A QUICK LOOK AT THE 2002 NCAA REGIONAL AT STANFORD

Stanford will be hosting Long Beach State, San Jose State and Cal State Fullerton in an NCAA Regional running this Friday-Sunday, May 31 - June 2 ... Stanford is serving as a Regional host for the seventh straight year and the 11th time in school history ... The Cardinal is the top seed in the Regional, as well as the No. 8 and final national seed in the 64-team field for the 2002 NCAA Division I Baseball Championships ... Stanford begins its quest for a fourth straight trip to the College World Series, where the Cardinal has finished second each of the last two seasons, by playing Cal State Fullerton in a rematch of a 2001 CWS bracket final on Friday ... Stanford won 11 of its final 13 Pac-10 games to finish in second place in the Pac-10, one game behind champion USC ... Long Beach State is seeded second after winning its final seven regular season games, including a three-game sweep of Cal State Fullerton in its final series ... The 49ers finished second in the Big West ... San Jose State is seeded third after setting a new school record with 45 regular season wins and won 19 of its final 22 games ... The Spartans finished second in the Western Athletic Conference ... Cal State Fullerton picked up a fourth seed and had won six of seven games before being swept by Long Beach State in its final regular season series ... The Titans finished tied for fourth in the Big West.

2002 NCAA DIVISION I BASEBALL CHAMPIONSHIPS INFORMATION

Stanford is one of 16 Regional hosts and the No. 8 national seed for the 2002 NCAA Division I Baseball Championships. The first weekend of play May 31 - June 2 features 16 four-team Regionals with the winners advancing to eight NCAA Super Regionals June 7-9. The winner of the 2002 NCAA Regional at Stanford will face the winner of the Regional being hosted by USC with Cal State Northridge, Maine and BYU joining the Trojans in the four team field. Super Regional sites will be announced on Monday, June 3. The eight Super Regional winners advance to the 56th College World Series to be held June 14-22 at Rosenblatt Stadium in Omaha, Nebraska.

STANFORD BASEBALL HISTORY VERSUS 2002 NCAA REGIONAL FIELD

Stanford is familiar with this year's versus the 2002 NCAA Regional field. This season, the Cardinal won two-of-three games (7-4, 17-1, 3-6) in its season-opening series (2/1 - 2/3) versus first round opponent Cal State Fullerton. Stanford also won four of five games against the Titans in 2001, including a pair of games at the College World Series. The Cardinal leads the all-time series, 38-29. Stanford split a pair of games with San Jose State this season, coming back for a 5-4 win at Sunken Diamond (4/9) before falling 12-0 in San Jose (5/1). Stanford and San Jose State have never met in the postseason. The Cardinal leads the all-time series, 72-30. Stanford and Long Beach State have not played since the 49ers knocked the Cardinal out of a 1998 Regional at Sunken Diamond (5/23) with a 5-1 victory. Stanford has won the only other game between the teams during the Mark Marquess era.

STANFORD BASEBALL NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS HISTORY QUICK NOTES

Stanford will be making its 23rd appearance in the NCAA Tournament and its 20th showing in an NCAA Regional ... The Cardinal will be a hosting a Regional for the 11th time and the seventh straight year ... Stanford has won nine of the 11 Regionals played at Sunken Diamond, including the last three years, and 13 in school history ... Stanford has needed a second championship game in each of its last two Regional victories after suffering losses earlier in the Regional ... Stanford has won four straight Regional elimination games over the past two seasons ... Stanford last lost a Regional at Sunken Diamond in 1998 when the Cardinal dropped two-of-three games and were eliminated by Long Beach State in Game 5 of the event ... Stanford has an all-time record of 55-21 (.754) in Regional action ... Stanford has reached the College World Series 13 times, including each of the last three years ... Stanford won CWS titles in 1987 and 1988, while finishing as the runner-up the last two seasons (2000, 2001) ... Stanford is attempting to go to the CWS for the fourth straight year for the first time in school history, extending its current record of three straight CWS trips ... Stanford has an all-time postseason record of 96-49 (.662).

