Just the Facts

Utah (23-6, 11-3 MWC) competes in the 2003 EAS Mountain West Conference Tournament, Thursday through Saturday at the Thomas & Mack Center (18,500) in Las Vegas, Nev.

The Utes were the Mountain West Conference co-champions with Brigham Young during the regular season. The Utes are the No. 1 seed in the tournament by virtue of sweeping BYU during the regular season. Utah plays No. 8 seed Air Force (12-15, 3-11 MWC) in the quarterfinals on Thursday at 6:00 p.m. (PST). Should Utah win, it will advance to face the winner of No. 4 UNLV (19-9, 8-6 MWC) vs. No. 5 San Diego State (15-12, 6-8 MWC) in the semifinal round on Friday at 9:00 p.m. (PST). The championship game takes place on Saturday at 7:00 p.m. (PST). The Mountain West Conference Tournament champion earns an automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament.

On Radio

All of the Utes' games in the Mountain West Conference Tournament will be broadcast on the Utah Sports Network (KALL-910 AM in Salt Lake City and affiliate stations). The games will also be carried on the Internet at www.theMWC.com. Bill Marcroft (play-by-play), Mark Rydalch (analyst) and Brad Stone (host) call the action.

On Television

ESPN Regional will televise Utah's first round game against Air Force on Thursday at 6:00 p.m. (PST). The game will be carried locally on KJZZ-TV in Salt Lake City. Rich Waltz (play-by-play) and Irv Brown (analyst) call the action.

Should Utah advance, its semifinal game on Friday at 9:00 p.m. (PST) and potential championship game on Saturday at 7:00 p.m. (PST) would be televised by ESPN with Bob Carpenter (play-by-play) and Jimmy Dykes (analyst) serving as the talent.

The Utes In Conference Tournaments

Utah has competed in 19 previous conference tournaments—16 as a member of the Western Athletic Conference and the last three in the MWC—posting a 22-16 (.579) record. The Utes won WAC Tournament

Utah Tradition

- Utah has a 1,515-782 all-time record in its 95th season. The U. entered the year ranking 10th in the NCAA in all-time winning percentage with a .658 mark. Utah also ranked 13th in the NCAA in all-time wins, and was one of just 22 schools to have 1,400 victories at the start of the season.
- The Utes have won three national championships, winning the 1916 AAU championship, 1944 NCAA championship and 1947 NIT title. Utah is one of only 33 schools to win the NCAA Division I men's basketball title.
- Utah has made four trips to the NCAA Final Four: 1944 (champions), 1961 (4th), 1966 (4th) and 1998 (runner-up).
- The Utes have played in the NCAA Tournament 23 times and have a 32-26 record (.552). Only 13 schools have appeared in the NAAs more times than Utah.
- During the decade of the '90s, the Utes won the eighth-most games in NCAA Division I with a 250-76 record. Utah's .767 winning percentage in the last 10 years also ranked as the eighth-best in the nation.
- The past five seasons, Utah had the 12th-highest winning percentage in NCAA Division I (.756) with a 121-39 record.

titles in 1995, '97 and '99. In the Mountain West Tournament, the Utes have lost in the semifinals the last three years.

The Utes' .579 combined winning percentage in WAC (1984-99) and MWC (2000-02) tournaments ranks third among the conference teams. UNLV at .769 (10-3) and New Mexico at .585 (24-17) rank first and second, respectively, ahead of Utah. BYU is fourth at .531 (17-15).

Opening Tips

Quickly On Utah

The Runnin' Utes are 23-6 overall and were the Mountain West Conference regular-season co-champions with an 11-3 record. Utah, ranked 23rd by ESPN/*USA Today* and 27th in the A.P. poll, has won 18 of its last 21 games. The Utes split their last two regular-season games at home, losing to Colorado State on Thursday night, 66-65, and defeating Wyoming, 86-70, on Saturday afternoon.

Utah was ranked 11th in the NCAA in scoring defense and 27th in three-point percentage as of March 4, and is currently giving up 60.6 points per game while hitting 38.7 percent from beyond the arc. Utah went 15-1 at home this season, 7-3 on the road and 1-2 on neutral courts.

Three Utes are averaging double figures in points. Junior center **Tim Frost** (6-10, 236) leads the way in scoring (13.3 ppg), shooting a team-best 51.8 percent from the field, and is second in rebounding (4.9 rpg). Junior guard **Nick Jacobson** (6-4, 200) is second in scoring (13.1 ppg) and is shooting 42.0 percent from three-point range (68-for-162) and a team-best 86.0 percent from the free throw line. Senior forward **Britton Johnsen** (6-10, 210) is third in scoring (11.6 ppg) and leads the effort in rebounding (6.7 rpg). Freshman point guard **Tim Drisdorn** (6-3, 203) leads the Utes in assists (3.2 apg). Sophomore guard **Marc Jackson** (6-1, 177) is fourth in scoring (9.1 ppg), shooting 45.6 percent from three-point range.

Four Utes Make All-Mountain West Team

Utah landed four players on the 2002-03 all-Mountain West Conference team, the most of any school in the league. Junior center **Tim Frost**, sophomore guard **Marc Jackson** and senior forward **Britton Johnsen** were named to the second team, while junior guard **Nick Jacobson** made the third team. Senior forward **Trace Caton** earned honorable mention.

Frost, in his first season with the Utes after transferring from Portland, ranked tied for 11th in scoring (14.3 ppg), third in field goal percentage (55.3), first in three-point percentage (56.2) and ninth in free throw percentage (78.3) in the MWC during the 14 league games. The Klamath Falls, Ore., native was also tied for 11th in rebounds (4.9 rpg) and seventh in blocked shots (0.93 bpg).

