Now in its 40th Year as the Nation's Top Holiday Tournament

Since 1967, the Cable Car Classic has been a Bay Area basketball tradition. This year, with teams from Air Force, Colgate and George Washington joining host Santa Clara, the Cable Car Classic is assured in furthering its reputation as one of the longest running, most prestigious holiday tournaments in the nation.

The Cable Car Classic was founded by two gentlemen who combined a passion for basketball with the hope of bringing the nation's top collegiate talent to the Bay Area. Art Santo Domingo, former public relations director of the San Francisco Giants, and Harry Jupiter, a sports writer for the San Francisco Examiner, have watched their hopes for exceed their wildest dreams, as the Cable Car Classic enters its 40th season as one of the country's longest running holiday tournaments.

The teams, players, and coaches who have participated in past Cable Car Classic read like a who's who in college basketball. From the Santa Clara teams of the 1960's and '70's that featured the talents of Bud Ogden, Dennis Awtrey and Kurt Rambis and the USF squads, led by Kevin Restani, Winford Boynes and Bill Cartwright to traditional basketball powers such as Dean Smith's North Carolina Tar Heels featuring Michael Jordan and James Worthy and the Ralph Sampson-led Virginia Cavaliers, it's easy to see why all eyes in the college basketball world turn to the South Bay in late December.
