QUICKLY ON UTAH

The Runnin' Utes (3-4) head to the East Coast to take on the Rhode Island Rams (5-4) on Saturday at 2:05 p.m. (EST) at the Ryan Center in Kingston, R.I. Utah is 0-2 on the road this season. The game will be broadcast on Sports Radio 700 The Zone.

Utah had its three-game winning steak snapped with a 60-57 loss at Utah State on Wednesday night. Last week, the Utes defeated Weber State, 67-55, on Nov. 29 and previously unbeaten Washington State, 69-55, on Dec. 2.

Sophomore center **Luke Nevill** (7-1, 265) is the Utes' leading scorer (17.7 ppg) and rebounder (8.1 rpg). He is shooting 70.0 percent from the field, and has 15 assists and a team-best seven blocked shots. Junior guard **Johnnie Bryant** (6-0, 180) is second on the team in scoring (15.9 ppg) and has connected on 48.8 percent (21-for-43) of his three-point attempts. Bryant also leads the Utes in assists (2.6 apg). Sophomore forward **Shaun Green** (6-8, 208) is third on the team in scoring (13.0 ppg) and second in rebounding (6.0 rpg). He is shooting 64.0 percent from the field and 65.5 percent from three-point range (19-for-29). Green also leads the Utes in steals (11) and blocked shots (5).

In the NCAA statistical rankings released on Dec. 4, Utah ranked first in three-point percentage (49.5), 11th in field goal percentage (52.0), 57th in free throw percentage (73.4) and 82nd in three-pointers made per game. Green ranked first in the nation in three-point percentage (68.0).

RUNNIN' UTE NOTABLES

- Three of Utah's four losses have come by a combined seven points.
- Before its loss at Utah State on Wednesday night, Utah had won three in a row for the first time since it won its first four games of the 2005-06 season. That followed up Utah's first 0-3 start since 1970-71.
- The Utes have shot at least 50 percent from three-point range in five of the seven games and at least 50 percent from the field in five of the seven games this season.

▶ UTAH VS. RHODE ISLAND PREVIEW

SCOUTING RHODE ISLAND

The Rams are 5-4 overall and 3-1 at home this season. During the past week, Rhode Island lost at Providence, 95-66, on Saturday and edged Brown, 72-68, at home on Tuesday night.

Junior forward **Will Daniels** (6-8, 220) leads URI in scoring (17.9 ppg), is second in rebounding (5.1 rpg), and has a team-best eight blocked shots. He is also shooting 50.0 percent (16-for-32) from three-point range. Sophomore guard **Jimmy Barron** (6-2, 190) is second on the team in scoring (15.0 ppg) and is shooting 55.3 percent (26-for-47) from three-point range. Sophomore forward **Kahiem Seawright** (6-8, 220) is the third Ram averaging double figures in points (13.4 ppg) and leads the effort on the boards (9.2 rpg). Junior guard **Jon Lucky** (6-5, 220) leads the team in assists (4.4 apg). He is suffering from ankle soreness and did not play against Brown on Tuesday.

Baron started in his place and poured in a career-high 28 points.

RAM HEAD COACH JIM BARRON

Jim Barron has a 73-85 record in his sixth season at Rhode Island. His career mark is 279-287 in 20 seasons.

Barron led Rhode Island to back-to-back 20-win seasons and NIT berths in 2002-03 and '03-04. He was named the 2003 Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year.

Named head coach at St. Francis (Pa.) in 1987, his 1990-91 team set a school record for wins (24-8) and earned the school's only NCAA Tournament bid. In 1992, he returned to his alma mater, St. Bonaventure. The 1995 Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year took the Bonnies to three NITs and one NCAA Tournament, posting a 39-22 (.639) log his last two years.

UTAH VS. RHODE ISLAND SERIES NOTES

- The Utes and Rams meet for the fourth time on Saturday afternoon with Utah leading the series 2-1. It will be the first game in the series played on the Rams' home court.
- The Utes won the first game of the recent home-and-home series last season 66-50 on Nov. 22 in Salt Lake City.

