THE FACTS

No. 6/10 USC women's volleyball (19-2, 12-2 Pac-10) looks to rebound from an 0-3 loss to UCLA last Friday (Nov. 3). With three teams in the hunt for the conference championship - Arizona, UCLA, USC - this week's matches should determine the Pac-10 title.

THE LAST OUTING

USC suffered a 0-3 (15-9, 15-3, 15-13) loss to crosstown rival No. 8 UCLA Friday night at Pauley Pavilion. In the first game of the match, the Trojans quickly fell behind 0-7 among 23 sideouts.

THE RANKINGS

Following only their second loss of the season, the Trojans dropped in each poll this week. USC is No. 6 in the AVCA/USA Today Coaches Poll and rank No. 10 according to Volleyball magazine's Division I poll.

BATTLE FOR THE PAC-10 CHAMPIONSHIP

USC's loss to UCLA closed the gap in the Pac-10 title race. USC (12-2), UCLA (12-2) and Arizona (14-1) will each determine its own fate this week as the Arizona schools visit Los Angeles.

IF GAME RECORDS WERE KEPT

If volleyball game records were officially kept, USC would currently own an amazing 57-12 (.826) mark. The Trojans best ever was in 1980 when the team recorded a perfect 38-0 season with a 100-6 overall game record (.943).

USC CONFERENCE CHAMPIONSHIPS

The Women of Troy have never won a Pac-10 Championship since the conference's inception in 1986. Prior to that, the Trojans earned three WCAA conference titles in 1976, 1977 and 1980. Below is USC's 14-year history in the Pac-10:

HENRY PROVES #1 ON DEFENSE

Senior outside hitter **Janae Henry** is most valuable to the team not because of her offensive power, but because of the solid and steadfast defense she provides. Leading the team with a 3.5 digs per game average (4th in the Pac-10), she has contributed 10 double-digit performances this season, including seven double-doubles (kills-digs). She added a career-best 25 against UCLA on Oct. 6, and in the last four matches, Henry has produced 62 digs for an average of 4.43 dpg.

DID YOU KNOW?

- **Janae Henry** tied a career high with five total blocks, including four block assists, against the Bruins (Nov. 3).
- Against UCLA (Nov. 3), USC was held to under .200 hitting for only the second time this season (first was against Arizona on Oct. 13).
- The USC-UCLA match was also the Trojans fourth-straight with 10+ team blocks.
- Against UCLA, the Women of Troy were out-dug for only the third time this season, 67 to 63.
- A freshman has led in kills, digs and/or blocks in all but three matches this season (18-of-21).
- USC broke Stanford's 45-match home win streak with the win on Sept. 22, putting an end to a 23-year USC drought at Maples Pavilion (Trojans had not won at Stanford since 1977). USC's second win on Oct. 20 completed a first-ever season sweep of the Cardinal since becoming members of the same conference (WCAA) in 1982.
- The UC Santa Barbara match was USC's longest of the season, lasting two-hours, 30 minutes... the shortest lasted one-hour, three minutes against Texas-San Antonio (Sept. 7).
- USC recorded a season-high 226 attacks, 75 assists, 16.0 blocks and 104 digs against the Gauchos (Oct. 24).

• The Women of Troy set a program record with a .556 team hitting percentage against Oregon (Sept. 30). The team's six errors in the match rank fourth among all-time program lows.

INJURY UPDATE

Senior outside hitter **Janae Henry** did not play against Cal (Oct. 19) nor start against Stanford (Oct. 20) due to sever shin splints in her right leg. She has since been cleared to play and reentered the starting lineup against UC Santa Barbara on Oct. 24. Senior outside hitter **Sara Peterson** has also been nursing shin splints and was cleared to begin practicing the week of Oct. 30.

POLK REACHES MARK

Senior **Antoinette Polk** reached a historic mark on Oct. 20 with her first of two digs in the final game against Stanford. With 1,065 career kills and 1,036 career digs to date, Polk became just the 35th player in Pac-10 history and the sixth player at USC to surpass 1,000 in both categories. The last USC athlete to reach this mark was OH Jennifer Kessy (1995-98) who collected 1,799 kills and 1,311 digs in her four-year career.

GAME WIN STREAK ENDS AT 38

USC put an end to a 23-year old record by surpassing a 28-game win streak previously set over the 1976 and 1977 championship seasons. The 2000 USC volleyball team extended its single game win streak to 38 before dropping its first game of the season to UCLA in a 3-1 victory on Friday (Oct. 6). Ironically, the previous record was also broken by UCLA on Oct. 26, 1977 in a USC 3-2 win.

