tremendous role model for our student-athletes," Dixon said. "He has an outstanding administrative and basketball background and is an individual who will benefit our program in many facets. He is a former NCAA Division I player who is familiar with the kind of student-athletes that we have and will continue to have representing the University of Pittsburgh."

Cox arrives at Pitt after serving seven years as an Assistant Principal at his alma mater St. John's Preparatory High School in Washington, D.C. His many duties at St. John's Prep from 1999-2006 included oversight of the school's athletic department, supervision of all extracurricular activities and serving as school disciplinarian. Prior to his tenure at St. John's, Cox also coached at Archbishop

Carroll High School in Washington D.C. from 1996-99. One of his former players was ex-Georgetown star Ruben Boumjte-Boumjte.

He served seven years as an assistant coach with the Washington D.C. Assault AAU program where he helped guide the team to the 2004 Under-16 national championship. In assisting D.C. Assault head coach Curtis Malone, several of his players earned college scholarships including Tre Kelley (South Carolina), Chris McCray (Maryland), James White (Florida, Cincinnati), Tony Bethel (Georgetown, N.C. State) and Amari Israel (Notre Dame).

As a collegiate basketball player, Cox lettered four seasons at William & Mary for head coaches Chuck Swenson and Charlie Woollum. A three-year starter at point guard from 1992-95, Cox concluded his career with 670 points (6.1 ppg), 216 rebounds, 336 assists and a .352 3-point field goal percentage (139-395). He remains ranked among school leaders in several statistical categories including career assists (eighth, 336), career assist average (ninth, 3.08 apg), career 3-point field goal percentage (ninth, .352), career 3-point field goals made (sixth, 137), season 3-point field

goals made (sixth, 57) and owns two of the school's top-10 best season assists totals. His career-high 12 assists against George Mason in 1995 still ranks third among all-time game performances in William & Mary basketball history.

Cox graduated from William & Mary in 1995 with a sociology degree and later earned his Master's in Education in 1996.
