Huskies Impress With Ohio State Sweep

UMD Dominates New Hampshire

Gophers Drop Pair to Dartmouth

Madison, Wis. - The St. Cloud State Huskies visited Columbus, Ohio for the lone conference series of the weekend and became the first WCHA team of the season to sweep Ohio State. SCSU won a 4-3 overtime contest in the first game before earning a 4-1 victory for the four-point weekend. The wins moved the Huskies one point back of the fourth-place Buckeyes. The Huskies have two-games at hand on OSU.

The rest of the conference took on non-conference opponents, including three teams facing-off against ECAC competition. In the marquee series pitting the two conference leaders, Minnesota fell twice to Dartmouth in New Hampshire.

Minnesota-Duluth played at home and handled the other ECAC from the State of New Hampshire. The Bulldogs shut out the University of New Hampshire, 3-0, in the opener and earned the sweep with an 8-1 win in the second game. Wisconsin was the third team to take on the ECAC, knocking off Boston College, 8-1 and 5-3, in Middleton, Wis. MSU, Mankato played Mercyhurst falling twice to the Lakers, 4-0 and 4-1.

UMD is the only team in action this week when Harvard visits on Saturday and Sunday.

Ohio State was swept for only the second time this season by visiting St. Cloud State over the weekend. The Huskies beat the Buckeyes, 4-3, in overtime Friday and won, 4-1, Saturday at the OSU Ice Arena • The OSU penalty-kill unit held St. Cloud State-which then had the highest power-play percentage in the league-scoreless through 11-of-13 opportunities. Ohio State leads the league in penalty kills with 68-of-79 (86.1%) • The Buckeyes were three-of-five on the power-play (60%) Friday. All three Ohio State goals came on the power play. Sixty percent is OSU's highest power-play percentage since Oct. 15 when the Buckeyes beat Findlay, 4-1 • Shana Frost had her third two-goal game of the season, Friday. Frost's second goal tied the game at three with 42 seconds remaining to send it to overtime. Currently the team's scoring leader (9-5=14), Frost has four power-play goals • Heather Farrell assisted on both of Frost's goals Friday. In seven games, the freshman left wing has five assists - two on game-winners and two on game-tying goals • OSU will take a two-week break before traveling to New York for three non-conference road games • OSU faces St. Lawrence Dec. 30, Cornell Dec. 31 and the U.S. National Team Jan. 2, 2001 at Lake Placid.