Jackson scored in double figures in the first eight conference games, keying Utah's 9-1 start. The sophomore from Olympus High School in Salt Lake City ranked 15th in scoring (13.4 ppg), 12th in field goal percentage (51.1), third in three-point percentage (47.7), seventh in free throw percentage (84.3), second in assists (3.43 apg), and fourth in assists/turnover ratio (1.60) during the conference season.

Johnsen earned all-league recognition for the second year. He was named the Mountain West Player of the Year and first team all-league in 2001-02. The native of Murray, Utah, ranked 18th in scoring (11.2 ppg), 14th in field goal percentage (46.2), fifth in rebounding (7.0 rpg) and tied for 14th in steals (1.07 spg) in league games despite recovering from a torn ligament in his right thumb the first part of the conference schedule.

Jacobson was named third team all-MWC for the second consecutive season. He was also the

league's Freshman of the Year in 2000-01. In the conference season, the junior from Fargo, N.D., ranked 14th in scoring (13.1 ppg), third in free throw percentage (86.0), 15th in three-point percentage (37.8) and tied for seventh in three-pointers per game (2.00).

Utes Own Nation's Best Conference Championship Run

Capturing a share of the Mountain West Conference regular-season championship this season, Utah claimed its eighth conference title in nine years under Rick Majerus. Winning 10 conference regular-season titles during the last 13 seasons, the Runnin' Utes own the most regular-season conference championships in the nation over that period of time.

Cincinnati (Great Midwest/Conference USA), Kansas (Big 8/Big 12), Kentucky (SEC) and Murray State (Ohio Valley) are one off the pace, winning nine regular-season league titles in the last 13 years. In addition, the Utes' eight titles in the last nine years is tied with Valparaiso (Mid-Continent) for best mark over that time frame.

Highlighting their conference championships during **Rick Majerus'** tenure, which began in 1989-90, the Utes won the WAC regular-season championship outright in 1991 and shared it in 1993 before winning five consecutive outright WAC titles from 1995-99 (the last three being divisional titles). Utah went 10-4 in conference play in 1999-2000 to share the inaugural Mountain West Conference championship with UNLV. The Utes also went 10-4 in 2000-01 to split the title with Brigham Young and Wyoming. The Utes' string of seven consecutive conference championships ended in 2002 when they finished one game behind Wyoming at 10-4 in the MWC.

Utah went 11-3 in the Mountain West Conference this season to get its most wins in the four seasons of the league's existence. It was also the Utes' best conference record since going 14-0 in its final season in the Western Athletic Conference in 1999.

MWC Quarterfinals Preview

Scouting The Falcons

Air Force is 12-15 overall and finished eighth the Mountain West Conference with a 3-11 record. The Falcons snapped a season-long five-game losing streak with a 68-60 home win over New Mexico on Saturday afternoon. Air Force started its losing skid with a loss to Wyoming (64-57) at home on Feb. 17, dropped road games at San Diego State (67-53) on Feb. 22 and UNLV (74-70) on Feb. 24, then fell to Brigham Young (56-43) on March 1 and Utah (57-52) on March 3 in Colorado Springs. Air Force lost its only game on a neutral court this season to UAB (69-59) on Dec. 27 in UTEP's tournament.

Sophomore guard **Tim Keller** (6-3, 180), who earned third team all-MWC honors, ranks tied for eighth in the Mountain West in scoring (15.2 ppg) and second in steals (42). Keller ranked seventh in the NCAA in three-point percentage as of March 4. He is currently shooting 45.6 percent from beyond the arc and averaging 2.89 threes per game to rank first and second, respectively, in the MWC in those categories. Keller is also an 83.5 percent shooter from the free throw line to rank tied for fifth in the conference. Junior forward **Joel Gerlach** (6-6, 195) is 15th in the MWC in scoring (12.1 ppg) and third in three-point percentage (44.6). Gerlach also has a team-high 28 blocked shots to rank sixth in the league. Junior forward **A.J. Kuhle** (6-4, 185) is third in scoring (8.6 ppg), hitting 37.2 percent from beyond the arc. Senior center **Tom Bellairs** (6-7, 220) leads Air Force in rebounds (4.2 rpg) and assists (2.9 apg).

The Falcons led the NCAA in scoring defense as of last March 4 and are currently giving up 57.6 points per game. They also ranked 18th in the nation in field goal percentage, 28th in three-point field goals

per game and 32nd in three-point percentage. After Saturday's games, Air Force ranks eighth in the MWC in scoring (58/0 ppg), third in three-point percentage (38.1), tied for first in three-pointers made per game (8.00), second in field goal percentage (48.8), first in assist/turnover ratio (1.16) and eighth in rebound margin (-9.1 rpg).

Head Coach Joe Scott

Joe Scott is 29-55 in his third season at Air Force. He led the Falcons to an 8-21 overall record in 2000-01, followed by a 9-19 record last season. His teams have gone 3-11 in the MWC both of his previous years.

Scott came to the the Academy from Princeton, where he spent eight years as an assistant under Hall-of-Famer Pete Carrill and Bill Carmody. Scott was a four-year letterman and a three-year starter at point guard for Princeton. Scott helped the Tigers to the 1984 Ivy League championship and a first round NCAA Tournament victory over San Diego.

