## THE SEASON STORYLINES . . .

- Tulsa completed the season with a 2-10 overall record and 2-6 American Athletic Conference mark.
- Three Tulsa players, all three returning in 2015, earned all-conference honors as voted on by the league's coaches – second-team selections WR Keevan Lucas and DE Derrick Alexander and honorable mention P Dalton Parks.
- This was the 115th season that Tulsa has fielded a football team . . . Tulsa fielded its first team in 1895 (Tulsa did not field a football team in 5 different seasons).
- Tulsa has the smallest undergraduate enrollment of FBS schools with 3,429 students.
- The Hurricane had 12 seniors this season – Donnell Hawkins, Dwight Dobbins, Demarco Nelson, Carl Salazar, Luke Snider, Mitchell Osborne, Matt Luetjen, Austin McDaniel, Chris Hummingbird, Jake Sizelove, Davis Walton and Brentom Todd.
- Offensive lineman Davis Walton was the lone scholarship senior on the Tulsa offense in 2014.
- Tulsa had 20 freshmen earn playing time this year — including eight true freshmen and 12 red-shirt freshmen . . . four true freshmen and three red-shirt freshmen started games this year.
- Sophomore quarterback Dane Evans became only the fifth player (but sixth time) in school history to throw for over 3,000 yards in a single season . . . he had 3,102 passing yards to rank fifth on the school's single-season passing chart.
- Evans threw a touchdown pass in all 12 games this season.
- Senior safety Demarco Nelson surpassed the 300 career tackle plateau with his first tackle at Houston, becoming the 16th player in school history with 300+ tackles . . . he ended his career with 312 career stops.
- Sophomore receiver Keevan Lucas had 1,219 receiving yards and was Tulsa's first 1,000-yard single-season receiver since the 2009 season.
- Lucas' 11 receiving touchdowns is the most since Trae Johnson had 13 TD receptions in the 2007 season.
- Seven of Tulsa's 12 opponents this year were Bowl eligible.

## WHAT RETURNS IN 2015 . . .

- Tulsa will return 30 different players who started at least one game in 2014, including 19 on offense and 11 on defense.
- The only offense player who started at least six games who does not return is OG Davis Walton, who started the last six games at right guard.
- Tulsa returns its top two tacklers from 2014 — safety Michael Mudoh (113) and linebacker Craig Suits (81) . . . Mudoh will be a senior and Suits a sophomore.
- The top sack-getter (7.5 for -58 yards) and TFL producer (12 for -72 yards) returns in the likes of DE Derrick Alexander.
- On offense, Tulsa returns its leading passer sophomore Dane Evans (3,102), top rusher junior Zack Langer (801) and top receiver sophomore Keevan Lucas (1,219).
- Tulsa returns 480.1 of its all-purpose yardage total (5,762 of 6069 all-purpose yards) in 2015.
- Tulsa returns 100-percent of its rushing and passing totals, and 93.5 percent of its receiving totals.
- A total of 61 lettermen return, including 31 on offense, 26 on defense and four specialists.



**TULSA HEAD COACH BILL BLANKENSHIP COMPLETED FOURTH YEAR AT THE COACHING HELM . . .**

- Bill Blankenship is a 1979 graduate of The University of Tulsa, where he was a quarterback from 1975-79.
- Completed his fourth season as head coach and his eighth as a member of the TU staff.
- As head coach, Blankenship posted an overall 24-27 overall record.
- In just his second season, Blankenship was named the 2012 Conference USA Coach of the Year after leading Tulsa to an overall 11-3 record and the schools' second C-USA Championship . . . the 11 wins tied a school record for victories.
- Completed his first season as the Golden Hurricane head coach in 2011 with an overall 8-5 record.
- Blankenship is just the second coach in school history to win 19 games in his first two seasons behind Todd Graham (21, 2007-08). Two other coaches won 18 games in two years — Francis Schmidt (18, 1919-20) and Henry Frnka (18 in 1941-42).
- Collected his first career collegiate win with a 31-3 win at Tulane on Sept. 10, 2011.
- Blankenship became only the seventh head coach in Tulsa history to win eight or more games in his first season.
- Blankenship was promoted as Tulsa's 28th Head Football Coach on January 14, 2011 . . . he spent the previous four years as a Tulsa assistant coach.
- Blankenship returned to his alma mater in January 2007 to coach the wide receivers . . . in 2008, Blankenship was named special teams coordinator and in 2009 added the title of running backs coach . . . in 2010, he served as senior associate head coach, running backs coach and special teams coordinator.
- Before entering the collegiate coaching ranks, Blankenship spent 23 years as an Oklahoma High School coach . . . Blankenship resigned as the head football coach at Tulsa's Union High School in December 2005 after leading his team to a second consecutive state championship at the Oklahoma Class 6A school.
- As a head coach on the prep level, Blankenship compiled a 205-68 record, including an average of 10 wins per season for his last 20 years, appeared in the state championship game eight times and won three state titles.
- He spent 14 years as the head football coach and athletic director at Union High School, where he registered a record of 154-26 . . . his teams qualified for the state playoffs 14 times, reached the quarterfinals 10 times and made the semifinals in nine seasons . . . Blankenship's teams made the state title game seven times . . . he guided his Union team to Oklahoma Class 6A state titles in 2002, 2004 and 2005.

