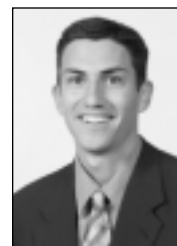

dous burden off our coaching staff. This is the senior class - in terms of character, personality and leadership - in my time at Wake Forest. All four are assistant coaches on the field."

Robbins returns after another All-ACC caliber season in 2002. A native of Richmond, Va., Robbins has started 58 games the past three years, including 40 of the last 41. She earned All-ACC second team in 2002 after scoring four goals out of the back. That ability to push out of the attack will be looked upon even more this season.

Winstead returns after one of the better all-around offensive seasons in school history. She scored nine goals, added six assists and was an All-ACC second team pick. The Raleigh, N.C., native is a versatile player - possibly playing at any position on the field.

Thom, who has made 42 consecutive starts heading into the season, scored eight goals and dished out seven assists in 2002. Thom, who began the last season at midfield, moved up front and excelled. The Jefferson City, Mo., native was named ACC Player of the Week once and registered three gamewinning goals. Similar to Winstead, she is another player whose versatility will be counted upon.

The fourth and final senior, **Griffin**, is unlike the previous three. Griffin missed the entire 2002 campaign after a torn ACL sidelined her prior to the season. A knee injury is nothing new to Griffin. She missed much of the 2000 and 2001 seasons with different knee injuries. The Englewood, Colo., native still managed to score five goals during the 2000 season, third best on the team, despite missing the second half of the season after tearing her meniscus against Duke. Her full recovery is critical to the Deacons.

The remaining returning letterwinners include Sara Creighton, Kenna Healy, Alli Hunt, Meagan Mullins, Sarah Kozey and Melanie Schneider - all of whom saw considerable time last season and will be counted on for more this year.

Creighton played in 19 games off the Wake Forest bench a year ago. The Boise, Idaho native scored two goals, against Oregon and Georgia, and a pair of assists. The junior will see increased time in 2003, mostly at an attacking midfield spot.

"Sara really improved over the course of last season," said da Luz. "Sara is a true playmaker. After working on her strength this offseason, she will make more of an impact this year."

Healy has been dealt the responsibility with replacing arguably the best goalkeeper in school history. Erin Regan was a three-year starter and now plays for the Washington Freedom of the WUSA. The junior paid her dues in 2001 and 2002, serving as backup. In that time, the Wilmington, Del., native played in just seven games, but allowed just one goal in over 318 minutes. While her experience is limited, da Luz is confident Healy will fill the void.

"Kenna had a very good spring," said da Luz. "She played in a lot of games and used that experience to determine her strengths and weaknesses. Kenna has the ability to be a solid goalkeeper in this league."

Hunt returns for her third season with the Deacons. The junior started all 22 games a year ago and finished with seven assists, tied for best on the squad. The Charlotte, N.C., native is an anchor in the midfield, but will possibly see sometime in

the back in 2003. Hunt, one of the hardest workers on the team, will provide tremendous leadership through example.

"Alli is another true leader," said da Luz. "Her work ethic is incredible, but she will need to pace herself more this season. We need her for 90 minutes."

Mullins is another player looking to breakthrough in 2003. The junior forward played in 18 games last season and tallied three goals and two assists. The Sterling, Va., native registered the gamewinning goal against UNC Greensboro and the gamewinning assist against #20 USC. Mullins uses her tremendous speed and strength to attack defenders.

"Melaine will help us in specific roles up front," said da Luz. "She is very quick and strong. Melanie has also improved her technique."

Kozey exploded onto the scene last year. The sophomore scored nine goals, added five assists and earned ACC All-Freshman honors. Kozey is definitely one of the more dangerous players in the entire ACC. Just take her performance against North Carolina in last season's regular season matchup. Kozey tallied both goals in a 3-2 defeat to the Tar Heels. A native of Halifax, Nova Scotia, Kozey can score with either foot and is dangerous anywhere near the penalty box. da Luz expects huge things from her this season.

"I am really excited for Sarah," said da Luz. "She worked hard over the summer and has improved her game mightily."

Schneider, the final returning letterwinner, is penciled in as a starting marking back heading into the season. The sophomore played in 21 games in 2002 and started all, but one. The Peachtree City, Ga., native registered two goals and five assists. Not only one of the fastest players on the pitch for the Deacons, but also one of the steadiest, Schneider will bring continued composure in the back.

"Melanie had such a good season last year," said da Luz. "She continued her stellar play this summer and has developed into a more confident personality. She had the athletic ability, but now has added the other parts to her game."

A staple of the Wake Forest program since the arrival of da Luz six years ago has been a loaded non-conference schedule. Well, the 2003 slate is no different. The Deacons will face the likes of Notre Dame, Connecticut, Pepperdine and California - all of whom were ranked at one time last season.

"I know it is said all the time, but this truly is our toughest non-conference schedule in years," said da Luz. "It is so important to play a challenging schedule. Not only does the NCAA Tournament consider your strength of schedule, but it makes the squad so much stronger."

The Deacons hope to improve upon their eighth place finish in the 2002 ACC Regular Season. Despite the finish, Wake Forest was just two wins out of second place. Even more interesting when you consider the Deacons had three losses in ACC play by just a single goal. da Luz feels the run to the ACC title will be similar this season.

"It would not surprise me at all to see the regular season come down to one game - there is such a fine line between winning and losing in this league," said da Luz. The conference, from top to bottom, is so deep. I bet our conference gets seven bids to the NCAAs."
