A QUICK LOOK AT THE 2002 NCAA SUPER REGIONAL AT STANFORD

Stanford will be hosting USC in one of eight NCAA Super Regionals across the country when the Cardinal welcomes Pac-10 rival USC to Sunken Diamond this Friday-Sunday, June 7-9. The winner of each of the eight Super Regionals will advance to the 2002 College World Series from June 14-22 in Omaha, Nebraska. Stanford reached the NCAA Super Regional by sweeping through three games in its Regional last Friday-Sunday. The Cardinal opened the Regional with a 3-2 victory in 13 innings over Cal State Fullerton before winning a pair of games against Long Beach State on Saturday (5-4) and Sunday (8-4). USC also reached the Super Regional by sweeping through its Regional with a 5-4 victory over BYU on Friday night, a 7-5 win over Cal State Northridge on Saturday and a wild 13-10 victory over BYU on Monday. Stanford and USC both enter the Super Regional on rolls with the Cardinal winners of a season-high seven straight games and USC boasting a six-game win streak. Stanford and USC have already squared off six times this year with the Cardinal winning five of the meetings, sweeping the Trojans in a non-conference series in Los Angeles (3/23 - 3/24) and taking two-of-three in a Pac-10 series (4/12 - 4/14) at Stanford. Either Stanford or USC has won at least a share of a Pac-10 title (includes Southern Division) for each of the last nine years since 1994. USC has won the league title the last two years by one game over the Cardinal. Stanford had won a league title the previous four seasons. USC holds an all-time series advantage, 197-143-3.

STANFORD'S NCAA SUPER REGIONAL HISTORY NOTES

Stanford has been victorious in all three of its appearances in NCAA Super Regionals and has never lost a Super Regional since the format began in 1999. Stanford swept USC in a pair of Super Regional games at Sunken Diamond in 1999, winning 1-0 and 5-3 to advance to its first of three straight College World Series in the last three years. The Cardinal then took two-of-three games from Nebraska in a 2000 Super Regional, coming back to win the second two games on Saturday and Sunday (7-1, 5-3) after dropping Friday night's opener (7-3). Last season, the Cardinal picked up two-of-three wins over South Carolina, taking the opener (11-1) and the series finale (3-2) with a 4-3 loss sandwiched in between.

STANFORD NCAA POSTSEASON HISTORY NOTES

Stanford is attempting to qualify for the College World Series for the fourth consecutive season as the 2002 senior class is looking to become the first class of Stanford Baseball players to reach Omaha in each of its four years ... Stanford is making its 23rd appearance in the NCAA Tournament ... Stanford improved to 5-3 all-time in extra inning post season games with its 3-2 win in 13 innings over Cal State Fullerton on Friday night ... The 13-inning game versus Cal State Fullerton was tied for the second longest Stanford post-season game (also 13 innings versus Florida State at the CWS, 6/18/98), one inning less than the school record 14-inning post season game in a 4-3 loss to Arizona State at the CWS on June 17, 1967 ... Stanford is looking for its 100th postseason victory with its next postseason win as the Cardinal is 99-49 in postseason action (.669) ... Stanford has reached the College World Series 13 times ... Stanford won CWS titles in 1987 and 1988, while finishing as the runner-up the last two seasons (2000, 2001).

STANFORD BASEBALL 2002 NCAA REGIONAL REVIEW

Stanford opened the 2002 NCAA Regional with a 3-2 win over Cal State Fullerton in 13 innings last Friday. Jeremy Guthrie tossed a 13 inning complete game to improve to 11-1, while Scott Dragicevich's RBI single in the bottom of the 13th inning drove home Donny Lucy with the winning run. The Cardinal then defeated Long Beach State, 5-4, on Saturday as Tim Cunningham earned the victory and Dan Rich came on to pitch the final 2.2 innings for the save. The Cardinal jumped out to an early 4-0 lead after an inning and a half when Chris O'Riordan led off the game with a homer before Andy Topham had a two-run double and Arik VanZandt an RBI single in the second. Rich retired the last out in the bottom of the ninth with the tying run on third base and the winning run on second. Stanford used a five-run fifth inning to snap a 2-2 tie on its way to an 8-4 victory again versus Long Beach State in the Regional final. Jason Cooper keyed the inning with a two-run homer. John Hudgins earned the victory with a complete game performance, scattering 11 hits and four runs.