**NEARLY IDENTICAL . . .**

- Tulsa's receiving combo of junior Keyarris Garrett and sophomore Keevan Lucas has nearly identical career receiving stats.
- In 24 career games, Lucas has 1,661 yards and 12 TDs on 133 receptions for a 12.5 average per catch.
- In 32 games, Garrett has 1,621 yards, 14 TDs and a 13.2-yard average on 123 career receptions.

**FIRST QUARTER SCORING . . .**

- Tulsa went scoreless in the first quarter of seven games this year, including the first five contests.
- Tulsa scored its first points of the first quarter this year on a 19-yard TD by Zach Langer at Temple in the sixth game.
- Tulsa scored just 59 first quarter points this year with — 7 points vs. Temple, 17 vs. USF, 7 at Memphis and 14 vs. SMU and East Carolina.
- In Game 7 vs. USF, the Hurricane scored 17 points in the first quarter, including seven points from the defensive unit on an interception return for a TD.
- Tulsa's 17-7 lead vs. USF at the end of the first quarter was the first time that Tulsa has led in the first quarter since the 2013 season finale against North Texas.

- Sophomore receiver Keevan Lucas ranked 2nd in the American Athletic Conference in receiving yards per game (101.6 ypg), receptions per game (8.4 rpg), and all-purpose yards (107.1 ypg), and scoring TDs per game (5.5 ppg)

**EVANS AMONG TOP-5 . . .**

- Sophomore quarterback Dane Evans ranked 2nd in The American for passing yards per game (258.5 ypg) and total offense (263.3 ypg).

**THREE ALL-CONFERENCE PICKS. . .**

## THE MATURATION PROCESS . . .

- Sophomore quarterback Dane Evans ranked third in the American Athletic Conference for passing yards per game (258.5), total offense (263.3) and for TDs thrown (23).
- In American Athletic Conference games, Evans completed 56.4-percent of his passes (170-of-301) for 2,173 yards (271.6 ypg), 10 INTs and 18 TDs in the eight league games.
- Evans went four games without throwing an interception — Temple, USF, Memphis and SMU . . . he had thrown 166 passes without giving up an interception before his first interception at UCF.

## MORE ON EVANS . . .

- Tulsa sophomore quarterback Dane Evans moved into 5th place on the school's single-season passing list with 3,102 yards and had 22 TDs . . . in eight games and five starts the previous season, Evans threw for 898 yards and 4 touchdowns.
- Evans is the 20th quarterback in school history to throw for over 2,000 yards in a single season, and it is just the sixth time that a player has thrown for over 3,000 yards in a season.
- Evans came into the season having played in eight games with five starts, and in those games as a red-shirt freshman last year never had a 200-yard passing game.
- He surpassed the 200-yard plateau in each of Tulsa's first nine games, including three games with over 300 passing yards . . . his streak of 200+ passing games was snapped with just 69 passing yards at UCF . . . he finished the season with 10 200+ passing games on the season.
- In the season opener against Tulane, Evans threw for nearly half of his total yardage from those eight games of the previous season as he completed 31-of-53 passes for 438 yards.
- He also matched his career total for TDs of four with four TDs in the Tulane game, with touchdown throws that covered 43, 84, 3 and 8 yards . . . he bettered that with five TD passes against SMU.
- His 438 yards is the ninth-best performance in school history, while it also is the fifth-best passing performance in the two years of American Athletic Conference history.
- Evans threw for 244 first-half yards in the opener, which bettered his previous career-high of 161 yards for a game last year against Marshall.
- He had his second career game of throwing for over 300 yards with 314 yards and one TD against USF, and followed that with 349 yards and two touchdowns at Memphis.
- With five TD passes against SMU, it was the most for a Tulsa quarterback since G.J. Kinne threw five TDs in the 2010 season opener at East Carolina.

## THE TAKEAWAY STORY . . .

- The Tulsa defense had just two takeaways through the first four games this year, and those two came in the season opener vs. Tulane.
- In the final eight contests, the Hurricane defense forced 13 turnovers
- Tulsa had at least two takeaways in five of the final eight games – Colorado State, Temple, USF, SMU and UCF . . . Tulsa did not force a turnover at Houston.
- In addition, the Tulsa defense has scored twice on those 13 takeaways . . . Tulsa had an interception return for a TD against USF and a fumble return for a touchdown at Memphis.
- Tulsa had a season-high three takeaways against SMU with two INTs and one fumble recovery.