• Utah won the teams' first meeting 84-72 on March 27, 1992 in Salt Lake City in the quarterfinals of the NIT. Then Rhode Island won the second match-up 70-63 on Dec. 2, 1998 in the Great 8 Tournament at the United Center in Chicago, Ill.

• Utah is 14-11 (.560) all-time against members of the Atlantic 10 Conference, including a 6-4 mark on the road. The Atlantic 10 team Utah has faced the most is St. Joseph's (Pa.), going 5-5 against the Hawks.

LAST MEETING

Bryant Markson scored 17 points and led Utah on an 11-0 run to pull ahead in the second half and beat Rhode Island 66-50 in the Huntsman Center last season on Nov. 22.

Shaun Green added 11 points and five assists in his first start and just his second college game, while Jonas Langvad scored 10 for the Utes.

Utah overcame miserable shooting in the first half by going 14-for-23 in the last 20 minutes to remain unbeaten at 2-0. The Utes made 7-of-18 three-pointers, getting three from Green and two each from Markson and Langvad, who was 2-for-2 from beyond the arc.

Jimmy Baron scored 16 and Will Daniels finished with 11 points for the Rams.

Rhode Island led 24-23 at halftime after forcing the Utes into nine turnovers and just 9-for-25 shooting. But the Utes finally broke through the defense midway through the second half and led the rest of the way.

Daniels put Rhode Island up 42-41 on a three-pointer with 9:40 to play, but Utah answered with an 11-0 run. Langvad started it with a three-pointer, Markson hit two free throws, then converted a three-point play with 8:17 remaining.

After forcing the Rams into a backcourt violation, Green came back with another three-pointer to put the Utes ahead 52-42 with just under seven minutes to play. Green also had a key block during the run, knocking Darrell Harris' shot right back to him then forcing Harris to step out of bounds.

Daniels made a jumper to give the Rams their first points in three minutes, then Utah scored the next five to pull away 57-44.

▶ PLAYER NOTES

TAKE NOTICE OF NEVILL

Sophomore center Luke Nevill (7-1, 265) is the Utes' leading scorer (17.7 ppg) and rebounder (8.1 rpg). He is shooting 70.0 percent from the field, and has 15 assists and a team-best seven blocked shots.

• Nevill has led the Utes four times in scoring and four times in rebounding this season. He has scored in double figures all seven games.

• As of Dec. 4, Nevill ranked 81st in the NCAA in scoring (18.3 ppg), sixth in field goal percentage (68.9) and 89th in rebounds per game (8.2 rpg).

• The Perth, Australia, native has had double-doubles in three of the last five games to bring his career total to seven. Most recently against Washington State on Dec. 2, Nevill had 16 points (5-6 FG, 6-6 FT) and 12 rebounds in 30 minutes.

• Nevill scored a season-high 24 points against Weber State on Nov. 29 to record his second 20-point game of the season and his second in a row. He now has four 20-point games in his career. Nevill also had three assists and five boards in 36 minutes.

• He shot 11-for-12 against Weber State to tie the fifth-best single-game field goal percentage mark in school history. Josh Grant went 11-of-12 against Montana Tech on Dec. 1, 1992. Four Ute players have shot 100 percent in a game—all with at least eight attempts—to tie for the top mark.

• Nevill had a career-high four assists against Utah State on Dec. 6.

• Nevill had an excellent freshman season, earning all-Mountain West Conference honorable mention. He played in all 29 games with 12 starts. Nevill led the Utes in rebounds (6.6 rpg) and blocked shots (27), and was the third-leading scorer (11.6 ppg). Nevill also shot 53.2 percent from the field while scoring in

UTAH TRADITION

• Utah has a 1,587-818 all-time record in its 99th season. The U. entered the year ranking 10th in the NCAA in all-time winning percentage with a .661 mark. Utah also ranked 10th in the NCAA in all-time wins, and was one of just 22 schools to have 1,500 victories at the start of the season.