STANFORD BASEBALL 2001 NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS REVIEW

Stanford finished as the runner-up at the College World Series for the second straight year in 2001, falling 12-1 to Miami in the CWS championship game. The Cardinal reached the CWS for the third straight year after surviving tough Regional and Super Regional competition at Sunken Diamond by going 4-0 in elimination games. Stanford began the 2001 postseason with a 4-3 win over Marist before the Cardinal was beaten 4-3 by Texas in its second Regional game. Stanford came back with a 6-0 victory over Marist later in the day to earn a spot in the championship game versus the Longhorns. Stanford then swept a doubleheader to advance in the NCAA Tournament for the first time in school history, sweeping Texas in a pair of memorable games (10-9, 10 inn.; 4-3). Stanford then needed three games to eliminate South Carolina in the Super Regional. The Cardinal picked up an 11-1 victory in the opening game of the series before South Carolina came back with a 4-3 win in the second game. Stanford finally put the Gamecocks away with a 3-2 win in the final game. Stanford then won its first three games at the CWS with a win over Tulane (13-11) and a pair of wins over Cal State Fullerton (5-2, 10 inn.; 4-1) to advance to the CWS final.

STANFORD BASEBALL QUICK TEAM NOTES

Stanford has won a season-high seven straight games after sweeping all three games of the NCAA Regional ... Stanford finished in second place in the Pac-10 with a 16-8 conference record, giving the Cardinal either a first or second place finish in the league standings for the 20th time in the last 22 seasons ... Stanford wrapped up its eighth straight 40-win campaign with an 8-2 victory over Washington State in its regular season finale and needs seven more wins for its fourth straight 50-win season ... Stanford moved up two spots to No. 7 in the most recent *Baseball America* poll released June 3 ... Stanford is 27-4 at home, while the team has managed just a 16-12 mark on the road ... Stanford has come from behind to win in 19 of its 43 victories this season ... Stanford is 10-5 in one-run games and 5-2 in extra inning contests ... Stanford is averaging 8.1 runs per game, reaching double figures in runs 20 times and double figures in hits on 40 occasions ... Stanford leads the Pac-10 in earned run average (4.01) and fielding percentage (.971), while co-leading the conference in batting average (.322) ... Stanford's 43-16 record is one game behind the team's 44-15 mark through 59 games in 2001 ... Stanford has set a new school season record with 68 double plays turned ... Stanford has compiled a record of 194-64 (.752) since the beginning of 1999.

Posted a 4-1 record and a 1.88 ERA with 62 strikeouts in 67.0 innings over eight Pac-10 starts, allowing just 52 hits and 14 earned runs ... Recorded his first shutout of the season with the most dominating performance of his career, striking out a career-high 13 and scattering six hits in an 11-0 win over UCLA (5/17) ... Picked up a victory with a complete game versus Arizona State (5/10), scattering eight hits and three runs with eight strikeouts ... Earned a victory versus California (5/3), scattering six hits and four runs (three earned) with 10 strikeouts ... Suffered his only loss of the season at Oregon State (4/26) despite throwing his first complete game of the campaign to snap an 11-game win streak ... Received no decision with 6.0 scoreless innings at Washington (4/19), allowing just two hits and striking out seven before being removed with a 1-0 lead before Washington came back to win, 3-1 ... Tossed 9.0 innings versus USC (4/12), scattering six hits and four runs (three earned) with eight strikeouts ... Tossed 10.0 innings but received a no-decision at Arizona (4/5), allowing just two runs and nine hits to receive no decision in a game that Stanford eventually won 5-4 in 18 innings ... Scattered eight hits and six runs (three earned) in 6.0 innings to earn a victory at USC (3/23 - Game 1) ... Needed a Stanford comeback to win at California (3/8) as the Cardinal scored 15 runs in the seventh and eighth innings for a 15-4 win in a game California led 4-0 after six innings ... Allowed just five hits and two runs (one earned) with eight strikeouts in 8.0 innings in an 8-6 win over Cal Poly (3/1) ... Started the season with victories over Fresno State (2/15), Florida State (2/8) and Cal State Fullerton (2/1) in his first three starts.