**SOPHOMORE LUCAS FINISHES YEAR 6th ON SINGLE-SEASON RECEIVING CHART . . .**

- Sophomore receiver Keevan Lucas ended the season with 1,219 yards and 11 TDs on 101 receptions for a 101.6-yard average per game and a 12.1-yard average per play.
- His 1,219 yards ranks 6th on the school's single-season receiving chart.
- His 11 touchdown receptions are the most since the 2007 season when freshman Trae Johnson had 13 TD catches.
- He is the first 1,000- yard receiver since Damaris Johnson had 1,131 yards in the 2009 season.
- Lucas is only the 15th Tulsa player in school history with 1,000 receiving yards in a single season.
- Lucas surpassed 1,000 yards receiving on the season in the SMU game . . . he needed 71 yards to reach that plateau and did it with 88 yards on four catches.
- In 2012, Lucas caught 32 passes for 442 yards and one TD in 12 games as a true freshman.
- He had five 100-yard receiving games this year and caught at least one TD pass in eight games.
- Lucas had a streak of four straight games with 100+ receiving yards — Colorado State, Temple, USF and Memphis.
- Lucas had a career day in his first game this season with 233 yards and three TDs on 13 receptions against Tulane.
- A week later against #4-ranked Oklahoma, Lucas caught 10 passes for 84 yards and one touchdown.
- His other four career 100-yard receiving games were 101 yards vs. Colorado State, with a 62-yard TD, 109 yards vs. Temple with a 29-yard TD, 160 yards and one TD on 11 receptions vs. USF and 120 yards on 11 catches at Memphis.
- After 24 career games, Lucas has 1,661 yards and 12 TDs on 133 receptions for a 12.5 average per catch.

**LANGER GETS ANOTHER 100-YARD DAY . . .**

- Junior running back Zack Langer, hampered much of his career with nagging injuries, has turned in some solid running games for the Hurricane.
- Against Houston, Langer had his fourth 100+ rushing game of the season with 124 yards.
- He missed the season finale against East Carolina with an injury.
- Langer had a career-best 167 yards on 33 carries vs. SMU.
- Langer also had 100 yards on 26 rushes against USF, and a week earlier, he gained a career-best 113 yards and one TD on a career-high 30 carries against Temple.
- In the last eight games, Langer has rushed for 732 yards and three TDs for an average of 91.5 yards per game.
- He has had 82, 72, 113, 100, 43, 167, 31 and 124 yards rushing in the last eight games.
- This year, Langer has rushed for a team-leading 801 yards, a 4.1 average per carry and 4 TDs in 10 games played, after missing the season opener with an injury.
- Langer has rushed for 1,040 yards and 6 TDs in 36 career games . . . he came into this season with 239 rushing yards on 53 carries.

**TURNOVER STREAK STOPPED . . .**

- The Tulsa offense snapped the ball 86 times against Temple, the third most offensive snaps this season and did not suffer a turnover in that game.
- The non-turnover game snapped a streak of 48 straight games with a turnover . . . the last time Tulsa did not turn the ball over came vs. Rice on Nov. 6, 2010.

**TULSA AT CHAPMAN STADIUM . . .**

Tulsa has a 321-151-14 record at Skelly Field @ H.A. Chapman Stadium since the stadium was built in 1930 . . . Tulsa is 33-17 since 2007 when the name changed from Skelly Stadium to H.A. Chapman Stadium.

**TULSA TAKES POSSESSION . . .**

- Tulsa averaged 9.8 more plays a game than the opposition, 958 to 841.
- The Hurricane held a double-figure lead for total plays in nine games this year, as only SMU (3 plays), UCF (26 plays) and East Carolina (2 plays) had more offensive plays than Tulsa.
- Tulsa entered the UCF game averaging nearly 15 more plays and five minutes more of possession time than the opposition.
- However, UCF turned the tables on Tulsa and ran 26 more plays (82 to 56) and had just over 14 minutes more possession time than Tulsa (37:02 to 22:58).
- The Hurricane offense, which held onto the ball nearly five minutes more on average, 32:24 to 27:36 through the first nine games, has dipped to just over three minutes on average for the season.
- Tulsa had the time of possession advantage in nine of 12 games . . . only FAU, SMU and UCF held the ball longer than Tulsa.
- In the SMU game, the Mustangs held just an eight-second edge in possession time, 30:04 to 29:56.
- The previous four games before SMU, Tulsa held nearly a combined 36-minute edge in possession time, 8:46 at Colorado State, 13:08 at Temple, 6:03 against USF and 7:56 at Memphis.

**THE BIG PLAY WAS TULSA NEMESIS . . .**

- Tulsa opponents had 44 plays of 30+ yards this season for an average of 50.8 yards per play and a total of 19 touchdowns.
- Those 44 plays amounted to 2,237 of the opponents 5,841 total yards this year, which is 40.8 percent of the opponents offense.
- In Tulsa's first three games, the opposition gained 30+ yards on 14 plays from scrimmage . . . on those 14 plays, the opponent averaged 55.9 yards per play and scored 6 touchdowns . . . that equaled 782 yards on just 14 plays for 48-percent of the opponents total offense.
- In the fourth game against Texas State, Tulsa allowed just one 30+ yard play and that was a 35-yard touchdown in the second overtime.
- Against Colorado State, the Tulsa defense gave up six plays of 30+ yards for 318 yards and 3 TDs . . . CSU had another play of 28 yards for a touchdown.
- In the Temple game, Tulsa gave up 301 yards on seven plays of 30 yards or more, while one went for a TD and five others came on scoring drives . . . Tulsa held Temple to a 3.3-yard average on their remaining 59 plays.
- USF had three plays of over 30 yards totaling 173 yards and all three went for TDs .
- Memphis had two runs for over 30 yards, totaling 81 yards and two touchdowns.
- SMU scored on its first play on a 64-yard TD pass, but the Hurricane went until the fourth quarter before giving up another 30+ yard play . . . SMU had two 30+ yard plays totaling 115 yards and one TD.
- UCF had two 30+ yard plays, a 48-yard pass and a 77-yard TD pass.
- Houston had four 30+ yard plays, covering 40 and 38 yards by pass and 56 and 45 yards on the ground.
- East Carolina had plays of 43 and 31 yards passing and 54 rushing yards.

