### WAKE FOREST HOSTS CITY-RIVAL WINSTON-SALEM STATE

Wake Forest and Winston-Salem State are set to battle for city supremacy as the Demon Deacons and Rams will meet in the fourth annual Twin City Shootout on Tuesday, Nov. 24. Tipoff is scheduled for 7:30 p.m. at the Joel Coliseum in Winston-Salem. The game will be available on the Wake Forest ISP Sports Radio Network.

The Deacons are a perfect 3-0 on the season and are coming off an 83-60 defeat of Triad-rival High Point last Wednesday. Wake Forest was idle last weekend and will sandwich the Thanksgiving holiday with Tuesday's game and a home matchup vs. William & Mary on Saturday.

Preseason All-American Al-Farouq Aminu has led the Deacons thus far this year. Aminu is averaging a double-double with 23.7 points and 10.7 rebounds per game. He has shot 68.6 percent from the field, including a 4-for-8 mark from three-point range, on the year.

Point guard Ishmael Smith is averaging 10.3 points and 4.3 assists per game, while center Chas McFarland has played well averaging 8.3 points and 7.7 rebounds per contest. Guard L.D. Williams has led the defensive effort with 10 steals in three games this season.

Winston-Salem State is 1-3 following its 94-57 defeat of Atlanta Christian College at home last Friday. The Rams opened the year with three straight losses in the Basketball Travelers Invitational in Eugene, Ore.

Wake Forest leads the all-time series with Winston-Salem State, 3-0. The Deacons took down the Rams, 62-31, in last season's matchup.

### WAKE FOREST UNBEATEN AT JOEL IN NOVEMBER

■ Since the Joel Coliseum opened prior to the 1989-90 season, Wake Forest has gone a perfect 49-0 in home games played at the venue in the month of November.

## LAST TIME OUT

Wake Forest fell behind early but fought back to pull off an 83-60 defeat of Triad-rival High Point on Wednesday, Nov. 18, in Winston-Salem.

The Panthers were up by as many as nine (24-15 at the 11:25 mark) in the first half, but the Deacons clawed their way back, outscoring HPU 20-11 over the next eight minutes to pull even at 35-35. Wake took a 42-39 lead into halftime.

The Deacons extended their lead with an 11-2 run early in the second half. Wake Forest used an 18-0 run over an eight-minute stretch to take charge with a 71-46 advantage at the 6:32 mark of the period. High Point managed to score on just three of its first 25 possessions of the second half.

Al-Farouq Aminu led the Deacons with a double-double of 22 points on 8-of-10 shooting and 10 rebounds. Chas McFarland also posted a double-double with 11 points and a game-high 12 boards.

Ishmael Smith scored 13 points and dished out five assists, while C.J. Harris came off the bench to tally 12 points on 5-of-6 shooting.

As a team, the Deacons shot 51.9 percent from the floor. The Panthers shot 35.1 percent for the game.

Wake Forest dominated the paint, outscoring High Point 44-10. The Panthers made 9-of-23 from long distance, while the Deacons went 1-for-5 from beyond the arc.

## DOUBLE DOUBLE-DOUBLES

Sophomore Al-Farouq Aminu and senior Chas McFarland both posted double-doubles in Wake Forest's 83-60 defeat of High Point on Nov. 18. Aminu had 22 points and 10 rebounds, while McFarland finished with 11 points and 12 boards.

For Aminu, it was his second double-double of the season and the 12th of his career.

For McFarland, the performance was his first double-double of the young season and the fourth of his career.

It also marked the first time since Jan. 28, 2009, vs. Duke that two Deacons posted double-doubles in the same game. In that contest, Aminu and James Johnson accomplished the feat to help Wake Forest upset No. 1-ranked Duke.

## WAKE FOREST UNBEATEN AT JOEL IN NOVEMBER

Wake Forest is looking for win No. 50 in November games at the Joel Coliseum. The Deacons are 49-0 in home games played at the venue in the month of November.