STANFORD BASEBALL 2001 NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS REVIEW

Stanford finished as the runner-up at the College World Series for the second straight year in 2001, falling 12-1 to Miami in the CWS championship game. The Cardinal reached the CWS for the third straight year after surviving tough Regional and Super Regional competition at Sunken Diamond by going 4-0 in elimination games. Stanford began the 2001 postseason with a 4-3 win over Marist before the Cardinal was beaten 4-3 by Texas in its second Regional game. Stanford came back with a 6-0 victory over Marist later in the day to earn a spot in the championship game versus the Longhorns. Stanford then swept a doubleheader to advance in the NCAA Tournament for the first time in school history, sweeping Texas in a pair of memorable games (10-9, 10 inn.; 4-3). Stanford then needed three games to eliminate South Carolina in the Super Regional. The Cardinal picked up an 11-1 victory in the opening game of the series before South Carolina came back with a 4-3 win in the second game. Stanford finally put the Gamecocks away with a 3-2 win in the final game. Stanford then won its first three games at the CWS with a win over Tulane (13-11) and a pair of wins over Cal State Fullerton (5-2, 10 inn.; 4-1) to advance to the CWS final.

STANFORD BASEBALL QUICK TEAM NOTES

Stanford finished its regular season by winning its final four games and 11 of its last 13 Pac-10 contests to take second place in the conference, giving the Cardinal either a first or second place finish in the league standings for the 20th time in the last 22 seasons ... Stanford wrapped up its eighth straight 40-win campaign with an 8-2 victory over Washington State in its regular season finale ... Stanford enters the postseason ranked No. 9 in the most recent *Baseball America* poll released May 27, down one spot from its No. 8 ranking the previous week ... Stanford is 24-4 at home, while the team has managed just a 16-12 mark on the road ... Stanford has come from behind to win in 18 of its 40 victories this season ... Stanford is 8-5 in one-run games and 4-2 in extra inning contests ... Stanford is averaging 8.2 runs per game, reaching double figures in runs 19 times and double figures in hits on 38 occasions ... Stanford finished the regular season as the Pac-10 leader in team batting average (.325), earned run average (4.10) and fielding percentage (.971) ... Stanford's 40-16 regular season record was two games behind the team's 42-14 regular season mark in 2001 ... Stanford is attempting to qualify for the College World Series for the fourth consecutive season as the 2002 senior class is looking to become the first class of Stanford Baseball players to reach Omaha in each of its four years ... Stanford has qualified for the CWS title game in each of the last two years ... Stanford is coming off three straight 50-win seasons for the first time in school history and has compiled a record of 191-64 (.749) since the beginning of 1999.

Had a memorable outing versus Cal State Fullerton in a 2001 CWS bracket final, earning the victory in a 4-1 Stanford win by holding the Titans to one run and four hits over the first 7.0 innings ... Golden Spikes Award finalist ... Leads the team and the Pac-10 in ERA (2.52) and strikeouts (115) ... Leads the team and ranks second in the Pac-10 in victories (10-1) and innings pitched (121.1) ... Has won 15 of his last 16 decisions dating back to last season ... Has a current consecutive scoreless streak of 19 innings after tossing 7.0 shutout frame in his final regular season start to earn a victory versus Washington State (5/24), scattering seven hits and striking out six ... Had previously thrown four straight complete games and has gone at least 6.0 innings in all 16 of his starts ... Posted a 4-1 record and a 1.88 ERA with 62 strikeouts in 67.0 innings over eight Pac-10 starts, allowing just 52 hits and 14 earned runs ... Recorded his first shutout of the season with the most dominating performance of his career, striking out a career-high 13 and scattering six hits in an 11-0 win over UCLA (5/17) ... Picked up a victory with a complete game versus Arizona State (5/10), scattering eight hits and three runs with eight strikeouts ... Earned a victory versus California (5/3), scattering six hits and four runs (three earned) with 10 strikeouts ... Suffered his only loss of the season at Oregon State (4/26) despite throwing his first complete game of the campaign to snap an 11-game win streak ... Received no decision with 6.0 scoreless innings at Washington (4/19), allowing just two hits and striking out seven before being removed with a 1-0 lead before Washington came back to win, 3-1 ... Tossed 9.0 innings versus USC (4/12), scattering six hits and four runs (three earned) with eight strikeouts ... Had the longest outing of his career at Arizona (4/5), tossing 10.0 innings and allowing just two runs and nine hits to receive no decision in a game that Stanford eventually won 5-4 in 18 innings ... Scattered eight hits and six runs (three earned) in 6.0 innings to earn a victory at USC (3/23 - Game 1) ... Needed a Stanford comeback to win at California (3/8) as the Cardinal scored 15 runs in the seventh and eighth innings for a 15-4 win in a game California led 4-0 after six innings ... Allowed just five hits and two runs (one earned) with eight strikeouts in 8.0 innings in an 8-6 win over Cal Poly (3/1) ... Started the season with victories over Fresno State (2/15), Florida State (2/8) and Cal State Fullerton (2/1) in his first three starts.