**A NEW STREAK BEGINS . . .**

- Tulsa entered the Memphis game with at least one QB sack in 37 straight games.
- Tulsa failed to record a sack against Memphis, snapping the streak at 37 games.
- The last time before the Memphis game that Tulsa did not register a sack came at UCF on Nov. 3, 2011.
- Since that streak was stopped, Tulsa started a new streak with a sack in each of the final four games, totaling 11 sacks for -57 yards.
- Tulsa began the new streak with four QB sacks for -22 yards against SMU.
- Tulsa has also had three sacks for -11 yards in the next game at UCF, two for -13 yards at Houston and two against East Carolina for -11 yards.

- Δ Tulsa has two Heisman Trophy runners-up – Jerry Rhome (1964) and Howard Twilley (1965)
- Δ Tulsa won a school record 11 games in 2008 and 2012
- Δ Paul Smith won the 2007 Wuerffel Trophy, while Wilson Hollo-way won the FedEx Orange Bowl-FWAA Courage Award in 2008

**THE YOUNG ONES GETTING OFFENSIVE . . .**

- A pair of true freshmen skill position players — D'Angelo Brewer and Bishop Louie — saw extensively more playing time as the season progressed.
- Brewer led Tulsa with 602 kick return yards on 27 returns for a 22.3 average, and with his receiving (64) and rushing (128) totaled has 794 all-purpose yards.
- Louie, who received his first start at Houston, had 274 receiving yards, 100 rushing, 168 on kick returns and 42 on punt returns for 584 all-purpose yards.
- The true freshmen duo has combined for 1,378 all-purpose yards, and ranked among the top-five for all-purpose yards on the team . . . Brewer was third and Louie ranked fifth.

**IT'S TWO OVER 1,000 CAREER RECEIVING YARDS . . .**

- Tulsa began the season with no receiver on the roster who had reached the 1,000-yard plateau for a career.
- Tulsa ended the season with two receivers who have caught passes for over 1,000 career yards – junior Keyarris Garrett and sophomore Keevan Lucas.
- They will enter the 2015 season needing less than 500 yards to reach 2,000 career yards and become just the 14th and 15th receivers to do so.
- Garrett hit 1,000 career yards in his 23rd career game played, while Lucas reached his 1,000th career receiving yard in his 18th career game.
- Garrett reached 1,000 in the season opener against Tulane, and ended the season with 1,621 yards and 14 career touchdowns in 32 career games.
- Lucas hit the 1,000-yard plateau against Temple, and ended his sophomore season with 1,661 career yards and 12 TDs in 24 career contests.
- The duo has combined for 3,282 career yards and 26 touchdown receptions.

**MORE ON GARRETT . . .**

- Junior receiver Keyarris Garrett returned this year after missing all but two games in 2013 with a broken leg.
- Garrett missed two games this year, including Colorado State and USF.
- Garrett now has 1,621 career receiving yards and 14 TDs in 32 career games.
- He had his third 100-yard plus receiving game in his career against Texas State this year with 117 yards on eight catches . . . two of his eight receptions vs. Texas State were for 20 yards or more, covering 39 and 26 yards.
- In 10 games this year, 13 of his 47 receptions went for 20+ yards.
- Garrett had 698 yards in 10 games this year for a 69.8 average per game.

**SEVENTEEN FIRST-TIME STARTERS . . .**

- Tulsa had 19 players who started for the first time in their collegiate careers, including six freshmen – true freshmen Nigel Carter, Earl Rollins, Bishop Louie and D'Angelo Brewer and red-shirt freshmen Zac Uhles and Kerwin Thomas,
- Six players received their first collegiate start against Tulane in the season opener – OG Chris Wallace, OG Garrett Gladd, WR Josh Atkinson, RB James Flanders, H-B Mandel Dixon and LB Craig Suits.
- Since then, 12 more players made their first career starts.
- Junior WR Conner Floyd started against Oklahoma, senior LB Jake Sizelove and red-shirt freshman CB Kerwin Thomas against FAU.
- Junior CB Darrell Williams and true freshman DT Earl Rollins started their first games vs. Texas State and true freshman WR Nigel Carter vs. Colorado State.
- RB Zack Langer, C Billy Lafortune and LB Zik Asiegbu started at Temple
- Red-shirt freshman Zac Uhles started his first career game at center against Memphis . . . it was just his third game that he had played for the Hurricane.
- Junior H-back Colby Scott started his first game against SMU, while true freshman receiver Bishop Louis saw his first career start at Houston.
- True freshman running back D'Angelo Brewer made his first career start in the season finale against East Carolina.

## SECOND HALF COMEBACKS FORCE OTs . . .

- Twice this season when Tulsa trailed at halftime, the Hurricane came back in the second half to put the game into overtime.
- Against Tulane, Tulsa trailed 21-14 at halftime and came back to tie the game at 28-28 to force overtime . . . Tulsa won that game in two overtime periods 38-31.
- The Texas State game saw Tulsa trailing 7-0 at halftime and 17-3 after three quarters . . . Tulsa tied the game at 17-17 with 0:10 remaining on the 4th quarter clock to force overtime . . . this time, though, Texas State won in the third OT period, 37-34.