STANFORD BASEBALL QUICK INDIVIDUAL NOTES

Sam Fuld leads the Cardinal with a .385 batting average and 102 hits ... Fuld ranks fifth on Stanford's all-time hit list and is just eight hits shy of breaking the school's single season record of 108 co-held by Troy Paulen (1990) and Mike Dotterer (1981) ... Fuld is hitting .479 (57-119) with 22 multiple-hit games over his last 27 games despite going 1-for-9 in his last two contests ... Fuld also leads the club in doubles (20), total bases (146) and on base percentage (.440) ... Fuld is Stanford's all-time batting average leader with a .372 (183-492) lifetime mark ... Ryan Garko leads the club in home runs (14) and runs scored (62), while co-leading the club with Jason Cooper in RBI (52) ... Brian Hall paces the team with 13 stolen bases in 13 chances ... Stanford's regular starting rotation of Jeremy Guthrie, John Hudgins and Tim Cunningham is a combined 29-4 with a 3.53 ERA ... Guthrie leads the team in ERA (2.34, #1 Pac-10), victories (11-1, #1-T Pac-10), strikeouts (119, #1 Pac-10), and innings pitched (134.1, #1 Pac-10) ... Guthrie is a finalist for the Golden Spikes Award, while Jason Cooper (Dick Howser Award), Garko (Johnny Bench Award) and O'Riordan (Dick Howser Award) are national semifinalist for their respective awards ... Chris O'Riordan has started 170 consecutive games at second base ... Arik VanZandt notched a team season-high with 18 putouts versus Long Beach State (6/1).

STANFORD JUMPS TWO SPOTS TO NO. 7 IN BASEBALL AMERICA POLL

Stanford has jumped two spots to No. 7 in this week's *Baseball America* poll released June 3 after sweeping all three games in the NCAA Regional last Friday-Sunday to extend its season-high win streak to seven games. Stanford currently ranks No. 8 (*Baseball Weekly/ESPN* - final regular season poll, *Collegiate Baseball*) in the other major national polls. Stanford began the season as the nation's unanimous No. 1 team and stayed on top of the *Baseball America* poll for the first seven weeks of the year before falling out of the top spot for the first time on April 1. Stanford spent two weeks (4/9 - 4/16) last year as the nation's unanimous No. 1 team and six weeks as *Baseball America's* top team (3/12 - 4/16) before finishing the year at No. 2 in all four polls. Stanford has been ranked No. 1 at one point during each of the past six years (including 2002). Stanford's poll history includes a run as "king of the polls" in 1998 when the team held the top spot in the *Baseball America* poll for the entire regular season (a record 14 consecutive weeks). USC is currently ranked No. 14 by *Baseball America*, No. 19 by *Baseball Weekly/ESPN* (final regular season poll) and No. 12 by *Collegiate Baseball*.

STANFORD IMPROVES TO 9-3 AGAINST RANKED OPPONENTS

Stanford improved to 9-3 versus ranked opponents after three victories over ranked clubs during the NCAA Regionals. Stanford won two-of-three games against then No. 15 Cal State Fullerton in its first series of the season (2/1 - 2/3) before picking up two-of-three wins at then No. 6 Florida State the following Friday-Sunday (2/8 - 2/10). Stanford then won two-of-three over then No. 16 Texas (3/28 - 3/30) in its final regular season games against a ranked team. Stanford's victories in the Regional were over No. 25 Cal State Fullerton (5/31) and twice over No. 22 Long Beach State (6/1, 6/2).