Utah-Air Force Series Notes

- Utah and Air Force meet for the 47th time on Thursday. The series dates back to a 108-57 win by the Runnin' Utes on Dec. 23, 1965 in Salt Lake City.
- The Runnin' Utes have won four in a row and 14 of the last 15 games from the Falcons. The last four games in the series have been decided by an average of seven points with one game going to overtime. Utah swept the season series, winning 45-35 on Feb. 1 in Salt Lake City and 57-52 on March 3 in Colorado Springs, Colo.
- Utah leads the all-time series 39-7. Utah had won 10 in a row before Air Force defeated Utah in the second meeting in 2001 by a 71-60 margin on March 1 in Colorado Springs, Colo.
- Utah won its only previous game against Air Force on a neutral court, defeating the Falcons 74-65 on March 9, 2000 in the quarterfinals of the MWC Tournament in Las Vegas. The Utes have faced Air Force one other time in postseason play, getting a 66-64 win on March 6, 1985 in the second round of the WAC Tournament in the Huntsman Center.
- Utah's most decisive win over Air Force under **Rick Majerus** was 26 points (87-61) on Feb. 18, 1993 in Salt Lake City.
- Air Force has only one win against Utah with **Rick Majerus** on the bench. The Falcons won 91-89 on Feb. 19, 1994 in overtime in Colorado Springs. When Air Force won in 2000-01, Dick Hunsaker was serving as Utah's acting head coach.
- **Rick Majerus** is 21-1 against Air Force all-time and 20-1 during his tenure at Utah.
- **Joe Scott** is 1-5 against Utah and 0-4 head-to-head against Rick Majerus.

The Runnin' Rebels are 19-9 overall and finished tied for the Mountain West Conference with an 8-6 record. They lost the tie-breaker to Wyoming since they were swept in the season series. UNLV has won three of its last four entering the MWC Tournament. Since its loss at Utah (86-80 in OT) on Feb. 17, the Rebels defeated New Mexico (74-69) and Air Force (74-70) at home and Colorado State (73-67) on the road. After losing at Wyoming (69-66) on March 3, UNLV defeated San Diego State (83-72) last Saturday.

Senior guard **Marcus Banks** (6-2, 200) leads the team in scoring (20.5 ppg), shooting 52.2 percent from the field and 34.6 percent from three-point range (37-of-107). A first team all-MWC pick, he also leads UNLV assists (5.5 apg) and steals (7.9). Senior forward **Dalron Johnson** (6-10, 215) is second in scoring (15.7 ppg), shooting 85.6 percent at the free throw line, and leads UNLV in rebounds (6.7 rpg). Johnson earned second team all-MWC honors.

Head coach **Charlie Spoonhour** is 40-20 in his second season at UNLV and 359-171 in 18 seasons as a head coach. He led UNLV to the second round of the NIT last season.

During the regular season, UNLV led the MWC in scoring (76.2 ppg) and ranked seventh in scoring

defense (72.0 ppg) and sixth in rebound margin (-1.9 rpg). UNLV was also first in turnover margin (+2.89) and steals (8.89 spg).

Utah-UNLV Series Notes

- The all-time series between Utah and UNLV is tied 12-12 with Utah winning the last two meetings
- The Runnin' Utes swept the home-and-home series this season, winning 66-63 victory on Jan. 20 in Las Vegas and 86-80 in overtime on Feb. 17 in Salt Lake City.
- After Utah won the first game of the 2002 season series, UNLV took the final two games. UNLV won 72-64 on Feb. 11 during the regular season and 76-70 on March 8 in the semifinals of the MWC Tournament.
- UNLV has an 8-4 advantage in games played in Las Vegas and had won the last two games played at the Thomas & Mack Center before Utah won there in January.
- In postseason play, UNLV has a 3-0 advantage all-time over Utah and a 2-0 edge during the **Rick Majerus** era. In addition to their win in the 2002 MWC Tournament, the Rebels defeated the Utes 83-66 in the West Regional semifinals of the 1991 NCAA Tournament on March 21 in Seattle, Wash. UNLV also knocked off Utah 54-51 in the first round of the 1998 WAC Tournament on March 5 in Las Vegas.
- **Rick Majerus** is 6-5 against UNLV all-time with all of those games taking place during his tenure at Utah.
- **Charlie Spoonhour** is 2-3 against Utah, facing the Utes for the first time last season.

Scouting San Diego State

San Diego State is 15-12 overall and finished fifth in the Mountain West Conference with a 6-8 record. The Aztecs dropped their last two games of the regular season on the road, losing at Colorado State (102-89) on March 3 and at UNLV (83-72) on March 8.

Senior guard **Tony Bland** (6-5, 201) leads the team in scoring (16.7 ppg), and is also averaging 3.4 rebounds and 3.2 assists. Bland earned second team all-MWC honors this season. Junior forward **Aerick Sanders** (6-8, 204) is SDSU's top rebounder (7.9 rpg). Senior guard **Deandre Moore** (5-10, 191) is the team's assists leader (4.1 apg) and is shooting 39.8 percent from beyond the arc (38-of-93) to average 8.5 points per game.

During the regular season, the Aztecs ranked fourth in the Mountain West in scoring offense (72.7 ppg), fourth in scoring defense (69.8 ppg) and second in rebound margin (+5.1 rpg).

Head coach **Steve Fisher** is 55-61 in his fourth season at San Diego State and has a 239-143 career mark in 12 seasons. Last season, Fisher led the Aztecs to the Mountain West Conference Tournament title and their first NCAA Tournament appearance since 1984-85.