Since the Joel Coliseum opened prior to the 1989-90 season, the Deacons have never tasted defeat on their home court in November. Wake Forest has won as many as five home November games in one season (2005-06) and had two straight seasons (1992-93 & 1993-94) without a home November contest.

## DEACONS EXTEND HOME NON-CONF. STREAK TO 22

With their 83-60 defeat of High Point last week, the Deacons pushed their home non-conference winning streak to 22 games.

Wake Forest's last non-conference loss at the Joel Coliseum was an 87-86 setback to Georgia on Dec. 2, 2006.

The Deacons have won 28 of their last 29 home non-conference games since beating Princeton on Dec. 17, 2005.

Wake has never lost in 41 tries at the Joel Coliseum against an in-state, non-conference opponent.

Head coach Dino Gaudio is 18-0 at home against non-conference opponents, including a 2-0 mark this season.

## SMITH CONTINUES SCORING BARRAGE FROM 08-09

Senior guard Ishmael Smith has the reputation of being a pass-first point guard. However, recent history shows that Smith can create for himself as well. Smith put on a scoring barrage over the last nine games of 2008-09 and has continued that into this season.

Smith scored in double figures in seven of his final nine contests last season. Included in that stretch was an 18-point performance in a Feb. 26, 2009, win against NC State. The total matched his career-best for a regulation game (12/23/07 vs. Virginia Tech).

In three games this season, Smith has scored in double figures twice including 14 against East Carolina and 13 against High Point.

Over his last 12 games (since the Florida State game last year), Smith has averaged 11.0 points per contest and has shot 47.2 percent (51-of-108) from the field.

## DEACONS AMONG ACC LEADERS

Four Deacons find themselves ranked among the ACC statistical leaders early in the season.

Sophomore forward Al-Farouq Aminu ranks in the top six in the ACC in five different categories. Aminu leads the league in scoring (23.3) and ranks third in both rebounding (10.7) and field goal percentage (.686). Aminu is also fourth in offensive rebounds (4.3) and sixth in defensive rebounds (6.3).

Senior guard L.D. Williams has shown his defensive prowess this season. A first team ACC All-Defensive honoree last season, Williams currently ranks third in the conference with 3.3 steals per game.

Senior guard Ishmael Smith has also shown a penchant for thievery this year, ranking in a tie for sixth with 2.3 steals per contest. Smith is also just outside the top 10 in assists with 4.3 per game.

Senior center Chas McFarland has averaged 7.7 rebounds per game this year to rank 14th in the ACC.

## AMINU NAMED ACC PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Forward Al-Farouq Aminu was named the ACC Player of the Week after averaging 24 points and 11 rebounds in the Demon Deacons' two wins on the season's opening weekend.

Aminu took home the league's first weekly honor of the season after leading Wake Forest to wins over Oral Roberts and East Carolina last week.

In a 76-56 season-opening win over ORU on Nov. 13, Aminu posted a double-double of 25 points and 13 rebounds. He shot 8-for-13 from the field, including a 3-for-5 mark from beyond the arc. Aminu was 6-of-7 at the foul line and also had an assist, block and steal each.

Aminu's 25 points and 13 rebounds were one off his career high in each category. It was his 11th career double-double after posting 10 as a freshman last season.

In an 89-58 win over East Carolina at the Greensboro Coliseum on Nov. 15, Aminu led Wake Forest with 23 points and nine rebounds. Six of Aminu's rebounds came on the offensive end. He went 8-for-12 from the field and was 1-of-2 from three-point range. Aminu also added three steals, two assists and was 6-of-8 at the foul line.

On the week, Aminu shot 64.0 percent (16-of-25) from the floor and was 4-of-7 from three-point range (57.1 percent).

This is the sixth ACC weekly honor of Aminu's career after he was named Rookie of the Week a school-record five times last season.