• The Utes have won three national championships, winning the 1916 AAU championship, 1944 NCAA championship and 1947 NIT title. Utah is one of only 35 schools to win the NCAA Division I men's basketball title.

• Utah has made four trips to the NCAA Final Four: 1944 (champions), 1961 (4th), 1966 (4th) and 1998 (runner-up). Only 15 teams have more Final Four appearances than Utah.

• The Utes have played in the NCAA Tournament 26 times and have a 35-29 record (.547). Since 1975 when the NCAA field was expanded to 32 teams, Utah ranks tied for 20th in wins (24), 21st in games played (42) and tied for 15th in NCAA Sweet 16 appearances (9).

double figures 18 times. He had a team-best four double-doubles.

- Nevill had career highs in points (29) and rebounds (14) against BYU in the quarterfinals of the MWC Tournament on March 9, 2006. He shot 9-for-15 from the field and 11-for-15 from the free throw line in 33 minutes against the Cougars.

JOHNNIE BE GOOD

Junior guard **Johnnie Bryant** (6-0, 180) is second on the team in scoring (15.9 ppg) and has connected on 48.8 percent (21-for-43) of his three-point attempts. Bryant also leads the Utes in assists (2.6 apg). He has scored in double figures in all seven games this season.

- As of Dec. 4, Bryant ranked 20th in the NCAA three-point field goal percentage (51.4), 43rd in three-pointers made per game (3.0) and 52nd in free throw percentage (89.5).

- Bryant set career-highs with 28 points (7-12 FG, 3-7 3FG, 11-13 FT) and seven assists (just one turnover) in 36 minutes against Rice on Nov. 25. It was his second consecutive 20-point game and the sixth of his career. Bryant had 20 points (6-12 FG, 6-9 3FG, 2-2 FT) in 35 minutes against Colorado on Nov. 21.

- Bryant earned all-Mountain West Conference honorable mention last season, his first with the Utes after playing one year at San Francisco College. Bryant led the Utes in scoring (13.3 ppg), assists (2.38 apg), three-point percentage (45.9), three-pointers made (68) and free throw percentage (83.3). He scored in double figures 20 times last season, playing in all 29 games with 27 starts.

- On the Ute single-season charts, Bryant tied for second in three-point percentage (45.9), tied for fourth in three-pointers made (68), and ninth in three-point attempts (148) in 2005-06.

- The Oakland, Calif., native is already just one class away from earning his undergraduate degree from the University of Utah and took part in the 2006 spring commencement ceremony. Bryant will officially finish his human development and family studies degree this fall and start a second major in sports management.

IT'S EASY BEING GREEN

Sophomore forward **Shaun Green** (6-8, 208) is third on the team in scoring (13.0 ppg) and second in rebounding (6.0 rpg). He is shooting 64.0 percent from the field and 65.5 percent from three-point range (19-for-29). Green also leads the Utes in steals (11) and blocked shots (5).

- As of Dec. 4, Green led the nation in three-point field goal percentage (68.0) and ranked 72nd in three-point field goals per game (2.8).

- Green has scored in double figures in all seven games this season to give him 16 double-figure scoring games in his career.

- Green tied his career-high with nine rebounds against Utah State on Dec. 6.

- The Salt Lake City native tied his career-high with 17 points in 33 minutes against Washington State on Dec. 2. He hit 5-of-5 three-pointers against the Cougars to tie the school single-game record for three-point percentage. Three other Utes have also gone 5-for-5 in a game.

- He established career-highs of 17 points (6-12 FG, 3-7 3FG, 2-2 FT) and nine rebounds (three offensive) in 31 minutes off the bench against Rice on Nov. 25. Green had a career-high three blocked shots versus Colorado on Nov. 21.

- Green made 24 starts and averaged 26.3 minutes per game as a freshman. A solid all-around contributor, Green ranked fourth on the team in scoring (6.4 ppg), third in rebounding (3.8 rpg), third in assists (2.1 apg), second in steals (31) and second in blocked shots (11). The Salt Lake City native shot 38.1 percent (43-for-113) from three-point range.