Utah-San Diego State Series Notes

- The Utes lead the all-time series 43-9 and have won 24 of the last 26. The Aztecs snapped Utah's 14-game winning streak in the series with a 58-56 win on Jan. 18 at Cox Arena. Before then, the Aztecs' last win over Utah was 76-73 on Jan. 22, 1994 in San Diego. The Utes won the second game of the season series 76-62 on Feb. 15 in Salt Lake City.
- Utah has a 2-1 advantage over San Diego State in games played on a neutral court.
- Utah is 4-1 against San Diego State in conference tournaments. The Utes and Aztecs have never met in the MWC Tournament. The two teams last met in postseason play on March 9, 1995 in the quarterfinals of the WAC Tournament in Albuquerque. The Utes won 72-63.
- **Rick Majerus** is 21-2 against San Diego State all-time with all of those games taking place during his tenure at Utah. Majerus is 5-3 against Steve Fisher.
- **Steve Fisher** is 3-7 against Utah, including a 1-7 mark while at SDSU.

Player Notes

Great Britton: Senior Forward Among MWC's Best All-Around Players

Senior forward **Britton Johnsen** (6-10, 210) has earned first team all-District 13 honors by the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) and second team all-Mountain West Conference honors this season. He was also one of 50 players named to the John R. Wooden Award Preseason All-America Team.

- Johnsen became the 29th player in school history to score 1,000 points against UNLV on Feb. 17. As he wraps-up his four-year career at Utah, Johnsen currently totals 1,051 points to rank 27th all-time at the U. He also has 570 rebounds in his career.
- This season, Johnsen appears in the top 20 in four MWC statistical categories, ranking tied for 17th in scoring (11.6 ppg), fifth in rebounds (6.7 rpg), 14th in field goal percentage (47.7) and 13th in steals (1.07 spg).
- Johnsen has led Utah in rebounding in 18 of the 27 games he's appeared in this season—including the first nine conference games Jan. 18-Feb. 17—averaging 6.7 boards per contest. Johnsen had a

season-best 13 rebounds against New Mexico on March 1, missing his career high by one.

- Johnsen has scored in double figures in 16 of the 27 games he's played in this season, leading Utah in scoring six times. Dating back to the 2000-01 season, Johnsen has scored in double figures in 54 of his last 82 contests.

- Johnsen reached the 20 points mark for the second time this season and the 10th time in his career against San Diego State on Feb. 15. He had 21 points, shooting 9-of-15 from the field, 2-of-4 from three-point range. Johnsen had his best scoring game since then last Saturday against Wyoming, scoring 17 points on 6-of-9 shooting from the field and a 5-of-7 effort at the line.

- The Murray, Utah, native had his fourth double-double of the season and the 11th of his career with 12 points and 12 rebounds against Brigham Young on Jan. 25. It was his seventh double-dip in the last 23 games he's played in dating back to last season.

- Last season, Johnsen was named Mountain West Conference Player of the Year and USBWA District 8 Player of the Year, and made the NABC/Pontiac All-District 13 first team. Johnsen was second on the team in scoring (12.6 ppg) and first in rebounding (6.3 rpg), ranking 13th and eighth in the Mountain West Conference in those categories, respectively. He also ranked 12th in field goal percentage (49.6) and 15th in three-point percentage (35.6) in the MWC.

Jacobson Stroking "J"s

Junior guard **Nick Jacobson** (6-4, 200), a third team all-Mountain West selection for the second consecutive season, is Utah's second-best scorer (13.1 ppg). Jacobson also paces the team in three-pointers made, hitting 68-of-162 (42.0 percent) from beyond the arc. He ranks 14th in the Mountain West in scoring, first in free throw percentage (86.0), seventh in three-point percentage and fourth in three-pointers made (2.34).

- Jacobson has scored in double-figures in 44 of the last 59 games dating back to last season, including 23 of the 29 games in 2002-03. He has led the Utes in scoring eight times this season.

- With his numbers this season, Jacobson ranks tied for second in three-pointers made (68) and third in three-point attempts (162) on the Ute single-season charts. Last season, Jacobson set the Utah single-season mark with 71 three-pointers, bettering the mark of 68 by Phil Dixon in 1991-92. He also ranked third in three-point attempts (160).

- Jacobson has already climbed into third place in career three-pointers made (176) and third in three-pointers attempted (419) at Utah. His career three-point percentage of 42.0 entering this season would have ranked fourth all-time at Utah. Jacobson became the 30th player in school history to score 1,000 points against Colorado State on March 6. He currently has 1,015 points in his career, needed three more to tie Pace Mannion for 29th place.

- Before missing his last three free throw attempts against Colorado State on March 6, Jacobson had hit 32 consecutive free throws dating back to Feb. 3. Jacobson hit 10-of-10 against Air Force on March 3, recording one of 13 games in Utah history where a player has had a perfect night at the line with at least 10 attempts. As a result, he moved up to 23rd in the NCAA in free throw percentage as March 4 and is currently shooting 86.0 percent.

- Before getting eight points against Colorado State on March 6, Jacobson had gone for at least 10 points in each of the previous 10 games, averaging 14.5 points per game over that stretch. He bounced back with 14 points against Wyoming last Saturday.

- Jacobson had a season-high 23 points against BYU on Feb. 24, going 7-of-12 from the field, 4-of-7 from three-point range and 5-of-5 from the free throw line.

- Against IPFW, Jacobson hit 6-of-7 three-pointers and 8-of-11 shots from the field to score a season-high 22 points. Jacobson tied the second-best single-game mark at Utah for three-pointers, coming up one short of the record of seven he shares with Phil Cullen and Phil Dixon. He reached 20 points for the seventh time in his career and the third time this season. Jacobson scored 21 points against both Utah State and UMass.