## MUDOH HAS 14 DOUBLE-FIGURE TACKLE GAMES . . .

- Junior safety Michael Mudoh will enter the 2015 season with 14 career double-figure tackle games in 24 games as a starter.
- Mudoh had six double-digit tackle games in 2014.
- Mudoh finished the 2013 season with eight double-figure tackle games, including the final four games of the season.
- In the 2014 season opener vs. Tulane, Mudoh picked up where he left off by tallying 10 tackles for his fifth consecutive double-figure tackle game . . . in 2013, he ended the year with 10 stops vs. East Carolina, 12 vs. Marshall, 10 vs. Louisiana Tech and 13 vs. North Texas.
- Mudoh had seven stops vs. Oklahoma to end his double-digit tackle streak of five games . . . after that five-game streak ended, he added 14 tackles against FAU, had 10 stops against Texas State and 12 tackles at Memphis.
- He had 12 stops, one INT and one fumble recovery vs. SMU and added 11 tackles at Houston
- Mudoh led TULsa for the second straight year in tackles with 113 stops.
- Mudoh will enter his senior season with 271 career tackles in 38 games played.

## SOPHOMORES CATCHING THEIR COACHES . . .

- A pair of sophomores, quarterback Dane Evans and receiver Keevan Lucas, are each coached by coaches that played at Tulsa.
- QB coach Josh Blankenship (1999-2001) played QB at Tulsa, while WR coach Dan Bitson (1987-89, 91) was an All-American receiver at Tulsa.
- Evans surpassed Blankenship on the school's single-season passing chart for 11th place in the SMU game and ended the year with 3,102 yards, while Blankenship threw for 2,507 yards in 2000.
- Bitson is on the single-season top-10 list twice (1989 with 1,425 yards and 1988 with 1,138 yards) . . . Lucas surpassed Bitson for his ninth place total of 1,138 yards as Lucas ended the year with 1,219 yards.

## LUCAS NAMED THE AMERICAN PLAYER OF THE WEEK AFTER SEASON OPENER . . .

- Tulsa sophomore receiver Keevan Lucas was named the American Athletic Conference Offensive Player of the Week after the first week of the season.
- Lucas was also named the College Football Performance Awards National Receiver of the Week.
- Lucas caught 13 passes for 233 yards and 3 TDs in the win over Tulane.
- It was the second-best receiving performance for a single-game in American Athletic Conference history.

## EVANS NAMED THE AMERICAN PLAYER OF THE WEEK AFTER FIVE TOUCHDOWN GAME . . .

- Tulsa sophomore quarterback Dane Evans was Tulsa's second American Athletic Conference Offensive Player of the Week after games the week of Nov. 8th.
- Against SMU, Evans threw for a career-best five touchdowns, while completing 16-of-24 passes for 286 yards.

## CONSECUTIVE STARTS . . .

- Four Tulsa players have had consecutive starting streaks of over 20 games since being inserted into the starting lineup for their first starting assignment.
- Junior offensive tackle Garrett Stafford has started 26 straight games since his first start in the 1012 C-USA Championship Game.
- Junior defensive tackle Derrick Luetjen and junior safety Michael Mudoh each received their first career start in the 2013 season opener and have now started 24 consecutive games.
- Junior defensive end Derrick Alexander has 23 straight starts after earning his first in the second game of the 2013 campaign.

## QUICK HITS . . .

- A total of 41 freshmen or sophomores saw some type of playing time this season for Tulsa, including 8 true freshmen, 11 red-shirt freshmen and 22 sophomores . . . whereas, only 9 seniors and 19 juniors played this year.
- Of the 56 players that saw action in the season opener, 31 were either freshmen or sophomores, while only 11 were seniors.
- Tulsa had three games this year with a 100-yard receiver and a 100-yard rusher in the same game – Texas State, Temple and USF.
- Tulsa went 48 straight games dating back to the 2010 season with a turnover before stopping the streak with zero turnovers at Temple . . . the last time Tulsa did not have a turnover was against Rice on Nov. 6, 2010.
- Tulsa took its first lead in regulation time this year in the 4th quarter at Temple . . . it took Tulsa 24 quarters to garner its first lead in a game this season.
- Senior safety Demarco Nelson had his second career defensive touchdown when he ran in a fumble from six yards out at Memphis . . . in his freshman season, Nelson had an 81-yard INT return for a TD at Oklahoma State.
- Senior cornerback Austin McDaniel had his second career INT against USF, but it was his first that was returned for a touchdown.
- True freshman DE Jeremy Smith's first two career tackles were both quarterback sacks . . . he had an 11-yard sack in the Tulane game and a 10-yard sack against Texas State.
- There were 21 different players on the Tulsa defense that have started at least one game in their careers . . . nine of those are either freshmen or sophomores.
- During preseason, four walk-ons were awarded scholarships — DT Hayden Carman, H-B Mandel Dixon Jr., safety Matt Linscott and H-B Colby Scott.
- On the 105-player roster, Tulsa had 73 freshmen or sophomore compiling 69.5 percent of the roster, which is tied for the fifth-most in the NCAA this season.
- QB Dane Evans started five games in 2013 without a 200+ passing game, but went over the 200-yard mark in 10 games this year with one over 400 yards and two 300+ passing games.
- Tulsa defenses' streak of 37 games with at least one QB sack came to an end with zero sacks at Memphis . . . the streak started Nov. 3, 2011 at UCF.
- Junior CB Darrell Williams made his first career start vs. Texas State . . . he missed last year when he suffered a severe leg injury (left knee dislocation with reconstruction to the ACL and PCL) in preseason camp after coming out of spring as a No. 1 cornerback . . . he started the next week vs. Colorado State.
- Tulsa has had eight true freshmen play this year – DEs Jeremy Smith and Petera Wilson, DT Earl Rollins, RB D'Angelo Brewer, WRs Bishop Louie, Brodrick Umblance and Nigel Carter and CB Jordan Mitchell
- Tulsa has had five different combinations of starting cornerbacks in the 11 games this year, including five different players . . . the starting combos have been Barrow/Dobbins (3 games), Thomas/Dobbins (3), Williams/McDaniel (2), Dobbins/McDaniel (2), Thomas/McDaniel (2).