Sam Fuld leads the Cardinal and the Pac-10 with a .396 batting average and 99 hits ... Fuld finished the regular season on an incredible tear over his last 24 contests, hitting .519 (54-104) with 21 multiple-hit games ... Fuld also leads the club in doubles (19), total bases (142) and on base percentage (.453) ... Fuld is Stanford's all-time batting average leader with a .377 (180-477) lifetime mark ... Fuld also led Stanford with a .425 batting average in 24 Pac-10 games ... Ryan Garko leads the club in home runs (14), RBI (51) and runs scored (62) ... Brian Hall paces the team with 12 stolen bases in 12 chances ... Carlos Quentin leads the club with four triples and has been hit by a team-high 17 pitches ... Stanford's regular starting rotation of Jeremy Guthrie, John Hudgins and Tim Cunningham is a combined 26-4 with a 3.62 ERA ... Guthrie leads the team in ERA (2.52, #1 Pac-10), victories (10-1, #2 Pac-10), strikeouts (115, #1 Pac-10, and innings pitched (121.1, #2 Pac-10, ... Chris O'Riordan has started 167 consecutive games at second base ... Guthrie is a finalist for the Golden Spikes Award, while Cooper (Dick Howser Award), Garko (Johnny Bench Award) and O'Riordan (Dick Howser Award) are national semifinalist for their respective awards.

STANFORD DROPS ONE SPOT TO NO. 8 IN BASEBALL AMERICA POLL

Stanford dropped one spot to No. 9 in this week's *Baseball America* poll released May 27 despite sweeping a three-game series versus Washington State last Friday-Sunday to end the regular season. Stanford currently ranks No. 8 (*Baseball Weekly/ESPN*) and No. 10 (*Collegiate Baseball*) in the other major national polls. Stanford began the season as the nation's unanimous No. 1 team and stayed on top of the *Baseball America* poll for the first seven weeks of the year before falling out of the top spot for the first time on April 1. Stanford spent two weeks (4/9 - 4/16) last year as the nation's unanimous No. 1 team and six weeks as *Baseball America's* top team (3/12 - 4/16) before finishing the year at No. 2 in all four polls. Stanford has been ranked No. 1 at one point during each of the past six years (including 2002). Stanford's poll history includes a run as "king of the polls" in 1998 when the team held the top spot in the *Baseball America* poll for the entire regular season (a record 14 consecutive weeks). All three other teams in the NCAA Regional at Sunken Diamond are also ranked in all three polls -- San Jose State (No. 18 *Baseball America*, No. 20 *Baseball Weekly/ESPN*, No. 22 *Collegiate Baseball*), Long Beach State (No. 22 *Baseball America*, No. 24 *Baseball Weekly/ESPN*, No. 24 *Collegiate Baseball*) and Cal State Fullerton (No. 25 *Baseball America*, No. 23 *Baseball Weekly/ESPN*, No. 25 *Collegiate Baseball*).

STANFORD TO PLAY FIRST RANKED OPPONENT IN TWO MONTHS ON FRIDAY

Stanford's Regional opener against No. 25 Cal State Fullerton on Friday will mark the first time the team has played against an opponent ranked in *Baseball America's* Top 25 at the time the Cardinal played them since the Cardinal battled then No. 16 Texas in a three-game series at Sunken Diamond March 28-30. Stanford has played eight games since its Texas series against teams that were not ranked when the Cardinal played them but have found themselves back in the current *Baseball America* poll.

