USC MEN'S VOLLEYBALL PLAYS AT UCLA, UC IRVINE

THE FACTS

The No. 11-ranked USC men's volleyball team (5-6 overall, 4-4 Mountain Pacific Sports Federation)--on its longest road trip of the season--remains away from home for the second straight week when it visits No. 4 UCLA (8-3, 5-2) on Wednesday (Feb. 6) in a match with Lexus Gauntlet points on the line and then No. 8 UC Irvine (6-6, 3-4) on Friday (Feb. 8). Both MPSF matches start at 7 p.m.

LIVE TV

The UCLA match will be shown live on FSN Prime, with Paul Sunderland, Karch Kiraly and Steve Obradovich mikeside.

All of USC's home matches are video-, audio- and data-streamed over the internet on www.usctrojans.com's TrojanTV All-Access.

RANKINGS

USC is 11th in the current CSTV/AVCA poll. UCLA is fourth, while UC Irvine is eighth.

OPPONENTS

USC trails its series with UCLA, 85-32, but the Trojans have won 3 of the past 5 meetings, including a thrilling 5-game match last month (18-16 in the fifth) and 3-0 last year in their last visit to Pauley Pavilion (it was USC's first win there since 2000 and first sweep over UCLA since 1991). USC holds a 28-16 series edge over UC Irvine, but has dropped the past 5 contests, including 3-1 last month at home. The Anteaters host Pepperdine on Wednesday (Feb. 6) before USC visits.

LEXUS GAUNTLET

The winner of this USC-UCLA men's volleyball match will score the final 2.5 more points toward the sport's 5 points in the Lexus Gauntlet competition, a trophy awarded annually to the school with the most successful athletic year against the other. Points are awarded to the winner of each Trojan-Bruin head-to-head contest and the Lexus Gauntlet will be awarded to the school with the most points at year's end (57.5 points is the magic number). The Southern California Lexus Dealer Association is the title sponsor of every USC-UCLA athletic competition. In 2001, the schools signed a contract with Lexus, America's best-selling luxury automotive manufacturer. USC captured the inaugural trophy in 2001-02, UCLA won it in 2002-03, USC recaptured it in 2003-04, UCLA won it back in 2004-05, USC claimed it in 2005-06 and UCLA won it last year. USC leads this season's competition, 37.5-10.

LAST MATCHES

No. 3 Long Beach State remained perfect in 2008 as it dispatched of No. 11 USC, 30-25, 32-30, 30-23, on Feb. 1 in an MPSF match at LBSU. USC was led by Andrew Vernon's 9 kills and 5 blocks. Hunter Current and Murphy Troy each added 7 kills as did Sean Dennis off the bench. USC hit just .116 in the match. Long Beach State limited the Trojans to a .077 hitting percentage. The 49ers led 29-24 in the second game, but saw a USC rally tie the score at 29-29. Tied at 30-30, the 49ers broke through on a USC service error and a combo block. In the third game, the 49ers led 17-16 but then had a 5-0 run and were never threatened from there. On Feb. 2, Troy had 17 kills while hitting .452 and Juan Figueroa added 12 kills, 9 digs and 5 blocks to lead USC to a 30-26, 30-22, 30-26 win at No. 15 UC San Diego in an MPSF match. The Trojans outhit the Tritons, .291 to .088 and had more blocks, 13.0 to 6.0. Dennis added 8 kills for USC and Luke Morris had 12 digs. The first game featured 10 ties, the last coming at 20-20. After the Tritons led 22-20, USC responded with 5 straight points to lead 25-22 and the Tritons could pull no closer than 2 points. In game

two, USC led 19-15 but the Tritons came back to within 20-19. USC scored seven of the next nine points to pull away at 27-21 before taking the game. In the third game, the Tritons came out firing, scoring 9 of the first 10 points. But the Trojans chipped away and used a late 10-3 run to close out the match.

RETURNERS

USC has one of the league's deepest rosters, with 31 players (its most ever), 11 of whom are upperclassmen. Included are 10 players who have started in their careers (USC's entire 2007 starting lineup returned this year) and 8 who appeared in last year's MPSF tourney match. Sprinkled throughout that roster are 15 freshmen who comprise the nation's No. 1-ranked recruiting class.