## WHAT YOU DIDN'T KNOW ABOUT TULSA'S FOOTBALL TRADITION . . .

- Tulsa was the first school to play in five straight New Years Day Bowl Games — Sun Bowl (1-1-42), Sugar Bowl (1-1-43), Sugar Bowl (1-1-44), Orange Bowl (1-1-45) and Oil Bowl (1-1-46).
- Ellis Jones, an All-American guard in 1945, was a one-armed player. He was the defensive standout for the College All-Star team vs. the Chicago Bears in 1945.
- Three former TU football players are enshrined in the Pro Football Hall of Fame in Canton, Ohio. They are Bob St. Clair, Jim Finks and Steve Largent.
- Two former Tulsa players finished runner-up in the Heisman Trophy voting — quarterback Jerry Rhome in 1964 and receiver Howard Twilley in 1965.
- Perhaps the greatest Tulsa football player of all-time is Glenn Dobbs (1940-42). He was also head coach of the Hurricane teams in the 1960's. Eighth Street which runs north of H.A. Chapman Stadium was dedicated as Glenn Dobbs Drive on Oct. 21, 2000. A statue of Dobbs was erected outside the stadium before the 2013 spring game.
- Former TU players — Glenn Dobbs, Howard Twilley and Jerry Rhome — are enshrined in the College Football Foundation Hall of Fame.
- Other former TU players went on to the NFL — Steve Largent, Drew Pearson, Rickey Watts, Don Blackmon, David Alexander, Jerry Ostroski, Gus Frerotte, Dennis Byrd, Tom Miner, Steve August and Gus Frerotte — to name a few.
- Coaching in the NFL — Tulsa has had four former players serve as head coaches in the NFL — Tommy Hudspeth (Detroit Lions); Sam Rutigliano (Cleveland Browns); Ray Rhodes (Philadelphia Eagles and Green Bay Packers); and Lovie Smith (Chicago Bears and currently with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers). Current Jacksonville defensive coordinator Bob Babich is also a Tulsa graduate.
- Tulsa has three former players and two former coaches who have been inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame. The players are Glenn Dobbs, who also coached the Hurricane, Howard Twilley and Jerry Rhome . . . the coaches are Francis Schmidt (1919-21) and John Cooper (1977-84).





**LONG PASS PLAYS FOR THE HURRICANE . . .**

- The Tulsa offense had their share of big passing plays of over 30 yards this year.
- The Hurricane had 22 pass plays this year that have gone for over 30 yards, including five pass plays over 60 yards that have resulted in three TDs.
- Keevan Lucas had 84 (Tulane), 62 (Colorado State) and 64 (SMU) yard touchdown receptions this year, while the other 60+ pass plays came against Colorado State on a 65-yard pass from Dane Evans to Derek Patterson and against East Carolina, a 67-yarder from Evans to Lucas.
- Lucas had a total of eight receptions for over 30 yards, while Keyarris Garrett had seven catches for 30 yards or more, Bishop Louie had three, Patterson and Josh Atkinson each had two 30+-yard receptions.

**FLANDERS GETS HIS FIRST 100-YARD GAME . . .**

- Sophomore running back James Flanders had a career-best 112 yards rushing on 21 carries against Texas State.
- He came into the game with just 139 rushing yards in his career.
- Flanders now has 461 career rushing yards on 104 carries for a 4.4 average per carry.
- Before this season, Flanders had carried the ball just twice from scrimmage for five yards.
- Flanders had 456 yards, one TD and a 4.5 average per carry this year to finish second on the team in rushing.
- Flanders ended the season with his second-best rushing game of the year with 97 yards and one TD on 23 carries vs. East Carolina.

**A LOOK AT TULSA'S CONFERENCE HISTORY IN FIRST YEAR AS AMERICAN ATHLETIC CONFERENCE MEMBER . . .**

- Tulsa completed its first season as a member of the American Athletic Conference in 2014, moving from Conference USA.
- Tulsa opened the season with an American Athletic Conference victory against Tulane, 38-31, in double overtime, but finished the year with a 2-6 league mark.
- The American is the sixth conference affiliation for the Tulsa football program, while the previous five include: Oklahoma Collegiate Conference (1914-28), Big Four Conference (1929-32), Missouri Valley Conference (1935-85), Western Athletic Conference (1996-2004) and Conference USA (2005-13).
- Tulsa was an independent for 12 years, coming between the Missouri Valley and its entrance into the WAC in 1996.
- In nine years as a C-USA member, Tulsa compiled a 49-23 regular season league record and a 2-2 mark in C-USA Championship Games – Tulsa was 2-1 against UCF in C-USA title games and 0-1 against East Carolina, both now members of the American Athletic Conference.