STANFORD WINS 14 OF 16 REGULAR SEASON SERIES

Stanford won 14 of its 16 series during the 2002 regular season. The Cardinal opened the season by winning two-of-three games in its first four series versus Cal State Fullerton (2/1 - 2/3), at Florida State (2/8 - 2/10), at Fresno State (2/15 - 2/18) and versus Santa Clara (2/22 - 2/24). The Cardinal then swept two of its next three series versus Cal Poly (3/1 - 3/3) and at USC (3/23 - 3/24), while splitting the sweeps with two-of-three wins at California (3/8 - 3/10). Stanford then won two-of-three in three more series versus Texas (3/28 - 3/30), at Arizona (4/5 - 4/7) and versus USC (4/12 - 4/14) before finally being beaten in a series for the first time in 2002 with losses in two-of-three games at Washington (4/19 - 4/21). The Cardinal lost two-of-three games again the following weekend at Oregon State (4/26 - 4/28) before rebounding with a sweep versus California (5/3 - 5/5) in the first series of May. Stanford finished the campaign by winning two-of-three versus Arizona State (5/10 - 5/12) and at UCLA (5/17 - 5/19) before sweeping Washington State (5/24 - 5/26) to end the regular season. The Cardinal was 14-2 in series openers, 8-8 in middle games of series and 12-4 in series finales.

TOP OF THE PAC

Stanford (16-8 Pac-10, finished in second place in the final regular season Pac-10 standings, one game behind champion USC (17-7 Pac-10, The second place finish Stanford among the top two in the conference standings (includes Pac-10 Southern Division) for the ninth straight year and the 20th time in the last 22 years with the only blemishes over that time period a fourth place finish in 1989 and a sixth place showing in 1993.

STANFORD EXTENDS SUNKEN DIAMOND SERIES WIN STREAK TO 22

Stanford won its 22nd straight regular season series at Sunken Diamond by sweeping Washington State (5/24 - 5/26) in its final regular season series of 2002. The last team to win a regular season series against Stanford at Sunken Diamond was USC with two-of-three wins from April 16-18, 1999. Stanford has won 33 of its last 37 regular season series overall.

CARDINAL PICKS UP EIGHTH STRAIGHT 40-WIN SEASON

Stanford picked up its eighth straight 40-win season by winning its final four regular season games. The last time Stanford didn't win 40 games was when the club finished 27-28 in 1993.

COMEBACK CARDINAL

Stanford has trailed before coming back to win in 18 of its 40 victories this season -- (vs. Cal State Fullerton, 2/1, 2/2; at Florida State, 2/9, vs. Santa Clara, 2/22, 2/24; at Cal, 3/8, vs. Texas, 3/28; at Arizona, 4/5; at USC, 3/23 - Game 1; vs. San Jose State, 4/9; vs. USC, 4/11; vs. Saint Mary's, 4/16; at Washington, 4/20; vs. Sacramento State, 4/24; vs. California, 5/3, 5/4, 5/5; vs. Washington State, 5/25.

JEREMY GUTHRIE NAMED GOLDEN SPIKES AWARD FINALIST

Jeremy Guthrie has been named one of five national finalists for the prestigious Golden Spikes Award. The other finalists are Russ Adams (North Carolina, Jr., INF), Jeff Baker (Clemson, Jr., INF), Bobby Brownlie (Jr., RHP) and Khalil Greene (Clemson, Sr., INF).

SLAMMIN' SAMMY FINISHES REGULAR SEASON ON A SERIOUS TEAR

Sam Fuld finished the regular season with 21 multiple-hit games in his last 24 contests, hitting .519 (54-104) over the period with four homers, 24 RBI and seven stolen bases during the amazing stretch. Fuld finished the regular season by leading the team and the Pac-10 with a .396 batting average and 99 hits. Fuld is attempting to become only the sixth player in Stanford history to hit .400 in a season and the first since David McCarty hit .420 in 1991. He is also looking to become only the seventh player in Stanford history to record 100 hits in a campaign. Fuld remains on top of Stanford's career batting average list with a .377 lifetime mark (180-477). Fuld also paces the club with 19 doubles, 250 at bats, 142 total bases, a .453 on base percentage, 35 multiple-hit games, 11 three-hit games and three four-hit games.