STANFORD WINS 14 OF 16 REGULAR SEASON SERIES

Stanford won 14 of its 16 series during the 2002 regular season. The Cardinal opened the season by winning two-of-three games in its first four series versus Cal State Fullerton (2/1 - 2/3), at Florida State (2/8 - 2/10), at Fresno State (2/15 - 2/18) and versus Santa Clara (2/22 - 2/24). The Cardinal then swept two of its next three series versus Cal Poly (3/1 - 3/3) and at USC (3/23 - 3/24), while splitting the sweeps with two-of-three wins at California (3/8 - 3/10). Stanford then won two-of-three in three more series versus Texas (3/28 - 3/30), at Arizona (4/5 - 4/7) and versus USC (4/12 - 4/14) before finally being beaten in a series for the first time in 2002 with losses in two-of-three games at Washington (4/19 - 4/21). The Cardinal lost two-of-three games again the following weekend at Oregon State (4/26 - 4/28) before rebounding with a sweep versus California (5/3 - 5/5) in the first series of May. Stanford finished the campaign by winning two-of-three versus Arizona State (5/10 - 5/12) and at UCLA (5/17 - 5/19) before sweeping Washington State (5/24 - 5/26) to end the regular season. The Cardinal was 14-2 in series openers, 8-8 in middle games of series and 12-4 in series finales.

TOP OF THE PAC

Stanford (16-8 Pac-10) finished in second place in the final regular season Pac-10 standings, one game behind league champion and Super Regional opponent USC (17-7 Pac-10). The second place finish put Stanford among the top two in the conference standings (includes Pac-10 Southern Division) for the ninth straight year and the 20th time in the last 22 years with the only blemishes over that time period a fourth place finish in 1989 and a sixth place showing in 1993.

STANFORD EXTENDS SUNKEN DIAMOND SERIES WIN STREAK TO 22

Stanford won its 22nd straight regular season series at Sunken Diamond by sweeping Washington State (5/24 - 5/26) in its final regular season series of 2002. The last team to win a regular season series against Stanford at Sunken Diamond was USC with two-of-three wins from April 16-18, 1999. Stanford has won 33 of its last 37 regular season series overall.

HAPPY AT HOME

Stanford is 27-4 at Sunken Diamond this season, while managing just a 16-12 mark on the road. Stanford has won 14 of its last 15 games at home. The Cardinal is just 5-7 in its last 12 road games and lost two-of-three games in back-to-back Pac-10 road series at Washington (4/19 - 4/21) and Oregon State (4/26 - 4/28).

CARDINAL PICKS UP EIGHTH STRAIGHT 40-WIN SEASON

Stanford picked up its eighth straight 40-win season by winning its final four regular season games. The last time Stanford didn't win 40 games was when the club finished 27-18 in 1993.

JEREMY GUTHRIE NAMED GOLDEN SPIKES AWARD FINALIST

Jeremy Guthrie has been named one of five national finalists for the prestigious Golden Spikes Award. The other finalists are Russ Adams (North Carolina, Jr., INF), Jeff Baker (Clemson, Jr., INF), Bobby Brownlie (Jr., RHP) and Khalil Greene (Clemson, Sr., INF).

GUTHRIE LEADS ALL-LEAGUE SELECTIONS AS PAC-10 PITCHER OF THE YEAR

Jeremy Guthrie led six Stanford players selected to the All-Pac-10 team by being named Pitcher of the Year, giving Stanford its sixth Pac-10 Pitcher of the Year in the last nine seasons. Five other Cardinal players -- Jason Cooper, Sam Fuld, Ryan Garko, Chris O'Riordan and Carlos Quentin -- earned All-Pac-10 honors. Tim Cunningham, John Hudgins and Andy Topham earned honorable mention.

SLAMMIN' SAMMY ON A SERIOUS TEAR

Sam Fuld has 22 multiple-hit games in his last 27 contests, hitting .479 (57-119) over the period with four homers, 24 RBI and seven stolen bases during the amazing stretch, despite going 1-for-9 in the final two NCAA Regional games. Fuld leads the team with a 102 hits and a .385 batting average, ranking fifth and 10th on Stanford's all-time single-season list in those categories. He is only seven hits shy of equaling the school's single-season hit record of 108 co-held by Troy Paulsen (1990) and Mike Dotterer (1981). Fuld remains on top of Stanford's career batting average list with a .372 lifetime mark (183-492). Fuld also paces the club with 20 doubles, 265 at bats, 146 total bases, a .440 on base percentage, 36 multiple-hit games, 11 three-hit games and three four-hit games. In addition, he was also Stanford's top hitter in Pac-10 action with a .425 batting average (45-106) in 24 conference games. Fuld also led the team in Pac-10 action in hits (45), RBI (27), runs scored (31), doubles (8, co-leader), triples (2, co-leader), total bases (69) and stolen bases (7).