**BIG PLAYS, TURNOVERS CRIPPLE HURRICANE AGAINST NATION'S NO. 4 TEAM . . .**

- On six of Oklahoma's seven TDs, the big play or a Tulsa turnover hurt the Hurricane.
- A 54-yard pass on the first play of the game set-up OU's first score, while the second Sooner TD came on a 31-yard run.
- Tulsa fumbled after getting to the OU 10-yard line looking for its first score in the second quarter, then gave up an 82-yard TD run on the first play as Oklahoma went ahead 31-0.
- Consecutive 18 and 23-yard runs gave Oklahoma its fifth TD.
- Oklahoma scored next on a 38-yard interception return.
- The seventh score for Oklahoma came after a 48-yard pass moved the Sooners from their own one-yard line to their 49-yard line.

**THREE BEGAN SEASON ON WATCH LISTS, TWO ADDED DURING SEASON . . .**

- Sophomore center Dylan Foxworth was named one of 66 preseason candidates for the Rimington Award, given to the nation's top center . . . he started eight games in 2013 as a red-shirt freshman and earned C-USA all-freshman honors.
- Senior place-kicker Carl Salazar, who connected on 11 straight field goals last year after missing his first two career attempts in the season opener, was named to the preseason watch list for the Lou Groza Award as one of 30 preseason candidates . . . he finished the year converting 16-of-19 field goals.
- Junior receiver Keyarris Garrett, Tulsa's leading receiver in 2012 with 67 receptions for 845 yards and nine TDs, has been named to the Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award Watch List for the second straight year . . . the award goes to the top offensive player from the state of Texas.
- After the first three weeks, sophomore receiver Keevan Lucas was added to the Biletnikoff Award Watch List, an award given to the nation's top receiver.
- Dalton Parks was named a candidate for the Ray Guy Award at mid-season.

**LUCAS TURNS IN CAREER DAY IN OPENER . . .**

- Tulsa sophomore receiver Keevan Lucas tied for the 11th-best receiving performance in school history in the season opener against Tulane.
- Lucas caught 13 passes for 233 yards and 3 TDs, tying Brennan Marion (2008) for the 11th-best single game for a Tulsa receiver . . . it was also the most receiving yards in a game for a Tulsa player since Marion did it in 2008.
- Lucas' three TDs covered 43, 84 and 3 yards . . . his 43-yard TD cut the Tulane lead to 14-7 . . . his 84-yarder came with 0:37 left on the first-half clock and cut Tulane's lead to 21-14 . . . his 3-yard TD came with 2:53 left in regulation and cut the Tulane lead to two points at 28-26 (Tulsa made the two-point conversion).

**MARTIN MAKES RETURN TO FIELD . . .**

- Sophomore linebacker Trent Martin was another Hurricane player who missed most of the 2013 season.
- Martin played in four games, but received a medical hardship last year.
- In four 2013 games, Martin had 29 tackles, while this year in the first four games he totaled 37 stops.
- This year, Martin led Tulsa in tackles in each of the first two games with a career-best 12 tackles in the season opener vs. Tulane and nine stops vs. Oklahoma.
- He had 64 tackles in nine games this season, and has 130 tackles in 22 career games.
- Martin missed the UCF, Houston and East Carolina games with an injury.

**HEAD COACHING EXPERIENCE ABUNDANT ON THE HURRICANE SIDELINES . . .**

- Tulsa Head Football Coach Bill Blankenship completed his fourth year as a collegiate head coach, but he had 22 years as a head coach on the prep level.
- Blankenship also has three former college head coaches on his staff — Defensive Coordinator Brent Guy, Assistant Head Coach, Offensive Coord./OL Coach Denver Johnson and Asst. Head Coach/Special Teams Coord. and TEs Coach Scott Downing.
- Guy spent four seasons (2005-08) as the head coach at Utah State.
- Johnson was a head coach for 12 seasons, spending three seasons at Murray State (1997-99) and nine years at Illinois State (2000-08) . . . he compiled an overall 69-66 record at the two schools.
- Downing was the head coach at Northern Colorado for five seasons (2006-10).
- Only three other FBS programs have three former collegiate head coaches on their coaching staffs as assistant coaches — Georgia Tech, San Diego State and Virginia.

- The first three years of 2000's were lean for the Tulsa football, posting just a 7-28 combined record in 2000, 2001 and 2002.
- Since 2003, Tulsa has an 89-66 (.574) overall record, as 19 of those 66 losses came in the last two seasons.
- From the 2003 through the 2012 season, Tulsa had a 84-47 record for a .641 win percentage
- In 2012, Tulsa made its eighth Bowl game appearance within 10 seasons and had a 5-3 Bowl record during that 10-year stretch.
- Tulsa won two outright C-USA Championships (2005 and 2012), four C-USA West Division titles (2005, 2007, 2008, 2012) and shared one West crown (2010).