SAM FULD LEADS CARDINAL IN PAC-10 PLAY

Sam Fuld was also Stanford's top hitter in Pac-10 action with a .425 batting average (45-106) in 24 conference games. Fuld also led the team in Pac-10 action in hits (45), RBI (27), runs scored (31), doubles (8, co-leader), triples (2, co-leader), total bases (69) and stolen bases (7).

RYAN GARKO LEADS TEAM IN HOME RUNS AND RBI

Johnny Bench Award semifinalist Ryan Garko leads the team in both primary power categories with 14 home runs and 51 RBI, both career-highs.

RYAN GARKO, JASON COOPER AND CARLOS QUENTIN REACH 50 RBI EACH

Each member of the middle of the Cardinal lineup -- Ryan Garko, Jason Cooper and Carlos Quentin -- drove in 50 or more runs during the regular season. Garko (51 RBI) holds the slimmest of margins over both Cooper (50 RBI) and Quentin (50 RBI).

CHRIS O'RIORDAN EXTENDS GAMES STARTED STREAK TO 167

Chris O'Riordan has extended his string of consecutive games started at second base to 167. O'Riordan also had a couple of other notable streaks earlier this season, hitting safely in a career-high 12 straight games (4/5 - 4/21) and reaching base in 38 straight contests (2/1 - 4/21) before having both streaks snapped when he went 0-for-4 without reaching base in the series opener at Oregon State (4/26). For the season, O'Riordan reached base in 53 of 56 games and hit safely in 48.

REGULAR STARTING PITCHING ROTATION NOW 26-4 WITH 3.62 ERA

Stanford's regular starting pitching rotation of Jeremy Guthrie (10-1, 2.52, 121.1 IP, 115 SO), John Hudgins (8-1, 4.88, 90.1 IP, 56 SO) and Tim Cunningham (8-2, 3.83, 96.1 IP, 60 SO) is now a combined 26-4 with a 3.62 ERA this season.

STANFORD SURPASSES 2001 HOME RUN TOTAL

Stanford has already surpassed its home run total of last season with 78 roundtrippers. The Cardinal is four homers away from breaking into the school's all-time Top 5 list.

RUNNING OVER THE OPPOSITION

Stanford has nearly doubled its opponents stolen base total this season with 67 thefts compared to 35 for its opponents. Brian Hall leads the club with 12 stolen bases and is a perfect 12-for-12 this season. Carlos Quentin (10), Arik VanZandt (9), Andy Topham (9) and Sam Fuld (8) all have eight or more stolen bases to their credit.

HAPPY AT HOME

Stanford is 24-4 at Sunken Diamond this season, while managing just a 16-12 mark on the road. Stanford has won 11 of its last 12 games at home. The Cardinal is just 5-7 in its last 12 road games and lost two-of-three games in back-to-back Pac-10 road series at Washington (4/19 - 4/21) and Oregon State (4/26 - 4/28).

STANFORD BASEBALL HISTORY

Stanford's storied baseball program has had many highlights as the program is in its 109th season with an all-time record of 2319-1464-32 (.612). The Cardinal won NCAA titles in 1987 and 1988 before returning to the CWS championship game in each of the last two years (2000, 2001). The program has had winning seasons in 37 of its last 38 campaigns and 54 of its last 56 seasons (including this year), has recorded three straight 50-win seasons for the first time in school history (1999-2001) and has reached the 40-win mark in eight consecutive campaigns (1995-2002). Just a few of the other highlights have included 13 College World Series appearances, 18 conference titles and 23 NCAA Tournament berths. Stanford has boasted a total of 43 All-Americans who have earned a total of 50 All-American honors. Stanford has also garnered three NCAA Player of the Year choices in Jeff Austin (1998), David McCarty (1991) and Steve Dunning (1970). Other numbers for the Cardinal Baseball program include 96 All-Conference players earning a total of 121 All-Conference honors, 57 major league players and 12 first round draft picks in the last 15 years.