THE RIGHT WEIGH

Freshman forward **Stephen Weigh** (6-6, 220) hasn't wasted any time in making an impact during his first season with the Utes. Weigh is fourth on the team in scoring (7.9 ppg) while averaging 26.9 minutes per game. He played off the bench the first two games before being inserted into the lineup the last five games.

- Weigh averaged 14.0 points over the first two games of the season. He shot 66.7 percent from the field (8-for-12), 75.0 percent (3-for-4) from three-point range and 81.8 percent at the free throw line (9-for-11). Weigh had a season-high 15 points at Santa Clara on Nov. 18.

- Weigh rebounded from a two-game shooting slump to score 11 points (4-8 FG, 2-2 3FG, 1-2 FT) in 26 minutes against Weber State. He followed the up with eight points (4-10 FG) in 26 minutes versus Washington State. He also had a season-high three assists against Weber State. The two previous games, Weigh went scoreless in an 0-for-3 night from the field against Colorado on Nov. 21, and posted four points (1-4 FG, 0-3 3FG, 2-4 FT) and two assists versus Rice on Nov. 25.

- The native of Rockhampton, Australia, played two seasons with the Australian Institute of Sport, the country's junior national team development program, before coming to Utah. Weigh led the AIS team in scoring at the Jones Cup, a FIBA International Tournament in Taipei, in July 2005. He averaged 18 points and five rebounds per game.

TAKE NOTE OF THESE UTES

• Senior guard **Ricky Johns** (6-3, 190) had a season-high eight points (3-4 FG, 2-3 FT) in 20 minutes off the bench against Utah State on Dec. 6. Johns tied a career-best mark with three steals against Weber State on Nov. 29.

• Sophomore guard **Lawrence Borha** (6-3, 205) has started the last five games. He had a season-high 11 points (4-6 FG, 0-1 3FG, 3-5 FT) and three rebounds in 32 minutes versus Washington State on Dec. 2. That followed-up eight points (2-5 FG, 2-3 3FG, 2-2 FT), three boards and two steals in 24 minutes against Weber State on Nov. 29. Borha had eight points (4-10 FG), a career-high four assists, two rebounds and a steal in 31 minutes versus Colorado on Nov. 21.

• Freshman forward **Daniel Deane** (6-8, 245) had a season-high eight rebounds (four offensive), three points, an assist and a steal in 15 minutes against Rice on Nov. 25.

• Freshman center **David Foster** (7-2, 230) was brought out of a redshirt season and played in his first official college game against Colorado on Nov. 21. He had two points, a rebound and a blocked shot in five minutes.

▶ TEAM NOTES

GAME 7 REWIND

Jaycee Carroll scored 27 points to lead Utah State in scoring but it took a three-point shot from teammate Chaz Spicer in the final seconds to defeat Utah 60-57 Wednesday night at the Smith Spectrum.

Spicer made the shot with 1.9 seconds remaining for the Aggies (7-1). The Utes (3-4) weren't able to get off a final shot.

Spicer scored 12 for USU. Stephen DuCharme scored 10 and pulled down a team-high seven rebounds for the Aggies. Luke Nevill and Johnnie Bryant both had 14 points for the Utes. Shaun Green had 12 points and a game-high nine rebounds.

USU burst out to a 10-point lead early in the second half, 44-34, but an 11-2 run by Utah, capped by a three-point shot from Bryant, gave the Utes their first lead of the game 47-46 with 8:46 remaining.

The teams traded baskets until Bryant made a three-point shot and gave Utah the lead 57-54 with less than a minute left in the game.

Carroll answered 18 seconds later, his fifth three-pointer of the game. Carroll shot 11-of-16 from the field.

Patient offenses and tight defenses by both teams led to a low-scoring first half. The score was only 13-12 for USU at the 10:00 mark. Utah State led 27-21 at halftime.

GAME 6 REWIND

Luke Nevill scored 16 points and grabbed 12 rebounds as Utah spoiled Washington State's best start in 13 years with a 69-55 victory last Saturday night in the Huntsman Center.