RYAN GARKO LEADS TEAM IN HOME RUNS AND CO-LEADS IN RBI

Johnny Bench Award semifinalist Ryan Garko leads the team in with 14 home runs and is the team's co-leader with 52 RBI, both career-highs.

Chris O'Riordan has extended his string of consecutive games started at second base to 167. O'Riordan also had a couple of other notable streaks earlier this season, hitting safely in a career-high 12 straight games (4/5 - 4/21) and reaching base in 38 straight contests (2/1 - 4/21) before having both streaks snapped when he went 0-for-4 without reaching base in the series opener at Oregon State (4/26). STANFORD BASEBALL HISTORY

Stanford's storied baseball program has had many highlights as the program is in its 109th season with an all-time record of 2322-1464-32 (.612). The Cardinal won NCAA titles in 1987 and 1988 before returning to the CWS championship game in each of the last two years (2000, 2001). The program has had winning seasons in 37 of its last 38 campaigns and 54 of its last 56 seasons (including this year), has recorded three straight 50-win seasons for the first time in school history (1999-2001) and has reached the 40-win mark in eight consecutive campaigns (1995-2002). Just a few of the other highlights have included 13 College World Series appearances, 18 conference titles and 23 NCAA Tournament berths. Stanford has boasted a total of 43 All-Americans who have earned a total of 50 All-American honors. Stanford has also garnered three NCAA Player of the Year choices in Jeff Austin (1998), David McCarty (1991) and Steve Dunning (1970). Stanford's team batting average currently sits at .322 (co-Pac-10 leader with USC) and has been at .315 or higher all season. Stanford has raised its mark from a season-low .315 after a game at Arizona (4/5) with double figure hits in 22 of its last 33 games. Stanford has had a pair of season-high-tying 19-run games in a 19-2 win versus Saint Mary's (4/16) and a 19-1 win at Arizona (4/6) with a season-high 26 hits in the latter. Stanford has scored double-digit runs 19 times and is averaging 8.1 runs per game. The team also has double-digit hits in 40 of its 59 games, including six of its last seven. The Cardinal has hit 82 homers, tied for fifth on the school's all-time Top 5 list. Sam Fuld leads the club in batting average (.385), hits (102), doubles (20), total bases (146), at bats (265) and on-base percentage (.440). Fuld has been on an incredible tear of late, going 57-119 (.479) with 22 multiple-hit games in his last 27 contests despite going 1-for-9 in his last two games of the NCAA Regional. Ryan Garko leads the team in homers (14), runs scored (63) and bases on balls (37). Garko and Jason Cooper co-lead the club with 52 RBI each, while Cooper also leads the team in slugging percentage (.629). Carlos Quentin leads the team in triples (4) and hit-by-pitches (17). Brian Hall leads the club with 13 stolen bases in 13 attempts. Guthrie has the team's longest performance of the year with a career-high 13.0 inning complete game pitched versus Cal State Fullerton in the opening round of the NCAA Regional to lead the Cardinal to a 3-2 win. Ryan McCally (4-3, 4.07, 7 SV, 42.0 IP, 35 SO) leads the club with seven saves. Dan Rich (2-2, 2.90, 3 SV, 31.0 IP, 36 SO) and Darin Naatjes (4-0, 2.53, 2 SV, 21.1 IP, 25 SO) have emerged as two of the club's top relievers. Others pitching primarily out of the bullpen include Jonny Dyer (2-0, 4.38, 12.1 IP, 8 SO), David O'Hagan (0-0, 5.11, 12.1 IP, 8 SO), Drew Ehrlich (0-2, 5.45, 2 SV, 39.2 IP, 40 SO), J.D. DEFENSIVE REPORT

Stanford leads the Pac-10 with a .971 fielding percentage, currently tied for its highest mark of the year and only .006 percentage points below last year's .977 school record and nation's best mark. Stanford has been errorless in six of its last 16 regular season games and a total of 20 contests this year. Ryan Garko leads the club with 365 putouts, while Chris O'Riordan has a team-high 193 assists. The Cardinal has broken the single-season school record with 68 double plays, including a season-high four at Fresno State (2/18). STANFORD HEAD COACH MARK MARQUESS