- In the final 2001-02 NCAA statistical rankings, Jacobson was 23rd in three-point percentage (44.4). The Fargo, N.D., native was named third team all-Mountain West and second team NABC/Pontiac All-District 13 in 2001-02. Jacobson led the team in scoring (13.0 ppg) and three-point percentage (44.4). He scored in double figures in 21 of the 30 games last season.

Frost Formidable Inside

Junior center **Tim Frost** (6-10, 236) has established himself as a strong interior presence in his first season with the Utes, earning second team all-Mountain West honors. He has paced the team in scoring in seven games and rebounds 10 times this season. Frost is the Utes' scoring leader (13.3 ppg), getting at least 20 points four times and reaching double figures in 21 games this season, including 14 of the last 17. He is also second in rebounds per game (4.9 rpg). Frost ranks 13th in the Mountain West in scoring and 13th in rebounds.

- An inside-outside threat, he is shooting 51.8 percent from the field to rank 10th in the MWC and 48.2 percent from outside the arc. Before missing his first attempt against Colorado State on March 6, Frost had made 18 consecutive free throws dating back to Feb. 10. He has made 27-of-30 in the last eight games and is shooting 72.2 percent at the line this season. He also has 22 blocked shots, including a season-high

of four against Colorado State on Feb. 8, to rank 11th in the conference.

- Over the last eight games, Frost has shot 57.1 percent from the field, 58.8 percent from three-point range (10-of-17) and 90.0 percent from the free throw line while averaging 15.6 points and 5.3 rebounds per game. Frost set a career-high with 23 points against Colorado State on March 6. He shot 8-of-16 from the field, 3-of-4 from three-point range and 4-of-5 at the line in 30 minutes, while also getting five rebounds and two blocked shots. Before then, Frost scored 22 points against UNLV on Feb. 17 and came back in the Utes' next game with 21 points and six rebounds in 29 minutes against BYU on Feb. 24. He had a league season-best seven rebounds against both New Mexico (March 1) and Air Force (March 3).

- The junior center has had two double-doubles as a Ute, taking him to eight for his career. Frost had 13 points and 10 rebounds against Pepperdine on Dec. 20, as well as 21 points and a season-high 11 rebounds against Saint Mary's on Jan. 6.

- The Klamath Falls, Ore., native spent the first two seasons of his college career at Portland. He was a first team all-West Coast Conference selection in his final season with the Pilots, averaging 14.9 points, 7.0 rebounds and 1.9 blocked shots per game.

Marc Makes His Mark Off The Bench

Sophomore guard **Marc Jackson** (6-1, 177) has been putting up impressive numbers off the bench, keying Utah's 11-3 record in the Mountain West Conference season. As a result, he was named second team all-Mountain West Conference.

- Jackson was Utah's third-most productive scorer in conference action, scoring in double figures in the first eight games and 10 of 14 overall. In MWC play, Jackson ranks 15th among the league's players in scoring (13.4 ppg), 12th in field goal percentage (51.1), third in three-point percentage (47.7) by hitting 21-of-44, seventh in free throw percentage (84.3), second in assists (3.43 apg), and fourth in assists/turnover ratio (1.60) in 25.6 minutes per game.

- Jackson is tied for the lead in the Mountain West Conference in overall three-point percentage (45.6) and is third in free throw percentage (85.1). He also ranked 30th in the NCAA in free throw percentage as of Tuesday. At one point this season, he made 19 consecutive free throws (Jan. 20-Feb. 3), hitting his last one against UNLV, all 13 against BYU, all four against Air Force and his first against New Mexico.

- Jackson had his 11th double-figure scoring game of the season with 11 points against Wyoming on March 8. He also had five assists to miss his career-best by one.

- The Salt Lake City native had a career-high 21 points against Wyoming on Feb. 10. He shot 6-of-10 from the field, 3-of-4 from three-point range and 6-of-6 at the free throw line against the Cowboys.

- Jackson was named the Mountain West Conference Player of the Week (Jan. 19-25) for his performances against UNLV and Brigham Young. In 25 minutes played in each contest, he averaged 19.0 points, 4.0 rebounds and 3.5 assists, while shooting 62 percent (8-of-13) from the field and 91 percent (20-of-22) from the free throw line.

Caton Earns Academic All-District Recognition

Senior forward **Trace Caton** has been named to the 2002-03 Verizon Academic All-District VIII team. Caton was joined on the team by Jason Blair of San Diego, Carl English of Hawaii, Shawn Redhage of Arizona State and Blake Stepp of Gonzaga.

Caton, the Utes' team captain, also earned all-Mountain West Conference honorable mention. He has started all 29 games this season, averaging 5.1 points, 2.6 rebounds and 2.1 assists in 29.1 minutes per game. The Alamosa, Colo., native has a 3.71 GPA in Spanish and has regularly appeared on the Dean's List and honor roll.

Caton scored a career-high 20 points against Wyoming in his last home game last Saturday. He shot 7-of-11 from the field and 5-of-6 from three-point range in 32 minutes.

Rating the Rookies

With only four lettermen returning from last season and 10 scholarship players on the roster, Rick Majerus has played his freshmen extensively this season. Here's a breakdown of how the quartet of **Richard Chaney** (G/F, 6-4, 186), **Tim Drisdom** (G, 6-3, 203), **Chris Jackson** (C, 6-11, 242) and **Bryant Markson** (F, 6-6, 182) has been producing.

- Chaney (5.5 ppg) ranks fifth, Drisdom (5.0 ppg) seventh and Markson (3.7 ppg) eighth on the team in scoring. Chaney is also third on the team in rebounding (3.3 rpg).