The Cougars (7-1) entered the game undefeated, but could not stop the Utes' 7-foot-1 center.

Even when Nevill was not throwing down dunks or pulling down rebounds, he was passing deftly out of double- and triple-teams to get his teammates open shots. Shaun Green scored 17 points as a result, and made all five of his three-point shots. Green tied the school record for three-point percentage in a game.

The Utes (3-3) made 9-of-17 from three-point range, including three during a 14-0 first-half run that blew the game open.

Robbie Cowgill scored 16 points to lead the Cougars, who entered the game leading the Pac-10 Conference by allowing 56.8 points per game.

But the Utes shot a season-high 58.1 percent, and led by as many as 25 points. Johnnie Bryant added 14 points for Utah, while teammate Lawrence Borha helped hold WSU's leading scorer, Derrick Low, to three of his 15 points in the decisive first half.

The Cougars tried to dig out of a 20-point hole in the second half, with a three-pointer by Low and a dunk by Cowgill.

But Utah's Ricky Johns buried a three-pointer on the other end with 10:08 remaining, and the Utes used a rapid-fire combination of a blocked shot and a long pass for a fast-break lay-up by Green to rebuild their lead to 56-36 and effectively seal the game.

Washington State has lost 10 straight games at Utah since 1946.

DEFENSIVE DATA

One of the trademarks of Utah basketball has been a stifling half-court defense. Since the 1989-90 season, Utah has finished in the top 30 in the nation 13 times in scoring defense, 12 times in rebound margin, eight times in field goal percentage defense and nine times in scoring margin.

• Opponents are shooting 49.0 percent from the field and 46.2 percent from three-point range against the U. this season.

• Utah's three-game winning streak against Rice, Weber State and Washington State was buoyed by its defense. After allowing Rice to shoot 54.2 percent from the field and score 39 points in the first half

on Nov. 25, Utah held the Owls to 34.8 percent shooting and 25 points in the second half. In the next two games, Utah held both Weber State and Washington State to 55 points each. The teams combined to shoot 41.6 percent from the field and 36.7 percent from three-point range. Utah State shot 48.1 percent from the field and 50.0 percent (8-for-16) from three-point range.

- The Utes' first two opponents, Southern Utah and Santa Clara, both shot at least 60 percent from the field and 50 percent from three-point range,
- The Utes have a +2.7 rebound margin this season. After being outrebounded 23-22 in the season opener against Southern Utah, Utah has had the advantage on the boards in five of the last six games, missing only against Weber State on Nov. 29 (28-24). The Utes had a season-best +7 margin (36-23) over Rice on Nov. 25.
- In three seasons under **Ray Giacoletti**, Utah is 45-15 when it has a rebounding total equal to or better than its opponents. Utah is 2-3 when it has the rebounding edge this season.
- Last season, Utah ranked 28th in the NCAA in rebound margin (+4.6) and 59th in scoring defense (64.3 ppg). The Utes matched or surpassed the rebounding effort of 21 of their 29 opponents in 2005-06, going 14-7 those games.

OBSERVING THE OFFENSE

The Utes have ranked in the top 30 in the nation in field goal percentage nine times in the last 13 years and in the top 35 in three-point percentage four times in the last seven years.