VOLLEYBALL SCHOOL

Besides the 4 NCAA crowns (1977-80-88-90) that USC's men have won, the Women of Troy have captured 6 national volleyball titles. USC's women won the AIAW trophy in 1976, 1977 and 1980, and the NCAA crown in 1981. Then, coach Mick Haley's 2002 and 2003 Women of Troy squads captured the NCAA titles.

COACH BILL FERGUSON

Bill Ferguson, one of the game's top young coaches, was promoted to head coach of the USC men's volleyball program on May 16, 2006. In 2007, his first season as head coach, he guided USC to its best season in 6 years. The Trojans had their most overall (12-16) and Mountain Pacific Sports Federation (9-13) wins, their highest MPSF finish (eighth) and their first appearance in the MPSF tournament since 2001. USC beat UCLA at Pauley Pavilion for the first time since 2000 and the 3-game sweep was its first over the Bruins since 1991, giving Ferguson a victory in his debut against legendary UCLA coach Al Scates. Troy also snapped a 12-match losing streak to Hawaii and did so in Honolulu, its first win there since 1999. This is Ferguson's second stint at USC, as he was an assistant for 2 years (1997-98) under head coach Pat Powers. He was one of the nation's most successful junior volleyball coaches and club directors before returning to USC in the summer of 2005. In his 15 years of coaching experience at the club level (Santa Monica Beach Club, Reebok Palisades Club, Los Angeles Athletic Club and Southern California Volleyball Club), he coached teams to 19 medals (including 12 golds) at national championships and the clubs he directed won 31 medals. Among the players he has coached over the years are Olympians Misty May, Brook Billings, Donald Suxho, Gabe Gardner, Jeff Nygaard, Ryan Millar, Brett Winslow and Mark Williams, as well as Brandon Taliaferro and current USC setters Jimmy Killian and Hunter Haley. He served as an assistant with the USA Youth National Team in 2000 and 2001. In the summer of 2006, he was the head coach of the 2006 USA Volleyball Men's Junior National A2 team. Ferguson played for Palisades High in Pacific Pali-

sades (Calif.), where he was a member of the 1988 L.A. City championship team. He then took a 2-year hiatus from volleyball. While enrolled at Santa Monica (Calif.) College, he pursued a competitive surfing career. From 1987 to 1991, he was a familiar face on the Southern California collegiate volleyball scene, where he served as a linesman for men's and women's matches.

KILLIAN

Jimmy Killian, a 6-4 senior co-captain, will start at setter for his fourth season after topping the Trojans in assists (1,226) in 2007, tying for second in blocks (82) and finishing fourth in digs (113). He was fifth nationally in assists (12.77) last year. *He has 3,971 career assists.* Late last spring, he spent time training with the U.S. National Team.

--He had 37 assists and 3 blocks vs. Long Beach State (1-4).

--He had 50 assists vs. Pacific (1-4).

--He had 27 assists vs. Cal State Northridge (1-5).

--He had 45 assists vs. Cal State Northridge (1-9).

--He had 47 assists vs. UC Santa Barbara (1-11).

--He had 47 assists, 6 blocks and 4 digs vs. Pacific (1-16).

--He had 54 assists and 4 digs vs. Stanford (1-18).

--He had 48 assists, 6 blocks and 5 digs vs. UCLA (1-23).

--He had 50 assists, 7 blocks and 6 digs vs. UC Irvine (1-25).

--He had 35 assists and 4 blocks vs. Long Beach State (2-1).

--He had 25 assists, 4 digs and 3 blocks vs. UC San Diego (2-2).