## DEACONS RECEIVING VOTES IN NATIONAL POLLS

Wake Forest is receiving votes in both the Associated Press and ESPN/USA Today Coaches polls. The Deacons were listed just outside the top 25 at No. 27 in the latest coaches poll.

Wake received 40 points in the coaches poll, 16 points behind Georgia Tech for the 25th spot. The Deacons got 49 points in this week's AP Poll and were listed at No. 35--a four-spot and 10-point drop from the previous rankings.

In the preseason polls, Wake Forest received 50 votes from the AP and 15 from the coaches. The Sporting News ranked Wake Forest No. 18 in its preseason poll.

Last season, the Deacons were ranked No. 21 in the AP preseason poll and No. 24 in the preseason coaches poll.

Wake Forest is one of eight ACC teams that are either ranked or receiving votes in the top 25. Duke (#7 AP/#7 Coaches), North Carolina (11/12), Clemson (19/19), Maryland (21/22) and Georgia Tech (RV/25) are in the top 25. Florida State, Miami and Wake are receiving votes in both polls.

## WAKE HAS HOME COURT ADVANTAGE

The Demon Deacons have been almost unbeatable at home in their third season under head coach Dino Gaudio. Wake Forest is a combined 31-3 (.912) at the Lawrence Joel Coliseum since the start of the 2007-08 season.

Last season, the Deacons went 14-1 at the Joel, which included two wins over top three-ranked competition. Wake Forest outscored the opposition by almost 18 points per game at home in 2008-09.

The Deacons have won 35 of their last 38 games at the arena since Feb. 6, 2007.

In their 21st season playing at the Joel, the Deacons are 257-56 (.821) all-time in the venue including a 110-48 (.696) mark against ACC opponents and a 147-8 (.948) mark against non-conference foes.

## AMINU NAMED PRESEASON ALL-AMERICAN

Sophomore forward Al-Farouq Aminu was named a Preseason All-American by a number of publications.

Aminu was named first team Preseason All-America by CBSsports.com, while FoxSports.com listed Aminu on its preseason second team.

Aminu was also chosen as a preseason candidate for the prestigious John R. Wooden Award, which goes annually to college basketball's top player, and for the Naismith Trophy, which is also presented to college basketball's top player.

Aminu entered the 2009-10 campaign as the Deacons' leading returning scorer and rebounder. The Norcross, Ga. native averaged 12.9 points and 8.2 rebounds as a freshman in 2008-09. Aminu was a unanimous selection to the ACC All-Freshman Team and was tabbed by multiple publications as the top rookie in the conference last season.

## THREE MAKE DEACON DEBUTS

A trio of Deacons made their collegiate debuts on the season's opening weekend. Sophomore junior college transfer Konner Tucker and freshmen C.J. Harris and Ari Stewart all debuted in Wake Forest's win over Oral Roberts on Friday.

Stewart had an impressive showing, scoring 11 points to go along with three rebounds. He shot 4-of-8 from the field, including a 2-for-5 mark from three-point range.

Harris provided productive minutes off the bench as well, scoring eight points and dishing out a team-high four assists. He made all three of his field goal attempts on the night.

Tucker saw seven minutes of action in his debut but did not register any statistics. The sharp-shooting guard, however, shined in Wake's win over East Carolina on Sunday. Tucker scored seven points and hit both of his three-point attempts against the Pirates.

## WAKE FOREST IN SEASON OPENERS

Following its defeat of Oral Roberts on Nov. 13, Wake Forest has now won 16 consecutive season openers dating back to the 1994-95 season. The Deacons are 82-12 all-time in season openers. The last time Wake lost a season opener came on Nov. 25, 1993, when then-freshman Tim Duncan and the Deacs lost at Alaska-Anchorage, 70-68, in the Great Alaska Shootout.