- As of Dec. 4, Utah led the nation in three-point percentage (49.5), ranked 11th in field goal percentage (52.0) and 82nd in three-pointers made per game (7.5). Utah is currently shooting 47.6 percent from three-point range and 52.4 percent from the field.
- The Utes have shot at least 50 percent from the field five times and had a season-best mark of 58.1 percent against Washington State on Dec. 2. **Luke Nevill** (70.0) and **Shaun Green** (64.0) are Utah's field goal percentage leaders this season.
- The U. has hit at least 50 percent of its three-point field goals in five of the seven games. Its best performance from beyond the arc was 64.3 percent (9-for-14) against Santa Clara. **Shaun Green** (65.5) and **Johnnie Bryant** (48.8) lead Utah in three-point percentage this season.
- Utah has made a three-pointer in each of the last 103 games. The last time the Utes didn't make a three-pointer was an 0-for-8 effort against Georgia State in a 46-38 win on Nov. 17, 2003. That broke a string of 152 games with a three-pointer made.
- Utah scored a season-high 80 points against Rice on Nov. 25. The Utes also scored 50 points in the second half against the Owls, which is the U.'s best half this season.
- The Utes have done an excellent job of getting to the free throw line more times than the opposition in three seasons under **Ray Giacoletti**. Utah's number of free throw attempts has been equal to or better than its opponents in 52 of the 71 games during the Giacoletti era, with the U. winning all but 13 of those games. Utah has gotten to the line more times than its opponents in five of the seven games this season.
- Last season, Utah ranked 47th in the NCAA in field goal percentage (46.6) and 63rd in three-point percentage (38.4).

UTES IN THE HUNTSMAN CENTER

Utah is 239-26 (.902) in the Huntsman Center over the past 18 seasons. The Utes' all-time record in the 38-year-old facility is 471-97.

- Utah is off to a 3-2 start at home this season, losing those two games by a combined four points.
- The U. went 10-5 at home in 2005-06. The last time the Utes lost five home games in a season was 1988-89 when they went 11-7 in the Huntsman Center.
- The Utes were 16-0 at home in 2004-05 to record one of seven undefeated seasons in the history of the Huntsman Center.
- In conference home games over the last 12 years, Utah is 82-8 (.911).

UTES ON NATION'S BEST CONFERENCE CHAMPIONSHIPS RUN

The Utes have won 11 regular-season conference titles over the last 16 seasons, laying claim to a share of the nation's best conference championships run over that time. Utah and Kentucky captured regular season titles in the MWC and SEC, respectively, in 2004-05 to set the top mark. Kansas won a piece of the Big 12 Conference title last season to draw even with the Utes and Wildcats. Cincinnati, Coppin State, Murray State and Penn follow, winning 10 conference titles since 1990-91.

All-time, Utah has won 28 regular season conference titles, the fifth most in NCAA history. Kansas is first with 49 titles, followed by Kentucky (43), Western Kentucky (38) and North Carolina (33).

Since joining the MWC, Utah won the title the first two years to continue a string of seven straight regular season league championships. The Utes went 10-4 in conference play in 1999-2000 to share the inaugural Mountain West Conference championship with UNLV. Utah also went 10-4 in 2000-01 to win a piece of the title with Brigham Young and Wyoming. Utah went 11-3 to share the Mountain West Conference title with BYU in 2002-03. Utah then went on to post its best record in conference play in six years with a 13-1 record in 2004-05, claiming the championship outright.

UTAH PICKED FOURTH IN MWC POLL

Members of the conference media selected the Runnin' Utes to place fourth in the Mountain West Conference preseason poll. Utah's **Stephen Weigh**, a guard/forward from Rockhampton, Australia, was selected as the Top Freshman.

Defending regular-season champion San Diego State was picked to repeat as the MWC champion, marking the second straight season the Aztecs have been picked to win the crown. Three teams earned at least one first-place vote, with SDSU capturing 17 of 21 first-place votes and 192 points for the top spot in the poll. BYU earned one first-place vote and finished second with 156 points, while Air Force garnered three first-place votes and 147 points to place third. Utah received 114 points to finish fourth, followed by New Mexico and UNLV in fifth and sixth with 101 and 99 points, respectively. Colorado State was chosen seventh in the poll with 68 points. Wyoming (51) and TCU (27) rounded out the poll.

Brandon Heath (Sr., G) of San Diego State was voted the league's top returning player. Also making the preseason all-MWC team were: **Jacob Burtschi** (Sr., F) Air Force, **Trent Plaisted** (So., F/C) BYU, **Jason Smith** (Jr., F) Colorado State, and **Mohamed Abukar** (Sr., F) San Diego State.

UTAH SIGNS THREE PLAYERS

Utah signed two high school seniors and a junior college transfer to national letters of intent during the early period.

