Texas Tech Participating in 24th Bowl

The Texas Tech Red Raiders face the East Carolina Pirates Wed., Dec. 27, at 7 p.m. in the inaugural galleryfurniture.com Bowl at the Astrodome in Houston, Texas. Texas Tech is appearing in its 24th bowl and ranks among the top 25 in all-time bowl appearances.

The Records

Texas Tech finished the 2000 regular season with a 7-5 record and 3-5 mark in Big 12 play. The Red Raiders knocked off Oklahoma State in the 11th game of the season to become bowl eligible for the eighth-consecutive season.

East Carolina wrapped up its regular season with a 14-9 at Southern Miss on Nov. 24. The Pirates are 7-4 overall and 5-2 in Conference USA play. ECU is making its second-straight bowl appearance.

Texas Tech Bowl History

The Red Raiders are tied 20th all-time with 23 bowl appearances in the program's 75 years. In those 23 games, Tech is 5-17-1. In the last eight seasons that Tech has qualified for a bowl appearance, the Red Raiders have participated in five postseason games:

Tough Slate

Texas Tech faced one of the toughest conference schedules in school history this season as four of the Red Raiders' eight league opponents were ranked among the top 20 at the time of the game. The games against Nebraska and Oklahoma mark the first time in school history that Texas Tech has faced two No. 1 teams in the same season. Kansas State was ranked 10th at game time, while Texas was ranked 20th. Texas A&M wasn't ranked when the Red Raiders travelled to College Station, but moved into the polls midway through the season.

Texas Tech vs. Conference USA

Texas Tech has faced three current members of Conference USA and trail the three teams 12-20-2. Of the 34 meetings, 28 of those came against Houston when both teams were members of the Southwest Conference.

Baker Posts Impressive Senior Campaign

Senior receiver Tim Baker finished the season with a Big 12-leading 69 catches for 765 yards -- both career highs. "Bake" caught seven touchdowns and finished second on the team with 63.8 all-purpose yards per game.

Dorris Finishes Strong

Senior receiver Derek Dorris also had an impressive season, catching 56 passes for 574 yards. He led the team with nine scoring catches, including a school-record four TD receptions at Kansas. Dorris' nine touchdown catches ranked him second on the scoring list this season with 54 points.

Kingsbury Ranks Among Best All-Time

Kliff Kingsbury has set several Texas Tech passing records in his sophomore season and first year as the Red Raider signal caller. He also is moving up the career charts.

Getting the Most Out of Completions

Kliff Kingsbury completed a school-record 362 passes this season, 21 of those for touchdowns. Kingsbury averaged a touchdown pass every 17.2 completions. Kingsbury also led the nation in completions and was one of two quarterbacks to complete more than 300 passes.

Defense Provides a Little Offense

Texas Tech's SWARM defense showed its versatility during the season, scoring four touchdowns, two on interceptions and two on fumble returns. The special teams also added a touchdown on a blocked field goal return against Oklahoma State.

Tech Defense Leads Nation in Shutouts

The Texas Tech defense led the nation this season with three shutouts – Louisiana-Lafayette, Baylor and Oklahoma State. The Red Raiders also held a fourth opponent – North Texas – without an offensive score. The Eagles scored their lone touchdown on an interception return.

Dead End

Tech senior linebacker Dorian Pitts led the team with 16 tackles for 74 lost yards. Pitts, who had five tackles for loss against OSU, also recorded five sacks on the season and returned a fumble for a touchdown.

Big 12 Leader

Sophomore linebacker Lawrence Flugence finished the season as the Big 12 Conference's top tackler with 156 tackles. His 156 tackles was second-best on Texas Tech's single-season list. Flugence was also fourth in the nation in tackles this year.

Curtis Collects Honors

Junior strong safety Kevin Curtis was named to several All-Big 12 teams, including first-team All-Big 12 by the *Associated Press*, *Football News*, *The Sporting News*, the *Dallas Morning News* and the *Houston Chronicle*. Curtis was also a second-team All-Big 12 selection by the Big 12 coaches.

Paper or Plastic?

Sophomore defensive end Aaron Hunt wrapped up the season with a team-high eight sacks, which ranks him fifth on the single-season sack list. Hunt has tallied 13 career sacks in his two seasons as a Red Raider and ranks ninth on Tech's all-time sack list.

Making His Mark

Junior strong safety Kevin Curtis has compiled 319 tackles in his three year to put him ninth on the Red Raiders' all-time career list for tackles. He was second on the team in tackles this season with 121.

Take it Away

Senior corner back Antwan Alexander recorded a team-high four interceptions this season. Alexander got a pick in four games this year: New Mexico, Baylor, Kansas State and Oklahoma State.

Top Tacklers

Texas Tech had five players rank in the top 10 in the Big 12 in tackles this season. Sophomore Lawrence Flugence led the league with 156 tackles, while junior strong safety Kevin Curtis was fifth with 121. Senior linebacker Dorian Pitts was seventh with 119 followed by senior free safety Mark Washington who was ninth with 114 and senior linebacker John Norman was 10th with 106.

Head Coach Mike Leach

Mike Leach fancies himself a *Rio Bravo* aficionado, and short of that, at least the world's biggest fan of the 1959 western movie.

Leach, named head football coach at Texas Tech Dec. 9, 1999, loves to draw an analogy from the John Wayne movie classic when talking Red Raider football. *Rio Bravo* logic, if you will.

He tells the story of Sheriff John T. Chance (John Wayne), and his charges defending the town against the raucous Burdett family, despite being a collection of mostly scraggly misfits themselves. He explains how they manage to get the job done, no matter the circumstances.