Wake has now won 22 straight home openers since the 1988-89 campaign. The last time the Deacs fell in a home opener came on Nov. 28, 1988, when Richmond posted a 74-61 defeat of Wake Forest at Memorial Coliseum in Winston-Salem. It was Wake Forest's second straight season-opening loss after falling to Siena the year before.

## WAKE FOREST IN ROAD OPENERS

The East Carolina game on Nov. 15 at the Greensboro Coliseum marked Wake Forest's first road game of the season. With its 89-58 win, Wake Forest has now won 13 of its 14 first road games since 1996-97.

The last time the Deacons fell in their first contest away from home was in 2004-05 when No. 1-ranked Wake fell, 91-73, at No. 5-ranked Illinois in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge.

## WAKE HAS VETERAN SQUAD IN 2009-10

In what has been a rarity in Winston-Salem the past few seasons, Wake Forest has veterans littering its roster in 2009-10. In terms of scholarship players, the Deacons returned four seniors, one junior and three sophomores.

The last time Wake Forest had more than two scholarship seniors on its roster was in 2005-06 when Chris Ellis, Justin Gray, Trent Strickland and Eric Williams led the Deacons.

Wake Forest had two scholarship seniors in 2006-07 (Michael Drum, Kyle Visser) and one in each 2007-08 (Cameron Stanley) and 2008-09 (Harvey Hale).

## WAKE PICKED SIXTH IN PRESEASON ACC POLL

Wake Forest was picked to finish sixth in the Atlantic Coast Conference this season by a vote of the media members attending the 2009 ACC Operation Basketball event on October 25 at the Grandover Resort & Conference Center.

Wake, coming off a 24-7 campaign in 2008-09, received 315 points and one first-place vote in the preseason poll.

The Deacons finished a mere one point ahead of Florida State for sixth in the poll.

This marks the 10th time in the past 12 preseason polls that Wake Forest has been picked to finish in the top half of the ACC.

The last time the Deacons were picked sixth in the preseason ACC poll was prior to the 2002-03 season. Wake went on to win the conference regular season title that year.

Last season, the Deacs were picked third in the preseason poll and finished in a tie for second in the final standings.

The Deacons were shut out of the preseason All-ACC team for the fourth straight season.

## GAUDIO QUICKLY COLLECTING WINS

Head coach Dino Gaudio went 41-20 (.672) in his first two seasons at the helm of the Demon Deacon basketball program. Gaudio's 41 wins were the second-most by a head coach in his first two years at Wake Forest.

Gaudio is second only to longtime mentor Skip Prosser, who went 46-19 (.708) in his first two seasons on the Wake Forest bench from 2001-03.

When the Deacons rose to the No. 1 national ranking on Jan. 19, 2009, Gaudio became the third-fastest head coach in ACC history to take his team to the top spot in the rankings. Gaudio needed just 46 games at Wake Forest to accomplish the feat.

## DEACON DEFENSE KEEPS IMPROVING

Since taking the reigns of the Deacon basketball program in 2007-08, head coach Dino Gaudio has put an increased emphasis on defense.

Gaudio and the coaching staff installed a new defensive system prior to the 2007-08 season with the goal of becoming one of the stingiest teams in the country. The change paid dividends as Wake Forest went from finishing last in the ACC in field goal percentage defense in 2006-07 to sixth in 2007-08 and to third in 2008-09.

Last season, the Deacons ranked 31st in the country in field goal percentage defense, as opponents shot 39.8 percent from the field. That mark included an ACC-low 30.4 percent from three-point range. The Deacons ranked 17th nationally in three-point percentage defense.

A bevy of blockeds and steals also helped the Deacon defense in 2008-09. Wake averaged 5.7 blocks per game to rank third in the ACC and 12th in the country. The Deacs were fourth in the ACC and 36th nationally with 8.3 steals per game.

## DEACONS ADD FIVE PLAYERS TO ROSTER

Five non-scholarship student-athletes were added to Wake Forest's 2009-10 roster last month.