One of the nation's premier collegiate coaches, Mark Marquess is in his 26th season at the helm of Stanford Baseball in 2002. Marquess has a career record of 1089-531-5 (.672), all at Stanford. Marquess coached his 1600th game at Stanford this season in a 19-2 win over Saint Mary's (4/16). Last year, he became the 23rd coach in the history of NCAA Division I baseball to reach the 1000-win mark with a 6-2 victory over Florida State in a game played on February 9, 2001. The 1969 Stanford graduate has led the Cardinal to two NCAA titles (1987, '88) and two other CWS title game appearances (2000, '01), as well as 11 College World Series appearances (1982, '83, '85, '87, '88, '90, '95, '97, '99, 2000, '01), 12 NCAA Regional titles (1982, '83, '85, '87, '88, '90, '95, '97, '99, 2000, '01, '02), 10 Pac-10 or Pac-10 Southern Division regular season titles (1983, '84, '85, '87, '90, '94, '97, '98, '99, 2000) and three NCAA Super Regional championships (1999, 2000, '01). The Cardinal has qualified for the NCAA Tournament 20 times under Marquess (includes this season). He began the 2002 season ranked 12th in victories and 16th in winning percentage among active Division I baseball coaches, while ranking 23rd on the all-time victory list and 42nd on the all-time winning percentage list. He has been named NCAA Coach of the Year three times (1985, '87, '88) and has received Pac-10 or Pac-10 Southern Division Coach of the Year honors on eight occasions (1983, '85, '87, '90, '94, '97, '98, '99). The Cardinal has posted winning seasons 25 times in 26 years under his leadership (includes this season) and has finished either first or second in the prestigious Pacific-10 (formerly Pac-10 Southern Division) 20 times in the last 22 years (includes this season). Stanford has had 104 professional baseball draft picks in the past 18 seasons, including 13 first round selections in the last 16 years (includes this season). A member of the American Baseball Coaches Association Hall of Fame, Marquess was the head coach of the 1988 United States Olympic baseball team that captured the gold medal. Marquess was also an accomplished football and baseball standout on The Farm and is a member of the Stanford Athletic Hall of Fame. He is one of only six collegiate baseball head coaches to have both played and coached in the College World Series. Marquess was the starting first baseman and a First Team All-American on Stanford's 1967 College World Series squad and played four seasons of minor league baseball with the Chicago White Sox organization.

COMMENTS FROM MARK MARQUESS

(on USC and the Super Regional)

"It'll be a very challenging Super Regional versus USC. They had a lot of injuries early in the season but played very well in the second half of the season when they were healthy. Winning the conference speaks volumes of the team they have. We won 11 of our last 13 games and couldn't catch them. Both teams know each other well. It should be a great Super Regional and a very special weekend."

"We always draw a lot of interest for USC. It's a great rivalry, it just adds more to it because we're playing in a Super Regional to go to Omaha. There's a lot riding on this."

"USC is similar to our team. They are very dangerous offensively. They are a veteran team with lots of juniors and seniors. They have played in the College World Series and postseason tested."

"I don't have to say much about USC (to our players). Our players know how good the Trojans are, their reputation and their players."

"We earned a right to host a Regional and a Super Regional, and be seeded eighth nationally. Even though we didn't win the Pac-10, our overall record against good teams makes us deserve to host a Regional. It's a reward for our players to be able to play the Super Regional to play it here."

(on Jeremy Guthrie and being drafted in the first round)

"Jeremy is one of, if not the best, pitcher in college baseball. He'll be a tremendous professional pitcher because he has the ability to throw three or four pitches for strikes. I'm happy for him because he's earned it and worked hard."

STANFORD COACHING STAFF

Dean Stotz is in his 26th campaign with Stanford Baseball and his third season as associate head coach after he was promoted to the position prior to the 2000 campaign. Stotz served for 23 years as an assistant. Stotz currently coaches third base while also handling various offensive and defensive aspects of the game. Tom Kunis (3rd season) handles the Cardinal pitching staff, while Dave Nakama (3rd season) returns as an assistant coach after three seasons as the head coach at San Francisco State. Nakama, also a Cardinal assistant in 1997 and 1998, assists with all aspects of the game and serves as Stanford's first base coach.