Leach likes to tell of Sheriff Chance and his frontier company working together under extreme pressure. He speaks of being flexible and confident enough to remain fair, while resorting to whatever measures necessary to get the job done.

An analogy to Leach and Chance is an

easy one, but a more accurate comparison is probably Leach and Colorado, a young gunslinger played by Ricky Nelson.

In the movie it was Chance who said of Colorado, "He's so good he doesn't feel he has to prove it." Those who know Leach say the same about Texas Tech's new, unassuming offensive gunslinger.

In reviewing the cast of *Rio Bravo*, columnist Charles Taylor said, "Their relaxation with each other, their ease with themselves, is the result of ... respect. They express it in actions, not words..." It's with that logic Leach assembled his first Texas Tech coaching staff.

A national search brought Leach and company to West Texas in December following the retirement of Red Raider coaching legend Spike Dykes, and ironically he begins collegiate head coaching career where he coached his last game as an assistant.

Leach was working the East sideline at Jones SBC Stadium as Oklahoma's offensive coordinator when Tech closed the Dykes era with a victory over the Sooners in a Big 12 South Division showdown.

In just one season at Oklahoma, Leach directed a Sooner offense that went from one of the worst in the Big 12 Conference to one of the best. Under Leach's tutelage, OU quarterback Josh Heupel was named 1999 Big 12 Offensive Newcomer of the Year.

Leach guided an Oklahoma offense that went from 11th in the Big 12 in 1998 to first in 1999, 101st in the nation to 11th. In just one year, OU total offense numbers improved from 293.3 to 427.2 yards per game.

The rise in passing and scoring offense categories is just as impressive. Oklahoma went from last to first in the Big 12 in passing offense in one year, from 107th in the country to ninth. Under Leach, the Sooners improved from 109.9 yards passing per game to 321.7 yards per game.

In 1998, Oklahoma was last in the Big 12 and 101st in the country in scoring offense at 16.7 points per game. In 1999, the Sooners improved to second in the league and eighth in the country in scoring at 36.8 points per game, an increase of just over 20 points per game.

Under Leach, the Oklahoma offense set six Big 12 Conference and 17 OU records. The Sooners were one of only two schools in the nation to have six players with 20 or more receptions in 1999.

Prior to joining Bob Stoops' Oklahoma staff, Leach served as offensive coordinator for Hal Mumme at the University of Kentucky and Valdosta (Ga.) State University.

For two years at Kentucky Leach masterminded the Kentucky "Air Raid" offense that was one of the most explosive in Southeastern Conference history. Under Leach, the Kentucky offense set six NCAA records, 41

Southeastern Conference records and 116 school records in 22 games.

Kentucky's offense produced more than 500 yards total offense in seven separate games, including a school-record 801 against Louisville in 1998.

Leach's Kentucky offense featured the talents of quarterback Tim Couch, who passed for 4,275 yards and 34 touchdowns as a senior. Kentucky receiver Craig Yeast ended the 1998 season as the top receiver in the SEC with 85 receptions for 1,311 yards and 14 touchdowns.

Named 1996 Division II Offensive Coordinator of the Year by *American Football Quarterly* magazine, Leach helped lead Valdosta State to a 40-17-1 record. The 1993 Blazer offense smashed 66 school records, 22 conference records and seven national records. In 1994, Valdosta State advanced to the Division II playoffs with Leach's offense shattering 80 school records, 35 conference records and seven more national marks.

Leach and Mumme first teamed up at Iowa Wesleyan College in 1989. From 1989 to 1991 he served as offensive coordinator and line coach for an offense that led the NAIA in passing yardage one season and finished second the other two. Iowa Wesleyan passed for more than 11,000 yards in Leach's three seasons and broke 26 national records.

Leach has also made coaching stops in Pori, Finland, where he served as head coach in the European Football League (1989), as well as one-year assistant stints at College of the Desert (1988) and Cal Poly-San Luis Obispo (1987).

After graduating with honors from Brigham Young in 1983, Leach earned a Master's Degree from the United States Sports Academy and his law degree from Pepperdine University, where he graduated in the top one-third of his class.

The oldest of six siblings, Leach and his wife, Sharon, are the parents of four children; Janeen, Kim, Cody and Kiersten.

An obvious proponent of the passing game, Leach resorts to further *Rio Bravo* logic when talking offensive philosophy.

Trapped under heavy gunfire and obviously gaining little through conventional means, the "good guys" resorted to **tossing** lighted sticks of dynamite toward the Burdett clan.

Translated by Leach, "they weren't getting anywhere through conventional means, shooting from behind sage brush and wagons **on the ground**. The logical way to win, then, was **through the air**."

So with his version of "Air Raider" football and an attacking defense also geared to score points, Leach has lighted the fuse at Texas Tech and a dynamic new era of Red Raider football is set to explode over West Texas and the Big 12 Conference.

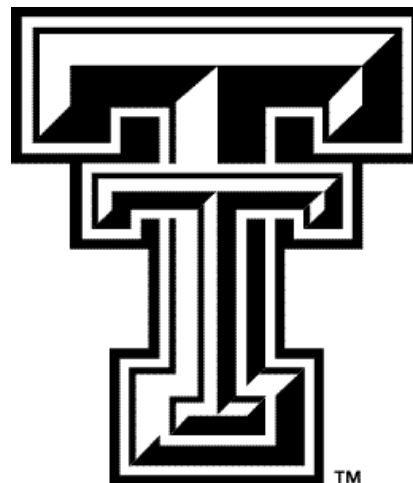