Joining the Demon Deacons were guards Phaethon Bolton (Greenwich, Conn./Brunswick School), Kyle Fowler (Wheaton, Ill./Wheaton North HS) and Aaron Ingle (Weaverville, N.C./Christ School) and forwards Ryan Keenan (Bellaire, Texas/Westbury Christian School) and Denmore McDermott (Baltimore, Md./St. Paul's School for Boys).

Wake Forest has 17 players, including 11 on scholarship, on its 2009-10 roster. The six non-scholarship players serve in an invaluable role as the Deacons' scout team in practice.

## INAUGURAL SKIP PROSSER CLASSIC

Wake Forest and Xavier will meet in the inaugural game of the Skip Prosser Classic on Jan. 3, 2010, at the Lawrence Joel Coliseum in Winston-Salem.

The inaugural game, which will be televised nationally on Fox Sports Net, begins a 10-year series between the Demon Deacons and Musketeers. Over the course of the series, five games will be played at Wake Forest and five at Xavier.

Prosser was the head coach at Xavier from 1994-2001 and at Wake Forest from 2001 until his death in 2007.

Demon Deacon coaches Dino Gaudio, Jeff Battle and Dave Wojcik have each spent time as a coach at Xavier during their respective careers. Wake Forest Director of Basketball Operations Walt Corbean played at Xavier from 1985-87.

## COACHING STAFF CHANGES

Wake Forest welcomed three new members of its coaching staff into the fold this year. Rusty LaRue and Dave Wojcik joined the Deacons as assistant coaches, while Mike Lepore came on as the assistant coordinator of operations.

LaRue is a former Deacon standout who was inducted into the Wake Forest Sports Hall of Fame in 2008. He is perhaps the most prolific multi-sport athlete in the modern history of the school after earning varsity letters in basketball, baseball and football in the same year.

LaRue played professional basketball for eight seasons and won an NBA Championship with the Chicago Bulls in 1998. Most recently, he was the head boys' basketball coach and athletics director at Forsyth Country Day School in Winston-Salem.

Wojcik comes to Wake after spending the previous four seasons at the University of Tulsa, coaching under his older brother Doug. Dave played for Dino Gaudio as a standout prep athlete at Wheeling (W.Va.) Central Catholic. The two won a state title together in 1987.

Wojcik is in his 16th season coaching on the collegiate level. He previously coached under Gaudio for three seasons at his alma mater, Loyola (Md.) College from 1998-2000.

Lepore recently graduated from Wake Forest this past spring and earned four letters as a non-scholarship player on the Deacon basketball team from 2006-09. Lepore played in 19 games during his career, including 10 as a senior in 2008-09.

## DEACONS RETURN NINE IN 2009-10

After fielding the ACC's youngest starting lineup each of the past two seasons, Wake Forest now returns a great amount of experience to its roster in 2009-10.

The Demon Deacons welcome back nine letterwinners, including three starters, from last year's squad that finished 24-7 overall and tied for second in the ACC at 11-5.

Senior guard L.D. Williams, sophomore forward Al-Farouq Aminu and senior center Chas McFarland are the Deacons' three returning starters from last season. Williams has started all but one game of his Wake Forest career, while McFarland has made 56 starts. Aminu started 30 of 31 games as a freshman last season.

Aminu, who was named a Preseason All-American by multiple publications, is Wake Forest's leading returning scorer and rebounder. The 6-9 forward averaged 12.9 points and 8.2 rebounds per game last season.

Williams is one of the top defenders in the country and was named to the ACC's All-Defense first team last season. Williams also averaged 8.0 points per game last year.

McFarland has proven to be one of the ACC's most reliable centers since his breakout campaign in 2007-08. McFarland, the Deacons' second-leading returning scorer and rebounder, averaged 8.7 points and 5.8 rebounds per game last season.