OFFENSIVE REPORT

Stanford's team batting average currently sits at a Pac-10 high .325 and has been at .315 or higher all season. Stanford has raised its mark from a season-low .315 after a game at Arizona (4/5) with double figure hits in 20 of its last 30 games. Stanford has had a pair of season-high-tying 19-run games in a 19-2 win versus Saint Mary's (4/16) and a 19-1 win at Arizona (4/6) with a season-high 26 hits in the latter. Stanford has scored double-digit runs 19 times, including five of its last seven games, and is averaging 8.2 runs per game. The team also has double-digit hits in 38 of its 55 games, including six of its last seven. The Cardinal has hit 78 homers, already surpassing its homer total from last year and just four away from entering the all-time Top 5 list. Sam Fuld leads the club in batting average (.396), hits (99), doubles (19), total bases (142), at bats (250) and on-base percentage (.453). Fuld has been on an incredible tear of late, going 54-104 (.519) with 21 multiple-hit games in his last 24 contests. Ryan Garko leads the team in homers (14), RBI (51), runs scored (62) and bases on balls (35). Carlos Quentin leads the team in triples (4) and hit-by-pitches (17). Jason Cooper leads the team in slugging percentage (.641). Brian Hall leads the club with 12 stolen bases in 12 attempts. Cooper (.359), Scott Dragicevich (.357), Chris O'Riordan (.330), Quentin (.322), Arik VanZandt (.321), Andy Topham (.314) and Garko (.311) are other regulars hitting above .300.

PITCHING REPORT

Stanford posted a Pac-10 best 4.10 ERA during 56 regular season games. Stanford's regular starting rotation of Jeremy Guthrie (10-1, 2.52, 121.1 IP, 115 SO), John Hudgins (8-1, 4.88, 90.1 IP, 56 SO) and Tim Cunningham (8-2, 3.83, 96.1 IP, 60 SO) is a combined 26-4 with a 3.62 ERA. Guthrie paces the club in victories (#2 Pac-10), ERA (#1 Pac-10), innings pitched (#2 Pac-10), strikeouts (#1 Pac-10, and complete games (4). Guthrie (at UCLA, 5/19) and Hudgins (at Oregon State, 4/28) have one shutout each. Guthrie has the team's longest performance of the year with a career-high 10.0 innings pitched at Arizona (4/5) in an eventual 18-inning 5-4 Stanford win. Ryan McCally (4-3, 4.07, 7 SV, 42.0 IP, 35 SO) leads the club with seven saves. Dan Rich (2-2, 2.86, 2 SV, 28.1 IP, 35 SO) and Darin Naatjes (4-0, 2.53, 2 SV, 21.1 IP, 25 SO) have emerged as two of the club's top relievers. Others pitching primarily out of the bullpen include Jonny Dyer (2-0, 4.38, 12.1 IP, 8 SO), David O'Hagan (0-0, 5.11, 12.1 IP, 8 SO), Drew Ehrlich (0-2, 5.45, 2 SV, 39.2 IP, 40 SO), J.D. Willcox (2-1, 6.00, 15.0 IP, 6 SO) and Mark Jecmen (0-4, 8.26, 28.1 IP, 19 SO).

DEFENSIVE REPORT

Stanford led the Pac-10 during the regular season with a .971 fielding percentage, currently tied for its highest mark of the year and only .006 percentage points below last year's .977 school record and nation's best mark. Stanford was errorless in five of its last 13 regular season games and a total of 19 contests this year. Ryan Garko leads the club with 353 putouts, while Chris O'Riordan has a team-high 182 assists. The Cardinal has turned 64 double plays, including a season-high four at Fresno State (2/18), and is just one shy of equaling the school record of 65 set last season. Arik VanZandt posted a team season-best 15 putouts at Arizona (4/6). O'Riordan had a team season-best 10 assists at Arizona (4/5).