The Runnin' Utes signed **Carlton Brown**, a 6-foot-4, 210-pound guard from Riverside, Calif.; **Nemanja Calasan**, a 6-foot-9, 245-pound post player from Midland Junior College; and **Morgan Grim**, a 6-foot-9, 205-pound forward from River-ton, Utah.

Brown and Grim made the "2006-07 Best in the West" team compiled by Frank Burlison of the *Long Beach Press Telegram*. Of the top 45 players on the squad, Utah signed two of the six that committed to Mountain West Conference schools. No MWC team had more selections than the Utes. Both Brown and Grim were named third team "Best in the West." Calasan was a first team all-region selection in 2005-06 at Midland.

RUNNIN' UTE NOTABLES

- Seven of the 13 Utes who have seen action this season are first-year players. Six of those players are freshmen.
- Utah started out 0-3 for the sixth time in school history. Utah last dropped its first three games in 1970-71 under **Jack Gardner**. The U. fell to Southern California (90-81) on Dec. 3 at home before dropping road games to Utah State (94-77) on Dec. 5 and Oregon State (91-75) on Dec. 7.

NOTES FROM THE 2005-06 SEASON

- Utah (14-15, 6-10 MWC) finished with a losing record in conference play for the first time since the 1993-94 season when it went 8-10. That was also the last time the Utes finished with a .500 record or lower overall, going 14-14.
- Of Utah's 10 losses in Mountain West Conference play, seven were by less than 10 points, including one overtime loss.
- Thirteen of the Runnin' Utes' 29 games were decided by nine points or less, with Utah going 6-7 in those games.
- Utah played one redshirt freshman and four other newcomers last season. As a group, the first-year players accounted for 58.9 percent of the Utes' points, 48.9 percent of their rebounds, 52.6 percent of their assists, and 54.9 percent of their minutes played.
- The Utes were 12-5 when holding their opponents to 68 points or less and 2-10 when allowing 69 points or more.

Ray Giacoletti

Head Coach • 3rd Season at Utah
Minot State, 1985

Ray Giacoletti is in his third season as the head coach of the Runnin' Utes. He directed Utah to a 29-6 record, an appearance in the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament, and the Mountain West Conference regular-season title in his first season in 2004-05.

Giacoletti had the best record of any first-year head coach in NCAA Division I in 2004-05. As a result, Giacoletti was named the NABC District 13, USBWA District 8 and Mountain West Conference Coach of the Year. He was also named the 2005 *Playboy Magazine* National Coach of the Year.

After losing six lettermen and two first team all-conference selections from the 2004-05 squad, Utah was in a rebuilding mode last season and went 14-15 overall and placed sixth in the Mountain West Conference.

Before coming to the U., Giacoletti went 69-50 in four seasons at Eastern Washington. Giacoletti was named the 2003-04 Big Sky Conference Coach of the Year after leading Eastern Washington to its first-ever NCAA Tournament berth in 2004. The Eagles, finishing 17-13 overall and 11-3 in conference play, won 14 of their last 18 games—including 11 straight victories—to capture the Big Sky regular season and tournament titles. Prior to taking over at Eastern Washington, he was at North Dakota State for three years (1997-2000), directing the NCAA Division II program to a 48-33 record.

Before becoming a head coach, Giacoletti was an assistant for four years at both Illinois State (1989-93) and Washington (1993-97) under Bob Bender.

Giacoletti graduated from Minot State University in North Dakota with a degree in physical education in 1985. He got his start in coaching as a student assistant coach at Minot State in 1984-85 while he finished his degree. Giacoletti was a graduate assistant coach at Western Illinois in 1985-86 and an assistant at Oral Roberts in 1986-87.

Giacoletti then moved on to the professional ranks as an assistant coach and director of player personnel for the Fresno Flames of the World Basketball League from 1987-89.

A native of Peoria, Ill., Giacoletti graduated from East Peoria High School in 1980. Giacoletti, born on April 14, 1962, married the former Kim Lankford in 1994.