The Deacs also welcome back senior guard Ishmael Smith, who has started 60 games in his career and could be considered a fourth returning starter this season. Smith served as Wake Forest's sixth man last year with the emergence of fellow point guard Jeff Teague, who has since departed for the NBA.

Smith excelled in his role off the bench, averaging 6.2 points and 3.4 assists per game. The Concord, N.C., native enters his senior season as one of just seven Deacons all-time with 400 or more career assists.

Wake Forest has a ton of experience back in the front court. In addition to McFarland, the Deacs also have centers Ty Walker, David Weaver and Tony Woods as returning lettermen. Weaver is a defensive-minded veteran who has played in 90 games during his career, while Woods is a young talent who started Wake Forest's NCAA Tournament game last season.

Walker has yet to get his chance at regular minutes but holds a great amount of promise after a talented prep career.

In the back court, junior Gary Clark returns along with Smith and Williams to give the Deacons a solid veteran group of guards. Clark has shown flashes of brilliance from beyond the arc the past two years and could get the chance this season to perform on a more regular basis.

### DEACONS WELCOME THREE INTO FOLD

Wake Forest will welcome three new faces into the fold this season. Freshmen C.J. Harris and Ari Stewart and sophomore junior college transfer Konner Tucker will join the mix for the Deacons in 2009-10.

Harris is a 6-2 combo guard out of Winston-Salem's Mount Tabor High School. He was ranked by ESPN as the No. 18 point guard in the class of 2009.

Stewart is a 6-7 forward out of Wheeler High School in Marietta, Ga. He was rated by Scout as the No. 8 small forward and No. 43 overall prospect in the class.

Tucker is a 6-4 guard from Lon Morris College. A native of Fort Worth, Texas, Tucker will be a sophomore in 2009-10 and have three years of eligibility as a Deacon.

### DEACS MUST REPLACE JOHNSON, TEAGUE

Wake Forest lost five letterwinners off last season's squad, including Harvey Hale to graduation and both James Johnson and Jeff Teague to the NBA Draft.

Johnson and Teague each declared for the NBA Draft after their sophomore seasons. Both were taken in the first round this past spring, with Johnson going to the Chicago Bulls at No. 16 and Teague to the Atlanta Hawks at No. 19.

One of the most difficult tasks the Deacons face in 2009-10 is replacing the production of Johnson and Teague, who were the Deacons' leading scorers each of the past two seasons.

Last year, Teague averaged 18.8 points and 3.5 assists per game, while Johnson scored 15.0 points to go along with a team-leading 8.5 rebounds per game. The duo combined to score 42 percent of Wake Forest's total points last season.

In all, the Deacons return 53.3 percent of their scoring and 67.4 percent of their rebounding from 2008-09.

### DEACS FACE TOUGH SCHEDULE IN 2009-10

Wake Forest faces a challenging, 28-game regular season schedule in 2009-10. The Demon Deacons will face 12 teams that participated in postseason play last season, including eight that made the NCAA Tournament.

The non-conference portion of the schedule is highlighted by back-to-back road games at perennial powers Purdue and Gonzaga in early December. The Deacons play at the Boiler-makers in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge on Dec. 1 and then head to the Pacific Northwest to face the Zags on Dec. 5.

Wake Forest will also begin a 10-year home-and-home series with Xavier. The inaugural game of the Skip Prosser Classic, as the Wake-Xavier series will be called, will be played on Jan. 3, 2010, at the Joel Coliseum.

The Deacons will begin ACC play with a pre-Christmas matchup against NC State on Dec. 20 in Winston-Salem.

Wake Forest must also face defending national champion North Carolina twice during the regular season.

In addition to the Tar Heels, the Deacons will also play two conference games each against Miami, Georgia Tech, NC State and Virginia.

The 57th Annual ACC Tournament is slated for March 11-14 at the Greensboro Coliseum in Greensboro, N.C.