OTHER SETTERS

Backing Killian in 2008 will be 3 inexperienced players with strong ties to USC volleyball: 6-2 junior **Hunter Haley** and a pair of first-year freshmen in 6-2 **Riley McKibbin** and 5-11 **Vince Altamura**, both 2007 prep All-American first teamers. Haley, the son of USC women's head coach Mick Haley, has played briefly in just 1 match in his career. McKibbin, whose uncle (Owen) and aunt (Claudia) played at USC, led Punahou High of Honolulu (Hi.) to 3 consecutive state Division I titles. He is also an accomplished beach player and was Hawaii's co-MVP in basketball. Altamura's brother, Gio, just finished his playing career at USC, while his twin sister, Alexa, is a member of the Women of Troy squad. Altamura, out of Mira Costa High in Manhattan Beach (Calif.), was the MVP of the 2005 Junior Olympics 16 Open division. He likely will redshirt the 2008 season.

--McKibbin had 16 assists vs. UC San Diego (2-2).

FIGUEROA

USC's most decorated player is high-leaping 6-0 senior **Juan Figueroa**, who will start for his fourth season on the outside. Last year, he was Troy's first All-American of any sort since 2001 when he earned 2007 All-American second team and All-MPSF third team honors. He led the Trojans in kills (505) and aces (26) in 2007, was second in digs (184) and fourth in blocks (72). He was fifth nationally in kills (4.90) and sixth in points (5.52) last year. *In his career, he has 1,304 kills, 509 digs, 184 blocks and 56 aces.* When last season concluded, he first long jumped for the USC track team (winning at the UCLA meet) and then played with the Puerto Rican National Team.

--He had a team-best 13 kills (hitting .500) vs. Long Beach State (1-4).

--He had 12 kills, 6 digs, 4 blocks and 4 aces vs. Pacific (1-4).

--He had 10 kills and a game-best 9 digs vs. Cal State Northridge (1-5).

--He had 11 kills and 8 digs vs. Cal State Northridge (1-9).

--He had 10 kills and 5 digs vs. UC Santa Barbara (1-11).

--He had 12 kills, 5 digs and 2 blocks vs. Pacific (1-16).

--He had 4 kills and 3 blocks vs. Stanford (1-18).

--He had 20 kills (hitting .359) and 11 digs, both match bests, vs. UCLA (1-23).

--He had a match best 20 kills, plus 11 digs and 5 blocks vs. UC Irvine (1-25).

--He had 3 kills and 3 digs vs. Long Beach State (2-1).

--He had 12 kills, 9 digs and 5 blocks vs. UC San Diego (2-2).

OTHER OUTSIDES

Both of the players who shared time at the other outside hitter spot in 2007—6-5 senior **Matt Anderson** and 6-4 junior **Matt Pavlovich**—are back. Anderson had 126 kills, 54 digs and 24 blocks in 2007, while Pavlovich added 97 kills, 51 digs and 31 blocks. But they'll be challenged in 2008 by a number of untested young players. There are a pair of redshirt freshmen in 6-3 **Chris Roche** and 6-4 **Tyler Stevens**, plus a quartet of first-year freshmen in 6-8 **Murphy Troy**, 6-5 **Tri Bourne**, 6-2 **Tito Goldstein** and 6-3 **Tom Fanchin**. Stevens, whose mother, Cookie, is an assistant with the USC women's team, transferred from Ohio State. He was a 2005 prep All-American first teamer and was on the 2004 U.S. Youth National Team. The appropriately-named Troy led St. Louis (Mo.) University High to the 2007 Missouri state title while earning prep All-American first team honors. He was a member of the 2006 and 2007 U.S. Youth National Teams (he starred in the 2007 FIVB Youth World Championships) and was the MVP of the 2007 Junior Olympics 18 Open division. Bourne was originally expected to redshirt following an appendectomy last fall, but he has recovered sufficiently. He helped Maryknoll High in Honolulu (Hi.) win the state Division II championship last year and played on the 2007 U.S. Youth National Team. He and fellow Trojan McKibbin, with whom he shared Hawaii's co-MVP award in basketball, also teamed to capture the gold medal at the 2007 AAU National Beach Volleyball Under 20 championship. Goldstein was a 2-time All-CIF first team choice at Brentwood High in Los Angeles (Calif.). Fanchin prepped at St. Augustine High in San Diego (Calif.). Two other outside hitters will redshirt in 2008. **Joey Dykstra**, a 6-5 sophomore, had 14 kills and 8 digs while appearing in 9 matches in 2007. A standout in beach volleyball, he'll spend 2008 getting back on track in the classroom after playing in 12 AVP tournaments last summer and then placing fifth in the 2007 Junior Beach World Championships.