- Drisdom, who's started every game at point guard, leads the Utes in assists (3.2 apg) and is fourth in rebounding (3.0 rpg). He is also shooting 45.5 percent from three-point range, making 25-of-55. In conference play, Drisdom had 38 assists to 22 turnovers (1.73 ratio)

- Chaney had his best offensive game in Mountain West play with 14 points in 15 minutes against New Mexico on March 1. He hit 6-of-8 shots and 2-of-4 three-pointers, and also contributed five rebounds. Chaney also had five rebounds in 24 minutes against Air Force on March 3.

- Drisdom had his second-best scoring game in conference play with 11 points against New Mexico on March 1, hitting 3-of-6 three-pointers and both free throws. He also had five rebounds. Drisdom came up big in Utah's overtime win over UNLV on Feb. 17. The Artesia, Calif., native had a career-high 17 points

on a perfect shooting night, hitting four field goals, three three-pointers and six free throws in 20 minutes. He scored nine of his points in the overtime period and did an excellent defensive job on the Rebels' leading scorer, Marcus Banks.

- Markson scored six points against both Air Force and Colorado State on March 3 and 6. In the two games, he has shot 5-of-6 from the field and 2-of-2 at the line.

Drisdorn Moving Up The Freshman Charts

With one regular-season game remaining, point guard **Tim Drisdorn** (6-3, 203) is moving up the all-time freshman charts at Utah. He has started every game this season, averaging 21.4 minutes per game.

- Drisdorn has 25 three-pointers, tied with **Trace Caton** (1997-98) for fifth place. He needs five more to tie Terry Preston (1993-94) for fourth place. If he maintains his current three-point percentage of 45.5 he will move into third place, ahead of **Keith Van Horn** (1993-94), who shot 44.3 percent as a rookie.

- With 93 assists, Drisdorn is in third place behind **Josh Grant's** (1988-89) total of 114. His average of 3.2 assists per game is fourth-best, behind Grant's 3.5 assists per game.

- Drisdorn's 21 steals are three away from tying **Mitch Smith** (1985-86) and **Jimmy Soto** (1989-90) for fourth place with 24.

Koford Returns To Sender

Senior center **Cameron Koford** (7-0, 227) may only be averaging 12.3 minutes per game, but he has made his presence felt on defense as a shot blocker. As a case in point, Koford had three blocked shots in 13 minutes against Wyoming on March 8.

- Koford, with 35 blocked shots this season, has moved into eighth place on the Ute single-season charts and is two away from tying **Keith Van Horn** (1996-97) for seventh place.

- With 58 blocked shots in his three-year Utah career, Koford has overtaken **Paul Afeaki** (1990-92) for 10th place and needs six more to tie **Phil Cullen** (1998-02) for ninth place.

Utes Seeing 20/20 Once Again

Utah has hit the 20-wins mark for the 11th time in 14 years under **Rick Majerus'** direction. Two of the years the Utes failed to get 20 wins, Majerus did not coach the entire season. In fact, the Utes have won 20 games each of the past eight seasons with Majerus on the bench. He missed all but the first game of the 2000-01 season when Utah finished 19-12.

- Majerus registered his 300th career victory at Utah with a 71-66 win over Colorado State on Feb. 8. He joined just two other coaches in Utah basketball history with 300 wins.

- Two nights later, Majerus recorded the 400th victory of his career with a 69-56 win at Wyoming on Feb. 10. He became the 16th-fastest to the 400 career wins mark (538 games) and just the 12th coach to reach 400 wins in 19 seasons or less.

Inside the Numbers

- In 11 of the 23 wins, Utah has held its opponent to under 40 percent shooting from the field. The Utes have outshot their opponents 47.8 to 40.7 percent in their wins. In their six losses, the Utes have been outshot 43.8 to 42.0 percent.

- The Utes have been even with or

had the advantage over their opponents on the boards in 19 of the 23 wins. In their wins, the Utes have outrebounded the opponents by an average of 34.1 to 29.2. Utah had a season-best +16 advantage in its wins over Pepperdine (48-32) on Dec. 20 and Air Force (36-20) on Feb. 1. In three of the six losses, Utah has been outrebounded. Its average rebounding deficit in losses is 33.5 to 32.3.

- Utah has gone 22-1 when leading with 5:00 remaining in the second half this season. The only time the Utes relinquished a lead at that stage in the game was against Colorado State on March 6. The Utes are also 20-0 when leading at halftime, 2-4 when trailing at the half and 3-5 when trailing or tied after 20 minutes. Utah's win over UNLV on Jan. 20 was its first when trailing at the half this season. The U. also came back from a 35-32 halftime deficit at Colorado State. The Utes won their only game when trailing with 5:00 remaining against Air Force on Feb. 1.

- The Utes have had the advantage at the free throw line in their 22 wins, making 463 trips to the line compared to 427 for the opponents and shooting 73.0 to 67.7 percent. In the six losses, the opposite has been the case with the opponents outshooting Utah at the free throw line 214 attempts to 91, and making 148 (69.2 percent) to 58 (64.8 percent). In the Utes' loss at New Mexico on March 1, the Lobos went 40-of-53 at the free throw line. Utah is 16-1 when it has had as many or more free throw attempts than its opponents this season.

Utah Ranked In Top 25 For Third Straight Week March 3

The Runnin' Utes were ranked among the top 25 teams in the nation by ESPN/USA Today on March 3 after appearing in both polls the previous week. Utah held steady at No. 23 in the ESPN/USA Today poll with 89 points. In the Associated Press poll released on March 3, Utah fell five spots to No. 27 with 118 points.