### LIGHTS, CAMERA, DEACONS

Wake Forest will appear on television 22 times during the 2009-10 season, including all 16 ACC games. The Deacons will play in front of a national television audience 14 times, including nine games on the ESPN/ABC family of networks, four games on Fox Sports Net and one game on CBS.

In ACC play, nine of the Deacons' 16 conference games will be televised nationally. The remaining seven league games are set to be broadcast regionally.

ACC teams are scheduled to make a conference-record 179 appearances on national television networks, including 136 appearances on the ESPN/ABC family of networks, 34 on Fox Sports Net and nine on CBS.

In 2008-09, Wake Forest appeared on television 24 times, including postseason play. That total included 15 appearances on national television.

## LAST MEETING - NOV. 24, 2009

Wake Forest shook off a sluggish start to defeat Winston-Salem State, 62-31, on Nov. 24, 2008. The Deacon led just 21-14 at the break but turned it on to score 41 points in the second half, opening the period with a 12-0 run.

Jeff Teague led Wake with 14 points. David Weaver scored 8 points, while Chas McFarland had 7 points and 6 rebounds.

Ishmael Smith saw his first action of the 2008-09 season after breaking his left foot in the preseason. Smith turned in 2 assists and 2 rebounds in 11 minutes of action.

Wake held a 41-20 advantage on the boards but lost the turnover battle, 23-22, after committing 18 miscues in the first half. The Deacs shot 52.4 percent from the floor.

## WAKE FOREST VS. IN-STATE FOES

The Winston-Salem State game will be Wake Forest's 888th all-time contest against an in-state opponent. The Demon Deacons are 417-470 all-time against North Carolina-based schools. Last season, Wake went 6-2 against in-state opponents, including a 3-0 record in non-conference action.

Wake Forest has not lost at home to a non-conference in-state opponent since the 1985-86 season when Charlotte posted a 62-61 victory at Memorial Coliseum in Winston-Salem. The Deacons have won 48 straight home games against non-conference in-state opponents, which includes a perfect 41-0 record at the Joel Coliseum.

## ON THIS DATE - NOVEMBER 24

Wake Forest is undefeated in seven all-time games on the date of Nov. 24 (since 1951). The Deacons are 5-0 at home on the date with all five contests played at the Joel Coliseum.

**1978:** Wake Forest defeated Jacksonville, 70-68, in the Deacons' season opener in Jacksonville. Alvis Rogers led the Deacs with 18 points and nine rebounds.

**1990:** The Deacons used a patient attack and a then-school record 12 three-pointers to defeat Fairleigh Dickinson, 67-55, at the Joel Coliseum. Rodney Rogers had 20 points, and Chris King had 16 points to lead Wake.

**1996:** No. 3-ranked Wake Forest rolled past VMI, 92-63, in the Deacons' season opener at the Joel Coliseum. Tim Duncan finished with 18 points and 15 rebounds, the first of 29 double-doubles that season.

**1997:** The Deacons took down Liberty, 81-47, in the first-ever meeting between the two schools. Robert O'Kelley and Rafael Vidaurreta scored 14 points apiece.

**1998:** Wake used a second-half run to come from behind and beat William & Mary, 75-57. Robert O'Kelley had 14 points, while freshman Darius Songaila finished with 12 points.

**2004:** No. 1-ranked Wake defeated Providence, 79-67, at Madison Square Garden in the semifinals of the Preseason NIT. Justin Gray had 21 points, and Eric Williams chipped in 16 points to lead Wake. The Deacs would go on to beat No. 18 Arizona to claim the Preseason NIT Championship.

**2008:** No. 19 Wake Forest defeated Winston-Salem State, 62-31, holding the Rams to the lowest point total in Joel Coliseum history.