--Troy had 12 kills (hitting .360), 3 blocks, 3 digs and 2 aces vs. Long Beach State (1-4).

--Troy had a game-high 19 kills (hitting .517), 7 digs and 4 aces vs. Pacific (1-4).

--Troy had 10 kills, 5 digs and 3 blocks vs. Cal State Northridge (1-5).

--Troy had 16 kills and 3 blocks vs. Cal State Northridge (1-9).

--Troy had a game-high 15 kills (hitting .571) vs. UC Santa Barbara (1-11) with 6 digs, while Goldstein had 2 aces.

--Troy had a match-high 15 kills (hitting .400), plus 3 digs and 2 blocks, vs. Pacific (1-16).

--Troy had a team-high 17 kills with 6 digs vs. Stanford (1-18), while Bourne added 4 kills, 9 digs and 4 blocks.

--Troy had 10 kills, 3 blocks and 3 digs vs. UCLA (1-23).

--Troy had 17 kills (hitting .324) vs. UC Irvine (1-25).

--Troy had 7 kills, 4 digs, 2 blocks and 2 aces vs. Long Beach State (2-1).

--Troy had 17 kills (hitting .452), 5 digs and 3 blocks vs. UC San Diego (2-2).

SHELLENBERG

At opposite hitter, 6-7 junior **C.J. Schellenberg** looks to start for his third season. He was second on the Trojans in 2007 in kills (358) and aces (24), third in digs (119) and fifth in blocks (66). *He has 730 kills, 260 digs and 171 blocks in his career.*

--He had 3 kills vs. Long Beach State (1-4).

--He had 11 kills (hitting .368) vs. Pacific (1-4).

--He had 9 kills and 4 digs vs. Cal State Northridge (1-5).

--He had a match-best 17 kills with 4 blocks vs. Cal State Northridge (1-9).

--He had 13 kills (hitting .458) with 5 digs, 3 blocks and 3 aces vs. UC Santa Barbara (1-11).

--He had 14 kills (hitting .522) and 6 digs vs. Pacific (1-16).

--He had 13 kills, 7 digs and 5 blocks vs. Stanford (1-18).

--He had 15 kills, 6 digs and 4 blocks vs. UCLA (1-23).

--He had 6 kills vs. UC Irvine (1-25).

OTHER OPPOSITES

Schellenberg will be pushed in 2008 by some relatively-inexperienced players. There's 6-9 sophomore co-captain **Jon Hackett**, who had 14 kills and 8 digs while appearing in 16 matches in 2007, and 6-3 sophomore **Matt Hillier**, who has played in just 2 matches at USC. Then there's a trio of first-year freshmen in 6-4 **Sean Dennis** of Harvard-Westlake High in North Hollywood (Calif.), a 2007 prep All-American second teamer, 6-4 **Bryce Overend** of Marina High in Huntington Beach (Calif.) and 6-3 **Andy Clemens** of Mira Costa High in Manhattan Beach (Calif.). Another first-year freshman, 6-7 **Drew Huffman** of Scripps Ranch High in San Diego (Calif.), will redshirt in 2008 following shoulder surgery.

--Dennis had 7 kills off the bench vs. Long Beach State (2-1).

--Dennis had 8 kills, 3 digs and 2 blocks while starting vs. UC San Diego (2-2).

VERNON/CURRENT

Both middle blockers return from 2007: 6-8 senior **Andrew Vernon**, who has started the past 3 years, and 6-8 sophomore **Hunter Current**. Vernon led USC's regulars in 2007 in hitting percentage (.385) and blocks (105) while also notching 178 kills (third on the team). He was 10th nationally in blocking (1.25) last year. *He has a .404 career hitting percentage with 646 kills and 326 blocks.* Current started most of his 2007 freshman campaign when he had 143 kills while hitting .337 to go with his 82 blocks (second on the team) and 18 aces (third on the team). He trained with the 2007 U.S. Junior National Team.