**A LOOK AT HOW TULSA'S YOUTH STACKS UP . . .**

- Coming into fall camp, Tulsa had a total of 73 freshman, red-shirt freshmen or sophomores in the group of 105 players reporting to make up 69.5-percent of the Golden Hurricane roster.
- The number, including 45 freshmen and 28 sophomores, ties for the fifth-most underclassmen in the country returning for the 2014 season.
- Pittsburgh (81-of-103) leads the nation with 78.6-percent underclassmen, followed by Penn State (72.4), North Carolina State and Wake Forest (70.5) tied for third place with Tulsa and Northern Illinois (69.5) tied for fifth place.

**GARRETT, NELSON BACK ON THE FIELD IN OPENER . . .**

- Tulsa has seen the return of two key players from the 2012 Tulsa team that posted an overall 11-3 record, won the C-USA Championship and the Liberty Bowl Championship in the likes of senior safety Demarco Nelson and junior receiver Keyarris Garrett.
- After missing the entire 2013 season, Nelson started his 40th career game in the season opener.
- In his return, Nelson totaled nine tackles, including eight solos, and his interception in overtime clinched the season-opening victory for the Hurricane.
- In the 2012 season, Nelson totaled 80 tackles, including 52 solos, had 4 TFLs for -10 yards, 3 pass break-ups and 2 interceptions.
- As a freshman All-American in 2012, Nelson had 86 stops, 6 PBU's and 6 INTs.
- Garrett suffered a season-ending leg injury on the last drive of the second game of the 2013 season against Colorado State . . . he returned in the opener to play in his 23rd career game and make his 14th start.
- In his return, Garrett caught five passes for 87 yards with a long of 31 yards in the opener against Tulane.

**48** With zero turnovers against Temple, Tulsa's streak with at least one turnover ended at 48 games. The last time Tulsa did not suffer a turnover came against Rice on Nov. 6, 2010.

**271** The number of tackles that Michael Mudoh has in his career. He is the second player on this Hurricane team with at least 200 career stops . . . the other is fellow safety Demarco Nelson with 312.

**312** The number of tackles Demarco Nelson had in his career. He is the 16th player in school history to reach 300 career tackles.

**602** The number of wins in the 115th year of the Tulsa football program. Tulsa got its 600th career win in 2013 against Louisiana Tech, and hit 601 with the season-opening victory against Tulane.

- Tulsa's Bill Blankenship completed his eighth season on the Tulsa coaching staff, first returning to his alma mater in 2007 as a member of Todd Graham's staff, and now is in his fourth year as head coach.
- Blankenship has three sons — two who played football at Tulsa, and two that now coach at Tulsa.
- Blankenship added his youngest son, Adam, to his first staff in 2011, and Adam is currently in his fourth year as defensive ends coach . . . Adam began his playing career at Nebraska, but transferred to Illinois State.
- The oldest son, Josh, who played three seasons at quarterback for the Golden Hurricane (1991-01) before completing his career at Eastern Washington University, joined the Tulsa coaching staff this past spring as the Hurricane quarterbacks coach.
- Blankenship's second son, Caleb (2001-04), played tight end at Tulsa, but is not in the coaching profession.
- Rex Blankenship, an older brother to Bill, serves in a volunteer capacity as Director of Player Personnel/Team Chaplain.
- A younger brother to Bill, Joe, played defensive end at Tulsa, while two nephews were also involved in sports at Tulsa – Kyle was a walk-on basketball player and Malachi was a walk-on football player.

**GRADUATED . . .**

- Junior offensive tackle Garrett Stafford received his bachelor's degree in May 2014 in Electrical Engineering with a 3.702 GPA. He is now working on a master's in Electrical Engineering. Stafford has recently been named to the Capital One/CoSIDA Academic All-District Team and is now eligible for All-America consideration.
- Senior offensive tackle Davis Walton is currently working on his second bachelor's degree in Organizational Studies. He received a bachelor's degree in Exercise and Sports Science in August 2014.
- Senior linebacker Jake Sizelove received his bachelor's degree in Mechanical Engineering with a 3.651 GPA in May 2014. He is working on a master's degree in Business Administration.
- Senior running back Matt Luetjen a transferr from the Army, earned his bachelor's degree in May 2014 in Psychology with a 3.766 GPA, and now is working on a master's degree in Industrial and Organizational Psychology.

**WHY GOLDEN HURRICANE?**

Enter the name Howard Acher as the Tulsa head coach in 1922. When he took over the position, Acher saw great potential in his team and wanted to publicize it by creating a new identity with a new nickname. Sports writers and others had called the school by any number of names from the Presbyterians to the Orange and Black, to the Kendallites.

After an opening day win against a strong Texas Christian University team in 1922, Acher put his mind to work. The press had claimed that the Kendall football team blew through its opponents like a tornado. So, it figured that Tornadoes, would be the nickname with "golden" added to identify the color of the uniforms. However, it was later found that Georgia Tech had claimed that name, so from tornado it was evolved meteorologically to a hurricane. Thus the squad voted, and the name "Golden Hurricane" became the new team moniker with the gold added because of the jersey color.

TU lived up to its nickname as the Golden Hurricane blew through the Texas A&M defense in the next game with pass after pass from quarterback Rex Thomas. TU won its first game as the Golden Hurricane by a score of 13-10.