It was the third consecutive week Utah was been ranked after cracking the AP Top 25 on Feb. 17. When the Runnin' Utes broke into the AP poll, it was the first time they were in the Top 25 since early in the 2000-01 season. Utah was last ranked the week of Dec. 4, 2000 when it was 22nd in both the AP and ESPN/USA Today polls.

From Beyond The Arc

Utah is shooting 38.7 percent from three-point range and ranked 27th in the NCAA as of March 4. The Utes have hit at least 40 percent of their long-range shots 15 times and 50 percent or better on six occasions. Utah is 13-2 when shooting at least 40 percent from three-point land this season.

- Four Utes are shooting over 40 percent from beyond the arc: **Tim Frost** (48.2), **Marc Jackson** (45.6), **Tim Drisdorn** (45.5) and **Nick Jacobson** (42.0).

- Utah tied a season-best effort from three-point range against Wyoming on Feb. 10, connecting on 57.1 percent (8-of-14) from beyond the arc.

- Utah also shot a season-best 57.1 percent (8-of-14) from three-point range against Winthrop. It was the Utes' best effort since hitting 66.7 percent (12-of-18) last season at New Mexico on Jan. 21.

- The Utes have hit 50.0 percent from long range three times, making 4-of-8 against Air Force on March 3, 12-of-24 against New Mexico on Feb. 3 and 5-of-10 against Massachusetts on Nov. 26 in the Maui Invitational.

- The Utes shot 80.0 percent (8-of-10) from three-point range in the first half against IPFW, which was the fourth-best mark for a half in school history. Utah's 14 three-pointers made in the entire game tied the second-best effort all-time at the U. The Utes shot 56.0 percent from three-point range in 25 attempts.

- Utah has recorded two of the top three single-game marks for three-point attempts in school history this season. The Utes put up 40 treys at New Mexico on March 3, topping the former record of 34 against San Diego State on Jan. 16, 1999. Utah also had 32 three-point attempts against Northern Iowa on Dec. 14 to notch the third-best mark in school history.

Getting Defensive

One of the trademarks of a Utah team during the **Rick Majerus** era is a stifling half-court defense. Since 1989-90, Utah has ranked in the top 30 in the nation 10 times in scoring defense, nine times in rebound margin, eight times in field goal percentage defense and eight times in scoring margin.

- This season, Utah ranked 11th in the NCAA in scoring defense as of March 4 and is currently giving up 60.6 points per game.

- The Utes have held 16 teams under 60 points this season and four teams under 50 points.

- Twelve opponents have shot under 40 percent from the field this season. The only team to defeat Utah when shooting under 40 percent is New Mexico on March 1 when the Lobos shot 38.1 percent. However, the Lobos made 40-of-53 free throws.

- Air Force on March 3 (52.9) and Colorado State on Feb. 8 (50.0) are the only teams to shoot 50 percent or better from the field on Utah in 2002-03. The Utes won both of those games.

- Utah has not allowed an opponent to score 80 points in 91 consecutive games that have ended in regulation. The last team to score 80 points on the Utes in a 40-minute game was Wyoming (88-61) on Feb. 28, 2000 in Laramie, Wyo.

Knockin' Them Down From The Line

In its last eight games, Utah has shot 85.4 percent from the free throw line, going 134-of-157. As a result, Utah has improved from a rough start at the charity stripe to 71.7 percent on the season and shot 75.5 percent in Mountain West Conference play.

- The Utes had a season-best effort (in games with over 10 attempts) from the free throw line to salt away their overtime win against UNLV on Feb. 17. Utah shot 92.3 percent, hitting 24-of-26. The Utes hit all 10 free throws in the overtime period and went 10-of-11 in the second half. As a result, Utah scored a season-high 86 points against the Rebels.

- Utah came back in its next game on Feb. 24 to hit 92.0 percent from the line against BYU on Feb. 24. The Utes hit 23-of-25 free throws, including all eight in the last minute.

- After hitting 7-of-7 free throws against New Mexico, the Utes made 17-of-19 free throws at Air Force on March 3. In the final 3:44 versus the Falcons, the U. hit 12-of-13 at the line.

Noting The Season

- Utah equaled a season-high with 86 points against Wyoming on March 8. The Utes also shot 52.8 percent from the field in that game, improving to 10-1 when they shoot 50 percent or better this season.

- The Utes are 17-2 this season with a positive or equal assist/turnover ratio. Utah had a season-low six turnovers in its win over Wyoming on March 8. Utah had had fewer than 10 turnovers in six games this season.

- The Utes' five road victories in conference play is its most since being a member of the Mountain West and ties the best mark in league history. The Utes had four road wins in 2002 for its previous best total. Wyoming and BYU also have the conference's best road record for a season. The Cowboys had five road wins in 2002 while BYU reached that mark in 2003.

- The Runnin' Utes road record over the last four years in the Mountain West Conference is 15-13, tying Wyoming for the best mark over that period.

- Utah swept the Colorado State/Wyoming road trip for the first time since the 1975-76 season. Utah won at both Colorado State and Wyoming during the 1990-91 season; however, that year the two games weren't played as one trip.

- Air Force's 35 points on Feb. 1 equalled the lowest mark by an opponent during the **Rick Majerus** era. Saint Mary's scored 35 points on Jan. 7, 2002 to establish the record. The Falcons also set season-low marks by a Ute opponent for field goals made (13) and field goal attempts (34).

- Utah set season lows in scoring (45 points) and field goals (15) against Air Force on Feb. 1.

- In their loss at San Diego State on Jan. 18, the Utes had their worst shooting day of the season, hitting just 35.3 percent from the field (18-of-51).