--Vernon had 9 kills (hitting .389) and 3 blocks vs. Long Beach State (1-4), while Current had 2 blocks.

--Current had 4 kills and a match-best 6 kills vs. Pacific (1-4).

--Current had 2 kills and 2 digs vs. Cal State Northridge (1-5).

--Vernon had 5 blocks vs. Cal State Northridge (1-9).

--Vernon had 6 kills (hitting .545) and 4 blocks vs. UC Santa Barbara (1-11).

--Vernon had 6 kills (hitting .400) and 5 blocks vs. Pacific (1-16).

--Vernon had 13 kills (hitting .391) and 6 blocks vs. Stanford (1-18), while Current added 6 kills.

--Vernon had 7 kills (hitting .500) and 7 blocks vs. UCLA (1-23).

--Current had 7 kills (hitting .462) and 8 blocks off the bench vs. UC Irvine (1-25), while Vernon had 7 kills

--Vernon had 9 kills (hitting .750) and 5 blocks vs. Long Beach State (2-1), while Current added 7 kills (hitting .500).

--Current had 6 kills, 4 digs and 3 blocks vs. UC San Diego (2-2).

OTHER MIDDLES

Because Vernon battles chronic knee soreness, the door is open for other middle blockers to break into the lineup in 2008. **Chris Jones**, a 6-6 senior, has played in 19 matches (with 10 starts) in his career, but saw action in just 1 match last season. **Sean O'Connor**, a 6-5 junior, has yet to play at USC. There also are 3 first-year freshman middle blockers looking to make an impact: 6-8 **Austin Zahn** of Redondo Union High in Redondo Beach (Calif.), 6-7 **Ian Wright** of St. Francis High in Mountain View (Calif.) and 6-4 **Jimmy Hirschmann** of Loyola High in Los Angeles (Calif.). Zahn, a prep All-American first team honoree last year, was on the 2006 and 2007 U.S. Junior National Teams (he competed at the 2007 Junior World Championships). Wright was on the 2007 U.S. Youth National Training team, while Hirschmann was a 2-time prep All-American second teamer.

--Zahn had 8 kills (hitting .889) and 5 blocks vs. Pacific (1-4).

--Zahn had 2 kills and 2 blocks vs. Cal State Northridge (1-5).

--Zahn had 6 kills (hitting .667) and 3 blocks vs. UC Santa Barbara (1-11).

--Zahn had 3 kills, 3 blocks and 2 aces vs. Pacific (1-16).

--Zahn had 8 kills (hitting .333) and 4 blocks vs. UCLA (1-23).

--Zahn had 7 blocks vs. UC San Diego (2-2).

MORRIS

Luke Morris, a 6-2 junior, returns for his third year as USC's libero. He led the Trojans in digs with 249 in 2007 and now has 577 in his career. He was 11th nationally in digs (2.42) in 2007. He trained with the 2007 U.S. Junior National Team.

--He had 12 digs vs. Long Beach State (1-4).

--He had 7 digs and 2 kills vs. Pacific (1-4).

--He had a game-best 9 digs vs. Cal State Northridge (1-5).

--He had 14 digs vs. Cal State Northridge (1-9).

--He had 9 digs vs. UC Santa Barbara (1-11).

--He had 7 digs vs. Pacific (1-16).

--He had 11 digs vs. Stanford (1-18).

--He had 6 digs and 4 assists vs. UCLA (1-23).

--He had 16 digs vs. UC Irvine (1-25).

--He had 6 digs vs. Long Beach State (2-1).

--He had a match-high 12 digs vs. UC San Diego (2-2).

OTHER LIBEROS

Backing Morris at libero in 2008 are 5-6 sophomore **Troy Tokuhama**, who played briefly in 2 matches last season, and 6-3 first-year freshman **Brad Keenan** of Mira Costa High in Manhattan Beach (Calif.), who was on the 2006 U.S. Youth National A2 team. A knee injury might sideline him in 2008.