3rd Year / 9th Season at Wake  
Ohio University, 1981

Entering his third season at the helm of the Wake Forest basketball program, Dino Gaudio has thrived under the most unfortunate of circumstances. After taking over for his longtime friend and mentor Skip Prosser, who died suddenly of a heart attack in the summer of 2007, Gaudio has quickly elevated the Demon Deacons back to national prominence.

The fact that Gaudio has been able to accomplish all that he has is nothing short of remarkable. It has been a whirlwind ride that began with one of the most difficult tasks in college basketball.

Just two weeks after the passing of Prosser, Gaudio was chosen as the next head coach of the Demon Deacon basketball program.

For Gaudio, it was yet another step on a long journey in coaching basketball—a journey that started alongside Prosser in 1981 in Wheeling, West Virginia, when the recent Ohio University graduate became Prosser's assistant basketball coach at Central Catholic High.

The two formed a fast and successful partnership. In four years together at Wheeling Central Catholic, Prosser and Gaudio won a state championship in 1982. After Prosser left to join Pete Gillen's coaching staff at Xavier in 1984, Gaudio was picked as Prosser's successor. Dino continued to build on Skip's success, making back-to-back trips to the state championship game and earning one title.

That Gaudio would once again be picked to succeed his mentor came as a surprise to no one. He assumed the reigns of a program that was not only grief-stricken but one that featured very little veteran experience on its roster.

In each of his first two seasons, Gaudio featured the ACC's youngest starting lineup according to class year.

After debuting with a 17-13 showing in 2007-08, the Deacs burst onto the national scene in 2008-09. Wake finished 24-7 overall and 11-5 in the ACC.

The Deacs spent the entire 2008-09 season ranked in the top 25, climbing all the way to the No. 1 ranking on Jan. 19 before finishing No. 12 in the final AP poll.

Gaudio became the third-fastest ACC head coach to have his team ranked No. 1, after just 46 games at the helm. He also led Wake Forest to its first NCAA Tournament appearance in four seasons in 2009.

A significant factor in Gaudio's success has been his emphasis on defense. The coaching staff installed a new defensive system prior to the 2007-08 season. The change paid dividends as Wake went from finishing last in the ACC in field goal percentage defense in 2006-07 to sixth in 2007-08 and to third in 2008-09.

In each of his first two seasons, Gaudio was recognized by a publication as being the ACC coach of the year. Rivals named Gaudio as its 2008 ACC Coach of the Year, while CBSsports.com tabbed Gaudio for the honor in 2009.

A veteran of 27 years of coaching, Gaudio joined the Wake Forest staff as an assistant coach in 2002 when Prosser was named head coach. After three seasons, Gaudio was promoted to associate head coach.

During his six years on the Deacon staff, Wake compiled a record of 126-68 and reached postseason play five times including four straight NCAA Tournaments from 2002-05.

In his previous 22 years at the college level, 12 of Gaudio's teams have reached the postseason including 11 NCAA Tournament berths and a pair of Sweet 16 appearances.

Gaudio's nine years of head coaching experience at the Division I level include four seasons at Army from 1993-97 and three years at Loyola (Md.) College from 1997-2000.

While an assistant at Xavier, Gaudio helped develop many future NBA players Tyrone Hill, Derek Strong, Aaron Williams, Brian Grant and David West (New Orleans).

At Wake Forest, Gaudio has worked with NBA stars Josh Howard (Dallas), James Johnson (Chicago), Chris Paul (New Orleans), Darius Songaila (New Orleans) and Jeff Teague (Atlanta).

A 1981 graduate of Ohio University, Gaudio earned double bachelor's degrees in accounting and secondary education. He received a master's degree in secondary education from Xavier in 1991.

Gaudio, a native of Yorkville, Ohio, and his wife, Maureen, are the parents of two daughters, Kaylan (25) and Alyssa (18). Kaylan is a 2006 graduate of Wake Forest, where she was a member of the dance team, and is now attending law school at Elon University. Alyssa is a freshman at Wake Forest.