STANFORD HEAD COACH MARK MARQUESS

One of the nation's premier collegiate coaches, Mark Marquess is in his 26th season at the helm of Stanford Baseball in 2002. Marquess has a career record of 1086-531-5 (.671), all at Stanford. Marquess coached his 1600th game at Stanford this season in a 19-2 win over Saint Mary's (4/16). Last year, he became the 23rd coach in the history of NCAA Division I baseball to reach the 1000-win mark with a 6-2 victory over Florida State in a game played on February 9, 2001. The 1969 Stanford graduate has led the Cardinal to two NCAA titles (1987, '88) and two other CWS title game appearances (2000, '01), as well as 11 College World Series appearances (1982, '83, '85, '87, '88, '90, '95, '97, '99, 2000, '01), 11 NCAA Regional titles (1982, '83, '85, '87, '88, '90, '95, '97, '99, 2000, '01), 10 Pac-10 or Pac-10 Southern Division regular season titles (1983, '84, '85, '87, '90, '94, '97, '98, '99, 2000) and three NCAA Super Regional championships (1999, 2000, '01). The Cardinal has qualified for the NCAA Tournament 20 times under Marquess (includes this season). He began the 2002 season ranked 12th in victories and 16th in winning percentage among active Division I baseball coaches, while ranking 23rd on the all-time victory list and 42nd on the all-time winning percentage list. He has been named NCAA Coach of the Year three times (1985, '87, '88) and has received Pac-10 or Pac-10 Southern Division Coach of the Year honors on eight occasions (1983, '85, '87, '90, '94, '97, '98, '99). The Cardinal has posted winning seasons 25 times in 26 years under his leadership (includes this season) and has finished either first or second in the prestigious Pacific-10 (formerly Pac-10 Southern Division) 20 times in the last 22 years (includes this season). Stanford has had 99 professional baseball draft picks in the past 17 seasons, including 12 first round selections in the last 15 years. A member of the American Baseball Coaches Association Hall of Fame, Marquess was the head coach of the 1988 United States Olympic baseball team that captured the gold medal. Marquess was also an accomplished football and baseball standout on The Farm and is a member of the Stanford Athletic Hall of Fame. He is one of only six collegiate baseball head coaches to have both played and coached in the College World Series. Marquess was the starting first baseman and a First Team All-American on Stanford's 1967 College World Series squad and played four seasons of minor league baseball with the Chicago White Sox organization.

COMMENTS FROM MARK MARQUESS

(on the 2002 NCAA Division I Baseball Championships)

"I'm happy to earn a national seed. We are in one of the toughest, if not the toughest bracket in the tournament, but at this point of the season all of the teams you are going to be playing are quality. We need to play our best baseball at this time if we hope to win this Regional."

"The tournament field seems to be too regionalized but what can you do about it. This is a big time championship. We pay for ourselves and make money. It is unfortunate that we have to do it this way. It really does a lot for college baseball when a team comes in here that we haven't seen. We've had teams like Texas, Alabama and Florida State come here in the past. That is huge for college baseball. That really helps our sport, and we're taking a step back from that right now."

"Our Regional is very difficult, but you're going to have to beat good teams in any Regional you go to at this point. I don't like the fact that you're playing a four-team regional with a team in your conference. When at all possible that should be avoided, as should having to play a team in your league in the Super Regional. If both us and USC win, we play each other in the Super Regional."

"We've played Cal State Fullerton a lot, twice in last year's College World Series and three times already this year, so we're very familiar with them. We have a lot of respect for them. San Jose State has played as well as just about anybody we've played this year, and they're playing really well right now. Long Beach State just swept Cal State Fullerton, so they're really hot right now. The good news is we know a lot about them (the other teams in the Regional) and the bad news is we know a lot about them, and how good they are."

"We earned the right to host a Regional and be seeded eighth nationally. Even though we didn't win the Pac-10, our overall record against good teams makes us deserve to host a Regional."

STANFORD COACHING STAFF

Dean Stotz is in his 26th campaign with Stanford Baseball and his third season as associate head coach after he was promoted to the position prior to the 2000 campaign. Stotz served for 23 years as an assistant. Stotz currently coaches third base while also handling various offensive and defensive aspects of the game. Tom Kunis (3rd season) handles the Cardinal pitching staff, while Dave Nakama (3rd season) returns as an assistant coach after three seasons as the head coach at San Francisco State. Nakama, also a Cardinal assistant in 1997 and 1998, assists with all aspects of the game and serves as Stanford's first base coach.