- Utah had a season-best 24 assists against IPFW on 29 baskets. Freshman point guard **Tim Drisdorn** led the effort with a career-best six assists.

- Utah defeated Alabama, then ranked No.1 by the Associated Press and No. 3 by ESPN/USA Today, 51-49 on Dec. 30 in the Huntsman Center. The Crimson Tide were the highest-ranked team to ever play the Utes in the Huntsman Center. The Utes had unseated a top-ranked team once before under **Rick Majerus**, defeating North Carolina 65-59 on March 28, 1998 in the national semifinals at the Alamodome in San Antonio.

- Utah is 1-1 against ranked teams this season, falling to No. 20 Gonzaga

71-52 on Nov. 25 in the first round of the Maui Invitational.

- With their win over Alabama on Dec. 30, the Runnin' Utes recorded the 1,500th win in the history of Utah Basketball. Utah became just the 13th NCAA Division I program with 1,500 wins.
- Utah held San Diego to just 12.5 percent from three-point range, its best defensive effort from long range this season.
- Winthrop shot 27.3 percent (15-for-55) from the field, which was the sixth-worst mark by a Ute opponent all-time. It was the Utes' best defensive effort since Concordia shot 20.3 percent, the lowest mark by a Ute opponent all-time, on Dec. 26, 2000.

Utes Tough At Home In The Huntsman Center

Utah is 195-18 (.915) in the Huntsman Center during the Majerus era and has never lost back-to-back home games. With Majerus on the bench, taking out the games he missed during the 1989-90 and 2000-01 seasons, the Utes are 177-13 (.932) at home.

- The Utes have won 134 of their last 142 games in the Jon M. Huntsman Center, including a 14-2 mark last season and a 15-1 record this season. Before the loss to Colorado State on March 6, Utah had won 16 consecutive home games, which was tied for the ninth-longest in the nation.
- In conference home games over the last nine years, Utah is 65-3 (.956), which is the best record in the nation over that time span.
- Utah has gone unbeaten seven times in the 33-year history of the Jon M. Huntsman Center. Six of those undefeated home seasons have come under **Rick Majerus**: 1990-91 (16-0), 1992-93 (15-0), 1994-95 (15-0), 1997-98 (13-0), 1998-99 (14-0) and 1999-2000 (17-0).
- The Utes' all-time record in the Huntsman Center is 427-89. Utah got its 425th win in the history of the facility on Feb. 17 with an 86-80 overtime win against UNLV.

It's Not How You Start . . .

Utah may have gotten off to a 5-3 start this season; however, dropping a few games early hasn't been a cause for concern over the last few years. Here's a breakdown of Utah's starts, following winning streaks, and finishes in the last four seasons.

Basketball Times Ranks Runnin' Utes Top 10 Program

A study by Jack Styczynski in the November issue of *Basketball Times* rated Utah ninth among the top programs in the nation. The study used a variety of criteria, including winning percentage over the past 10 years, number of former players in the NBA at the conclusion of the 2001-02 season, graduation rate, academic reputation, coaching and "cleanliness" of the program.

A total of 28 schools were ranked. Duke was rated No.1, followed by Stanford, Kansas, Michigan State, North Carolina, Arizona, Xavier, Gonzaga, Utah and Kentucky.

Huntsman Center to Host NCAA's in 2003 and 2006

The NCAA Men's Basketball Tournament returns to the University of Utah's Jon M. Huntsman Center this spring for its 12th booking in 19 years with first and second round games March 20 and 22. The NCAA also recently announced that the Huntsman Center will host first and second round tournament games in 2006. The JMHC ranks third among the nation's arenas for most NCAA Tournament basketball games hosted, with 69 games having been played in the facility.

Long recognized as a site of championships, the Huntsman Center played host to the 1979 NCAA Basketball Championship "Dream Match-Up" featuring Indiana State's Larry Bird and Michigan State's Magic Johnson—deemed one of the most successful Final Fours ever held. The men's NCAA regional tournament received a Huntsman Center booking in 1984, '85, and '87, and the NCAA first and second rounds took place in the arena in 1988, '89, '90, '91, '93, '95, '97 and 2000.

Utes Picked Third in Mountain West Preseason Poll

Utah placed third in the Mountain West Conference preseason media poll, voted on by the league's media members.

The Utes received 111 points and one first-place vote. Wyoming was picked for the second straight year to win the Mountain West title with 141 points and 12 of the possible 19 first-place votes. UNLV was second in the poll with 126 points and five first-place votes. BYU, coming in behind the Utes in fourth place, received the remaining first-place vote and 99 points. San Diego State (82), which won the 2002 MWC Tournament championship, came in fifth, followed by Colorado State (56), New Mexico (40) and Air Force (29).

Utah senior forward **Britton Johnsen** was one of five players named pre-season all-Mountain West. He was joined by Wyoming senior Marcus Bailey, who was tabbed the top returning player. Also making the team were Ruben Douglas of New Mexico, and UNLV's Marcus Banks and Dalron Johnson. Demetrius Hunter of UNLV was voted the league's top newcomer.

Utah Ranked Among Nation's Top 20 Athletic Programs

The University of Utah was listed in the *U.S. News & World Report* College Sports Honor Roll, which appeared in the March 18, 2002 edition. The College Sports Honor Roll recognized 20 schools with the best overall rankings across four categories of achievement. Information on gender equity, number of varsity sports offered and wins and losses were collected from the schools' athletic departments. Data on graduation rates and sanctions for NCAA rule-breaking were collected from the NCAA's web site. Utah and Stanford were the only two schools located west of the Mississippi River that were listed.