FRESHMEN BRING REMINDERS OF THE PAST

The nation's No. 1 (according to *Volleyball* magazine) freshman class has made a definite impact on USC women's volleyball this season. Not only are three of the six (**April Ross**, **Katie Olsovsky** and **Toni Anderson**) currently starting for the Women of Troy, but their contributions have been significant. Ross leads the team in kills per game (3.11), Anderson is splitting time and assists at setter, and Olsovsky is averaging 1.33 blocks per game. As a group (which also includes **Kelli Lantz**, **Nicole Davis** and **Jamie Carroll**), the freshmen have been compared to the class of newcomers that joined USC in 1976 under head coach Chuck Erbe. With Terry Place, Paula Dittmer-Goodwin, Debbie Green and Debbie Landreth, the '76 Trojans went on to win the AIAW National Championship.

AGAINST RANKED OPPONENTS

USC will face its eighth ranked opponent of the season on Friday (Nov. 10) against No. 3 Arizona, after enduring a loss to No. 8 UCLA on Friday (Nov. 3). Of the six ranked opponents USC has faced, No. 6 Arizona and No. 8 UCLA are the only teams to claim a victory. The Women of Troy have defeated then-ranked No. 18 Texas (Sept. 1), 3-0, No. 11 Stanford (Sept. 22), 3-0, No. 8 UCLA (Oct. 6), 3-1, No. 17 Stanford (Oct. 20), 3-2, and No. 14 UCSB, 3-2. After the losses, Texas fell out of the Top-25, Stanford dropped to No. 21 after the first and remained 17th after the second, the Bruins fell to No. 10, UCSB dropped one spot to No. 15, while the Wildcats improved to No. 5 and the Bruins moved up to No. 7.

OPPONENT NOTES

Arizona State -- The Sun Devils, with a 17-8 overall record and 9-6 mark in the Pac-10, received votes in this week's USA Today / AVCA Coaches Poll, ranking them 26th... ASU is currently fourth in the Pac-10 standings... Last week the team defeated both Oregon, 3-0, and Oregon State, 3-1... The Sun Devil's conference losses this season have been to UCLA (2-3), USC (1-3), Stanford (1-3), Oregon State (1-3) and Cal (1-3)... With 1,493 career kills and 995 career digs, outside hitter Amanda Burbridge needs just seven kills and five digs to become the 17th player in conference history to reach 1,500 kills and 1,000 digs... Burbridge leads the team with 5.56 kills, 0.34 aces and 3.93 digs per game.

In the last meeting, the Trojans defeated Arizona State, 3-1, Thursday (Oct. 12) at Wells Fargo Arena in Tempe. The Trojans overcame a first-game setback, just 30 minutes into the match, by taking the next three for the 9-15, 15-13, 15-6, 15-13 win. Five of six starters posted double-digits in kills on the night, while freshman **Katie Olsovsky** led all players with a .464 attack percentage (15 kills) and five total blocks. Outside hitters **Antoinette Polk** (22 kills, 11 digs), **Janae Henry** (13 kills, 13 digs) and **April Ross** (17 kills, 20 digs) all led both offensively and defensively.

Arizona -- With a sweep of Oregon (3-0) and Oregon State (3-1) last week, the Wildcats improved to 21-2 overall and 14-1 in the Pac-10... For this week, Arizona has sole possession of the conference lead... This is the most wins ever for the Wildcats in conference play (the previous record was 12 wins which they posted the last three years)... The teams only two losses have been to UCLA, 2-3, and UC Santa Barbara, 2-3, to start the season... Middle blocker Marisa DaLee, who leads the team with 3.78 kpg and ranks second with 1.08 bpg, had an error-free weekend last week with 20 kills in 34 attempts.

In the last meeting, USC suffered its first loss of the season to the then-ranked No. 6 Wildcats 10-15, 17-19, 12-15 on Friday (Oct. 13). The two-hour match was played in front of 7,298 at Arizona's McKale Center - the highest attendance figure ever for an Arizona home match. The Trojans, who rank second in the Pac-10 in blocks per game average, were drastically out-blocked by the conference-leading Wildcats, 19.5 to 9.0. The Women of Troy collected 63 kills off of 187 attacks, but added 37 errors in the match for a season-low .139 attack percentage. **April Ross** led all players with 22 kills and a team-best .306 attack percentage.

WOMEN OF TROY WIN NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP ON "THE WEST WING"

In preparation for the 2000 NCAA Championships, USC women's volleyball was already crowned National Champions by the cast, crew and viewers of the Emmy Award-winning "West Wing." When the season premiered on October 4, 2000, the Women of Troy presented Vice President Hoynes (Tim Matheson) with their own championship jersey in the opening scene.

SERIES RECORDS

USC and Arizona State will meet for the 50th time in program history on Thursday (Nov. 9). The Women of Troy own a 38-10-1 advantage in the series (.765) and have won the last nine meetings. Last season, USC defeated the Sun Devils 3-1 at home and 3-2 in Tempe.