RELATIVELY SPEAKING

Jimmy Killian comes from a family of Trojans: his father, Don, was a member of the 1977 USC NCAA championship men's volleyball team (he lettered in 1976 and 1977); his brother, Donny, played volleyball at USC in 2001 and then was a Trojan assistant coach in 2002 after playing three seasons at Pepperdine (twice playing in the NCAA Final Four, including on the NCAA runnerup Waves squad in 1998); his sister, Lauren, was a member of USC's 2002 NCAA championship and 2000 Final Four women's volleyball teams (she lettered from 1999 to 2002); his uncle, Doug, lettered in men's volleyball at Troy in 1982 and 1983 (the 1982 team finished third in the NCAAs); and his mother, Chris, is a USC graduate, along with a grandmother, two grandfathers (both played basketball at USC), a great grandfather, 2 other uncles, an aunt and numerous cousins...Riley McKibbin a pair of relatives who played volleyball at USC: his uncle, Owen McKibbin (who lettered in 1983-84-86-87, as the Trojans finished second at the NCAA Championships his final 2 seasons), and his aunt, Claudia McKibbin (a letterwinner on the Women of Troy's 1980 national championship team)...Vince Altamura's brother, Gio, lettered at USC for 4 years (2004-07) after transferring from Ohio State, while his twin sister, Alexa, is a freshman on the USC women's volleyball team...Juan Figueroa's father, Juan Figueroa, and his mother, Mayra Pacheco, were sprinters for Puerto Rico's national track team (his father also was a basketball referee in 3 Olympics and worked the men's final at the 1992 Barcelona Olympics that involved the USA's Dream Team); his sister, Rayma, played volleyball at Dickinson State University and Huron Si Tanka University...Austin Zahn's brothers played college basketball: Andrew at Arizona in 2002 and Biola in 2003 (he then played professionally in Japan) and Adam at Oregon (2004-07), who is now playing professionally in Norway...C.J. Schellenberg's father, Jim, played football at Vanderbilt...Joey Dykstra's sister, Jenna, plays volleyball at Davidson and his father, Joe, played basketball at Western Illinois...Hunter Haley's father is USC women's volleyball coach Mick Haley, who

guided the Women of Troy to the 2002 and 2003 NCAA titles...Tyler Stevens' mother, Cookie, is an assistant coach with the USC women's volleyball team (she previously was the head coach at Florida International, Westminster Christian High in Miami and Miami-Dade Community College after playing at San Diego State) and his brother, Sam, played at Ohio State from 2004 to 2007...Tito Goldstein's brother, Ilan, plays volleyball for New York University...Drew Huffman's grandfather, Verle Sorgen, was a 3-sport letterman (track, basketball and baseball) at USC in the 1950s and then was a Pac-10 football official and its coordinator of football officiating (he also officiated in the U.S. Football League, World League and Arena Indoor League)...Murphy Troy's brother, Phinney, was an offensive tackle at Missouri...Troy Tokuhama's father, Roy, played baseball at Hawaii and Pacific (Oregon)...Head coach Bill Ferguson's father, Tom, was a 2-time (1961-62) All-American at Santa Monica College, which won the USVBA college national championship both years...Assistant coach Brad Keller's brother, Jarod, is a junior libero at Stanford.

LAST YEAR

One has to go back to 2001 to find the last time USC advanced to the Mountain Pacific Sports Federation playoffs or had as many overall (12) and MPSF (9) wins or had a higher league finish (eighth), all accomplishments of the 2007 Trojans. The last time Troy had a longer winning streak than the 4-match string it had in the middle of this season was also 2001. Although that might not seem all that impressive for a program that has won 4 NCAA titles and finished second 6 other times (and third once), consider that USC had won a total of just 36 matches and finished no better than 11th in the MPSF in the previous 5 seasons. USC posted a 12-16 overall record in 2007 (9-13 in the MPSF) while advancing to the MPSF play-in match. Along the way, USC collected some impressive victories. The Trojans went to Pauley Pavilion and beat UCLA there for the first time since 2000, doing so in 3 games (it was USC's first 3-0 sweep over the Bruins since 1991). USC also snapped a 12-match losing streak to Hawaii by going to Honolulu and claiming a 5-game win over the Warriors. It was Troy's first win there since 1999. And the Trojans also swept their MSPF matches over Long Beach State, Pacific and Stanford.