USC owns a 37-13 (.740) all-time record against Arizona, as the two teams face each other for the 51st time in school history on Friday (Nov. 10). Last season, Arizona upset the Trojans with a 3-1 defeat at North Gym. USC returned to defeat the Wildcats 3-1 in Tucson.

PAST, PRESENT AND FUTURE COACHES

Jerritt Elliott enters his second season as USC's interim head coach after serving as the Trojans' assistant for four seasons under former head coach Lisa Love. After leading the U.S.A. Women's National Team at the 2000 Olympic Games, *head coach Mick Haley has joined the USC program but will not take an active coaching role until the completion of the 2000 season.*

INTERIM HEAD COACH JERRITT ELLIOTT

USC interim head coach **Jerritt Elliott** was tabbed the 1999 Pac-10 Coach of the Year in his rookie season. Elliott, serving as the Trojans' head coach through the 2000 season, became just the second coach in Pac-10 history to post 13 league wins in their first season. Troy's 13-5 (.722) conference mark was the best win percentage ever recorded by a rookie coach in the conference. In 1999 Elliott led the Women of Troy to a third-place Pac-10 finish, a 21-9 overall record, and a No. 17 final ranking in the *USA Today/AVCA* Top-25 poll. Thanks to his efforts, USC's incoming class of 2000 was named the nation's No. 1 recruiting class according to *Volleyball* magazine.

HEAD COACH MICK HALEY

U.S.A. Women's National Volleyball Team head coach **Mick Haley**, who won two national championships in the 1980s while guiding the Texas women's team, has joined the USC women's volleyball program after the conclusion of the 2000 Olympics in Sydney, Australia. Due to the fact that he arrived in the middle of the collegiate season, Haley does not expect to take an active coaching role until 2001. Haley accepted the USC coaching position in June of 1999. In his fourth season as head coach of the U.S.A. National Volleyball Team, his squad earned a berth to the 2000 Olympics by defeating Canada to win the Nike Americas' Volleyball Challenge. Before taking over the national team, he spent 17 successful seasons (1980-96) at Texas, where he earned a 522-137-1 overall record, won two national championships and 13 Southwest Conference titles, and captured 15 NCAA tournament berths.

U.S.A. WOMEN'S VOLLEYBALL AT THE 2000 OLYMPICS

Under the leadership of head coach **Mick Haley**, the U.S.A. women's volleyball team surprised many by advancing to the semifinals before falling to Russia 2-3 and Brazil in medal contention. The Americans, who weren't favored to make the semifinals much less push the powerful Russians to a fifth game, relinquished the bronze medal to Brazil with a 0-3 loss. The United States made a strong start at the 2000 Olympic Games by defeating China (3-1), Kenya (3-0), Croatia (3-0) and Australia (3-0). The team lost its first match of the Games to Brazil (1-2) in the first round of play, but returned to beat South Korea 3-2 and advance to the semifinals.

PLAYER PROFILES

#1 TRACY LINDQUIST

Setter • Sophomore

A returning starter... named to the 1999 Pac-10 All-Freshman first team... averaged 7.86 assists and 1.95 digs per game while sharing the setter's role... finished the season tenth in the Pac-10 in assists... an extremely versatile player and a great competitor for the Women of Troy.

Did You Know?... A true beach buff, Lindquist played in the 2000 Pro Seal Beach Open and represented the United States in 2-man beach volleyball in Israel this summer with her partner, sister Katie Lindquist.

This Season... Has played in 69 games and started 5 matches... Averaged 6.67 assists and 2.5 digs against Texas (Sept. 1) and Arkansas (Sept. 2) while splitting time at setter and DS... Averaged 6.6 assists per game at the Met-Rx Invitational (Sept. 6-8) and recorded a career-high five service aces against Temple... Collected six digs against Oregon State (Sept. 29) and averaged 5.0 apg for the weekend series... Added 33 assists and one ace against UCLA (Oct. 6)... Averaged 7.3 assists per game against Arizona State (Oct. 12) and Arizona (Oct. 13)... Made her third and fourth start of the season against Cal (Oct. 19) and Stanford (Oct. 20), setting a **career-high** against the Cardinal with 16 digs... Added 11 digs against UCSB (Oct. 24) along with 38 assists... Posted eight digs and 24 assists as a starter against UCLA (Nov. 3).

#2 JULIE MARIANI

Defensive Specialist • Sophomore

A returning letterwinner who made several starts in the backrow... collected 243 digs (2.27 dpg) and led the team with 50 service aces in 1999... led the Pac-10 averaging 0.47 aces per game... an aggressive player on the court.

Did You Know?... Mariani currently holds the USC career and single season record for ace average after posting 0.47 aces per game as a freshman.

This Season... Has played in 24 games... Entered the match against Oregon (Sept. 30) and accounted for one ace and one dig... Played three games against UCI (Oct. 3) and UCLA (Oct.
